

I heard them, logether with Keith Richard and co-manager Andy Oldham, even before the rest of the Stones and I can say, without doubt, these tracks are

without doubt, these tracks are the greatest, most musical sides. I've ever heard from the group, and, according to Andy and Keith, was the best session they'd ever worked on.

"The whole ust up was terrific," and Andy. "We used the RCA studies in Hollywood, and completely insulated outselves from the outside. The boys recorded for 15 hours non-stop— from 11 a.m. until 4 the next morning— and I appear another three hours in the studies overduabling and editing the misters."

#### Terrified

Keith agreed that he really let blimtelf no at the session, as did the rest of the boys.

"The atmosphere and studin plus the fact that we knew we had noed material, made the session's good one. We didn't think it would work out at flast, as the studia is so gigantic we were ferrified to use it. #### From June Harris in New York

Andy produced every one of the sides, of which only one, "Hearts Of Stone" was written by Mick and Keith. The others have all been recorded by various American artists, and there's one new Jerry Leiber number, Stied Down Hone Girl."

He rang "I Be's Trouble" and "Country Blues." Lomax and Work packed their recording equipment and left, and Muddy went hock to working another season in the fields playing on Sunday night concerts and all-night dances, just for the chance to sing. The next summer Muddy joined up with a tent show and travelled round the South. When the show closed he returned to the farm but could not settle. A few months later, at 28, he decided to head North to Chicago where he started recording in carnest.
