Combined To Purchase Globe

Combined Communications Corporation has reached a definitive merger agreement to acquire Globe Broadcasting Co. for \$13.8 million. Globe owns WVON and WGCI-FM/Chicago, WDOK/Cleveland, and WDEE/Detroit.

Before the transfer can take place, Globe must sell WMGC/ Cleveland, since Combined has acquired wwwE(R&R 8-26). Former WWWE General Manager Tom Embrescia and Station Manager Jim Embrescia have filed to purchase WMGC as reported in RER 8-26. Combined also recently bought WLDM-FM in Detroit.

The Globe acquisition is subject to approval from lenders of both companies, the FCC, and Globe's shareholders, and to the outcome of a tax ruling.

Dallas Paper Makes Radio Combination Pitch

Radio and newspapers are often regarded as natural enemies in certain quarters, thanks to the fierce competition between the two media forms for (often) the same retail advertising dollars. Therefore, the pictured full-page advertisement taken in Advertising Age by the Dallas Times-Herald comes as something of a shock to many media observers, as if a leading cobra representative was proposing a peaceful coexistence pact with the local mongoose population. The Times-Herald ad is an unprecedented call for combination radio and newspaper ad buys. It's headlined "If you're buying radio in Dallas-Fort Worth, you need the Times Herald," with the body copy telling advertisers: "You know how effective a combination of newspaper and radio advertising can be.

The ad goes on to claim that the paper can "help you make your radio buy even more effective," thanks to its dominance of the Dallas-Fort Worth print market and comprehensive knowledge of the area. "The more you know about the market," claims the ad, "the more you'll tie in your radio buy with the paper that reaches of the people you want to reach." The small print also offers advertisers "media analysis" services, tying with the claim that the paper knows "the thirty-one radio stations...and the audiences they reach. And we know up-to-the-minute what's going on." But aside from offering to pull some weight in advising advertisers on the best radio station buys, the tone of the ad is unusually cooperative. As television continues to increase its

own voracious share of the ad dollar, such cooperative campaigns between newspapers and radio stations could well become more com-

Loses It To FCC The FCC has issued a stern matter broadcast and from whom warning to radio and television stations on the subject of sponsorship identification rules, stemming from the recent nationwide

"I Found It" religious teaser blitz. The radio and TV spots, consisting of either a personal testimony about the joys of religion or merely the words "I found it," followed by an ambiguous explanation, were purchased nationwide by a religious organization called 'Here's Life."

The FCC strenuously objected to frequent sponsorship identification broadcasts saying "Presented by: Here's Life (name of city)." According to the Commission the Communications act requires that a sponsorship identification announcement must state in language understandable to a majority of the audience that the station has received consideration for the that consideration was received." It is conceded by the FCC that using the phrase "sponsored by" is an acceptable substitution for 'paid for by," but "the Commission is of the view that the term 'presented by' does not clearly inform the audience that it is hearing or viewing matter which has been paid for.

"I Found It" Campaign

Accordingly, the FCC has issued a Public Notice on the subject "to set forth clearly the requirements in this area and to remind licensees of their obligations to insure that proper sponsorship identification announcements accompany all commercial matter." The notice states that sponsorship identification is a "critical aspect of broadcast operation," and cautions licensees that "failure to adhere to the requirements set forth herein will subject them to the full range of sanctions authorized by the Communications Act." Copies of the Notice, which will apply to any future teaser campaigns of any kind, are available from the FCC.

Billboard Sued For Copyright Infringement

Biliboard Publications, Inc., along with Bowers Record Sleeve Company, has been sued for copyright infringement and "unfair trade practices and unfair competition" by Record-Rama, manufacturers of a customized 45 record sleeve. The suit, filed in the U.S. District Court in Pittsburgh, seeks substantial damages and an injunction requiring Billboard, through its Record Source International (RSI) division, and Bowers to halt the manufacture of a 45 record sleeve which Record-Rama alleges infringes upon his copyright.

According to Paul C. Mawhinney,

proprietor of Record-Rama, an independent oldies record shop in Etna, Pennsylvania, he sent a sample of his sleeve design to RSI, who allegedly expressed interest in it, sending back a letter of intent to that effect. Mawhinney also negotiated with Bowers to manufacture his sleeve. Three months later, he says, he found a virtually identical 45 sleeve on the market, called "Durasleeve," designed by RSI and manufactured by Bowers. Mawhinney stated that the paper stock used by Bowers to make the RSI sleeve was the very stock the company had (Continued on page 3)



Music Still Makes It For Teens; Would Buy More Records If Prices Lower a number of other areas of interest


84% of teenagers claim to be "very interested" or "fairly interested" in music today, according to a Galhup youth survey of 1035 subjects in the 13-18 age bracket nationwide. Only 3% said they were "not at all interested." Interest in music was consistently high among the four teenage categories the poll measured, with girls 13-15

and 16-18 maintaining the highest level of interest (slightly over 60% "very interested," about 25% "fairly interested"). The most striking difference was between boys 13-15, only 41% of whom were "very interested," and their 16-18 counterparts, who registered 59% in that category

Des Moines Becomes Radio Rage

The city of Des Moines launched an innovative radio campaign recently to attract new industry and convention business, getting results far beyond expectations-at least in terms of national attention. The city planned a ten-week promotion campaign on radio stations in other major Midwest and East Coast cities. Although some spots were straight, others took a light approach. One commercial solicited a surfers convention by pointing out the convenient location of not one but two oceans, an equidistant short hop 1200 miles away in either direction.

However, the humor was not confined to the commercials themselves. Air personalities in different cities began using the Des Moines booster spots as a catalyst for humorous bits of their own, blending sound effects, satire, and spontaneous humor to create further takeoffs on the idea of Des Moines as a convention center. Reaction has been

generally favorable, although some Cleveland businessmen were reported upset about possible loss of business after hearing the Chamber of Commercials in every

ABC Contract Proposal Goes To NABET Vote

A "final" contract proposal package from the ABC network goes to a vote of National Association of Broadcast Employees and Technicians members this week, with a vote for approval bringing an end to the union's 4 1/2 month strike, longest everagainst a network. Neither side divulged details of the offer, but indications seemed to point to ABC offering an increase over

NABET's salary scale arrangement with NBC, settled last year.

The voting process calls for a separate ratification vote by over 20 units of NABET, each of which must approve the offer. If a majority in any unit declines, the strike continues. Over 1700 NABET members will vote, and if the four-year contract is ratified, they will return to work October 1.

to the industry. The median amount spent by those who purchased alburns at all during the month prior to the survey was \$12. Significantly, 64% of those polled said they would buy even more records or tapes if the cost were reduced. As it is, 5% spent more than \$30, with a further 8% over \$20 and 9% more over \$15.11% spent over \$10 monthly, 18% between \$6 and \$10, 13% under \$5 and 34% said they did not buy any records or tape during the previous month.

53% owned a stereo record player, 37% a stereo tape deck. Median expenditure for a sound system was \$200. A full 92% have a record and/ or tape collection, with over 50% owning more than 20 records and tapes. Breaking those figures down further, 7% own more than 100, 13% own 50-100, 10% own 41-50, 9% more own 31-40, 13% own over 20, 20% between 11-20, and 18% own 1-10. Finally, 63%, nearly twothirds, have been to a live concert. Obviously, the teen market is still a highly active one.

FCC Denies WGNE License Renewal

The FCC has denied applications for the license renewal of WGNE-AM-FM/Panama City Beach, Florida, by Janus Broadcasting Company, citing a rigged contest and deceptive claims by the AM station as reasons. WGNE had staged a "Play WGNE" or "Radio Roulette" contest in the fall of 1975, with listeners attempting to guess the correct call letter over the phone. The contest was a three-level competition, with first-level winners getting the option to play the game again for a larger prize, and second-level winners allowed to try (Continued on page 10)

Rubinstein Sues ABC For \$12 Million



Carter On Verge Of Forming Copyright Tribunal

After a long delay and at least one missed deadline, Washington observers expected President Carter to make his nominations for the new Copyright Tribunal within a week. The fivemember panel was established under the Copyright Revision Act of 1976 to set royalties for records, jukeboxes, cable TV and public broadcasters, and was to have started operations by April 1, 1977. In June, Carter made his selections, but formal nominations have not yet been forthcoming. Chosen by the President for the committee were Thomas Brennan, chief counsel for the Senate Copyright Subcommittee; Clarence L. James, a Cleveland attorney; Frances Garcia, a CPA from Austin; Douglas Coulter, author; and Mary Lou Berg, a former Deputy Chairman of the Democratic National Committee. Administration officials blamed the holdup on nominations on the necessity of thorough background checks and conflict-of-interest

Newscaster Blasts News Celebrity Trend

Susan Stramberg, co-host of National Public Radio's "All Things Considered" show, issued a strong statement against the trend of newscasters being considered as celebrities. "It stinks," she told reporters. "Anonymity is as essential to a reporter as a pen and typewriter. Especially for an electronic media reporter, there is always the problem of participating in the story, being one of the performers." Stamberg went on to say, "I admire Barbara Walters, but I think she forgets that demarcation between the reporter and the celebrity."

\$300,00 At Stake In Mr. Steak Campaign

Mr. Steak restaurants are debuting two new entrees in a concentrated campaign in 20 nationwide markets via 30-second radio spots and TV commercials, supplemented by local newspaper ads. Steak and Teriyaki Chicken will be introduced through October 24, with a Steak Almond Shrimp push following a week later.

Classic Chemical Sets Multimedia Campaian

Classic Chemical, who manufacture 17 automotive appearance products, is waging a \$500,000 multimedia campaign to introduce two new products, Mag-Brite Whell polish and Classic Soft Wax. Spots on major market radio stations will introduce the new lines, as well as promote Classic Car Wax. Automotive trade ads and a 30-second TV commercial will also figure in the campaign, which is built around pride in auto ownership with a subtly humorous approach

New Olympia Beer Push For Radio, Other Media

Olympia Beer has begun a new campaign built around the theme "Come Taste Olympia's World," utilizing most available media outlets. Radio spots began September 26 in 40 markets. with network TV commercials and regional TV buys also set. Full page print ads in general and specialized publications are a major part of the push, which focuses on Olympia's outdoor Pacific Northwest image

CBS Gives Recorded Interviews College Try

CBS Records' College Department will be offering a monthly fully-produced 30-45 minute vinylized interview with a label artist to 500 college stations. The "Inter Chords" series debuts in October with Epic's Nona Hendryx (ex-Labelle), following with Columbia's Karla Bonoff, plus others to be announced later. Music will be featured with the interviews, and college stations will receive bios, photos, and a cover letter with the vinyl interview. Artists will be chosen for their college-market potential appeal.

FCC Unlikely To Set New Quadraphonic Standards

The Chief Engineer's Office of the FCC has issued a report implying that current quadraphonic matrix systems are acceptable for most listeners, leading to the belief that the commission will probably not set any new standards for quadraphonic in the course of its current inquiry into the subject. Reported upset at the FCC position was NRBA President Jim Gabbert, head of the National Quadraphonic Radio Committee, who maintains that quadraphonic will be basically a dead issue without quality discrete systems. The NQRC plans to develop new tests to refute the FCC findings, believing that high-quality quadraphonic broadcasting will be necessary for FM stations to fight coming AM stereo

Total Radio, TV Stations Announced

FCC statistics indicate that there are 8378 radio stations in the U.S., along with 983 television outlets. Breaking the figures down further, there are 4506 AM stations, 2964 FM, and 908 FM educational stations. As for TV, 725 commercial stations exist (514 VHF, 211 UHF), along with 258 educational outlets (157 UHF and 101 VHF)

Freightliner Trucks Try Radio

Freightliner will promote its heavy trucks with a 13-week national radio campaign, with Rice recording artist Dave Dudley acting as spokesman. The promotion ties in with Dudley's current trucking single "Rollin' On, We Gone," and Country radio stations will be used Personal appearances by Dudley will also be tied in.

Best of the rest: 2) the special one-hour opening "Happy Days" 3) "Three's Company" 4) "Soap" in its debut 5) "Welcome Back Kotter"s special one-hour season bow 6) ABC Sunday Movie "Young Joe: The Forgotten Kennedy" 7) "Betty White Show," the first show to break ABC's Top 10 monopoly, on CBS 8) "Best Of All In The Family" special, also on CBS 9) "Barney Miller" and 10) "Eight Is Enough." "Soap" and "Betty White" topped the season's newcomers, with ABC's "Carter Country" close behind at 11, and the same network's "Redd Foxx" at 18. No other shows made the

Arbitron's results for the week ending September 16 showed "Charlie's Angels" far out in front for New York televiewers, with ABC taking seven places in the Top 10 to NBC's three. Other standings: 2) "Soap" 3) "Three's Company" 4) a tie between "Eight Is Enough" and "Welcome Back Kotter" 6) a tie again between "Happy Days" and the Emmy Awards 8) "Barney Miller," and tying for 9th, NBC's Saturday and Monday Movies.

Thanks to the travelling exhibit of ancient Egyptian King Tut's treasures, the Pharoah is hotter than Farrah as a marketable commodity. Jewelry, rugs, and other Egyptian-style items are selling in spectacular quantities in cities visited by the tour (Washington, Chicago, New Orleans), with expectations running high for the tour's upcoming stops in L.A., San Francisco, Seattle, and New York. Most jewelers are finding that advertising isn't really necessary, as the tour publicity and natural curiosity are proving enough to lure buyers. Over 1,500,000 people saw the Tut treasures in Washington and Chicago alone, and Egyptology is shaping up as a major merchandising and cultural fad.





FCC Denies WGNE License Renewal

(Continued from page 3)

for the grand third-level prize of \$1000.

FCC Administrative Law Judge Reuben Lozner ruled that the renewal hearings had "made it patently clear" that WGNE listeners had been "misled into believing they could win the grand prize of \$1000," and that "the contest was rigged," with jocks selecting a prearranged cartridge which would result in a letter different than the one guessed by the caller coming up, making it impossible for the grand prize to be won.

Janus Broadcasting was also cited for deceptively claiming it was "number one," and for a spot claiming "...all along the beaches, more people are listening to WGNE than all other stations combined. This figure is based on our own survey. You can check it out for yourself." According to the judge, the "survey" consisted of station personnel walking up and down beaches listening to what stations were played, with no statistical records being kept and no "acceptable statistical methodology" or random sampling techniques employed. Concluding, the judge stated that "the egregious nature of the misconduct...consisting of misrepresentations, lack of candor, and rules violations, led inexorably to the conclusion that Janus was unfit to be a licensee." The denial becomes effective in November unless an appeal is filed or a review is ordered by the FCC.

Charging breaches of those agreements, the suit states "In truth and fact, the financial statements of ABC for the calendar years prior to 1975 did not adequately or accurately reflect the net profits at ABC Records, and the balance sheet of ABC Records as of December 31, 1974, reflected assets at values which were vastly overstated...The acquisition of the Dot Records label was reflected in the books of accounts of ABC Records at a cost of \$2,500,000, but by reason of the terms of the purchase of the assets, the true cost of the acquisition was about \$8,000,000." The complaint also charged ABC sold records to distributors "...on the promise of permitting them the privilege of 100 percent return of the (unsold) merchandise. The reserve retained for such possible returns was vastly inaccurate, and the experience of quantities, the reserve." Distributors were also allegedly induced to hold returns "so that they could be made in later accounting periods."

Rubinstein therefore is asking for \$2 million in loss of salary resulting from the non-completion of his original 5 year contract; \$3 million compensation for damage to his business reputation; \$600,000 for loss of salary from his termination date until the date of filing the suit; \$1,400,000 loss of incentive pay, and \$5 million punitive damages.







National Program Director/Bartell

R&R: What does the job of National Program Director with the Bartell chain involve?

LAKE: Primarily my job is to help the Program Directors at the individual Bartell stations as much as I can, any way I can. I communicate with each of them several times a week. We might discuss promotions, music or if one of them is looking for a lock. I can be of assistance

R&R: How much involvement do you have with the individual stations in regards to format control, music control, etc.?

LAKE: I don't exercise any day-to-day control because the Program Director is the undisputed head of programming for his Individual station. I am there as a back-up to him, I don't come in and say, "You will play these records. You will rotate your records in such and such a fashion, you will place your stop sets in a particular part of the hour." Although some of the things I have suggested at some of the stations have been implemented I make them understand that I don't tell them exactly how to do it. In other words, there is not a specific system laid down which they must follow. We adapt some general rules to each of the stations and to their individual target audience on-air image or whatever.

R&R: How much of a difference is there between each Bartell station as far as the way they sound?

LAKE: They resemble each other in their attack on the air and to some extent in the overall kind of attention paid to news, or public affairs. It would probably be safe to say that a jock in Milwaukee could transfer to San Diego, or Miami, or St. Louis, or Detroit, and work in very well, because each of the stations are set up pretty much along the same lines. But after that the Program Director's interest, the demands of the market cause each of them to sound somewhat different according to the need. For instance in Detroit we're a lot more R&B-oriented in terms of music and the jocks are a little more laid back then they are in Miami, which is not so much R&B but more Disco. We're talking about music now. In St. Louis the station has much more of an AOR stance, at least musically. In Detroit we use Jingles. In St. Louis we don't. In Miami we don't use jingles. In San Diego we do. Some of the stations cluster for two minutes at a shot, some of them stop for only sixty seconds. Some of them run one promo an hour, some of them run two. Some have big money contests, some stick to smaller things. It's just whatever seems to work in that particular market.

R&R:What is your opinion on the usage of jingles on Top 40 radio

LAKE: My own personal opinion is that they're extremely expensive. You do need to update them because you can burn them out through rotation the same way you burn out a record or a contest. I can certainly see how arguments can be made for their effectiveness. I choose to take that money and put it into on-air promotions but yet Jim Harper et WDRQ in Detroit likes jingles and his jocks like jingles end they sound good on the station. If he wants to use them that's fine. That area is really left up to the individual Program Director.

PLAYLIST LENGTH

R&R: Musically, are the station's playlists basically the same

LAKE: I would sey they are moving more and more towards the same musical stance, at least in terms of breaking records or playing album cuts. There was a time when all of the stations were playing in the neighborhood of 20 records. I think all of them are now running between 30 and 40 records. WDRQ is running with 40. KSLQ with 40. Miami at this point in time I think is about our tightest playlist, it's about 30 records. San Diego is 30 with a few extras. Milwaukee is between 35 and 40 records right now.

R&R: What's your opinion on the length of playlists? Do you think that stations that run with a 20-or-less playlist are really going to increase cume or whatever any fester than one with 40 records?

LAKE: I think it's a great way to increase your cume if you're playing the right 20 records but I think a station that stays with 20 records over a period of say a couple years leaves itself very vulnerable, in the sense that people become accustomed to hearing the hits on the station and they will continue to tune in assuming they're playing the right 20 records. If they want more variety they're going to have to go somewhere else and I'm a believer in programming for the radio listener as opposed to programming for the mass audience. I may differ in my opinion on that with a lot of people around the country, but it's always been my belief that you should go for the people who listen to the radio most. People say, "We want to attract everyone. If we can just get everyone to listen for 5 minutes then we'll win," but I think that's pretty difficult to do. The people who listen to radio the most for the last several years have been people who have tuned to your album-formatted stations because they don't want to listen to Shaun Cassidy every hour and 15 minutes. So I think when a station gets itself up to a respectable share in the market I think it becomes almost incumbent upon them to expand their playlist to create some sort of variety, some sort of diversification. If you're going to be a music station, if that's going to be your primary function, if that's going to be your primary avenue of entertaining the audience, then I think you need to expose the music. I think you need to put some variety on the air.

R&R: Have you found that FM Top 40, whose listeners listen for a longer period of time in most cases, should run with a much larger playlist than an AM Rocker?

LAKE: I would say so. I also think the time is coming, though, where it's going to vary market to market. Let's take a situation like a New York or a Chicago or Los Angeles where AM stations are still dominant in the market. Signal has a lot to do with that, of course, but also take Milwaukee for instance, where your leading top 3 stations are all AM stations. I think part of the reason for that is the fact that AM radio may be perhaps a bit better in Milwaukee than it is in some other markets. In Minneapolis, too, KDWB, WCCO of course keep a lot of people on the AM dial, that's a big key. In New York your better radio stations are on AM.

R&R: What do you meen by better radio stations?

LAKE: Well, better in the sense that they seem to be appealing to a very large segment of the audience. I don't mean better from a personal viewpoint, I think the audience always has to judge what is better. When you have a WCCO or a KDKA or KMOX, these stations with shares in the 25 or 30 range must be good radio stations.

R&R: What do you think they're doing right in those

TAKING A SPORTING CHANCE

LAKE: They're obviously tuned in, they are keyed in, they are providing a full service radio station for their audience. Ball games-if we could get football or baseball games on one of our Top 40 stations we would do it in a minute in any one of our markets, because people like to listen to them.

R&R: You don't think you'd tune out the larger portion of your everyday music listener?

LAKE: I think whatever you would lose for three hours on a Sunday afternoon with a football game you'd more than off set by the thousands upon thousands of people that would tune in and discover your station at least for that one day during the week. Even a baseball game might tune out a certain segment of your audience, but I think they will return if they like the radio station the rest of the time.

R&R: Do you foresee Top 40 radio stations in the future going into sports programming?

LAKE: WKBW is a station that does that right now. I don't

think anyone would disagrae when I say that has probably had a great deal to do with their success.

RER: WDRQ went into Detroit several years ago and went up against a glant radio station. It took a few years but they finally won. To what can you attribute their success?

LAKE: It may sound trite, but I think they have gotten their finger on the pulse of the market. It's taken them as you've said several years. They've tried this thing, they've tried that thing, they've experimented with balances of black music versus white music, they've experimented with personality. What has happened is that they've just kept what seemed to work and eliminated what didn't work and they've found their place in the market. They have a very solid base now. Jim Harper, the Program Director, who I don't think enough people give credit for the incredible job he's done, has put together a very fine radio station. It may not knock you down the first time you listen to it but the more you listen to it and the more you hang out in Detroit I think the more you realize it really is a Detroit radio station.

R&R: What's been the story with your Miami operation? When they kicked off years ago they came on like gang-busters, and somewhere at the midpoint they died. Just recently in the past year or two they seem to be on the way for a comeback.

LAKE: Yeah, I think when Y100 came on the air, followed shortly thereafter by the RKO-AM WAXY's brief entry into a Top 40 format, it created a lot of noise in the market. There was a lot of turning around and I think some people, including 96X, perhaps over-reacted to Y100 and never quite really regained their ground there for a couple of years. They were just kind of knocked down and had a hard time getting back up off their rear end, but now they have started to get back up. I give a lot of credit for that to Rochelle Steab and to Jerry Clifton of course who programmed the station until a couple of months ago. Now I think it was a severe damage to the collective egos of everyone involved with that station, which was one of the most publicized FM success stories of the early 70's and then it did sort of peak out and go back down. But I think now we're back on the right track down there. We are committed, we have Joel Denver who came in from WFIL and Jack Forsythe, an excellent Music Director from 13Q in Pittsburgh. We're very optimistic. I think we'll have an excellent book in October and November and Bartell is very committed to being successful in Miami.

R&R: What was the reason they changed from WMYQ to WMJX?

LAKE: They felt an image change was necessary. They felt that WMYQ had a bad image because the station had floundered around for a couple of years trying this kind of Top 40 and then another kind of Top 40 they felt there was some confusion on the part of the audience in a negative way; they thought of MYQ as a station that didn't know what it was doing. I was not involved with the company at that time, I might have disagreed, but they did go ahead and change it at any rate, and that's the way it stands today.

R&R: What's WMJX doing now that it wasn't doing a year ago?

LAKE: Well, actually I'd say it's changed a great deal in just the last 60 days since Joel got in there, which was some time in June. The station has become a lot more foreground; it has started to play more records. It was very teen-oriented for quite some time and is now moving a bit away from that, more towards an 18-34 target audience. It's become a lot more community-involved. They're involved with every kind of charity drive, every kind of outside appearance that can be done. They are doing some free concerts. I think they ran into that trip that can so often be the case, where they were bringing people in from all over the country and farming them through there, people were running in and running out and nobody down there remembered that they were in South Florida, and South Florida is a very distinctive type radio market. You have a huge Hispanic population, Little Havana. I think Dade County now is something like 55 percent people of Cuban descent and 45 percent black, white, everything else. Then you have Broward County which is a different ethnic socioeconomic picture entirely. South Florida has gone through enormous growth over the last several years, of course and it's not an easy place to put your finger on the pulse. I think they're going to have to do what's been done in Detroit, which is just keep hanging with it and find out what works and what doesn't.

Creativa Jocks Needed

R&R: As you travel to each of the Bartell stations, you have a chance in a particular city to go up and down the dial and hear other radio stations and other jocks. What impresses you about a jock when you hear him? What does it take to become a good jock?

LAKE: I think more than ever you've got to be talented, you've got to be different and original. Those are all easy things to say, but what I really mean is that we're looking for someone who doesn't sound like he's doing a rip-off of a John Records Landecker aircheck. Or a guy who isn't trying to sound like the 6-10 jock at KHJ or the afternoon drive jock at another station somewhere that he listens to at night on his little transistor radio. I think we're looking for people who are not afraid to be themselves on the air, and again we're speaking in platitudes. It's someone who is not afraid to be himself and hasn't had his mind messed over by a Program Director who says, "I want you to sound like J.J. Jordan." Someone who understands the basic concepts of modern

contemporary radio presentation but yet can integrate his own personality and his own viewpoint.

RER: Don't you think that ell jocks who get into the business at the very beginning stages of their career emulate somebody?

LAKE: Yes, but I think the point comes where you have to move away from that and carve out your own area—not just disc jockeys, but Rock musiciens or painters or any kind of entertainers or people involved in the arts for profit. They are almost all impressed by someone in the beginning. I know I was end I know that most all my friends in radio today all-started out sounding like their fevorite disc jockey somewhere, but there comes a point where you have to

to that six or that seven, I think what's going to have to happen before you have any of those monster Top 40 stations like you used to in the old days, when there were stations in every market pulling 15 and 20 shares, is that they're going to have to be different because that's what made Top 40 successful in the first place. It wasn't laidback, it wasn't something that sounded like evaything else, I think that's what's going to happen again, I think it's starting to happen right now.

R&R: I think 20 years ago people who listened to the radio often listened to the radio because of the jock. Today it seems like everyone is listening just for the music. Do you think there's a place today for the type of jock who is an entertainer?

move on ahead and be yourself. I think the biggest prerequisite for the successful disc jockey today is to have an interesting personality and not be afraid to reveal that to the audience.

R&R: Have you found that there's a lack of quality jocks in smaller markets?

LAKE: In many ways I think a lot of the jocks in smaller markets are better than a lot of the jocks in bigger markets. By that I mean a lot of them are fresher; they don't feel the pressure of 4 ARB's a year and 2 Pulses and 12 Mediastats and 2 Sources. They're not constantly being bombarded with the dollars, the agency rep, and all those other pressures that often get back to the disc jockey, that may take his mind off his primary function at the radio station, which is to entertain people during the course of his airshift. A lot of times many of these young guys-the ones who haven't had their minds messed over by the attitude of a paranoid Program Director or a General Manager who sees the disc jockey as nothing more than a computer with blood-have a lot of good ideas that they haven't been told not to utilize yet. I think you're seeing a lot more guys these days going from tertiary markets directly to the big time because they have that spark that certain major market Program Directors are looking for. I had a discussion with Bob Pittman about that a couple of weeks ago. I said "I hear you're looking for an 18-year-old disc jockey to give a break to." He said, 'Yeah, I think I'll be able to find somebody who hasn't had his head messed up around the circuit.' There are a lot of guys you can put on the air and know they're not going to mess up. You know they're going to do a good competent job but they're not going to be brilliant. They're not going to give you anything above 50 percent. I think that's why so many of your major market stations today are very easy to listen to but yet don't get you really excited. They don't move you the way some of those old Top 40 stations did when you were growing up as a kid.

R&R: Why is that?

LAKE: I think the emphasis on research, the emphasis on...there are so many things. A lot of the excitement has been taken out of it! think. So much freedom has been taken away from the disc jockey. You'll go to a convention or something and a guy like Jack Armstrong, who is a brilliant disc jockey, will stand up and rail against the powers that be because he can no longer be creative, he can no longer be an artistic disc jockey. I think there's a lot to that.

R&R: Do you think that Top 40 radio should start going back to where it was?

LAKE: Yeah. I think that's what's happening right now. For a long time when you studied your ARB's in your large markets around the country you'd have 6 stations which are one form or another of Top 40 and they'd all have a 5, and it's all because everyone has been doing the same thing. Everyone has disc jockeys that sound alike, they all run the same contests, they all run the same jingle in the same place, and they wonder why none of them can seem to get over that hump. They start off perhaps with a one and they work their way up to five and all of a sudden they can't seem to get

LAKE: I think one of the reasons everybody listens for the music is because they haven't been given any reason to listen for anything else. We have emphasized the music so much and de-emphasized the disc jockey to such a degree that people no longer listen for him because they never get to hear a truly entertaining jock. A lot of that is the fault of radio itself. I firmly believe that if he is innovative, you should let him go as much as possible. Often I had situations arise where I've had to explain to other disc jockeys at a station why I might let one jock cheat on the format and never yell at him. The reason I don't do that is because if I've got a guy who can win by being different I'm going to let him go ahead and do whatever he wants to do.

R&R: Do you think today's audience really wants to be entertained by a talkative disc jockey?

LAKE: I think they want to be entertained, period. Today in any decent size market you can turn the dial from left to right on AM and from left to right on FM and you can hear Fleetwood Mac every place on the dial. You can hear the popular music, the Barry Manilow, the stuff that crosses all "musical boundaries." You can hear that everywhere and the people who have been winning for the most part are the people who have the best balance, because for the most part everybody is playing the same music. The stations that are going to break out of that are the stations that start doing something a little different with the music and have something else, such as a disc jockey.

R&R: What makes a good Program Director?

LAKE: A lot of things. First he has to be someone who inspires respect not because he says "I am the boss," but because it becomes obvious after working with him for a while that he does know what he's talking about. It has to be someone who is not afraid to lead, someone who is not afraid to make mistakes and admits his mistakes. Many disc jockeys are difficult people to lead. A lot of times these are guys who were class clowns in school. You can refer back to your George Carlin records for a complete explanation of what that's all about. A PD has to be the kind of person who an handle difficult people. He has to know about music, he has to understand promotion, he has to understand modern marketing concepts and most of all he just has to be a person who genuinely cares about people. If the people he works with don't really think he cares about them, I don't see how they are going to respond to him In any kind of meaningful

R&R: Do you think that a Program Director has to come from the jock ranks?

LAKE: Not necessarily, but I think that it's still very beneficial because jocks for the most part tend not to respond as quickly to someone who has not done what they've done. It's a simple attitude of "How can he criticize what I do on the air when he has never been on the air?" I think if you've worked as a jock at a successful radio station, I think they're going to respect you more. That's just human nature.

R&R: What can a Program Director in a small market who has never been in a large market do to make his radio station sound like a major market radio station?

LAKE: That's kind of a pet peeve of mine. I often get tapes from guys who are programming smaller stations and little presentation kits which explain all their rotations and explain their contests and why the disc jockeys sound this way. So often it seems the stations are just direct superficial rip-offs of some 50,000 watt station that blasts into their market at night. They said "Well, this station is successful in Chicago and I'm only 300 miles from Chicago, so I'm going to make my station sound like that big station in Chicago." They copy what they hear without giving much thought to what's really behind it, and the next thing you know in a market of 25,000 people he's got a station with Boss-Jock one-liners and they're yelling and screaming and talking about things that are totally unrelatable to that small market. I believe the best small market PD is one who really programs his station for his little market. My first Program Director job was a station called WYRE in Annapolis which had this really awful sounding stuff called Marine weather twice an hour at the top and the bottom of the hour. Three minutes of some guy at the Coast Guard talking over the telephone with this terrible audio quality about the waves, heights, visibility and the high tide and the low tide. To my "sophisticated" ear, I thought it just sounded crummy. When I started taking over that station it had been my desire to try and talk the General Manager out of doing that, but the more I hung out in Annopolis, Maryland, I realized that that Marine weather was real important to those people in Annapolis because they were really into boats, a lot of those people were fishermen, and that information was very valuable to them. A Program Director who goes to a market in the Southwest gets there and he's just come in from Boston and he hears all these Charlie Rich records on the air and says, "I hate Country music, that's so corny." Often the hardest thing for that Program Director to learn is that those records are very meaningful to the people in that market and he'd be a fool to take everything off just because he thought it was

R&R: What do you ask your PD's to do to involve their radio station in the community?

LAKE: It's understood throughout the Bartell chain that you can never go wrong involving your station in the community, not only because it's good for your FCC file, or it's a handy thing to pull out of your pocket at license renewal time, but because it is terrific promotion for the radio station and it doesn't cost a cent out of your pocket. For instance, this past Labor Day weekend when the Jerry Lewis Telethon was going on all across the country, all our stations had their jocks on TV when they had the local breaks from the local affiliates in the market. That doesn't cost us anything but all our guys were there. They stayed up for 24 hours and accepted those nickels and dimes in dixie cups from little unscrubbed kids who came into the city in hopes of maybe getting a T-shirt in return for a donation. We send our guys to little carnivals in people's backyards. We'll send them out in a station van and they'll lay down a few promo copy albums and T-shirts and stuff just to get people involved because it shows people that our radio stations really do care about the community. It anchors us in the community in a way that we can't get just from sheer longevity.

R&R: Do you foresee radio stations in the near future taking their public affairs programming out of the dark ages of early Sunday morning and putting it on the air Monday through Friday in prime time in some other type of form other than 30 or 60 minute blocks?

LAKE: Absolutely. I think creative public service and creative public affairs are the coming thing. Radio is bigger and better and healthier than ever before. We all thought that TV was going to take it away from us but I think we underestimated the American public's appetite for mass media. There are no more 100,000 watt FM availabilities in the Top 50 markets. There are no more big signal AM's that are available. All you can do is buy stations, and as people get hold of stations and hold on to them because they are money making ventures, the stations that are going to win are the stations that do things differently, the stations which are not afraid to make a commitment. A person who is buying and selling radio stations as little more than a broadcasting property broker is not interested in sinking his teeth into the community. He just wants to get the ratings up, dump the station after 3 years, make a profit and go buy a bigger property somewhere. But there are people who are committed to staying in the market, not only making money but being a part of the community, putting something into it rather than just taking out advertising dollars. With them you're going to see more and more attention to these areas that have been neglected, such as public service and public

R&R: Do you think radio could ever hurt itself by using too much music research?

LAKE: I think the implementation of good applicable research is a very positive thing for a radio. What disturbs me is when people hide behind it and use it as a defense against being creative or trying something new. It's very easy to do a bunch of call-outs, store calls, request tabulations and the like every week and sit back and say "We shouldn't add any new records because according to our research there are no new records selling." The obvious reason that no new records are selling is because the station isn't exposing any new records. Research can point the way to areas in which you can be creative. I was fortunate at KSLQ because it had the biggest budget and the biggest staff for research of any radio station I've ever been associated with. I got all this information back on Tuesday and I could see things that I had never seen before, and I interpreted some of that research in a way that caused me to expand the playlist and caused me to do some things that I had been totally against before. I'm a graduate of the 20-record playlist and I think that it can be a very healthy thing for the industry. It can help not only us but everyone. It's good for the audience, it's good for the jocks, but when it's just used as a defense against changing that's when I think it becomes dangerous.

R&R: Do you think the radio audience wants to hear a lot of music on the radio, 40 records as opposed to 20?

LAKE: I think the radio audience that listens to the radio for music definitely wants to hear more music. I truly believe that. I did not believe that a few years ago. I'm a recent convert to this philosophy, but when you have MOR stations, Top 40 stations, AOR stations, even R&B and Country stations playing so many of the same records it becomes very obvious that something else has to be done if you're going to be different. Your major AOR stations in so many of your large markets sound so much like Top 40 stations these days that it has given me reason to believe that the Top 40 stations of the future and the AOR stations of today are going to be one in the same. I think AOR as we know it now is really the Top 40 of the future. It's really no accident that in Detroit you have a WRIF or in Cleveland you have a WMMS or WEBN in Cincinnati. These stations are winning because they are giving those markets what they really want. The music station that wins really by definition is the Top 40

R&R: What are those stations giving their audience?

LAKE: I think they are giving them the truly popular music. They have gone to albums and they have gone to other forms of research and other forms of input that many Top 40 stations have Ignored. It's no longer possible for the Top 40 station to call 10 record stores and find out what the 20 top selling singles are and program the station off that. You just can't program your station off single sales anymore. You're putting yourself in a very vulnerable position and someone is going to come along and beat you up. I think that the call-out, the passive call-out, or the random call-out is a very valuable tool. Many Program Directors are suspicious of the call-out because they think that it is too much work and it doesn't have anything to do with what they're doing. But I believe the call-out is a much more valuable tool than request lines. I think that attention does need to be paid to retail but I think people who call and check on singles without checking on albums are kidding themselves. A common misconception is that the person who does not buy records does not like music. A lot of people are very hip to music, they know who the artists are, they know what songs are out but they just don't buy records for whatever reason. Maybe they are just too expensive, or if they did buy them they just don't have the time to listen to them at home, but that doesn't mean that they don't like music. That's why I really think the term passive call-out is a misnomer. I think random call-out is a better term, because passive call-out implies that every person you reach on the telephone out there is a person who does not care about what music he or she hears on the radio, and I think that is false.

RER: Do you think the record Industry will find in the near future that call-out research will be more of a help than the old method of calling record stores?

LAKE: I think it's a very valuable tool for anyone who's involved in wanting to know the popular songs in general, whether they're singles or not. For instance, in St. Louis during the 6 months I was there I can honestly say that at least 50 percent of the records we added came from the callouts. We would see songs starting to appear that were not singles and that we were not aware of being concentrated airplay records by our AOR competitors, but yet people out there in the audience, no matter where they heard them, like them and they told us so when we would reach them on the telephone, and so we would put the records on. Call-out research can also make you keep a record on that you might otherwise drop for lack of single sales.



HCD: A Key To The Puzzle

Programming music radio to a fractionalized society in a competitive marketplace can be like putting together a jigsaw puzzle. Some choose to look at the individual pieces first with the hope that they'll depict a scene when finally put together. Others look at the total scene first and then proceed to pick up the pieces.

The number of pieces that a jigsaw puzzle is split into has no effect upon the scene depicted by that puzzle.

Demographic groups do not live in vacuums. Each relates to the whole of society just as they relate to the particular nuances of their so-called segments. The best programming categories are probably those that are open-ended and open-minded. Otherwise the mechanics of radio can become too stiff to allow for the crossing-over of ideas and concepts which are part of the inevitable change at hand.

"'One' is the loneliest number that you'll ever do" Harry Nilsson

Programmers in pursuit of lowest common denominators, worship the categories of human difference that they uncover with their research microscopes, and continue to seek out and appeal to the things people do not have in common. The result: more pieces to the same scene.

Programmers in pursuit of **Highest Common Denominators** are aware of the differences in people and respect those differences, but seek out and appeal to the things people have in common.

The greater the microscope's magnification, the lesser its field of vision.

Perhaps we should reset our microscopes toward the goal of re-defining the meaning of the words *good* and *quality*. After all, they will always be subjective determinations based upon the scene at hand.

When was the last time we checked out the scene?




