**THE first thing Freddie Garrity said to me in his dressing room at Reddy Steady Go! last Friday was "Sspplurshht"**

This is not a special Freddieism. He was stripped to the waist at the basin and had just dunked his face into it to wash the soap off.

When the soap and water bit was done, he manipulated a tape recorder and sang a bit about the latest Freddie and The Dreamers' single "Over You."

"It's written by me," said the lad. "I know who the songwriters are—Derek Quinn and Alan Jones." Reddy Steady Go! rules. "Probably won't ever make it."

"It's our first effort," declared Derek proudly, ignoring the Garrity pun. "We've been writing it for months. We'll be springing it on you till we'd finished it."

"Actually it was a nothing number until they changed the melody eight bars," said Freddie.

"After that, it was done, it made all the difference."

Freddie and the boys will be on the BBC's new programme *The London Palladium* bill on March 22, and they're already preparing.

"I don't think we'll have more than a seven minute spot, so we have to be very concise," counts down on Freddie. "We'll open with a medley of our hits, do a comedy number, and then do a dance finale. 'Over You,' it all depends on how much time we have."

Freddie and the boys have their eyes firmly fixed on the States at the moment too.

"We want to go over there as fast as possible," he says. "We've got to go and get a teeth-cleaning operation with a blood-coloured toothpaste.



**HELLO.** This is Manfred Mann—all five of us—writing for DISC a few days after the start of our first big national tour.

It's the very first time we've played in theatres—and we're liking it a lot. We are all agreed—theatre are better than ballrooms. But clubs are best of all.

For our kind of music, we mean. Our music? It's gutsy, earthy rhythm and blues—our definition of R and B that is—and that covers a pretty wide field.

By rhythm and blues we mean every variation of that music and we mean the rock-and-roll sound sphere which many people tend to class as R and B.

Yes, there's no denying it, we like the atmosphere in clubs. It's definitely the best for our music. So much so that after that tour we're taking a break. Monday night residency at London's Marquee, where we know there's the kind of audience that loves genuine rhythm and blues feeling.

All five of us are pretty pleased that we've made it into the charts with "Frove It" and like the record-hunters themselves, of course, although we must admit that we prefer the title.

# DAVE CLARK WINS SILVER DISC No. 2!

DAVE CLARK has pulled off a Silver Disc double! He has snatched a Silver Disc for "Bits And Pieces," which roared into the quarter million sales brackets even before it was released—on St. Valentine's Day, February 14. Dave's "Bits" single smash sold 91,000 copies on Monday alone, and in only nine selling days had grossed a total of 414,000!

# Shopping: We didn't get time, says Paul

THERE'S been nothing like it since King George I took a trip along the Thames in 1715 and they played that Water Music jazz of his.

The approaches to the Teddington footbridge last Sunday morning were crowded from the crack of dawn, and the ABC TV cameras were under guard by an older crew. ABC security patrols forced by a strong contingent of the local constabulary, hunched around the gates and patrolled the area.

Inside there was a swarm of Press photographers mingling with the ABC camera crews and technicians who had been waiting for the stars to arrive. The day was dull, the details was cold as well as wet, but nobody seemed to bother.

Soon after tea loud screams further along the

Thames gave up earlier of their approach. They were travelling about a quarter of a mile, and were practically surrounded by a miniature Botticelli of craft crowded with film and press people.

Just before the Beatles got off the launch on to the jetty, where the rest of ABC TV's "Big Night Out" cast were waiting to greet them, a sudden outburst of the screams and stampedes broke out.

The boys hurried off the jetty to an antique Royal Mail van which had been driven two hundred yards to the "Big Night Out" studio for the benefit of the cameras. Pressmen scurried about, cameras clicking, leaping against the enthusiastic weight of the crowd, and suddenly a girl wearing a Beale placard raced through the Press and TV personnel like a knife through butter.

She burst into Bentley as it moved off towards the studio, and landed hard first in Ringo's lap.

### Overwhelmed

When I caught up with them again in the studio, she was already being interviewed by what had done more being closer to the Beatles than Paul was.

"We're very pleased to be back," declared Ringo, with that unshaven grin of his. "In the studio, we're all right."

"What have you brought back from America?" I asked Paul.

"The Four American shopping bags you've got to wear in the press," he answered. "Actually we've got a lot more, but most of presents before we came home. We didn't do any shopping while we were there, though, there

wasn't time. Brought some records back with us, though, including good rhythm and blues things."

The Beatles' "Big Night Out" will be recorded in London except London on Saturday evening at 6.35. Londoners will see it on Sunday evening (March 3) at 8.6.

In the first part of the programme they will do two sketches with Mike and Bernie Winters, and will also see the film of the Beatles' first visit to the studio.

The Beatles close the programme with "A Day in My Life," "I Want You," "Till There Was You," "Please Mr. Postman," and "I'm a Pilgrim."

## END OF MARCH SET FOR NEXT BEATLES SINGLE

**T**HIS Beatles' next single will be another Lennon composition. "Many Men" may be the title, probably one which they have written for their film, "Beatlemania." Likely release date is the end of next month.

On Tuesday next week the boys start recording another song for the film. The manager, Brian Epstein, told DISC: "They will make five or six recordings for the film and an LP will be re-

leased around August, when we expect the film to be completed."

The Beatles will spend the rest of this week in the recording studios and will start shooting on the film, which is being made at the United Artists' studio, Monday. The first work will be on location, but NOT in Liverpool. In fact, the exact location is being kept secret to prevent fans wrecking the shooting. The Beatles will be in black and

white, and is being written by top TV writer Alan Owen.

The Beatles' return from the States has boosted their fan-mail to fantastic proportions. At a London Press office in Moorgate, 30 large sacks of letters are delivered, plus 25 parcels of varying sizes.

The new version of "She Loves You" has now appeared in our charts for 27 consecutive weeks—another record set by the fab four! N.R.
