in the country by all the top D.J.s.
"Woman You're Breaking Me" was penned by Richard and Brian, and the song itself has guts, a driving rhythm, and most

important it is commercial.

The success of this single can not be fully determined, as it is still selling 28 weeks after release date, but it is reported that sales could reach the 50,000 mark which would earn the Groop a gold record.
