## Arbitron Discovers Diary Tampering In Memphis

Arbitron has reissued the April/May 1976 Radio Market Report for Memphis. This move came after several weeks of a very quiet investigation of diary tampering. The results of the new tabulations clearly show the advantage was to WHBQ, the RKO outlet.

Arbitron's initial investigation has now lead to a Postal Service investigation. The story breaks down as follows: a representative of a Memphis radio station was looking over the raw diary data in Beltsville after the April/May book was released, and established that several diaries had what seemed to be excessive listening time to WHBQ. Upon bringing this up to Arbitron officials, they recalled the people that supposedly submitted the diaries, only to find that none of them had ever received their diary. The next step was to investigate from the post office.

At press time R&R has established that there were seven Metro Area diaries tampered with and that a post office employee had sold them to an as yet un-named individual. The post office is now conducting a full investigation with

"attempt to defraud the mail" charges awaiting the guilty parties. Arbitron has stated they have done all they can do and that it is out of their hands now. Arbitron VP/GM Larry Manuel, informed R&R that "We have absolutely no indication that any similar problems have occurred in a previous Memphis survey or in any other market now or in the past...new security procedures instituted prior to the beginning of the current (Oct/Nov) survey will help to insure against a reoccurrence of this type and any other type of survey tampering."

The newly reissued April/May 1976 Arbitron for Memphis shows WHBQ significantly down in all demographics. In Monday-Sunday 6am-12mid total persons 12 plus, WHBQ went from 11.8 to 6.3, in Men 18 plus 11.6 down to 4.3 in the newly processed book. In Women 18 plus they dropped from 9.8 to 5.2 and in teens from 20.2 to 16.8. The only stations other than WHBQ to be significantly affected in the reprocessing of the data were WDIA (B) up from 17.1 to 18.1, WMC (C) up 10.8 to 11.4 and WMPS (R) up 10.1 to 10.7.

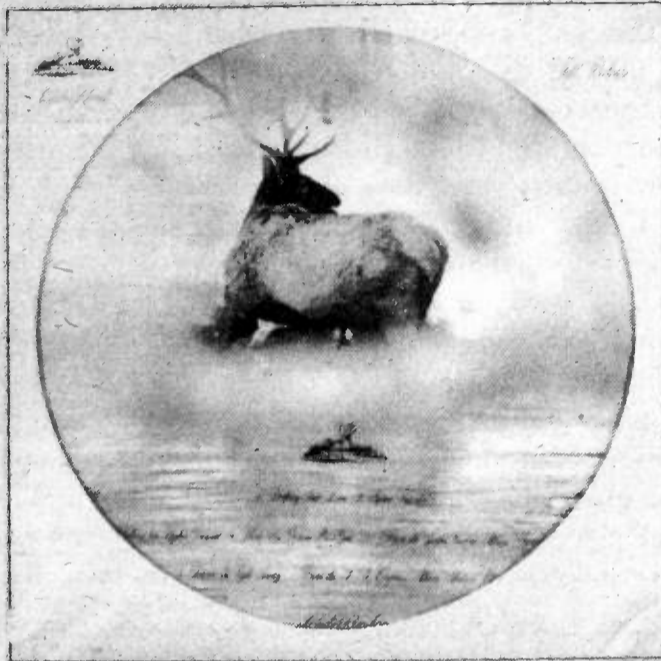
## Far Out Productions Leaves United Artists

# So you can inform your listeners, here's the story behind "This Song"

Five years ago, suit was filed against George Harrison and Harrisongs Music, Inc. by the estate of songwriter Ronald Mack and Bright Tunes publishing. The suit alleged that George Harrison's 1970 composition "My Sweet Lord" infringed on the copyright of Mack's "He's So Fine," recorded in 1963 by the Chiffons. In February of 1976, the case went to court before Federal Judge Richard Owen. Over three days of testimony and cross-examination, both sides attempted to prove the musical derivation of "My Sweet Lord." Both plaintiff and defendant solicited the opinions of musicologists and music experts from various fields. At one point in the proceedings, huge charts were introduced, on which were inscribed the 3-note pattern Harrison was alleged to have plagiarized. In the confused

discussion which followed, differences arose as to whether or not the 3-note sequence constituted a "song." "That ain't no song," testified gospel music expert David Butler, "that's a riff!" On August 31, 1976, Judge Owen ruled against Harrison, finding "My Sweet Lord" and "He's So Fine" "virtually identical," but adding that Harrison had unknowingly lifted the riff, owing to an "unconscious" familiarity with the chord pattern in question.

"The whole thing made me sort of paranoid," Harrison explained. "I got to thinking, what if every time you sat down to write a song, you had to pass your music by some expert or into a computer, to make sure you weren't copying someone else's notes. It's all a joke, really. Basically, songs are written to entertain and that's all there is to it. That's where it's at."

## RADIO CREATES RECORDS

At Y100/Miami, all the "Y-Guys" got together to create Scampaign '76," done in Dickie Goodman style, using all the jocks' names in the record. Y100's Bill Tanner reports number 1 requests within a 24 hour period.

KLEO/Wichita has also put together a record collage type novelty, titled the "KLEO Debates." Under the direction of Marc Elliott, all the station air personalities added their bits to the production. PD Ken Clifford also noted instant phones on the record.

On another subject matter, WRFC/Athens' Sports Director has done a take-off on "Nadia's Theme" entitled "Jill's Song," fondly named after his girlfriend. The song is a take off on the "Desiderata" theme, and is also gaining huge response by listeners.

## HALLOWEEN WRAP-UP

In KRSP/Salt Lake City's annual "Haunted House," a record amount of donations has been reached. By last Friday, a total of \$85,000 was registered to benefit the March of Dimes. PD Alan Hague reported that the charity officials and the station expected to hit the \$100,000 mark as Halloween approached, making this one of the most successful Haunted House benefits ever.

KIMN-AM-FM/Denver was involved with Campus Life for their Halloween promotion, the "Scream In The Dark" Haunted House. The House, located in the city's largest shopping center, featured 30 rooms of frightening horror. All proceeds from the event went to the local Campus Life chapter.

98Q/Vidalia had a real fortune teller on the air for Halloween, taking calls at random and telling the listeners their "haunting" fortunes, as well as giving them prizes ranging from LP's to booby prizes.

Either tricks or treats were in store for WFOM/Marietta listeners. "Trick" prizes were albums by Heart, Alice Cooper, and Earth, Wind & Fire. "Treat" albums were by Boston, Kiss and the Spinners. Each hour, listeners were told whether that hour was a trick or a treat, so they could make their choice of trying for their favorite LP.

With the Halloween weekend still to come, KLAZ/Little Rock raised over \$2500 for the March of Dimes in their "Haunted House."

KRLA/Los Angeles had some help

during their Countdown of Los Angeles' all time favorites over the Halloween weekend. The Captain & Tennille, who's "Love Will Keep Us Together" came in number one, appropriately hosted the countdown of the Top 10. Programmers Billy Pearl and Tom Greenleigh also used a novel twist on Halloween. Frankenstein himself did the station breaks...Mr. Bill Frankenstein of Los Angeles that is. "Even Frankenstein listens to KRLA," Pearl quipped.

WORC/Worcester's "Halloween Midnight Love Affair," offered their listeners a chance to be chauffeured to Boston to meet Midland International's Carol Douglas, plus dinner and tickets for her show. Two couples will join Carol for dinner, with one couple also winning the chance to spend Halloween night at a Boston hotel. To qualify for the prizes, listeners had to listen for the Halloween phrase of the hour and be able to call in and name the phrase sometime later during that hour.

Trick or treaters in Grand Forks got an added bonus when they asked if the house they were visiting was a "KKXL Bonus House." When they did find one of the many station houses around town, they won a Sony transistor radio to help fill their bag of goodies.

## CHICAGO WOMEN NAME WLS STATION OF THE YEAR

WLS/Chicago was named "Station Of The Year" by the Chicago Women In Broadcasting recently. This marks the third consecutive year the group has awarded the station, having received honorable mentions the past two years. In making the award the CWB cited the fact that one-third of the station's employees are women, including five department heads, six on-air talent, and three technicians.

WLS has also announced that they will provide up to the minute information on business and school closings due to the Windy City's winter weather. The station has sent over 600 letters to schools and businesses, containing the phone number of a direct line to the WLS newsroom and a code that must be used by anyone supplying information.

## Q102 IN VICTORY PARADE

When the Cincinnati Reds baseball team returned home for their World Series Victory Parade, the Q102 Jeeps took part in the massive parade. Driven by station MD Jim Fox and a Q102 salesman, the jeeps passed by over 50,000 Reds fans, while Fox broadcast reports via mobile phone. Fox noted that nearly the entire parade was comprised of jeeps this year, due to the fact that no auto makers are producing convertibles, the old parade standby.

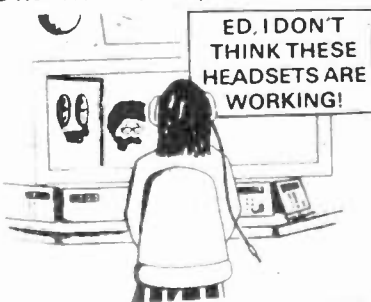

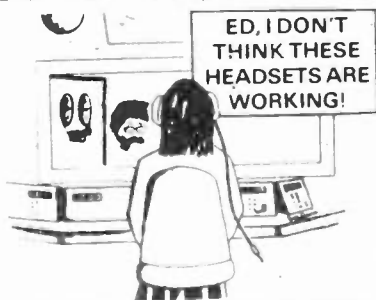

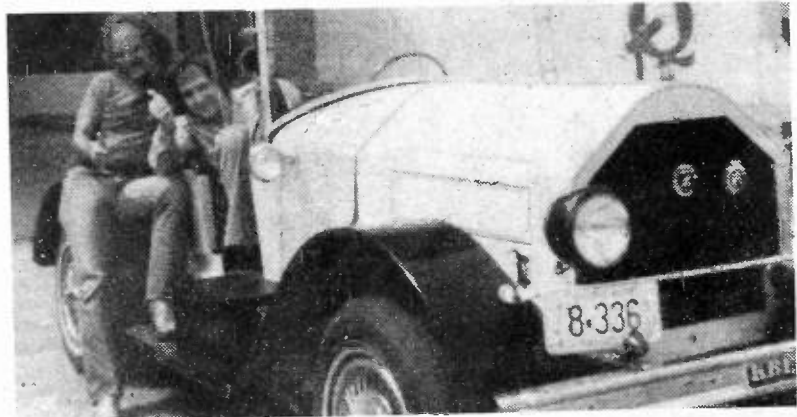

# BUSINESS NEWS

## FCC Turns Down Justice Dept. Again

Once again, the Federal Communications Commission has rejected petitions from the Department of Justice against license renewal of KSD-AM-TV/St. Louis, KSL-AM-FM-TV/Salt Lake City, WTMJ-AM-TV and WKTI-FM/Milwaukee, and KTVI-TV/St. Louis. The Justice Department has brought a number of petitions recently against commonly-owned broadcast facilities, none of which the Commission has concurred with. The FCC conditionally renewed the KSD licenses until an EEO suit has been settled.

## Fairness Doctrine Not Applicable To Critics

In a test case against KNBC-TV/Los Angeles, the FCC has ruled that a movie critic's unfavorable review of a film was not subject to Fairness Doctrine procedures. The Commission stated that the criticism was not a specific issue of public importance in a letter to movie makers MGM, who had complained about a review by the station.

## Starr To Restructure Debt

Starr Broadcasting Group Inc. has announced plans to restructure its current outstanding secured debt of \$18 million. In order to generate approximately \$1.4 million in cash, Starr had formerly announced that they will sell WCYB-TV/Bristol, Virginia and WLOK/Memphis. The company said that lenders would be able to hold second liens on Starr properties, and that their subsidiaries would guarantee the secured debt.

## Keystone Petitions Against RCA

Keystone Broadcasting System has filed a petition with the FCC stating that RCA's broadcast networks and satellite communications systems constitute unfair competition when competitive broadcasters are tied in with RCA's satellite system. As an example, RCA has an agreement with the Hughes Television Network to feed sports programs via their communications system. Keystone contends that RCA's dominance in the satellite field constitutes a violation of the Communications Act.

## Nixon Tapes In Public Domain

Tapes played during the Watergate trial are now in the public domain and can be broadcast on radio and TV, according to a decision by the U.S. Court of Appeals. Thirty Nixon White House tapes are included in the decision. In addition, Warner Brothers Records will ask the court to allow them to distribute the tapes on recorded discs in two-record packages for sale, and a separate set of a full 22 hours made available to schools, libraries and the general public at no profit.

## Golden West Buys Seattle FM

KETO-FM/Seattle has been purchased by Golden West Broadcasters, and call letters changed to KVI-FM. The station will be an ABC Contemporary News Network affiliate. Golden West VP and GM Jack Bankson will assume the responsibilities of General Manager of the station.

## WRVR-FM To Sonderling

The FCC has turned over the license of WRVR-FM/New York to Sonderling Broadcasting, from the Riverside Church. In the same proceedings, the Commission also overturned a petition from the Citizens Committee To Save Jazz to deny the transfer of license to Sonderling. Sonderling purchased the station for \$2.3 million cash.

## "Superstars" Hits 20

KRKE-FM/Albuquerque will begin Burkhardt/Abrams & Associates' "Superstars" format in the near future, marking the service's 20th station to use the package.

## Postal Service To Commemorate Discs

The RIAA has announced that the U.S. Postal Service has agreed to accept their proposal to commemorate the 100th anniversary of recorded sound with a special stamp to be issued next year.

## American Motors' Losses Heavy

With sharp drops in profits for the fourth quarter, American Motors Corp. has announced that their financial situation after the fiscal 1976 year is far worse than expected. The company did not directly quote their losses for the year, but some industry experts predict that it may reach \$40 million. Sales of AMC cars have been running anywhere from 20% to 50% below year-ago figures. American Motors' spokesmen have still held on to optimism, saying that their manufacturing would be streamlined to drop costs.

## Union Negotiated Pay Down

For the first nine months of 1976, union negotiated pay increases were down from the same period last year. Analysis by the Labor Department shows that this year's pay increases averaged 7%, compared to 1975's 7.8%.

## Springfield To Sell Stations

Springfield Newspapers will sell KHMO/Hannibal, Missouri and WVTI/Springfield to the newly formed Mark Twain Media so that Springfield can merge into the Gannett Co. Also being sold is KQBX/Springfield to Stauffer Publications Inc. Both sales are subject to FCC approval. The divestiture of properties was necessary because of Gannett's ownership of newspapers in the cities where Springfield held broadcast properties.

## 1976 Car Expenses

A study by Hertz Car Leasing has shown that expenses for a typical 1976 model year car totaled 28.1 cents per mile, which is 3.3% higher than last year's cars. Although there has been an increase, it represents the lowest in numerous years, comparing with a 5.8% jump in the consumer price index for 1976, and a 17.8% increase in car expenses two years ago.

## 1977 Ad Budget Predictions

Advertising industry observers are predicting an increase in ad budgets for 1977 of nearly 10% over this year. Even though higher prices for media and inflation have been given as possible reasons for the projected figures, many also feel that an upward trend in consumer spending is also a factor. Many company execs, in a poll done by Advertising Age, included the introduction of new products as further reasoning for increased budgets.

## Military Zooms In On Radio

Now that the U.S. Military services have the go-ahead for big budget advertising, the armed forces will spend a huge \$71 million on recruit ads during the next year. For radio, the Army plans a \$1.6 million budget, the Navy \$1.5 million, and the Marine Corps \$450,000. The Air Force has yet to announce firm plans for radio buys. These figures do not reflect regional and district recruiting offices' budgets, which will boost the figures.

## America's Air Carriers Safest

Americans can rest assured that their airlines are among the safest in the world, according to a British survey based on crashes since 1950. U.S.A. airlines are 4 to 5 times safer than the average, and an incredible 25 times safer than Eastern European airlines.

## [So You Can Understand It]

Insight To New AM/FM Duplication Policies

Effective May 1, 1977, the FCC's new AM-FM duplication limitations will come into play. Therefore, this seems to be an appropriate time to provide an insight into this often confused rule and thereby provide programmers with sufficient time to meet the challenge.

For communities with populations of 25,000 to 100,000, an FM station may not devote more than 50% of the average program week to duplicated programming. Effective May 1, 1979, the percentage for stations in the 25,000 to 100,000 category will decrease further to 25%. All stations licensed to communities of 100,000 or more, will be limited to 25% weekly duplication effective May 1, 1977.

Of utmost importance is the fact that the FCC will continue its policy of computing the time on a weekly basis with an overall "regulatory eye" to the average over a year. While the average limit is either 25% or 50% depending upon the market population, it must be noted that in any one individual week, the total may be as high as 40%, as long as the average weekly duplication during the year does not exceed 25%. What does this mean? This means that stations may duplicate Monday through Friday at a 40% level and then drop back on Saturday and Sunday sufficiently to meet the average 25% limitation. This is of particular concern to those stations that wish to duplicate AM and PM drive time Monday Through Friday.

It is also pertinent to point out that the FCC exempts AM pre-sunrise service from the rule. Duplicated operations during such pre-sunrise hours will not be counted for computation under the rules.

I've worked AM's...FM's...shortwaves...CB's...and just about everything else that puts out a signal...and for the last few months, one thought has been coming to the front of my mind.

I keep hearing from other radio folks who say that "AM should never try to compete with FM"...that "FM's are hip havens where the announcer never should sell HARD"...and so on. That the listeners go to FM as an alternative...and that the days of the AM band are numbered.

Seems to me that it's really we radio folk who are to blame for what appears to be a generally held misconception about the electronic media! Isn't it true that we, as an industry, have been perpetuating the myth of "FM" by wearing the traditional hats as we have? It seems that WE...we who are responsible for any forward motion in concept...WE are dragging our heels in matters pertaining to diversification of formats of FM radio!

Certainly, there are markets where there is a great representation of all formats on the FM band...and there are obvious examples of successful FM stations which are programmed ACTIVELY...but this is just not representative of the entire industry. For the most part, WE are holding the FM band to PASSIVE formats...whether automated or live, Beautiful Music or AOR...it seems overall to be passive...to lack the involvement, the "personality," if you will, that is extant on the AM band.

Certainly, there are the technical arguments...fidelity of FM...signal availability of AM...sets in use...and on and on...but the fact is, is that it is we who are in the position to do something about it, and not the listeners who say it is "hip" to listen to "stereo" on a \$19.95 mono receiver, who are to blame.

Before we can change the audience's perception of our industry, we've got to change our perception of ourselves.

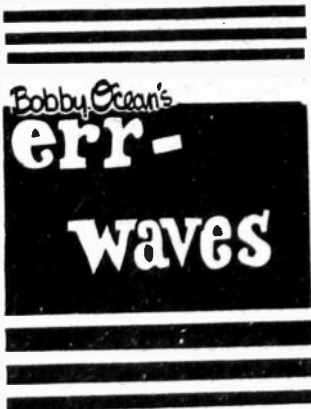

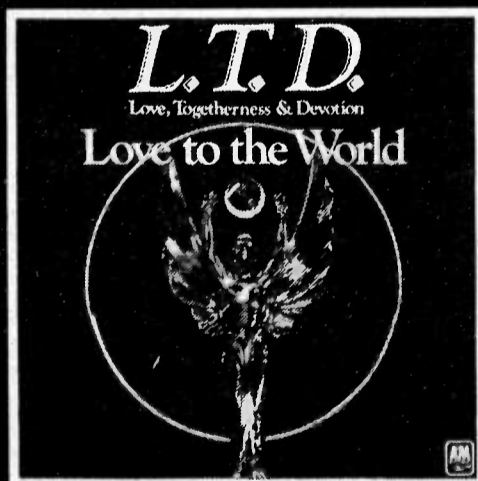

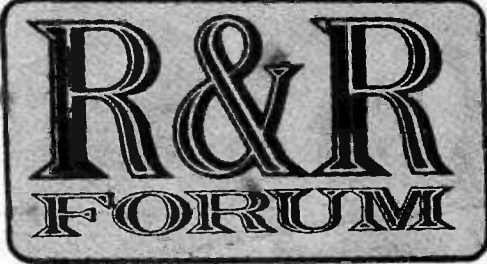

# Can't Judge A Book By Who's Covered

Upon returning from Beltsville (home office of Arbitron) after a beneficial week of reviewing the diaries of Jacksonville, Orlando, Tampa, Nashville, and Cincinnati, an important lesson has been learned: "Do not accept the results of your rating at book value...the key factor is diary value."

Thanks to Rounsaville Radio and Tom Kennington, our National PD, I was given the opportunity along with Tom West, PD of WBJW, to investigate the ARB diary-by-diary. The results of my findings were most helpful in certain areas and rather confusing in others. By reviewing each and every "hand" diary, you can discover some vital information about your market. Some of the positives are listed below:

#### Diary Information

1. You can discover who you are sharing audiences with and possibly why. If you program an FM station, most likely people listen to your station while at home. In the car, it's likely to be AM listenership. Since we're basically a mobile society, AM is most likely to continue to control the cume factor (until all cars are equipped with FM radio).

2. Radio control in the household—In some cases, it's the teenager who controls the radio in the household. This set of circumstances possibly accounts for the fair share of 35-49's that "Top 40" seems to have under its belt.

3. Comment section—This is a valuable piece of data for numerous reasons. In diary after diary, it was discovered that a considerable amount of listeners are forced to listen to the "beautiful music" station in the office. When these same listeners were in control of their radio at home, the listening patterns were generally different. It is more than likely occurrences like the above confirm the "beautiful music" stations whopping daytime quarter hour shares. Check your local ARB to compare. Furthermore, the comment section can also allow you to know and understand the public image that your radio station projects.

4. Zip code section—By the use of zip code information, you can determine the amount of diaries placed in each and every zip code...very useful information relevant in all aspects of the ratings.

#### And now, for the confusing events at Beltsville...

1. Call letter flips and slogans—For some logical reason, I was under the impression that "flips" and "slogans," which are submitted to Arbitron by their request before every survey period, were automatically programmed into their computer. "Not so," says Richard Gladspell, Public Relations Representative for Arbitron. "Slogans" are checked manually in the diary edit department. This is the department that can make or break a question of credit given to a radio station. Flips that are submitted for the forthcoming book will not become valid until the next book.

The policy on flips disturbs me. I asked Tom Kennington his impression on the "flip" controversy. He stated that

his interpretation of flips was that four separate diary keepers had to list the same flip in order for that particular flip to be permanently programmed into their computer. This situation will hopefully be rectified in the near future.

The reason of importance regarding call letter flips was brought to my attention while reviewing the diaries for the Jacksonville market. There were three diaries that were



controversial in nature. Diary number 1 was listed as WAVE; ARB gave credit to no radio station. In short, diary number one was "unusable." Diary number two was listed as WIVY-FM/97. The credit went to WIVY. Diary number three was listed as WPDQ-FM. Credit was given to WPDQ-AM. ARB's answer to WIVY-FM/97 was that call letters take precedence over frequency. Their reply to PDQ-FM was that if there is not an existing FM station in the market, the AM receives credit. As to WAVE, Arbitron explained that four flips had to be mentioned in a book before credit could be given.

These particular diaries were brought to your attention due to the fact that the three slogans, and flips were submitted to Arbitron in October, 1975. The slogans submitted were "FM/97," and "The WAVE." One of the flips submitted was "PDQ-FM," (now WAIV). Somewhere down the diary assembly line a breakdown in communications occurred...an apparent breakdown that could cost WAIV thousands of dollars in potential advertising revenue. Inasmuch that diary weight can vary from 500 to 2500 persons per diary, each diary credit is too valuable to forfeit.

At this point, I'm still confused on policies and procedures of Arbitron regarding flips and slogans. I'm sure this feeling is shared by many of my colleagues in the industry. Tom West suggests that there are too many grey areas in Arbitron's diary edit department. Programmers only have access to the in-tab diaries. How about the diaries that never leave the edit section? Are they thrown away?

2. The 18-24 controversy—This demographic is the most difficult one that will faithfully return in-tab Arbitron diaries. AOR's have got to pick up the 16-34's in order to win. Arbitron stated that they are aware of the 18-24 return deficiency but have not been able to solve it as of this date.

Unfortunately, in areas like Boston, Gainesville, Florida, and Berkeley where the college student population is a rather large factor, the students who live on campus are not represented under the current methodology approach used by Arbitron. My question is this: What if Arbitron used a similar method incorporated by Pulse to survey the college students?

Most every college student has a mail box. A list of every student who uses a mail box is probably available at the student post office. If this is the case, then a pre-survey questionnaire could be mailed to random post office boxes on each campus. You might be surprised at the results of this suggestion.

3. The surveying of unlisted phone number holders—The statistics of unlisted phone numbers may startle you! According to Southern Bell's Public Relations Representative, Joe Turk, 9.1% of all telephones on a nationwide basis are "unlisted." In some large metropolitan areas, unlisted numbers may rate as high as 20%. In essence, between 10-20% of the population are not being surveyed. Arbitron is aware of this problem and it's a serious problem that we are going to have to solve. Any suggestions on how unlisted households can be surveyed?

4. The surveying of the mobile population—Statistics here are interesting, too. Again, according to Southern Bell, between 15 and 20% of Jacksonville's population will move during the lifetime of one telephone book. This situation can complicate matters when those people change phone numbers or move into another zip code. If a person moves to another zip code during the lifetime of a phone directory, will he or she still receive a diary or will this move upset the pre-selected sample size?

As you can see, some of the areas covered in this article leave many questions unanswered. However, these areas could determine the success or failure of a radio station's financial status—this is serious. Hopefully, some definitive answers will be established in lieu of the standard Arbitron answer of "I'm sorry." This answer is old and we've heard it for many years.

May I have your comments colleagues?

### Hefner Vs. Ford

Hugh Hefner has voiced his complaints against President Ford's campaign stabs at Jimmy Carter's Playboy interview. The magazine also refuted a Ford statement that he had turned down an interview with them, stating that an interview offer was never made to the President. Hefner was disturbed at the Ford camp's idea that the Carter interview was "equivalent to posing naked in the center of the magazine."

### Pioneer's Centrex In Radio Push

The top 22 radio markets will be the main force in Pioneer Electronics' three week ad campaign, scheduled for the end of the month. The ads will push the Centrex Home Stereo Systems, which features AM/FM radio with either cassette or eight track. Two separate radio spots will run, one with the Bob Newhart Shows' "Howard" in a comedy commercial. The other is entitled "Reluctant Santa" also in a humorous approach.

### Concerts To Radio City Music Hall

The chocolate bars comes in four flavors, including a truffle-filled bar.

### Higher Datsun Budget

Nissan Motor Corp. U.S.A. launches their 1977 ad campaign this month with the slogan "Suddenly it's going to dawn on you. Datsun saves." Company spokesmen have said that the budget will surpass "significantly" the \$35 million spent during the last fiscal year.

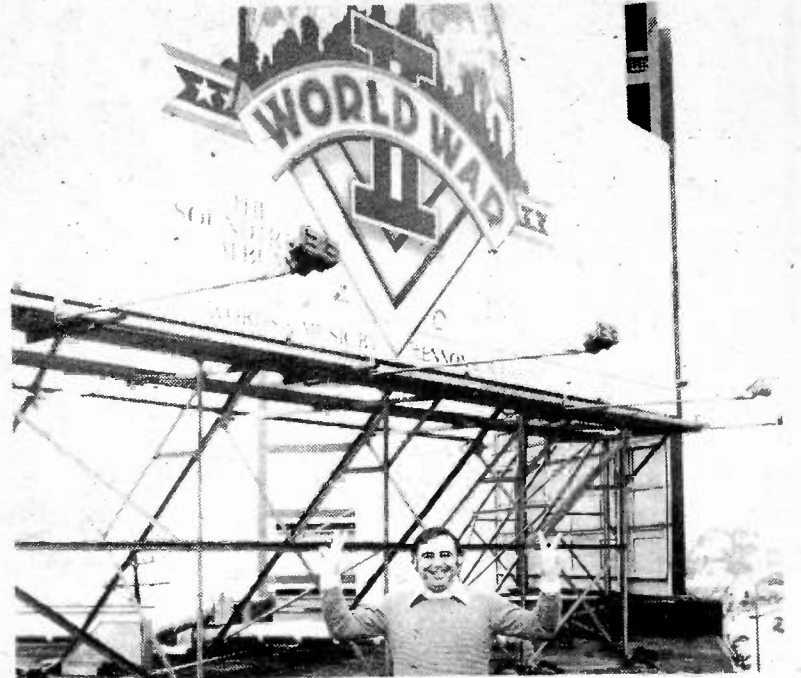

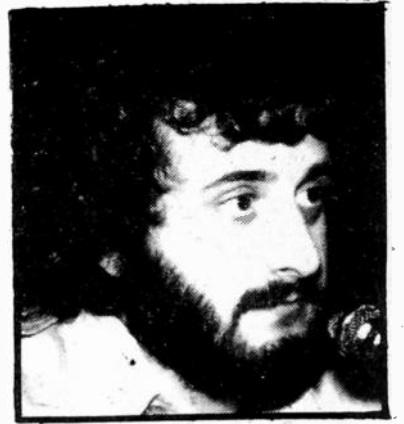

## Mike Harrison



It has been said, "The entire world's a stage..." and those of us in the business of electronic creativity and performance would probably like to think that this idea applies to radio. After all, whether we play music, give news, do production, or any of the many other roles and functions available to us within the framework of audio broadcasting, we do think of ourselves, to one degree or another, as performers.

The question is, however, is radio today really a stage for the individual projection and reflection of the human condition or has it become a vehicle for a machine which provides society with an audio backdrop?

In an age of the all-powerful media, we find different forms of media infiltrating each other and clouding up the differentiation between their individual uniqueness. For example, you see more and more of the film media making up what we consider to be the television media leaving the power of television's uniqueness almost solely to sports coverage and news broadcasting. When TV runs films, television then becomes nothing more than a vehicle rather than a stage for its own inherent creativity.

The same applies to radio. Music radio has become the main vehicle for the media of records, emphasizing that separate media form to the point of, perhaps, using it as a crutch to escape the burdens and risks of being that which is uniquely radio.

I am certainly not saying that TV should not run films or that radio should not play records. That of course would be ridiculous and, particularly in the case of the latter, would be in contradiction to the very philosophies and ideals of this publication, a strong and healthy relationship between the radio and record industries. Nevertheless, the record industry is always talking about and trying to develop other avenues or vehicles to bring their unique product to the public in addition to music radio...isn't it logical to assume that music radio should not lose sight of it's ability to flex those non-music muscles and be more than just a continuum of records on a vehicle called radio. That would be accomplished by refocusing it's interest and energy on being a stage for the many facets of creativity, art, entertainment, and communication that are inherent and unique to the medium called radio.

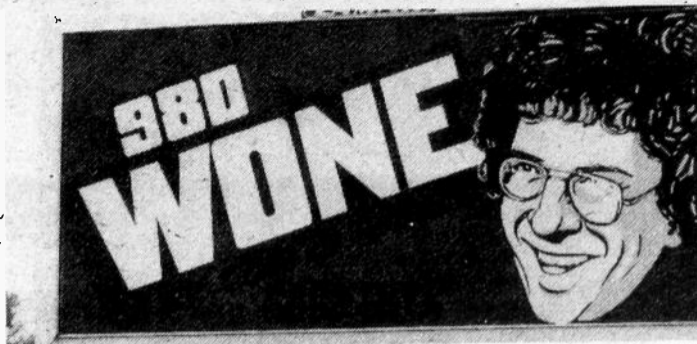

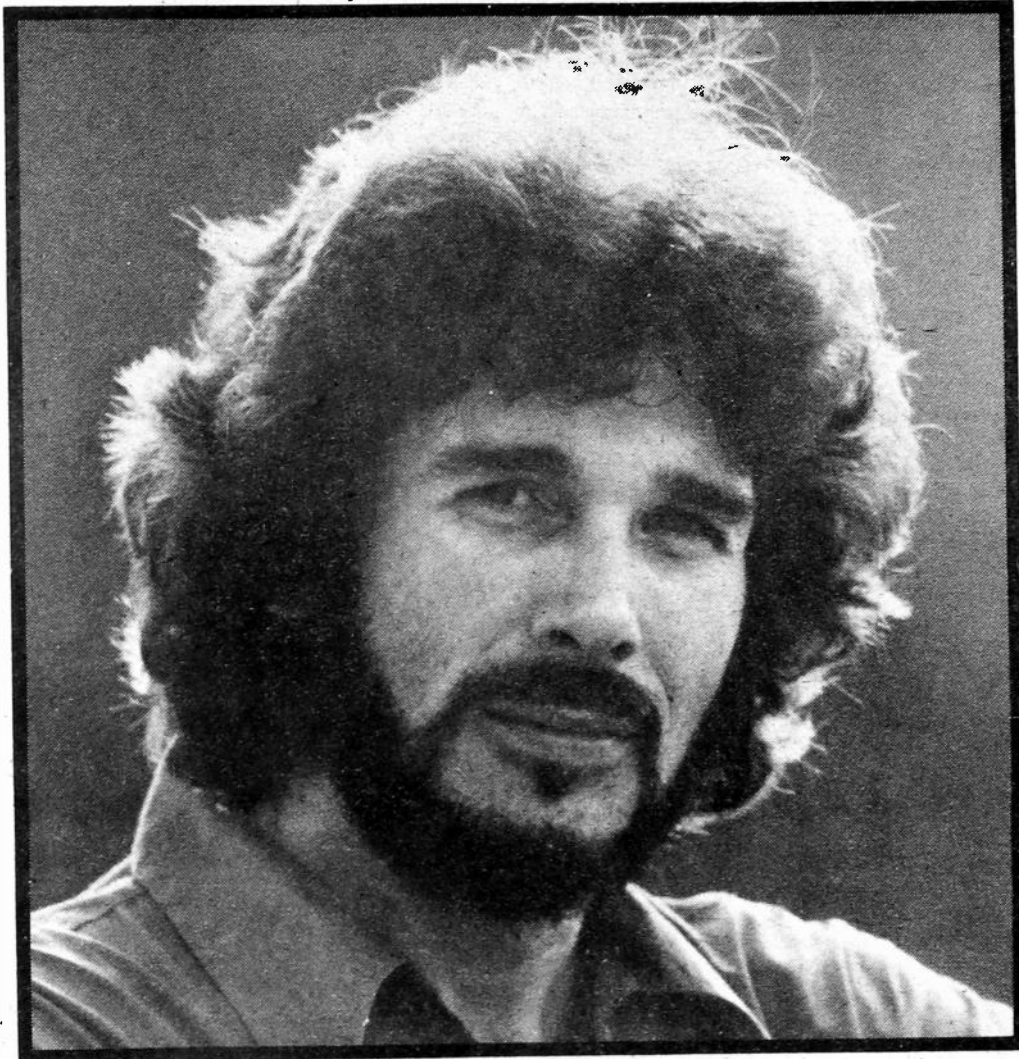

However there is a question as to whether or not Merle actually was the one to cancel the date...On the advice of her physician, RCA recording artist, DOLLY PARTON, has been forced to cancel all concert appearances for the remainder of the year. The physician said Ms. Parton is suffering from a severe throat condition and he has advised her that for the next two weeks she should talk only when necessary and he has forbidden her to sing for the balance of the year... FARON YOUNG's Jailhouse nightclub changed to Rhinestone Cowboy. Faron and MERLE KILGORE "batching" together in Faron's high priced pad. (He bought it from LIZ and CASEY ANDERSON. 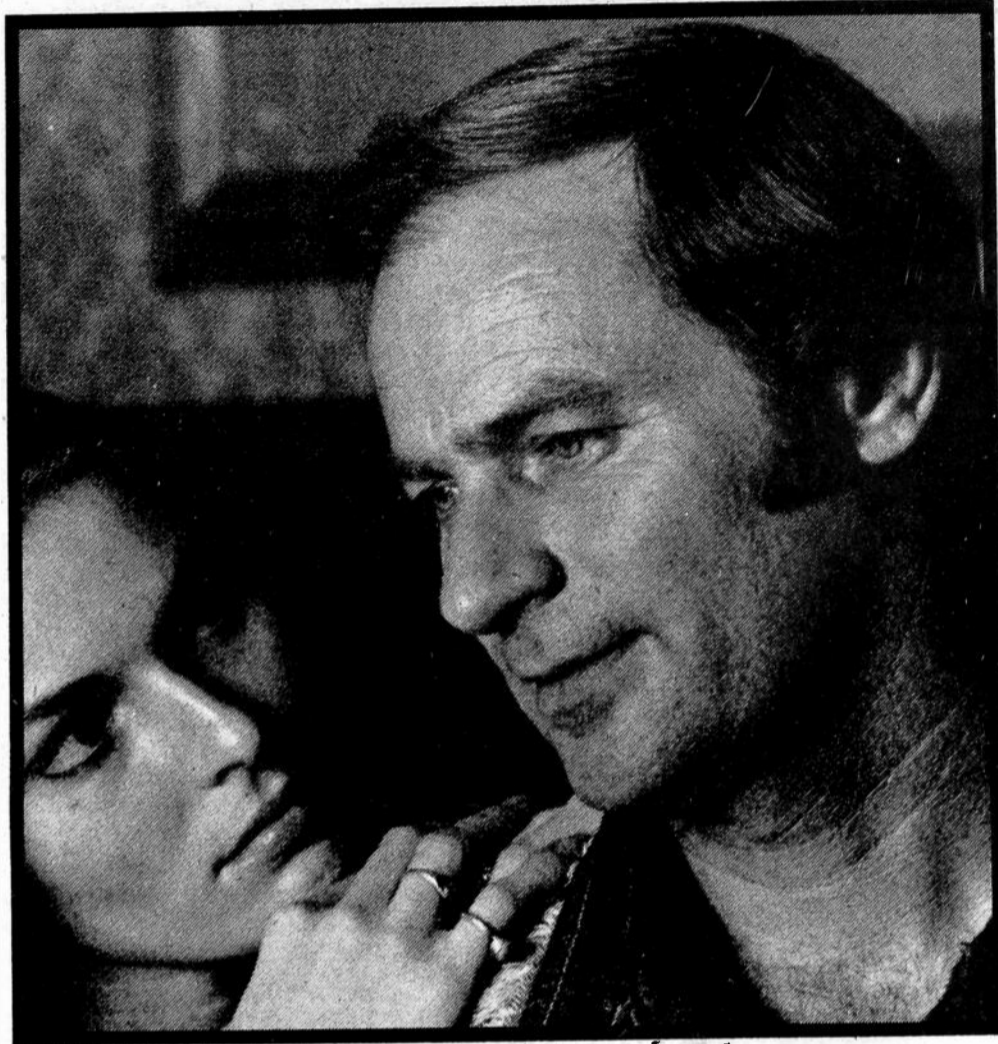

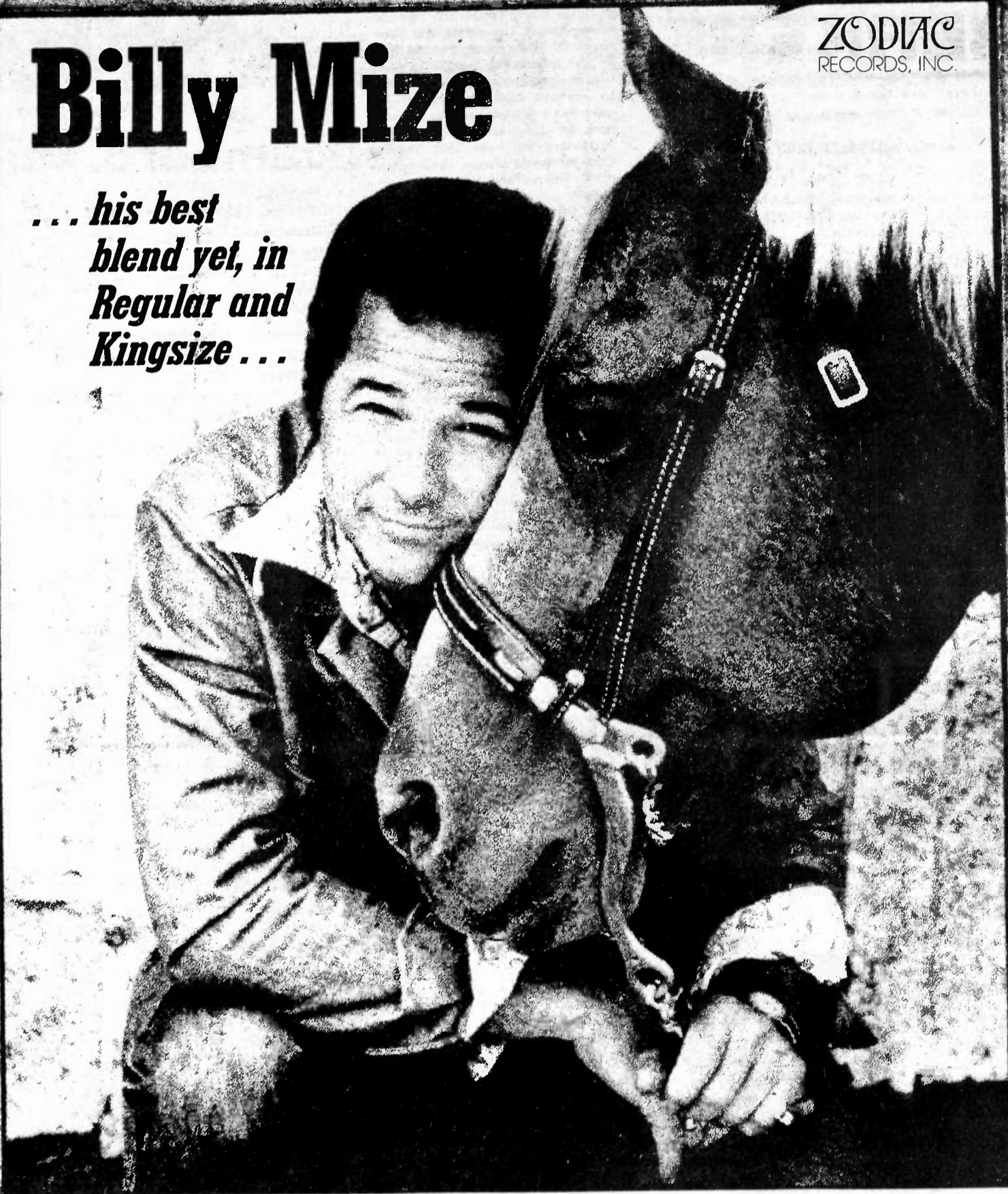

The joint venture was centered around a double weekend of CBS Country artists' concerts at Kings Island by Johnny Duncan, Sonny James, Tammy Wynette, Connie Smith, Billy Swan, Freddy Weller, and Johnny Paycheck. The event was designed for a two-fold purpose: to increase CBS Country albums sales in a four-state area; to increase park attendance at King's Island.

Utilizing the new CBS Records Country music prepack, catalog, product, national and local advertising dollars, point-of-purchase materials, and CBS artist appearances, Country album sales in the CBS/Cincinnati Branch's four-state territory tripled all forecasts. Additionally, park attendance rose over double that of previous years. With King's Island discount coupons on park admission, dealer involvement from a four-state area, press conferences, over 100 radio station involved in time-buys and album/park ticket giveaways, along with a CBS-sponsored talent search campaign, CBS Records' Country marketing division converted paid artist performances into a dynamic and timely merchandising thrust.

### Ed Salamon Comments On The "Grand Ole Opry"

Dear R&R:

I attended my third "DJ Convention" in Nashville last week, and I'm somewhat puzzled about the connection between a get together of Country radio folks and WSM's Grand Ole Opry 51st Anniversary Celebration.

The Opry certainly deserves a lot of credit for being one of the first major important forums for the presentation of Country music. It's members are part of the very fabric of Country music and Country radio history; just like Babe Ruth, Joe DiMaggio and Stan Musial are important to the early and formative years of baseball. Country radio and baseball certainly owe a degree of their present day success to the early legendary greats. But how relative are these former greats to the way the game is played today and how relative is WSM's Grand Ole Opry to today's Country radio?

However, the Country Music Association and the record companies must feel it's terribly important because they go to an awful lot of time and expense to produce a 90-minute television special and extravagant live shows held under the "Grand Ole Opry 51st Anniversary Celebration" banner, which essentially serves to promote the profit making enterprises of WSM Incorporated. Meanwhile, many of the stars of the current Grand Ole Opry can't even find record labels willing to press their records, and Country music is emanating more and more from places like Austin and Los Angeles. For example, in New York, America's most urban market, almost twice as many people listen to Country radio each week than attended the Grand Ole Opry in the whole of last year! That's more than three times as many people as even live in the city of Nashville!

It's great that there is a celebration every year to recognize WSM Inc., it's WSM Grand Ole Opry, and WSM Associated Enterprises like Opryland, but is it honest to celebrate it under the guise of a "Country Radio DJ Convention?" Perhaps if we had a more Country radio oriented convention, more radio folks would show up and less people from the fringe of the business. Wouldn't that be closer to the original aims of the folks that founded the get-together in 1949?

Be looking for a new Barry Manilow single from the album. It's the "Weekend In New England" cut and has already gotten good exposure as an album track from many Pop/Adult radio stations.

Another album cut that continues to show excellent strength is Stevie Wonder's "Isn't She Lovely." It is one of the hotter cuts at WIP, KEX and moves 14-8 at K96. Most of the stations reporting the cut are working with an edited version that runs about three and a half minutes.

Elton John is back in single form after two duets in a row with "Sorry Seems To Be The Hardest Word." All play at press time was from the album, but the single was to ship this past Monday (11/1).

Blood, Sweat & Tears showing some early impressive gains 13-9 KRMG, 24-18 KMRJ and reporting hot at WTMJ, WJNO and KITE.

The Beatles on record revival appears to be a real thing. Their new re-issue "Ob-La-Di, Ob-La-Da" which is from the "white" album is just getting into the field and went right on WASH, KVI and KIIS. It's another Paul McCartney lead vocal as was the case with "Got To Get You Into My Life."

Burton Cummings is coming on strong with another solid week of airplay...check New & Active.

The seemingly outrageous Alice Cooper continues to gather more and more attention at the Pop/Adult level. His latest "I Never Cry" was added to some very important P/A stations this week (see New & Active) and moves 14-8 at K96. Most of the stations reporting the cut are working WYMC.

The new Judy Collins out and getting attention at WMAL, WSB, WATR and KMRJ.

We note a good jump for the Gladys Knight record "So Sad The Song" at KAKE 7-4. It also reports hot at K101.

"Sing Your Own Song" by Mark Lindsay is showing excellent strength at West Palm Beach powerhouse WJNO.

Lee Hazelwood & Nancy Sinatra have teamed up again and might just repeat their earlier successes. Not a ton of play at this point but many programmers have had very favorable comments about it to me on the phone. Latest play includes WIOD and WATR.

The new Walter Murphy is off like a rocket...check New & Active.
