Danny Goldberg Rises To President Of Atlantic Records

Multifaceted Music Man Latest in Industry's Young Lions

Danny Goldberg was named President of Atlantic Records. The 43-year-old Renaissance Man represents the latest in the second generation of record industry vetrans now in leadership positions at the the corporate level.

Goldberg already had considerable experience when he joined Atlantic as Sr. VP in 1992. He began as a journalist and editor in the late '60s for publications such as *Billboard* and *Circus*. In the mid-'70s, he was named VP for Led Zeppelin's Swan Song Records, which was distributed by Atlantic. After a brief stint running his own PR firm, Goldberg and partner Paul Fishkin founded Modern Records, with Stevie Nicks as the label's first signing. It, too, was distributed by Atlantic.

In 1984, he left Modern to form Gold Mountain Entertainment, an artist management company which currently represents Bonnie Raitt, Nirvana, Sonic Youth and the

Beastie Boys. Goldberg has also been music supervisor for over 15 films and the TV series, *Miami Vice*. Outside of the business, Goldberg has been heavily involved in politics, most recently serving as Chair of the ACLU Foundation of Southern California.

"When Danny joined Atlantic, he brought a tremendous diversity of experience – as journalist, publicist, artist manager, label founder and activist," states Atlantic Group Co-Chairman/Co-CEO Doug Morris. "Over the past two years, he has become a pivotal figure in the Atlantic of the '90s and beyond. Danny has been the driving force behind a series of dynamic ventures in the Alternative music arena, while being involved in many other areas of the company. He is a person of wide-ranging talents who is ideally suited to assume this multifaceted post."

"When Doug Morris invited me to come at Atlantic, I leapt at the chance," Goldberg notes. "One of the few true visionaries in the business, Doug has been a great mentor and the past two years have been the most exciting and fulfilling in my career. I firmly believe that by encouraging a true entrepreneurial spirit to flourish under the umbrella of a major label, Atlantic offers an extraordinarily fertile environment where artists and staff alike can realize their full potential."

Brian Bridgman Named PD At WDCG Raleigh

KIIS MD Heads East To Re-enter Programming Wars

KIIS FM Los Angeles MD Brian Bridgman has accepted the Program Director position at WDGC "G105" Raleigh. He succeeds Bill Cahill in the post.

WDCG GM Ron Stone is bullish on Bridgman's potential. "We searched high and low to find the right guy and in Brian, we think we did," he says. "Brian's reputation of

being the best with the music is second to none. We're excited about bringing him on board and we feel he will take this station exactly where we want it... to the top."

Bridgman, who already has programming experience at the former KHTK "Hot 97" St. Louis, seems ready to accept the new challenge. "I've been thrilled to be at KIIS-

FM as Music Director," he notes. "It was a tough decision, but I've been looking for the right programming opportunity. o I'm sitting in Le Dome with a couple of other outlaws watching the ponies run. A money-winner stops near our table briefly and searches the bar with her eyes. Being a true, Southern

She, unfortunately, isn't stupid and knows the key word in that sentence is pending.

About the time I figure I'm making real headway (which also coincides with the arrival of her drink) she stands and says, "There's my date."

I look across the room and see the ugly gnome this beautiful woman is meeting. "You're leaving me for that guy?"

She tosses her head back and gives me a quick look over her shoulder. "Call me when you've *got* a deal."

Don't you just love L.A?

Which brings me to the point of this editorial. (If there ever really is a point.) In our business, we seldom hear the word, "no." We hear a lot of other words combined in different scenarios that mean the same thing, but rarely do we hear "no."

I'm sure it's not going to be a problem. The consultant is giving me a hassle. Let me listen to it again. I'm not getting good feedback. Let me think about it and get right back to you. I'm freezing this week. Call me back at two o'clock. I'm concerned about the stationality. I can't talk now; I have to go to the hospital.

If you're the head of promotion and you're trying to get an answer from your LPM, you've certainly heard one of the following:

I really think we've got a shot. The guy's a real asshole, but he said he would listen to it one more time. He's only going to add two records and two other companies are offering him trips to Paris and thousands of dollars in cash... and a time buy. He's trying to get his general manager to approve it. He really likes the record. I know I'm in the mix, but the indy will probably bump it. He's in the hospital... I'm trying to get through to the emergency room.

If you're a program director and have asked a favor from a record company, have you heard this?

The CDs haven't arrived... there must be a problem at the plant. I don't know what happened... I left the tickets at will call. I'll overnight you a copy. I never got a message. My assistant must have fucked it up. I'm sorry, I've been in the hospital.

Damn, we're a verbose group. We'll always use a sentence when a word would suffice.

Not me. When someone asked if last week's editorial about independent record promoters was the last one I would write on that subject, I gave them the answer.

TEXOMA'S NUMBER ONE!

Located in northern Texas, just south of the Oklahoma border, is Wichita Falls, a metro area of a bit over 100,000 people and home to Power 92.9, KNIN. PD J.J. McKay says his radio station is "a Mainstream Top 40, geared to 'Texoma'." That's the name the locals use for the border area of the two states. "Our station, like most Top 40s, is geared to attract young adults, with a slight emphasis on fe-

males. I tell the airstaff to keep a 29-year-old woman in mind while they're on the air. That way they're generally talking to the center of our target demo. If there's any musical lean, it's a bit Rock. The ethnic makeup of this area is only 10% Black and 10% Hispanic. The rest is pretty middle of the road/Rock in their musical taste, so we provide that to them."

Wichita Falls is home to the Sheppard Air Force Base, which is the area's largest employer. "It's one of the major bases that wasn't closed or affected by the scaling back. Because of that, we're seeing growth as other bases are being incorporated into Sheppard." As for radio competition, McKay say's it's "Country, Country and Country. This is Texas!" Does that mean that Country music is likely to be heard on the station? "No, not really. I tried a year or so ago to spike in a Garth Brooks song when he was really hot. I played it during my morning show and the immediate phone response was 'Why are you playing that? I can hear that on three other stations! I thought you played my hit music!' That was all the research I needed. We need to stay true to ourselves, and true to

our format to keep our listeners happy."

Musically, there are no surprises. "Although we've tried to expose some of the New Rock artists over the past year or so, we're not an Alternative station. A lot of artists like Pearl Jam, The Breeders, US3 and 10,000 Maniacs have really worked for us. So have Mariah Carey and Michael Bolton. From a Gold standpoint, there are some bands that still matter

here in Texas. ZZ Top cut their teeth in this part of the world, so we still play a number of their songs. We also spike in .38 Special and an occasional Stevie Ray Vaughn as well. The one thing we will have to watch is a new Rock station that's due to sign on soon. We may have to be more careful with some of that older product in the mix."

KNIN just finished up a New Year's promotion "where the grand prize winner went to New York City to see Janet Jackson in concert. We didn't do anything really unusual to give it away, just a 'listen for the Janet jam of the day' contest, where listeners qualified to win the trip. We then gave it away on the air. We also just finished up a holiday promotion that had us involved in the 'Coats for Kids' campaign that a couple of other stations around the country were involved with. It's a great cause — especially during the holidays — and a great way for the station to be a part of this community. Although it was the first time we did it in this market, the area can expect it to become an annual event for KNIN."



MUSIC REVOLUTION AND EVOLUTION!

The 36th Annual Grammy Award nominations are in and this year artists from all genres of music were cited in multiple categories. From Peabo Bryson to Smashing Pumpkins and all styles in between, the types of music being produced and delivered to radio continue to grow, expand and diversify. Successful Top 40 radio stations and Top 40 programmers continue to define the format as being the best of the best. The changes in music style and texture continue daily and on this week's Programmer's Conference Call, we look at changes occurring in the world of music in the past year and in '94.

Discuss the changes in music delivered to radio over the past year.

BRIAN: A couple of years ago, the whole Seattle thing began to develop. Everyone instantly jumped on the bandwagon in the sense they were signing and producing bands very similar to the original sound. I don't want to sound negative about it; I'm grateful it happened. It clearly defined a separation in the appeal factor between the 18-24 demographics and the 25+ demographics. There used to be a disproportionate number of artists who blurred the lines between demos, but the number has been dramatically reduced over the last two years.

ERIC: Alternative music has defiantly exploded in the last year. A lot of bands we haven't heard

from in a long time, such as Kate Bush, The Breeders and Nick Heyward, are seeing this evolution in music and are jumping in on it. Radio has exposed a lot of older songs by these artists in the past year, fueling the evolution for this year.

HELEN: During '93, it seemed like everything became raunchier and raunchier as the year progressed. I'm referring to everything from ballads to Gangsta Rap and beyond. If it wasn't just about sex, it was describing sex or the desire for sex. Everything just seemed to become more blatant during the year. Hopefully, this trend will slow down, then reverse itself in '94.

GREG: There's been a lot of changes. We saw the explosion of Gangsta Rap with the Dr. Dre and Snoop albums. At the same time, we almost saw its demise this year. A lot of people have become very gun-shy over it recently. Everyone seems to be waiting for another huge change in our format and the music within it, No one is quite sure what that change will be. I don't think Gangsta Rap will completely go away but I think it will change form. For instance, the Snoop Dog album is more melodic than other albums in the category.

ERIK B: We hit a huge Rap trend in the last year where everyone was shopping for the Dr. Dre/2Pac sound. Now it seems everyone is shopping for the Johnny O./Collage/Robin S. sound. Gangsta Rap initially exploded onto the scene, but now everyone is wondering if they want to be a part of it.

Why do you think Alternative music became a part of the mainstream in '93?

BRIAN: It is indeed the mainstream. It's mainstream America for the younger demos. I'm not sure whether it's because the so-called Generation X has embraced this music so much or because America has embraced the generation. The music itself is the attitude of the generation.

ERIC: Alternative music is more accepted now than ever before. First, there is a lot of great Alternative music out there. Secondly, the people who grew up when Duran Duran was huge the first time out and when all these underground bands were creating the buzz, are still into these bands. Even though they weren't huge then, they were bigger than most people gave them credit for being. Hearing these records now is refreshing to these same people because they're sick of hearing the same old Top 40 music on the radio. People always for look for new and exciting sounds and people will always want something new and different.

HELEN: People were looking for something fresh in their listening habits, something new... an Alternative, if you will. People enjoy new things all the time and the availability of Alternative music, coupled with the fact people were ready to embrace a new genre of music, helped bring the music into the forefront during '93.

GREG: From my perspective, the last couple of generations have been very strange in that each generation has been able to listen to what the previous one did. At the same time, each generation has its own specific genre of music but it seems this time we just skipped a generation where Alternative music is concerned. Alternative music reflects the lifestyle and angst of the most current generation, who skipped the music of the '80s because it was so disposable.

ERIK B.: One factor is a lot of people made the decision that even though they may like Rap music, when stations saturated the air-



waves with it, these same people looked for something different... and they found Alternative music. The genre of music called Alternative defined itself. At the same time the music became a lifestyle that is reflected within the music. In essence, Alternative was another choice of the contemporary music available at the time.

What type of developments or evolution of music do you think we'll see in '94?

BRIAN: We'll continue to see people attempting to capitalize on existing trends and existing genres in music. While this is going on, the smart A&R guys are out searching for the next genre. I think things like "Cantaloop" by US3 and Deep Forest "Sweet Lullaby" offer a unique, fresh sound in music and we'll probably see more and more of these unique sounds arriving this year.

ERIC: I definitely think Alternative music will continue to be the genre that garners the most growth, but I don't think every station should go out and start playing it because of the growth. If Pearl Jam happens to be mainstream for your marketplace, play it. If not, don't. Top 40 has always been the best of the best. If it fits, play it, but not for the sake of just trying to fit in.

HELEN: Dance will continue to grow through the year, the House sounding music... things like Zhane. Keep in mind, Retro Disco came back last year and even though it was treated in novelty fashion, I don't think it's ready to go away yet. We will probably see "Old School" sounds well into this year and other forms of music similar to it being developed as well. Give "Old School" another six months to a year before it goes away.

GREG: It's going to be a year of experimentation. We're going to see a lot of real innovative artists this year. People like Me'Shell Ndegeocello are way ahead of their time with extremely creative and innovative music. I look for a lot more things like this in '94. I don't know if all of them will be accessible by radio but I do think this is a year of experimentation in music. Things like the combination of Jazz with Hip-Hop and sing-song lyrics. We'll see

this type of thing develop through this year.

ERIK B.: Real music! I say this as opposed to over-produced crap. I think we'll see more from real artists like Boyz II Men who can really sing and who are true vocal talents. Legitimate, real artists are going to be this year's truly successful groups.

Who do you think will win the "Best New Artist" category among those nominated for this year's Grammys and then who do you think should win?

BRIAN: Toni Braxton will probably win it. She's a Platinum artist, she has the goods and she'll be around for a long while. As far as who should win it, again, Toni Braxton. She's a real artist and deserves this Grammy.

ERIC: Toni Braxton should win but I don't know if she will. She has the most longevity of all those nominated. At the same time I think they're all great artists. As far as who will win... probably Blind Melon because the group received so much hype in and out of the industry this past year.

HELEN: Toni Braxton and Toni Braxton. She is the best new artist and is definitely going to be around for awhile. She hooked up with the correct people, she has the correct product and because of this she has the correct future.

GREG: Toni Braxton should win. Of all the groups nominated, I think she'll be around the longest and she's an incredible vocal talent. Even though she should win, I think Blind Melon has a good shot of winning it because of the exposure and hype they received.

ERIK B.: I can't say who I think will win, but Toni Braxton should win it. She's had four hits in the past year, she's incredible and is the next diva. Any of the groups nominated could win, but I won't guess simply because the winners at the Grammys never cease to amaze me.

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

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


Andy Schuon

The Mind Behind The Televised Music

INTERVIEW BY DWAYNE WARD

Andy Schuon has already ascended to the heights of the entertainment industry elite. He's now head of programming for MTV, Viacom's most powerful music television channel. Many people in the record industry feel that one video aired on MTV is worth countless spins at any one radio station. In this, the first of a two-part interview with Radio Editor Dwayne Ward, Schuon discusses his radio days and what he misses and has learned from them.




Absolutely. I miss the immediacy of radio. It's a lot quicker from your mind to the radio than from your mind to the TV. I miss some of the one-on-one combats I enjoyed waging in Denver and Los Angeles radio. The team-against-team competition that exists in radio is something I really miss because of the inspiration and adrenalin that's created when you get a concert away from a competitor, have a better morning show or by just being the innovator... all those things were really fun and are missed. In radio, it was like flying a fighter plane. Now it's like I'm flying a bomber.

Your first programming gig was at KAZY Denver. How did that come about?

KAZY was an unbelievable experi-

ence. GM Bill Struck, who's now in Salt Lake City, just believed in me lock, stock and barrel. I'd been there for eight months as APD/Production Director and to my surprise, he kept a close eye on me. He built up a lot of trust in me, so when Trip Reeb went to 91X in San Diego, Bill pulled me into his office and said, "You're the Program Director—not interim PD, you're my programmer." I started off on such a high; I was not going to let him down.

KAZY basically came of age while I was there. It was the first FM Album Rock station in America, signing on in 1965. KAZY had this fabulous history, but it never enjoyed the success I thought it deserved. It was also in a very competitive market with five other Rock stations; that got me really fired up and made me want to excel. So I sized up the market and decided to make KAZY the Rock station, so we rocked the hardest.



I used those same programming principles at KROQ: I tightened the playlist, stayed true to the niche, did everything to get involved with the Rock lifestyle and forged a great relationship with Barry Fey, the biggest promoter in Denver. We became the concert authority in the market. The station was run in a very structured manner, but within that framework, I let the personalities be themselves and do what they wanted to do. That made the station more entertaining.

It was a pure adrenalin trip for me. I realized that if I could make this station work and beat the others in that market, I'd be able to program wherever I wanted. I was lucky enough to have a great staff and build a top-rated station. Then it was off to L.A.


...Where you hooked up with Trip Reeb

again, this time at KROQ. In this case, you took what was an ailing station and helped it become the preeminent Alternative station in the country again.

Put the Rock back into K-ROQ!!! Exactly what was the station like when you came on board and what did you do to fix it?

With [GM] Trib Reeb, I made wholesale changes from the onset. When he brought me in, it was understood the station needed to be set up, musically, for the '90s. It needed a great morning show. It needed to be fine-tuned in every single way. We did everything from deciding what color the van should be, what the logo was going to be, who was going to be on the airstaff, to the music position, the production... we looked at every aspect of the station in minute detail.

This came at a time when KROQ had taken a serious blow from Pirate



[KQLZ] Radio. Los Angeles was a sophisticated market with all these polished stations like KIIS-FM and KPWR. Then you had KROO, this thing from Pasadena that in its history had broadcast from a hotel room and all these other quirky things... just to stay on the air. It was really the underdog station in the market and came across, in truth, as being barely able to stay on the air. Then Pirate, which was so focused, came on at the time KROQ had experienced the tragedy of losing Rick Carroll. When the station lost a lot of its inspiration, Pirate took a bite out of KROQ. After I came in, we made the decision to go head-tohead with Pirate because they'd passed us in the ratings. So we did some counter-positioning on the air, attacked their playlist from the angle of them being a Bon Jovi station and attacked the fact they were editing songs and speeding them up on the air. They were pukers and had no respect for the music they were playing... all those sorts of things.

And like I said before, we started putting the Rock back into KROQ. KROQ musically had taken a Euro-Dance approach, high on the Depeche Mode, Erasure-type sound. So we went about adding the Cult, Cure, INXS sound to the station and really tightened the playlist up.

Given that KROQ was targeting the eccentricities of the market, how did you do research? Was a lot of it gut instinct?

A lot of it was instinct, knowing there was really a void and that the music wasn't really going in the direction the station had been in for awhile. We really felt it was obvious that KROQ needed to be a Rock station. Part of the beauty of KROQ was it was always perceived to be a Rock station with a lot of the fundamentals of Top 40 radio. We wanted to keep the exciting aspect of the Top 40 fundamentals while at the same time bring back the music credibility by putting on artists who made sense and mattered to people. Artists who played instruments, wrote good songs and produced good music. We quickly cleaned the music up and before we did anything else this change turned the ratings in our favor and also by putting discipline back into the station and the music.

Talk about bringing Kevin & Bean to KROQ.

We looked at a lot of people. Just by being KROQ, we could pretty much hire anybody to work for us if they wanted to move to L.A. and didn't have a contract that would prohibit it. So we looked at quite a few people and talked to a lot of the bigger morning shows out there. While doing this, we realized we were going to be going up against Mark & Brian, who were still young and hungry air talents. We were looking at hiring a show that would go up against them, Rick Dees, Scott Shannon and Jay Thomas.

Phoenix. The two of them were friends and had just done a mock morning show on the overnight show in San Francisco at Bill Richards' station KXXX. They did it for fun and I called them up, got the tape, listened to it and I definitely heard an automatic chemistry that we could work with. After talking with them about their material and concepts, I felt they would work well for the station so we put them in place as our morning show.

Discuss your role on their morning show as Mr. TV. How did the character come about on the KROQ morning show?

[Laughs] MTV is the first job I've ever had where I don't pull a somewhat

said, "Andy, you know what... just come by and visit us next time." [laughs] I think Mr. TV has retired. It was fun while it lasted and I really got to do a lot of fun things with them... among them, traveling all over the place, trying to track down the Loch Ness Monster in Scotland. Doing those things was a great time in my life. You have to hand it to Trip and KROQ for sticking with Kevin & Bean for the last four years. It proves that if you take the time, which most broadcasters today don't have, something you believe in pays off. Those two guys have really turned the corner in L.A.

Looking back, what key elements of radio programming have you been able to use when programming MTV?

Actually, when I came to MTV, I had to check a lot of my radio knowledge at the door. In many ways, the reverse of radio programming holds true. Here, we threw caution into the wind and went more current-based. Radio makes a short-term fix from a tight playlist of high-testing library material, which was part of what drove KROQ and KAZY. At MTV, I'm running 80% current and all-'90s. We can't afford to be passive, like many radio stations want to be. We have to be extremely active to keep our audience plugged into the Pop culture.

The other fundamental difference was that at KROQ and KAZY, we were very tight and focused on what we wanted to do. We wanted to be the preemenient station for our particular music niche. We focused on a particular hole in the market and filled it. If I went back to radio tomorrow, I'd do it that way again. At MTV, we're the last great Top 40 station that plays all these different kinds of music - and makes it work. You never know how good you have it programming a niche station until you hold a music meeting and can simply define what's eligible to be played by the niche. "Is it Alternative... okay, put it in the pile to think about." I can't weed it down that way at MTV. I've got to program Dr. Dre next to Aerosmith next to Blind Melon... and somehow make it work. I've got to tell my audience that diversity is a hipness, not a hindrance. I came here to keep it broad. (Next week: Andy Schuon on programming MTV.

Our show had to be good immediately and had to be hosted by someone or ones who were going to be aggressive, work the long hours it would take and be in the streets where they could be seen. We didn't want to hire someone in a Top-25 market who was really good but who was also really comfortable. This was going to be a ground level attack.

We also wanted a show that was different than anything that already existed in L.A. However, after a while we decided that instead of being different just for the sake of it, we'd simply put on the most entertaining morning show. So we hired Kevin & Bean Came from San Francisco and Kevin came from Phoenix.

Did they know one another before you put them together?

Yes. They had worked together at KZZP in Pheonix. Todd Fisher, who is in Baltimore, was good friends with Bean and had worked with Kevin in

regular on-air shift. I originally got into the business on-air; I like being an air personality. Kevin & Bean and I became really close friends during the first six months of their show through a lot of the planning on a day-to-day basis. Honestly, I probably spent too much time with the show. I can't really tell you how it began, but because I liked the comedy writing; we had discussed doing a trivia game at one point and I liked how lame and thoughtless the character of Mr. TV was. Then it just kind of happened. The character was a cross between a cartoon character and a pro wrestler and it was really fun to do. We started doing it and the response was so phenomenal, I ended up doing it every day for over a year.

Do Kevin & Bean still ask you to do the character for the show?

No. I'm so rusty now that when I came to L.A. about six or eight months ago and did Mr. TV, they

Another classic Rap production, "The Dawg" maintains his familiar turf with the next release from *Doggystyle*. Produced by master rapper Dr. Dre, this track will garner tremendous phone action in just a couple of spins. If you

are trying to strengthen your nighttime audience, this Hip-Hop jam hits the bullseye.

ETERNAL

"Stay"

(1ST AVENUE/EMI/ERG)

The buzz has been huge on the debut single from this funky diva quartet — so big that many majors are already spinning this soulful tune. These talented ladies have already taken off in their English homeland. A contagious groove, spiced with vintage harmonies, makes this masterpiece incredibly hip, yet still safe for Mainstream and Urban radio.

LITTLE TEXAS

"What Might Have Been" (WB)



Sure to blitz phones from all demographics, the first release from the much-heralded *The Spaghetti Incident?* album will quickly rocket to the forefront. Axl Rose's gentle but trademark raspy vocals are distinctive and searing in this power ballad, which should enjoy success at Top 40, Rock and even AC radio.

Produced by mega-stars Naughty By Nature, this smooth rhythmic groover follows their Top-10 smash, "Hey Mr. D.J.," nicely. FAST FORWARD

MEAT LOAF (MCA)

- Marvin Lee Aday was born on September 27, 1947 in Dallas.
- Loaf's first break in show business came when he starred in the Broadway production of "Hair." He subsequently appeared in a number of Broadway and off-Broadway productions, including the New York Shakespeare Festival In Central Park.
- His first significant entree in the music business was a brief fling as part of Stoney & Meat Loaf in 1971, whose lone single, "What You See Is What You Get," went as high as #71.
- In 1974, he starred as Eddie in the original Broadway production of "The Rocky Horror Picture Show" and later in the film version.
- In 1976, he sang lead vocals on Ted Nugent's Free-For-All album.



- In 1977, he met up with songwriter Jim Steinmam and they created the *Bat Out Of Hell* album. The theatrical Rock compositions "Two Out Of Three Ain't Bad," "Paradise By The Dashboard Light" and "You Took The Words Right Out Of My Mouth" help propel the album to classic status, as it has sold upwards of 25 million copies.
- The sudden fame took its toll on the singer, who literally quit the business for three years.
- In 1981, he returned with *Dead Ringer*, which featured a duet with Cher on "Dead Ringer For Love." It sold four million worldwide.
- Although subsequent albums didn't do much, Loaf also appeared in films like Americathon, Roadie and more recently, Wayne's World and Leap Of Faith.
- In April of '89, Loaf reunited with Steinman and they started working on what would eventually become *Bat Out Of Hell II: Back Into Hell.* The first single is "Rock And Roll Dreams Come Through."

CULTURE BEAT (550 MUSIC)

Tania Evans, vocals.

Peter Zweier, writer/instrumentalist/engineer. Nosie Katzmann, co-writer.

Jay Supremme, rapper.

• Culture Beat originally consisted of the latter three members, producer/DJ Torsten Fenslau and vocalist Lara E. All were European except for Supreme, who was a New Jersey rapper.

- Fenslau started this Greman group while he DJ'ed at the Frankfurt disco Dorian Gray. There, they tested out material for their future albums.
- Culture Beat started getting noticed three years ago with the European hit single, "Erdbeermund." They first hit U.S. clubs in 1990 with "I Like You" and "No Deeper Meaning."



- * After their debut American album, *Horizon*, they replaced Lara E. with Tania Evans, who they found in the London nightclub, Xenon. Londonborn of Jamaican parents in 1967, Tania fronted her own band in 1989 and also sang background vocals for Neneh Cherry.
- Their next album, Serenity, featured the current smash, "Mr. Vain."
- On November 6, 1993, Torsten Fenslau died in an automobile accident in Germany. The 29-year-old died from internal injuries after his Mercedes skidded on a wet road and crashed. His girlfriend, who was in the car with him, was only slightly injured.

RICHARD MARX (CAPITOL)

• Born and raised in the Chicago area, Marx got into the business at an extremely young age. By the time he was five years old, Marx was writing jingles professionally. Also during that time, he'd make his way to Rush Street to catch an eye and ear of what was going on in the Blues clubs.



- Moving to L.A., Marx landed a gig as a backup singer for Lionel Richie and he co-write a hit for Kenny Rogers, "What About Me."
- He landed a solo deal with Manhattan Records in 1987 and his career skyrocketed. Beginning

with the autobiographical "Don't Mean Nothing," Marx enjoyed four Top-10 hits from his debut album, helping it go triple-Platinum.

- The follow-up album, *Repeat Offender*, sold six million worldwide and boasted two chart-topping singles, "Satisfied" and "Right Here Waiting."
- In 1989, he married Cynthia Rhodes, lead singer for the band Animotion.
- To highlight his *Rush Street* album, Marx embarked on a "Rush-In, Rush-Out" tour where he performed five free concerts at or near airports in five different cities all in less than 24 hours.
- Marx has also performed at Farm Aid and several other benefit concerts for causes such as Pediatric AIDS, runaway children and cancer prevention.
- The debut single from his new album, *Paid Vacation*, is "Now And Forever." The song is dedicated to his wife.

COLOR ME BADD (GIANT/REPRISE)

• The members of Color Me Badd, representing a variety of racial and cultural backgrounds, hail from various parts of the country, from L.A. and Amarillo, TX to Camp Springs, MD and Oklahoma City. They first got together in 1987 in Okahoma City.



- They began as an a cappella group, inspired by the Levi's jeans 501 Blues commercials. Impromptu concerts in high school were banned because too many students would clog the halls. So they performed in choirs, on street corners and won many a talent show.
- Eventually, they'd audition for major music celebrities who'd pass through town on tour. They performed for Huey Lewis, Tony Toni Tone, the O'Jays and Bon Jovi, who even let them open for their concert.
- Robert "Kool" Bell of Kool & The Gang was so impressed that he befriended the group and helped set them up in New York City. It wasn't too long before they landed a recording contract with Giant Records.
- Their first major breakthrough was the song,
 "I Wanna Sex You Up," from the New Jack City soundtrack.
- Their latest single is "Choose," from their Gold album, *Time And Chance*.
