Arbitron Diary Scandal Foiled

In what could have turned into "another Memphis" (see last week's front page), six Arbitron diaries that were offered for sale to radio station KSJO/San Jose were turned in by station management.

Last week, a former employee of KSJO offered six Arbitron diaries for older Americans. The nationwide effort ties in with radio across the country for the "No Greater Love" charity. In years past, the Washington community, with the help of a notified Arbitron. Rosetta commented to R&R: "I did this to get the diaries off the street."

The blank diaries were obtained legitimately according to Arbitron methodology. The young Jardy's grandmother had been contacted by Arbitron about receiving a diary. Not knowing what to do, she handed the call over to the granddaughter who informed Arbitron that there were six people over twelve years of age in residence at that household. Arbitron sent six blank diaries to the house, addressed to the grandmother's deceased husband.

R&R contacted Ron Laufer, Arbitron Northwest Representative, for a comment. He said, "We are absolutely delighted by the posture he (Rosetta) has taken. Now we will do everything to prevent this from happening again. It shows that there is a high degree of integrity in the broadcasting business and we'll do our best to follow up on this with a complete investigation."

Rosetta sums up the broadcasters plight: "I hope that something is done

to prevent this type of situation from happening with a survey that is so crucial to our industry. I would hope that this incident will inspire Arbitron to tighten the method of interviewing their subjects before the diaries are placed. A good way to start is to limit the number of diaries placed in each household. Whatever we do here (at KSJO) to succeed we'll do it the right way and I hope that other broadcasters in the future who find themselves in a similar situation will do the same. Based on the drastic changes that questionable diaries made on the WHBQ situation and ratiating them to our market, those 6 diaries could have amounted to well in excess of a 1/4 newspaper, with 8 pages in the future. Musi-News will contain a printed playlist, artist bio's, station pictures, recording artist pictures, concert calendar, contest info, weekly columns penned by the station's jocks and more. In a very unique promotion, KCBQ PD Gerry Peterson gathered many never before heard Beatles tapes and songs. Included in the multi-hour presentation were seven never before released songs by the Beatles, the "Abbey Road," "Let It Be," and "Sgt. Pepper," recording sessions, which had Paul McCartney singing demo parts to the other Beatles as well as commenting on their performances. The show concluded with a bootleg Paul McCartney concert from the recent American tour. Peterson made the most of his find with a heavy week long promotional effort and closed the station down on Friday afternoon, locking all doors and posting armed guards to resist any cease and desist orders that were sure to come. Peterson was arrested at one point for causing a public disturbance, but was released within hours. The promotion caused tremendous reaction in San Diego and will assuredly spread soon.

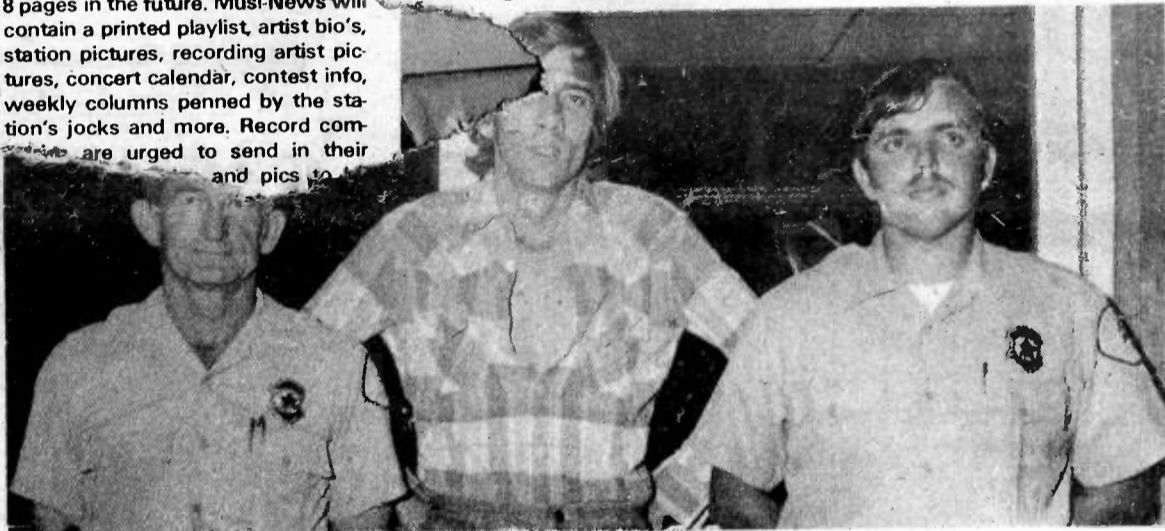

KHJ Contest Loser Files \$510,000 Suit

A contestant in the KHJ "See Through Safe" contest that was run 11 months ago has filed a \$510,000 law suit for damages when she didn't win. According to **Charlie Van Dyke**, KHJ PD, the woman showed up at one of the locations to try her combination. Contest rules called for contestants to write down their combination before they actually tried it on the safe. When the woman tried her combination, which was incorrect, the safe malfunctioned and opened even though the combination was

wrong. The correct combination was eventually found and the winner received the \$10,000 cash amount.

The station maintains that there really is no basis for the suit and they will fight it. KHJ printed and distributed rules to the contest that specifically pointed out that the contestant must submit the correct numerical combination in writing to win. The rules also included a disclaimer regarding mechanical or lock malfunctions.

NBC To Drop NIS

Jack G. Thayer, President NBC Radio Division, has announced that the network News & Information Service will be phased out by the middle of next year. The service was started in June of last year, and currently has under 70 stations, less than half of what NBC had expected to pick up by this date. Thayer said that the low level of station subscribers and national audience did not make it possible for the network to continue the round-the-clock news service.

Hooks Leaves FCC

FCC Commissioner Benjamin Hooks will resign his post effective January 1st of 1977 to become Executive Director of the NAACP, succeeding current director Roy Wilkins who has announced his retirement. Hooks has been with the FCC since 1972.

Pittman will become an off-the-air PD and now program the FM in addition to the AM. WMAQ's FM outlet will return to a music format when NBC's NIS goes off next year. Pittman is in need of jocks and has requested tapes and resumes.

Bob Goode exits the MD position at WSAI/Cincinnati. The move came about over a difference in programming philosophies Goode has been with WSAI for six years. He can be reached at (513) 251-5664.

Worthy Patterson has been named to the post of Eastern Marketing Manager for Casablanca Records, it was announced by **Dick Sherman**, VP, Sales. Patterson was most recently National Promotion Director for RCA.

Rocket recording artist **Cliff Richard** will have two of his albums released in the Soviet Union, it was announced by Rocket Executive Vice President **Tony King**. The LPs, "The Best Of Cliff Richard," and "I'm Nearly Famous," are the first by Cliff Richard ever to be available in the USSR. The release of these albums follows the artist's successful three week concert tour of Russia where Cliff did 20 concerts performing for over 90,000 enthusiastic fans.

On The Road With "J.J."

J.J. Jordan, R&R's new Top 40 Editor, will be making a cross country trip beginning this week. Jordan will be visiting radio stations and conducting interviews in the many different markets he'll travel through on his way to Los Angeles. Plans now call



for Jordan to take the route down the Northeast through the South and into Los Angeles.

A compilation of interviews and attitudes of Top 40 Programmers will make up a special January edition of Radio & Records.

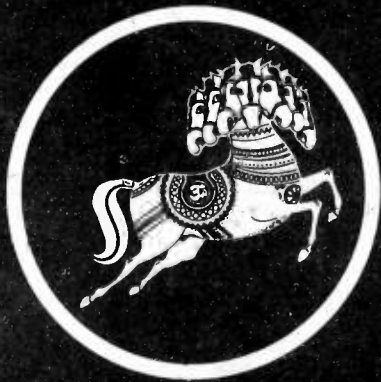

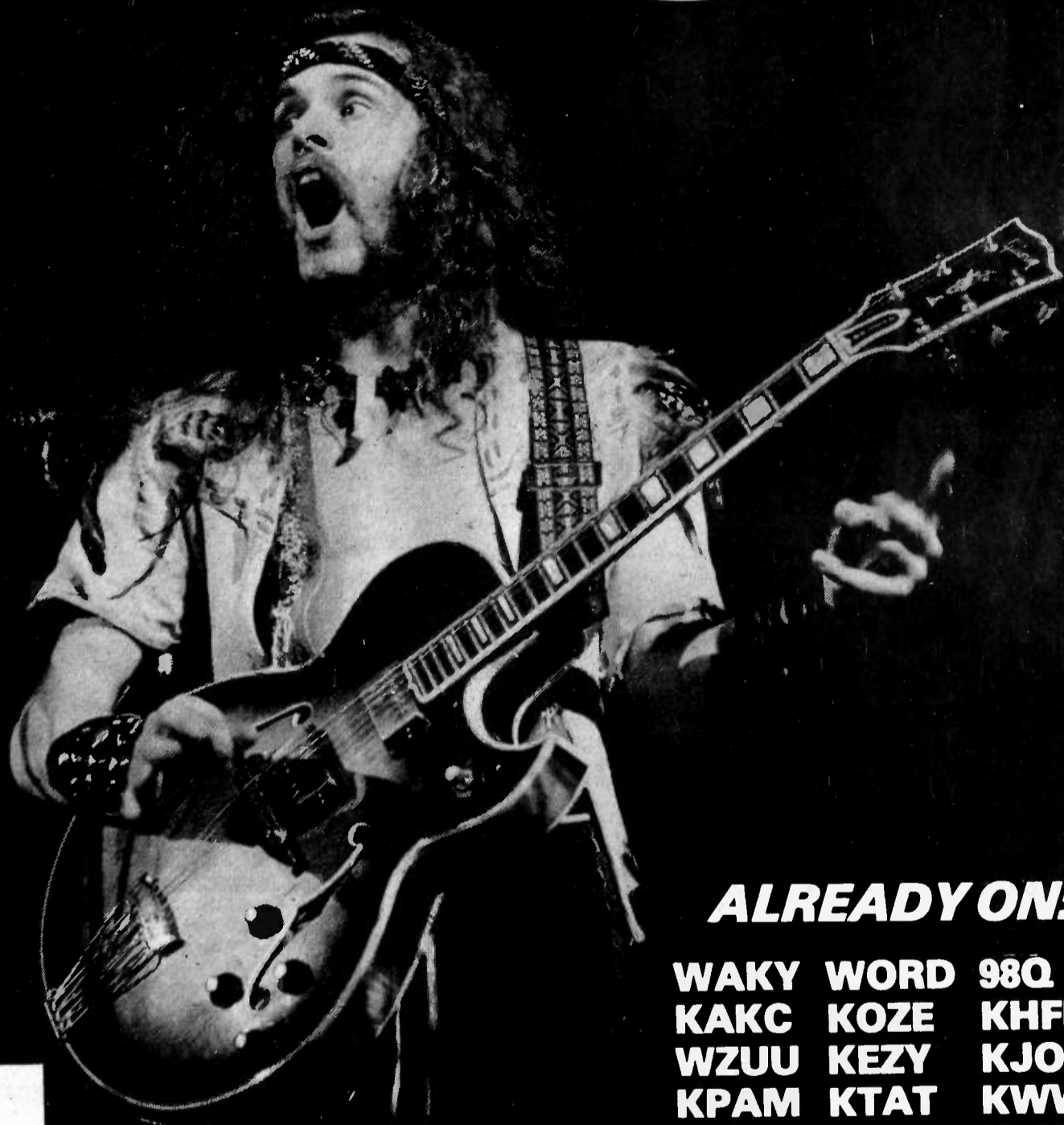

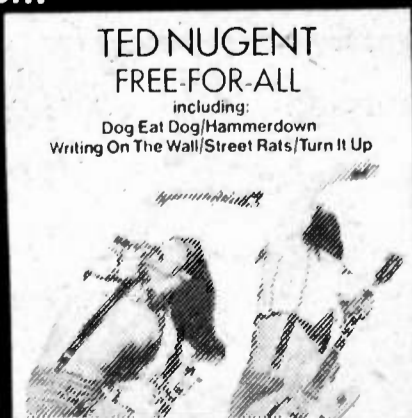

Record Year For Radio

An unprecedented revenue for radio was reached in 1976, according to statistics released by the FCC. Total revenues of \$1.7 billion exceeded 1974's previous record by 7.6 percent. Pre-tax profits were up 7.8 percent, while expenses kept pace with income, increasing 7.6 percent. Total advertising expenditures for radio reached \$1.8 billion an increase of 7.8 percent. FM revenues climbed 24.3 percent during 1976, continuing yearly increases for these stations. Total FM revenue was over \$380 million. Ad buys in network radio were up a significant 20.6 percent, national and regional spots were up 7.6 percent, local ads up 7.2 percent. Radio networks took losses of \$2.5 million after taxes and expenses, but the network owned and operated stations' profits were up 7.7 percent after a drop last year. The Commission reports that 61 percent of full-time operating commercial stations were profitable during the year, compared with 65 percent in 1974 and 60 percent in 1973.

Busy Complaint Month For FCC

The Federal Communications Commission received 1108 more complaints during September than for the previous month, for a total of 3119. Comments and inquiries were also up, totaling 2000 for the month, up 742. 1026 letters were sent in response to the public's questions.

Arbitron Monitors Newspapers

Arbitron has increased the number of markets surveyed by their Newspaper Advertising Reports and also announced plans to expand further in 1977. Markets surveyed in 1976 were San Francisco, Philadelphia and Boston, with Buffalo, Dallas, Sacramento, San Diego and Toledo added to the service this year. Twelve additional markets will be added next year. Newspaper Advertising Reports provide clients with a monthly monitored record of local newspaper advertising activity. The Reports aid broadcasters seeking to increase their share of local advertising budgets to identifying retail buys, co-op vendors and products advertised. By combining a full twelve months of NAR reports, stations can get an overview of annual budgets of local retailers. Also, NAR identifies specific budgets spent in newspapers on individual promotions such as Mother's Day, Back-To-School and others.

FCC OK's Mississippi License Renewals

The FCC has granted renewal of the licenses of 15 Mississippi radio stations that the NAACP had filed petitions to deny renewal on. WHII/Bay Springs, WVMI and WQID-FM/Biloxi, WACR/Columbus, WMAG and WQST-FM/Forest, WLSI and WJFR-FM/Jackson, WNAT and WQNZ-FM/Natchez and WJNS/Yazoo City were granted unconditional renewals. WMPA/Aberdeen, WJQS/Jackson, WLAU/Laurel and WHNY/McComb were granted conditional renewals pending equal employment opportunity reporting requirements being filed.

Harrison Settles With A&M

A&M Records' \$10 million lawsuit against George Harrison's Dark Horse Records has been settled. Terms of the settlement were not announced. Dark Horse has now pacted a manufacturing and distribution deal with Warner Bros., and will headquarter in Warner's Burbank offices. Dark Horse Manager Dennis Morgan and creative consultant Bob Cato remain with the label. Harrison's "33 1/3" LP will be released by Warner Bros. later this month.

Wiley To Stay With FCC

FCC Chairman Richard Wiley, responding to demands for his resignation by the Directors Guild of America, Writers Guild West and Screen Actors Guild, has said that he will not step down from his post. The Hollywood Guilds acted after reports that a Federal Court ruling stated that Wiley had made threats of government action on the "Family Hour" rule. Wiley stated that no such threats were expressed by the Commission or him, and that he will definitely retain his position until his current term expires.

New Faces In Carter Administration

Barely a week after the election, many Washington speculators have made guesses on what new faces the Carter Administration will bring into Communications offices. The election defeat of Senator Vance Hartke, who was the likely prospect to head the communications subcommittee, and Senator Frank Moss' defeat, will probably give the subcommittee chief position to Democratic Senator Ernest Hollings. A nearly complete turnover in that subcommittee is seen, since California Senator John Tunney, J. Glenn Beall of Maryland, and James Buckley of New York all lost their seats in the Senate. Of the 18 member panel, 7 vacancies will be filled by Carter. The White House office of Telecommunications will also see a complete turnover to the Democratic team. Additional changes that will affect broadcasters is the appointment of a new anti-trust chief in the Department of Justice.

Mexican Stations Facing Strict Music Legislation

New members of Mexico's Chamber of Deputies have introduced a bill which would restrict Mexican licensed radio stations to playing 90 percent Mexican music. The amendment to the Radio & Television Law has been attacked by many in the industry there. Many fear that if the bill is passed into law, that it may extend into other media, including theater, concerts, motion pictures and the like. Mexican lawmakers have accused radio of airing primarily imported tunes, but acknowledge that the country's Classical music stations would still be allowed to program Mozart, Beethoven, and other non-Mexican classics if the law is passed.

Conditional Renewal In St. Louis

Although the FCC has issued a conditional renewal of license for KSD and KSD-TV/St. Louis, the Commission said that final determination of the license is dependent on U.S. District Court rulings on equal employment opportunity. The Commission denied petitions by the St. Louis Broadcast Coalition and one of their constituent organizations, which claimed that the stations were faulty in their community ascertainment, past programming, proposed programming, fairness doctrine and compliance with public file rules. Earlier, the FCC had turned down a Department of Justice petition against renewal of the stations because of cross-ownership rulings.

Hearing For San Diego Station

Two San Diego residents have asked the FCC to question the renewal of KDIG-FM/San Diego, contending that the station's programming failed to meet the needs of the community, and that they had repeatedly violated FCC rules. The Commission has set a hearing on the license application of West Coast Media Inc., owner of KDIG.

Screen Gems-EMI To Manage Capitol Publishing

Bhaskar Menon, President of Capitol Industries-EMI Inc., and Lester Sill, President of Screen Gems-EMI Music Inc., have announced that the catalogs and business of Capitol's Beechwood, Glenwood and Central songs music publishing companies will be managed world wide by Screen-Gems-EMI.

WOMP-AM-FM, BELLAIRE, OHIO, GRANTED SHORT TERM RENEWALS

The Commission has granted T/R Inc., short-term license renewals for its stations WOMP and WOMP-FM, Bellaire, Ohio, for the period ending December 1, 1977.

The Commission said that based on an investigation conducted in September 1975 into the affairs of WOMP and WOMP-FM it found the stations failed to conduct a contest in accordance with FCC policy, broadcast a program-length commercial and violated numerous technical rule requirements.

The FCC said evidence obtained during the field investigation indicated that during May and June 1975, WOMP conducted a contest called the "Pot Of Gold Funtest." According to promotional announcements of the contest, listeners could win thousands of dollars by submitting postcards to the station.

WOMP's General Manager stated that he initially broadcast the announcement using the figure \$20,000 as the amount that could be won, but later increased this amount to \$250,000 as the contest progressed. Although the announcement indicated that the drawing would be conducted May 12, the General Manager stated that the drawing "took place around the first of June 1975." At the time of the drawing, he said, it was announced that the prizes were a total of 50 tickets for the Ohio State Lottery.

The licensee asserted that no promotional announcement stated that WOMP would award any money whatsoever—only that WOMP would make its listeners eligible to win. It also contended that at no time were its employees or the public told that the stations would give away any money, rather they were told that listeners would be eligible to win in the Ohio State Lottery.

WOMP announcing employees stated to FCC investigators that they believed cash prizes were to be awarded and they did not learn until the drawing that the prizes were Ohio State Lottery tickets.

In addition, on September 25, 1975, Commission staff members tape recorded a one-half hour program entitled "Home Sweet Home," which consisted primarily of a discussion by Jimmy Bee of home repair questions submitted by telephone calls from listeners. Both the introduction to the program and the WOMP program log for September 25, 1975, identified the sponsor as the Wheeling Paint Company.

During the course of the program, Bee, who, with his wife, operates a Wheeling Paint Company, recommended specific products. Both Bee and his wife, who also participated in the program, made statements that all products mentioned on the program were available at the Wheeling Paint Company and invited listeners to visit the store to browse and gave instructions on the store's location.

As a result of an inspection of the stations by an engineer from the FCC's Detroit Field Office, Official Notices of Violation were issued for WOMP and WOMP-FM for numerous technical rule violations.

In response, the licensee informed the Commission that action had been taken to remedy the violations. However, the Commission noted that the remedial action did not correct a violation of Section 73.56(a) concerning the defective nature of the AM modulation monitor.

The Commission said it appeared that the promotional announcements concerning the "Pot of Gold Funtest" were misleading regarding the amount or nature of prizes.

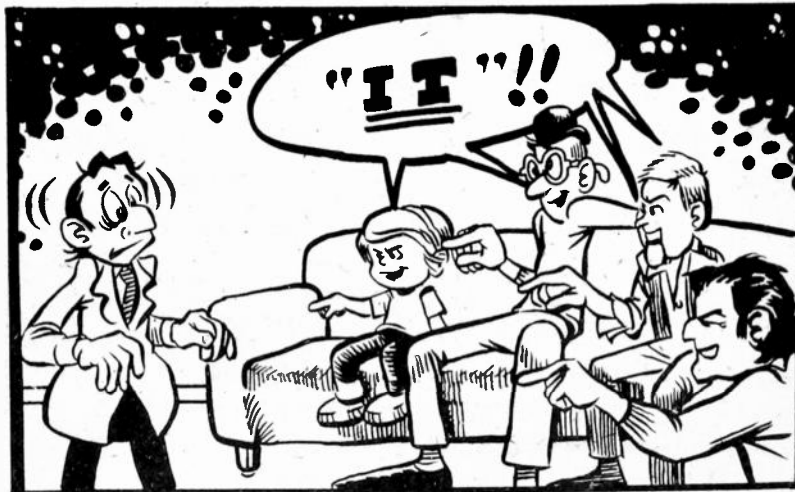
TV News

NIelsen FAVORS ABC AGAIN

The sixth week of network programming has ABC on top again with a 20.6 rating. NBC, with three special features "Bob Hope," "Amelia Earhart," and "Life Goes To The Movies" held second place with a 19.3 rating. CBS came in third with a 17.6. Six of the top 10 shows were ABC's, starting off with the top four: "Happy Days," "Charlie's Angels," "Bionic Woman," and "Laverne & Shirley." Following were "Bob Hope," "Baratta," "Six Million Dollar Man," "All In The Family," "Amelia Earhart," and a surprising tenth place for Jimmy Carter's final political statement.

OTHER TV NEWS

American Bandstand's 25th anniversary will air in prime time on ABC next February 11th, with flashbacks of Bandstand highlights from years past. Also included will be "Celebrity Jam Band" featuring numerous recording heavies. Among those hosting will be The Captain & Tennille, Chubby Checker, Barry Manilow, and Chuck Berry, with special appearances by Stevie Wonder, Sonny Bono, The Carpenters and Tony Orlando. All together, 75 stars will be spotlighted in the two hour special...The ABC owned and operated TV stations will air a new half hour musical "Sha Na Na," now being taped...NBC won the Election Night battle with an estimated 54 million viewers, CBS followed with about 4 million less, and ABC finished last with an estimate of 37 million...The Carter advertising force placed better in ratings than Gerald Ford's political shows. Carter's 10th place finishing last week compares with Ford's best performance, coming in 29th. Both half-hour shows were on ABC.

Parallels

Inside Abba

Those of you who consider ABBA to be merely another competent Top-40 single machine should consider this fact in terms of record sales and audience acceptance, they are the biggest group in the world. Every record they turn out goes straight to number one in virtually every country in the world.

With this fact in mind you begin to wonder why they haven't achieved this level of success in America. Not that they haven't done well here (their most recent single "Fernando" was a top ten record in R&R, and they've had several other huge hits in this country, including "Waterloo" and "SOS"). But even so, nobody in the U.S. would consider them to be a supergroup, by any means. When I had a chance to talk to the group (Bjorn Ulvaeus, his wife Agnetha, Benny Andersson, and his fiancée Annifrid Lyngstad) I asked them whether or not they were concerned with their second-rate status (compared to the worldwide situation) in America, and if so, what were they prepared to do about it. Bjorn (pronounced "Bee-om") responded by saying that they were indeed interested in reaching the level here that they have reached everywhere else, and that "We'll do anything to get there, except maybe to play concerts here before people really want to see us."

Why was it, I wondered, that ABBA doesn't tour here?

"We don't tour anywhere," replied Bjorn, "and we haven't for two years. We spend such a long time writing and recording and doing television that what little time we have left over, we like to spend with our families."

Do they foresee a U.S. concert tour at some point in the future?

"For us to tour in the States right now, there would be no real audience. We wouldn't fill the Los Angeles Forum, would we? The problem is, we're still considered a singles group here, and it's much harder for singles groups to draw a lot of people."

You get the impression, despite what the group claims, that they really don't stay up nights worrying about how to increase their U.S. stature. There's no reason that they should. With worldwide sales of over 30 million units in the last four years, they aren't exactly starving.

ABBA's most recent hit "Fernando," represents quite a departure from the music usually associated with the group. An eerie, mysterious song with overtones of love, death and revolution, it's by no means a typical Top-40 smash. Listening to the song, it seems to be about the Mexican revolution. Is it?

"We've been asked that question before," replied Benny, "but we really don't want to pinpoint any special event in history or any special place. We just wanted to create a feeling. It could be about any revolution. Lyrics have never been that important to us. We use them to fit in with the music, which is important. You see, the vast majority of our audience can't understand our lyrics anyway, since they don't speak English. In Poland or Germany or Italy or France they don't have any idea what we're singing about. They just like the



melody and the sound of our records. As for "Fernando," I don't want to say too much, because it was meant to be a little mysterious."

Since the group does appeal to a non-English speaking audience, the emphasis must necessarily be on production. Here, ABBA takes a back seat to no one. Their productions (by Bjorn & Benny) are the most complex to appear regularly on Top-40 radio since the days of Phil Spector.

"Our idols," said Bjorn, "are Phil Spector and Brian Wilson. In our opinion they are simply the best producers of Rock music in the history of the form. Nowadays you don't hear many records that have a good performer, a good song, and a good production. You might hear a very good performance or a very good song or a very good production, but seldom do you hear all three like you will on "Good Vibrations," for example."

Since the group's American acceptance thus far has been confined to Top 40 radio, I wondered if they were interested in reaching AOR audiences as well. Would they ever consider making music that was somewhat more subtle, more program-mable on AOR?

"It would be nice," said Benny, "but we feel they could play the music we are making now. There's a lot in our music that they could be playing on AOR if they wanted to."

Since ABBA depends on Top 40 for airplay, I wondered what they thought of the tight playlist that governs Top 40 programming.

Benny responded: "I really think that the tight playlist must contribute to the quality of music that you hear in America as opposed to the quality of average German music and average French music, and so on. I think it helps. For one thing, the audiences are more sophisticated here and they go for more sophisticated records. This must be due to the fact that radio plays these records over and over again. They have to be well-made records in order to hold up over so many plays. Another advantage of the tight playlist is that it enables the more

advanced sounding records that you might not fall for the first time to become acceptable through repeated plays."

"One More thing I want to say about this," continued Benny, "is that radio people over here (in America) are in a very good situation that they might not appreciate. Take Swedish radio for instance—we have three stations, and maybe one and a half hours per day of Rock and Roll. It would be hard, I suppose, to find a format that would please everyone, but I think in the U.S. at least you have a choice. Anybody if they look, can find music to fit their tastes, which you can't do anywhere in Europe, really."

Since the group has yet to break through in the States the way they have elsewhere, I asked if they were pleased with the way their U.S. record company, Atlantic, has handled them thus far.

"Yes," said Bjorn without any hesitation. "I think it's a very good record company and we have very good relations with the people working in it. They do almost all the work for us in the States. We don't have a manager here, don't have an agent—they've done it all so far. And we feel they're behind us. We're the only act they have in our particular field, which means they can concentrate on us. In fact, I think they're more behind us than we are behind them. What I mean is that we don't tour here or come here that often, which we really should do more of. It's all a matter of exposure. It seems that the audience needs to have a face behind the music in order for it to be popular on a mass level. We don't have that yet. I imagine that some people must think that ABBA is a solo female singer, which is what you'd think if you've just heard our records. But I really believe that it's just a matter of time now and that our time is coming. I mean if everybody likes it in the whole world, why shouldn't they here?"

Seider Promoted At UA Music

Harold Seider has been promoted to the new post of President of United Artists Music & Records Group Inc.'s international division. Seider was formerly Business Affairs VP. UA President Artie Mogull said that Seider's appointment was the forefront of the company's plans to acquire overseas artists for U.S. distribution by the label.

Mercury's Biggest Month Ever

October was the biggest sales month in Phonogram/Mercury's history. Senior VP of Marketing Jules Abramson stated that the month's successes were due to "a wide range of new releases and previously released LPs in all musical areas that contributed." LP product from Thin Lizzy, the Ohio Players and BTO were given partial credit for the surge.

Playboy To Study Men

Pollsters Louis Harris & Associates have been commissioned by Playboy Enterprises to do a major survey on American men, including behavior patterns, attitudes, changing values and goals. The report, to be published this spring, will be titled "Playboy Report on American Men," and will release statistics and trends on male attitudes about themselves and their environment.

Beasley Broadcasting Buys Savannah Stations

Pending FCC approval, the Beasley Broadcast Group, based in Goldsboro, North Carolina, will purchase WSAV and WSGF-FM/Savannah. Beasley currently owns stations in Georgia, Alabama, North Carolina and Ohio.

George Burns To Become "God"

Upcoming film "Oh God," directed by Carl Reiner and produced by Jerry Weintraub, will star George Burns in the God role, and John Denver as a supermarket manager. Production starts on the film next month, marking the first movie done by Burns since his Academy Award winning acting in "The Sunshine Boys."

Labor Board On Drug-Related Firings

The National Labor Relations Board has ruled that one company's firing of an employee

for allegedly smoking marijuana on the job was illegal. The Board found that the company allowed workers to consume alcohol on the job in their ruling. The NLRB also noted that the fired worker had distributed union cards, which was the actual reason for his release.

Middle-Agers Decline Newspaper Reading

Although many industry experts have attributed the decline in newspaper circulation to the younger generation, a study by Market Opinion Research shows that the 35 to 44 year old bracket may be the culprits. This age group reduced their newspaper reading by 12 percent since 1962, while decline in the 18 to 24 demographic slipped only 4 percent. In the 25 to 34 bracket, 8 percent reduced their newspaper reading habits. In the company's study of 1973-1975 reading, the study showed that mid-morning papers held younger readers better than the older generation.

It pointed out that it previously has stated that serious questions would be raised as to the sense of responsibility of a broadcast licensee disseminating false or misleading information regarding the amount or nature of prizes. The FCC also has indicated that it requires licensees that conduct contests to adequately supervise and control the contests to assure that they are conducted fairly and are substantially as represented in announcements to the public.

With the respect of the broadcast of the "Home Sweet Home" program, the Commission said because the noncommercial informational portions of the program were so closely interwoven with the advertising portions for the sponsor's products the entire one-half hour program must be considered a program-length commercial.

In view of these findings, the Commission said it appeared that T/R, Inc., had fallen short of the FCC's requirements concerning the manner in which broadcast contests are to be conducted, and also has failed to comply with FCC policies with respect to the broadcast of program-length commercials and technical requirements for the operation of radio stations.

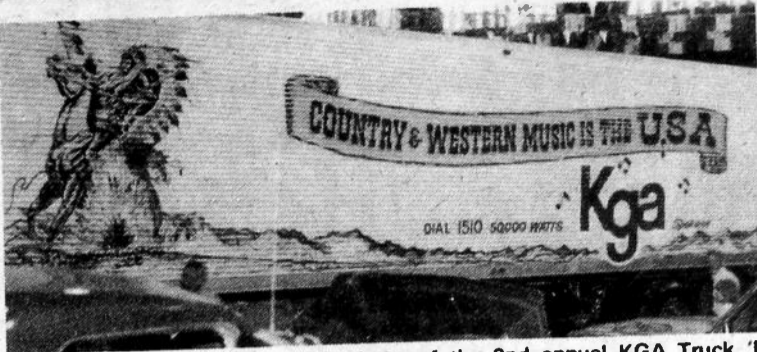

The JOHNNY CASH Christmas Show, one of only two Yuletide specials to be aired by CBS, was taped here last week with guests ROY CLARK, TONY ORLANDO, BARBARA MANDRELL, MERLE TRAVIS, THE CARTER FAMILY, JAN HOWARD, BILLY GRAHAM, TOMMY CASH, plus his wife JUNE and members of the family. While here, Orlando filmed a segment with Cash to appear on Tony's show this week. It's nice how stars can exchange guest shots and both save money. The only other special CBS will do this Christmas is BING CROSBY. They moved most of all of Cash's den furniture from the house on the lake to the Opryland studios, so what you see on the show December 5th is, for all practical purposes, the den at Johnny and June's house.

RCA will have a cocktail reception a week from Sunday at the exclusive Nashville CITY CLUB for JOHN DENVER between his two shows at the Opry House that will cost over \$10,000. Denver asked company people to invite local Country artists to the affair. Invitations are at a premium.

When MARY REEVES DAVIS saw the wax model of sculptor BILL RAINES' work honoring JIM REEVES she cried. I saw it the other day, and it was frighteningly realistic. Raines asked Mary if there was anything she wanted changed, she suggested a slight re-positioning of the hands. It's really JIM though, the way he stood, smiled, everything. The first bronze casting will be presented to the Country Music Hall of Fame, the second to Mary, his wife. Raines estimates his investment in the project at \$37,000, not counting his time. 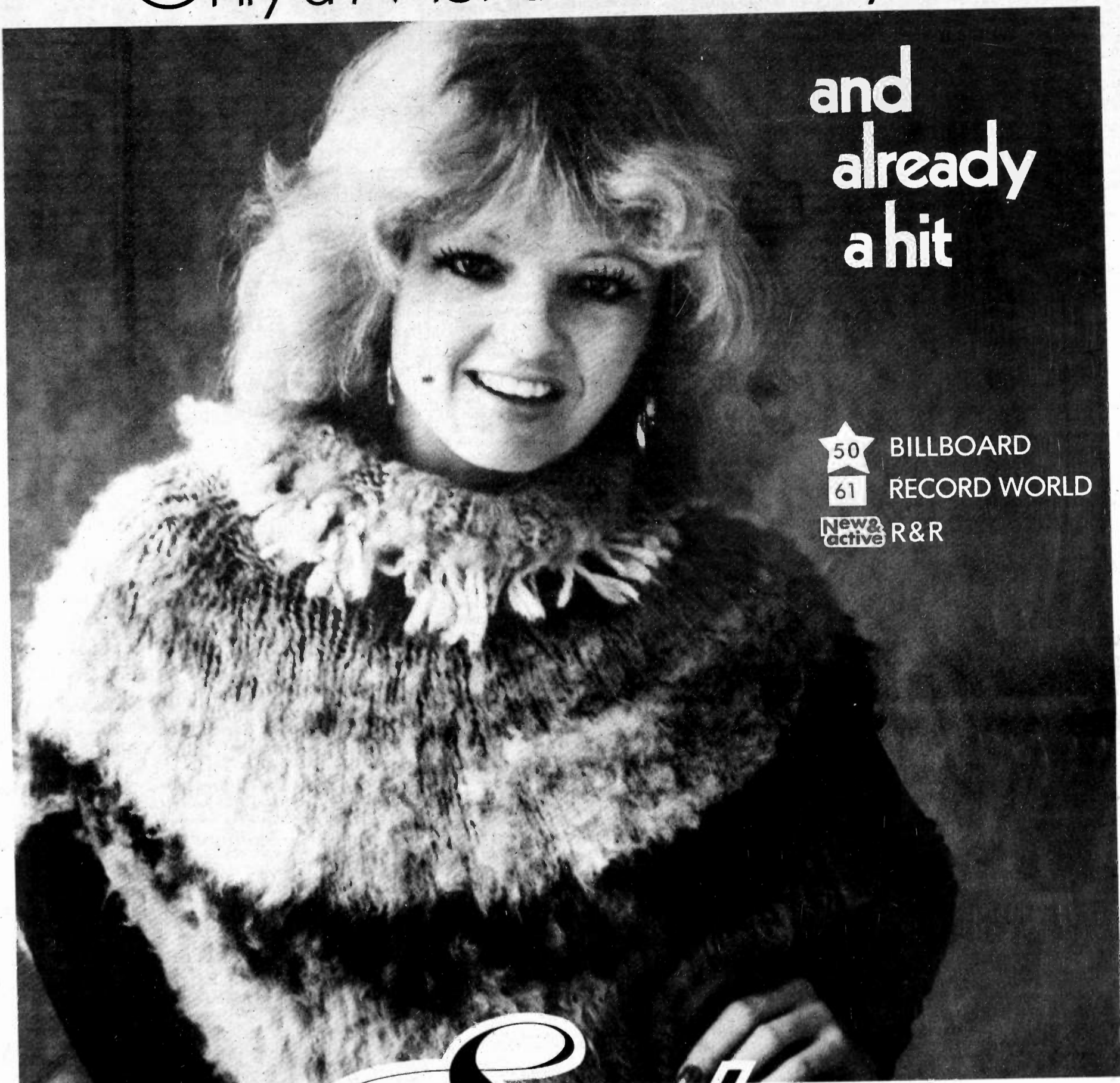

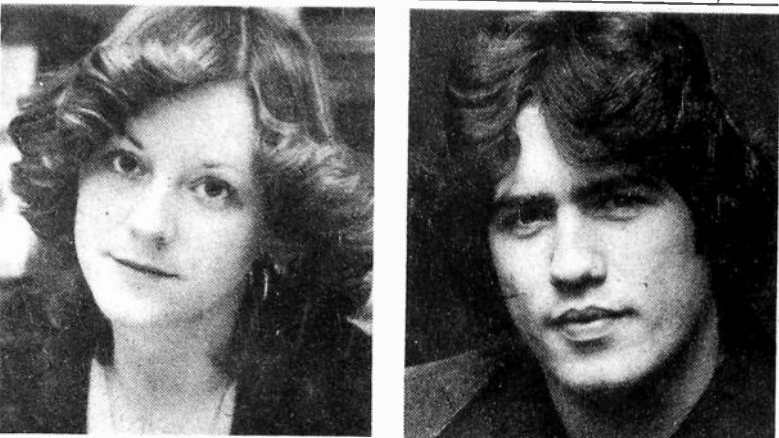

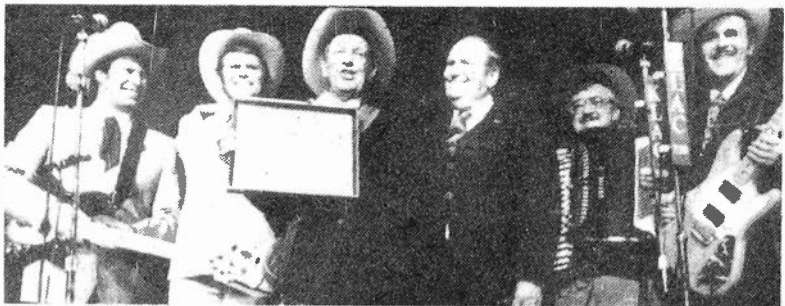

Comments On A.C.E.

Dear R&R:

While glancing over some AP copy early this morning, I came across the article in which ACE, was criticizing the Country music radio stations for not playing a variety of Country product. The group, consisting of Billy Grammar, Bill Carlisle, Vic Willis, Del Wood, Jim Ed Brown, Grandpa Jones and Barbara Mandrell, claims that the lack of variety in Country music is "the worst crisis Country music as an art form has faced in 20 years."

I can't truly believe that ACE has taken a truly objective look at Country music radio. It's changed so much in the past five years that for the first time, more and more people are receiving airplay than ever before. More new artists are coming into being, and more appreciation is being given to the traditionalists of Country product. The ACE views that repetitions hurt the Country music industry is narrow-minded and full of loopholes. Fortunately for the mentioned artists, repetition has given them a name in the recording industry. As for some of the artists, a new release every now and then wouldn't hurt. According to Joel Whitburn, Del Wood hasn't had a hit record since "Down Yonder" in 1951. Does he expect us to play it once a day and call him one of the "greats" in Country music?

ACE makes the claim that "much product not wanted by the consumer is being pushed down his throat, and he's being told he likes it." I'll admit that many times a station will play a song that doesn't have any particular socially redeeming value to it, but is that the fault of the stations? KSSS played Red Sovine's "Teddy Bear" til the jocks threatened to hide it, but the phones kept on ringing and the record sales climbed. Do we tell our callers that they shouldn't buy a record because they really don't like it, and not to request it for the same reason? I think not!

Most of the programmers that I have spoken with continually fight to keep the music fresh, and come up with a good blend of old and new. I think that once again, ACE has shown the purely emotional side of the Country industry. We are not trying to destroy careers, as they put it. If anything, we're helping a lot of people make new careers and enhance the ones that are already established. We as programmers are trying the best we can to entertain and support Country music, so I would say to ACE representatives, help us...don't criticize us, and we in turn will help you. But comments such as the ones that came out of their recent meeting aren't going to help them, or Country music.

Stevie Wonder's "Isn't She Lovely" continues to be the most active album cut in the country for Pop/Adult programmers. Most stations have done an edit, bringing the running time from six minutes down to three or three and a half. See New & Active for latest adds.

Brook Benton is back on the scene and has gotten two heavyweights right off the bat...WNEW and WIOD.

We note early interest on the Stephen Bishop record "Save It For A Rainy Day" on ABC. First three stations are 50,000 watters...KFI, WSM and WNEW.

Many programmers have commented to me about the fine vocal treatment given to "You're The One" by David Clayton-Thomas. Good moves include 26-10 WLW, 13-8 WSAV, 22-18 KWAV and hot reports from WIOD, KHOW, WTMJ, KITE, WJNO.

Big jumper again this week is Alice Cooper's "I Never Cry" 16-10 WSAV, 15-9 WCHV, 9-5 K149, 6-4 WATR and reporting hot at WIP.

If you missed the Dr. Buzzard record the first time around, you might want to take a second listen. "Cherchez La Femme" went on four very important stations this week...WNEW, WIOD, KFI and K101.

Yvonne Elliman is having her best entry to date with "Love Me" And at this point a lot of stations do. We show hot reports from WIP, KFI, KITE, KNBR, WTMJ, WIP, KWAV, WHOK.

LaVern & Shirley's debut into the record business got immediate attention at three powerhouse stations...WGN, WSB and WGY.

A couple of overseas smashes starting to get some attention in the States are "Dancing Queen" by Abba (which registered number one requests last week at KEX) and "Mississippi" by Pussycat (which is now getting action at KNBR.) The Pussycat record hit the number one slot in England, while Abba soared to the top in Australia.

The Rowans record shows continued airplay growth with key adds at WSM and WTRX.

The new Boz Scaggs went right on WSM, KFI and KIIS.

We note a lot of positive comments on the Frank Sinatra version of John Denver's tune "Like A Sad Song." Consensus opinion from programmers is that Francis sounds as though the song was written just for him. Check New & Active for initial airplay.
