Mariah Carey's #1 Sweet Weeks

Second Single Replaces "Fantasy" As PPW Leader

Mariah Carey continued her record-breaking assault on radio when her latest single, "One Sweet Day," the collaboration with Boyz II Men, replaced her debut single, "Fantasy," as the most-played record in the country.

Last week, she became the first artist to have two Top-10 singles in the PPW era. Now, she can boast about being the only artist to ever replace her own hit at #1. Last week's chart-topper, "Fantasy," falls to #4 after a nine-week reign.

What's more, "One Sweet Day" is #1 on the Crossover chart (also re-

placing "Fantasy," which falls to #2) and rose 6*-3* on the A/C chart. Considering its rate of increased spins (and the fact that the two songs ahead of it have peaked), expect to see Carey top all three charts next week.

And if that's not enough, "One Sweet Day" was the most-requested record for the second week in a row and the hottest record on the Mainstream chart (Accelerated Airplay) for a record four consecutive weeks. That means the song could stay on top of the PPW mountain well into the new year—and possibly surpass "Fantasy's" nine-week stay.

Of course, there are a variety of other hits in several formats. In Top 40, Natalie Merchant's "Wonder" and The Beatles' "Free As A Bird" switched places to finish first and second, respectively, as the most-added records last week. The Beatles' reunion was the second-hottest record in the format, increasing in spins by 1,418 plays. Merchant's second solo single was #5 Accelerated Airplay.

The surprise story has to be Everything But The Girl's "Missing." Originally released last year, its second life has turned it into a bonafide smash. It was #4 Most Added *and* Accelerated

Airplay. Other records to watch: Madonna's "You'll See" (#5 on the Mainstream PPW chart), Seal's "Don't Cry" (#5 Most Added, #6 Accelerated Airplay) and Big Mountain's "Get Together" (#6 Most Added, #3 Accelerated Airplay).

In other formats:

• The Smashing Pumpkins have the out-and-out "event" record at Alternative radio, as it boasts two bulleted hits in the top seven. "Bullet With Butterfly Wings" is #2 and "1979" is #7 and #1 Accelerated Airplay. Watch out for the new Pearl Jam record "I Got Id.," a collabora-

tion with Neil Young, which was the most-added record last week.

• Records to watch in Crossover are Tha Dogg Pound's "Let's Play House" (#1 Accelerated Airplay, #3 Most Added), The Tony Rich Project's "Nobody Knows" (#2 Accelerated Airplay, #1 Most Added) and L.L. Cool J featuring Boyz II Men with "Hey Lover" (#7 on the Crossover chart, #3 Accelerated Airplay).

• The Beatles' "Free As A Bird" was #1 Most Added and #1 Accelerated Airplay for a second week in a row at A/C. It rocketed from 35*-18* on the A/C PPW chart. Other hot disks on the format include Madonna's "You'll See" (#6 on the chart, #2 Accelerated Airplay) and Michael Bolton's "A Love So Beautiful" (#3 Accelerated Airplay, #2 Most Added).

• Alan Jackson's "Tall, Tall Trees" enjoyed its second week atop the Country PPW chart. Songs to keep an eye on include Joe Diffie's "Bigger Than The Beatles" (#1 Accelerated Airplay, #1 Hot Picks), Martina McBride's "Wild Angels" (#2 Most Added, #2 Hot Picks) and Shania Twain's "(If You're Not In It For Love) I'm Outta Here" (#2 Accelerated Airplay, #3 Hot Picks).

Elektra Names Bill Pfordresher VP Promotion

23-Year Industry Vet Leaves Same Post At Zoo

Elektra Entertainment Group Sr. VP Promotion Greg Thompson bolstered his department with the hiring of long-time industry veteran Bill Pfordresher as VP Promotion. He's based in the Group's New York headquarters.

Pfordresher's record industry career started in 1972 when he was hired as a local promotion assistant for Record Merchandising. It wasn't too long before he decided to move over to the label side of the business. Pfordresher climbed the corporate ladder to land top-level executive positions such as VP Pop Promotion for Curb Records in 1991 and, most

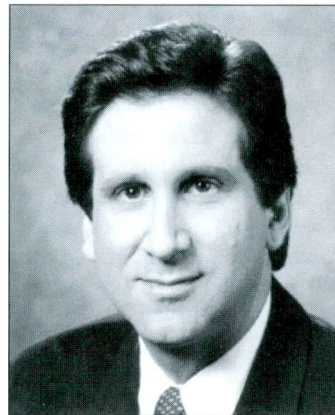
of the conglomerate, overseeing the company's major commercial transactions, the development of new businesses and the ongoing international expansion program.

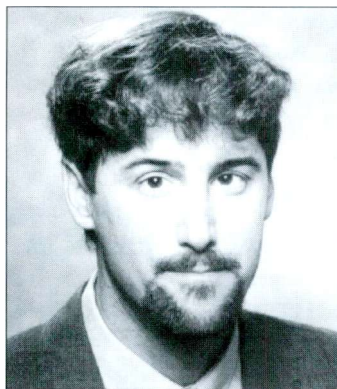
Jay Boberg Appointed President Of MCA Records

Former I.R.S. Records And MCA Publishing Head Moves Up

Cutting-edge executive Jay Boberg was appointed President of MCA Records. Based in Los Angeles, he will oversee all of the label's operations.

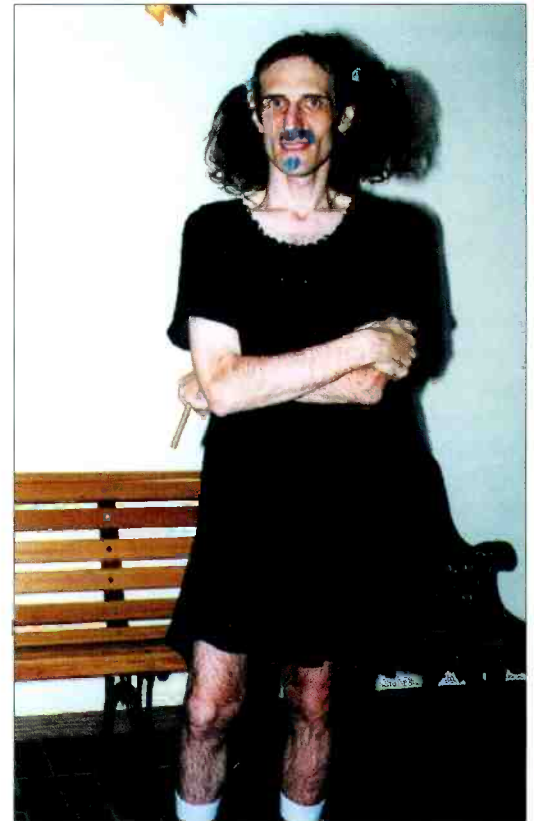

Come together, right now, over me. The Beatles documentary on ABC garnered a huge audience. Interviews by and about The Beatles were on every national television newscast, the local news and just about every talk show in syndication. *Time*, *Newsweek*, *Rolling Stone*, *People* and every newspaper in America covered the story of The Beatles releasing a new CD with feature articles. Water cooler conversation centered around The Beatles just like it did decades before when the group released a new record. The CD set a single-day sales record. It could set the all-time first week sales record. *This* from a double-CD.

And some Mainstream Top 40 stations didn't add the new record, "Free As A Bird."

Am I missing something here?

Countless Editorials, convention panel debates, professional and casual conversations about programming center on the lack of excitement in radio today. Programmers are quick to stand up and pontificate about the importance of locking in with the lifestyle of the audience. Programmers cite promotions and public affairs topics that are familiar to their audience as the important factor in focusing on their core.

Here is an absolute lock...something totally contemporary that the entire world is talking about...something positive...not wars or murders or terrorists or gangs...but a positive *musical* experience that some programmers chose to ignore.

I'm sorry, I just don't get it.

Now I know that those of you who added the record are nodding your heads in agreement. And I also know that those who didn't add the record are saying I don't know what I'm talking about. You're saying that I don't program a radio station, that I don't understand, that if I was behind the programming desk, my opinions might be different.

Let me expound.

There is absolutely, positively no reason in the world for any Mainstream Top 40 station in the world not to play The Beatles' "Free As A Bird." Period.

There is not one person in America who wasn't insulated from the hype that preceded the documentary and the subsequent release of the

single. There is not one person who wasn't interested in hearing what the song sounded like.

Forget, for a moment, whether or not the single is a bonafide hit. Don't weigh your decision to add the record on whether or not the musical integrity of the track fits perfectly within your flow or format. The simple fact is that everyone is interested in hearing the song. Not one person would tune out when the song was played. Everyone wants to hear what it sounds like...to decide for themselves whether or not the sound lives up to the hype.

There is no down side.

Play the record for a while. Daypart it in mornings and middays if you must. Then, after you play the record a few times, let your audience decide whether or not they want to hear it again.

The hype has already been created. All you have to do is join in. Mainstream Top 40 stations across the country are falling all over themselves trying to lock into the 25-54 year-old-demos. Is there a 25-54 year-old person out there who isn't interested in hearing the new Beatles song?

Give me a break.

Granted, if you are programming to a specific ethnic group, you've got a reason. I'm not sure that a Hispanic Dance station should jump right on that Beatles release. Or an Urban station station. But if you're a Mainstream Top 40 station, what is the reasoning behind *not* playing "Free As A Bird?" Please help me out. I just don't understand.

Is it because, as a programmer, you're so positive that you can pick all of the hits all of the time

that you make these decisions for your audience? So you're telling me that every song you've ever added to your playlist in your career has been a bonafide smash? And, of course, you never missed one either, did you?

Objective decisions about subjective subjects like music are very dangerous. They're more than dangerous; they make for boring radio.

It seems that all too often, programmers find reasons not to do something, rather than search for reasons to make positive, innovative decisions. All of us are responsible for putting music in the box it is in today. We seem to want more of the same, rather than to seek out a different sound that might be the trend of the future.

If The Beatles' earlier music had been held to such stringent rules, we would never have enjoyed hearing the innovative, different, revolutionary songs and albums that The Beatles made. *Rubber Soul* would never have seen the light of day. (What? Play cuts off an album with no single release? The sound doesn't fit what is being played on radio across the country. I think I'll pass.) *Sgt. Pepper's Lonely Heart's Club Band*? No shot. (A concept album? What is a concept album? I don't know. I think I'll pass.) *Magical Mystery Tour*? No way. (Another concept? I don't understand. They've got the London Philharmonic Orchestra in there. I can't play that.) And the *White Album*? Puleeze. (There are unfinished tracks on this thing. There are different arrangements. It's another album without a single. Hell, there isn't even a name on this album. I can't play this thing! How will I know which cuts to program? It's much too Underground.)

I am a radio programmer. I understand, more than anyone else in our industry, the pressures that go with the job. But I also know that we, as programmers, have to push the envelope, now more than ever before, or the envelope will soon be sealed and we won't have any other way to go.


Research and consultants have bred a type of radio that is too safe...too cookie-cutter...too boring. As programmers, we must find moments that we can turn into magic. There aren't a lot of them. When we do find something positive...something contemporary...doesn't it make sense for us to ride it until the tank runs dry?

Beatles giveaways, Beatles promotions, Beatles trivia...aren't these elements that our entire audience would enjoy...*especially* with all of the hype that was generated by the TV documentary and other media? Isn't this a natural?

And, in the end, the love you take is equal to the love you make. ▣

Melissa Etheridge

No Secret Anymore

INTERVIEW BY JIM NELSON

Well, the cat's out of the bag now. The secret's been leaked. What we all suspected for years about Melissa Etheridge was confirmed with the release of 1993's *Yes I Am*: Melissa is capable of far more than the "comfortable" confines of her fan base of a million.

With *Yes I Am* and its three Top-10 singles, its two Grammy nominations (and one award), its two-year-plus stay in the national sales charts (so far) and its more than five million copies sold, Melissa has exceeded the lofty sales of Platinum-sellers Melissa Etheridge and Brave And Crazy and the nearly-Platinum *Never Enough*. Now, with the new album's debut single simultaneously charting in the Top 40, Album Rock, Adult Rock, and Alternative Radio airplay charts on top of heavy video exposure, Melissa has shattered whatever glass ceiling that was trapping her. She's entered the very exclusive, high-rent district of superstardom.

Does the real-life feeling of being a multi-Platinum artist meet what it was in your dreams?

You don't dream about the real stuff. You dream that all your problems will be solved, but of course, they're not. There's a bunch of new problems. Things get great and you have this feeling of success and confidence, but there's some responsibility with that, so I just went back in and made another album so that I would sort of feel like I'm still moving ahead and not stopping."

Let's do a little free-word association...Bruce Springsteen.

Oh man, one of the high points of this year was singing with him. He was such an in-

fluence and an idol and a hero of mine...someone I crafted my career like. I had such respect for him and his decisions that getting to know him this year has been so exciting. And have him come and sing with me just blew my mind."

Five million.

A very, very large number. Almost incomprehensible. It's just really a good feeling, you know? It feels good to think that that many people thought that much of my music to plunk down a good hunk of change to bring it into their lives.

Woodstock and Janis Joplin.

I'm glad I went there, I'm glad I did it, I'm glad I paid tribute to Joplin. It was finally an opportunity to do so with-



out being obvious, although the Joplin comparison is obvious. I just wanted to be able to do it in a tribute.

The Rock and Roll Hall of Fame.

Well, inducting Janis into the Hall of Fame was a special moment for me. I always felt she belonged there and I wanted her to get her due. There's just not enough women in there, or in the history of Rock N' Roll, *period*, and it was important for me to do that. I really wanted to be the one to do it.

And then performing at the concert at the opening of it was such a trip. It was well enough standing on the side, watching James Brown, thinking, "Good Lord, there's James Brown,"

but I was standing with Bob Dylan and Bruce Springsteen! It was really a fun time.

The cover of *Rolling Stone*.

A dream come true, a goal achieved. A marker that told me where my career was. It really meant something.

Stardom vs. privacy...and is it worth it?

A lesson to learn. I'm still finding new things out about that. Is it all worth it? I'm very accessible, but if I felt that it was hurting my private life, I would tune it down.

Twelve-string guitars, both acoustic and electric.

Makes more noise than the others. That's why I always played 'em. I first started playing a 12-string acoustic when I was playing solo because it felt

like there was more behind me and I just haven't stopped. It's just my sound now, I guess.

MTV and VH1.

VH1 is a comfortable chair. MTV is new shoes.

Alternative Radio.

I always had a hard time because I enjoyed listening to Alternative radio. I always listened to KROQ. Although I didn't feel like I was terribly on the fringe as a record listener, this was just *new* music and I thought that other radio stations had stopped moving forward. [The music on Alternative Radio stations] was new and fresh and exciting and full of energy and soul and spirit—what I always liked in music.

Then it was always like, "Okay, why [can't] I get played on Alternative stations? Is it age? Is it that I've had four albums out so I must not be 'Alternative?'" I couldn't understand what the rules were and where they were drawing the lines. Now, with this record being embraced by what they call Alternative radio, I think the word has taken a new definition. I don't think it's Alternative music, but it is the sort of programming that I enjoy listening to.

When I was driving to your concert at the Greek Theater in June of 1994, O.J.

Simpson was driving on the 405 freeway, sort of evading a bunch of police officers. So, your thoughts on O.J. Simpson.

On that fateful night. I had to go onstage not knowing what was happening...and the Greek Theater was half-full because half the people were just sitting in their cars listening to the radio, or sitting at home. It was really amazing. I've always felt attached to it because of that. I remember that night, and it affected me so deeply. Unfortunately, it was so much more than a murder trial, for justice's sake and for the fami-

lies that lost their loved ones. I think in the future, we will look back and see that it was a pivotal point, a changing point for our justice system, for our own racial feelings and feelings of tolerance. Our society in general has to take a real hard look at ourselves.

What's the biggest aspect that gets overlooked when people interview you?

uh...you have to guess from now on."

And thoughts on probably the darkest song you've ever written: "I Could Have Been You?"

It was one of the songs that you finish writing and go, "Geez, where did that come from?" And it came so fast, it was written in one day. John Shanks, my guitar player, wrote

"Yes, each song is a part of me and they all come from a real, honest place, but I'm not going to tell you what all of them are about."

There really is no aspect that they have missed. They've covered everything from how I play a guitar to my personal, private sexual life. There's really not anything that has been overlooked.

Your long-time fans realize that there's a certain part of you in every one of your songs. So what are we to make of the song "Unusual Kiss?"

Well, I'll tell you what. With this album I'm going to start something new where I say, "Yes, each of these songs is a part of me, each of these songs comes from a real and honest place, but I'm not gonna tell you what it's about."

There's just too bright of a light being shown upon my personal life that it's like, "Uh-

the music. He was actually playing me something else, and the tape player happened to rewind too far and I said, "Oh my God, what is that?" "Oh, it's just something I'm working on." I said, "It's mine," and I grabbed the tape and went off and wrote a song to it, because it touched me. There was something in the music that was disturbing and strange, and it touched that part of me and opened up something that I hadn't been able to open up before. I was able to bring out my issues of intolerance and bigotry and these things that I don't know where to put or how to say...things that truly make me angry. It's a part of me I need to open, figure out more of and put more out.

"This War Is Over."

"I wrote that song very simply. It came from one part of me, a part of letting go, a part of coming against my fears and going through them, instead of battling them—even into the fear of death, and the whole process of death and not to fight these things.

It's a terribly simple song, and I enjoyed arranging it with the band. It sort of freed them up from maybe the first thing they would do; they really came in the back door with the arrangement. It's really one of my favorite things to listen to.

Your biggest secret.

I don't have any. I guess "Unusual Kiss" is my biggest secret, now. I mean, you just don't want everybody knowing everything about you. I have to keep some things private, but there isn't any terribly horrible, big, private secret that I've got. I'm just not that good at hiding things.

Your Little Secret, as both the album title and the first single.

The song is so different for me, because it's the first time I'm standing there looking at someone else going, "I know what you're feeling, I used to do just what you're doing," and being drawn in by that energy and that sort of lustful game playing that's always so complementary.

[I wanted] to make this the title of the album because I remember reading in some online something, one person saying to another, "Melissa Etheridge has really gotten famous and popular and successful now...she's no longer our little secret." So I thought, "You know what? I'm gonna put an album out called *You're Little Secret*, 'cause no, I'm not anymore." ▀

NEW YEAR'S EVE PARTIES TO-GO

For those who are too busy or can't make a New Year's Eve party, put together a "New Year's Eve Party Pack" that contains a small bottle of sparkling cider, a plastic bag of confetti, a hat and horn, a couple of Alka Seltzers, a video of a New Year's-ish movie, station junk and a guide to the Bowl games. Give them to those with the "saddest sack" tales.

COST: MINIMAL.

RETURN: COLLECTIBLE ITEM FOR CORE FANS. MAKES FOR SOME NICE WARM & FUZZY RADIO, TOO.

NEW YEAR'S EVE-CARE

Young parent listeners can now go to their New Year's Eve bashes guilt-free—and save babysitting money—by being able to drop off their toddlers at station-sponsored remote "New Year's Eve-Care" centers. Have "1995" sashes with little hats and party favors for the kiddies. Take pictures and do a remote there so the rugrats can wish "Happy New Year" on-air, which can also be used later for drop-ins.

COST: MINIMAL FOR BABYSITTING STAFF AND KIDS' PARTY PARAPHERNALIA.

RETURN: HUGE APPEAL TO TARGET DEMO LISTENERS. ALSO A WARM & FUZZY REMOTE THAT MAKES GREAT DROP-INS AND EVEN TV SPOTS.

"NO BOWL" PARADE

On a weekend day preceding New Year's stage your own "No Bowl" parade. Choose a theme, be it topical or nonsensical, such as a "Salute To Marshmallows." Invite local celebrities and touring artists; they'll be driven by listeners who have the most creatively decorated cars (including the station's calls). Others who won karaoke contest get to sing from flatbed trucks. For a "good cause" hook, encourage people to bring cans for a local food bank. If it's really cold, hold it in a mall or large warehouse and use golf carts instead.

COST: THE COST OF A PARADE PERMIT; THE REST SHOULD BE TRADED OUT.

RETURN: BUILDS TRAFFIC IN MALLS, RAISES STATIONS PROFILE BOTH AS THE CREATOR OF WHAT CAN BECOME AN ANNUAL CITY EVENT...AND FOR HELPING A GOOD CAUSE.

"READ OUR LIPS"

NEW YEAR'S RESOLUTIONS

For the week between Christmas and New Year's, have the air staff make resolutions on-air. Such as: "play at least five songs in a row," to "not mention O.J. Simpson's name on air," "not mispronounce a band's name," "never give a prize to the 69th caller" or "call another jock a certain nickname." A list of the resolutions should be printed on leaflets and distributed throughout the market via client locations. Then, over the course of the next month, have the jocks break a resolution here or there. The first caller to notice it, wins.

COST: PRIZES AND PRINTING COST SHOULD BE TRADED OUT.

RETURN: NOVEL WAY TO BUILD CUME AND ESPECIALLY TSL OVER A PERIOD OF TIME. ALSO, BROKEN RESOLUTIONS ARE A LIVELY TOPIC FOR BANTER AMONG JOCKS.

"POP YOUR CORK"

A quickie phoner contest: Nth callers will hear if their "bottle of champagne" has any pop. The jock opens it on-air; if it "pops," party sounds are heard and the caller wins a prize. If a "pfffft!" is heard, the caller gets some Alka-Seltzer.

COST: MINIMAL FOR ALKA SELTZER AND STATION MERCHANDISE.

RETURN: ENTERTAINING, TOPICAL BIT.

"CONFETTI-PALOOZA"

At a high-traffic remote on New Year's Day, qualified listeners enter a roped off area that has a 20-foot-high mountain of confetti. Hidden in the midst of that are concert tickets, CDs and other prizes. After a countdown to zero, the audience yells "Happy New Year!" and the contestants get to jump into the confetti pile and pull out prizes. Or hide one grand prize in a confetti mountain at a high-traffic mall or retail store (a car, a 60-inch TV, a fancy stereo system, etc.). People can write down their guesses as to exactly what it is over the weekend. The winning guesses are segregated and a grand prize winner chosen.

COST: THE GRAND PRIZE AND OTHER PRIZES, SHOULD BE TRADED OUT.

RETURN: OUGHT TO DRAW A TON OF MEDIA ATTENTION. CLIENT STORE OR MALL WHERE CONFETTI IS SHOULD PAY FOR INCREASED TRAFFIC AND MENTIONS.

"FOOTBALL WIDOW" WAKE

On New Year's Day, all "grieving" football widows are invited to a local club for refreshments, a fashion show, a video screening of *Little Women* and jocks spinning Michael Bolton and Luther Vandross tunes throughout the day. Gift certificates to clothing stores and female-appeal videos are given away.

COST: MINIMAL; EVERYTHING SHOULD BE TRADED OUT.

RETURN: SHOULD GET AD BUYS FROM CLOTHING STORE (THAT PUTS ON FASHION SHOW), CLUB (THAT'S FULL OF LISTENERS), VIDEO STORE (FOR TAPES), ETC.

HANGOVER KITS

In a station call-lettered pillow case, put some Alka Seltzer, quality coffee, earmuffs, aspirin, coupons for services such as a late breakfast at a local eatery, a limo driver/taxi for the (next) day, a one-hour massage, etc. and give away packages to lucky listeners.

COST: PRODUCTS SHOULD BE FREE FROM CLIENTS SUCH AS PHARMACIES, CLOTHING STORES, RESTAURANTS, ETC.

RETURN: SHOULD GET AD BUYS FROM PARTICIPATING CLIENTS, TOO.

"DESIGNATED DRIVERS... FROM HELL"

The station van and other rented vehicles should be manned by the air staff and used to pick up inebriated listeners at parties throughout the market. While an intern drives, a jock talks on-air with the drunks on their way home. Passengers must give out their home phone numbers so the jocks can call them bright and early the next morning to tell them what happened, play back tape of the previous night and in general make their hangovers more miserable. But, hey, that's show *bidness!*

COST: OUTSIDE OF RENTAL VEHICLES, NOTHING.

RETURN: PUBLIC SERVICE STUNT ATTRACTS POSITIVE MEDIA ATTENTION. ON-AIR STUFF CREATES PLENTY OF ENTERTAINING THEATRE-OF-THE-MINDLESS.

"CORK GAMES"

At a weather/stain-proofed remote, have listeners participate in "cork games," where they aim and fire champagne corks at targets for prizes. The rest of the bubbly is put into vats for "Bobbing for Avocados" or some other messy fruit.

COST: PRIZES TRADED OUT; ABOUT 100 BOTTLES AT \$3 PER FOR THE CHEAPEST CHAMPAGNE = \$300, TOPS.

RETURN: ENTERTAINING REMOTE FOR ACTIVE AUDIENCE SHOULD ATTRACT LOCAL TV COVERAGE.

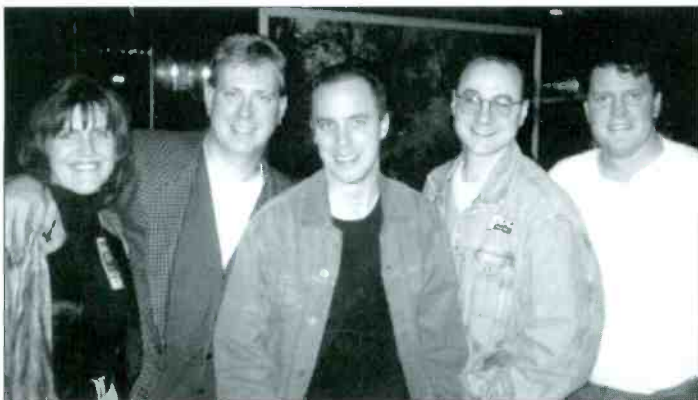

Smokin' Armadillos

Taking The Back Roads To Nashville

INTERVIEW BY JEFF SILBERMAN

It's chilly in Champaign, Illinois, but the bus containing the Smokin' Armadillos doesn't stop. Fittingly, it's next stop is not Nashville, but the warmer climes of Tampa. To Music City and most of the country, the Armadillos are just one of a plethora of new acts trying to gain a foothold in the crowded Country music scene.

Yet the Smokin' Armadillos are anything but typical Country neophytes. They've already generated quite a buzz in their native California, headlining shows to upwards of 5,000 people. Their indie album sold over 150,000 records. Obviously, MCG has gotten itself a fire-breathing posse that already knows how to put on a good show and, as heard on their new album's first single, "Let Your Heart Lead Your Mind," can transfer that energy on tape.

It all started in the mind of Josh Graham. He first thought about getting into Country music while walking alongside Highway 155, 80 miles outside of his hometown of Bakersfield, CA. The would-be rodeo star came home and spontaneously wrote what would become the lyrics to the song, "I'm A Cowboy." It began as more of a Rap tune, which Josh performed at talent shows and banquets. Friends told him to come up with some music and they suggested he work with a young fiddler named Jason Thieste. Next, he met his girlfriend's brother, Aaron Casida, who played bass.

Aaron was also a punter on the Porterville Jr. College football team; a linebacker by the name of Rick Russell became the lead singer. Lead guitarist Scott Meeks and drummer Darrin Kirkendoll rounded out the band. "Only two of the guys had actually played in other bands," Josh recalls. "The rest of us hadn't played in anything other than this, but we were having so much fun. We thought we were hot stuff even when we couldn't play anything. It just began to click naturally.

"Aaron's musical background borders between Country and Rock. Darrin and Scott came from Rock backgrounds, but they've all since become Country music connoisseurs.

Once both were exposed to Country, they became real aficionados. As a whole, the band has definitely used all of our influences to become musically versatile."

Instead of traveling the demo route, the Armadillos decided to develop on stage...and it didn't take them long to get in gear. Their fourth live gig, opening for Steve Wariner, elicited two standing O's.

From there, they went into the studio to cut their own record. "When we recorded it, we didn't even think about releasing a single," Graham says. "We basically thought about selling it at our shows. But Steve Sharp, who was at Asylum at the time, told us to put out a single. We put out 'My Girlfriend,' and it went to #4 on the independent chart. That got us excited about getting serious as a band.

"We eventually put out three singles from the album, including 'Red Rock,' which was #1 for two weeks in a row. That pushed album sales up to around 150,000. If that wasn't the exact point when we felt the band could happen, then the day we signed the contract with Curb had to be it."

Graham admitted that going into the studio to cut their major label debut posed some new concerns—the main one being how they could effec-

tively transfer their live passion to the studio. "We realized we had to leave the fireworks behind and rely more on subtleties," Graham notes. "We did a few things different in the studio—little percussion things here, a bit of strings there.

"We were really worried about it. We were so used to playing live, we were afraid the songs won't come out as powerful on tape. We became very picky during the recording; we went back several times. By now, the album's everything we hoped for. It has a lot of energy, which was the main thing producer Chuck Howard was trying to catch. He did a really great job. Hopefully, people who hear the album will get a good idea of how we sound on stage."

When Graham talks about energy, he means it. At a recent headlining gig at a County fair near their hometown, they actually integrated pyrotechnics and large video screens in their show.

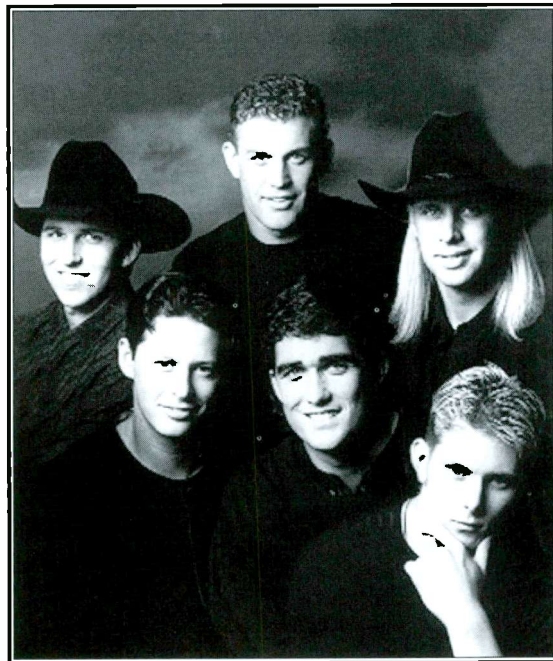
"That's not a normal part of our show, but it was something we wanted to do for a long time," he explains. "Through the years, Bakersfield has always supported us. Each year, we'd play a bigger show, so we decided to come up with something special for them. We realized that it would probably be our last trip there for a

while, as we'd tour the rest of the country, so we just had a good time with it. Eventually, we hope all of our shows will be up to that level.

"We've since headed east, where nobody knows us. We started taking smaller dates in the clubs, where we can't do the shows we've been doing at the fairs. It's all just a building process."

Chief on the itinerary is, of course Nashville. Although the Smokin' Armadillos didn't travel the typical Music City route in getting the label deal, they don't consider themselves an outlaw to the Nashville establishment. "People have told us, 'You're really good, your music's great...but you'll never make it because Nashville won't accept you since you're from California. Even though Dwight Yoakam is a major exception to that rule, we were a bit scared about that because we didn't know much about this business.

"Still, we don't like the term, 'outlaws,' because we're not setting out to deliberately do opposite of what Nashville wants us to do. In the beginning, we didn't know anything about Nashville's method of doing business. We just did things the only way we knew. We definitely want to get accepted there because that's the heart of Country music, and it'd be nice to be a part of it all." ▽

HALFWAY DOWN

Halfway down, just a getting started. *R&R's* beginning on their journey now and they're already halfway down.

Happy Thanksgiving. I hope all of you enjoyed your holiday turkey, better known in our industry as *R&R*. For the 26 radio stations that were dropped by *R&R* as reporters, the turkey was especially hard to swallow.

Among those receiving "Dear John" letters from "Dear Lon" were Kelly Jay of KFAN Abilene, Polly Wogg of WFGY Altoona, Roger Garrett of KAGG Bryan-College Station, Clint Marsh of WIXY Champaign, Leslie Faye of KOUL Corpus Christi, Ken Peiffer of WJOD Dubuque, Tom Bishop of WAVC Duluth-Superior, George House of WAXX Eau Claire, Ralph Cherry of KIXQ Joplin, Don Riley of WKOA Lafayette, Kevin King of KDDK Little Rock, Jon Prell of WDDD Marion-Carbondale, Jim Zinn of KRWQ Medford, Chris Palmer of WGTN Myrtle Beach, Dave Priest of WYAK Myrtle Beach, Mike McCoy of KFBC Oklahoma City, Thom Williams of WXXX Parkersburg, Gary Popejoy of KNCQ Redding, Mark Sprint of WWJO St. Cloud, Rick Stewart of KORD Tri-Cities, Russ Williams of WTXT Tuscaloosa and Bill Berg of WOVK Wheeling.

These programmers and these radio stations just aren't good enough to report to *R&R* any more. Oh, they were two weeks ago. Yes, indeed. Two weeks ago these programmers were among the cream of the crop. No longer.

Why?

Call Lon. See if he can tell you. He won't take my call.

You see, once again, *R&R* has changed the rules by which you play *their* game. Because it suits *their* needs, *R&R* has arbitrarily decided to cut their panel of radio stations.

Supposedly, *R&R* met with the heads of the labels in Nashville to try and determine which radio stations to include in their ever-changing panel. It is no secret that most big Nashville record companies would prefer a smaller panel of radio stations to reflect a chart. Looking at the short term and strictly on paper, a smaller panel would save record companies money in promotional efforts, service and expenditures. A smaller panel of reporting stations probably wouldn't

affect the success or failure of a superstar release. But with major stations tightening their playlists every week, where does this leave a new artist?

Oh, right. Most record sales come from the larger markets, so we really don't need airplay from smaller markets anyhow...right?

Well, a new artist needs some kind of a story. With the larger markets tightening up, the only story left to be told is how a record is doing on smaller stations. But if these stations don't count, the story won't matter.

There are over 2,500 stations in the United States programming Country music. Shouldn't we be supportive of all of these stations? Can a chart that is based on less than 10% of the total be truly reflective or accurate?

Sounds a lot like Arbitron to me: small sample, secret weighting, arbitrary rule changes. And we all know how fair Arbitron is to radio.

Everyone understands the relationship between record companies and radio stations. Each, in a sometimes twisted way, serves the others' needs. It is understandable that *R&R* should seek the input from record companies when making changes that could affect a chart. But isn't *R&R* forgetting something? What about radio's input? If *R&R* made these changes at the behest of some record companies, why didn't radio have a say in the changes? Were any of the radio stations that were dropped contacted and asked to make a case as to why they should remain?

Nope.

Once again, *R&R* decides what is best for the industry and dictates those changes to those it pretends to serve.

How long will this bullshit go on?

Many labels in Nashville *aren't* happy with the latest changes in the *R&R* panel. I ask: Why put up with it? If record companies make *R&R* important, those same companies can make it unimportant.

What are *you* waiting for? Another change in calculations that affects your way of doing business? On *R&R's* whim? If you give the Emperor his clothes, you have the power to call his bluff!

When *Network 40* began our Country section, we sought the counsel of Nashville labels. We solicited a list of stations that should be included in our initial chart. Each record company had a different list. The majors were the same, but the rest of the lists differed.

We also solicited input from programmers and consultants across the country in both large, medium and small markets...because *we* believe they matter.

We then decided to include every radio station that wants to report in our database. The record companies can pick and choose which stations to actively support. *We* don't determine what radio stations are important to a particular record company. The labels can decide themselves.

So, what's wrong with that policy?

If you weren't one of the radio stations that was dropped from *R&R*, why should you worry? Because with the changing *R&R* criteria, *you may be next*. And remember, you have absolutely no say in the matter. *R&R* plays by no rules, only those they make up or change when it suits their needs.

R&R doesn't serve the needs of radio. Nor does it serve the needs of the record industry. It feeds off the weaknesses of both.

R&R does not care about radio. Arbitrary changes like this latest one proves that claim. *R&R* could care less what happens to stations and programmers...as long as you get your list in on time. Time and time again, *R&R* has sacrificed the needs of radio to further its own aims.

In every other format, *R&R* has lost its influence because of the "Holier Than Thou" attitude which is reflected by this latest move...a move that adversely affects radio and records.

When will Country programmers and record companies finally admit *R&R* isn't beneficial to either industry? *R&R* is just a bottom-feeding parasite interested only in promoting its own short-sighted, short-term power at the expense of all others.

Halfway down...just a little bit further. ▼
