Payola: Your Questions Answered

The Federal Communications Commission is presently conducting its inquiry into "payola" and "plugola" practices. It cannot be emphasized enough that the broadcast industry must rid itself of the "payola" and "plugola" cancers. Payola and plugola is illegal and in addition to stations losing their licenses those individuals found guilty are subject to a \$10,000 fine and five to ten years in prison.

Payola is generally defined as accepting, paying and agreeing to pay any money, services or other valuable consideration "for the inclusion of any matter in a broadcast without disclosure of the fact before the broadcast to a program producer or the broadcaster." Textbook examples of payola are when an announcer accepts money, food, car payments, trips, or other benefits in exchange for an understanding that he will play certain records in his airshift, and this fact is not disclosed prior to the broadcast of such records.

Unfortunately, it is occurring in today's broadcast industry for Music Directors, Program Directors and/or disc jockeys to insist upon payment from record companies in exchange for record play—sometimes running as high as \$1000 a record!

At the R&R Convention in Dallas a panel of experts addressed the subject of payola and plugola and answered questions from the audience. There follows a capsulation of the question and answer session which should serve to set definite guidelines to be followed by all those concerned with the selection and playing of music over-the-air.

Question: If a record company flies a Program Director and his wife to another city to see their artist in concert, is that considered payola?

Answer: The answer is yes. A trip to Las Vegas to see the opening of a particular artist's show constitutes payola. The same would be true if a record company flies a Program Director, announcer or Music Director to another city to see a sporting event or to purchase a new wardrobe.

Question: Can a Program Director accept gifts from record companies for Christmas and if so

Van Dyke Resigns KHJ PD Position

Charlie Van Dyke, Program Director of KHJ/Los Angeles, announced his resignation from the RKO station Monday (14).

Van Dyke, who was both morning man and Program Director, told R&R he felt the dual jobs were too much especially in view of the ex-

panding competitive challenges in the Los Angeles market.

"There were two people doing two jobs before I became Program Di-

rector," he said. "I think that there is a need to divide the responsibilities again."

"KHJ's plans for growth are so exciting that I want to be of any assistance possible, but I find time to be a problem in trying to be both a Program Director and morning man plus develop the outside activities I've been into for the last several months. KHJ is a magnificent radio station, and it deserves more time and attention than just one person can give."

Van Dyke gave 60 days notice and indicated he would stay with the station until his replacement is selected.

RKO Vice President of Programming Paul Drew commented to R&R regarding Van Dyke's departure:

"I know of no one who is a more dedicated and hard working broadcaster than Charlie. His contributions to the many successes at RKO Radio over the past eight years are many and he will be missed. Charlie and I have discussed some other projects since he made his decision, and I'm hoping that he will be available to work with me on them."

Ode, A&M Records End Association

Ode Records and A&M have severed their distribution association, terminating a working relationship of seven years' duration. Ode Vice-President/General Manager Marshall Blonstein told R&R: "Our association with A&M has been one of the most rewarding experiences of my

career, and we leave them with the best of relations and positive feelings. As far as the future is concerned, our direction has yet to be decided."

Ode Records was founded by Lou Adler and was originally a CBS

subsidiary, enjoying hits by Spirit and Scott "San Francisco" McKenzie. Upon teaming with A&M, the label had tremendous success with Carole King, including one of the best-selling albums of all time, "Tapestry," as well as Cheech & Chong, Tom Scott, and others.

WDGY/Minneapolis Changes To AOR

WDGY/Minneapolis has modified its Top 40 format to an AOR-slanted approach. The station will feature top cuts from current albums along with a selection of singles, with no

jingle package and segued sets. According to PD Chuck Roberts, the new format "is closer to AOR than Top 40 radio. The term we are using to describe this particular

form of AOR is 'Coloradio.' Our research and general observations indicate that this is the direction of AM Top 40 radio, so we may as well start now."

Carter Broadcast Gets 30 Share

President Carter's nationwide call-in radio broadcast (March 5) reached 30% of all in-home radio listeners in major markets, according to an Arbitron incidental study. The share is among the highest ever recorded by Arbitron.

The Carter broadcast won a 38 share in Men 18 plus and a 33 for Women 18 plus (35 total for Adults), while garnering a 16 in Teens 12-17. The Arbitron sample was 3600 households in the markets of New York, Los An-

geles, Chicago, Detroit, Washington D.C., Philadelphia, Boston, San Francisco, Cleveland, and Dallas/Ft. Worth. During the time of the Carter broadcast, 18% of all households in the ten market area were listening to radio.

WSGA's 'Car Cram'

Black Listeners Prefer AM

Black radio listeners prefer the AM band, while Spanish-speaking listeners display essentially the same pattern of AM/FM listening as the general population. A recent Arbitron FM listening study, encompassing 16 special reports in Black markets and four Spanish reports, revealed that 27.6% of all Black audience listening is FM, as compared to 40.1% for the general population in the 16 markets surveyed for the special report.

The Spanish audience FM listening figure was 28.3%, compared to 33.7% for the population as a whole in the four markets covered.

The FM figures for Black listeners varied widely from market to market. In Indianapolis and Kansas City, Black FM stations received shares of 66.5 and 56.3 respectively, while in Atlanta and Baltimore, FM stations accounted for less than 10% of Black

listening time.

Markets surveyed for the Black audience listening reports were Atlanta, Baltimore, Chicago, Cincinnati, Cleveland, Dallas/Ft. Worth, Detroit, Houston/Galveston, Indianapolis, Kansas City, Los Angeles, Louisville, New York, Philadelphia, St. Louis, and Washington D.C. The four Spanish markets covered were Los Angeles, Miami, New York, and San Antonio.

Feliciano Sues RCA Records For \$10 Million

Jose Feliciano has sued RCA Records for \$10,000,000, charging breach of contract and fraud. He also requested an injunction against RCA's alleged plan to release a new "Greatest Hits" album compilation on Feliciano.

The suit contends that RCA owes Feliciano \$200,000 in royalties for his last three albums for the label (the singer now records for Private Stock). It also asks for "unascertained damages" from any sales on budget labels or from surplus and cutouts.

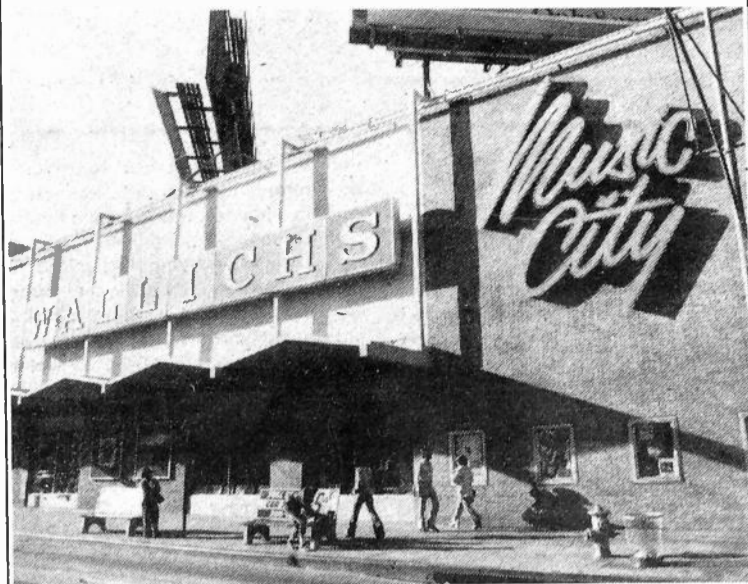
According to the suit, a new RCA "Greatest Hits" package would be a direct violation of Feliciano's 1972-1976 contract. The pact allowed two "Greatest Hits" albums, but Feliciano claims that he was guaranteed control over packaging and content, and states that he was not consulted. If fraud is proven against RCA for their handling of Feliciano's records, the suit asks \$10 million in punitive damages.

END OF AN ERA



"It's Music City, Sunset and Vine." Generations of recording artists made that commercial refrain a familiar one to Los Angeles radio listeners. Now the Wallich's record chain faces bankruptcy. See story below.

Wallich's Goes Bankrupt

Wallich's Music and Entertainment Co., owners of the first important Southern California record store chain, Music City, filed for bankruptcy in a Los Angeles Federal Court. The corporation listed large debts to major record companies, such as Columbia, ABC, Capitol, and the WEA labels.

Music City, founded over 25 years ago by Glenn Wallich, who was also a principal in the formation of Capitol Records, was the first Southern California chain to penetrate the suburban shopping-center market, pioneering the path later taken by the successful Warehouse, Licorice Pizza, and Music Plus discount chains. In the heyday of Top 40 radio's initial

dominance in the late 50's, Music City, particularly the flagship operation at Sunset and Vine, was the headquarters for the new generation of rock & roll record consumers, and played a key role in establishing Rock as a dominant retail force.

In recent years the Music City stores had been operating marginally, owing in part to their resistance towards the discounting format prevalent in Southern California. In 1976 the stores finally went discount, but were unable to win back sufficient patronage from the established discount operations, leading to the bankruptcy petition and, to many longtime observers, the end of an era.

Jock Admits Plugging Group In FCC Hearings

WOL/Washington air personality Mel Edwards admitted that he had played records of a local group over the air without indicating in writing that he also managed the group. The disclosure surfaced during the FCC's open hearings on payola in Washington, D.C., which have already produced a number of payola accusations, as reported in R&R.

Edwards testified that he had played tracks by the group, Ureous, on his show in December 1973, without filling out a station log reporting that the tracks had been

aired. Edwards is the former president of D.J. Productions, a production company formed by WOL jocks which has been under fire at the hearings for reportedly accepting payment for plugging acts on-the-air before Washington area concerts.

is there a value limit on them of \$25.00?

Answer: As a general matter, a Program Director can accept a gift at Christmas time. The \$25.00 limitation is arbitrary but nevertheless has come to be a standard of the industry. The rationale being that the more expensive the gift the greater the inducement to "return the favor" to the record company so that the record company rather than the Program Director becomes the benefactor. In other words, a Christmas gift should be a reasonable as opposed to a luxury item. However, any gift received by a disc jockey, Program Director and/or Music Director should be reported to the station's management.

Question: Why does the FCC feel the need to begin a new investigation?

Gary Davis Forms Baybros

KFJZ-AM-FM Split

The frequencies of KFJZ and KFJZ-FM/Fort Worth have been divided to allow operation of two complete stations, featuring two different programming formats. VP/GM Richard Marcellan said the move was effective February 28. The station had been simulcast 24 hours with a Top 40 format. The FM station now carries the logo "297 Stereo," featuring a contemporary hit music format. KFJZ-FM will take an added personality approach, and will place more emphasis on local and regional news coverage.

On-Air Sports Auditions

When WLS/Chicago learned of the Chicago Bears' change in broadcast affiliation to WBBM, after airing on WGN for nearly 25 years, the station decided to help WBBM, find a play-by-play announcer for the football games. WLS invited Gary Deeb, the broadcast critic from the Chicago Tribune, to judge station listeners who called in to try out during Bob Sirott's afternoon drive show. Sirott told R&R that many listeners used a great deal of creativity in their presentations, and that the winner did a perfect imitation of Jimmy Carter doing a play-by-play. The impressionist won an autographed Bears NFL football, an NFL jersey, and an autographed copy of a column written by Deeb, in which he blasted WGN's Bears announcers. Unfortunately, WBBM did not pick up the ball and run, the WLS winner did not get the gig.

Kong Excites St. Louis

KSLQ/St. Louis played on their listeners imaginations for their "King Kong Weekend." For several days prior to the happening, mysterious promos were run on the air, saying that "The Q forces have contained Kong and are bringing him to St. Louis on a barge up the Mississippi...stay tuned for details." It was announced that Kong himself would climb the landmark Gateway Arch every hour and KSLQ listeners could

earn a dollar a foot for every foot he climbed. Rotating carts and sound effects beds determined if the hour's caller would win. Kong was let out of his cage and began a climb, if the listener said "stop" before Kong was blown off the arch with "fighter jets and cannons," they collected \$1 per foot. Consolation prizes consisted of Kong soundtrack albums and a set of Kong posters. The idea created quite a stir in town, with crowds gathering at the arch waiting for the supposed Kong climb, a local TV crew even sent a mobile unit out to cover the imaginary event.

Diamond Tie-Ins

When Duluth's local NBC TV outlet replaced the network's Neil Diamond special with a NHL hockey game they were committed to, WEBC PD Jay Scott reacted to dozens of complaints from his listeners and decided to air Diamond's "Love At The Greek" LP in its entirety as a substitute for the TV show. Happy listeners deluged the station with calls and letters of thanks for the special program. The TV station quickly announced that they have re-scheduled the Diamond special "due to popular demand."

WFBC/Greenville also had their switchboard and mailbox flooded with thanks after the station simulcast the Diamond TV show on their 100,000 watt FM signal.

Grand Prix Sweepstakes

WCAO/Baltimore will send a winning couple to Los Angeles for the L.A. Toyota Grand Prix races. Callers picked one of the letters T-O-Y-O-T-A that would come up on a rotating cart, winning a free T-shirt and qualifying for the grand prize drawing for the trip.

98Q Promotions

To welcome new 98Q/Vidalia PD Chuck Whitaker to town, the station gave away copies of Abba's

"Arrival" LP and the Eagles' "New Kid In Town" single to correct number callers. Tying in with Starbuck's local disco appearance, 98Q awarded copies of the group's LP to listeners who called in and sung their favorite Starbuck song on the air. The station created another promotion around a recent "mysterious" happening in town. The weather bureau had released a special gas into the air to measure wind, creating an eerie light in the night air. 98Q asked listeners to call in their "brainstorm" on what the light was, giving away copies of the Brainstorm album to the callers.

Klaatu Controversy

Several stations have reported on their promotions surrounding the controversial Capitol Klaatu album, which, according to many, sounds distinctly like a Beatles recording. WNGP/Providence picked up on the mystery after The Providence Journal published a story on the group, running an "Is It The Beatles" weekend. Cuts from the album were aired, along with news stories and bits of facts about the artist. The station logged "thousands" of calls in response to the special.

KLIV/San Jose also crated quite a stir when they were one of the first in the Bay Area to air their findings on Klaatu. Production Director Bob Ray put together the special program, doing comparisons with Beatles and Klaatu cuts, and interviewing one researcher who talked about his findings.

Free Car Licenses

With the deadline for car registration fast approaching in Texas, KAYC/Beaumont offered to pay listeners' registration fees in their latest contest. Callers picked one of the letters K-A-Y-C, if the correct letter came up on a rotating cart, the bill was paid. The promotion will continue to pay 4 or 5 winners

per day up to the April 1 deadline.

Basketball Binge

To publicize the activities of WRBR/South Bend's charity basketball games, the team played the faculty of Notre Dame University in a ten minute game during half-time of one of the school's games. Over 11,000 fans were treated to a "very slopply" played 8-4 victory by the school's faculty. WRBR's team has already raised over \$1000 for a local institution for retarded children, and another \$1000 for various local school clubs and groups.

Promotion Highlights

WAVZ/New Haven morning man Judge Harrigan had a "soft stroke" promotion on his show recently. Judge solicited listeners to send in postcards if they wanted to win a 6 month supply of Bic razors. Entrants were picked at random, that listener had 13 minutes to call in

to win his shaving supply.

Ron Parker, MD, WLCY/St. Petersburg, called to say that he now has a direct line available for promotion people to call him on—813-576-0622.

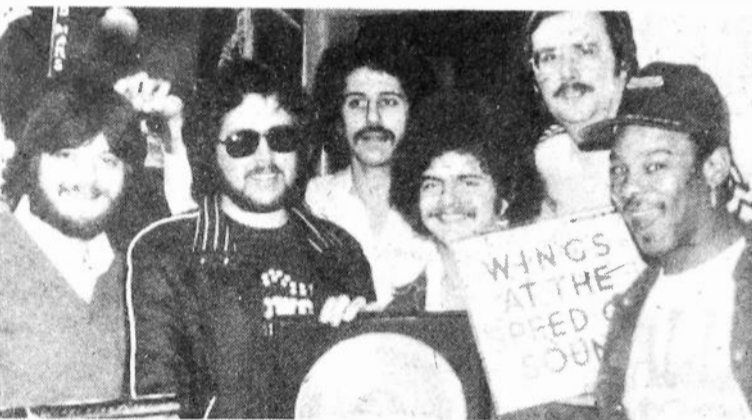
Tom Barsanti, PD, WOW/Omaha, was out in L.A. last week cutting

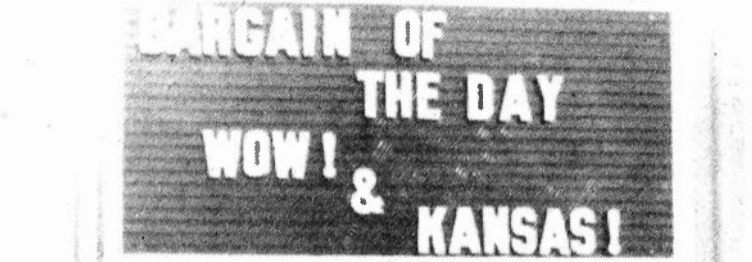

I also have heard from quite a few Washington attorneys whose clients raised questions with them apparently stimulated by the panel discussion. I even took a call or two from DJ's who asked my opinion as to whether or not they should accept certain payment or favors since they were not sure whether the payments constituted payola. From the Commission's standpoint such interest is a good sign.

Disturbing Length Of Singles

Dear R&R:

We are disturbed to note that four of the five music adds this week are over 3:30 length. The discipline imposed on the music industry when Paul Drew, Programming Vice President of the RKO chain, banned all records over this length from his stations a few years ago, seems now to be slipping. We have no quarrel with records exceeding this length for legitimate artistic reasons (we even edited "Silly Love Songs" by Paul McCartney and Wings last year to expand the record from 3:30 to 4:45, which we felt was merited by the content), but find in most cases that it is self-indulgence by the artist that results in longer songs, and that in most cases the extra length diffuses the impact of the song, rather than heightens it. KEX will continue to edit such undisciplined performances to increase listener impact, when it seems called for; and we urge Paul Drew to make another statement on the matter!

"Hire An Ex-Telephone Operator"

Dear R&R:

I just read Mike Harrison's article ("Radio is a business"). I laughed and read it again. Then I cried. Well put, Mike. Radio is just a dial-punch away from one master program tape with interchangeable call letters and slogans. For a really good (as in loyal) announcer, I suggest hiring an ex-telephone operator. There are so many ways we make our job in radio an easy one. For instance, it takes time and talent for a Music Director to listen to music. It's always easier to "watch" the song and see what it does. It takes thought to produce a slogan that builds or supports a strong radio image. It's so much easier to borrow ideas from the "big" stations getting all the ink in the trades.

Let's face it, General Managers and Program Directors are not talent agents. If anything, programmers are geared to marketing music, not personalities. So most of radio's potential talents are without agents to properly market or represent them.

Radio needs more agents for the "egotistical stars" who eventually move into the other fields of entertainment where they are more welcome to succeed.

As a Programming Consultant I hope to meet and hire as many stars (or potential stars) as I have openings to fill. If talents need room to grow into giants, I prefer they do it on my stations. The "risk" of a talent leaving is no risk at all. It's an inevitable fact. I'd rather have a good man leave than a really inferior one stay and not be able to get rid of him.

Well, back to business.

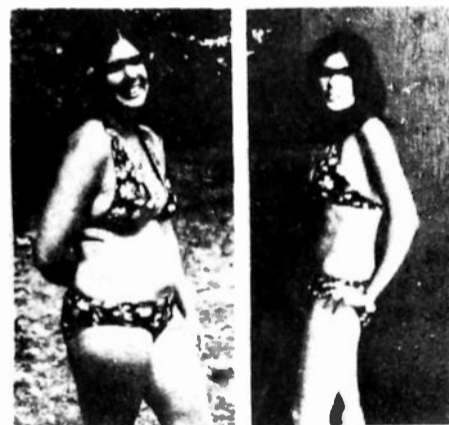

Business News

FCC Told To Hold Up Refunds

Both the House and Senate communications subcommittees have told the FCC to put a hold on any refunds of license fees recently deemed illegal until the Department of Justice and General Accounting Office have reviewed the situation. Chairman **Richard Wiley** was also urged by the committees to consider appealing the U.S. Court of Appeals decision on the license fees to the Supreme Court.

WUBE License Opposed

A Spokane, Washington resident has filed a petition with the FCC to deny license renewal of **WUBE/Cincinnati**. The station is currently owned by **Dana Pictures Inc.** and **Alexander Broadcasting Co.**, subsidiaries of **Kaye-Smith Enterprises**. Kaye-Smith's primary owner is actor **Danny Kaye**.

CBS Buys Common Stock

In an attempt to increase equity return and higher invested capital, **CBS'** board has authorized the company to purchase up to \$50 million worth of its common stock, a price which could purchase up to 900,000 shares.

Ownership Rules Amended

The FCC has amended its rules on common ownership of stations within a certain mileage of each other. The new rules prohibit acquisition of a license or modification of facilities if it would result in company ownership of three stations where any two are within a 100 mile radius of the third. The rule also applies if the primary service area of any of the three would overlap. Commonly owned AM-FM combinations in the same market will be considered as one signal. The Commission also said that they had reviewed applications for licenses that would be connected to the new rules, and that nearly three fourths of those applications would not be affected.

FCC Investigates Educational Station Promos

One of the FCC's current investigations centers on rules pertaining to educational stations' use of promotional spots for fund raising drives such as auctions, and promos for products and services. The Commission has suggested a ban on airing announcements that directly promote sales of products, but would allow indirect references to money making projects. As an example, a station could promo facts such as time and location of an upcoming event, but would be restricted from giving ticket prices. They are asking for comments and ideas on guidelines for handling promotions for fund raising events other than auctions.

Sargent Promotes Closed Circuit Concerts

Show business promoter **Bill Sargent** has announced his latest scheme, a national closed circuit theater network to transmit live concerts. Sargent has the financial backing of **American International Pictures** on this endeavor, and has already presented a demonstration to several major theater chains. The 60 market network would project the concerts in color on a 27 X 24 foot screen, supposedly with better quality than current closed circuit broadcasts.

School Schedules May Change

Your available listening audience may change next winter if some Eastern school districts follow through on proposed changes in their schedules. While many districts are just hoping for a milder winter than this year's, educators in at least five states are discussing closing for several weeks in the midst of the winter months. The Michigan Department of Education would start school in mid-August and end June 15, with a vacation between December 22 and February 15. New York state is considering a five week closing as well. Although many parent and teacher groups are against such plans, the possibility of millions of school-agers having their schedules switched is worth keeping an eye on.

California Station Gets New Call Letters

KAGB/Inglewood-Los Angeles, which has been off the air for some time, will have a new identity when they resume broadcasting. According to the new owner of the station, **All Pro Broadcasting Inc.**, the FCC has assigned call letters **KACE** to the facility. All Pro's take over the station is still subject to Commission approval.

FTC Kills Children's Ad Restrictions

After pondering guidelines for advertising aimed at children for several years, the **Federal Trade Commission** has officially cancelled the proposed plans. The Commission had made an attempt to crack down on premium offers to children in TV ads, and also tried to come up with a general enforcement statement on such ads. They said they will continue to monitor the advertising on a case-by-case basis. Broadcasters and ad reps had argued that most premium offers are fair and not misleading to children. The Commission agreed that there was not enough evidence to prove that all such offers were deceptive or unfair.

The top ten were: "Happy Days," "Laverne & Shirley," "Challenge of the Network Stars," "John Denver Special," "MASH," "Six Million Dollar Man," NBC's "Man From Atlantis," "One Day At A Time," "60 Minutes," and "Welcome Back Kotter." NBC's "Diana Ross Special" rated a poor 59th. For the entire week, ABC had a 21.4 rating, **CBS** 17.9, and **NBC** 17.8.

Top 10 shows in Los Angeles, according to Arbitron TV meter estimates, for the week of February 26-March 4: 1) "Happy Days" and "Laverne & Shirley" tied, 3) "Challenge of the Network Stars," 4) a five way tie between ABC Sunday Night Movie, "Barney Miller," "John Denver Special," "Welcome Back Kotter," and "What's Happening!" 9) "Wonderful World Of Disney," 10) "Barry Manilow Special" tied with "Man From Atlantis." 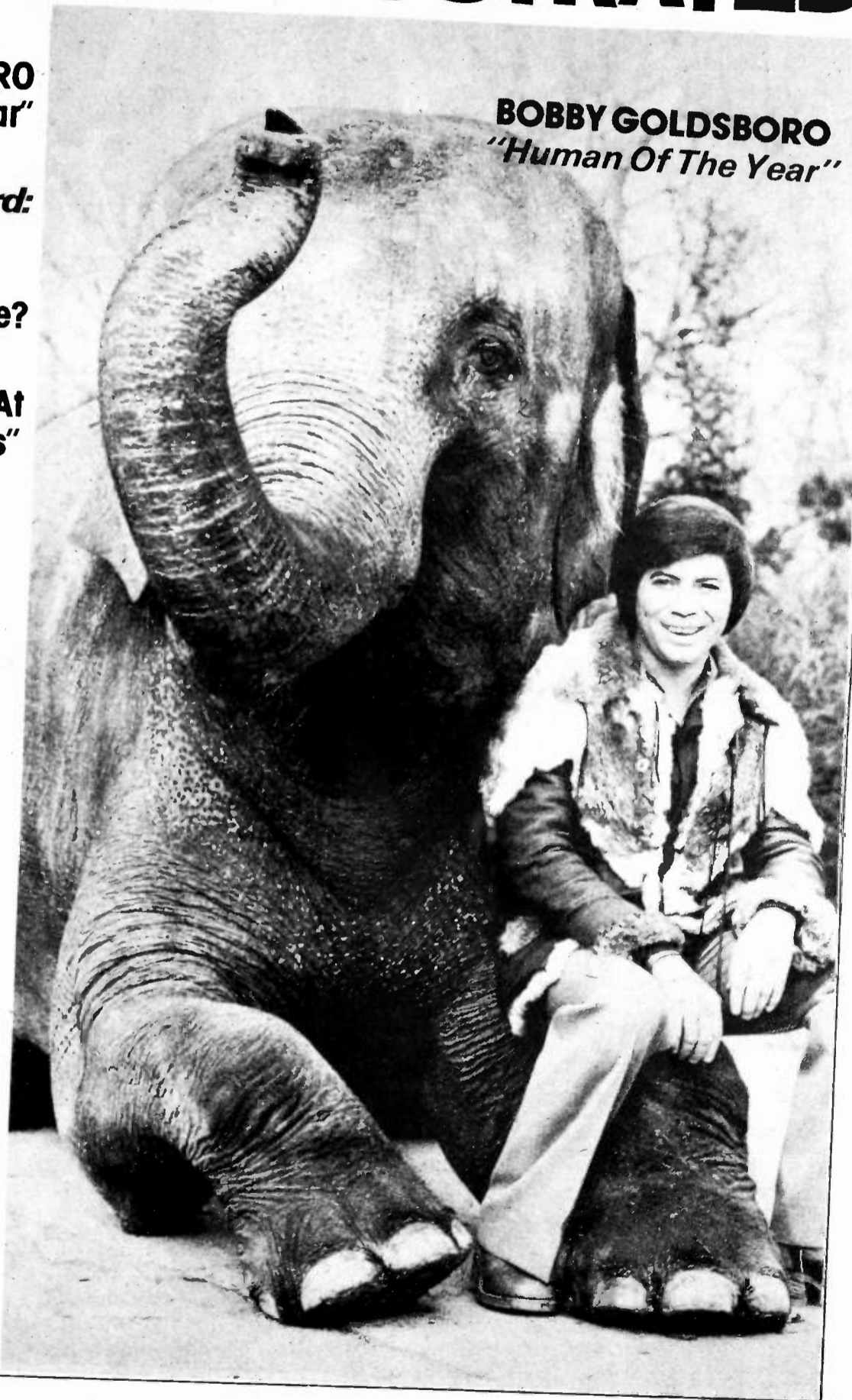

Question: How would you like it if you and your associates were given a radio station to program solely on your educated musical ear, taste, and opinion, with subjectivity being the key to your success not being that concerned with record sales, artist track records, and audience-related music research? That would mean, if you were to leave, the sound of the station would change. Is that regressive in relationship to the direction in which contemporary music radio seems to be heading? Perhaps. But it seems to be working, although the industry has yet to recognize it for what it is...

How Hard Is Your Soft Rock?

"We don't give away money, albums, tickets, anything...and yet we've got the best FM Rock ratings in Los Angeles." KNX-FM/Los Angeles Program Director Steve Marshall went on to say, "When I was a kid listening to the radio, I always thought that there has to be something wrong with a radio station if they had to offer me money or prizes to listen."

In spite of the fact that KNX-FM's "Mellow Sound" variation of AOR radio is now battling for the top position of all the many stations competing in LA's crowded Rock derby, the station continues to maintain a relatively low promotional profile, consisting primarily of outdoor billboards and a consistent on-air sound. More important, the station is proving to be a highly successful concept that is inspiring a lot more of the same across the country. Interestingly, although the growing number of these stations share the same premise, that there is a tremendous audience for the "mellow" approach to Album Oriented Rock radio, each one is quite different than the rest.

According to Marshall, "Because we program our records based on sound, the way we choose them is a highly subjective thing. Anyone else who programmed the way we do would have to come up with a different sound because their subjectivity wouldn't be exactly the same as ours."

Both Steve Marshall and KNX-FM Music Director Michael Sheehy claim that although the station is definitely an AOR station they never use the actual word "Rock" on the air. Another word that is never used is "soft" although many observers use it as an adjective

to describe the station. Marshall puts it this way, "The word is 'mellow' and in the context we use it, 'mellow' relates more to 'melodic' than 'soft.' 'Soft' indicates 'dead.'"

Right next door to KNX-FM on the dial is the relatively new 94 FM (KPOL-FM). They use the opposite terminology in publicly projecting the station's image with the logo, "Rockin' You Softly." The strange thing is that even though they use the word 'Soft' they actually play a 'harder' blend of 'soft Rock' than KNX-FM. 94 FM Program Director Roger Layng claims, "The word 'soft' doesn't necessarily have to mean 'limp.' We are soft people here at 94 FM and try to create a soft environment and feel that goes beyond the music." Nevertheless, whatever their terminology, it isn't unusual to hear songs such as "Layla" mixed in among the Simon and Garfunkel on 94 FM.

This brings up the question, what is mellow? Where does one draw the line between hard and soft?

Steve Marshall says, "We are very concerned with the irritation factor of a record. We don't ever want to play anything that will annoy our audience because it is overly harsh."

New York City's WKTU Program Director Larry Miller told me, "One of the things we are trying to do is not sound like anyone else. I find that we come up with a good, healthy ratings spread by directly focusing our attention to the 25-34 demographic. Interestingly, we've done reasonably well even with men 18-24, in spite of the fact that they are probably one of the most vocal and difficult groups for any AOR station to deal with. For the purposes of our 'soft' approach to AOR radio, I do not consider them at all in my programming decisions. We concentrate heavily on females. I program more on 'sound' than I do on 'popularity' because our target audience doesn't buy as many records as some of the younger demographic groups do."

Miller agrees with Marshall on the subjectivity involved in determining exactly what sound is right for their kind of radio. "There are tremendous differences of opinion in the world of 'soft' AOR radio when it comes to not only adding records, but in structuring them, too. I choose my music based upon everything from lyric content to the actual vocal quality of a singer. Thus, I may not play a seemingly 'mellow' record simply because the vocalist's voice might be a bit on the harsh side. The way one record will blend with the rest in our programming mix is also considered. For example, we avoid playing records that were produced before, say, *Sgt. Pepper* because they have a tinny sound when played back to back with more recently recorded material."

As 'Soft' and 'mellow' AOR radio continues to gather ratings and spread across the country, there will continue to be different approaches. Steve Marshall points out that

subjective determination of sound isn't the only factor contributing to these differences. "Not only do we have to be concerned with 'how mellow' each particular record is, we also have to determine whether or not the image of the record and artist fits our concept, just like any other AOR station. For example, if Engelbert Humperdinck came out with a great sounding record that fit our 'mellow' requirements, we would still have to think twice about adding it. Our audience still might not accept him."

Marshall also acknowledged the evolution factor of change in KNX-FM. "We are always going through the library and making changes based upon contemporary pertinence. It's also amazing how our interpretation of 'mellow' has changed over the years. Many records which are considered 'soft' by today's standards were hard Rockers five or six years ago."

The industry basically regards "Mellow Rock" as just another of AOR radio's many factions and is tending to lump them all together into one categorical label. It is becoming obvious, however, that there are as many factions within the ranks of the "Soft Rockers" as there will be stations subscribing to it's premise. That isn't all that different than the rest of the wide spectrum of format approaches we call "AOR."

It is doubtful that we'll ever come up with a definition of "mellow" that will suit everybody's taste and opinion, and it is probably healthier that we don't try to. Don't be surprised, however, if the day comes when these stations get broken down into "Soft Soft," "Medium Soft," "Hard Soft," "Soft Mellow," "Medium Mellow," and "Hard Mellow," categories, not to forget "Progressive Mellow" and "Tight Mellow" as the entire world of AOR radio continues to explode into an endless amount of colorful options.

tion into payola? What event or events prompted the action?

Answer: Simply stated, the FCC determined to conduct the present payola inquiry because of a myriad of complaints from people within and without the industry. Contrary to the self serving declarations of many within the industry, payola is rampant. Air personalities, disc jockeys and Program Directors are "on the take" or attempting to coerce record companies and/or their employees into making payments in order to gain air play for record products. In addition, the record companies themselves have been rather lax in policing their own personnel thereby adding to the problem. The FCC considers it necessary to formulate new rules, regulations and procedures which will guard against payola practices and help "clean up" the industry.

Question: If a radio station employs a person who owns a record store or an interest in a record store, and this person is on the air, is this illegal?

Answer: Each broadcast station should have an affirmative action plan with respect to a playlist and how the playlist is derived. So long as the individual having an interest in a record store has no influence in the selection of the music to be played over-the-air, then there is no question or aura of payola. On the other hand, if the person owning the record store does participate in the selection of music to be played over the station, then a strong presumption arises that this individual's objectivity and impartiality may be suspect.

Question: Is it permissible for Music Directors, Program Directors and disc jockeys to have record promotion people buy them lunch or dinner?

Answer: A business and/or luncheon meeting is certainly permissible. In today's business world business luncheons and dinners are commonplace and there is no reason why radio station personnel should be singled out and chastised for such a business practice. This means that a record promotion man is certainly free to invite a disc jockey, Music Director and/or Program Director to lunch or dinner without fear of a payola smear. The same is true if the invitation also extends to the wife of the disc jockey, Program Director and/or Music Director. On

the other hand, a quick flight to L.A., Chicago, Las Vegas, etc., for a "unique night on the town" is beyond the realm of reasonableness and would constitute payola. Once the luncheon and/or dinner leaves the realm of reasonableness and becomes extraordinary the payola presumption rears its ugly head.

Question: Can a radio station that has no financial interest in a concert announce over-the-air "92XYZ presents the Eagles in concert?"

Answer: The answer is no. The FCC has recently imposed a very rigid standard which prohibits any radio station from making announcements that mislead the public into believing that the station is in fact the promoter of the concert when the truth is that it has no financial interest in the concert. The test that the FCC imposes is one that requires a radio station to have a financial interest - sharing in the losses as well as the profits - before it can affirmatively disseminate information to the public that it is in fact the sponsor and/or promoter of a concert. Therefore, if radio station 92 XYZ does not have a financial interest in the Eagles concert then it cannot make the announcement - "92XYZ presents the Eagles in concert." On the other hand, there is no problem should the radio station say "92XYZ welcomes the Eagles to Tuppalow" or, "92XYZ is proud to announce the Eagles in concert."

Question: Are Program Directors and/or consultants permitted to attend record company seminars and/or meetings?

Answer: So long as there is a legitimate business purpose to such a meeting then it is permissible for a Program Director and/or consultant to attend the meeting. On the other hand, if the purpose of the meeting is simply to frolic in the sun and surf, then once again we have that ominous payola cloud hanging over head. Before any Music Director and/or consultant consents to attend such a record company seminar, he or she should request a written statement from the record company spelling out the business purpose for the invitation and the participation in discussions, panels, etc., expected from the invitee. The consultant, Music Director and/or Program Director should then respond to the letter confirming the business purpose and the fact that the invitee will in fact be participating in a meaningful business meeting.

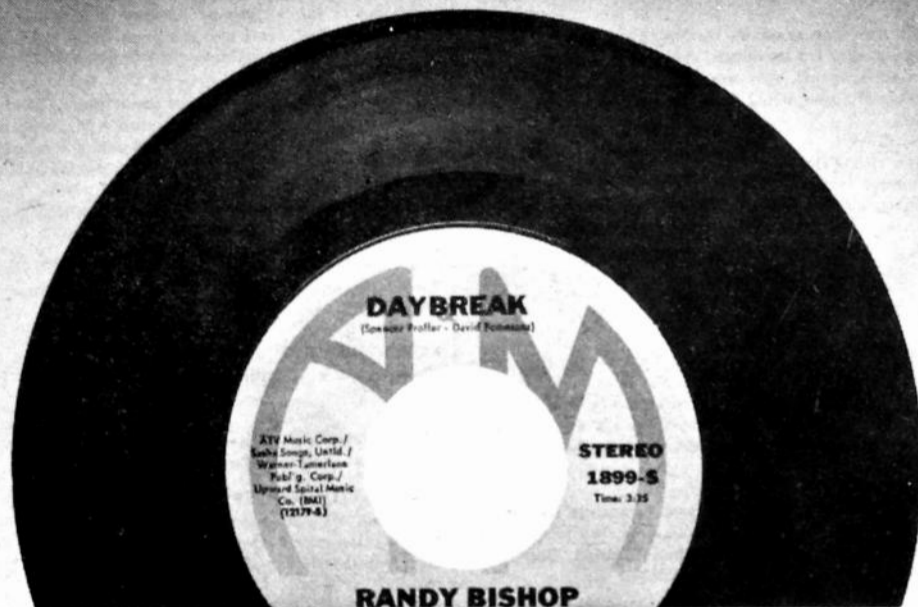
