HCD

(Has Its Time Come?)

It's interesting how seriously we take the categories that we create. After all, aren't categories created only to help us with the business of creativity? Or are they actually ends unto themselves? Are nails created so we may have a use for hammers? Hopefully not!

The reason for creating categories in this industry is to make it easier to differentiate between the varied aspects of our inventory (music) and our customers (listeners).

After we design our categories, we fill them with as many individual components as we possibly can in an attempt to please as many customers as we possibly can. This practice gave birth to that entity which we call the lowest common denominator. Unfortunately, there comes a time when our lowest common denominators fail to serve us and a true numerical majority of our potential customers becomes just about impossible to obtain. For the most part, the contemporary music radio industry has arrived at this position.

There is, however, an answer: HCD. HCD is that wonderful but elusive element that seems to pop up from time to time when least expected. It gives some sort of solidarity to the way large, diverse groups of people act. Quite simply, HCD is the **HIGHEST COMMON DENOMINATOR** that opens the door to new, workable target audiences, large enough to be seen from a distance.

HCD may just be needed now to up radio's potential success ceiling in all formats.

Although it often may not seem so, history works in a cyclical pattern. Change...as we perceive it, is probably just the rolling of impressions and opinions from one side of the philosophical spectrum to the other. The proverbial pendulum undergoes tremendously diverse fields of gravity as it follows its predictable course.

Radio people's impression that people are changing is pretty much an illusion brought on by our rapidly aging methods of "figuring them out." Taking it one step further, when our attempts at reaching a true mathematical majority (the *real mass*) became difficult, if not impossible, by currently fashionable means, we coped out to the convenient excuse that the public is incurably fragmented. Perhaps it is music radio which has become curably weak in its original

Charles Ferris Nominated As FCC Chairman

Charles Ferris has been nominated as Chairman of the FCC by President Carter. Ferris, a top legal aide to Speaker of the House Thomas O'Neill, replaces Richard E. Wiley, who resigned September 7.

Ferris, who has no broadcasting experience, played a major role in drafting civil rights legislation in the 60's, and was chief counsel to Senate Democratic leader Mike Mansfield for many years. He had been rumored to be a candidate for Deputy Attorney General at one point but was not chosen. Senate approval of his nomination is expected to be routine.

The other vacancy at the FCC, caused by the recent departure of Benjamin Hooks (now head of the NAACP), was expected by many of the same sources to be filled by Tyrone Brown, former General Counsel of the Post/Newsweek broadcast stations and currently with a Washington D.C. law firm.

Brown's appointment would maintain Black representation at the Commission. However, Brown was reportedly offended by being offered only the two-year term remaining in Hooks' stint instead of a full seven-year term, and therefore may decline the appointment. Hooks' personally endorsed choice, Memphis lawyer Russell B. Sugarman, has withdrawn his name from consideration, stating a general dissatisfaction with the FCC's approach and use of its time, according to a Daily Variety report.

Wiley, head of the Commission since 1974, had stayed on until a replacement could be found. In resigning, he wrote to President Carter, "I resign from the Commission of my life to serve as Chairman of the agency. In this regard, Mr. President, I would like to express appreciation to you for permitting me to remain in my current position during some nine months of your administration."

O'Shea Appointed PD At KVI/Seattle

Michael O'Shea has been named Program Director at KVI/Seattle by officials of the Golden West Broadcasting chain. The former National Program Director of the Amaturio Group (KMJX/Houston, KKSS/St. Louis, WGLO/Miami and WFTL/Ft. Lauderdale, where he was based) takes over the Seattle Pop/Adult outlet October 1. Before coming to Amaturio in 1976, O'Shea had been Program Director of WLW/Cincinnati and

KLIF/Dallas. Commenting on the move, O'Shea told R&R: "KVI is a fine station, with extensive community involvement. The station is Number One 18-49 in Seattle, and my mission is to sustain and perhaps increase its already enormous numbers."

Don Hoffman, present Program Director at KVI, will be moving to Golden West's KSFO/San Francisco, where he will assume Assistant Program Director duties under PD Victor Ives.

Arbitron Sinks Survey Pirates

Arbitron has announced notable successes in its campaign against non-subscribers using its survey data. According to the company, damages have been collected in "over a dozen" markets amounting to approximately \$100,000, with further cases pending in other markets.

Thanks to a Pittsburgh Federal District Court guideline ruling, which stated non-subscriber data use infringes copyright, constitutes unfair competition, and violates

Arbitron proprietary rights, the company has been successful "in every case where sufficient evidence has been presented." Arbitron issued a stern warning that "pirating Arbitron audience estimates (is) illegal," and pointed out that clients are currently subsidizing the free use of data by pirates. The company stated that it will continue "to protect its clients from non-subscribers regardless of the legal expenses."

RCA Headquarters Promotion On West Coast



New Radio Role For Rolling Papers

Cigarette ads went up in a puff of smoke following the federal ban on tobacco smokable broadcast advertisements, but radio spots promising "smooth, consistent smoking pleasure" are being aired in three major cities currently. The advertiser is not a cigarette, cigar, or pipe manufacturer, and tobacco itself may not even be their prime concern. The spots are for Job cigarette rolling papers, who are, via their American distributor **Adams Apple Distributing Company**, in the midst of a major radio campaign.

For some time, youth-culture magazines on the order of **Rolling Stone** or **High Times** were the focus for rolling paper advertising. Now, however, according to Adams Apple sources, almost 20 percent of the company's ad budget is slated for radio. The campaign was launched in Philadelphia, with copy spotlighting available flavors and colors, quality of the papers, and the Job company's experience in the field (since 1838), all set to music written by Midwest Rock act **Allota, Haynes & Jeremiah**. Just completed in Philadelphia was a major promotion featuring a giveaway of 500 Job T-shirts and a drawing for a 7-day trip for two to Paris, home of the rolling paper concern. The company also sponsored a live broadcast of a **Grateful Dead** concert on **WMMR** during the Labor Day Weekend.

Adams Apple has now extended the campaign to Cleve-

NAACP Files Billion Dollar Suit Vs. L.A. Broadcasters

Following through on an earlier warning (**R&R** 9-2), the Co-Chairmen of the Labor & Industry Committee of the Beverly Hills/Hollywood branch of the **NAACP** have filed a damage suit for \$1 billion against 11 Los Angeles broadcasting companies. The suit alleges that the various stations have "bastardized the true Black American experience by promoting racist programming designed only to ridicule the pride and dignity of Black Americans," and also accused defendants of discriminatory hiring practices. Named in the suit were **NBC's KNBC-TV**, **CBS' KNXT-TV** and **KNX-AM-FM**, **ABC's KABC-TV** and **KABC**, **Golden West's KTLA-TV** and **KMPC**, **COX's KFI** and **XTRA**, **RKO's KHJ-TV** and **KHJ**, **Bonneville's KBRT** and **KBIG**, **Storer's KGBS** and **KTNQ**, **Capital Cities' KPOL**, **Rollins' KDAY**, and **Tracy's KGFJ** and **KUTE-FM**. Although named at the earlier warning press conference, neither **Metromedia (KTTV-TV, KLAC, KMET)** or **Westinghouse (KFWB)** were named in the actual suit. The stations named also face license-renewal challenges from the **NAACP**, filed earlier.

land and Chicago Rock stations, with the same T-shirt giveaway drawing already underway. The company has reported reluctance on the part of some major stations to accept the spots, however, because the stations consider most rolling papers users to be marijuana smokers, apparently deemed a minor and specialized segment of the target audience. However, rolling papers have

been rolling into radio for some time now with the Job campaign merely a recent and spectacular entry. **Easy Rider** papers currently run spots on 80 radio stations in 40 markets nationally, spending 75 percent of a \$500,000 annual ad budget on radio. Their pitch focuses on their "double-width" papers, stressing the ease of "rolling a good smoke" on the wider paper.



UPI Board Recommends Terrorist Broadcast Guidelines

Concerned about terrorists' exploitation of the broadcast media, the **United Press International Broadcast Advisory Board** adopted a seven-point guideline proposal for broadcasters covering stories of terrorism. The recommendations are:

- 1) Each station should have established procedures for coverage of incidents of terrorism, kidnapping and other extreme violent crimes.
- 2) Judge each story on its own, and if the story is newsworthy, cover it.
- 3) Coverage should be thoughtful, conscientious, and should show restraint, and should be carried out with an awareness of the potential danger to life and person.
- 4) Report demands made as an essential point of the story, but do not provide an excessive plat-

form for such demands.

5) Reporters should avoid deliberately injecting themselves into the stories as intermediaries or negotiators.

6) If there has been no mention of a deadline, no one should ask a kidnapper or terrorist if there is one.

7) Above all, apply the rules of common sense.

With most radio and television stations adopting these or similar protective guidelines, it is hoped that incidents of terrorists attempting to exploit the broadcast media will decrease significantly, with the added hope that if terrorists are generally deprived of sensational publicity the total incidence of such crimes will decrease as well.

Motown Sues CTI Records

Motown Records filed an \$18 million suit against **CTI Records** and its President, **Creed Taylor**, for alleged breach of contract and fraudulent misrepresentation. According to Motown, CTI was to have deliver 24 albums to Motown, six a year over a four year pact signed in 1976. The complaint states that only four LP's had been delivered by August 1, 1977, when at least seven were due,

and Motown thereby suffered a \$9 million loss, including money fronted to CTI. Motown is also seeking an additional \$9 million under the fraudulent misrepresentation count, contending that CTI "had no intention of living up to their obligation" and had gone into the agreement "with the express intent to deceive and defraud Motown."

KCBS-AM/San Francisco Computerizes Newsroom

All-News **KCBS/San Francisco** is claiming the honor of possessing the world's first computerized broadcast newsroom, developed by **CBS** and **UPI**. Video display terminals hook up the station via satellite to **UPI's** information storage and retrieval system computers in New York. Reporters sit at a terminal keyboard and prepare entire stories, taking advantage of space-age capabilities. Should

they wish, reporters can leave blank spaces in stories, inserting instructions for the use of taped actualities, which will be automatically dubbed in by computer by the time the story is ready to be broadcast. Anchor-men can press a button and instantly see a breaking story on their terminal screens, ready to read. And, if a traditional paper copy of a story is required, an-

role as a cultural gatekeeper to trends and popular movements. Again, look at history. On artistic, sociological, and even political levels, whether you're talking about the emergence of the Renaissance from the Dark Ages, or JFK from the fifties' political doldrums, or (on the negative side) Hitler from a period of total political fragmentation in post-World War I Germany, or Rock and Roll from a tarnished pop music scene, or **Elvis** from a disorganized Rock and Roll scene, or the **Beatles** taking over a going-nowhere American Rock scene, or countless less dramatic tide-turning elements and events, an obvious theory begins to emerge. Weak leadership results in a fragmented consumer society. In turn, a fragmented society sets the stage for new strong leadership.

Plainly speaking, people probably have a lot more in common than we give them credit for, even today. They have a lot more in common than, perhaps, we are appealing to through the use of our categorical structuring. There has got to be a better mousetrap. When over-utilized categories indicate otherwise, we are ready for new categories of common human interest. The human condition probably hasn't changed since it began, just our subjective interpretations of it under the expedient guise of objectivity.

Dancing, music, life, love, romance, fantasy, tragedy, mystery, and conflict, are as much **HCD's** as **Elvis**, the **Beatles**, and **God**. There are as many more **HCD's** out there as there are things that are capable of turning us human beings on! Thus, we need not resign ourselves to being stuck with the old ones nor watered down imitative generations that follow major cultural revelations.

When radio continues to be pro-

grammed under the lowest common denominator theory after the main **HCD's** of an era have gotten old, it's like driving a beat-up 1959 Cadillac down Main Street and wondering why no one is impressed by the fins, and not understanding that you are way out of step with the masses. In fact, it's like thinking there's something wrong with the people for their lack of attention.

Let's take a quick look at the motion picture industry. It's not all that different than ours. Of all the films released this year, only one created an international stir triggering off waves of human reaction and attention. "Star Wars" is an **HCD**. Other films such as "The Exorcist," "Jaws," "One Flew Over The Cuckoo's Nest," and a handful of others, dealing with overly obvious human-related themes have captured the public's imagination and fancy during recent fragmented times. They are **HCD's**.

Soap operas are **HCD's**. People are fascinated by themselves and other people. Touch them, they'll respond. When it comes down to the real core of the issue, people defy shallow and temporary categorization.

One of the negative manifestations of our industry's preoccupation with lowest common denominators is our lack of sense about the maturity and intelligence of music audiences. Obviously, this has been said before, but, perhaps, because it's true. *Until programmers of music can confidently feel intelligently superior to most of the adults they come in contact with in the outside world, they have no right to think that adult music consumers are stupid, since their view is from the security of the radio station.* Point number two: The quickest way to be surpassed in intelligence by

What's New?

Wine In A Glass By Itself

Beringer/Los Hermanos Vineyards are test-marketing a new packaging concept—a 6.3 oz glass bottle of Los Hermanos wine topped with a plastic glass to serve it in. Washington, Oregon, and California are the first regions for **Wine By The Glass**, which retails at 79 cents a bottle, and comes in Chablis, Chenin Blanc, Vin Rose and Burgundy. The wrap-around bottle label also serves as shrink wrap binding the glass and bottle together. As they say, wine not?



Bulb Burns Longer, Uses Less Energy

A new light bulb, licensed exclusively by **Duro-Test Corporation** of New Jersey, reportedly cuts energy consumption by 60 percent and lasts 300 percent longer than ordinary bulbs. A new chemical film, consisting of a layer of silver between two titanium oxide layers, is responsible for the saving. However, the new bulb is presently estimated to be ten times as expensive as the conventional model. Market introduction is scheduled for early 1979.

Compact Copter Cops VW Image, Sets Ad Campaign

A new "compact helicopter" will be promoted by **Hunt Helicopter Corp.** as the airborne equivalent of the Volkswagen in a forthcoming ad campaign. The copter is targeted for ownership by "economy-minded professionals," with an ad employing a VW-style profile. The helicopter will sell for \$39,995, reportedly \$16,000 less than any other current compact, and relatively inexpensive to operate. According to Hunt, the helicopter market has grown 25 percent yearly for some time, and this model is "the vanguard of an exciting new concept in air transportation."

Japanese Fly High With Hi-Fi Exports

Sales of Japanese audio equipment, including tuners, receivers, amplifiers, and other stereo components, in the U.S. were up 31 percent in the first half of the year. A recent Japanese-American agreement stipulated a cutback in Japan's color TV exports, and the dramatic increase in U.S. sales of audio equipment is viewed by financial observers as an attempt to make up for the color TV loss.

Robots Ready As Security Guards

If you work in a building with a security guard, give him a close look. He may be a robot. Actually, there's no mistaking the **Century I**, a robot designed by **Quasar Industries** of New Jersey—it's 7 feet tall and weighs a trim 650 pounds. The Century I has sensors to detect movement, noise, or body heat, then "locks in" on any intruder, giving pursuit if necessary at a steady 20 mph. When it gets within eight feet of a suspect, it orally instructs the intruder to halt. If cooperation is not forthcoming, Century I can use a strobe light to blind its quarry, a high-frequency sound transmitter to cause pain to the inner ear, a mechanism to release laughing gas, and an electronic shock gun. The robot is bulletproof, and retails for \$75,000, for those interested in the latest trends in security guard fashions. Quasar is also designing a Century II model robot for the Army, for which they claim "once he's put on program, nobody can stop him"—including, presumably, personnel on the robot's own side. The Machine Age is coming on strong.

Soviets Turn Rock Critics; Pan Dylan

A Soviet newspaper criticized **Bob Dylan** for dropping his anti-Establishment stance of the 60's, asserting that the singer had fallen prey to the irresistible lure of capitalist gold. "Many old

songs of protest that brought him his fame started disappearing one by one from his repertoire," the article stated, implying that Dylan's story was typical of many Rock artists who had allowed "a revolutionary form of art" to degenerate into a mere commercial enterprise. Apparently Dylan has a long way to go before he can approach the Russian popularity of **Andy Williams** (R&R. 9-2).

Check The Book First

Before radio stations and jocks make an all-out attempt to break that world record for broadcasting in a sealed glass cage without oxygen or consuming spinachburgers on top of a flagpole, they should keep two things in mind. One, check to see that your category is actually listed by the **Guinness Book of World Records**, and second, that the record you're trying to break is actually the latest, correct figure—otherwise you might broadcast from a highwire stretched across the Grand Canyon for 167 straight hours all for nothing. That's the advice of a longtime observer of radio promotions, **R&R** can only second the emotion. Check your Guinness before you start your stunt.

Sony Videotape Unit Maintains Price

Sony Corporation unveiled a new model videotape recorder with a two-hour recording capability on a single cassette, but stated that the retail price would remain at \$1300, the same as the current **Betamax** model. Many observers had expected Sony's price tag to decrease substantially in response to **RCA's** new \$1000 model. Sony also introduced a new cassette with three-hour recording capacity.

Memphis Sets Elvis In Bronze

The city of **Memphis** will receive a 25-foot bronze statue of the late **Elvis Presley** courtesy of the **Memphis Development Foundation**. The 50-ton statue will be completed in two years, with donations being accepted during that time, as it will be financed privately. No other contemporary musician, to **R&R's** knowledge, has ever been memorialized on such a grand scale.

CBS, Mottola In Production Deal

CBS Records and **Tommy Mottola's Champion Entertainment Organization** have entered into a "production association," whereby Mottola will deliver artists to the company. In an unusual feature, the agreement specifies that Mottola and CBS executives will jointly determine which CBS label the new acts will appear on, with a Champion Entertainment logo placed on the record no matter what the specific label. Mottola's firm currently manages **Hall & Oates** and **Dr. Buzzard's Original Savannah Band**. First CBS signing under the new agreement is a band called **Network**, contracted to **Epic**.

Holy Days Still Holidays, Government Warns

The **Equal Employment Opportunities Commission** reiterated that employers must try to accommodate workers' requests for time off on religious holidays. A recent Supreme Court ruling limiting the need to accommodate religious holidays does not affect the situation, contrary to many employers' beliefs, the Commission warned.

Capsulize Your Own Life

First Earth Time Capsule Corporation of New York is introducing a personal time capsule this fall. The 6 x 17 inch circumference canister, called the "**Mel Time Capsule**," retails for \$5 and includes labels for pertinent information on the capsule's contents. Owners can select and seal special mementos for posterity or for reopening later in life.

RCA Shells Out For Tortoise

RCA Records has signed a distribution and marketing agreement with **Tortoise International Records**, a new Detroit-based label founded by producer **Don Davis**. Davis has produced hit records for **Johnnie Taylor**, **McCoo & Davis**, **Robin Trower** and **Larry Santos**, and promises a versatile label roster encompassing "all kinds of music, including Jazz." First product is a new Johnnie Taylor album.

Congressional Hearings On FM Car Radio Prices Set

The **Small Business Subcommittee** of Congress has set hearings for September 20-21 on alleged anticompetitive pricing of FM radios in cars. The hearings may have an influence on future requirements for providing FM in automobiles. The **Justice Department** studied car radio prices last year and decided no action was required, but high prices for AM/FM combination radios have stirred up considerable consumer opposition.

Wine In A Glass By Itself

Beringer/Los Hermanos Vineyards are test-marketing a new packaging concept—a 6.3 oz glass bottle of Los Hermanos wine topped with a plastic glass to serve it in. Washington, Oregon, and California are the first regions for **Wine By The Glass**, which retails at 79 cents a bottle, and comes in Chablis, Chenin Blanc, Vin Rose and Burgundy. The wrap-around bottle label also serves as shrink wrap binding the glass and bottle together. As they say, wine not?



Bulb Burns Longer, Uses Less Energy

A new light bulb, licensed exclusively by **Duro-Test Corporation** of New Jersey, reportedly cuts energy consumption by 60 percent and lasts 300 percent longer than ordinary bulbs. A new chemical film, consisting of a layer of silver between two titanium oxide layers, is responsible for the saving. However, the new bulb is presently estimated to be ten times as expensive as the conventional model. Market introduction is scheduled for early 1979.

Compact Copter Cops VW Image, Sets Ad Campaign

A new "compact helicopter" will be promoted by **Hunt Helicopter Corp.** as the airborne equivalent of the Volkswagen in a forthcoming ad campaign. The copter is targeted for ownership by "economy-minded professionals," with an ad employing a VW-style profile. The helicopter will sell for \$39,995, reportedly \$16,000 less than any other current compact, and relatively inexpensive to operate. According to Hunt, the helicopter market has grown 25 percent yearly for some time, and this model is "the vanguard of an exciting new concept in air transportation."

Japanese Fly High With Hi-Fi Exports

Sales of Japanese audio equipment, including tuners, receivers, amplifiers, and other stereo components, in the U.S. were up 31 percent in the first half of the year. A recent Japanese-American agreement stipulated a cutback in Japan's color TV exports, and the dramatic increase in U.S. sales of audio equipment is viewed by financial observers as an attempt to make up for the color TV loss.

Robots Ready As Security Guards

If you work in a building with a security guard, give him a close look. He may be a robot. Actually, there's no mistaking the **Century I**, a robot designed by **Quasar Industries** of New Jersey—it's 7 feet tall and weighs a trim 650 pounds. The Century I has sensors to detect movement, noise, or body heat, then "locks in" on any intruder, giving pursuit if necessary at a steady 20 mph. When it gets within eight feet of a suspect, it orally instructs the intruder to halt. If cooperation is not forthcoming, Century I can use a strobe light to blind its quarry, a high-frequency sound transmitter to cause pain to the inner ear, a mechanism to release laughing gas, and an electronic shock gun. The robot is bulletproof, and retails for \$75,000, for those interested in the latest trends in security guard fashions. Quasar is also designing a Century II model robot for the Army, for which they claim "once he's put on program, nobody can stop him"—including, presumably, personnel on the robot's own side. The Machine Age is coming on strong.

Soviets Turn Rock Critics; Pan Dylan

A Soviet newspaper criticized **Bob Dylan** for dropping his anti-Establishment stance of the 60's, asserting that the singer had fallen prey to the irresistible lure of capitalist gold. "Many old

songs of protest that brought him his fame started disappearing one by one from his repertoire," the article stated, implying that Dylan's story was typical of many Rock artists who had allowed "a revolutionary form of art" to degenerate into a mere commercial enterprise. Apparently Dylan has a long way to go before he can approach the Russian popularity of **Andy Williams** (R&R. 9-2).

Check The Book First

Before radio stations and jocks make an all-out attempt to break that world record for broadcasting in a sealed glass cage without oxygen or consuming spinachburgers on top of a flagpole, they should keep two things in mind. One, check to see that your category is actually listed by the **Guinness Book of World Records**, and second, that the record you're trying to break is actually the latest, correct figure—otherwise you might broadcast from a highwire stretched across the Grand Canyon for 167 straight hours all for nothing. That's the advice of a longtime observer of radio promotions, **R&R** can only second the emotion. Check your Guinness before you start your stunt.

Sony Videotape Unit Maintains Price

Sony Corporation unveiled a new model videotape recorder with a two-hour recording capability on a single cassette, but stated that the retail price would remain at \$1300, the same as the current **Betamax** model. Many observers had expected Sony's price tag to decrease substantially in response to **RCA's** new \$1000 model. Sony also introduced a new cassette with three-hour recording capacity.

Memphis Sets Elvis In Bronze

The city of **Memphis** will receive a 25-foot bronze statue of the late **Elvis Presley** courtesy of the **Memphis Development Foundation**. The 50-ton statue will be completed in two years, with donations being accepted during that time, as it will be financed privately. No other contemporary musician, to **R&R's** knowledge, has ever been memorialized on such a grand scale.

CBS, Mottola In Production Deal

CBS Records and **Tommy Mottola's Champion Entertainment Organization** have entered into a "production association," whereby Mottola will deliver artists to the company. In an unusual feature, the agreement specifies that Mottola and CBS executives will jointly determine which CBS label the new acts will appear on, with a Champion Entertainment logo placed on the record no matter what the specific label. Mottola's firm currently manages **Hall & Oates** and **Dr. Buzzard's Original Savannah Band**. First CBS signing under the new agreement is a band called **Network**, contracted to **Epic**.

Holy Days Still Holidays, Government Warns

The **Equal Employment Opportunities Commission** reiterated that employers must try to accommodate workers' requests for time off on religious holidays. A recent Supreme Court ruling limiting the need to accommodate religious holidays does not affect the situation, contrary to many employers' beliefs, the Commission warned.

Capsulize Your Own Life

First Earth Time Capsule Corporation of New York is introducing a personal time capsule this fall. The 6 x 17 inch circumference canister, called the "**Mel Time Capsule**," retails for \$5 and includes labels for pertinent information on the capsule's contents. Owners can select and seal special mementos for posterity or for reopening later in life.

RCA Shells Out For Tortoise

RCA Records has signed a distribution and marketing agreement with **Tortoise International Records**, a new Detroit-based label founded by producer **Don Davis**. Davis has produced hit records for **Johnnie Taylor**, **McCoo & Davis**, **Robin Trower** and **Larry Santos**, and promises a versatile label roster encompassing "all kinds of music, including Jazz." First product is a new Johnnie Taylor album.

Congressional Hearings On FM Car Radio Prices Set

The **Small Business Subcommittee** of Congress has set hearings for September 20-21 on alleged anticompetitive pricing of FM radios in cars. The hearings may have an influence on future requirements for providing FM in automobiles. The **Justice Department** studied car radio prices last year and decided no action was required, but high prices for AM/FM combination radios have stirred up considerable consumer opposition.

Lawyers Reluctant To Advertise

The legal profession has demonstrated general reluctance to avail itself of its recent freedom to advertise on radio, TV, and in newspapers and the Yellow Pages. According to a *Wall Street Journal* report, the vast majority of lawyers have refrained from advertising, even after receiving legal sanction and after the ABA established an advertising code. The report cited lawyers' fears of tarnishing their professional dignity by advertising, as well as a view that advertising was an admission of failure—a lawyer forced to use advertising to attract business must be a second-rate lawyer. Observers predicted that both prevalent attitudes toward advertising would wear off shortly, with advertising playing a more important role.

Atchley Promoted At TM Productions

Jerry Atchley has been promoted to Vice President/General Manager of TM Productions, the prominent broadcast sales service concern. He was previously General Sales Manager for the company. TM President Jim Long cited strong sales management and major sales achievements in awarding the promotion to Atchley.

Schulke Renews BBC Beautiful Music Pact

Schulke Radio Productions and the British Broadcasting Corporation have signed a multi-year renewal of an agreement granting Schulke exclusive American rights to Beautiful Music product from BBC orchestras. The selections range from old standards to current or recent hits, and under the new agreement, the BBC will record material specifically commissioned for Schulke and will feature group vocals for the first time. FTC Pushes For More Medical Advertising

The Federal Trade Commission has scheduled at least 23 days of hearings on its complaint challenging the American Medical Association's policy on doctors advertising. The FTC contends that AMA restrictions deny necessary information to consumers about health care prices, discourage competition, and fix prices. The AMA has defended its anti-advertising stand on ethical grounds, stating that "false and deceptive" advertising of a quack variety would result from a lifting of its restrictions. According to the AMA, its policies approve legitimate advertising, including information about fees, but forbid solicitation of patients.

Taft Broadcasting Buys Marineland

Taft Broadcasting has purchased Southern California amusement park Marineland from Hollywood Park, Inc. for \$5 million. The Ohio-based firm, which operates Q102/Cincinnati among other broadcast properties, also has amusement parks in Cincinnati, Richmond, and Charlotte, N.C. and owns Hanna-Barbera Productions. Plans call for a thorough revamp of Marineland's operations, as the park has been in financial trouble for several years.

Butterfly Comes Out Cocoon, Expands

Butterfly Records has announced a major personnel expansion, with three new executives joining the independent label. Fred Ruppert is new Vice President of Promotion, coming from the National Promotion Director position at Polydor. Joe Carbone was named Vice President, Sales, having come over from United Artists, where he was National Sales Director. Ronni Rosen was appointed National Promotion Director, after promotion stints with a number of labels. According to label President A.J. Cervantes, "Butterfly has established itself and laid the base for a massive assault on the industry. We have the best promotion, marketing, accounting, legal, and business people ever assembled for a new label."

All-News Not Good News For WAVA

WAVA-AM-FM/Washington D.C. will shift from its All-News format shortly, easing a three-way battle in the capital city. WTOP and WRC will continue with the News format, while WAVA-AM will go Religious and the FM side "mellow."

Captain & Tennille Sue Tabloid

Daryl Dragon and Toni Tennille (The Captain & Tennille) have sued the weekly tabloid "Midnight" for \$22 million over a story June 1, 1977 which stated their marriage was on the rocks. The "Midnight" piece called the duo the "Sonny & Cher of 1977."

Comput/Net Debuts General Ledger

Comput/Net will offer a "General Ledger Service" in September, aimed at keeping "station management informed up-to-the-minute on the station's financial situation." The service also allows users to enter budget information for 12 months in advance, produce balance sheet statements on command, and automatically calculate statements of income and expense for the current month's budget, among numerous other features. The system is designed, according to the company, to "expand the business operation capabilities of Compu/Net Radio automation package."

The company affirmed that its New York promotion office would "remain at full strength," with Anderson maintaining an office there in addition to his main headquarters in Los Angeles. No mention was made of whether changes in RCA's West Coast promotion force were impending.

young people is to think down to them.

These mis-impressions of our target audiences are the result of our playing to whom we choose to play to, as opposed to playing to who's available. Two popular lowest common denominator extremes exist. The first is the assumption that there is enough of a mass of music consumers who live, eat, and breathe music to the exclusion of all else to easily support a radio format. The other is that there is a giant mass of consumers who are not capable of knowing what's good because they fail to devote every minute of their existence to the musical pursuit. We fall victim to believing that all of humanity fits into one of these two stereotypes and, for the most part, we find both extremely distasteful.

Fortunately, the average person (especially the average adult) is neither. Just as all people who eat at McDonalds are not human garbage cans (you've eaten there—are you?) and all people who go to the movies are not "film buffs," all people who listen to the radio, or are potential radio listeners, are not heartless, brainless one-dimensional androids whose main ambition in life is to hear "Free Bird."

It doesn't take a great amount of intelligence to recognize the truth (it usually takes more to avoid it). We all were probably taught to do things the hard way. That's why, seldom, if ever, were we asked to

find the HIGHEST COMMON DENOMINATOR of anything on school math tests. It was just too obvious. It shouldn't have to take social scientists to point out to this industry that people react to their feelings quicker than to their brains when it comes to artistic decisions and taste. Music and beans are not one and the same.

Consider this...if you feel the emergence of leadership qualities in your personality, don't stand in the way of progress. Don't deny your own vision, it's the greatest form of passive or active research. One of the greatest meters of how people will react to things is your own humanity. Remember the old cliché: I wouldn't serve anything to my customers that I wouldn't feed my own family.

HCD's always seem offbeat before they are laid on the public, but embarrassingly obvious after they have. They are resisted at first because of the standards by which political-business-artistic communities as ours function. The business of imitation and justification for the premise that human beings are weaker than their institutions eventually clouds up the creative activities of even the true trendsetters and, as is seemingly becoming the case of the music radio industry, the blind begin to lead the deaf.

We'll be discussing the many aspects of HCD in coming editions of Radio & Records.

WEA Meetings Successful/Strong On AOR Interest

This portion of our weekly "get-together" was penned about 30,000 feet above the Gulf of Mexico as we returned to California from the WEA National Meeting in Miami. Some 700 record executives from WEA and the labels it serves spent nearly a week participating in serious group discussions, product and talent presentations, and one-to-one encounters. I had the privilege of participating on a panel entitled "The Radio Habit - Is It Hazardous To Your Health?" and attending "The Chairmen's Panel," both of which were superb.

The radio session was the result of claimed strong interest on the part of WEA toward understanding radio and the radio audience better for the purpose of making more meaningful time buys in the future. In addition, much time and attention was devoted toward exploring and explaining the AOR radio explosion for the many record people who's jobs do not come in daily contact with radio (and there were many). The fine panelists, including Lee Abrams, Burkhart/Abrams; Bob Pittman, PD WNBC/New York; (the legendary) Gary Stevens, VP of KDWB/Minneapolis; Gary Granger, PD WSHE/Miami (which, by the way, sounded real good); and yours truly. WEA's National Advertising Manager Alan Pepper, who organized the session, acted as moderator. Special sound effects (that's right folks, there were even special sound effects) were provided by the man historians indicate was the nation's first AOR Jock, Tom Gomache.

Among many topics covered were research, fragmentation, the differences in radio audiences and how those audiences differently effect the radio station and the record company. Much credit to Lee Abrams for his superb (and rather unbiased) explanation of AOR radio in general.

The Chairmen's Panel consisted of Atlantic Chairman Ahmet Ertegun; E/A Chairman Joe Smith and WB Executive VP (filling in for Chairman Mo Ostin) Stan Cornyn. WEA President Joel Friedman acted as moderator. The session was informal, informative, and undoubtedly inspiring to the members of the WEA family.

Smith indicated a firm commitment on the part of E/A to develop a meaningful roster of Jazz artists in addition to expanding the label's yearly number of releases and spread beyond the "singer/songwriter" image to include more Rock and Roll.

Both Ertegun and Cornyn pointed out the importance of their labels continuing to release records by some artists solely for their musical contributions regardless of whether they sell or not. Cornyn (in his always eloquent manner) added that it is vital for all record people to remain interested and knowledgeable about the music they are promoting and selling.

The subject of recent escalating artist deals came up (quite obviously, the James Taylor/CBS deal is still a WEA/WB sore spot) and all three label leaders indicated that in the interest of good business a record company shouldn't over-extend itself for the purpose of winning inter-label prestige battles. The sales track record of the organization was heartily reconfirmed and the companies involved in WEA, in the words of Ahmet Ertegun, "...hold varied attractiveness to artists."

It was an entirely productive time for the WEA family.



On the "soft" AOR side (remember, this is Detroit, where if it doesn't break your teeth, it's soft), **WNIC-FM** under the direction of former **WWWW** Program Director **Paul Christy** moved up from a 3.2 to 4.1. 

Inside Nashville

RONNIE McDOWELL is 27, has been working local clubs in the Gallatin-Madison-Nashville area since his teens. He finally got a record out awhile back of ROY ORBISON's "Only The Lonely" on SLIM WILLIAMSON's Scorpion Records. Ronnie had been raised on ELVIS PRESLEY's music, never met him, but idolized him. Ronnie called Slim Williamson, vacationing in Florida, two days after Elvis died and asked if he would make him a dub on a song he and his friend LEE MORGAN had written for Elvis. Slim said, "Stations will think you're 'cashing in' on Elvis." Ronnie talked Slim into making ten acetates of this song Ronnie said he "had to do for Elvis," using as the artist's name simply "A FAN."

Those ten acetates went to WHIN/Gallatin, Tennessee (first), WENO and WSIX-FM/Nashville, WAMG/Gallatin, KQ101/Russellville, Kentucky, WDOD/Chattanooga (got 800 requests the first day), WSLC/Roanoke,

WYDE/Birmingham, and after the first day, because of overwhelming requests, WMAK/Nashville. The first week they played it, both WINN and WAKY/Louisville debuted McDowell's "The King Is Gone" on their charts at number one. WIL/St. Louis logged 5,000 calls in 2 days requesting it. The day WIRE/Indianapolis went on the record, ABC Distributors ordered 65,000 records. The first day WPLO/Atlanta played it, Pickwick Distributors ordered 7,000. The same day changed the order to 70,000, and the next day changed the order to 130,000. The second week on WPLO it was charted at number one. The second week, it was number one on KFI/Los Angeles (as of last week KLAC had not gone on the record). One retail shop in Baltimore sold 6,000 in two days, DENNIS BAKER at Action Distributors in Cleve-




