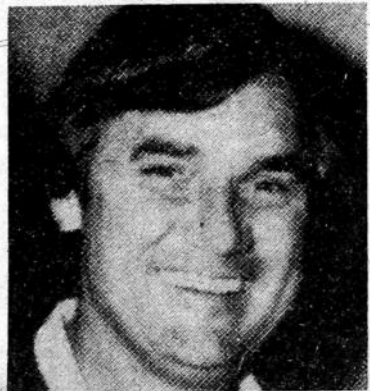
Major A&M Restructuring Announced by Moss, Alpert

A major restructuring of A&M Records' corporate organization is underway. Jerry Moss and Herb Alpert, who made the announcement Tuesday (4/5), will assume the titles of Chairman and Vice-Chairman. Gil Friesen has been promoted to the Presidency of A&M from the Senior Vice President position, while Bob Fead becomes Senior Vice President, Director of Marketing and

Distribution, a newly created position. Chuck Kaye was appointed

President of the company's publishing wings, Irving/Almo Music and Rondor Music, Inc. Gerry Lacoursiere was named President of A&M Records, Canada.

Moss, who with Alpert created A&M 15 years ago, commented, "This restructuring firms up our organization for present needs and leaves enough room for future growth. I will be spending less time in the administrative area. Gil (Friesen) will run the company. I'll spend more time with artists, producers, and managers..." Alpert indicated that he would be producing more actively in the future.

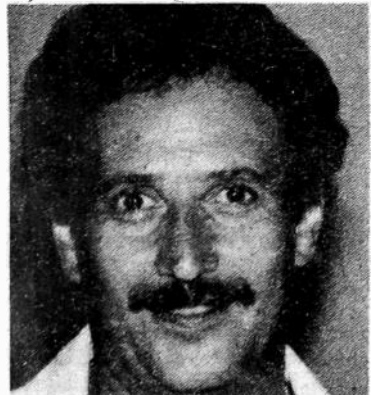

Posner had been with Elektra and E/A for 19 years, rising from the mailroom to a 1973 appointment as company President.

AFTRA—Mutual Strike Over

The five-week strike against Mutual Broadcasting by AFTRA's Washington/Baltimore local ended Saturday (4/2). Mutual reinstated all jobs in question (without back pay) after AFTRA agreed to drop its unfair labor practices charges with the NLRB. Mutual President C. Edward Little had fired four employees for "intimidating non-union workers," which touched off the strike. Little and Evelyn Freyman, Executive Secretary of the AFTRA local, said in a jointly-issued statement that the two sides had "entered an interim contract which will remain in effect until a full collective bargaining agreement has been concluded."

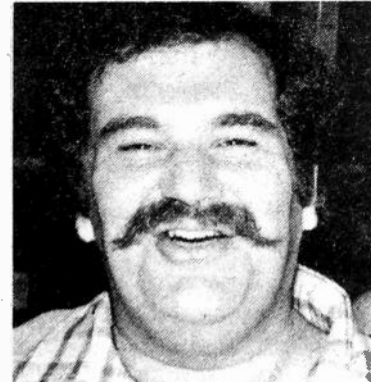

CKLW Strike

Thirty-three members of NABET, including board operators, news writers, FM operators, and clerical workers, walked off the job at CKLW Thursday (3/31) over a jurisdictional issue. CKLW had agreed to allow all board operators to keep their jobs, but had refused to guarantee replacement in all positions once present jobholders exited or retired.

AFTRA members have not supported the strike and have remained on the air, and station President/General Manager Herb McCord did not seem overly perturbed by the situation, telling R&R: "I frankly think this strike may go on forever. We found out how well we could run this station with management people."

WFEA's 'Mystery Man' Fools Listeners AND Competition

He wore an army surplus trench coat, a wool cap, and ski goggles, and carried a crumpled paper bag. His appearance and demeanor were not significantly different from any of the other patrons at the Manchester, New Hampshire shopping complex, but his actions immediately attracted attention. As people strolled past, he reached into his bag and pulled out \$2 and \$5 bills, blithely handing them out to the stunned passers-by. Crowds gathered in record time, attracted by the thought of free money. So did the police. A call on the police scanner alerted the media. The crowds grew larger. And watching the mysterious philanthropist from the fringes of the crowd was a man posing as an undercover policeman.

The police attempted to arrest the giveaway artist. The watching pseudo-cop persuaded them to desist. A thief attempted to steal all the money for himself. The pseudo-cop talked him out of it. A local phone-in radio talk show discussed the incident. The pseudo-cop didn't try to stop them. The local newspaper ran a front page story the next day. The pseudo-cop made no attempt to deter them either.

In fact, the pseudo-cop was thrilled to death. In real life he was

Dave Corey, of WFEA/Manchester, and he'd just acquired the kind of publicity for a station promotion that money couldn't buy. Only money given away could accomplish it. The mystery man passing out the bucks was actually WFEA weekend personality Bob Wheeler, and the key to the success of the promotion was that instead of announcing that the WFEA Mystery Man would be handing out money at the shopping center, as most station promotions have worked it, Corey kept it all a big secret, made an actual mystery out of it, until he had his front-page story and free air-time on the competing talk-show station. He did have to let the local police in on the secret when they were about to bust Wheeler (for disturbing the economy?), and by telling the would-be thief it was all a radio station promotion, he managed to halt a potential assault. But by using the subtle approach, Corey, Wheeler and WFEA could claim an immensely successful promotion that piqued the curiosity and interest of the local media and the entire population.

The "Mystery Man," his identity now exposed on the air the next day, is currently en route to other southern New Hampshire locations, passing out money to people who say "Musicradio is my favorite radio station."

Beach Boys Reported Set To Leave WB For Caribou Records

The Beach Boys have signed with James Guercio's CBS-distributed custom label, Caribou. Beach Boys drummer Dennis Wilson has been under contract to Caribou as a solo artist, with an album scheduled for release in the near future, and the group and Guercio have enjoyed a longterm friendly relationship (Guercio recently toured with the Beach Boys, playing bass).

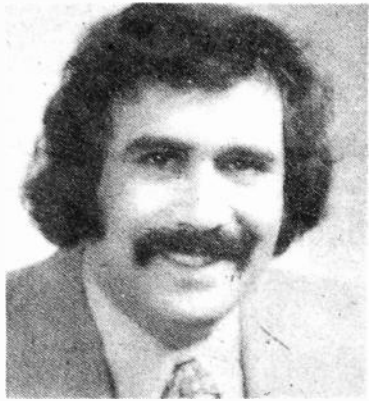

Hennes Details WIBG's 'Rock & Roll Machine'

Bill Hennes, who took over the PD position at WIBG/Philadelphia a week ago (R&R 4/1), has already instituted major changes at the station. WIBG switched over from its Pop/Adult-styled format on April 1 to a Top 40 approach featuring a 30-record playlist, playing no album cuts. Other changes detailed by Hennes as part of his "electronic Rock & Roll machine" include the use of the shotgun jingle package, Hit Line opera-

tors on duty 24 hours a day, an improved audio chain, and an "instant winners" promotion with giveaways of cash and/or the top-selling albums in the Philadelphia market. Five-State Communications Conclave A Success

The second annual Five-State Communications Conclave, held from March 31 to April 2 at the Radisson Inn, Plymouth, Minnesota (just outside of Minneapolis) was acclaimed a success in its goal of bringing together programmers in the Five-State area (Minnesota, Wisconsin, South Dakota, North Dakota, Iowa) and industry figures for frank, informative discussions. The Conclave was highlighted by a keynote address by George Brooks, Owner of KCUE/Red Wing, entitled "Thinking With Your Ears," and several productive sessions. The Large Market Session featured comments and a question and answer session from large market management personnel; while the Country Session spotlighted a spirited dialogue between differing philosophies of Country radio, one spokesman be-

ing WMAQ/Chicago PD Bob Pittman. A major highlight was the Trades Session featuring R&R Publisher Bob Wilson, Cashbox Editor Gary Cohen, and Gavin Report As-

sistant Editor Gary Taylor, representing the three trade publications specifically requested by the broadcasters participating in the Conclave.

Malamud Exits NARM

Jules Malamud, NARM President for 16 years, has resigned effective April 22. He said, "I leave NARM with mixed emotions. It was my life for 16 years. My resignation is by no means a sudden decision or action on my part. The decision regarding my resignation was a mutual one, between the NARM Board of Directors and myself."

The resignation came on the heels of a reported altercation with a prominent industry executive and other pressures, but according

to Malamud these were not the direct causes of his leaving.

Malamud presided over NARM's growth from a small rack jobbers' association to its present prestigious status. He indicated that he was considering at least four solid new offers, and would possibly relocate to the West Coast.

No successor has yet been named, and there was a possibility that the present executive staff would be reorganized in lieu of appointing a new President.

KRLD And KAFM/Dallas To Metromedia And Bonneville

The licenses of KRLD and KAFM/Dallas will be transferred to Metromedia Inc. and Bonneville International Corp., under a transaction announced last week. KRLD Corp. currently owns both outlets, and has agreed to Metromedia's purchase of the entire company for approximately \$13 million, at which time Bonneville will pur-

chase the assets of KAFM for over \$2 million cash. Metromedia will then assume the license of KRLD. Both Metromedia and Bonneville now own the maximum seven FM outlets, therefore Bonneville will sell KSL-FM/Salt Lake City, and Metromedia is restrained from keeping KAFM. All the transactions are subject to FCC approval.

Gaylord Broadcasting Gets FCC Approval To Buy KOIN-Portland

Gaylord Broadcasting has received FCC approval of their purchase of KOIN-AM-FM/Portland, and has announced plans for new formats for both stations. New General Manager is Tom Reddell, formerly of KOMA/Oklahoma City, with Mike Davis named Program Manager. Davis told R&R that the station has applied for new call letters

KYTE-AM-FM. The AM side will be Top 40-Contemporary, FM a Pop/Adult format, with plans to program live in the near future. Burkhart/Abrams Associates has been retained to consult the facilities. Gaylord also owns WKY/Oklahoma City, and KRKE/Albuquerque.

Business News

FCC Payola Hearings Postponed

The **Federal Communications Commission's** continuation of their payola hearings has been put off until May 16, after the Commission had earlier announced that hearings would resume on March 30.

Globe, Storer Announce Earnings

Globetrotter Communications, under their new name **Globe Broadcasting**, has reported an operating profit of over \$200,000 last year, after a loss of over \$1 million in 1975. The company's gains came during the period when they sold their non-broadcasting operations.

First quarter earnings for **Storer Broadcasting** are expected to stay at the same level as the same period last year, approximately \$2.3 million. Storer Chairman **Bill Michaels** blamed in part the severe winter weather for the lower-than-expected earnings, but said that current trends toward better business allowed him to expect higher profits for the rest of the year.

Congressional Hearings On Radio Prices

The Small Business Subcommittee on Antitrust & Restraint of Trade Activities has announced intentions to investigate complaints on the pricing of automobile radios. Committee Chairman **John Brockinridge** said that all facets of pricing by the three major auto manufacturers will be investigated, and an attempt to see what relationship exists between cost of manufacture and retail prices. Complaints from both the broadcast industry and small manufacturers of car radios prompted the hearings, which will be scheduled after the current Congressional recess.

"Payola" Charges Denied By FCC

In response to a Washington D.C. Appeals Court suggestion that **FCC** members may have been "influenced" by contacts with cable-TV industry leaders in the Commission's recent pay-cable decision, FCC Chairman **Richard Wiley** said "It is naive to suggest that just because I have a visit from a party I'm going to vote the way he wants." Other Commissioners in attendance at the NAB Convention concurred with Wiley's comments, arguing that the court was attempting to administrate the Commission's regulatory process, and that some personal contact with the industries they regulate is necessary.

Beatles Appeal To Stop Album

An album recorded by the **Beatles** in Hamburg, Germany in 1962 has come under fire from the group's members. The Beatles, individually and collectively through **Apple Co.**, have appealed to British Courts to block the release of the LP. They are asking for an injunction against **Lingasong Records**, which is planning to release the album worldwide in the near future.

NBC May Drop Emmy Show

Industry speculation is that the **NBC-TV** network will drop their annual telecast of the **Emmy Awards**, scheduled for May 15. Basis for the network's decision is because of recent hassles between the National Academy of TV Arts & Sciences, presenters of the Emmys, and the Hollywood Chapter of NATAS which was recently kicked out of the organization. Since a good majority of the celebrities up for awards are Hollywood-based, NBC speculates that there would be a very low star turnout for the event.

Fotomat, Avis National Buys

An \$8 million budget has been set for **Fotomat Corp.**'s "Picture Pickup Promise" advertising campaign. Spot radio buys, backed up by TV and print, will tell consumers about the company's guaranteed film processing service.

"Avis Trucks Harder" is the theme of the **Avis** truck rental advertising effort. Radio spots in 22 markets will feature testimonials from truck rental customers and local Avis managers.

Loretta Lynn Book-Record Tie In

Both **MCA Records** and **Warner Books** are planning a large scale promotion effort for **Loretta Lynn's** "I Remember Patsy" LP and paperback book "Coal Miner's Daughter." The two companies will tie in with promotion, distribution and advertising, including co-op radio buys nationwide. A trade of albums for books between the companies will also help push sales on both ends.

A Close Shave For McDonald's

McDonald's food chain will distribute **Gillette's** "Good News" disposable razor in 70% of their restaurants, offering free razors to adults who purchase a breakfast entree. A \$3 million ad budget is planned for radio and TV buys. The month-long promotion kicks off on April 15th.

Warner Bros., has just released the latest album by the group, "The Beach Boys Love You," and the group apparently owes the label one more album under their present contract. CBS sources told **R&R** that they will attempt to buy out the last album owed to Warners. Future Beach Boys product

R&R/Friday, April 8, 1977 will carry a Brother/Caribou logo (Brother being the Beach Boys' 10-year-old custom label).

The Beach Boys have been among the top American musical acts for 15 years, recording innumerable hit singles and albums and accounting for well over \$100 million in worldwide sales. Their new CBS deal is rumored to be one of the most lucrative ever, with a reported guarantee of \$1 million per album.



TV News

ABC Dominates Top 10

ABC regained their lead on **CBS** in the Nielsen ratings for the week ending March 27, with a 20.3 rating, compared to CBS' 18.9 and **NBC's** 17.2. On top again was "Happy Days," followed by "Laverne & Shirley," "Barney Miller," "What's Happening!," "Welcome Back Kotter," "Three's Company," "MASH," "Charlie's Angels," "Little House On The Prairie," and a two way tie for 10th spot "Feather and Father Gang" and "Most Wanted."

Overnight Nielsen results from last Sunday's NBC presentation of "Jesus Of Nazareth" showed the first part of the six hour film the hands down winner for the time period. In Los Angeles, the show pulled a 34.7 rating, compared to ABC's "Six Million Dollar Man" and "You Only Live Twice" which had a 13.1, and CBS' regular "Rhoda," "Phyllis," "Switch" and "Delvecchio," coming in with a poor 11.8. New York and Chicago results showed the same three-way breakdown.

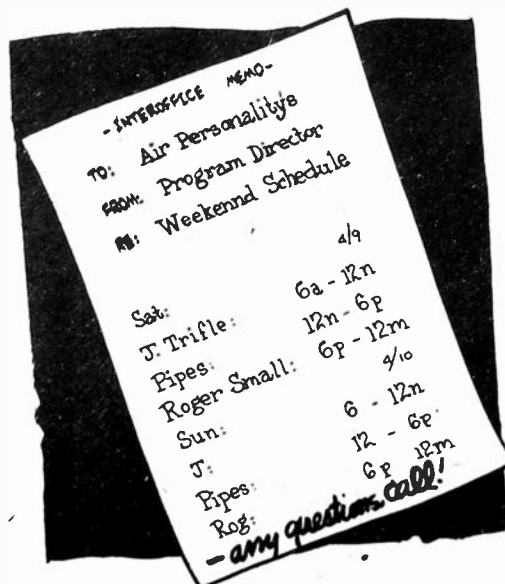

Arbitron Adds Markets To Spring Sweep

Four new radio markets will be measured in Arbitron's April/May '77 sweep; Lincoln, Nebraska; Pueblo, Colorado; Daytona Beach, Florida; and Burlington-Plattsburgh ADI. Two markets measured last spring, Waterbury, Connecticut; and Richland-Pasco-Kennewick, Washington will not be surveyed this year. A total of 164 markets are scheduled for the April 14-May 11 sweep.

WGAR's Broadcast Career "Basic Training"

The ninth series of WGAR/Cleveland's "Basic Training" begins April 20. The six week programs are offered to high school seniors and college freshmen with interests in the broadcast field. Weekly sessions feature two WGAR staff members lecturing on the various fields, including engineering, programming FCC Community needs, ratings, formats, music, news, public affairs, sales, accounting, traffic and more. Sessions are held at the station to give students an even better look at day to day broadcasting.

"Roots" Contests Continue To Grow

One KLUC/Las Vegas winner got a chance to trace their own "roots" through the Nevada Genealogical Society in the station's Roots contests. Callers won copies of the "Roots" soundtrack LP and qualified for the grand prize drawing.

In celebration of the first weekend of Spring, WEEQ/Waynesboro gave away Quincy Jones' "Roots" albums, along with a rooted plant of their own. All these winners were eligible for \$50 worth of plants from a local store.

KRTH "K-Earth"/Los Angeles tied in with National Earth Day, giving listeners copies of the "Roots" album, and inscribing their names on a scroll to be given to the L.A. County Parks and Recreation Department, along with a 10 foot evergreen tree to be planted in a local park.

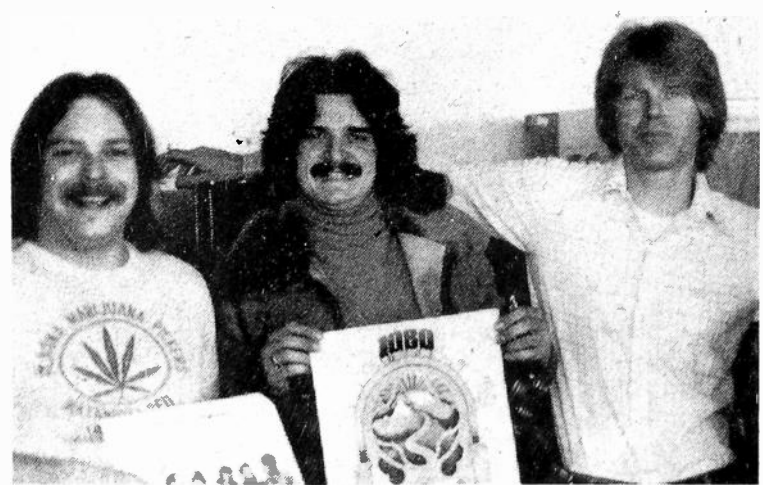

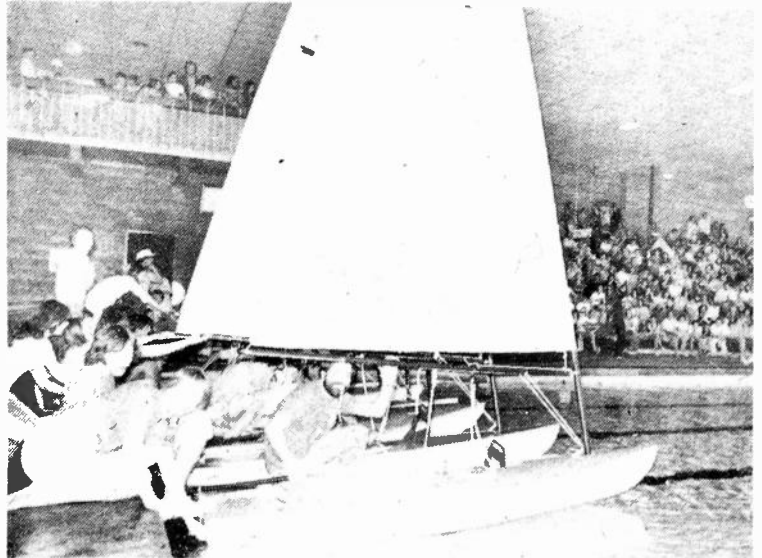

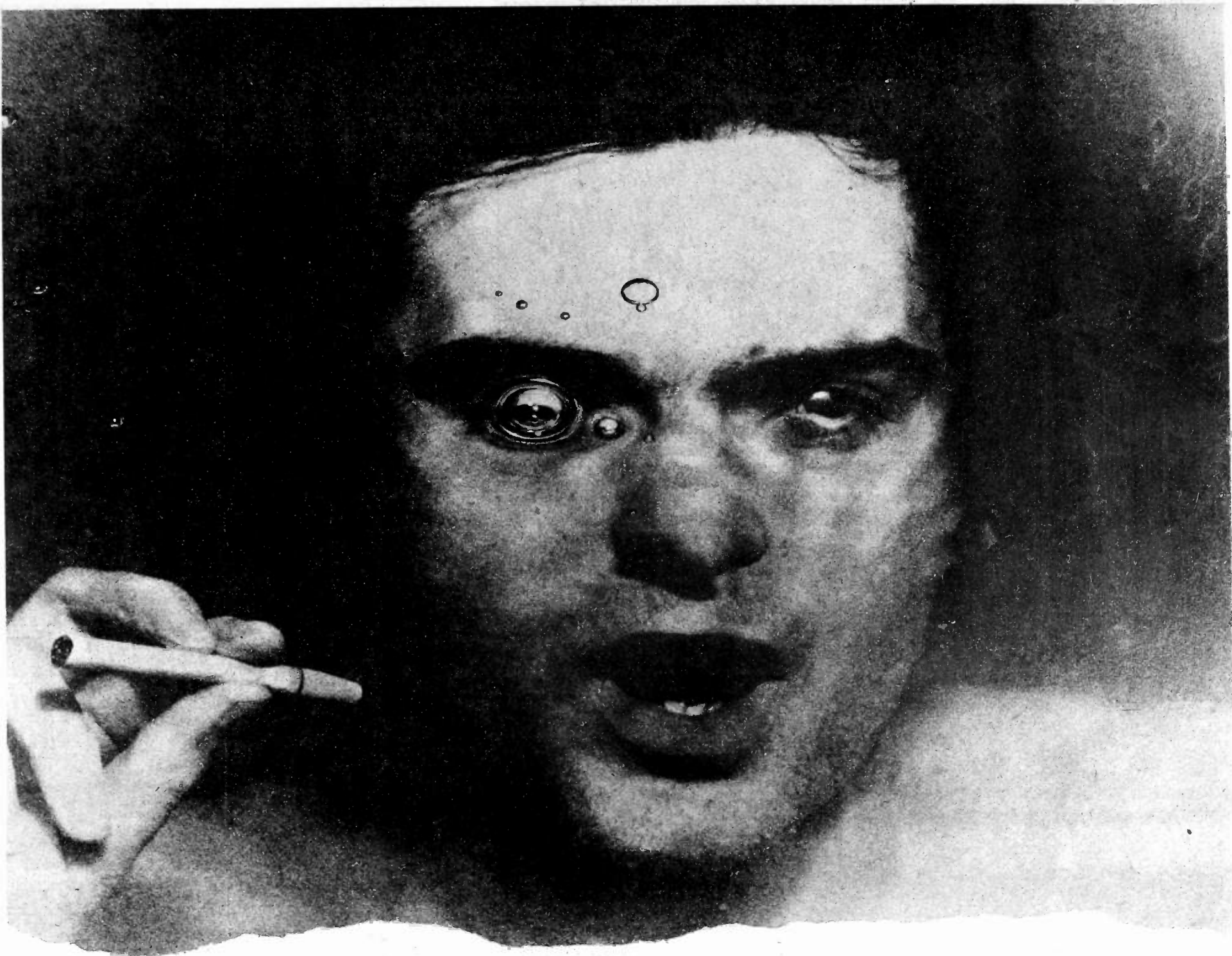

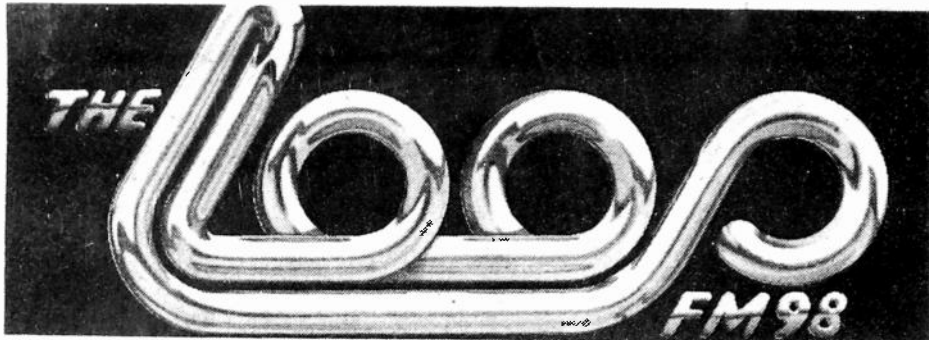
Lots of news this week, so let's get right to it...

KFIG To Mellow Out

KFIG/Fresno has announced a change in their AOR format approach, incorporating the services of Tom McKay's Windchime Communications "Mellow" AOR package. KFIG has been considered to be the "free-est form" of Fresno's three AOR's, all of which have basically been of the "all-purpose" mold. The other two are KFYE and KYNO (96 Rock) which is now being PD'd by Jeff Pollack. This change should round out the AOR spectrum in the Central California market and pave the way for an interesting battle. KFIG will remain under the Program Directorship of Joe Rolling.

Speaking Of Well Rounded Markets...

Welcome to AOR City, folks, as Chicago's WLUP, in the words of Program Director J.D. Blackburn, "...gets the warts out of their new format." Because Chicago's so jam packed with AOR radio stations now, WLUP is concentrating on competitive engineering as well as intensive research to gain their hopeful edge. In an effort to reduce listener fatigue, all music is on cart, and the DBX noise reduction system has been installed so listeners will only hear the sounds they want to hear. To combat tape hiss, the station has installed (the first in Chicago to do so) the Ambar EQ system. On the research front, KLUP set up a "war room" and ran up a 10,000 call telephone bill talking to specially selected representatives of the Chicago market about both their music and their lives. Their target is those Post-War Babies and based on some tapes I've heard of their first week on the air, coupled with the background lowdown, KLUP seems to mean business in the Windy City AOR battle. They'd better, because they're going up against some of the best programmers from just about every point of the growing AOR gamut. Current line-up: Tom O'Toole, mornings; Billy Martin, middays; Les Tracy, afternoons; and Greg Budell, evenings.

It's been approximately a year now since WXRT increased their AOR programming to 24 hours a day and their policy of "non-produced" commercials has received national trade attention on many occasions. WXRT Program Director John Platt told R&R, in regard to Chicago's burgeoning AOR scene, "It's hard to believe that not so long ago AOR radio in this town was basically dormant. The competition that exists now will be focusing national attention on Chicago as a major AOR center. I know that people from both the East and West used to write Chicago off in that area. Also, it's good because the increased amount of attention given to FM radio in general lately through outside promotion, especially TV, will draw more listeners to the FM dial, and we all stand to gain from that." In terms of competition, Platt states, "This is a big market and there's plenty of room. Look at New York.

Changes And Evolution

WLRS/Louisville got new studio equipment...Alan Young has become Asst. PD of Y95/Rockford from WLRS...Chris Miller is the new MD of WQDR/Raleigh...Dan Carlisle is now doing 2-6pm on KWST/Los Angeles from WWWW/Detroit...KLOL/Houston welcomes Paul Rian, 10am-2pm, from KBPI/Denver; Danny Moffatt, 10pm-2am, from KZEW/Dallas; and Debbi Miller, 2am-6am, from KEXL/San Antonio...KLOS/Los Angeles switches: Keith Lowe moved to 10am-2pm, Darrion to 6-10pm, and Patti Glick from 10pm-2am...Howard The Cabdriver is celebrating his second anniversary as the morning meteorological prognosticator and all around character at WPLJ/New York...Syndicated AOR program Rock Around The World is now using the services of KWST's Chuck Marshall as host and Tree as Production Manager, since moving to Hollywood. Their first show features Jesse Colin Young...Stuff Kaufman of WHCN/Hartford and his wife Coni are the proud parents of a new baby girl, Sara Ann...

WNEW-FM has something like an overall 2 share and they're still considered to be hot shit. Because we are one of the more distinct sounding AOR's in this market, we'll do fine in the ratings. I don't expect that we'll match WKQX in numbers because they're going after a more 'mass appeal' type audience and to try to compete on that level wouldn't do any of us any good. I suspect that WDAI and WKQX will be basically fighting for the 18-24 male audience, while we should do well 25-34." Platt describes WLUP's arrival with educated reservation, "WLUP is kind of the 'wild card' entry here. I'm certain that the market can handle 3 AOR's (WDAI, WKQX, WXRT) but as far as four are concerned, that will have to remain to be seen." In summary Platt went on to say, "We'll all have to be on our toes now. The important thing is not to panic. Thank God we've been full time now for almost a year. We're looked upon as an established station. As a matter of fact, our competitors are using our name as a point of reference in making their sales presentations."

Interestingly, WKQX Program Director Bob Pittman did just that in describing his station's programming position in the crowded AOR Chicago spectrum: "WDAI is more hit

oriented than we are. I see us as being somewhere between them and WXRT. I think WXRT will continue to pull the share they've been getting. Musicians and people who are really into music will continue to support their type of radio. The main thing, though, is that we consider WDAI to be our only competition. I think WDAI has made some positive changes since the last book. They certainly won't roll over and play dead." In regard to the new WLUP, Pittman observes, "Several things are working against them. First of all, they don't have the budget we do, and second, the Loop has a negative connotation in Chicago. It's the place you want to get away from. At WMAQ (Pittman's Country formatted AM), we had a 60 year old lady win a \$10,000 cash call. She refused to come into the Loop to pick up her check." Pittman, although programming one of Chicago's newer AOR's, will be going into the impending book as standard bearer because of WKQX's tremendously successful debut Winter Arbitron which placed them at the top of the AOR heap. WKQX is automated, but Pittman prefers to describe it as "Pre-recorded." The jocks record all voice tracks right before their shows. All News is live. According to Pittman, "Everything is on cart. No reel to reel. That way we have as much, if not more, personality and control of music than if we were live."

WDAI Program Director Bill Todd seems fully recovered by the shock of WKQX's stunning opening book. He explained his station's position to R&R as follows: "I'm remaining consistent with what we've done. No changes." He pointed out that WKQX came on the air "...with 2 months of commercial-free broadcasting and a promotion budget in the vicinity of \$225,000. Now they're running only about 6 commercial minutes per hour with every sixth hour commercial-free. We can't do that. We are live, have a big staff, and need the revenue to support our situation. Eventually their commercial policy can come back and bite them in the ass. Nevertheless, they are to be commended for their fine showing thus far." Todd went on to point out, "...3 or 4 AOR's battling it out in this market may very well create a good situation for the existing Top 40's. That's the major danger here."

It must be pointed out that there are more than "3 or 4" AOR stations grabbing their share of the Chicago market. TRIAD is a large free publication serving the Midwest out of Chicago and they have a broadcast extension of the magazine on WXFM each weekday evening programming their interpretation of AOR. TRIAD General Manager Rob Gilts told R&R, "the stepped up Chicago FM battle will not effect us that much because we have the magazine to promote ourselves. It is a very strong tool because we basically program in the old block style and print the schedule in the magazine which helps us gather a select audience. About the only change that we've made to maintain our individuality is in increasing the amount of local music that we play. We are programming the music that's happening on the streets, as well as imports, tapes, and lots of new music."

-- WJKL stands to be effected by the stepped up competition. Broadcasting from Elgin, Illinois, the station is the strongest AOR entry coming in from a suburban "umbrella market." WJKL Co-Music Director Tom Marker explained his station's posture: "We're trying real hard not to compete. Everyone else seems to be getting very worried. They seem to be moving toward the middle ground. Even WXRT seems to be adding fewer records and relying more on research...at least that's what it sounds like to me. We are trying to establish ourselves as being above all that. We want to remain more progressive. We don't pay any attention whatsoever to research. All we do is play the records that sound good to us." As far as immediate business is concerned, Marker approaches it differently: "On a sales level the increased competition will effect us in the area of record company and concert promotion dollars, so we are definitely paying attention toward building more retail accounts."

Chicago is now a vitally important market for AOR radio and the industry will undoubtedly be paying careful attention to all ensuing developments. In the words of WLUP Program Director J.D. Blackburn: "Things are heating up in Chicago. As cold as this winter was, I suspect we will have a long, very hot summer."

Ten Big Ones For WABX

WABX/Detroit has just entered their tenth year as a Progressive/AOR radio station (right on the heels of WNEW-FM/New York) and the gala celebration is underway. Highlighted will be an anniversary party/concert featuring an "opening act" with the Kinks and Heart to follow at 12,500 seat Cobo Hall. According to Century Broadcasting National PD Bob Burch, the two weeks leading up to the event will feature on-air wishes from former WABX air personalities, as well as greetings and music from Rock artists who have been the mainstay of the station's sound since its inception.

Idi...Are You There?

KWWW (KW3/Wenatchee, afternoon personality Brian G. caused some concern in his market as he attempted to talk with Ugandan President Idi Amin during his program. Brian only got as far as a spokesperson at the Presidential Palace, but will try again soon to get through to "the man who talks with God." According to Program Director David R. Saline, many listeners thought that Brian was tampering with national security by trying to talk with Amin, "...so, if anyone spots the Ugandan Army, let us know. I'm sure Brian would like to talk with them, too."

More Wenatchee Hotchky Potchky: A speedy recovery to KW3 morning personality Don Bernier who broke three ribs during last week's KW3 Kawasaki/Suzuki motorcycle races. Riding a Kawasaki 75cc at the time, Don lost control of the bike as he tried to stop.

New AOR's

According to WXQR/Jacksonville, North Carolina Music Director Kris Kelly, "We finally did it. We're over the hump. We now consider ourselves over the half-way mark on our way to becoming an AOR station. And judging from listener response so far, the rest of the way is all down-hill." Service is desperately needed. Phone Kris at (919) 455-2507 (station) or 455-2560 (home).

Canada Gets Another One: I heard from Ross Davies, Program Director of CJAY-FM/Calgary, who informed me of the station's plan to go AOR around the beginning of June.

The studios of KLOS/Los Angeles were the setting for the Media Sales Class from Pepperdine University as station VP/GM John Winnaman, PD Tom Yates, General Sales Manager Bill Sommers, A.E. Bill Shearer, Traffic Manager Phyllis Scott, and Marketing Research Director Janine La Perch all played "teacher" for the evening (3/17). The class, taught on a regular basis by KLOS National Sales Manager Lee Larson, is designed as a comparative study of radio, TV, newspaper, magazine, and outdoor advertising.

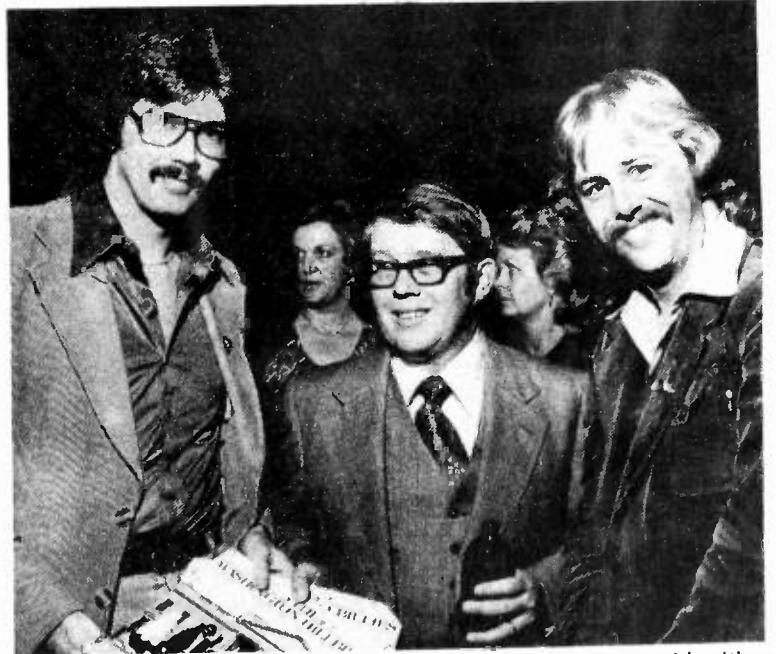
