Chapman: Rakes In Money For Nothing

The whole thing began with an off-the-cuff boast. KVIL/ Dallas OM/morning man Ron Chapman told a Dallas Morning News reporter that he could convince listeners to send in money simply by asking them. Later, after giving the idea more thought (and checking with station management, the legal department, and the FCC), Chapman followed through.

Listeners were asked to mail in \$20 checks payable to "KVIL Fun & Games," with no explanation of the money's destination or purpose. The original plan was to return the checks with \$2 interest and a station T-shirt.

Far more than the 300-400 checks management expected poured in. Four thousand checks arrived the first day. Figuring that was it, Chapman was stunned the following day when 5000 more checks arrived. Following that day's deluge,





KHIH Drops Classic Rock For NAC

Last Thursday (4/14), Classic Rock KHIH/Denver pulled the plug on its rock programming in favor of NAC. The Gary Guthrieconsulted station had been dayparting NAC between 7pm-4am.

Guthrie told R&R, "I think we've got a winner here. The ratings, revenues, and niche were all right for the format switch. The audience enjoyed both Classic Rock and the dayparting, but there was a heavier listener use of the nighttime programming.

"The reaction (to the change) initially was 50/50," he continued. 'The 50% negative came from those who were shocked, who expected to hear CCR. It's now about 90% positive. We're playing two or three New Age songs per hour and no heavy jazz. We don't play the typical Weather Report genre music: our music tends to be very hummable. I think we'll share audience with (AOR) KBCO, the ACs. and Beautiful Music stations in KHIH/See Page 34



Peterson Becomes WSTF VP/GM





Fairness Codification Dropped From Transfer Tax Bill

Broadcasters Gear Up For Rematch Of Last Year's Fight

A proposal to write the Fairness Doctrine into law has been dropped from a proposed new version of Sen. Ernest Hollings's (D-SC) bill to levy a tax on broadcast station sales. According to a staff member who helped draft the new version of the bill, Fairness Doctrine codification was dumped in order to focus debate on the transfer tax itself.

"We have really talked the Fairness Doctrine to death," said Antoinette Cook, counsel to the Senate Commerce Committee. "We've discussed it in other hearings and on the (Senate) floor. By leaving Fairness out of the bill we hope to make the transfer fee the center of discussion."

NAB Still Opposed NAB, which led last year's successful fight against a similar transfer tax proposal by Hollings, remains adamantly opposed to the current Doctrine-less bill. The proceeds of the transfer tax would be channeled into a trust fund to provide a stable source of financial support for public broadcasting.

"Taking out the Fairness Doctrine removes one element from the legislative mix," said NAB chief lobbyist James May. "It does not, however, change our opposition to the concept of funding public broadcasting on the backs of commercial broadcasters."

NAB officials, including President Eddie Fritts, have repeatedly said they support continued government support for public broadcasting. Asked if NAB might suggest other ways to fund the public broadcasting trust fund, May responded, "We do not have any alternative suggestions, but we do hope Senator Hollings will come up with some creative methods."

Hollings's Two Percent's Worth

Hollings, however, remains committed to the transfer tax. In a brief **R&R** interview last week, Hollings said he was willing to lis-

ten to alternative proposals from opponents of the transfer tax but called such a levy "the best thing we've got right now" to support the trust fund.

Like its predecessor, the current transfer tax proposal calls for a two percent tax on broadcast license transfers. If a licensee has owned the property less than three years, the tax would increase to four percent. A provision in last year's measure that would have slapped station owners with an increased transfer tax if their stations were found to be in violation of the Fairness Doctrine has been dropped from the current draft of the bill.

Under the revised bill, which will be considered at an April 27 hearing before the Senate Telecommunications Subcommittee, some station sales would be exempt from the tax. Transfers from a bankrupt broadcaster to a receiver or trustee, for example, would be exempt. However, when the trustee sells the station, the tax would apply. The transfer of experimental licenses would also be exempt, as would the transfer of an educational station from one noncommer-

cial broadcaster to another. Asked why he thought the transfer tax had a chance of passage after being soundly rejected last year, Hollings said, "I think each time we go around we increase support (for the measure). We have increased support this time and we'll keep on trying."

Nader: Broadcasters Should Give Up An Hour Of Drivetime

Consumer advocate **Ralph Nader** thinks the citizenry needs more access to radio airwaves currently occupied by commercial broadcasters. How much access? An hour a day – during drivetime.

Nader is quietly preparing to launch a major push for creation of a Congressionally-chartered citizen access group that would be entitled to one hour per day on every broadcast outlet in the country. Radio stations would be required to make time available during either morning or afternoon drive, while TV stations would have to surrender an hour of prime time.

In addition to programming this hour in "the public interest," the "Audience Network," as the hypothetical group would be called, would also represent "the interests of its members" before Congress, the FCC, and the courts on broadcasting matters.

Larry Irving, a key member of the House Telecommunications Subcommittee staff, told R&R that Nader submitted the Audience Network proposal to the subcommittee last year but there have been no discussions regarding possible hearings on the concept. Asked if a proposal such as Nader's might be taken seriously on Capitol Hill, Irving said, "Everything has a chance of being taken seriously on Capitol Hill."

The Audience Network would be, in some respects, similar to the existing public broadcasting system. Individuals would pay a small annual fee to become a member of the organization. Members would

elect a board of directors with responsibility for deciding what types of programming should be aired in the group's time slot.

The organization would not receive federal funds and would support itself primarily on membership fees and money it would receive by selling back to stations a limited amount of the time they would be required to give the network.

In a recent speech to a group of individuals involved in cable television access projects, Nader acknowledged there are problems with the Audience Network concept. Still, he insisted that with time and public education the idea is viable. He said the network may need to be phased in over time until a large portion of the public understands and is ready to support the concept. Contraction of the second



Execs' Yearly Raises Declining

Managers and office workers aren't the only members of the US workforce who are getting a smaller piece of the pie each year. According to current statistics, annual pay increases are also declining for corporate executives, continuing a downward trend that began in the mid.'80s.

Listed below are the average annual salary increases for business executives, covering the years 1980-87. (The figure for 1988 is projected.)

(1987) survey conducted by the Washington, DC-based RTNDA. Another 15% of all radio stations surveyed reported that their news operations were breaking even.

Meanwhile, in medium markets – defined as those with populations between 50,000 and 250,000 – the percentage of radio stations that claimed their news operations were profitable was even greater (48%). Another 36% of these stations said that their radio news operation broke even.

And in small markets – those with populations under 50,000 – the *majority* (54%) of radio stations surveyed said that their news operation turned a profit. At another 34% of these small market stations, the radio news operation broke even.

While only 33% of major market (one million or more people) radio stations reported that their radio news operations was making money, another 53% of these stations claimed that radio news was a break-even situation.

Although only 30% of the large market (250,000 to one million people) radio stations surveyed were able to claim a profit on their radio news operation, another 51% of these stations noted that radio news broke even.

Finally, 53% of those stations whose radio news staff numbered three or more people reported that the news operation turned a profit, as opposed to 42% of the two-person radio news crews, or 43% of the one-person operations.

Survey Shows Radio Gives Most Satisfaction

mericans reported that radio provided them with the greatest amount of satisfaction among all media, according to a recent survey conducted on behalf of the RAB by the Arbitron ratings company.

When compared to newspapers, television, or magazines, radio's overall satisfaction rating ranked higher among adults 18+, men 18+, women 18+, and adults with annual incomes of \$45,000 or more. Radio also scored the highest level of satisfaction among managerial, administrative or professional adults, as well as those with college or graduate educations.

As for those adults who claimed to be "very satisfied" or "moderately satisfied" with their available sources of information and entertainment, radio was again the clear-cut choice of media. What Makes A Working Woman Successful?

G loria Steinem must be beaming. Respondents to a recent survey conducted by Working Women magazine reported that ambition, rather than aggression, is the most important factor in the success of today's career women. Success is a relative term, of course, but a walloping 80% of the women surveyed said they feel successful, while a third of all the women report that they are very successful.

More than half of the women who responded to the poll said that they are ambitious, and 93% of this group feel that this ambition has helped their careers. Only a third of the women label themselves aggressive, and 23% of that group feel that this aggression has been a hindrance to their careers.

On the other hand, aggression probably shouldn't be confused with risk-taking, as "playing it safe" just doesn't cut it in today's working world. More than half (63%) of the group feel that taking on more authority and challenges are the most effective ways to advance their careers. Nearly onethird (29%) of the women label themselves "risk-takers," and report that, on the average, they earn twice as much as those who avoid risks.

In addition, the survey found that:

• Almost half of the respondents have made radical career changes, and 84% of them say it was an improvement.

• 83% of women working in male-dominated fields say they have no regrets, as opposed to 42% of those in female-dominated fields.

• Almost a fifth of the women feel they need more training and education.

• 39% believe that taking a year off from work had a negative effect on their careers.

• Almost two-thirds of career women have tailored their appearance to fit their jobs, while a third have actually changed their personalities.

Five More Steps To Make Yourself A Better Sales Manager

aking the transition from salesperson to manager isn't always easy. This week, we'll continue our discussion of the most common mistakes made by managers – new and old – and provide some advice on how to avoid them.

Managing The Department Vs. Managing Individuals

VERVIEW

All too frequently, managers find themselves managing the group as opposed to managing the individuals. The difference between the performance achieved by managing the individual versus managing the group is staggering.

Always keep in mind that each of your salepersons' growth objectives is different, and each salesperson is motivated by different criteria. Step back from the daily pressures of the workplace for a few minutes and ask yourself what motivates each of your salespeople to obtain maximum results in new business.

Next, develop a simple, consistent action strategy to use with each member of your staff. You'll find that some of your salespeople are self-starters; your management objective for these people should be to consistently present them with new business opportunities to pursue. Others are strong conceptual salespeople – give them an idea for a category and they get results. Then there are those who need to be shown techniques in action before they're able to make the concepts work for them.

The second question to ask yourself about each of your staffers is this: what one specific sales technique could be improved or acquired by an individual salesperson to make him a higher achiever? (In other words, where does each person bog down?) The most frequent areas to look

for are time and income management, profitable prospecting, telephone skills, call strategy, and proposal writing. Once you've identified which of

these areas needs improvement for each staffer, find out whether each

salesperson agrees with your assessment. Then figure out how you will lead him to accomplish that goal.

After you've identified each salesperson's particular motivation and integrated these with the specific technical areas in which each person's performance could be improved, don't forget to work constantly at evolving your objectives.

Monitoring The End Result Vs. The Beginning Result Another key area to be concerned with is your sales accountability Along with the standard pending business or projections, the form should provide answers to the following two questions: Who did we see (and what kind of

call was it)? What actual closing calls are

scheduled for the coming week? By taking the number of actual active potential clients and factoring in the industry closing ratio of 35% within four weeks, you will have a much more realistic concept of the amount of business that will be written.

Adding Or Updating Account Exec Job Descriptions

Whether you already have a job description for your account executives or not, you should make sure that such documents contain a specific description of exactly what you expect from each person.

In any case, your AE's job description should include the annual percentage increase that you expect from sustaining station advertisers. Most salepeople have some sustaining business that is assigned to them.

Yes, this sounds radical – but when you consider that there are 12 months in which to penetrate an account, I think you'll agree that this approach is more than realistic.

Your account execs' job description should probably also include the minimum number of weekly new business appointments that are expected, the number of weekly planned closing calls expected, and the required specifics for retaining an agency.

With regard to the latter, some managers find it useful to include the number of presentations made to non-radio active accounts within an agency, the number of contacts made beyond the media buyer, and the number of additional presentations made to active radio accounts at an agency.

Talk Account Strategy As Well As Account Assignments

In addition to discussing target accounts in general, your individual account meetings should focus on developing an action strategy that includes actual potential contacts to be made, as well as the titles of actual decision-makers you want each salesperson to pursue; *i.e.*, human resource directors, directors of merchandising, zone managers, etc. Because some of these contacts may be new and foreign to your staff, you should discuss call strategy as regards

these decisionmakers and set a date to review the progress.

This kind of management strategy is virtually mandatory in 1988, because there is no such thing anymore as *the* decision-maker. Instead, we now have numerous decision-makers with a myriad of budgets available. In fact, many radio stations have taken this mode of thinking one step further and have taken to managing by contact rather than by account. If you really want to maximize your revenues, you're going to have to make sure that your staff is multi-dimensional when it comes to approaching and dealing with accounts.

List Management


As we discussed a couple of weeks ago, there are usually more new business accounts on lists at any given station than you'll ever be able to prospect. Try setting up a "master list," on which the accounts must have had activity within the last 12 months, and a "secondary list," on which the accounts have been filed on and contacted, but with which there has been no activity.

These secondary lists should be assigned for a period of 90 days, after which time they should revert back to you, the manager, for reassignment. While there are some accounts that require a longer cultivation period, you'll find that, in general, once an account has been

filed on, you'll see a 45 to 90-day buying cycle. Besides, after that amount of time, the salesperson usually loses interest anyway.

Managing this type of system isn't really that much of a nightmare. Master lists should be included in a word processor program, and a 5" x 7" card file – in which the cards are the account data form – should be kept on the sales assistant's desk. The master list should be updated weekly and distributed, and the cards should be filed by month of expiration. One station even changes the colors of the cards on a monthly basis to make culling the cards easier.



66 WW arning: the music contained on this album may influence your child's taste in fashion." No, this isn't the latest message being championed by the PMRC, and while this warning has not yet found its way onto record covers, the *idea* behind the message may not be far from the truth.

According to recent issues of the Zandl Slant – a quarterly newsletter published by the NYC-based Xtreme, Inc. youth marketing consultancy firm – there is a direct link between rock music and teen fashion trends, as young fans of rock stars try to emulate their favorite performers.

While this concept is hardly new, Xtreme has turned the concept into a fine art by breaking out specific musical styles and tracing the direct influence that music has on purchases made by trendy young Americans. (The firm bases its forecasts on surveys of 1000 teens and young adults, ages 12-24.)

Most-Prescribed Drugs In U.S.

N ervousness, tension, anxiety, and high blood pressure. While these maladies might not be the most common among Americans, they seem to be the ones for which doctors prescribe the most medications.

According to research compiled by *Pharmacy Times*, the top ten most-frequently prescribed drugs in the US during 1986 – the most recent year for which statistics are available – are as follows:

- 5 Tagamet prescribed for people with stomach ulcers
- 6 Xanax used in treating depression and anxiety; also known as "the new Valium"
- 7 Inderal for nervous tension 8 Lasix — another diuretic pre-
- scribed for high blood pressure
 9 Motrin an anti-inflammatory drug that helps reduce the pain

Microwave Oven Ownership On Rise

hen first introduced to US consumers, microwave ovens were considered a luxury item. However, declining costs have placed microwaves in the same expense bracket as many commonplace kitchen appliances, and a recent survey shows ownership of microwave ovens is growing at a dramatic rate.

According to statistics compiled by the Roper Organization, 57% of *all* US consumers currently own a microwave oven, up 17% over figures from two years ago. 
Incidentally, the RIAA - also an antitrust defendant - is seeking its release from the case, and talking to Isgro's attorneys. Neither side had any comment.





What's this about **Chuck Kaye**, who's headed **Warner Music** for years, resigning?







geographically dispersed markets. The results were compared with 26,000 respondents who returned conventional diaries.

The new diaries were designed to be more attractive and easy to use. Some of the changes include the use of heavier stock paper, richer colors, glossy inks, more modern graphics, and easier-to-read typestyles.

Time Vs. Soft Format

One of the two diaries tested, called "time format," resembles the current diary but uses less imposing graphics separating the columns and has easier-to-read instructions.

The other diary, known as "soft format," also uses simplified instructions, but eliminates the boldlined divisions between the dayparts.

Arbitron Director/Research Jim Peacock said, "Both the Arbitron and COLRAM subcommittees concluded that the soft-formatted version met its objectives for improvement . . . The most significant change we found was an increase in away-from-home 'other place' listening. Average Quarter Hour estimates for 12+ total week persons rose almost a full rating point for 'at work/other place' listening."

Peacock added that the test confirmed an Arbitron suspicion that most away-from-home listening occurred in the workplace by a 3-1 ratio against other away-fromhome locations. He also said AOR and Beautiful/Easy stations were most likely to benefit from the change, and that the greatest daypart increases occurred in middays.

Other findings that were uncovered in the study showed that, using both new diaries, the number of stations per diary increased, overnight listening levels increased, and 18-24 male returns increased.

Peacock said the information will be shared with executives in the radio and research industries, and that the new diary can be implemented for the fall survey if agreement is reached by the end of this month.



Music is used constantly as an advertising draw in commercials. To find out what music consumers think of TV ads, the Soundata panel was asked to list its three favorite - and least favorite - commercials.

The Best

One third of the panelists cited the dancing California Raisins as one of their favorite spots. The commercial was particularly strong among 21-44 year-old music consumers, and twice as many women loved the spot as men.

Number two on the commercial hit parade was the Bud Light campaign, with and without Spuds McKenzie. Men made up a majority of those who liked these commercials.

Pepsi commercials were number three. The Pepsi folks have an "event" mentality when it comes to advertising, as was exemplified during the Grammy Awards when the company ran the four "acts" of the Michael Jackson campaign. The Pepsi commercials, including those with Michael J. Fox, were most popular among women and older demos.

Music fans do seem to like music-driven commercials: the fourth most popular ad was for Levis 501 blue jeans. The score was again dominated by women. No other jeans ads were cited by at least a half-percent of the panel.


The Worst

When asked to name the worst commercials they've seen in the past three months, the panel put Energizer's Jocko ads at the top of the list. Dislike for the ads ran high among all age groups, women, and those in the South.

The Pepsi ads were the second most unpopular commercials, especially among the under-18 crowd. And younger fans are twice as likely to be negative toward the spots, compared to the entire panel. Kind of makes it tough on the "New Generation" angle.

The third most unpopular commercials belong to Nissan. These ads show several people sitting at a table, tossing around design ideas. All the negative comments came from people 21+. This is a bad sign, since these are the folks the ads are supposed to attract.

McDonalds notched fourth place, getting 54% of its negative nods from 25-44 year-olds. Next was Bud Light, thanks to people 25+. It's interesting to note that three of the five least liked commercials are built around very identifiable personalities: Jocko, Michael Jack-son/Michael J. Fox, and Spuds



Frank Zappa and the Mothers of the League of Women Voters. What a team! Zappa's current US tour has just ended, and in its wake are 30,000 newly-registered voters. His audience demographics were a great match to the "get out the vote" campaion.

You might think Zappa - who's been making music for more than 25 rs - would primarily attract an older audience. Polling his concert fans, however, we found that over half were of college age: 29% fell between 18-21 years; another 26% were 22-24 years. As suspected, Zappa didn't attract very young concert fans. The remainder of his audiences were generally older. It could well be that Zappa's involvement with voter registration, as well as his stance against censoring rock lyrics, have brought him renewed exposure among young fans.

However, not everyone in the crowd owned Zappa and/or Mothers of Invention catalog, indicating that a percentage of his audience was made up of new fans. Twenty-seven percent had never bought Zappa product, so possibly at least that many people were seeing him for the first time.




Are music consumers more likely to listen to one radio station over another because of contests? The answer is no - by a five-to-one ratio. Eighty-six percent said they disagreed with the statement.

Contests can influence younger listeners, however. Twenty-five percent of those under 18 years said contests would affect their listening habits. And, according to the panel, contests are more ef fective in the South than in other parts of the country.

Can bigger prizes do the trick? The answer is no by almost the same five-to-one ratio, only slightly higher. Regionally speaking, however, survey results indicate that bigger prizes will do better in the South





The Double Decade Club was recently devised here to salute artists who have sustained successful careers for 20 years or more. (It's also a great excuse to run quaint old shots from the past and compare 'em to present-day pix.) This week's honorees are Cher

and Bob Seger. So when Cher started recording, it was with names like Bonnie Jo Mason (a Spector-produced number called "Ringo I Love You"), Cherilyn, and (with Sonny) Caesar & Cleo. The Cherilyn record, "Dream Baby," a rather magnificent Spectorian tune, was an L.A. hit of sorts in late '64, but 1965 was

L.A. restaurant's turning him away for improper attire (the fur vest failing to compensate for his absence of necktie). And Cher, on her first solo record under her professional name, **Bob Dylan**'s "All I Really Want To Do," beat out a version by a group just coming off its first No. 1 record, the **Byrds**.

And the hits kept coming - sporadically. Sonny's "Bang Bang" gave Cher a big early '66 solo hit, the duo came back strong in early 1967 with the profound philosophical thesis "The Beat Goes On," and Cher scored again with "You Better Sit Down Kids" later that year. In between, solo efforts like the 978th version of "Hey Joe," a cover of South African singer Miriam Makeba's "Click Song" (sort of a "Graceland" preview 20 years too early), and "Mama (When My Dollies Grow Up To Be Babies)" failed to reap their fair share of acclaim.

After "You Better Sit Down Kids," both Cher's solo and duo careers foundered. S&C's film "Good Times" was right up there with Roy Orbison's "The Fastest Guitar Alive" in the rock stars' cinematic hall of fame, and Cher's move from the Imperial label to Atco (where the duo hits were) met with no hits.

Gypsies Breed Hits

But in 1971 a new deal with Kapp hit paydirt right away, as Cher allied herself with "Gypsies, Tramps & Thieves," a profitable image which produced two more chart-topping dividends in "Half-Breed" and "Dark Lady" two years later. Sonny & Cher got a couple of hits out of the comeback as well, not to mention a TV series which outlasted, by a slight margin, their marriage.

Following this renaissance, record success was hard to come by for Cher. She cut a pair of singles for the Warner-Spector label, switched to Warners proper, and even recorded with second husband Gregg Allman under the feministically enlightened banner of Allman & Woman. A switch to Casablanca brought a hit of sorts, "Take Me Home," but the disparity between

its Billboard and R&R peaks (#8 BB, #20 R&R) indicates the hype level surrounding the record.

At Casablanca, Cher submerged her identity in a group called Black Rose, with close friend Les Dudek. Then the movies became her priority, with the recording career mostly on hold until her 1988 Geffen comeback, hitting with a Michael Bolton song that Laura Branigan had previously missed with and now allying herself with the Bon Jovi camp. A long way from flowers and bellbottoms, to be sure, but quite a career record.

Seger Section

Bob Seger has been one of rock's most eloquent, concerned articulators of the average American's life and times for over 20 years. Keeping that in mind, he got off to a truly strange start in his recording career.

His first record (pictured) came

out under the alias of the Beach Bums, and was a 1966 takeoff on Sgt. Barry Sadler's jingo-jungle tubthumper "Ballad Of The Green Berets." But the Beach Bums' "Ballad Of The Yellow Berets" was not an antiwar answer; instead it ragged on conscientious objectors from a strict conservative standpoint.

Seger. Two years later, for his Capitol debut, he wrote what may be the most effective anti-Vietnam

rock record ever. $(2+2)^{+}=?$ worked because it brought the war issue directly down to the individual, the way Seger's best songs always have. His first record under his own name, "East Side Story" in fall 1966, concisely encapsulates the grind of poverty, the need to escape by any means, and the sometimes tragic consequences; as was recently said about Suzanne Vega's "Luka," it's an entire movie in three minutes.

Seger Bullets



All this came before Seger even had a hit outside his native Michigan, along with gems like his '66 James Brown salute, "Sock It To Me Santa"; the Spring Break anthem "Florida Time"; the savage, Dylanesque "Persecution Smith"; and the prophetic, pre-metal "Heavy Music."

Systematic Breakthrough

Seger first broke through to the nation at large in late 1968 with the Top 20 "Ramblin' Gamblin' Man," as by the Bob Seger System. Several other Capitol LPs failed to match its success; same sad story for a few more for WB, despite rock ravers like "Get Out Of Denver." 1975's "Beautiful Loser" LP, back on Capitol, made an impact which was consolidated by the hit "Live Bullet" LP the next year, and capped by the Top 5 hit "Night Moves" in 1977.

From then on, Seger has established himself as one of the premier American rockers, with 11 Top 10 hits, including two No. 1's, one of them last year's "Shakedown." If his first 11 years were a struggle, the fame and acclaim he's accrued in the second 11 must more than compensate him for his estimable efforts.

"Sqt. Pepper" Revisited

An all-star remake of "Sgt. Pepper's Lonely Hearts Club Band" has been released in England to benefit a children's charity. Entitled "Sgt. Pepper Knew My Father," the LP features the **Christians, Billy Bragg, Wet Wet Wet,** and other British acts doing their versions of songs from the classic album.

The record was originally only available by mail order through Britain's *New Musical Express*, but **Island** recently picked up the rights. Proceeds go to "Childline," a hotline for kids needing help.





Programmers' Roundtable

What's going on in the minds of CHR programmers? To find out, R&R conducted another Programmers' Roundtable. A cross-section of PDs from different regions of the country was polled on a variety of subjects affecting the format.

Taking part were WNVZ/Norfolk's Chris Bailey, WZOK/Rockford's Mark McClure, B93 (KBTS)/ Austin's Lisa Tonacci, and KWSS/ San Jose's Mike Preston. This is the first of a two-part column.

Everything's Coming Up Roses


R&R: As you enter the spring book, how do you feel about your stations and the format in general? CB: I've never felt better about anything. Our music sounds great, and our promotions are topnotch. We're number one now and expect to be number one by even greater leaps and bounds by the time the whole thing's over.



MP: I'll echo his sentiments. We feel good about where we're at in San Jose. The market has changed somewhat with new competitor KHQT. But last week's Arbitrend showed KWSS at its highest point ever. While we expect to see a little fluctuation here and there, KWSS is very solid promotionally. And we've never had a hotter staff.

LT: Things are looking up for the

spring book. I'm proud of my onair lineup right now, as we just hired Barry Kaye from K98 (KHFI). He used to program that station and has a lot of market recognition. Our direct mail piece will be hitting soon, so there are a lot of things to be excited about.

MM: We just completed music research I feel good about. Also, the music that's available for programming right now is damn good. We've started to regain some of the buzz and promotional sizzle that were missing for a couple of months. We currently have a "smokescreen" promotion going on, with our main promotion starting in about a week.

Promotional Strategies R&R: What's a smokescreen

promotion? MM: I don't like to lead off with my main book promotion. I want to keep my competition off guard as much as I can. So, for the past two years, we've come up with a promotion that runs anywhere from ten days to three weeks into the first part of the book.

We make it sound like this is the promotion to end all promotions. But when we complete this, we then kick in with our book promotion. If there's going to be any reaction from the competition, they normally react to the first thing they hear.

WZOK is using a new image liner, "Rockin' Good Times." We just bought a "Power Trip" package, which is for the upcoming Prince's Trust Concert in England. We're calling it a "Fantasy Rock-

in' Good Time" and really playing it up. The main promotion is going to use our current image liner in a "phrase-that-pays" promotion called "The More You Say It, The More You Win." R&R: Besides cash, what are the

hot prizes this year?

CB: A close second to cash would be trips to anyplace exotic, anyplace out of the country ... Europe, Jamaica, Japan.

LT: I definitely agree with Europe and the exotic places. But I'm also sensing an attitude of "What are you going to give me today?" Listeners' expectations are very high, and times are very tough in Texas. So free money goes a long way.

MP: I tend to agree with Lisa. The Bay Area is such a competitive market. And with the changes that have happened here, it's really a battle of the bucks. I'm lucky because Nationwide believes in supporting its product promotionally. When you have a station like which just started a KMEL. \$106,000 giveaway, or K101, with its "\$1000 Phrase That Pays," we have to be able to play at that level. Our research most recently show-

ed that cash is still king – but even ahead of trips are cars. They're very much the status symbol in California.

R&R: Speaking of cars, Mark, how did your "Pink Cadillac" promotion to lure Bruce Springsteen to

town work out?

MM: We collected thousands of signatures on the car, but it didn't happen. Thankfully, Columbia supported our efforts or I'd have had egg all over my face. They gave us a number of tickets to the Chicago show, LPs, CDs, an autographed guitar, seven trips with tickets, and hotel accommodations in various cities hosting his tour.

CHR & Records: **Friends Or Foes?**

R&R: Describe your relationship with the record companies

CB: Personally, it's at an alltime low. If my competitor is adding more music than I am, the labels tend to lean to it a little more and swing all the promotions to one station. In my area, they've also hired many inexperienced people – a lot of them call up just to read a laundry list of chart moves. I'd like some more constructive information. While things aren't at their optimum, we're all working to make them better.

MP: Although we have a few in-

experienced people in the workplace, our relationship is excellent. More labels are becoming responsive to radio stations' needs. By talking to some of the record VPs during the R&R convention, I learned that all you have to do is ask to get things done. Radio has to be more willing to say to records, "Hey, I've got an idea. Let's do a promotion.

CB: But don't you find that if they do go along with a promotional idea, they then want things in return?

MP: What I try to do is pick records for promotions that I'm already playing - or at least a pro-



ject we're supporting in some manner. Most record people who deal with me know that they shouldn't call Mike Preston and say, "Hey, if you add such and such, you get the promotion." I don't do business that way.

CB: They know that with us too, but they still do it. We like to ask about a promotion after the record is being played. Record people only seem to want to do a promotion son something they need us to play.

LT: [Rival] K98 has had a longstanding relationship with record people, and it takes time to change that around. Beyond that, I run a much tighter playlist than K98 does, which sometimes can be difficult. For the most part, the



labels here know our policy which is to be on something before we do a promotion with an artist

MM: Until recently, I was the only reporting station in the Rockford market. I've had good relationships with everybody as a result. If the labels want to do a promotion with me, that's all well and good. But I just remind them upfront that there are no airplay guarantees.





Urban Radio Says 'Let's Jingle'

UC radio went through a period when most stations didn't use jingles or musical beds with voice drops. They've made a comeback at some stations during the past three years, however, and three jingle producers' reps discussed the reasons why.

Rosemary Sichi is Director/Operations at Chicago-based Joe Kelly Creative Services, which has supplied production assistance to several UC stations in different parts of the country. "We offer a music production library for the Urban format, not a jingles package," she explained. "We create music libraries for radio stations. 'LaserFresh,' the library we've been using specifically for Urban stations, is cutting-edge music created by Joe Kelly because Urban PDs seemed at a loss in this department. We'd have PDs who asked, 'What are we going to use for musical beds? Do I use the same jazz album other stations use? We want our station to sound professional, too.' Even Don Kelly of Don Kelly Associates, who consults a number of UC stations, asked us where to find some musical aids for his clients' stations.

"After hearing this from a number of people, we decided to take a crack at putting a library together."

An Ethnic Mix

"We used white, black, and Hispanic musicians from our staff for the 'LaserFresh' library. They composed and arranged all the



music, and the end result was a fusion of rock, R&B, and jazz – sort of a modern urban sound. The library ended up with 80 cuts. We offer 60-, 45-, 30-, and 15-second beds, and most stations are using them for promos, IDs, sweepers, and commercial production."

Sichi pointed out that the music in the library — which is digitally mastered and available on either CD or acetate — sounds like the hit songs most UC stations program. "It's really like listening to Jody Watley without the lyrics," she explained. "It has a dance music beat, and is very consistent with y.

what Urban stations are playing. The idea is to keep people listening during the station breaks."

WXYV/Baltimore and KPRR/ El Paso are two Urban clients using Joe Kelly Creative Services. One FM station per MSA can lease exclusive rights to the library for a period of ten years. Sichi can be contacted at (312) 645-8241.

Music Experimentation

Bob Shannon, VP/Radio & Television Music at Dallas-based TM Communications, described his company's Urban radio music package by saying, "Most radio jingles traditionally had a similar sound, generally using a vocal group of five or six singers. In fact, the same 15 or so people have been doing the jingles in Dallas for years. About two years ago, I started experimenting by adding black singers to the mix. This

wasn't so much to create a black sound as it was to create a more *emotional* sound. We were looking for something with feeling, but we didn't initially set out to create an Urban package of jingles.

"The first package we did using black singers was for KMEL/San Francisco. They're a CHR station, but they air a lot of urban music, recognizing that there is no color barrier in music – or at least there shouldn't be."

Shannon said TM will soon introduce a package that uses all



genres of music. "There are five or six cuts based on the urban sound, but there are also rock and pop sounds. We used traditional singers for the vocals, and then we brought in some gospel singers from a church here in Dallas to lay down tracks on top of them. It ended up

as eight voices, and it's a very exciting project. It has an energy that's consistent with today's UC radio.

"I don't think most companies really delivered for Urban radio in the past, but I think the time has finally come. More and more, I see the music all coming together in



the various formats. We're currently working on some new things that will feature solely black singers.

"If you can achieve a sound that expresses the energy and excitement of the radio station, then you're doing what the jingle is supposed to do."

Urban . . . Or CHR?

Jon Wolfert, President of Jam Creative Productions, commented, "Our company has developed some packages specifically for Urban stations, but we've found that most Urbans want mainstream, straight-ahead jingles like you hear on CHR stations. They may want to change a lyric here and there, but I think we actually do more CHR- type things than specific Urban approaches for our Urban clients. I don't know why this is, but to each his own.

"We've done jingles for the BBC's Radio 1 and Radio 2. Our 'Music Now' package for Radio 1 is rock-oriented, but – for whatever reasons – this package has be-

come a favorite with some of our Urban clients. It wasn't originally developed with Urban purposes in mind, however.

"Since every PD has his own philosophy about how and where to use jingles, we just do what he wants and aim to please. For a jingle to be successful, however, the client first has to know what he wants. Our job then is to help him communicate that idea to our musicians, our singers, and our production people."



Love Is in The Air

What's the dang deal? Has AOR gone soft? Isn't this the format that primarily caters to drug-addled, skirtchasing heathens who only react to promotions involving beer and wet T-shirts? Since when does rock radio have anything to do with *love*?

Well, if recent developments are any indication, AOR listeners are just as hopelessly romantic as you probably are (and as I know I am). Statistics continue to show that, despite depressing divorce rates, marriages are on the rise. And stations have found that marriage makes for some good, fun promotions. Here are some of the recent on-air nuptials we've heard about:

Marry Us — Today! When WYMG/Springfield, IL morning matchmakers Don (Murphy) & Liz (Willis) invited women to phone on Sadie Hawkins Day (February 29) with on-air marriage proposals, one of the first callers surprised the duo by requesting an early morning wedding instead. Patricia and Mike Mussatto, whose first marriage to each other had ended in divorce,



were ready to give it another try. "Would it be possible," Patricia inquired, "to marry us today?"

'YMG was not the only station which used Leap Day as an excuse to have some fun. WQFM/Milwaukee's then-morning man John Millinder decided to do his best Miles Standish on the 29th, challenging marriage-minded Milwaukee women to call him with proposals for their unsuspecting boyfriends. Four listeners responded, and one of the guys Millinder called actually said "yes." Little did he know what he and his wifeto-be were getting into.

Millinder's partner Susie Austin got things rolling when she suggested the perfect locale for the nuptials: the Milwaukee County Zoo's picturesque Monkey Island. 

That's because Dashow and Bonnie Ann Comley decided to tie the proverbial knot on the air during the Dennis Elsas program.

"When I told Dennis I was just planning to get married at City Hall, he suggested we do it on his show instead," Dashow recalled. "In a way it was what we wanted all along — just the immediate family in the studio. And the audience reaction was great. 





FEMALES IN MANAGEMENT

Women Take Charge At New Bedford's WMYS

While female announcers can now be found at a number of stations, women holding down management positions aren't as easy to locate. Thus, WMYS/New Bedford, MA is a true phenomenon, having both a female GM and OM.

Networking Disadvantage

GM Christine Lodge and OM Joanie Pfieffer joined the soft AC at about the same time. Lodge advanced to GM via the traditional sales route. Pfieffer, who doubles as one-half of the morning show, made history 14 years ago by becoming Providence's first female music host.

Lodge doesn't labor over the fact she's a female GM. "I deal on a people level. I do my job period," she said. "Over the past few years there's only one disadvantage I've seen — that's networking and the time it takes to establish relationships. Men build relationships beyond business hours. They may go out to dinner or play racketball with clients. I work within business hours. Those relationships are developed, but they take longer."

If any resentment among staff members exists, Lodge believes it's because she's simply the GM, rather than the *female* GM. "Nobody works in utopia. Every GM in the country has employees who aren't pleased with decisions that get made. I look at people as individuals. I don't break things out as male/female. We're in a competitive environment; it doesn't matter if the right person for the job is male or female." WMys 98.1PM

Catch 22

Addressing the paucity of female programmers (see sidebar), Pfieffer talked about the Catch 22 inherent in the situation. "For so long, being on the air was closed to females. Often, however, PDs start on-air. How could you grow into a PD's job when most people on-air were males? But (in 1974), I was determined to make it in the business.

"We're at the point where all that should matter is 'Who can do the best job?' That's what counts. There's still an old-boy network in the business, [but] things are going well now. The future is wide open for people who know what they're doing."

During the years she's worked with the WMYS staff, Pfieffer said she's had no difficulty asserting authority. "The way you critique airchecks and give direction is the same, whether the PD is male or female. I have no problem being direct and leveling with people. Generally speaking, with our entire male staff, there are few prob-

I get by them by showing my confidence and ability. Frankly, I can't think of anyone's respect I haven't won."

thought, Pfieffer called it "all a crock. I don't have absolute proof but from the research I've read, my biggest fans are females. You have to be yourself. Some of us feel we have to be so perfect and professional and can't show the femininity we have. I try to come demo in three of the four prior books.

Since it focuses on the 25-54 demo – and specifically women in that age group – WMYS may have an added advantage with a female GM and OM at the helm. Or as Lodge noted, "It doesn't hurt."

More than half of the Music Intensive stations (56.8%) have at least one woman serving as GM, PD, ND, or MD. Slightly less than ten percent (9.9%) have two women holding those jobs; in one case, a person is both PD and MD. Among MI stations not employing a female GM, PD, ND, or MD, 22.8% were in P1 markets; 37.1% were in P2 markets; and, 40% were in P3 markets.

Observations Of An Ex-PD

During the R&R convention Country panel on radio and record relationships, a couple of former PDs now on the record side of the business offered their observations. Not able to get any mike time at the session – or perhaps he's just shy – RCA/Nashville Midwest Regional Promotion Manager Dale Turner sent in this thoughtful piece:

"My initial observations since moving into record promotion are:

• What an inadequate understanding of the record industry I actually had going into this job. The functions of distribution, artist development, and overall marketing have confirmed to me that the emphasis is on *business* in the record business.

• It's my impression (I hope I'm wrong, maybe it's a false impression) that there's a lack of attention to the music at the radio [level]. If a station has a music-intensive format, the main ingredient of the product is, of course, the music. probably 75-80%. Therefore, your listeners are cuming your station for music. So why wouldn't the programmer be devoting the same percentage of his work week to the music? A side note: as an ex-programmer (WSAI/Cincinnati; KSSN/Little Rock), I realize the many responsibilities of a PD. It's definitely non-stop meetings and people management.

But I just can't believe how a PD can rationalize the minimal attention given to the biggest part of his on-air product. If all there was to it was to research the top 300 oldies and add currents when they hit the top 30, we'd all be brilliant millionaires! At various stations where I worked, we had daily brainstorming sessions to find out how to stimulate excitement on a new song to make the music the "event" or the "star." Everything we did promotionally had a connection to the music; e.g., cash for counting the songs (forcing longer time spent listening) or winning vacations by listening for designated songs, etc.

It's my opinion that using active listener research through the request line is no worse a technique than trying to interpret half-baked, in-house passive research.


In closing, I'm encouraged that some stations are doing "new music days," where they play their new adds and give a brief bio sketch on the artist/song. Others are conducting new music battles, playing new songs against each other for the most popular response. These, along with allowing your air talent to become emotionally involved with the music – and not just emotionally involved with the local meteorologist – can only help the business.

I may never be remembered as an innovative programmer, but no one can ever accuse me of not having a passion for the music."







ATALIE COLE continues her l-o-n-g ride atop the DMR chart, while Latin hiphopper NOEL closes the gap with a two-place jump. E.U. butts into the Top 5 with an 11point gain, edging out 3 MAN ISLAND, who climb seven positions to #5.

TODD TERRY PROJECT batters its way to #6, leaping from #33 on the DMR's full 80-place chart two weeks ago. DEPECHE MODE's "Wheel" rolls upward this week, as does NEW ORDER's double-shot. PET SHOP BOYS move up two spaces to close out the Top 10. IM-AGINATION, now a pop release, is up, while fresh faces fill most of the rest of the Top 20. SWEET SEN-SATION checks in at #12 (from 52). NARADA (an Urban debut this week) graduates from #23. Fastclimbing Urban fave JOHNNY KEMP cashes in at #15 (from #42). Big-jump honors go to PEBBLES, who drives her "Mercedes Boy" to #16 (from #76). REIMY rolls to #17 (from #36), and Sleeping Bag's latest find JOE CHURCH goes 26-20 to close out this week's list.

Making a run at the chart are G.T., BLUE MERCEDES's new one, ROCHELLE, and JESSE JOHNSON. British acts RICK ASTLEY, CLIMIE FISHER, and OMD are on the move, and REGINA's back.

Pet Shop Boys hold off Climie Fisher (just out here and on its second-time's-the-charm rerelease in the UK) to notch a second week on top of the British chart. Closing fast on both acts is FLEETWOOD MAC. Dance diva HAZELL DEAN makes a big jump to reach #4. S-EXPRESS surges into the Top 10 with a #6 debut for this latest home beatbox project: TAYLOR DAYNE improves her psotion, as do dance faves Natalie Cole and Pebbles.

BANANARAMA's fifth UK hit off the recent LP moves up ten to compiete the upper half.

JACKSON 5 are back on the chart with an '88 remix of their first US #1 single. PAT & MICK's Michael Zager remake debuts at #16 from deeper on the full UK listing. DANNY WILSON's "Prayer," on our CHR charts last fall, makes a British debut at #19 on rerelease, and EURYTHMICS (single #3 in the UK) break onto the chart to round out the Top 20. T'PAU keeps talking dirty to remain an up-and-comer. Others pointed toward the chart include DEF LEP-PARD, JERMAINE STEWART, BRENDA RUSSELL, GEORGE MI-CHAEL, and WILL DOWNING. Dirty dancer PATRICK SWAYZE is making a gale-force charge at the British chart, as are ROB BASE & DJ E-Z ROCK (issued first on Profile here)

chart, with no changes in the top four positions. HONEYMOON SUITE steps up one to conclude the chart's upper half. NEO A4 climbs a notch to #8.
