

from pete townshend's guitar in london

I am a Rickenbaker guitar, and I bei am a Rickenbaser guitar, and I of-long to Pete Townsend from The Who. I've been with him for about three years now and I've had some woird experiences in that time, but I must be his favorite because he's had lots of other guitars and they've only lasted two or three weeks.

My own brother died a terrible death when he was rammed through a speaker box, two of my sisters were burnt to death and my father was smashed to

pieces and thrown into the crowd. So far though I've been lucky, I've only had a neck broken and a few

strings.
I don't get taken on stage much and though I'm scared stiff whenever he does take me on with him I just can't help admiring him and the rest of the group they're so exciting and colourful. But I like it best when he uses me to

work out the songs he writes. I've helped him write "My Generation",
"Substitute", "Happy Jack", "Pictures
of Lity" and even the new one "I Can
See For Miles and Miles". He's got some really wild vibrations going and I think he's one of the most imaginative song-

writers around. I've been on all the recording ses-sions and he's a knockout musician. He stons and he's a knockul muscial. The keeps his playing simple and effective (though he's as fast as hell when he wants to be). He experiments with un-usual sounds; you know, the feedback and distortion, I think they call it psy-chedelic music now but ole' Townsend was the first to use it. He also started weird clothes kick, wearing medals and flags and things.

I'll never forget the time we were doing a tour of Ireland and some of the Irish got upset because he used the Union Jack to make a coat and they said they'd blow The Who up if he wore it in their town so Pete cut up the Irish flag and wore that. He's like that.

Pete has been called arrogant, conceited and rude and I'm inclined to agree.
ile hates the adult social world, his
songs show this with lines like "I hope i die before I get old" and "why don't

He's always turning up late for in-terviews and he even insults the other members of The Who. Once a reporter, on meeting him put out his hand and Pete retaliated by throwing a sandwich in his face. Pete explained that he did this because the guy didn't look im-portant enough to talk to. He does just what he wants, when he wants, if he

doesn't like something he does some thing about it.

My Auntie 's owned by one of the Beatles and she said that even they are impressed and influenced by Pete and she reckens that "god" (John Lennon) her owner and Townsend are really stir-ring up the pop scene and bringing a bit of character and honesty to it.

I know that Pete doesn't care what people think about him, he's only in-terested in himself and his music; as long as he can experiment and keep pro-gressing and improving on each new song, he's happy. I think he's one of the most progressive writers in pop, rude and all as he is.

I still pack every time he opens my case. I think I'm never going to get
