

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

A lot of people have heard the Rolling Stones sing Raby Please Don't Go', unfortunately not many have heard the man who wrote it — Big Joe Williams.

Big Joe was bern in Crawford, Missispipi in 1903 and like so many great blues-men taught himself to play on a home-made box in Joe's case made of some wire, a speel and some staples). He got his first break with a show called the Rabbit-Foot Minstrels playing guita, in the

show's jug band. It was with this jug band that Joe first recorded. He later cut a couple of sides for Vocalin and then under the pseudonym "King Solomon Hill" and disguising his voice by singing faisetto, he recorded for Paramount.

Since then Big Joe has recorded fairly regularly for Bluebird, Columbia and several of the post-war indepen-







TECHNIQUES OF HILL - CLIMBING

(Contiued from last week.) It is a help to every novice at the sport to be given a few pointers on technique before he finds bad habits of his own. Here is a nutshell summar of leading driver's methods.

Indiscriminate blipping or over-revving is of no value and frequently disturbs car-burettor mixtures. The main reason so much blipping is heard at the line is probably sheer starting nerves and the delight in the sound of the motor!

THE START

A fast start is only achieved with much practice, and getfrom the line is an unusually tricky operation. The novice will declare his lack of experience very quickly, by either letting the clutch in too far too many revs with conse-quent uncontrolled wheelspin. Conversely he may take off on falling revs and lose tor-que when he needs it. 
