Miami

Nice story here as Jerry Clifton makes a solid return, bringing the ailing Bartell facility WMJX (R) neck and neck with Y100 (R) and beating WOAM. WMJX up to 5.9 from 2.2, Y100 6.7 down to 6.0 and WOAM 5.4 to 4.4. WINZ-FM (A) mellow Rocking up to 3.8 from 2.0. WQBA (S) still number one with a 14.4, WLYF (BM) the leading lush sounder with a 6.1, down from 6.5. Tight Pop/Adult battle here, WGBS (PA) 3.8 to 3.7, WINZ (PA) 3.7 to 4.8, WIOD (PA) 3.4 to 4.2. WAXY (O) 1.5 to 2.2, WSHE (A) 3.0 to 1.7, WEDR (B) 3.3 to 3.9, WWOK (C) 2.5 to 2.6. In Adults 18-34 WMJX-FM has a 9.8, Y100 a 9.7, WMJX 7.9, WQBA 7.8, WEDR a 7.2. In Adults 18-49 WQBA 13.6, Y100 6.7, WINZ-FM 6.2, WMJX 5.7. In Teens WMJX 29.7, Y100 19.5, WEDR 10.8, WQAM 9.7.

Pittsburgh

The success story in this market is Ted Atkins' WTAE, jumping up to a solid number two position in the market, 5.0 to 9.0 on AM, 1.5 to 2.8 on FM. KDKA (PA) still way on top with a 22.6, down a bit from 25.8. Another success here is WEEP AM & FM who returned to the Country format just a few months before the book. In a total audience switch they went from a combined 5.4 with a Talk format to a combined 5.7 with Country music. In the Rock battle WPEZ (R) slipped 5.7 to 5.0, but came in ahead of 13Q (R) who slid 6.1 to 4.7. WDVE (A) 6.8 to 5.7, KQV (N) 1.5 to 3.0. WAMO (B) AM & FM 4.5 to 3.9, WYDD (A) 1.3 to 1.9. WSHH (BM) on top of the lush musc stations with a 7.5, up from 6.3. In Adults 18-49 KDKA 18.1, WTAE 14.0, WDVE 6.8, WEEP AM & FM 5.8, WKTO (13Q) 5.6. In Teens WPEZ 23.4, WDVE 22.4, WKTO (13Q) 17.2.

Lake To St. Louis

Charlie Lake, Program Director of WPEZ/Pittsburgh, has resigned his position to accept the Program Directorship of KSLQ/St. Louis, effective the first week in February. Lake told R&R: "Having recently converted to vegetarianism, I was smitten by the irony of George Wilson's invitation to become a piece of meat for Bartell Broadcasting. That coupled with the opportunity to live in St. Louis, the San Francisco of the Mid-West, precluded any thought of refusal. I will miss WPEZ and Pittsburgh but look forward to my new position as Program Director of KSLQ." Under Lake, WPEZ, in the just-released Pittsburgh Arbitron, moved to the top Rocker position in the market, just edging out 13Q.

Convention Update

The Radio & Records Convention & Expo '77 is only four weeks away. If you have not yet made your room reservations, we suggest you call either the Dallas Sheraton or Dupont Plaza hotels direct. Some highlights of this year's schedule are the special Friday night one-to-one sessions, where top programmers from all formats and research companies will be available to meet and discuss radio in an informal setting. This feeling will be carried into Saturday with the one-to-one brunch, a continuation of the relaxed conversational atmosphere we will be presenting. The Saturday General Sessions will include a special forum on the FCC. Our guests will be Arthur Ginsberg, Asst. Chief of Complaints and Compliance. Ginsberg is the man behind the new FCC payola investigations and has agreed to answer all questions regarding the situation and detail to all radio and record attendees the Commission's view on what constitutes payola, and how far the FCC intends to go in its investigation. He will also cover record company supported on-air album giveaways and other dual industry related promotions. Our other FCC representative is Richard Shiben, Chief of Renewal and Transfer Division. Mr. Shiben will candidly be discussing EEO and license renewals. We have been assured by our moderator, Jason Shinsky, that the format will be no holds barred and all questions will be answered.

Another recent addition to our schedule is the fact that Arbitron will have three representatives in attendance to meet with any and all to discuss, on a one-to-one basis, everything from how to read an Arbitron to how to get the most out of it programming wise, to answering your questions and complaints about the service. They will be available at our Friday Night sessions and all day Saturday. We will also have a display of the Canadian Moffit chain's computer assigned programming center, a definite look into the future.

Please check our cutoff dates for registration and hotel reservations inside this issue. Your compliance with them will assure your participation.

Radio May Pay Copyright Royalties

Senate leaders apparently now feel the Registrar of Copyrights will issue a report within the next two years recommending an amendment to the new copyright bill giving royalties to performers when their recordings are played on the radio. The new copyright bill goes into effect next January 1. The statement was made by California Senator (D) Alan Cranston, who said that he has long supported such royalties and noted nearly all countries, including the Soviet Union, already have such a provision. The economic burdens on a small or medium market radio station have yet to be determined, but a quick R&R survey of several Station Managers showed that there will be major resistance from the broadcasters and that economically it could be disastrous.

KHJ/Los Angeles has kicked off one of their biggest promotions ever, with the help of "Zork," a mystery person who has chosen to use KHJ as the vehicle to give away thousands and thousands of dollars in cash to listeners. Zork has promised to give away \$2000 on the air to start his money giveaway, and to follow up with numerous giveaways of \$1000 and \$100 bills thereafter. In addition, Zork is being chauffeured throughout Southern California making personal appearances and giving away envelopes to everyone, which may contain anywhere from \$1 to hundreds.

CHUM Button Creates Controversy

CHUM/Toronto gained some unexpected publicity with their CHUM "Superstar" Zodiac buttons which depict each of the astrological signs. While the University of Toronto Blues hockey team was visiting mainland China for a series of exhibition games, some team members decided to show their friendship toward the Chinese by distributing some of CHUM's buttons. Unfortunately, the Gemini buttons showed nude twins, which apparently is considered quite obscene by the populace there. One of the buttons ended up in the hands of officials, who politely informed the team that they should not give away any more CHUM buttons.

Leukemia Radio-Thon Set

Over 50 stations across the country are already set to participate in the 1977 Leukemia Radiothon, scheduled for February 26 and 27. Nationally known celebrities will be in Hollywood to talk with participating stations and update audiences on the progress of the fund raising. Interested stations may also help the cause by holding their radiothons on other dates. WKBW Outlines Single Policy

As an update to WKBW/Buffalo's announced policy on edited singles,

Music Director Jim Quinn has given R&R this statement: "As of April 1, 1977, WKBW will no longer step out early on any record who's stock single is an edit of the LP version. We have no objections to edited promo copies for stations that wish to play them. Our concern is for the welfare of the single record consumer."

Quinn noted that they have delayed the policy change in an attempt to obtain comments from radio and record industry people at the upcoming R&R Convention.

WDGY's "Changes"

WDGY/Minneapolis' new Program Director **Chuck Roberts** and Music Director **Gary Bridges** decided to let their listeners know about the "changes" happening at the station in a big way. The first promotion staged by the new staff is called "Changes." For the first 15 days of January, listeners are counting the number of times **David Bowie's** "Changes" is aired, offering \$1000 cash to one listener who knows.

Rock & Roll Research

WAAY/Huntsville play every number one song from "Rock Around The Clock" to the present in their "Gold For Gold" promotion. Each day from 10am to noon, another segment of the greatest hits of all time are aired. Listeners are encouraged to register their three favorite songs during the promotion, giving the station added oldie research and entering their names in a drawing for "Solid gold LPs" and solid gold coins.

Another "Slick" Promotion

WRNR/Martinsburg plays up the recent rash of oil tanker wrecks with their most recent contest. Certain number callers are taken to play a rotating-cart game. If the "oil tanker gets grounded" on the cart, that listener wins a \$10 gift certificate for gas and oil.

Disney Trips

WFIL/Philadelphia has already scored two winners in their huge giveaway of Disney World trips. The all expense paid trips are awarded to listeners who register their names and then listen to hear them called on the air. A total of 60 trips will be given away.

\$1 Million Giveaway

KAYC/Beaumont's **Jay Scott** reports on the station's "Million Dollar Giveaway," which takes advantage of the current shredded money jars. Listeners register and listen for their names to call in and win \$10,000 in shredded cash.

KTKT Promotions

KTKT/Tucson tied in with the local Tucson Open Golf Tournament with their "Chip To The Green." All the station personalities were heard on a rotating cart, listeners call in and guess whether they make it to the green as they play their game of golf over such obstacles as waterholes, pretty girls, wild animals, and sand traps. Everybody playing won a pass to the tourney, and the grand prize winner walked off with a new set of golf clubs and bag.

Midday man and PD **Roger Collins** is giving out "nooners" to his audience, callers win lunch for two at a local pub plus a T-shirt and album for both.

Ed Alexander's current morning promotion on the station helps listeners find alternatives to high-priced coffee. Ed and his news team are trying out everything from clam juice to high-powered tea after the listeners call in and suggest possible caffeine substitutes.

Hits Of '76 Response

Q102/Cincinnati's countdown of the Top 102 of '76 gained great listener response while it was on the air, but even more after. MD **Mark Elliott** reports that over 1000 requests for the printed list of the top 102 were received in two days, some from as far as 70 miles away.

98Q's

"Pipe Dreams"

In coordination with a local theater, 98Q/Vidalia is giving away passes to "Pipe Dreams," starring **Gladys Knight and the Pips**. Random callers are taken on the air, callers have to tell the jock what their lifetime "pipe dream" is to score the tickets.

WNBC's Holiday Food Success

A check for more than \$16,000 has been presented to Senior Citi-

zen Centers in New York by **WNBC** after the station's first annual Holiday Food Fund.

Other Promotions

WFIW/Fairfield, Illinois, "Kissed" in the New Year by giving away copies of "Beth" to all daily trivia winners for the first two weeks of '77. WFIW is now in a month-long contest of giving away tickets to see the St. Louis Hockey team in action.

WFLI/Chattanooga's "Off & Running" contest was featured the first weekend of the New Year. Copies of **Gene Cotton's** "Off & Running" LP and boxes of X-Lax were awarded to call-in listeners. In another weekend promotion, the station gave away free car washes and copies of the movie soundtrack LP to callers.

WSPT/Stevens Point is using a rotating cart for their "Kissometer" contest. Listeners call in and push the meter, if it registers over 50 they win a Kiss LP, if it doesn't, a Kiss single is given away.

Los Angeles National Public Radio outlet, **KCSN**, has a regular Friday feature, "Backbeat," which explores current music stars' careers. **Arista Records' Jennifer Warnes** will discuss her new album and her starring role in "Hair." Also planned is a two hour **George Harrison** interview.

WSGA/Savannah has announced the winners of their "Superbowl of Rock & Roll" promotion, which pitted all past and current hits against each other. In tribute to **Elvis Presley's** 42nd birthday, held during the contest, the King's "Burning Love" came in number one, followed by **Elton John & Kiki Dee's** "Don't Go Breaking My Heart," and **Elvis' "Suspicious Minds."**

WLCY/Tampa's "Summer In January" presented the **Beach Boys** in concert for their 15th anniversary show there. Giveaways of tickets, albums and packs of summer skin care kits brought attention to the show, which sold out in 3 days.

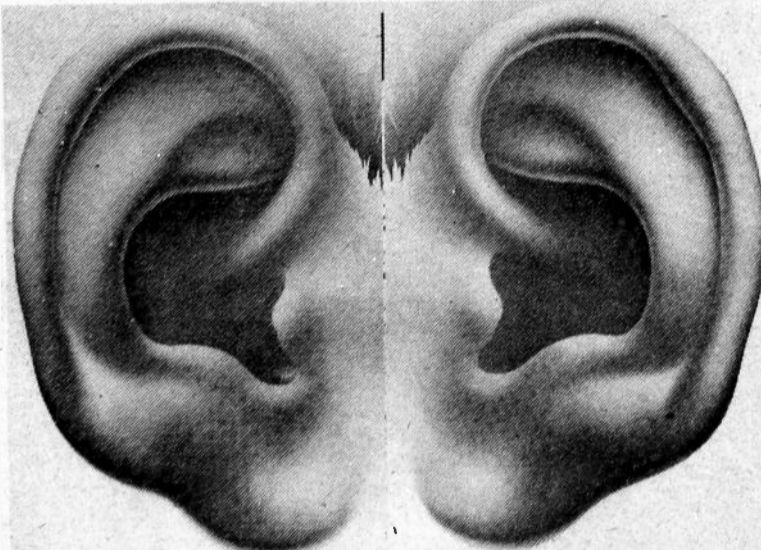

Business News

FCC Will Start Network Inquiry

The Federal Communications Commission has given public notice that it will begin a study into ABC, NBC and CBS television networks, regarding the acquisition and distribution of TV programming. The Commission noted that 20 years have lapsed since a government body has done an inquiry into the networks, and also said that their study will zero in on affiliate station-network relationships. Also included in the inquiry will be points brought up in a Westinghouse Broadcasting petition filed last September. The agency has put a deadline on comments of May 2.

Sonderling Buying Philly Outlets

Sonderling Broadcasting Corp. has announced that they will purchase WDAS-AM-FM/Philadelphia from Max M. Leon Inc. for approximately \$4 million cash. Sonderling will take a loan from Massachusetts Mutual to foot part of the purchase price.

Storer Purchase Of Viacom Nixed

Last week, Storer Broadcasting offered to acquire Viacom International Inc. for \$60 million. Early this week, Viacom's board of directors announced that they had unanimously voted to reject Storer's offer. Viacom, which owns cable TV systems and commercial TV program syndication, said that the merger would not be in the best interest of their shareholders. As a result, Storer announced that they would no longer pursue the offer.

Ford Asks For Record FCC Budget

In the closing days of his administration, President Ford has asked Congress to appropriate \$59.8 million to operate the FCC during fiscal 1978. The budget surpasses the Commission's current budget by \$2 million. The plan calls for 26 new positions within the agency, several of them within the Common Carrier Bureau, which is now flooded with work because of the CB craze. President Carter will have final say on the proposed budget.

AT&T To Test New Communications System

American Telephone and Telegraph Co. has said it will test a communications system that can carry telephone calls, computer data and television pictures via laser light beams. The test will be in Chicago, on a 1.5 mile long cable between a downtown office building and two telephone exchange offices. Previous testing of a similar system was done in Atlanta last year. Results of the testing in Chicago will be completed next year.

FCC Refuses Station Renewal

The license renewal of WSTC/Stamford, Connecticut has been refused by the FCC, which granted the license to a competing application of Radio Stamford Inc. Western Connecticut Broadcasting Co. was refused the renewal because of censured political broadcasts, violation of logging requirements and misrepresentations to the Commission.

Casablanca To Distribute Ienner/Biegel Label

Jimmy Ienner and Irv Biegel have formed a new record label, as yet unnamed, and have announced that Casablanca Record and Filmworks will distribute. Ienner will serve as President of the company, with Biegel serving as Exec. VP. Biegel was most recently VP for Private Stock Records, Ienner is a well-known producer and publisher.

Reddy's Vegas Show Satellited To France

Helen Reddy's opening show at the MGM Grand Hotel, Las Vegas, on Friday (21) will be beamed by satellite to the 11th annual MIDEM festival in Cannes, France. The 90 minute production will be presented to the full festival audience in the morning session. This marks the first time ever that MIDEM has used satellite TV.

Motown/Casablanca Present "Disco"

A feature film, released by Columbia Pictures, entitled "Disco" has been announced as a joint venture by Casablanca Records and Filmworks and Motown Productions. "Disco" will feature such artists as Jermaine Jackson, the Commodores and other acts from both record labels on a one-night disco adventure. Casablanca's Neil Bogart and Peter Guber will act as executive producers of the film, which will open in October.

Radio Moves

Burkhart/Abrams & Associates has announced that their Superstars format has been added to WCCV/Charlottesville, WYXE/Madison, WHOT/Youngstown, and KGON/Portland. The addition of these stations brings the total of Superstars stations to twenty-five.

Susan Breakfield has been named Vice President and General Manager of WASH/Washington D.C. Ms. Breakfield replaces William Dalton, who has moved to the VP/GM position at Metromedia's WNEW/New York.

WZYQ/Frederick, Maryland President Leo Shank has appointed Howard Johnson to Vice President of parent corporation Musical Heights Inc. Johnson has served as GM of WZYQ, a position that he will continue to hold.

The FCC

[So You Can Understand It]

WBIZ-FM/Parkersburg, W. VA. Admonished For Deceptive Advertising

The Commission has admonished Randy Jay Broadcasting Co., licensee of FM station WBIZ, Parkersburg, W. Va., for broadcasting misleading or deceptive advertising in connection with its conduct of a contest known as the "Secret Sounds Contest."

In order to win the contest, a person had to identify the secret sounds aired daily. A total of 15 sounds were broadcast, each 15 times per day. The winners were those who correctly identified the most secret sounds. The prize for correctly identifying the most secret sounds was a choice of vacation spots for 4 days and 3 nights for the winner and a companion in one of 4 locations.

The Commission said that two complaints were filed against the station with the FCC and a third complaint was sent to the station.

The complaints said the station's promotional spot announcements broadcast between April 19 and 22, 1976, in connection with the contest did not fairly and accurately describe the nature of the prize. They stated the advertising implied that a complete four day vacation would be awarded as a prize when in fact only the lodging was included.

The Commission said it appeared the prize could reasonably have been construed to include transportation since it was described as a "vacation" and the cost required to be transported to the area from the station's listening area was substantial.

Therefore, the FCC stated, the textual material appeared to be misleading and deceptive as to the value or nature of the prize and, as such, violated the Commission's policies regarding the conduct of contests in a fair manner.

TV News

Top Network Turns Over Again

ABC once again took top Nielsen honors for the week ending January 9th, after CBS' top rating the week before. ABC had a 21.4 average, followed by NBC with 20.2, and CBS right behind with 20.1. "Happy Days" and "Laverne & Shirley" continue their dominance as number 1 and 2 shows, followed by the rest of the top 10: "MASH," tied with NBC special "Raid On Entebbe," "One Day At A Time," ABC Monday movie "Green Eyes," "Welcome Back Kotter," "All In The Family," "The Wonderful World Of Disney" and "Charlie's Angels."

ABC research, taken from Arbitron TV data, shows that network has a wider 18-49 audience than their competitors. The Arbitron study, done in November, shows ABC with over 13 million 18-49's tuned in during the average prime time minute, compared with NBC's 11.5 million, and CBS' 9.9 million.

Other TV News

Neil Diamond's first-ever TV special will air on NBC February 21st. The show was taped live during Diamond's L.A. Greek Theater run... NBC's airing of the Super Bowl drew a whopping 75 million people to their TV sets, second in number only to 1975's 7th World Series game as the most watched sports event ever.

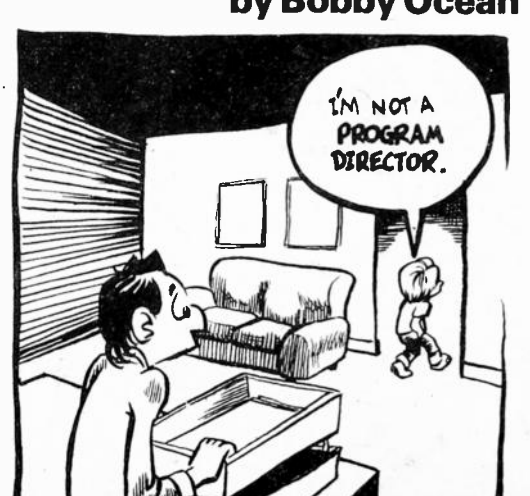

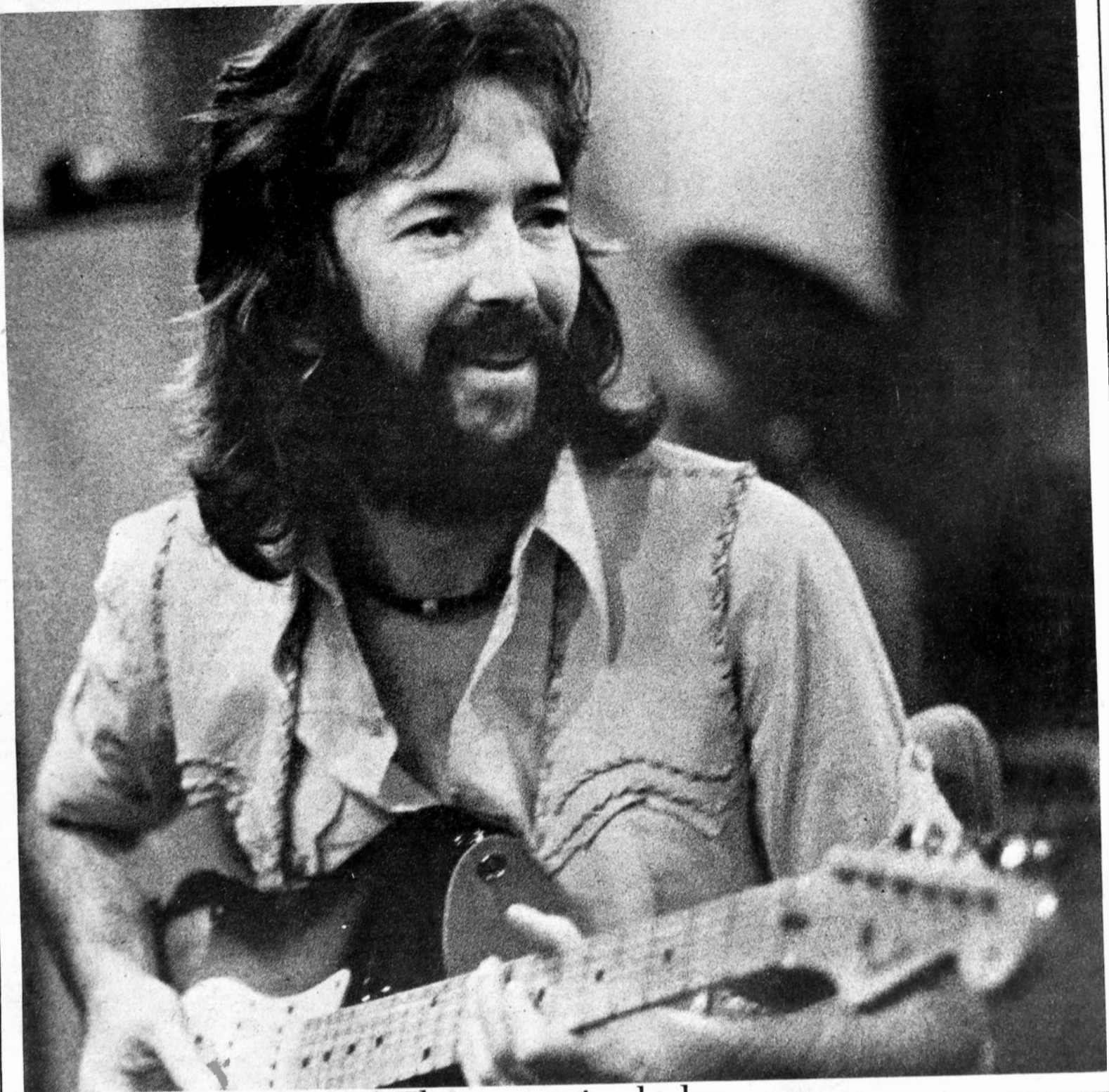

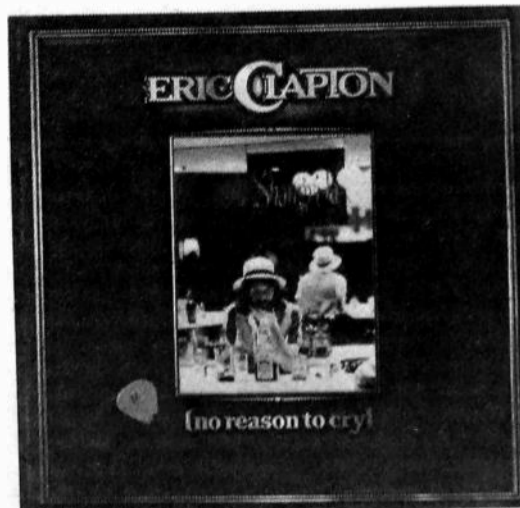

New PD & MD at WFOM is Greg McClure.

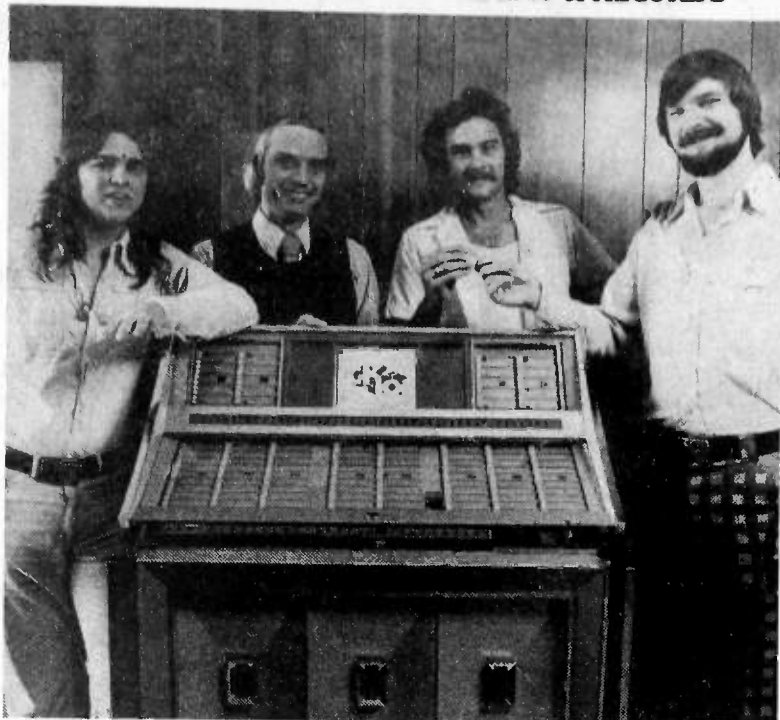
A new twist to independent promotion. Marc Kreiner, a former L.A. disco jock has gone independent "disco" promotion servicing clubs and disco formatted stations.

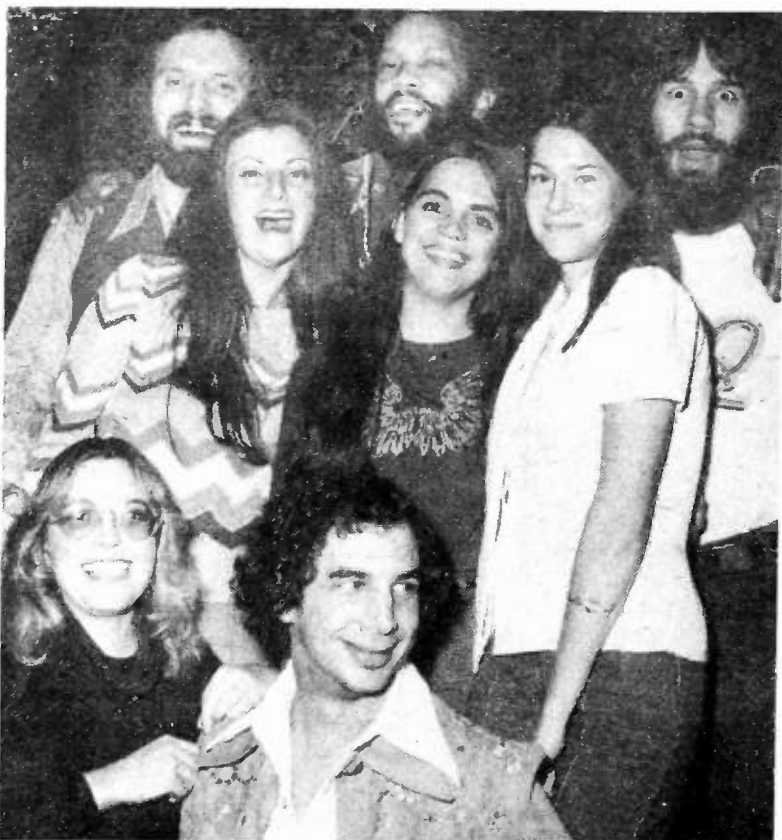

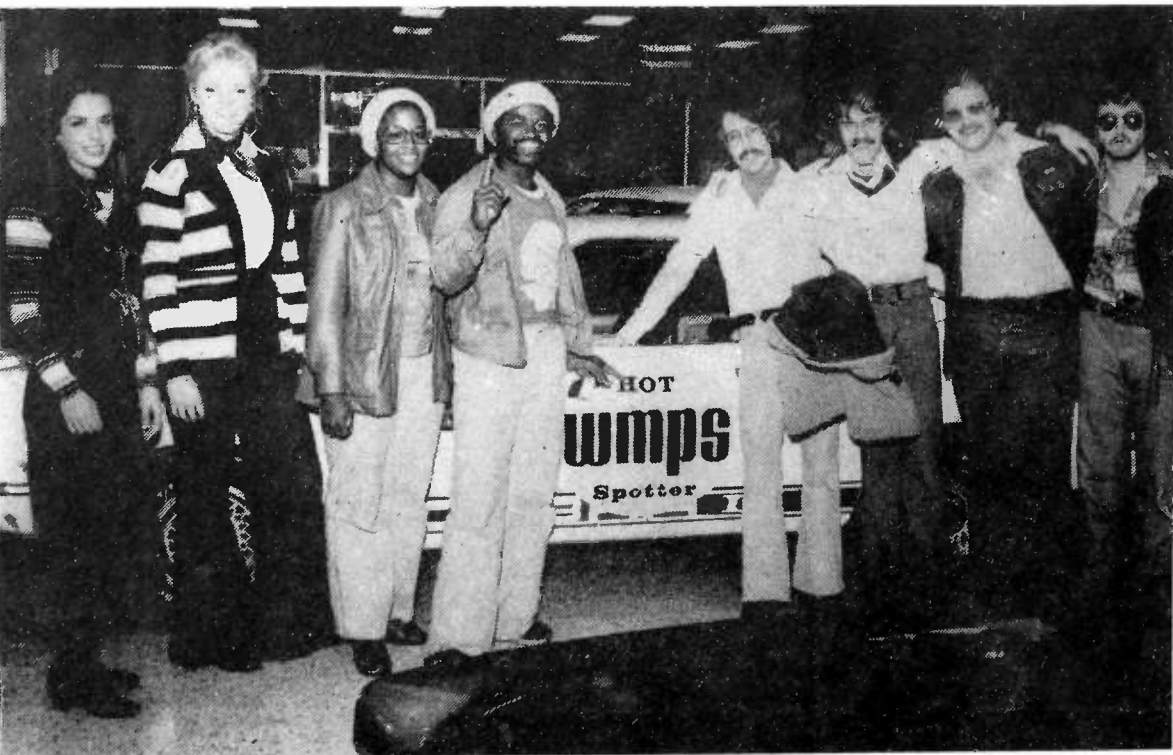

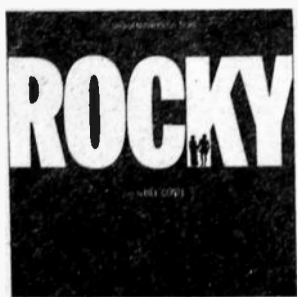

AOR

Although there are still more books to come than have already been published, initial returns indicate another strong showing for AOR radio this time around. In many markets, the combined AOR shares are as lofty as the Top 40's and the concept of an FM AOR providing an AM Top 40 with total audience competition is fast becoming a reality. WMMS/Cleveland did not repeat last book's overwhelmingly number one performance of 9.7 (Mon-Sun 6am-12mid Metro total persons 12 plus) which established them as the highest rated major market AOR radio station in the United States, but their current 6.4 is nothing to be ashamed of. In the lead for that particular achievement, at this point, is KGB-FM/San Diego with their all time high 7.6 showing. ABC-FM's O&O, WRIF/Detroit came in with an extremely impressive 6.4, placing them among the nation's top three AOR's and WWDC (DC 101)/Washington D.C. rocketed through the "6" barrier by increasing from a 3.8 to a 6.3.

Of particular interest are markets that showed increases for more than one competing AOR station, which shows growth for the genre as a whole. For example, in Boston, both WCOZ (3.1 to a whopping 5.0) and WBCN (2.4 to 3.5) showed marked improvement discounting the often stated theory that there isn't enough room for two AOR's in that market. In Detroit in the wake of WRIF's success, WABX moved 3.0 to 3.4. In Seattle, both KZOK (OK102½) and KZAM fared well. In Hartford WCCC grew and WPLR, from New Haven (a whole different market) showed incredibly strong.

The AOR success story in Miami is relatively new. WINZ-FM (ZETA 4) moving up to a 3.8 from 2.0. In Dallas, KZEW climbed from 3.9 to 4.3. Toledo's WIOT racked up a huge 7.1 from 5.3. KREM-FM in Spokane had a good book, 3.2 to 4.6.

It should be pointed out that these particular figures are based upon total audience. Many AOR's although not showing obvious upward movement in total, did very well in the area of their individual target demographics.

We'll keep printing and evaluating the Arbitron reports as they are made available. In the meantime, congratulations to Program Director Rick Liebert and the entire staff of KGB-FM for a performance we all can be proud of.

A few thoughts about this year's R&R Convention (and conventions in general). Careful observation of convention chemistry (and I've found myself on enough industry convention panels in the past three years to constitute a full time job) indicates that broadcasters attend conventions for academic purposes that can be broken down into two categories. The first is to absorb facts that pertain directly to the details of their professional situation (FCC, engineering, etc.). The second is to be exposed to concepts which provide inspiration to self-start new concepts or to carry out already conceived ones with refreshed energy. In a "giving of the facts" situation, the conventional panel/audience structure works fine. These sessions can almost be compared to guest lecturer situations in which a sizeable body of people gather to hear a person of either knowledge or authority speak on a specific topic and then be open for questions. The encounter sessions, on the other hand, work best when the body of people are gathering to share ideas, test their's out on others, and make business contacts.

This year we have decided to differentiate between the two approaches and purposes and apply each where they fit best. Therefore, the individual Friday format meetings at the convention (Top 40, Pop/Adult, Country, AOR) will be held in a manner that will be conducive to one to one communication on an equal plane. Each format will be assigned a conference room and leading broadcasters will be designated on a rotating scheduled basis to spearhead group discussions open to all those wishing to attend and participate. To further enhance the loose and uninhibited environment, these particular sessions will take place during the late night hours. The spirit of idea sharing and personal contact will be extended into Saturday when notable members of the industry will be pre-assigned numbered tables at brunch and be available to meet and engage in one to one conversation with anyone wishing to make such contact.

Among the AOR speakers already scheduled for the convention are Norm Winer, PD WBCN/Boston; Bonnie Simmons, PD KSAN/San Francisco; Bob Gooding, PD WCOL-FM/Columbus; Bill Bartlett, PD WAIV/Jacksonville; Lee Abrams, Burkhart/Abrams; Jeff Pollack, Music Co-ordinator KBPI/Denver; Frank Wood, GM WEBN/Cincinnati; Seth Mason, Business Manager WXRT/Chicago; and Bobbin Beam PD WQFM, Milwaukee, plus others.

The more "conventional" style panel sessions taking place on Saturday afternoon will devote themselves to topics of concern to the industry in general and present speakers who have specific facts and knowledge to share with the convention goers. Check the developing convention schedule for a run down of some of the exciting and outstanding sessions we have in store for the industry during these Saturday sessions.

The past two R&R Conventions were the biggest and best in the history of our combined industries. We are now facilitating the knowledge gained from those experiences toward lifting the third to a new and even higher level of achievement.

Lee Abrams comes to Hartford, Columbus, and Riverhead. The consulting firm of Burkhart/Abrams has announced that they are bringing the "Superstars" AOR method to WHCN/Hartford, WTVN/Columbus (Ohio), and WRCN/Riverhead (Long Island). Tom Teuber, Music Director of Abrams' WGRQ/Buffalo has already resigned the position to become Program Director of WTVN. It'll be interesting to observe the impending AOR contest between the Superstars and already established, highly rated WCOL-FM which is programmed by Bob Gooding and greatly respected. As far as Riverhead is concerned, it seems that Long Island will now be fully covered by local AOR stations. The furthest East AOR goes now is WBAB located in Babylon. Long Island is so large a market (long) that it is difficult for any of the many stations located there to fully cover it, including neighboring New York City stations.

KSAN/San Francisco goes bananas. The Bay Area AOR stronghold is teaming up with Banana Records to stage a "Banana Eating Contest" with hopes of breaking the existing banana eating world's record which consists of somebody having consumed 68 bananas in 10 minutes. The winner of the event to be held at Embarcadero Two will win a trip for two to Puerto Vallarta via Hughes Air West (an airline, that for the sake of our East Coast readers, commercially depicts their planes as flying bananas) and be crowned "Top Banana in the West" by Fee Waybill of the Tubes, who'll be emceeding the affair.

KMYR/Albuquerque will be dropping their AOR format in favor of an automated Beautiful Music approach. That leaves Program Director Bob Slavin out in the cold. Slavin, if you recall, spent many years as the Music Director of WBCN/Boston before coming to New Mexico where he never really had enough time to get anything going. I heartily recommend him for any good programming position. He can be reached at (505) 881-3282.

WYDD/Pittsburgh weekender Mark Wallace has left the station to join the Warner Bros. promotion team. Tim Brando has replaced Gene Kent as Music Director of KROK/Shreveport. The station is Top 40 by day and AOR by night. WHCN/Hartford News ace Jim Cameron (one of the best AOR radio news people in the business) has taken his talents to WCOZ/Boston. Journalist Neil Tesser has joined WKQX/Chicago to host "Chicago Issues" a Sunday morning public affairs program.

WAAF/Worcester gave away a night shift on the station in conjunction with a promotion for the Foghat "Nightshift" album. The station is now in the process of inviting listeners to send in postcards for a drawing in which the grand prize winner will receive an album per week until the year 2001. WENE/Endicott's new address is PO Box 151, Endwell, New York 13706. Word is the station's new studios are almost complete. I understand that the station gave Arista Record's very own Perry Cooper the opportunity to do an hour show. Reportedly, he did so well that they offered him a full time airshift but he turned it down, saying that he couldn't afford to take the cut in pay. But Perry, think of all those poor listeners you're depriving. Bakersfield's first AOR station KKXX (formerly KUZZ-FM) has taken to the airwaves complete with new sound, T-shirts, and billboards. KPRI/San Diego (whose logo was designed in a contest) has taken it to the listeners again with a poster design contest. The winning poster will be designated "the official KPRI poster," reproduced and distributed around town. In addition, the winner will get "his" and "hers" motorcycles. Second place wins tickets to all "KPRI Presents" concerts and third prize is an album catalogue of any artist the winner chooses. WKDF/Nashville (I'm starting to get used to the new call letters) broadcasted the Third Annual Volunteer Jam. KWST/Los Angeles interviewed Al Kooper and Al Stewart. WWCK/Flint gave away Aerosmith catalogues, Gary Wright albums, and gold belt buckles. Bonnie Koloc played in the studios at WCAS/Cambridge. KZAM/Seattle interviewed Heart. WBLM/Lewiston-Portland presented Joan Armatrading in a live radio concert. Derringer and the Winters Bros. stopped by WQSR/Sarasota.

The genre is growing in every direction, Soft Rock, Hard Rock, AM, automated, as well as "all purpose" AOR. Our policy at R&R is to maintain as much contact with and knowledge of our reporting stations as possible so that the Album Airplay 40 chart (which is a compilation of our reporting stations' airplay activity) can remain as accurate as it has been since its inception. Couple that with space limitations and you can well see that it is difficult to expand our list of reporting stations without proper scrutiny.

AOR stations wishing to become R&R reporters are advised to send as much information about themselves as possible, including station history; ratings; staff profile; how an "add" and a "hot" actually translate into airplay; promotional activities; community involvement; and just about any other information that will help us understand and know them, to Mike Harrison, Radio & Records, 6430 Sunset Blvd., Hollywood California 90028. After that, the next step is patience. I would like, however, to reiterate an R&R policy in regard to radio. A station does not have to be an R&R music reporter to qualify as a news reporter. We want to know about what's going on at your station so we may spread the word to the industry. Don't hesitate to pass the word on to us either by phone or mail, and remember, we love photos.

Chart Summary

AL STEWART is re-surfing in the wake of a hit single, strong album sales, and a full blown publicity campaign. It looks as if we have a new AOR superstar on our hands. WONDER maintained. QUEEN moved up. WINGS had another good week. WRIGHT and SANTANA made impressive upward movements. ZZ TOP inched into the top ten. GENESIS maintained. ARS grew. KANSAS held on to relatively healthy airplay. EMMYLOU, AWB, and COREA continue to grow. TAJ had a great second week. HAGAR was the week's highest debut with his second solo album. BOWIE debuted. At the time these reports were taken, many stations had not yet received the album. CARS moved up nicely to very positive programmer reaction. LEON, RIDERS, CITY, WINTERS, STARCASTLE, and DON HARRISON debuted. PONTY bounced back onto the chart. PETER FRAMPTON and BJ HARVEST almost made the chart.

This chart is based solely on airplay and does not attempt to fabricate a trend. The artists in italics are those receiving the most rapid gain in airplay.
