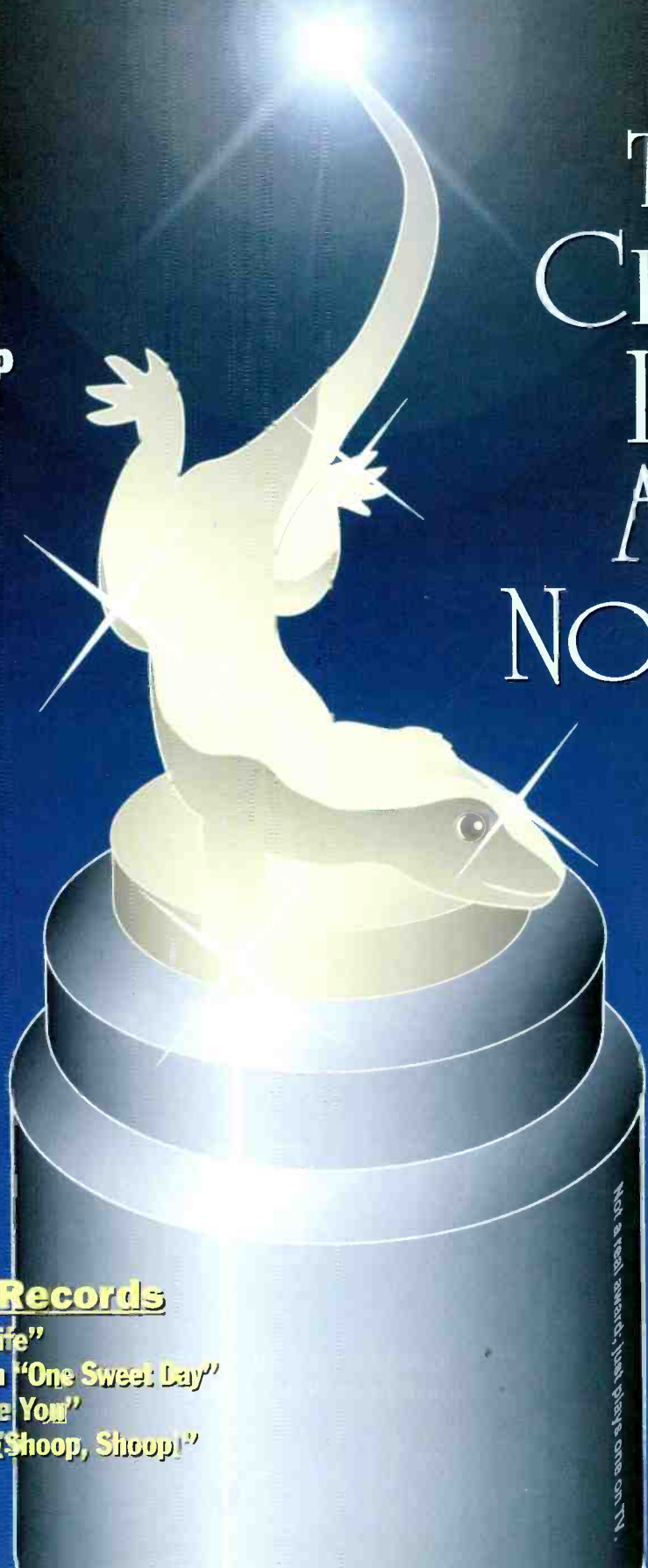

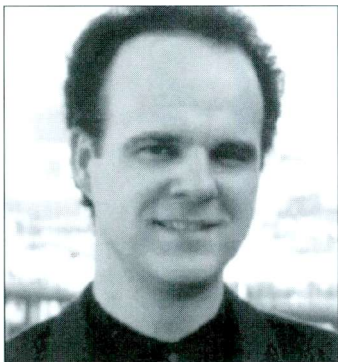
Major California A/C Radio Shake-Ups

Dave Shakes Leaving KIOI; Randy Lane Leaves KYSR

Two major names in the Adult hit radio world have left or are leaving their respective stations. KIOI "K101" San Francisco Operations Manager Dave Shakes has resigned, effective December 31. Down the coast, KYSR "Star 98.7" PD Randy Lane has left the station, effective immediately.

In San Francisco, the Shakes departure is being described as amicable by both sides. "I'm here to provide a smooth transition until a new PD can be found and will consult Evergreen on special projects," Shakes notes in the official statement. "Expect an announcement of my future plans soon."

Shakes left a successful stint as

PD of B96 Chicago to replace Keith Naftaly at KMEL San Francisco. He eventually was promoted to OM of both KMEL and K101 before con-

centrating his efforts on sister station K101. In the latest book, K101's ratings increased in 12+, 18-34 and 15-54. Reportedly, Zapoleon Media Strategies' Steve Wyrostok will oversee the daily operations until Shakes' successor is hired.

It's sheer coincidence that just a few days after Shakes decides to consider other career options, a PD vacancy at KYSR opens up. Randy Lane's sudden departure has left the programming duties in the hands of sister station KXEZ PD Dave Beasling. Star's new GM, Ken Christensen, is already considering contenders for the plum position.

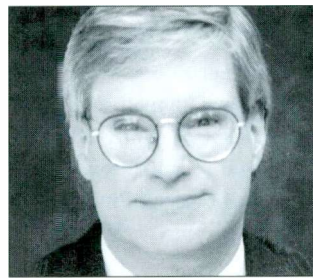

PRO-FM Names Chris Hamilton PD

Former WDJX PD Heads For Providence

Heritage Top 40 WPRO-FM Providence GM Mike Wheeler named veteran programmer Chris Hamilton as the station's new PD. Hamilton, who starts November 6, succeeds former PD David Simpson. On top of his programming duties, he will also host the afternoon-drive shift.

Hamilton brings plenty of experience to the table. Most recently, he served as PD at WDJX Louisville under the name of Chris Shebel. Before that, he was an air personality at KZZP

Spokane and WLS AM/FM Chicago.

"I'm confident that Chris can lead our station to the next level of greatness," states Wheeler. "He has the experience to continue the tradition of PRO-FM and lead our staff into the future."

"I'm excited about the opportunity to program a legendary station like PRO-FM," Hamilton says. "They've got a great history not only in the marketplace, but across the country. I look forward to adding to the history."

News Briefs

Atlantic Taxis Underground

The latest scheme in Atlantic Records' innovative guerrilla marketing campaign resurfaced when label personnel hit the New York City streets with sandwich boards that implored taxi drivers to listen to the label's underground low-power signal.

Led by VP Promotion Danny Buch and National Director Top 40 Monte Lipman, the team plugged the new record by Edwin McCain, which was being aired on the 90.5 FM signal continuously. Complimenting that campaign was a live performance by McCain. He played

on top of an Atlantic van, which was illegally parked on city street corners. **"LOVELINE" MOVES TO TV**

KROQ Los Angeles' late-night sex/relationship advice show, "Loveline," will soon be syndicated as a one-hour TV show through New World and Fox-TV. Its scheduled debut is set for the Fall of '96 and will air at either 11:30 pm or midnight.

The show will tweak the radio gabfest's structure of hosts and celebrity guests fielding questions from callers by adding a studio audience. Co-hosting the show are long-time regular Dr.

Drew Pinsky and Adam Carolla. Carolla is better known as "Mr. Burcham," the *Home Improvement* fix-it curmudgeon who regularly appears on the Kevin & Bean morning show. It's not officially known if he'll replace Riki Rachtman on the radio version.

Steve Leeds Catches A Rising Tide

Will Handle Promotion For Doug Morris' New Label

Doug Morris' new record company, Rising Tide Entertainment, landed the services of Steve Leeds to head up promotion and be involved in various aspects of the label's start-up.

Leeds, whose new position has no official job title, comes to the label from Island Records, where he served as VP Alternative/Video Promotion. "Daniel asked me to come in as his #2 to help him be the architect in structuring a brand new music company," Leeds explains. "I'll be involved in many areas of the company—not only promotion, but other departments, including marketing and sales.

"I'm leaving Island with the knowledge that it will probably have its best year yet," he continues. "I know I made a significant contribution. Johnny Barbis will always be a friend of mine. Chris Blackwell gave me the music and tools to work with...I'm leaving behind a lot of friends. Joe Riccitelli is now spear-

heading the promotion department, and I know he'll carry the torch. We've built a great promotion team and I'd be lying if I said it was easy to walk away. I was given an amazing challenge at Island by Chris Blackwell and John Barbis, but this was an opportunity knockin' at my door...and when something like this comes up, you should take a serious look at it. Rising Tide is great because it's like walking into an empty room...and

anything we do will be noted."

Leeds' entrance into the music business came when he helped start up Stiff Records' U.S. operations over a decade ago. He then became PD at the Newark-based music video channel, U68. He left to join MTV, where he helped launch MTV Brazil, MTV Asia and MTV International. He then joined PLG as Director Alternative Promotion & Video before being promoted to the Island VP post.

"Steve's experience and sensitivity with artists all over the media spectrum made the decision very easy," comments Rising Tide Exec. VP Daniel Glass. "He's truly a leader in the Alternative and Rock communities and has become another reason why great artists want to join Rising Tide. Ho-Hum's in the studio, the Zero Hour label is just beginning and Fleming & John are on their way. So it makes a lot of sense to get Steve's influence on this company right away."

Jay Albright Resigns From BP Consulting

Client Support Strong As He Undergoes Gender Correction

In a statement remarkable in its straightforward honesty and frankness, acclaimed Country consultant Jay Albright resigned from his GM post at the Broadcast Programming Consulting Group on November 1. He will continue to consult with certain BP Group clients as an independent contractor as he undergoes gender correction surgery.

In a heartening late development, concerns of him losing clients appear to be unfounded, as the early response has been near-unanimous in support and understanding.

Having the medical condition known as "gender dysphoria," Albright details that he was born with "the biological characteristics of one gender and the emotional and psychological characteristics of the other...as you can imagine, this creates an untenable conflict which can be fully resolved only by bringing the physical, emotional and psychological characteristics in congru-

ence through a process which culminates in transsexual surgery."

Four years ago, Albright began taking hormones, undergoing electrolysis and "living in the role of my correct gender away from the job...this has been the reason for changes in my appearance."

Acknowledging that some people would have difficulty accepting his transformation, Albright has decided to step down as GM, transferring his clients, at least for the time being, to BP's Ken Moultrie and L.J. Smith. After the surgery, he will work as an independent contractor for BP by the name of Jaye Albright. "[I] will still be available to my current clients in the same basis as before," he states. "I hope that a majority, if not all, of them decide they can still work with me."

"All who know and have worked with Jay through the years, whether as clients, co-workers or competitors, recognize his brilliance and talent as

a Country consultant," declares BP Consulting Pres./GM Edie Hilliard. "He has a unique ability to quickly grab and assess a competitive situation, great programming and promotion instincts and a long history of remarkable successes as a programmer and consultant. Having invested much in building his excellent reputation and track record, Jaye hopes and trusts that he will be able to continue in the consulting business."

The initial response from the industry has been supportive and encouraging. "We anticipated that most of our clients and friends in the industry would accept this change with good grace, but we were unprepared for the immediate outpouring of good wishes and expressions of confidence directed to Jaye and to us," Hilliard adds. "We're thrilled with these reactions and look forward to long, successful relationships with all of our clients."

ON THE LATIN TIP

Conference Conducted By Miguel Marino

Latinos make up the nation's largest minority population. Smart radio programmers in high-density Hispanic markets already know that and program accordingly. But how far do you take it? Is being "brown and proud" an Arbitron programming game or a radio station audience lifestyle decision? This week's Hotline spotlights some of the more "caliente" programmers who are down with their Latino core and up in ratings and revenue. The mis-used "Hispanic" term will only be used for Arbitron purposes; otherwise, we'll call it like they are: Latino listeners. Vamonos!

Give us the 4-1-1 on Latinos in your market. Musically, what can you get away with while maintaining loyalty from your core audience?

TREADWAY: According to Arbitron, San Antonio is 52% Hispanic. Our main competitor is a Tejano station. So, musically everything we do is Hispanic-driven, with a focus on Latin women 18-34. In general, Hispanics here have more traditional tastes that are different from those on the West Coast. Even the Anglos here have come to expect hearing the Spanish records we play. We'll play a Bryan Adams record when it's huge, but overall, we stay true to our Rhythmic format. We don't deal with Rap unless it's a huge Coolio or Bone Thugs-N-Harmony record, which we'll play after 7 pm.

MERCER: This is a Latino market, period. Over 70% of our listeners are Latino. Power 106 is the Top 40 station for Latinos between the ages of 12 and 25. Within the realm of Rhythmic music, we play what Latinos like, from Old School to Hip-Hop. We can't get away with trying to educate our listeners. For example, we love New York Hip-Hop and Reggae, but we'll never get our listeners to like it.

ST. JAMES: We can't dictate to our listeners because it comes back to haunt us. The census says L.A.'s Latino composition is over 40% and we're a great example of a Latino lifestyle radio station.

CANDELARIA: What's kept us #1 in El Paso for over three years is the fact that our listeners know what to expect when they turn on KPRR. Hispanics here are very Rhythm-driven, not only with our format but with all types of music. We brought back a Rhythm-based format with Freestyle and high-ener-

gy records, as well as the Hip-Hop songs. We mix in some ballads with core artists like Janet and Mariah. We can't get away with the Alternative titles; our listeners will tell us Hootie and Sheryl Crow don't belong on our radio station.

Being in a high-density Hispanic area, how do you play and win the Arbitron game? What programming basics can help you score extra cume and time-spent listening with weighted diaries?

TREADWAY: Since we've become a better Hispanic-focused 18-34 radio station, we've discovered our Tejano competitor has become a better-focused 35-64 radio station. In fact, we beat them in Hispanic women 25-34 by remaining true to our focus. We don't claim to be anything else. Since our core holds

onto songs longer, we're very non-aggressive with new songs. We have also created categories that force the biggest Hispanic Oldies, like "You're My Everything" by Santa Esmerelda and "Always and Forever" by Heatwave, to play on a regular basis. We do the same with special nighttime songs. We have no other special tricks; we just play the hits song after song.

MERCER: We laugh at the attitude some programmers have regarding the Arbitron "game." There is a game of sorts, but it's really about being the best radio station you can be and treating yourself like your #1 competitor. Programming to manipulate Arbitron is a short-term, inside-thinking approach.

ST. JAMES: We don't think where stopsets fall has any measurable difference on TSL or cume. Instead of getting caught up in an Arbitron game, we try to create a great sounding radio station—knowing that Arbitron numbers will follow a few months later. Extra cume and TSL is a byproduct of great radio.

CANDELARIA: Programmers should understand Arbitron's Maximiser to its fullest. The whole key to this Arbitron game is superserving those listeners with diaries. Get into Maximiser and click onto the high-density Hispanic profile and then analyze your hot zips. In my office, I have a "war board" where I highlight areas we need to superserve. We do direct-mail pieces and street hits as often as possible. During weeks six and seven of each book, we beef up our TV campaign and on Thursdays, diary day, we beef up on the money giveaways.

How deep do you get into the Latino lifestyle, in terms of marketing and on-air execution?

TREADWAY: We hit our streets everyday, hitting

not only grocery stores, but our hot zips as well, talking to our listeners. Charles Chavez, our MD, lives more in the nightclubs than at home. We also understand the #1 form of entertainment with our listeners is going to the movies. We send our staff out to talk to people as they come out of theatres. I think we can learn more from them at that moment than any other time or place in town.

MERCER: We roll deep! We are a mirror, a reflection of our listeners. We focus Latino, Latino, Latino!

ST. JAMES: Power 106 totally immerses itself in the Latino lifestyle, from the personalities and the presentation to the promotions and the music. Everything we do is geared towards the Latino listening audience. Even our research is focused 100% on Latinos.

CANDELARIA: There are no set rules. Basically your airstaff, the people executing your product, have to live the lifestyle of your listeners. They have to get out as much as possible, hitting the restaurants where the listeners go. If it's 117 degrees on a Saturday, we'll go to a swimming party and hand out free ice cream and Cokes. For Cinco de Mayo, we give away money because of how important that holiday is to the Hispanic culture. If we're down with our Hispanic listeners, we've got 'em for good.

Every Top 40 station needs a strong street presence. Has your station stepped this up because of your programming focus?

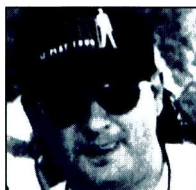
TREADWAY: Definitely. Our biggest form of marketing is one-on-one, shaking hands and kissing babies. If we don't have a special street plan for the day, we'll make sure Charles and I will go out in the van ourselves—even if it's just for lunch.

ST. JAMES: We are one of the first stations to implement street marketing. We even have a private company that does street marketing for us. It's really something tangible and positive for our listeners.

MERCER: Four years ago, when Power 106 became what it is now, we asked ourselves, "How can we adopt the feel, the attitude of our listeners?" The answer was to get out into the community. We marketed the station to the kids and, in turn, they told us how to be their favorite radio station. Additionally, it became apparent how we could use the station to help the community and positively affect our listeners. Not only do we develop strong images for community service, but the staff has something more than just winning the radio game to be proud of. Let's face it—being a Hip-Hop station in an urban area with lots of

violence can be tough. Hands down, Power 106 does a better job with street marketing than any other station I've seen, and we do Hip-Hop better than any concert or club promoter.

CANDELARIA: Yes, everybody can play the same records, but in a heated radio battle, it's what you do in between the records that'll matter the most. We continually think of ways to get into the listener's head and street presence is a very big part of it. We look for new ways to give away prizes, like our "Weapons For Jams," where we gave away Boyz II

Men tickets to individuals who handed in their firearms. This gave us three to four days of newspaper and TV coverage. Our street presence allows us to make even more of a difference in our community.

How do you superserve your P-1 Latino audience without alienating your P-2s and P-3s? Is it even a concern?

TREADWAY: Again, we are very fortunate to have Anglos who accept our P-1, Hispanic lifestyle. We're also lucky to not have a direct competitor forcing us to be early on certain songs.

ST. JAMES: It's not a concern. Take care of your P-1s and the rest will fall into place. Let me quote Rick Cummings, who said in a *Network 40* interview, "Narrow focus equals broad results." We are a living example of that.

MERCER: The broader you focus, the more people you try to attract, the more you dilute your product and your results.

CANDELARIA: I'm learning this every day. For the first time, I have a direct competitor, so we've adjusted our research to call-out our P-2s that could be

their P-1s. We continue to superserve our P-1, 18-34 audience, but now we also research females 18-45, matching the ethnic breakdown of our city. Promotionally, we gear ourselves to all females while still recognizing the Hispanic lifestyle. Musically our female focus is #1 and we daypart appropriately to keep it that way.

Any more words of wisdom to other programmers who have the same focus?

TREADWAY: You've got to be who you are. Lots of "white" GMs and suits can come in and say who we need to be. I feel we are what Steve Smith is to his audience in New York. Some people can claim we're Hot A/C during the day and a Dance station at night, but KTFM is what the Hispanics in this market want, plain and simple. Let the people decide what your radio should play...then play it over and over. If a song is a power to your listeners, it should be a power on your radio station.

ST. JAMES: If there's another station that sounds like us, please give us a call because we'd love to talk to you! We can't find anyone like us. I think it's fair to say we are the world's *only* major-market 15-24, Latino Hip-Hop station. Remember, we are different than other Hip-Hop stations because our Hip-Hop audience loves Dance music.

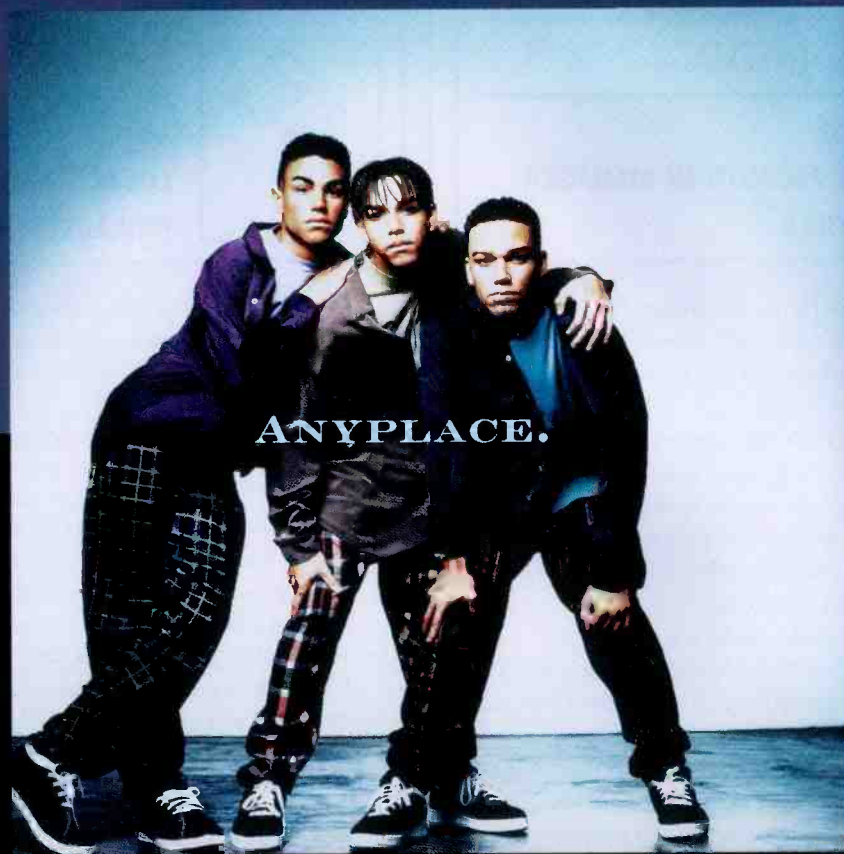
MERCER: As for words of wisdom, you really need to know your listeners. Hold focus groups if you can afford them; if you can't, go find out on your own. This format changes quickly and quietly, so unless you're close to your consumer you won't see that happen. Also don't get too married to what you are. Even though Power 106 is a Hip-Hop station, we can't be the same station Hot 97 is in New York. They're in a different region with a different audience. We have to remain flexible enough to change with our audience.

CANDELARIA: Don't be afraid to get out and do things you've never done before because it's the little things that count. There may be rules in radio, but you can change them based on what your listeners tell you. Don't do something because *you* feel it's right, do it because your P-1 Hispanic listeners told you to do it. Playing a cruising classic from the Delfonics or Tierra may not fit Top 40 radio, but you need to be a Top 40 radio station for your market and your Hispanic audience. ▀

Reprise's Promotion Man-Of-The-Year has been breaking Pop/Rock records in the heart of Country music for over a decade. Bill is successful because he's able to find and convey a certain warmth and peace in a high-pressure, intense business.

Why did you first decide to get into record promotion?

I really didn't decide to get into record promotion. I wanted to work for Reprise Records and that's the only job they'd give me. The opportunity to get up every morning and look forward to talking to people about music is a great privilege. Ten years ago, I interned for the Warners local in Nashville. Gene Dries, and I decided I wanted to be involved with Russ Thyret and the gang.

Describe your region in terms of the stations you work.

I work Top 40, Rock, Alternative, A/C and AAA with stations in the upper Southeast—Tennessee, Arkansas, Mississippi and parts of Kentucky and Indiana.

Do you have a specific strategy to work records?

My strategy for each programmer is different. The best strategy is to set up the record in advance. I have all my information and promotional ideas ready. I have my national staff back me up...I have the independent promoter back me up...and the receptionist, etc.

What is the wildest promotion you've ever done for airplay?

I hear about wild horse riding and sleeping on radio stations' front lawns; I've never done anything like that. I go in and get the record, but I can't think of anything wild. Yet trust me, rabbits have been pulled out of hats.

What is the best excuse for a drop or not adding a record you've ever heard?

"I can't sit down and listen to new stuff because I have hemorrhoids."

How do you deal with rejection...in terms of not getting your records added?

In the beginning, I didn't take it very well. I took it personally because I love music so much and I wanted to shine for my company. As time went on, I learned that I couldn't carry that around. I like my programming friends too much to let one record get in the way of our friendship. Ten years from now, I won't remember what the record was, but I will remember and retain a friendship.

How do you deal with direct-format competition as far as exclusive releases?

We have a very fair policy at Reprise that has trickled down from our warmhearted leaders, Russ Thyret, Howie Klein and Rich Fitzgerald: We don't give exclusives. I think I can speak for them when I say that we feel music isn't about that.

What do you like best about your job?

There are so many levels of *best*. I love working with the people here. I love our music and artists, and I like forming relationships with PDs and industry people. When that friendship bleeds into a personal level, you have a friend for life. Maybe most of all, I enjoy having a mentor at the head of our company like Russ Thyret.



FRED SHADE

**A&M
LOCAL PROMOTION MANAGER
PHILADELPHIA**

Ask Fred why he's called, "The Sixth Gin Blossom" and he answers, "They are my brothers from different mothers." Raised on a farm and on Country music, Fred has become A&M's point man in Pennsylvania in less than three years on the job.

Why did you first decide to get into record promotion?

When I was growing up, my father would never listen to *anything* but Country music. I figured if I can't decide what's on the radio here, I'll decide on the music before it gets on the radio. That's how I got into my short stint in college radio. I learned about record companies and made the natural transition.

Describe your region in terms of the stations you work.

Pennsylvania, Binghamton, some of West Virginia, Southern Jersey. As far as formats go, as a Promotion Manager for A&M, we wear every hat.

Do you have a specific strategy to work records?

The people I work with in radio are the *best*. I swear this region has the lowest asshole-per-capita rate around! I work records based on the sound of the music and the sound of the radio station. I connect the dots. It's not a cookie-cutter, one-record-fits-all kind of thing... but eventually they do.

What is the best excuse for a drop or not adding a record you've ever heard?

The PD said, "My morning guy flipped out and started chasing the rest of the staff at their house, so I've been on the phone with lawyers all day and haven't had time to think about it." It sounds like a great TV mini-series.

How do you deal with rejection...in terms of not getting your records added?

I have a very positive attitude. I really believe that "no" is not a permanent answer. If a person has the ability to say no, they also have the ability to say yes. No doesn't mean "I don't like you," "I don't like the artist" or "I don't like the song." It means "Not this week." I never take it personally. It just motivates me for the next week.

How easy is it to promote records you don't especially like or ones that you think are not hits?

I have been very fortunate to find a positive element in every song. There is a long string of people who believed in a particular song before it gets to me. There is no "I" in team but there is in A & M.

What's the best way to get into a station that has a PD change?

Not too long ago, I sent a letter to a new PD on how to speak Pittsburgh-ese. It turned out to be really funny. I know that town really well, so I included all the Pennsylvania nuances to it.

What do you like best about your job?

With bands like the Gin Blossoms and artists like Sheryl Crow, it's amazing to be a part of their growth and development as professionals. As far as working for A&M, I'll follow Rick Stone to the gates of hell; I really enjoy sharing my morning coffee with Chuck Bliziotis. Lori Anderson is one of the greatest, warmest people I know; she definitely keeps me on my toes. Patrick O'Conner is the one who brought me into the farm team and who helped me with a lot of my training.

• Safe Toys And Gifts Month

A reminder for parents to give their kids guns with training holsters. Contact: Marita Gomez (800) 331-2020.

Go to client toy store, have jocks be product testers. Kids can shoot/bang and poke toys at jock and if he goes, "Ow!" they're unsafe....Give away vibrators with condoms....Have jocks dress up as Mighty Morphin Power Poets or MM Park Rangers.

• Mitten Tree Kick-Off Ceremony

Bash inaugurates drive to collect mittens and gloves for needy in Baltimore. Contact: (410) 396-9177.

Do same in your market, or get some made with station logo on them and give them away to homeless—save a few hundred pairs for listeners....Do same thing with scarves, knit caps and boots.

• Cowboy Christmas (1-3)

Wickenburg, AZ gathering of cowboy poets and singers. Contact: (602) 684-5479.

Snow-cowboy making contest....Give away call-lettered cowboy hats with antlers....Make up and sell cowboy snow boots....Hold an ice rodeo, where you lasso a pig or something wearing cowboy boots.

• Bachelor Bar (2-3)

As part of the Alaskan Bachelor Society Wilderness Woman Contest, eligible bachelors are auctioned off for drinks with highest-bidding women. *Big question:* Who gets the drinks? Contact: (907) 733-2423.

Have jocks "be" Santa and Mrs. Claus so kids can call in their Xmas wishes....Have jocks, as Santa, call a phone sex line—and ask them what they'd like for the holidays....Initiate a Psychic Santa line, where Santa predicts what gifts callers will get.

• "Bob Barker, Come Whenever You Can!"

Host of *The Price Is Right* and model sex toy is 71.

Stage own version of game show on air, using client products as prizes....Make Barker snap; send him love letters and sign it from Dian Parkinson....Stage "The Age Is Right Game," where people guess Barker and music stars' ages for prizes.

• Santa Lucia Day

Swedish festival of lights, where hotels have a young girl (Lucia) attired in a long, white flowing gown, serving guests coffee and saffron buns early in the morning.

Send interns (or better yet, male jocks) to hotels and other high-traffic areas, dressed as Lucia to serve them coffee and donuts....Hold a Ms. Santa Lucia pageant, who serves the best coffee and has the stickiest buns (watch it there!).

- With their new self-titled album, the band is gearing up for two months of dates opening for Van Halen.
- The latest track off the album is "The World I Know," about extremes of good and bad in life.



DEF LEPPARD (MERCURY)

- Rick Allen, drums. • Rick Savage, bass. • Phil Collen, guitar. • Vivian Campbell, guitar. • Joe Elliott, vocals.
- Def Leppard, originally called Deaf Leopard, first rehearsed in a spoon factory in Bramall Lane, Sheffield.
- The original members were Joe Elliott, Rick Savage, Pete Willis and Tony Kenning. Six friends saw their first gig—a six-song set with covers of Bowie and Thin Lizzy.
- One year later, Steve Clark joined the band. They played their first public gig at Westfield School, Sheffield.
- In 1979, drummer Rick Allen joined Def Leppard full-time. Their first recording, *The Def Leppard EP*, picked up some radio play and landed them a deal with Mercury.
- In '88, Steve Clark died after mixing alcohol with painkillers he took after breaking three ribs earlier that year.
- They've put out a succession of multi-Platinum albums: *Pyromania*, *Hysteria*, *Adrenalize*, *Retro Active*.
- Def Leppard's latest album is *Vault*, a greatest-hits effort with the new song, "When Love & Hate Collide."

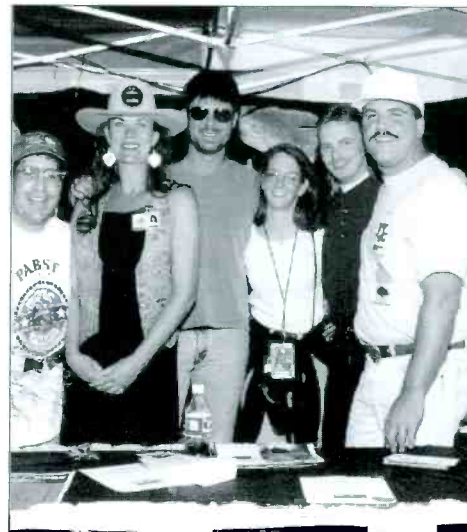
