





Also new to KSMG is PDKelly Mc-Cann, formerly PD at WYVY/ Chattanooga. Under McCann's supervision, KSMG has evolved from AC to Gold.

Devine, who moves into her first GM position, told R&R, "I'm happy to have someone like Kelly as my PD. He really understands the new format and the direction we have to move in. "We've dropped all the current product and the initial impact has been beyond amazing. We're hearing Magic 105 already airing in stores and restaurants all over the city."

SMN To Air In China

Listeners in Shanghai, China will be able to sample a variety of American radio beginning next month, when Satellite Music Network will beam its formats to the Asian city for an hour each day.

Speaking from Hong Kong, SMN Chairman John Tyler said his company will provide Radio Shanghai with an hour of programming each day at noon. The content will be drawn from SMN's Gold, Country, CHR, and AC formats.

"This is an exciting venture for SMN," said Tyler. "We hope that the airing of American music in China can help promote mutual understanding between our countries."

SMN will market the commercial inventory to advertisers. "Our alliance with Radio Shanghai is a tremendous opportunity for advertisers," noted Tyler. "It is the first step towards expansion of American music programming throughout China."

The broadcasts will begin September 5 on Shanghai's English channel at 103.7 MHz. Radio Shanghai, the largest local station in China, also operates another FM and five AM stations. It claims a listenership of 30-35 million.

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

FCC Issues Clarification **Of Political Ad Rules**

Prompted by inquiries from candidates, broadcasters, and members of Congress, the FCC last week issued a few guidelines for broadcasters to use when calculating how much to charge political candidates for airtime.

The Communications Act re-

quires broadcasters to provide legally qualified candidates for office with airtime at the station's "lowest unit charge" during the 45 days prior to a primary election and 60 days before a general or special election. While that sounds straightforward enough, there has always been a great deal of disagreement regarding just how to define "lowest unit charge."

In its newly-released Public Notice, the Commission's Political Programming Branch has declared all preemptible spot time to be a single class of time for the purpose of calculating the lowest unit charge. The Commission also defined the lowest unit charge for preemptible time as "the lowest price any advertiser has paid for a spot that cleared a particular time period or daypart" in the same week.

The Commission also said stations that have established fixed rates for political advertisers may not raise those rates during the election season unless the increase is part of a broader rate unrelated to the election.

The NAB criticized the notice on political broadcasting as "a narrow, restrictive, and unwarranted interpretation of what the law requires of broadcasters" and said the ruling will result in much more paperwork for stations.

Broadcasters Lobby FCC On Spectrum Allocation

A coalition of broadcast groups led by the NAB is urging the FCC to pay more attention to the concerns of radio and television stations as it considers new and expanded uses of the spectrum.

"If our free local and universal broadcast system is to survive in an era of increased competition, we must have the capability not only to maintain our current level of service but to match the technical quality of other media through im-provements," said the broadcasters in an August 3 letter to FCC Chairman Dennis Patrick. "But our opportunities may be completely undercut if FCC policies in the interim result in eroding the technical integrity of present broadcast signals."

The six-page letter was signed by the presidents of the NAB, the Association of Independent Television Stations, the Association of Maximum Service Telecasters, the Corporation for Public Broadcasting, and National Public Radio.

> **Increased Tolerance For Interference**

The broadcasters charge that the FCC, in its rush to provide new and expanded services that it believes the public wants, has demon-strated an increased tolerance for increased interference in the broadcast services.

"In choosing to permit these new facilities or services," the broad-casters wrote, "the Commission has almost universally ignored or given short shrift to maintaining the public's existing service and to preserving opportunities for expansion and quality improvement.'

The group also said the impact on radio and television of possible rule changes that might result in increased interference has been obscured by the fact such changes are being evaluated in several different proceedings.

"Each proposal, standing alone, may not have universal or devastating interference consequences, but their cumulative effect can be severe," said the coalition.

Ironically, the broadcasters, many of whom have benefitted from recent FCC deregulation policies, also chastised the Com-

As the Republican Staff Director and Minority Chief Counsel of the House Energy & Commerce Committee since February 1987, he has been deeply involved in many battles over broadcast issues such as the Fairness Doctrine.

This month Smith will become a partner with the Washington law firm of Wiley, Rein & Fielding, where he will specialize in communications and securities law.

He will be replaced on the committee by Margaret Durbin, the associate general counsel for the American Life Insurance Council. From 1977-84 she worked on the Energy & Commerce Committee staff as associate minority counsel.





Services & Nondurable Goods

Service businesses and stores that sell such nondurables as food, clothing, and drugs will prosper during the next half-decade – and Americans are also likely to spend more on services.

Health care is the service area predicted to experience the greatest growth, but household services (electricity, gas, telephone), transportation services (ranging from oil changes to exotic vacations), and personal business services (ranging from copy centers to banks) are also expected to perform well from now until 1992.

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cluding new and unusual prizes to be awarded listeners. But that old standby — cold, hard cash — is still radio's most popular contest prize.

According to a recent *Promotion & Marketing Monthly* survey of 500 stations, money is still the most frequently awarded prize in primary contests. More than half (55%) of the respondents said cash is their payoff of choice, with vacation trips a distant second (16%). Cars – preferably exotic and expensive models – are also semipopular (7%), while 8% of the stations give away other types of gifts and prizes.

Shopping On The Job

he next time your boss tells you he's leaving the office to "run some errands," he may actually be spending his time shopping.

According to a recent International Council of Shopping Centers survey, a large portion (38%) of respondents said they find time to shop during a regular work day. (Office workers in the following US cities were included in the survey: Seattle, Dallas, San Francisco, Denver, Chicago, Atlanta, Tampa, and Boston.)

However, not all the workers said they shop 'til they drop during their lunch break. A full 40% go bargain-hunting at times other than the traditional lunch hour!

And which type of employee is most likely to conduct his or her shopping spree at odd hours of the day? It's not the working girl in the secretarial pool, but someone from the ranks of upper management. Managers have more flexible (and often self-dictated) work hours, which allows them to spend their hefty paychecks whenever they feel like it.

Working Man's Blues

Il you air personalities who've just been blown out of a job can take comfort in the fact you're not alone. According to the NYC-based **Roper Organization**, more than 25% of the entire American workforce – that's 30 million employees – will be let go at least once in their lifetime.

What's more, a full 20% (six million) of those terminations are unjustified. And . . . if it's any consolation, companies also lose money whenever they fire an employee.



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Avoiding The Most-Common Vendor Selling Mistakes

ontinuing last week's discussion of how to tap vendor dollars, here are the most common mistakes that stations and salespeople make when trying to work with manufacturers on local programs:

Not Identifying Manufacturer Objectives

When approaching manufacturers, too many salespeople fall back on traditional radio selling technologies. It's not uncommon for radio salespeople to spend valuable meeting time discussing either the "advertising value" of radio or the benefits of an individual station when what they really should be doing is showing the manufacturer how to leverage the radio medium for additional product visibility at key retailers, which then fosters additional sales.

Targeting Too Small Accounts

Since the amount of manufacturers' local dollars that are available to the trade is not unlimited, each company must be sure to invest its money with retailers that can generate a significant amount of additional sales. The problem comes when inexperienced salespeople try to set up a vendor program with retailers that can't offer a manufacturer any sort of significant sales increase because their stores are too small. While there are no hard and fast rules about this, generally you should try to work with retailers who either have at least \$1 million dollars in annual sales volume or a minimum of 30,000 square feet of retail floor space.

Targeting Too Large Accounts

While it's not impossible to work with companies that are sophisticated market leaders, these aren't the places to try and get a vendor program off the ground. You'll find it's much more fruitful to give your sales staff the opportunity to get comfortable working with manufacturers and retailers in a lower risk situation than to try and pitch

the market leaders their first time out of the box.

Asking For Too Much Money

One of the biggest reasons that vendor programs break down is that neither the salesperson nor the retailer knows exactly how much money they should be trying to pry out of the manufacturer. Much of this problem stems from press accounts of \$100,000 vendor programs. Truth is, there are a lot more \$7500 and \$9000 programs available than there are the splashy, six-figure variety.

Two things happen when you ask for too much money. One is that it simply isn't possible for the manufacturer to recoup the contribution from the additional sales. The other is that any requests for large sums of money tend to get passed from the local manufacturer's reps

to the regional staff, which in turn passes your request over to the national office and results in the radio salesperson getting bogged down in a tremendous amount of paperwork and unnecessary contacts. This is the so-called hidden agenda that causes people to complain about the hopelessly long vendor selling cycle. When properly done, the vendor selling cycle shouldn't take any longer than six to eight weeks per program.

Trying To Sell Through An Agency

Many times a salesperson will try to raise vendor dollars by broaching the option with an agency media buyer. This generally adds more problems than it's worth. First, most accounts don't want their agency involved in raising dollars because most of these negotiations involve floor space, instore demonstrations, etc. Second, these vendor programs can be huge profit centers for the accounts, which is another reason why they don't want their agencies involved. (This is also the reason that so many accounts place their print buys direct, yet funnel their electronic buys through the agencies.)

Not Enough Lead Time

This problem isn't unique to manufacturer programs, but it's a major drawback nonetheless. Along with willingness to participate and the ability to generate the vendor dollars, you'll invariably find several variables, including the introduction of a new product, the timing of a peak selling season, and national promotions that must coincide with your retail event.

Bear in mind that it takes approximately four weeks to get a corporate decision. Then you've got to allow time for the product to be distributed to the stores so it can

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be displayed. And, if your promotion requires additional product to be shipped, you've got to allow even more time for that.

Furthermore, manufacturers' selling cycles often vary from those of retailers. Examples: snow blowers were sold to retailers in May; cosmetics and holiday seasonals are just now being put to bed; patio furniture and outdoor orders for next summer will be starting in September. For a clearer idea of manufacturers' selling seasons, see the box located at upper right.

Targeting Low Volume Manufacturers

While some manufacturers that have small amounts of product movement will be interested in vendor programs, your salespeople are better off sticking with main line goods. Smaller manufacturers give salespeople a lot of hope, but rarely end up participating in vendor programs because the dollars invested can't match the money generated by the additional sales.

Working With

Low Margin Products

One of the hidden reasons that so many promising vendor programs fall through is that the salesperson is trying to work directly with a manufacturer that has an extremely low profit margin for retailers. In these cases, the retailer simply doesn't want to provide the additional floor space to products that don't carry enough of a profit margin. Recognizing this potential pitfall in advance will save you a lot of time that could otherwise be spent on more profitable endeavors.

Philip Collins is one of the foremost collectors of these treasures in the US, and he has turned his hobby into an eye-popping book, entitled "Radios: The Golden Age" (Chronicle Books; \$14.95).



"PayFax" **Machines To** Go Nationwide

he facsimile craze is in full swing, and many business travelers are using these popular machines on the road as often as they would in the office. Unfortunately, the use of hotel fax machines is often restricted to certain hours, and the cost of sending a document can take a big chunk out of any salesperson's expense account. (Some hotels charge up to \$17 per page.)

Now a Santa Clara, CA-based company is giving travelers more opportunities to access fax machines. FAXplus Corp. is installing its "PayFax" machines in hotel lobbies, airport terminals, office buildings, rental car agencies, and convention centers across the country. The equipment is available around the clock, and costs less than many other fax services.

For an \$8 fee, the user is allowed ten minutes of fax time to either send or receive material; there's an 80-cent charge for each additional minute of use. The cost can be charged to any major credit card.) FAXplus expects have 1500 of its PayFax machines installed nationwide by the end of the year.

Compact Discs With US Census Information Now Available

ompact discs have been hailed as one of the most important technological breakthroughs of the past decade. Currently there are several major corporations-including 3M, Sony, and Philips - that employ a system called CD-ROM (Read Only Memory) in which the disc is used as a data-storage device, similar to the way floppy discs store informa-

tion for computer systems.

Now an Australian company, Space-Time Research, has come up with a unique (and potentially profitable) use for CD-ROM: The firm has put the entire US Census Bureau's data onto compact discs. Census data stored in the "Su-

permap" system could be used by any number of professions. For example, radio stations could better

select target neighborhoods for station mailers, while retail chains would be able to plan the site of a new store in an area with the most desirable customers.

Space-Time Research predicts sales of the new system will help push total company revenues to the \$1 million mark by the end of this year - a mere fraction of the \$100 million CD-ROM market. (Industry experts predict the market should reach an estimated \$300 million by 1991.) Supermap is now available through Chadwyck-Healey, an Alexandria, VA-based distributor, at a cost of \$2300.

Record Rental Ban Passes House

The House of Representatives has passed a measure that would continue the current ban on record rental shops, which have been illegal in the US since 1984. The House record rental bill must now be reconciled with the Senate version, which was approved two months ago.

The Senate bill calls for the rental ban to become a permanent part of the Copyright Act, while the House version calls for the ban to be reviewed by Congress at some point in the future. Final passage of some compromise version of the bill is expected to come this fall. The present law expires at the end of 1989.

The Recording Industry Association of America, which has been pushing for passage of some type of extension of the record rental ban, has successfully argued that record rental shops exist solely to facilitate home taping of recorded material. RIAA President Jason Berman has testified that legalizing record rentals would result in higher prices and less variety for consumers of recorded music. The RIAA also has pointed out that the introduction of the virtually in-

destructible CD, which could be rented an infinite number of times, has made record rental operations an even bigger threat to the music industry.

Prior to the ban on record rental shops there were approximately 250 such businesses in the US. Record rental is still a legal and lucrative business in Japan and several other countries.



Look for some major upper level restructuring at **MCA Records** in the near future, including a healthy boost for Exec. VP/Marketing & Promotion **Richard Palmese.**

Meanwhile, **Solar** Exec. VP **Hank Caldwell** appears to be the leading candidate for a senior marketing position at MCA's Black Music division.

When Emmis assumes control of CHRformatted KYUU/San Francisco next month under new PD Bill Stairs (see Page 1), the group will simultaneously take over AC outlet WKQX/Chicago and Easy Listening-formatted WJIB/Boston. Don't expect any programming changes at either of these two stations in the near future.

ST has learned that AOR WXXP/ Pittsburgh has received FCC permission to use WYMX as its new calls. The station is currently dark, as it's undergoing some technical improvements, but market speculation is that it will go up against B94 as a CHR under newly-named PD Waylon Richards (see Page 3).

Crazy Eights

Figuring they'd "never forget their anniversary," **KUPD/Phoenix** PD **Curtiss Johnson** and his fiancee — who had planned a spring '89 wedding — suddenly decided to hop a jet to Vegas and tie the knot last Monday. The date, of course, was 8/8/88.

Power 95 /NY MD **Andy Dean** resigns to become PD at **WDHA/Dover, NJ,** replacing **Mike Boyle,** who's joining the *FMQB Album Report.*

However, this does *not* signal a format change away from AOR at 'DHA, as Dean is a big fan of the station's progressive musical posture. No replacement has been named at Power 95; OM Larry Berger is accepting applications.

Expect **KBPI/Denver** APD/MD **John Edwards** to take the PD job at **Devine Communications** AOR **KBER/Salt Lake City.** As ST went to press, Edwards was "99% sure" he'd take the job, since there's only a minor contract detail that needs to be worked out. KBER PD **Katherine Brown** is stepping down to handle marketing and promotions for the chain.







When asked what changes he'd make at KTWV, Sebastian said, "I want to come in and look at the research and find the ways to maximize the potential of this format. No one has come close to doing that yet. With KTWV's signal and resources, it offers a unique opportunity to do just that. I have such a love and sensitivity for this format that I believe I can accomplish it; I won't be doing any knee-jerk reactions."

According to Sebastian, KTWV's spring ratings were disappointing. "It was possibly a fluke, but certainly a poor book. The good news is that its cume almost hasn't changed at all. That means the station has a loyal audience. The only job there is to get people to listen longer. We don't have to bring in any new people; if we do, that's just fine."

Sebastian has also programmed WCOZ/Boston, KUPD/Phoenix, KDWB/Minneapolis, and KDKB/ Phoenix.

In the spring Birch, KTWV tied for 18th place (12+) with a 1.8; in the Arbitron it was 19th with a 1.7.

Wave Network Changes

Meanwhile, the "Wave Network" (consulted by Cody and Owen Leach) will be making some sweeping changes in its satellite delivered format.

One addition will be a complete departure for both the network and flagship KTWV: the addition of "smooth, pleasant-sounding announcers" who will identify every song played.

Artist information capsules that will profile aspects of the artists' music will be launched, the music mix will be more "energetic," and Sunday evening programming will be developed. Stopsets will be decreased from four to three per hour, and a new "sounder package" will be offered.



INTER-URBAN BROADCASTING PRESIDENT

Hutchinson Addresses Minority Ownership Challenges

nter-Urban Broadcasting is a fivestation chain run by President and former National Assoc. of Black-**Owned Broadcasters** (NABOB) Chairman Jim Hutchinson. He talks with Urban Contemporary Editor Walt Love about the challenges facing minority radio owners, the bid to place more Procter & Gamble advertising on Black radio, and the game plan for the company's most recent acquisition. KATZ-AM & FM/St. Louis.

R&R: What are the current percentages for minority radio ownership?


JH: Radio has less than two percent black or minority ownership today, meaning there are less than 200 black-owned radio stations out of the 9000 or 10,000 radio stations in existence. When you're in a one-to-two percent ownership position, there's still a long way to go vis-a-vis the ethnic breakdown of America.

R&R: And the biggest obstacle facing minority owners?

JH: For black people it's financing. I haven't asked many Hispanic owners what their major problems are, but I would suspect they also would be moneyrelated.

The bottom line is that it's tough to get your first station regardless of what color you are, and it seems like it's tougher for minorities to find out about the opportunities which exist.

Generally, the best opportunities never become public but are communicated through informal relationships among broadcasters and the "old boy network." The best properties never hit the market.

R&R: As NABOB President, you urged Procter & Gamble to place more advertising on Black radio. How would you assess the results of the talks you had with the company?

JH: I think we had very constructive discussions with P&G, with significant achievements. One was the recognition we received, as opposed to them denying our existence. Just being able to articulate our concerns and our position to P&G's Vice Chairman was very important on a personal level. On a one-to-one basis, we were able to express our concerns - not only as they relate to broadcasting, but in terms of how we regarded black America's relationship with P&G.

The company has enjoyed about a \$1.5 billion a year relationship with black America, which represents in the area of 10% of its total sales. The fact that P&G communicated with its ad agency about instituting new goals for Black radio buys was very significant.

P&G is responding in terms of making a commitment which substantially increases its annual dollar outlay. We think we can look forward to the company spending some 10-20 times what they spent last year on Black radio. There's also the fact that they have assigned a former brand manager, **Buddy Tucker**, to a new position monitoring activities with black media in general.

During our meeting with the Vice Chairman, we also raised the issue of the company's serious lack of meaningful black representation in the ad agency community.

R&R: Why is it imperative for P&G to spend more ad dollars on black-owned radio stations, as opposed to any Urban stations with good numbers?

JH: Non-black UC station owners in many cases own other forms of media and can get advertising revenue through those media if they could not get them via the Urban station they own. At this time, blacks don't have the option of being that diversified.



The vast majority of black-owned stations are owner-managed, and we tend to provide one-on-one station involvement with the community. We are the ones who spend the money and time to positively affect organizations, both black and white, in our communities. Too often this aspect is overlooked. I think since P&G is the number one advertiser in the country, it can set a tone for corporate America to follow.

R&R: Now that you are no longer NABOB Chairman, how do you still plan to stay active nationally?

JH: My primary focus will be Inter-Urban Broadcasting, but I'm still on a number of boards in New Orleans. ing for new challenges, but I'm not retired.

R&R: Inter-Urban acquired KATZ-AM & FM/St. Louis last year. What game plan have you developed?

JH: We are pleased with our St. Louis stations. What we have developed over the past 18 months has been a track record with the community for service. With the recent addition of Earl Boston as KATZ-FM PD, we see greater movement in the future.

We do feel there have been some problems with Arbitron sampling of the black population within the St. Louis metro, which has negatively affected our stations. We've spoken to Arbitron about this; they have committed to being more watchful and will work toward correcting this situation.

R&R: What characteristics do you look for in a GM candidate?

JH: You have to look at the individual as well as the market in which the position is available. We try to promote from within whenever possible. Our current St. Louis GM, Charles Richardson, was promoted from our Louisville outlet (WJYL). Rod Burbridge, our GM in New Orleans (WYLD-AM & FM), was also promoted from Louisville. And Reginald Brown, GM in Cincinnati, was promoted from Inter-Urban's finance division.

R&R: With WYLD on the rebound, do you feel you're in a position to once again dominate the New Orleans market?

JH: You can't keep a good station down. Given our programming and community thrust, the station will always be near the top in the market, if not at the top.

WYLD had been number one for the past five out of the last six years, and I don't know many stations in major markets that can be number one consistently over that span of time. Based on the winter Arbitron, we're number two and there are over 20 signals. Finishing in the top ten is not bad, and we still maintain a very solid adult demo. We have never really gone after teens, as our competitor has done.

We recently received a letter from a Coca-Cola VP who wrote that although WYLD was not the number one station in the market, he believed it has captured the heart and soul of the city. I still feel we are New Orleans's radio station, and we work toward that every day.

R&R: It's rumored that WYLD is for sale.

JH: No. From time to time, if you have something that is attractive, you will always get offers. Given WYLD's track record in this decade, we do receive unsolicited offers. But WYLD will be moving into a new 18,000-square-foot home very soon and has dedicated itself to being a prime mover in the community.

R&R: Are there any plans to program other formats besides Urban Contemporary?

JH: Our strategy has been to work with Urban, because at this time that's what we do best. However, at some point we would like to develop another format based on market needs to get the experience of being on the other side of the fence. NEW FROM PAISLEY PARK!

The very close CHR derby broke apart somewhat during the spring. KSFM rebounded on both surveys and took the Birch market lead. Competitors KWOD and KROY rose in the Birch, but KWOD fell a couple in the ARB. Both AORs underwent PD changes during the book, KZAP PD Pat Still lightened up on the Classic Rock approach, while KRZQ PD Judy McNutt continued the station's youthful, metallic sound. NAC KOPT debuted notably.

Although KSFI is more often the Arbitron winner here, other stations, including KKAT, KRSP-FM, and KSL, will occasionally earn the opportunity to occupy the top spot. This time, KISN, which contemporized its music mix. led the market. The station conducted its usual spring bumper sticker campaign and read license numbers over the air. In the Birch, KKAT continued to lead the market. The usual flip-flop between KCPX, which also did a sticker campaign, and KRSP was instead decided by a second-place tie, with KSL just a nose behind.

KTFM remained stable but lost a notch in the ARB rankings, displaced by KCOR. The Spanish station's movement resembles a stock market chart: 5.6-9.7-4.9-8.4 in the last year. Formatleading Country outlet KCYY posted gains on both surveys, but its other competitors, with the exception of KAJA, kept pace.

KEEPING YOUR STATION TOP-OF-MIND

Winning Key: Effective Identity

The key to winning in Arbitron and Birch, as we discussed previously (R&R, 7/22), is to become a champion on the battleground of unaided recall. The key to creating that strong top-ofmind position for your station is by building station benchmarks — elements your station airs which a person can use to reconstruct listening to your station in either a diarykeeping or telephone recall situation. Literally anything that can help a listener remember listening can be so classified.

Most Common Examples

Following are some common examples of benchmarks.

• Station Format - Your format, if it's easy to describe, can be a benchmark. Country and News/ Talk are good examples. Oldies or Classic Hits are also readily describable by listeners. Adult Contemporary, on the other hand, is not a format for which listeners have a single description, and this is a problem for most ACs. They lack a single unifying term for the music that listeners can relate to

• Call Letters or Dial Position — Unless you have a blockbuster set of calls or a tremendous handle, listen-

ers will often confuse your calls or dial position with those of another station. The key to making the actual calls or dial position into benchmarks is their memorability, not necessarily how they roll off the tongue.

• Handles — Handles very often work well. "Magic," "Power," "Mix," and "Lite" are all essentially memorable. A key point, though, is to make sure you explain the handle to your listeners. None of the above – particularly "Magic" and "Power" – can stand alone as a music descriptor.

• **Personalities** – Even though listeners don't often

write down the names of personalities in diaries, they are very useful in helping a listener identify listening to a particular station. However, many DJs who have good overall name recognition fare poorly when it comes time for listeners to properly identify the station where those personalities work. That can create a miscredited identifier.

The solution? Give the call letters and dial position as often as possible. Market the jock *and* the calls. Realize that many ostensibly visible personalities are invisible with respect to how accurately they are linked to their stations.

• Promotions and Contests - Promotions and contests can be great top-ofmind items if they are handled correctly. Far too many broadcasters will stage a major contest or event and then fail to properly "backsell" it. The assumption is that listeners will intuitively link the event with the sponsoring station; unfortunately, that's not the case. If you want to create an event identity, you must consistently remind listeners of your station's role in the

event, establish a perception that the event is accessible, and hammer home the fact that your station is the only place where they can get such fare.

(If you don't think listeners get contests confused, just think back to the number of times your phone rang when your competitor was giving away a Porsche.)

• Features – Lots of stations are successfully creating program features that occur at predictable times; you could call these "time benchmarks." Morning zoos and other handles for shows can have a similar effect. Regular events like the "7:20 joke of the morning" or the 8:10 phone call from "Mr. President," when properly promoted, also have potential.

Battle For The Mind

If you were to ask listeners in a market to say the first thing that came to mind about soft rock market leader KAAA, the elements might look like this:

The ratings differences between these two stations are reflected in the intensity of their key elements and their overall awareness factors as reflected in the "don't know" score. Station KAAA has a 7.8 share 12+. Station KBBB has a 2.6. The bottom line: listeners' topof-mind awareness for KAAA is far better. They have a much higher likelihood of converting real KAAA listening into reported listening.

Remember, there's a distinct correlation between how much people can tell you about a station and its likelihood of having a large cume. One begets the other. And that's the real advantage to building benchmarks. Some stations have only one, others have five or six, but without them a station cannot sustain competitive numbers.

Investigating **Cover Activity**

You Can Judge A Cover By Looking At The Book

I might as well admit this right of f - I don't really know what the "deck" (secondary headline) above means either. But it sure sounded good at three in the morning. I think what I was driving at (al-

though I shouldn't be driving at anything at three in the morning except home) was that with the large number of cover versions currently out, looking at the "book" of past history helps place the new versions in some kind of

Some contemporary covers are predictable; others are surprising. Would you have tabbed a Queens rap group to dredge up a Monkees song? (Actually, "Mary Mary" has an odd history of its own, the Mike Nesmith composition having been cut in a brawny, bluesy style by the **Paul Butterfield Blues Band before** the Monkees had even emerged.) Or how about Belinda Carlisle venturing into the Cream catalog for their first UK hit?

Another unusual phenomenon is self-revivals, of which there are four at the moment, two of them recent Top 20 hits (the Contours' 1962 classic "Do You Love Me" and, stretching the definition a bit, Chubby Checker's participation on "The Twist" with his spiritual grandchildren the Fat Boys. The other ones, just out, are Deep Purple's new live "Hush," which they covered in 1968 for their first hit, from an original by Billy Joe Royal; and the radio-generated resuscitation of UB40's "Red Red Wine," originally a Neil Diamond track reggaeized in 1969 by Tony Tribe).

This type of revival is commonplace in England ("Reach Out" by the Four Tops is Top 10 there now; Eddie Cochran's "C'mon Everybody" was a recent Top 20 item), but rarely, Ben E. King's "Stand By Me" apart, happens here.

Pull Up The Covers

Running through other covers in the pop/R&B area, we've got an all-in-the-family revival of "When I Fall In Love" by Natalie Cole, notably cut by her late father and later a hit for the Lettermen and. last Christmas in the UK, Rick Ast-

ley (whose version battled it out with Nat King Cole's).

Johnny Mathis revives Little Anthony & The Imperials' Phase II hit from 1964, "I'm On The Outside Looking In" (Phase I for Anthony was his doowop hit string in the '50s). Times Two updated Simon & Garfunkel's 1970 frivolity "Cecelia," while David Drew has stormed the AOR chart with another 1970 hit, Sugarloaf's "Green-Eyed Lady."

Cheap Trick aims high by doing the King's thing, the 1956 Elvis Presley megamonster "Don't Be Cruel." This No. 1 has been thus far relatively impervious to successful vocal covers (an instrumental version by Bill Black's Combo hit Top 10 in 1960), even proving to be the Judds' only Top 10 miss since their first single (also an Elvis cover, 'Had A Dream (For The Heart)").

"He Ain't Heavy, He's My Brother" was big for the Hollies in 1970 (there's that year again) and is out in a new rambunctious version by Bill Medley. Livingston Taylor's first single in many years, "Lovin' Arms," is a song by the late Tom Jans introduced to the public by Dobie Gray as the follow-up to "Drift Away."

John Kilzer's "Green, Yellow & Red" is a cover of sorts - he wrote it, but Rosanne Cash's version made it to vinyl/tape/CD first on the "King's Record Shop" LP. Aswad's "Don't Turn Around" was a recent non-hit for veteran soul singer Luther Ingram. And the oddest cover around may just be the

Debbie & Divinyls Plunder The Garage

While I was rummaging around the masses of data R&R churns out, looking for covers, two very recent revivals on the CHR Activity Level caught my eye (since they were right next to each other). Debbie Harry's new single, "Liar Liar," brings back from the moribund the 1965 Castaways classic (who could forget that shrill finger-pointing falsetto chorus), while the Divinyls regender (and retitle "Hey Little Boy") the Syndicate Of Sound's 1966 snotrocker "Little Girl," with its ever-memorable sneering, dis-

missive peals of laughter.

If I'm waxing up my adjectives a little more enthusiastically than usual, there's an excuse. This stuff's my roots. I cherish virtually the entire spectrum of '60s pop/rock/ R&B, but there's a special quadrant in my anterior lobe for hits by the Standells, the Seeds, the Leaves, the Music Machine, the Shadows Of Knight, the Gants

. plus hundreds of local hits or nonhits by more obscure garage bands working the same vein of American R&B/rock & roll filtered through British Invasion rock and reinterpreted in snarling, petulant, fuzztoned freakouts --- the days of whine and neuroses, hope and "Gloria."

In a way, this brief flowering of garage rock (1964-67, more or less, with occasional throwbacks) is responsible for inflicting my

Covering The Country

Asleep At The Wheel, as befits their traditionalist leanings, re-vives "Walk On By," not the Dionne Warwick/Bacharach-David hit but the 1961 Leroy Van Dyke country chartbuster. Earl Thomas Conley & Emmylou Harris bring new life to Johnny Rodriguez 's 1978 hit "We Believe In Happy Endings."

The most unusual covers would probably be David Slater's Little River Band countrification, "The Other Guy," and Jo-El Sennier's "Tear-Stained Letter." This song was cut by its composer, UK folkrocker Richard Thompson (ex-husband of Linda Thompson, whose "Telling Me Lies" was a big hit last year for the Trio). Sonnier has an even more bizarre cover on his LP, a tune called "Baby Hold On," recorded by an extremely obscure L.A. duo called Stars In The Sky on a local label around 1974 and unheard anywhere since. Which once again goes to show contemporary country need take a back seat to no format when it comes to being adventurous

ormer ANIMAL CHAS CHANDLER, the man who discovered and managed JIMI HENDRIX, recently told us about the fourth JIMI HENDRIX EXPERIENCE album he's been working on. "I had all my tapes at Olympic Studios. Virgin was developing it (the studio), so they asked me to move it all. I found this Hendrix stuff that had almost slipped my mind. NOEL REDDING, MITCH MITCHELL, and I had a listen to it,

and liked what we heard." The material, all previously unreleased, includes a "terrific blues thing," said Chandler, titled "Taking Care Of No Business." The threesome have decided against tampering with the tapes or overdubbing. Don't expect the new LP for a while, however. "I haven't made any release arrangements yet," said Chandler. "It'll probably come out towards the end of the year."



The End Of An Era The legendary Marquee Club has moved from Wardour Street in the heart of London's Soho, where the club has existed for the past 24 years. The last gig there was on July 31, and the club now moves to a new venue, some five minutes' walk away on Charing Cross Road. The good news is that the place now has a capacity of 850 as opposed to 400. The bad news is we're saying goodbye to a building that played host to early career appearances by artists as diverse as the ROLL-ING STONES, WHO, DAVID BOWIE, PINK FLOYD, YES, MARILLION, and HOWARD JONES. The Marquee's owners have promised that the new venue will continue the club's no-frills policy – and, yes, that does mean warm beer in plastic glasses, even if the doubled capacity might mean an extra square inch or two of legroom.

BIG AUDIO DYNAMITE have now cancelled all their US dates, as well as the UK concerts they had rescheduled, due to MICK JONES's illness. The former CLASH man's chickenpox developed into pneumonia late last week, and he was admitted into intensive care at a London hospital. Fortunately, he is now improving slowly, but it's unlikely he'll be able to tour for several months.



This past Tuesday (8/9) saw the beginning of London newspaper the Daily Mail's serialization of ALBERT GOLDMAN's book, "The Lives Of JOHN LENNON," which will be published by Bantam Press in Britain on August 22. (The book

hits America in October, published by McGraw-Hill.) Goldman's tome, reportedly based on interviews with 1200 people and six years of research, is predictably

The Springsteen Strings

Remember those albums of **Beatles** songs performed by the **Hollyridge Strings** back in the '60s? Well, a similar thing is about to be done with **Bruce Springsteen**'s music, proving that the Boss has finally *really* hit the bigtime.

A pops interpretation of some of Springsteen's most famous songs entitled "The Springsteen Concerto" is scheduled to be released September 12. The album was recorded by pianist **John Bayless** and produced by **John McClure**, whose credits include stints with **John Williams**, **Henry Mancini**, and **Leonard Bernstein**. The 72-minute record kicks off with "Jungleland," then moves into three variations on "Rosalita," followed by "Sandy," "Candy's Room," "Hungry Heart," and "Born To Run." Side two is comprised of the "Born In The USA Suite," featuring songs from the LP juxtaposed with such traditional American songs as "Battle Hymn Of The Republic."

The most unusual aspect of the record is that it's being released through WEA by the owners of the same label that discovered such speed metal bands as Metallica and Anthrax. "The Springsteen Concerto" will be the first release on Megaforte, a subsidiary of Megaforce Records.

An Album Of Olympic Proportions

On August 30, **Arista Records** will release an album featuring some of today's hottest superstars to serve as the soundtrack to the 1988 Summer Olympic Games, which begin September 15 in Seoul, South Korea. Entitled "The 1988 Summer Olympics Album: One Moment In Time," the LP features a platinum lineup of artists from every musical genre performing new songs exclusively for the LP.

Arista has entered into an unprecedented agreement with NBC-TV to work together with the Olympics soundtrack. Arista will lend its marketing muscle to the project, along with some of the label's most successful artists, while NBC has committed to showcasing the music by weaving it into its 180 hours of Olympics programming, most of which occurs during prime time.

Artists on the LP include Whitney Houston performing the title track; John Williams performing an "Olympics Theme" instrumental; the Bee Gees performing their own "Shape Of Things To Come"; the Four Tops, "Indestructible"; Eric Carmen, "Reason To Believe"; and a band called the Bun Burys, featuring Eric Clapton on guitar and vocals, performing a song entitled "Fight (No Matter How Long)." Other artists include Taylor Dayne, Jennifer Holliday, Kashif, and a new band called Odds & Ends.

Cassettes Save The Single

While sales of seven-inch black vinyl singles have declined steadily during the last several years, the cassette single is presently being hailed for saving the two-song single from virtual extinction. Amazingly enough, however, recent surveys show that only 22.5% of active record buyers even know the cassette single exists.

To further the format's initial success, all the major labels now have joined to launch a massive promotional campaign aimed at spreading consumer awareness of this new type of single. Both the National Association of Recording Merchandisers (NARM) and the Recording Industry Association of America (RIAA) have entered the act as well, establishing a recent national merchandising display contest for retailers and wholesalers.

Says **Don lenner, Arista** Executive VP and GM: "All we need now is to increase consumer awareness and encourage retailers to do their best at merchandising cassette singles, and we will see this configuration break wide open in sales. And then we will literally have saved the hit single, which is so crucial to the continued breakthrough of new artists in our business."

Short Cuts

• And they thought **DYLAN** going electric was upsetting ... Despite the recent attacks on corporate sponsorships, such an arrangement has saved the historic Newport Folk Festival. Ben & Jerry's Homemade dessert parlors recently supplied funds not only to keep the festival afloat, but to broadcast it on the **American Public Radio** network. The only catch is the festival will now be called Ben & Jerry's Newport Folk Festival. The event takes place August 20-21, with numerous acts including LOS LOBOS, **ROBERT CRAY, RICHARD THOMPSON**, and DOC WATSON taking part.

• Speaking of "folk" artists, **BOB DYLAN** is getting *rave* reviews on his current tour, which critics are calling his best shows since the 1974 Zimmy/**Band** reunion. Featuring **G.E. Smith** of "Saturday Night Live" fame on lead guitar, **Kenny Aaronson** on bass, and **Christopher Parker** on drums, the band learned a repertoire of more than 60 songs for the tour. The show changes night to night, with fiery versions of songs ranging from "Subterranean Homesick Blues" to "Silvio" from his new "Down In The Grooves" LP. LP.



And now there is Lizard Man, a presumed cousin of Bigfoot, compelling major chunks of air time and ink in the South. During the past six weeks or so, the swampdwelling ogre has become a hot phenom by virtue of leaping out from behind cypress trees to chase hapless folks around — after midnight, when there are no witnesses. Big news!

News? Well, the question of whether Lizard Man should be treated as a serious news item has separated journalists into two opposing camps, since 17-year-old Chris Davis of Browntown, SC dutifully reported to Sheriff Liston Truesdale that a red-eyed, hairy giant chased him out of Scape Ore swamp.

On one side, true blue newsmen tend to keep the creature at arm's length, either declining to carry the item as legitimate news or, at the very least, using a whole passel of allegedlys and reportedlys.

Some anchors, however, swept up in the fun of it all, have unwittingly lapsed into tabloid mode, emphasizing the colorful aspects T-shirt sales are booming. Naturally, there's a novelty song. Sheriff Truesdale confirms that "traffic is pretty much bumper-to-bumper" on Browntown Road, which crosses the swamp.

With that kind of high-interest story, we newspeople must remember that with every deadline, we're making a choice between sensationalism and respectable journalism. The choice we make lives on long after the specific story dies.

Fun's fun, but tabloidizers are likely to discover, not far down the line, that quick glitz generates a jolt of response, but only at risk to a news department's longterm credibility.

Believability is the hard currency of the news profession. I respectfully point out that when we eventually meet that Great Newsman in the sky, we'll have to explain why we sometimes failed to balance our stories. "I forgot" probably won't hack it.

Tussle In Tulsa

Tulsa, like other oil-producing cities, is coping with a weakened economy. However, one thing that isn't weak is the CHR rivalry between longtime leader KAYI (KAY107) and relative newcomer KMYZ (Z104.5) - it's heating up into a strong battle.

The spring Arbitron brought good news for both stations. KAY107 rose 10.1-10.4, while Z104.5 jumped 5.7-6.1. And from the way both programmers talk, this battle promises to pack more excitement than a just-tapped gusher.

Although he's a new arrival in town, KAY107 PD Steve Stucker grew up in Omaha and understands the "Midwest mindset." "No great surprises here," he said. "The Midwest mentality of family and conservative thinking is quite prevalent, but as the economy gets stronger so does everyone's adventurous spirit."

He joined KAY107 in March after a five-year stint at KNMQ/Albuquerque (which he put on the air), so Stucker is quite familiar with Urban product. "When I came here KAY107 was playing too much of it, but we're working with (Burkhart/ Douglas & Assoc. President) Dwight Douglas and have thinned out that image to bring us more to the middle ground. KAY107 is still the leader in adding that type of product, however, while KMYZ is the leader in adding rock crosso-

vers. Still, with the help of (MD) Duncan Payton, I've eaten into their arena by being faster on rock records than KAY107 used to be. This was a pretty soft station before I got here."

Sometimes KMYZ out-musics us because they have a lighter spot load, but so far they haven't put up a challenge to our music promise. We also claim to play "The Best New Music First'; we like to get exclusives and pound the hell out of them for a few days.

"We launched a contest called \$7000 Thursdays," which aired for seven weeks. The prize was awarded by listening for a designated song at 7am, and later in the day the 107th caller would win. So far we've handed out over \$84,000 in cash since I got here."

KAY107 also grabbed a lot of attention when Stucker brought in morning man Jim Marbles. "We

call him 'Marbles In The Morning,' and he was my morning man at KNMQ. We kicked him off with the 'I need a job' billboard campaign. He pretended to be an out-of-work PR/advertising executive from Illinois who loved Tulsa and wanted to settle down. We even housed him in a mobile home with Illinois tags to complete the image. He told everyone since advertising was his business, a billboard would be more effective than a classified ad.

"The whole city bought the story. The three top morning shows (AC KRMG, KMOD, and AC KRAV) each gave him live interviews. In addition he received a lot of TV coverage.

"When everyone found out, no one was upset except KRMG morning man John Ehrling, who's been on top for years. We wrapped up the stunt with a marching band and small parade. Jim's done remarkably well in a short period of time. He and the station are number one in 18-34 females, while KMYZ is fourth."

Balanced Promotions



KMYZ Flips To CHR KMYZ PD Mel Meyers has 12 years of experience in the Tulsa market, including PD duties at former CHR KELI and a Production Director stint at KMOD. He

joined Z104.5 as Asst. PD to then-PDBrent Alberts, who took the station from Classic Rock to CHR. "I know this market and so does my staff," said Meyers. "In fact we've got a lot of KAY107's key people over here now. Their GM, Rick Cohn, is now ours. We also grabbed GSM Jerry Gerson, Promotion Director D.C. Roberts, and

the number one sales rep in the market, Lee Hubby. In addition,

my Asst. PD Dave Michaels was over at KRAV for 12 years. So we have a committee of people who know the market intimately."

When it comes to promotions, established ratings winner KAY107 is outgunning Z104.5 in cash. But that doesn't faze Meyers. Pointing to the oil-dependent economy, he said, "Sales have been soft, but things are getting better. We go for the smaller prize and more winners, which seems to be working rather nicely. We're trying to convey that we play the music for Tulsa and that this is the place where people have more of a chance to win."

KMYZ's main promotional effort is the "Song Of The Day," which airs at 7:15am and is worth \$104-\$1004. "We're more specific about which hour it will be played in than they are at KAY107. We feel this will encourage more folks to tune back in, versus keeping them on the edges of their seats for a whole day. After all, who has time to do that?"

To make up the difference for the lack of giveaway cash, Meyers said his promotion staff has been working overtime to steal some longtime events from KAY107, including a lot of movie premieres.

"We've got a bumper sticker campaign going right now. We send spotters to write down tag numbers, then we call them out onair and wait 15 minutes for a winner. This is backed up by twiceweekly 'sticker parties,' one in

Tulsa and one in the suburbs. This allows us to meet folks in-person and lets them feel they've got a better shot at hearing their numbers."

Meyers has also updated his onair positioning statements. "Our slogans right now are 'Stick With The Z And Win' and 'Tulsa's Fastest-Growing Station.' It's true; we haven't had a down book since the format change in either the 12+ or 18-34 categories. We're still number two in teens, but as our excitement and momentum increase that will take care of itself. I want Z104.5 to be the all-around family station."

If a typical listener were satisfied with KAY107, what would make him switch to Z104.5? "It's the music," Meyers said. "We know the music for Tulsa and have an excellent callout program in

We play a few oldies in middays for in-office listening, but the rest of the day is 80%-90% current.

"I'm not tied down with improper input from a consultant," he added, taking a shot at KAY107's situation. "As a result, we hang back on the Urban stuff until local research proves it right or wrong. We're earlier on the rockers. I'm more comfortable playing stuff for the heartland listeners. We balance the music so that if we play something too adult then we play something more mass appeal next."

Meyers also does mornings, with D.C. Roberts handling the news. "When Marbles came to town, I smelled a fish over that billboard stunt and I was right," he recalled. "He's good and has made some noise in town, but so have I - and I plan to make a lot more soon. We have something big coming for the fall.

"Our biggest advantage is knowing the community and being more active in it than anyone. We pride ourselves on being able to field calls on our toll-free lines and tell anyone who calls the information they need.

"It would be nice to have the cash to throw around. However, being consistent and in touch will serve us better in the long run," Meyers reasoned. "Going on the air and blowing out \$100,000 may grab listeners for a while, but what do you do when the money goes away?"



Radiothons: Commitment **To Public Service**

Rock radio's public service commitment seems as if it's never been greater. Station press releases describing a veritable cornucopia of charitable activities arrive on my desk daily. Among these, one money-raising event is becoming increasingly popular: the radiothon.

KSJO Helps Homeless


KSJO/San Jose recently completed its second annual radiothon, raising \$14,000 for the city's homeless. Originally scheduled for six hours, it was ultimately extended to nine to better accommodate listener interest.

This is the number one charita ble thing you can do," raves PD Ken Anthony. "In the race for ratings and success, it's easy to lose track of a radio station's responsibility to the public. The listeners really respond. It's quite an exciting day."

A radiothon can be an excellent time-spent-listening promotion people listen all day, including many who normally wouldn't do so. And this type of charitable endeavor also generates all-important press coverage, especially if celebrities are involved.

Actually, KSJO holds a combination radiothon/auction. While playing requests - in exchange for donations - is the primary method of securing pledges, Anthony says having intriguing items and services to bestow upon the highest bidder enhances the event. One of the more popular "items" was the opportunity to "buy" morning mavens Perry Stone & Trish Bell as "radio slaves" for a day. Two listeners paid a total of \$1200 for that privilege.

The station hooked up with Acts Contributing To Solutions (ACTS), a local organization that aids the homeless. To publicize the event, unemployed and previously homeless individuals took to the streets wearing KSJO sandwich boards and handing out flyers

• Keep your morning team on all day. Emphasize that your morning personalities are going to be on the air for several hours; promote the entire event around them.

• Secure as many big-name guests as possible. Let the media know about them. Make sure you tell press people exactly when the stars are going to be at the station. • Make sure you're well-staffed.

Arrange for extra phones and volunteers to man them.

• Have a computer whiz write a pecific program for the project. That way you can immediately input and use the information you'll be receiving from callers: name, age, address, amount. After a volunteer fills out a pledge form unless, of course, you can provide each volunteer with a terminal the data should be entered into the computer as soon as possible. That way you not only have an up-to-theminute money total, but you know how many calls you've received and where the dollars are coming from. This info can be printed out and given to the jocks.

Then "you can go on the air and say, 'Hey, we haven't received a call from Modesto,"' Anthony explains. "Or, 'We've got \$1000 from Sai

WIXV's Flying Fourth

Last year, with promotion on his mind, WIXV/Savannah AE Mark Weisner was thumbing through the "Guinness Book Of World Records." One particular entry caught his eye: the largest number of flying discs (frisbees) tossed at the same time, in the same place, was 1600.

On July 4 that record fell. The new mark - subject to verification by the people who do that sort of thing - was established at a WIXV holiday bash. Some 2200 people participated in the toss, which was part of a free outdoor party that also featured five bands, including John Kilzer and Drivin' & Cryin'.

In all, 3800 listeners flocked to the Hilton Head Inn for the full day of entertainment. Those who registered for the toss received a certificate entitling them to a disc, which could be personalized with a peeloff sticker provided by the station. (Many did just that, although a ge number simply fired their

ics as far as they could and left em up for grabs.) **More Security Needed**

PD Virgil Thompson provides e promotional specifics, iniding recommendations on what 'd do differently next time:

Seagram's was the banner sponr and paid for the discs. Three cal bands played for free, in addiin to Kilzer and Drivin' & Crvin'. KV made arrangements with the cord companies involved (Geffen cords and Island Records, spectively), so the station didn't ive to shell out any money for the tertainment

The hotel provided the security id paid for the sound. Thompson ivs both served their purposes, but could have been better. "We needed more security right around where the bands were playing. It got real wild there for a while; people were all over the place. Toward the end of the afternoon they were getting real rowdy. You can imagine what the crowd was like on the Fourth of July, after a full day of drinking.

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As for the sound system, Thompson says it wasn't quite big enough, despite the fact the bands dealt directly with the sound company. The station also traded for several large tents, which was essential to keep costs down. (If you've ever

priced tents, you know what he's talking about.) Overall, eight or nine sponsors were involved in the event, saving 'IXV tons of money.

Cost Virtually Nothing

Of course, several sponsors meant the station was saddled with a host of on-air mentions - at least twice a shift initially and significantly more in the days leading up to the party.



\$7,400 for AI. In 1989, WBCN's sister station in Los Angeles, KROQ, will also produce a calendar and donate the proceeds to AI.

Lorraine Rapp, program director at WAQX in Syracuse is a member of Amnesty International and a strong advocate of the organization's objectives. Recently, Rapp coordinated a promotion for the station



centered around the October '87 U2 concert. U2 had approved AI information tables and declaration signings at all venues on their U.S. tour and Rapp took full advantage.

In advance of the concert, the station ran 30-second PSAs promoting the U2 concert sign-ups with all jocks ending each announcement with "Stop the Silence" followed by a dramatic pause. Also, the station's public



affairs program interviewed local AI representatives. At the concert, WAQX displayed huge custom posters in the Carrier Dome lobby and station jocks staffed AI information tables.

Rapp's AI chapter was instrumental in obtaining the release of a prisoner of conscience in Thailand in 1987 who had been imprisoned for criticizing the Thai Royal Family.

"You must keep your eyes open to help other people," said Rapp. "Radio can accomplish a lot. To live and not think you can effect a positive change is awful. There are so many violations in the world, if people would listen, they would be outraged. Radio can take advantage of the positive influence it has on its audience and work to promote change."

keep playing the requests as long as it's feasible.

WXRK: A Real PAL Another rocker that recently raised money was WXRK/New York. Its 12-hour "K-ROCK/Police Athletic League Radiothon" netted a whopping \$61,000 for PAL, the city's largest nonprofit youth organization.

Donations solicited on-air totalled \$30,500, which was matched by CBS Records CEO Walter Yetnikoff and Triangle Industries CEO Nelson Peltz. Yetnikoff and Peltz made the surprise announcement during an on-air interview with PM driver Meg Griffin.

Among the hot auction items was one of Howard Stern's famed wake-up calls, which a New Jersey man named Fuzzy bought for \$1100. The station also auctioned various features such as the "K-ROCK Cafe" and the "Ultimate Album Side."

Rather than requests, the main lure for pledges was a commemorative T-shirt; anyone who donated at least \$25 received one. Promotion Director Sharon Rosenbush estimates 80% of the pledges were for \$25 or more.

Rosenbush agrees with Anthony that special guests are an important part of the radiothon. Not only do the right guests provide entertainment, they can generate more money. "Phil Rizzuto was particulary poignant – he was a PAL kid himself. And there was a direct correlation between Phil's interview and the amount of money that came in," Rosenbush says.

WWCK: "We Played Anything"

WWCK/Flint's second annual radiothon – anchored by morning men Sean McNeil and Tom Easton – was a 12-hour event that raised \$5000 for the Vietnam Veterans Of America. This was a request-driven affair appropriately referred to

Since 'IXV — like many smaller market stations — doesn't have a promotion director, the bulk of the preparation was left to Thompson and Weisner. "If I could do one thing differently, I would delegate more responsibilities to the staff," Thompson says. "It seemed that Mark and I ended up organizing every last detail."

The hard work paid off handsomely, though. Despite the minor sound and security shortcomings, the event was a memorable one for the listeners. The disc toss provided welcome publicity. Best of all, the entire affair – aside from incidental expenses like backstage passes – cost 'IXV virtually nothing.

Ah, the wonders of trade.

as "All-Request Thursday."

Two levels of pledges were established. Individuals had to pledge a minimum of \$5; the minimum for business/corporate pledges was \$100.

But wait, there's more. What made this radiothon special was the station's willingness to play any song it could get its hands on, no matter how bizarre or out-of-format. The more ridiculous the request, the more money had to be donated. Individuals who wanted to hear out-of-format songs were required to pay \$20. Those requests labelled "outrageous" necessitated a pledge of at least \$50.

Want an example of what constituted an "outrageous" request? How about the Royal Scots Dragoon Guards playing "Amezing Grace," replete with bagpipes? Some of the decidedly non-AOR artists heard that day were Prince, Frank Sinatra, and the Oak Ridge Boys.

Boys. "We played *anything*," says Promotion Director Lecia Macryn. "We even played some old country song our GSM Ray Nelson recorded one night after having a few beers. His friends brought it in and paid \$50 to air it."



Major Market Spring Results

As the results of the spring sweep pour in, it's time once again to check out the stories behind the numbers. This week, the focus is on two of the more disparate areas of the US for country: the Northeast and the Texas cities of Dallas and Houston.

All trends listed are for winter '88, then spring '88; 12+ Arbitron shares are listed first, followed by Birch numbers in parentheses. The 25-54 market rankings are based on 25-54 ARB shares and are shown for winter '88 and spring '88.



The spring also yielded its second best 25-54 showing, vaulting WBOS five places into the top ten. The station changed direction late last year, moving to a modern-oriented sound. It looks as if the move has paid off in this, its second book since the change.

• Off a half share 12+, WYNY was off about the same amount 25-54, though remaining top ten in the target demo. Said PD Michael O'Malley, "It was disappointing to drop 3.0-2.5. But there were a number of positives, including improved male cume in morning drive, and cume and TSL increases in key demos. We were off less than 10% 25-54; improved 35-64, and were barely off in cume, which is still over a million."

Describing the station's evolution since signing on Country just a year ago (July 1), O'Malley added, "We were very cautious. As time progressed, we didn't want to compromise the original 'more music' promise and were afraid that adding additional elements too soon might blur the station's message. Lately we've moved into the third stage, with a more aggressive presentation and additional production elements to make it a more complete, fun-sounding station. Plus we're going outside of the studio to be more active (i.e., live AM drive 'casts from Fan Fair).

Westwood One's purchase of NYC's only Country outlet should be complete in early fall. As is usual in times of transfer, the outside promotional activites are relatively quiet, though O'Malley said, "Our media campaign for late '88 and and all of '89 is laid out. We're ready to go."

• Don't let the slight 12+ downtick fool you: WXTU is extremely healthy. After years of numbers in

the solid threes, the station has posted its third four in the last four books. And it tied its best-ever 25-54 figure (in the mid-fives).

• Easily the spring's biggest story, WMZQ's 7.0 makes it numero uno in Washington. For a Country outlet to attain such a feat is amazing. Further indicative of its strength: Presidential candidate George Bush declared in USA Today (7/28) that WMZQ was his station of choice. More on WMZQ's accomplishment in a couple of weeks, when the focus will be on spring's 12+ winners.

KSCS posted its best book since spring '84. But it didn't come cheaply; the station laid out a ton of cash, with healthy doses spent on TV ads and billboards. This gave it a running start on the mid-July arrival of former KPLX morning man Terry Dorsey, on whom KSCS is betting to take it to the next plateau.

During the spring sweep, 'SCS ran its "free money artist of the day" promotion, good for more than \$1000 a day, seven days a week, from March 1 through mid-June. The right caller, when hearing the artist, netted \$96, but hearing a particular song by that artist resulted in a cool grand. Each day there was a minimum of one \$1000 prize and two \$96 prizes.

In preparation for Dorsey's arrival (contractually, the station wasn't allowed to promote him until July 1), KSCS ran a variety of "teasers," including "switch parties," held at local nightspots; a weekly "household report," in which Dorsey's wife Logan described events that occurred in the Dorsey home; a taped promo by his son Bo Bo, inviting listeners to KSCS's Family Day; billboards; and the Film House-produced "Music Machine" TV spot. (The Friday prior to Dorsey's first airshift, his wife did the entire morning show.)

Meanwhile, over at KPLX – which has led this battle the last three years – the new morning team of Harmon & Evans has had a couple months to settle in. They've been promotionally active, most recently sitting in every seat in Texas Stadium as part of a charity event. KPLX is a heavy TV user, continuing its unique "Flex Your Plex" campaign using country stars as spokespeople.

On the Cap Cities/ABC side of the ledger, WBAP had what has become a perennial spring surge into the sixes, no doubt partially on

the strength of its Texas Rangers broadcasts. And, amidst the muchheralded battle between FM morning shows, the WBAP team of Hal & Jay ranks second in the market (12+), with KPLX and KSCS running fifth and sixth respectively.

KILT-FM came in fourth with its best 12+ book since last spring. The race is much closer 25-54, with KIKK-FM leading KILT-FM by four-tenths.

KILT-FM PD Rick Candea is very excited by his station's progress and will surely fan the extremely competitive flames with his assertion that "the only thing the competition has going for it is its call letters. We have a better morning team and a better afternoon show, which shows in the numbers. We're just now getting to the point where we're able to overcome their call letter legacy and get the credit that's due us.

"They've gotten a lot of credit in the past which should have gone to us — just because people say 'KIKK' since they're so used to it. It's been a building process which is just starting to pay off."

Amid all the hubbub over the "morning zoo" shows in this market, KILT-AM & FM and KIKK-AM & FM are one-two, 12+, with only three-tenths separating KILT's top team of Hudson & Harrigan from KIKK second placers Charlie O'Neal & Pam Ivey. (Both sides simulcast their morning shows; FM vs. FM, KIKK leads KILT by four-tenths.)

However, Candea quickly noted, "25-54, we're number one in morning and afternoon drive." KILT-AM & FM lead KIKK-AM & FM by 2.3 shares.

KIKK-AM & FM OM Jim Robertson countered. "Country owns the morning numbers in this town with more than 19 25-54 shares (this sweep). Looking back over the last few books, sometimes we beat them, sometimes they beat us. We both have good morning shows. But I don't see a trend there that concerns me."

Robertson credits much of KIKK's gains — including a cume increase of almost 60,000 — to "marketing consistency. We've

been doing the same type of campaigns since late last summer. The repetition is important for building an audience. We're being consistent and methodical about what people see in our station."

Both outlets used heavy TV. KIKK continued its "Most music allowed by law" (Film House), while KILT used the "Sister" spots done by Nova Productions.

Rochester

WBEE is third 12+ and first 25-54, piling almost six shares on top of the last book's 25-54 number. All this for a station that signed on April 2, 1987.

PD Tony Kidd, fast becoming one of America's hottest young programmers, pointed to a number of areas which were "shored up" in recent months and which contributed to the huge increases.

"We became more market-focused," he said. "Our announcers were out more than ever shaking hands. On-air talk centered more on what people were talking about, and oon telling our life group about things they could get involved with."

Kidd said WBEE also changed its music. "We went away from the AC-based stuff and played more new traditional," he said. Kidd's oldie/current ratio is 65/35, with weekends more current-oriented.

WBEE used "opportunistic" TV spots and "did a lot of billboards," Kidd said. "This becomes a very mobile market when the weather turns nice." The station also gave away a \$30,000 mini-motor home, registering listeners wherever staffers made appearances. Those hearing their names on the air and calling in the specified time won \$92 and a shot at the grand prize.

REPRISE, RCA ISSUE SINGLES

A Double Dose Of Rogers

A couple of weeks ago programmers received Kenny Rogers's new Reprise single, "When You Put Your Heart In It." But wait a minute. Many of them have already received another Rogers single, RCA's "I Don't Call Him Daddy." Confused? Read on.

Even though Rogers joined the WB/Reprise family earlier this year, RCA still planned to release another single from Rogers's last LP, "I Prefer The Moonlight." (The song will also be on Rogers's soon-to-be-released Greatest Hits LP). In an effort to avoid any conflict between the two singles, RCA called Rogers's Nashville headquarters and was told the Reprise single would ship in October. So RCA set its release for the end of July

However, Reprise's tentative release date was moved up when the US Olympic gymnastics team chose the tune as its official theme song. As WB Sr. VP/Promotion Nick Hunter points out, "Had we waited until October to release the single, the Olympic Games would be over." And Reprise wouldn't

have realized the full benefit of the increased visibility

By the time RCA found out about the date change, "I Don't Call Him Daddy" had already been mailed. Phone calls between the two labels confirmed the misunderstanding wasn't an attempt to "step on any toes." Summing up the unfortunate situation's eventual outcome, Hunter deadpanned, "It's the joy of victory and the agony of defeat."

The July '88 Redbook contains a first-person account of the death of Timmy Rabbitt, the young son of singer Eddie and wife Janine. Rabbitt talks about the trauma, heartache, and the decision to put his career on hold: "My wife, daughter, and son needed me, so music had


Drake is survived by his wife Rose, mother Nora Blevins, eight children, and 13 grandchildren.

AC Radio: Looking Healthy

In many ways, the second annual Adult Radio Conference presented by Coast Seminars July 29 and 30 in Newport Beach was a rerun of the event's Monterey debut last year. Attendees were enthusiastic, eager to learn, and eager to share - but the number of registrants was painfully low (about 25). However, those present seemed to relish the intimate, friendly setting.

IN THE MAILBAG

'Extending Playlists Isn't The Answer'

The following excerpts from a letter sent in by KELT/ McAllen, TX OM Tad Griffin may launch some heated dialogue on playlists. Your opinions are encouraged and welcomed.

'Radio stations aren't going to play every new record - or even as many as the record companies think we should. Record companies will continue to kick out what they think is the correct amount of new music by new artists. Radio thinks it is way too much.

"We're being asked to lead people and manage business under very different conditions than in past years. Extending playlists isn't the answer. That's like shortening the football field by ten yards; even if there is more scoring, the points will be worth less simply because it'll take more points to win.

"When the conversation gets down to why we're playing the new Hall & Oates, Bruce Hornsby, or Rick Astley, as opposed to a new act with (or without) a chart position, my patience grows short. Last year. Hornsby was a new artist. Know what? My listeners still consider him a new artist. Same goes for Rick Astley. My listeners still expect us to play the latest su-

perstars. Even superstars have good records!

"Radio stations will always be out to get more ratings. Record companies will always be out to sell more records. Until we change the goals of free enterprise and the 'American Dream' of ownership, we're going to be doing that voodoo we all do so well!"
