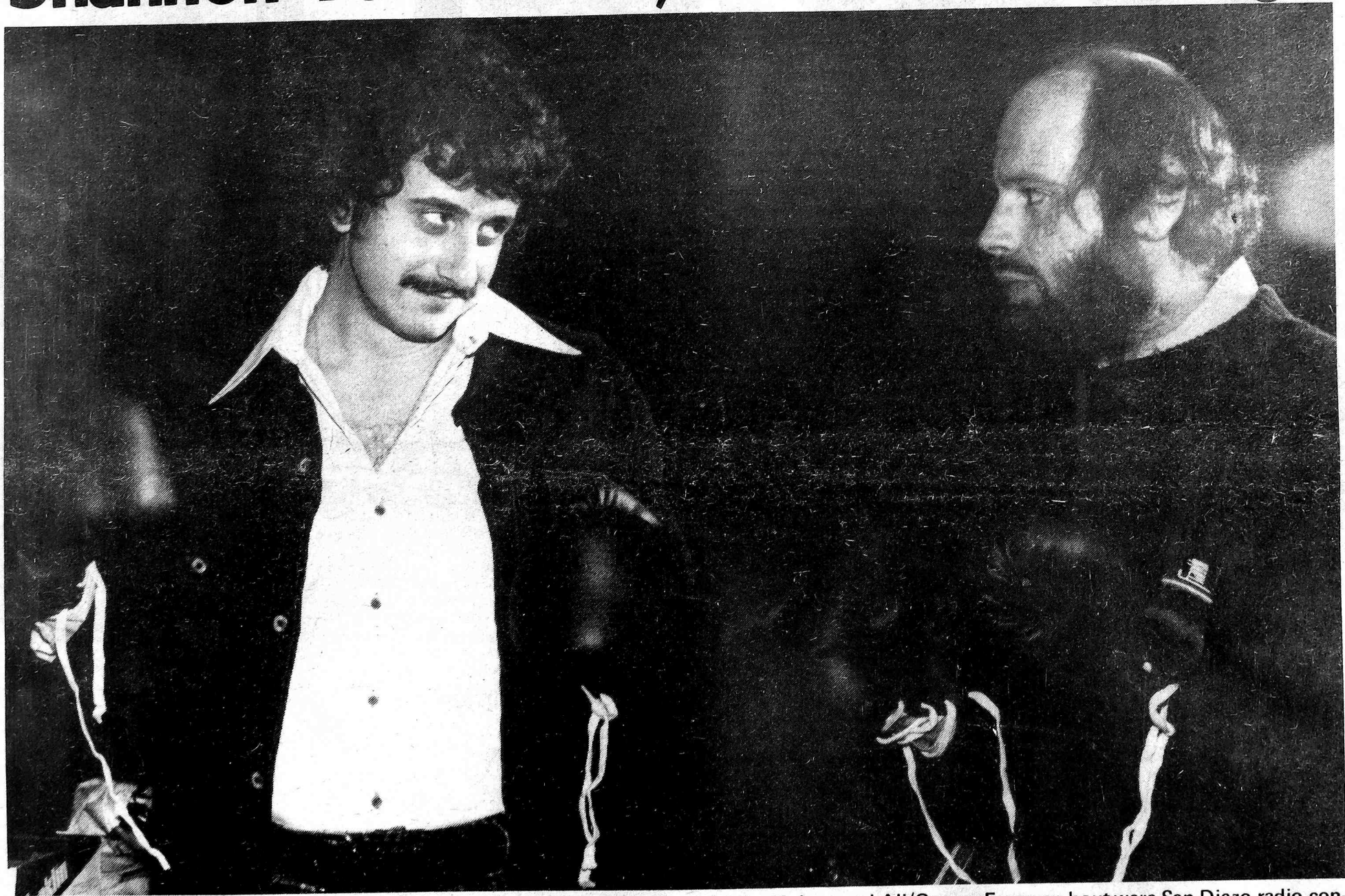

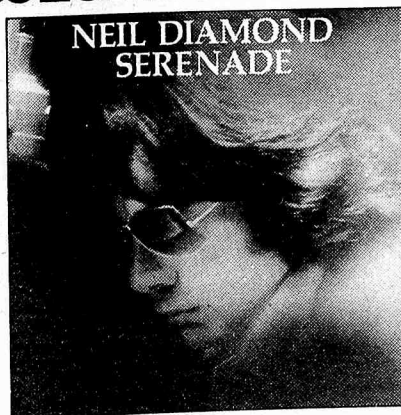

## "We Want To Be Number One In Your Book..."

Several stations around the country are running "diary sweepers" at the quarter hours. They are usually one-liners given by the jocks or listener recorded lines like "Dear diary, this morning I'm listening to (jock) on (station)." Another is "(station) is number one in my book;" still another "Taking your requests at (station) because we want to be number one in your book." Only time will tell if it will have any effect on an ARB. So far there have been no legal hassles on any of the above, and they are running on several of the biggest stations in the country.

### PRIZE IS RIGHT

**XEROK**-El Paso running "The Prize Is Right." Prizes rotate on air, and listeners pick the prizes they want. All they have to do is guess the correct retail price. It is a sales promotion, with promos telling listeners where they can go to see the actual prize displayed.

### THE GREAT SNATCH

**13Q**-Pittsburgh running "The Great Snatch." Simple Call-In-And-Win with the calls played on air. They take the 13th caller every time. Prizes are tee shirts, albums etc. They also have a "Snatch Curtain" where they trade the current prize for whatever is behind the curtain.

### WEIRD CONTEST

**KQWB**-Fargo ran the "Weird Contest" for Halloween. Idea was to guess what was to come out of

the coffin. All the good Halloween monsters were in it, Frankenstein, Dracula, etc. etc. Actual prize was your very own ghost, and a rope to hold him with. (Actually what was sent was a small rope noose.)

### LIFE IS A ROCK BUT WHO ROLLS ME?

**KHJ**-Los Angeles PD Gerry Peterson made the right call at the right time and managed to get Reunion to cut special versions of their hit to say "Life is a rock but KHJ rolls me." When the lyric comes up in the song about "My DJ told me" they insert their jock's name in the song. **KFMG**-Des Moines, meanwhile, got permission from the publisher to print the lyrics of the song on the

back of their weekly survey. They advertised it on air, stores ran out of the normal supply in just a couple of days.

### KUNG FU FIGHTING

Last Wednesday (30) around 100 representatives of the Asians For A Fair Media Committee appeared at the studios of **KYAC**-Seattle to protest the playing of "Kung Fu Fighting" by Carl Douglas (20th). The song contains the word "Chinaman," which according to the protesters is a contemptuous and patronizing term as well as a racial slur. **KYAC** pulled the record; the group then went to **KJR**, and they too removed it from their playlist. We contacted Michael Spears, PD

at **KFRC**-San Francisco, a city with a 16 percent Asian population. Michael told us the station has received no complaints that he knows of, and the record is number one in requests. **Paul Lovelace**, National Promo for 20th said "Seattle is the only area where this situation has arisen. The record is number one requests in most of the country. We don't anticipate the spread of this over-reaction."

### KFRC SNO BIZ 74

Station is promoting a "Skiers Rock & Roll Fair." You can **SKI KFRC**, and win a \$10,000 ski machine, which is a specially equipped mobile van, and ski equipment. The big fair will have a ski fashion show, a concert, movies, booth, etc. Promos have liners like "There's no biz like sno biz 74."

### KING PIN

**KING**-Seattle running a "KING PIN" promotion. Similar to the **WABC** button. Station has already handed out 50,000 buttons.

### MOVIE MADNESS

**Z103**-Montgomery new PD **Jim Dooley** calls attention to the fact that they have been rock for several months and are gaining on the market. Current promotion is to send a whole school to the movies. Promo liner is "A night at the movies for you and a few thousand friends."

### NEW KRTH PD

**KRTH**-Los Angeles has changed PD's. **Jim Pewter** resigned and the new PD is **Dick Bozzi**, the man that developed the all-oldies format for **WCBS-FM**-New York. Station is now running

a major campaign designed around "Captain K-RTH." They are giving out Capt. K-RTH secret decoders, and broadcasting coded messages on air. First to decode the message wins the prize. **KRTH** GM **Allan Chlowitz** has commissioned a special wardrobe to be designed for the big man, and they will take an actual Captain **KRTH** all over Southern California, claiming him to be the new "Hero Of L.A."

### "WHAT DOES IT TAKE..."

**KXFM**-Santa Maria running a "What Does It Take To Get You Through The Night?" promotion. Listeners are asked to send in their entry stating what it takes to get them through the night. Prizes will be waterbeds, candles, station shirts, etc. etc. So far entries have run the gamut from "sex" to "a W.C. Fields film."

### WAYS WILD HAIR

Big **WAYS**-Charlotte PD **Jay Thomas**, who has unsuccessfully run for the Mayor of the city, is now asking his audience to call in and tell him their wildest hair (which is a crazy dream). So far station is logging around 3000 calls a morning. TV commercials advertising the promotion show **Thomas** dressed in a bunny suit in bed with a girl, making a pass in the face of the rednecks, and giving a black man a whitewall tire. So far on the air they have awarded a ride on a camel, a bathtub full of beer, a weekend in a nudist camp, a trip to the Philadelphia zoo, among several other trips.

### LATE NEWS:

#### Shannon To Atlanta; Pittman To Chicago

**Scott Shannon** resigned as PD at **WMAK**-Nashville to accept the PD position at **WQXI**-Atlanta. **Bill Sherard** resigned last Friday. Contrary to rumors circulating, **John Leader** will stay as assistant program director and music coordinator. **Coyote McCloud** will also exit **WMAK** to join **WQXI** as a jock. **Don Benson** will be the new music librarian and research director. **R&R** reached **Scott** who told us, when we asked if he planned any major changes, "...well the station is 5th overall in the market and 2nd in teens, since I don't believe in programming anything but number one stations there will obviously be some changes." New PD at **WMAK** is **Mark Damon**, who has been assistant PD for the past year.

#### PITTMAN TO WMAQ?

**Bob Pittman** is rumored to be leaving **WPEZ** to join **WMAQ**-Chicago as assistant PD, working under **Lee Sherwood**. The station will remain in the country format. We reached **Pittman** who said he could not comment at this time.

#### CHASE LEAVES WKLS

Another late Atlanta PD change happened Tuesday afternoon as **Barry Chase** left **WKLS**. No new PD named.

#### WLAV FORMAT CHANGE

**WLAV**-Grand Rapids changes from Rock to Pop.

#### DEMENTO TO KLOS

The famous **Dr. Demento** leaves **KMET** with his oldie library and takes it over to the number one rock FM in Los Angeles, **KLOS**. Rumors have persisted for weeks that **Demento** was unhappy at **KMET**, where he garnered incredible listenership in his Sunday night show.

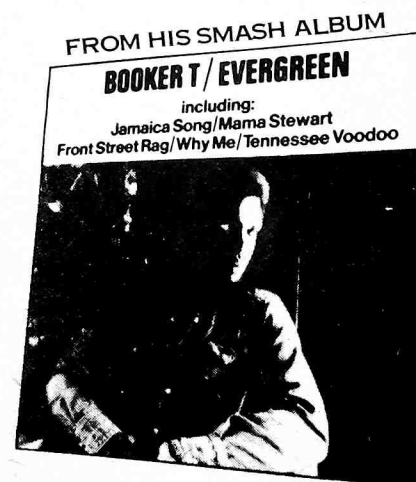

## FM ROCK RADIO

BY MIKE HARRISON

When one does something wrong, one should be big enough to admit one's error and face the consequences. Therefore, I feel an obligation to apologize to each and every one of you -- and to three people in particular -- for the rotten remark that I made in my column several weeks ago. When I wrote it, I didn't realize that it would be taken the way it was, that it would be responsible for three jocks losing their jobs and one losing his marriage. I should have thought about what I said before saying it. So again, please accept my apologies and rest assured that nothing like that will ever happen again in this column.

Bob Paiva's article about contests aroused my interest. He made some good points and I'd like to add a few things. I don't think people could care less about radio contests unless a contest is already on the station they listen to. Thus, the primary purpose of contests on the air is audience manipulation rather than attraction. Maintenance is the name of the game.

As far as getting people to listen longer is concerned, that's not as important as getting them to listen at more separate times than they normally do. Thus, getting the listener to listen from 9:15 pm to 9:30 pm instead of 9:15 pm to 9:20 pm would be less effective during an ARB than getting that listener to listen for three two-minute segments at totally different times of the day. The first totals 15 minutes, the second totals 6 minutes -- but I'd take the 6 minutes.

Just because a contest is creative and entertaining does not make it justified unless it concerns itself with the black & white facts of rating mechanics.

If I told you now that Mike Kasabo was going to name one of R&R's subscribers as the winner of something in his column this issue, you sure as hell would read it, and vice versa. You might not otherwise, even though you are a subscriber to this publication. That sums the whole thing up.

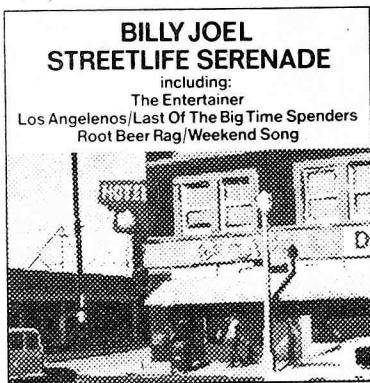

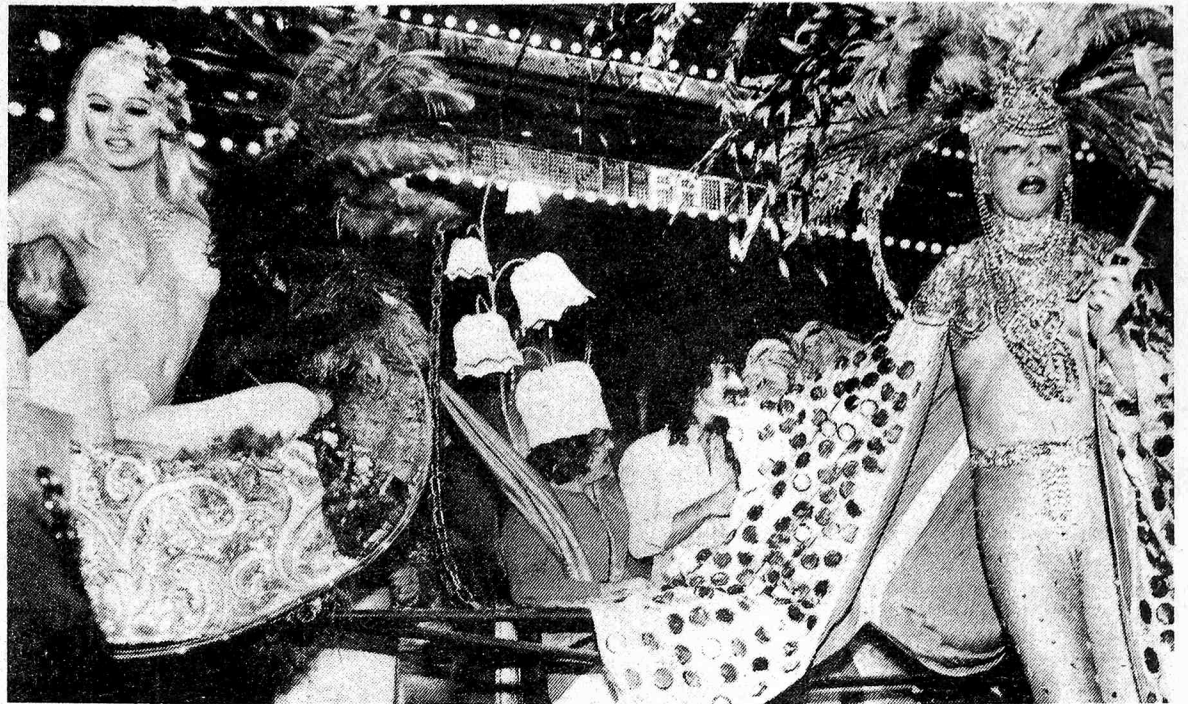
### GALACTIC PASSWORD SAVES JOCKS

who have asked, yes, Neil will be going on a tour come Spring. And yes, his album is gold heading for 600,000 pieces with big reorders within two weeks of release.

...About Chicago, "Wishing You Were Here" is the eighth most requested record according to R&R's Request Tabulation (and if you can't trust a former Program Director like Bob Wilson who can you trust!?) and it went from 36-16 and 25-17 at WKLO and WAKY, already been 3 at 13Q and 12-4 at KQV, 22-10 at WDGW, 18-11 WQXI, 21-10 WPGC, 16-9 KSTP, 28-6 KFJZ, 9-4 KTLK and God bless you all who believed in this when it was still on one of those big records with the little hole before it became a smash as a little record with a big hole.

It's definitely going to be a long haul record, but "The Ballad of Lucy Jordan" by Dr. Hook says too much, too well, not to get maximum effort from we who believe. For example of the amazing response it elicited from early secondary play, call Eddie Esserman collect at (404) 321-4553.

Thanks to Ron Riley at WCAO and Norm Brooks at WFBR for being the first to play "Just Leave Me Alone" by Don Potter. 'QXI's John Leader says Potter sounds like Ray Charles and Charlie Rich at the same time and that the record could be a monster (not as good as airplay but better than having the record thrown back at you.) And special thanks to Scott Shannon for hearing it and getting us crazy in the first place.

...Maybe my one remaining good ear has gone bad, but it seems to me that a kickin' version of a great tune would get more play when it's by a group that is becoming one of the biggest, most exciting live bands around (11,000 at Detroit's Pine Knob as headliners) and though they're from Boston they've sold 40,000 albums in Detroit! Step back to your music room and relisten to "Train Kept a Rollin'" by Aerosmith.

Thank you, Bill Young, for getting genuinely excited upon hearing "Cryin' Time" from Barbra Streisand's new album and adding it at KILT which reminds me -- "The Entertainer" from Billy Joel's new album will be in your hands today ... and in the same package "Plans of the Lord" by Goose Creek Symphony, who have been a killer band for years and now the world's going to know it... "Gonna Make You a Star" by David Essex will turn you on after one listen (maybe two) ... and when you listen to "The Children's Song of Peace" by Michael the melody will drive you crazy until you realize you've been hearing it over and over for the better part of a year on the Metropolitan Life Insurance commercials (and so have all your listeners ... speaking of familiarity.)

...And if it isn't in the envelope today by Monday you should have "The Lady Came From Baltimore," Tim Hardin's super tune and the greatest record Johnny Cash has done since "Sue."

MIKE KLENFNER/BELL:

## Al Wilson, Manilow Looking Very Strong

"La La Peace Song" -- Al Wilson: Moving with incredible response, continued chart action and sales. Added WPOP No. 28, KXOL, K101-San Francisco, WBGW-Bowling Green, WPGN-Knoxville, WLEE-Richmond, and continues to gain at WTXI 26-21, WAYS-Charlotte 26-17,

WHBQ No. 10, WRKO No. 26. With the heavy momentum going, it looks like we've got a smash hit record. Also, forgot to mention it's an Extra at WIXY.

"Mandy" -- Barry Manilow: Seems to be an out-of-the-box smash with significant adds at WMEX-Boston, KGRB, WKY, KEEL and WLKP-Baltimore No. 2 requests. The reaction at all levels including FM and Top 40 appears to be excellent and we are looking for further additions next week. Great ARB record which will bring immediate phones.

"Harlem" -- Fifth Dimension: Produced by John Florez. Early R&B adds at WWIN and WEBB, and also a pick at WNJR. Also getting excellent sales activity from discotheques in New York. It looks like we can have an R&B smash with this record, which will be the first hit R&B record for them in quite some time. Also, the pop reaction has been quite good, although the record has only been out for three days.

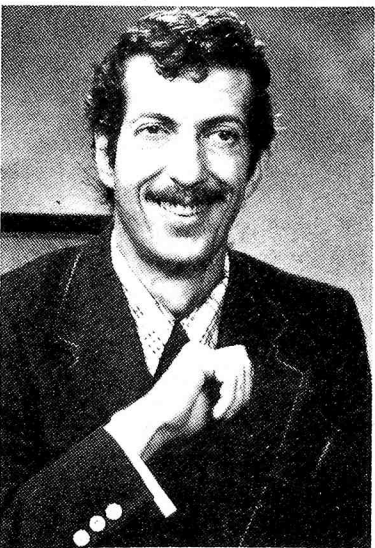

**CON SCHADER**  
In 1962, Con joined KLAJ as morning drive-time DJ. Two years later, because of his valuable knowledge and association with country music, he was appointed music manager for KLAJ. Con's work in music has helped make KLAJ one of the most successful country radio stations in the nation. He played a large role in developing and maintaining the modern sound of KLAJ. Gibson guitars will be made in Music City beginning early '75? ... Weight doctors abound around town; ask Kinny Price, Johnny Russell, Eddie Miller, all show results.

Talk is Charlie Pride will leave road travel, except for exceptional dates. Jack Johnson is busy working award-winning Ronnie Milsap ... Tanya Tucker has evidently convinced a number of air personalities, music and program directors that she doesn't want to be 'country'; they're accommodating. ... Jimmie Davis told us while here for convention this year that he works only gospel dates nowadays. His wife is the beautiful Anita Gordon, one of the original members of the Chuck Wagon Gang. They work together in concerts, rallies, revivals, and TV ... Roger Miller said on the Carson show the other night that his new record he wrote about his and his estranged wife's life together ... Marijohn Wilkin wrote "One Day At a Time" with Kristofferson. Word records signed her to a record deal, she's just completed her first album of "contemporary country-gospel" songs, which they'll release on Myrrh, Ray Price's new record home. It's all owned by the ABC-Dot group now (if they don't like what's happening on records, they may soon be able to control

it ... )Marijohn, by the way, is one of the most prolific female songwriters of this generation, at least. She was a catalyst in the early Cedarwood hit-writing team of Mel Tillis, Wayne Walker, John D. Loudermilk, and she owns some of the heaviest Kristofferson copyrights (like "For The Goodtimes"). She was also a Columbia artist in the early '60's, and had one of the most successful backup vocal groups in Nashville studios for ten years (The Marijohn singers) ... There was a wave of country stars in the late fifties and early sixties who invested in radio stations; Webb Pierce, Faron Young, Hank Snow, Ernest Tubb, Jim Reeves. The '70's may harvest another bumper crop of artist radio station buys. No public announcement as yet, but there are a number of deals on the fire, which when consummated, will add to other radio involved music men like Roy Clark and Hank Thompson ... Cinnamon, and award-winning independent record label in country last year, is very quiet these days ... Grant Turner, the 32 year veteran of WSM and the Grand Ole Opry, deserved the honor his peers gave this year through CMA. Grant is one of the most dedicated to his craft of anyone I know. Our congratulations to two other equally involved and productive people (if not quite as long) who have paid their dues and helped make country radio better, for listeners and professionals alike, and whose recognition was overdue; Billy Parker (also another Ernest Tubb graduate) has done as much in Tulsa for country radio as Bob Wills did for the ballroom dance business, and when Jack Cresse launched the KVOO Country Flagship, his first airman was Billy. Dale Eichor has been instrumental in launching country operations in Shenandoah, San Antonio, Peoria, and Ft. Dodge (that I know about). Dale's one of the "quiet ones" who speaks with action more than with words. One of the nicest things about being a part of country for over 30 years has been watching a lot of giants growing up ... Cheers!!!!
