"I don't love the Queen, I love Yoko", said John Lennon in London last week.

Great speculation has been mounting over the past two weeks about John Lennon's six-year marriage to Cynthia.

Lennon had been holidaying in Ireland with YOKO ONO, wife of American film director Anthony Cox. Lennon's return to London, accompanied by Yoko, set London columnists and gossip mongers talking.

Last week John Lennon dedicated an art exhibition to Yoko, and to mark the event he released 365 gas filled, white balloons over the fashionable Mayfair area.

Yoko rose to English fame over the controversial film that she and her husband made. The complete film is on 365 bare bottoms.

I rang Terry Doran of Apple Music (life-long friend of Lennon's and asked if the rumor was true. "John is an unpredictable character," said Terry. "he does what he wants to do. It is true that John and Cynthia are having marriage problems, both have sought the advice of solicitors. It appears that John is very much in love with Yoko. Marriage between the two . . . could be very likely if everything is not sorted out between John and Cynthia".

On the Art Exhibition, Terry said, "It was weird and nice, and the balloons were just great."

Lennon is reported to say, when asked about the possible marriage to Yoko . . . "I don't think marriage is the end product of love."

I wonder what Cynthia and their five-year-old son, John, think.

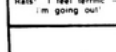

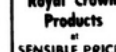

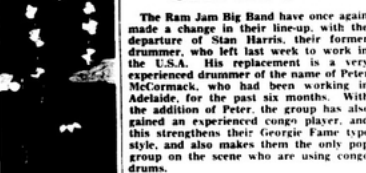

SUICIDE - BOBBY JAMES

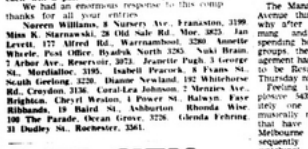

Bob, with the help of his lead guitarist, Lyndsay Shah, quickly tore up strips of sheets, and rapidly stopped the flow of blood before calling an ambulance. On arrival the ambulance rushed the girl to hospital where emergency blood transfusions were given. The girl is now in a satisfactory condition.

Bobby James, disturbed by this near tragedy in his home, was not available to be interviewed, but Lyndsay told Go-Set that it was Bobby's quick action, and cool head that saved the life of one of his closest friends.

Buying a Guitar

When you buy any instrument, remember that famous brands are usually famous because their product gives a good sound and doesn't fall apart in a hurry. All brands can sometimes make instruments that are either better or worse than their average products.

Here are some points to look for.
When you look down the neck of a guitar, it should be perfectly straight all the way. If it is not, then the guitar will be of no use to you. The wood that the frets are set into should be a separate piece to the back of the neck and glued flush on to it. The best fretboards are made of ebony or similar hardwood.

Tune all the strings down and up, to get the feel of the machineheads. They should be firm and smooth, and sensitive to fairly slight pressure.

Play a note on every string and on every fret right up the neck. If it is first tuned in concert pitch, then the strings should not rattle or buzz on higher frets. Every position should produce a clear tone. If it sounds out of tune or fuzzy then the frets may be slightly worn or incorrectly placed, or the bridge may not be positioned properly.

The sound on the twelfth fret should be exactly an octave above the open string sound. The bridge should be solid and adjustable in all directions.

The guitar should produce a clear and undistorted sound when played through an average quality amplifier, with the volume controls turned full on. If it is fuzzy then the pickups are probably faulty.

They also toured America in March, and recorded "Painted Black" in Hollywood.

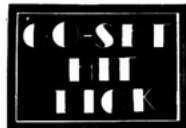
