'93 Radio Revenue Gains **Continue Through March**

Radio revenues continued their rapid climb during March. Of the 71 markets surveyed by CPAs Miller, Kaplan, Arase & Co., 86% reported increases.

From March '92 to March '93. 87% showed a rise in local revenues and 69% were up in national revenues. March marked the sixth consecutive month of local business increases and

third straight up month for national.

In standard broadcast March 1993's four weeks, eight of the 71 markets surpassed figures from 1992's five-week standard broadcast March. The percentage of markets showing increases in total radio revenues is the greatest so far this dec--George Nadel Rivin, CPA

News Not A Fiscal Burden But Staffing Down Anyway

RTNDA survey says 90% of newsrooms broke even; big markets feel biggest pinch

Nearly 90% of radio news operations were generating a profit or breaking even in mid-1992, according to a recently released RTNDA survey. However, the report notes that stations continued to cut their news staffs last year.

Almost half (44%) of radio respondents to RTNDA's June 1992 survey said their news operations were making money; another 41% said news was breaking even. Just 14% of the respondents said their news departments were losing money.

Those figures are essentially unchanged from the previous year, when 43% of respondents were turning a profit, 46% were coming out even, and 11% were suffering losses.

Newsrooms with three or more fulltime staffers reported the best financial performance: 66% said they were making money. FM stand-alones and stations with no more than one

fulltime newshound had the lowest instance of news profitability, both at 41%.

Shrinking Staffs

Despite those positive financial performances, the radio news workforce saw continued reductions in 1992. Overall, 22% of respondents' newsrooms reported staff reductions, either through layoffs (13%) or failure to replace departing staffers. Major market stations and those located in the East.had the highest rates of staff reductions, both at 33%.

Based on the survey data, RTNDA estimates total radio news employment in mid-1992 was down 8% from the same period one year earlier.

The RTNDA news profitability and employment survey is based on data from 343 radio news operations. It was con-ducted by University of Missouri Professor Emeritus Vernon Stone.

Arbitron: Diary Deals Merit 'Death Penalty'

KWAC delisted, sued for on-air solicitations

Arbitron is throwing the gauntlet at Spanish-language KWAC/Bakersfield. The ratings company has filed a \$50,000 suit against the station and delisted it from the Winter '93 ratings book after determining that station personnel obtained and returned listening diaries through illicit means.

Delistings – Arbitron's most severe punishment for ratings distortion – are rare. The last station to have suffered the socalled "death penalty" was KELI/Tulsa in 1986. In addition to monetary damages, Arbitron is also asking a federal court to prevent KWAC staff from trafficking any more diaries.

According to Arbitron VP/ Communications Thomas Mocarsky, a competing station called Arbitron to report that KWAC had broadcast requests for people who "received cash in the mail" to call the station.

Arbitron hired a private investigator, who called the station February 1 to say that he was in possession of some diaries. The next day, the investigator met with a station representative, who received two blank diaries in return for a \$25 restaurant coupon and "offers of other compensation."

Mocarsky would not identify the person who the investigator dealt with, nor would he specify

what other compensation that person offered. He said Arbitron received the two diaries shortly after their February 5 postmarks.



Analysts High On Evergreen Offering

Evergreen Media Corporation's first public stock offering should find smooth sailing on Wall Street, according to analysts who've examined the deal.

Evergreen recently filed to sell up to \$64 million in stock to the public (R&R 4/2). Evergreen's foray onto Wall Street follows recent stock offering successes by Infinity Broadcasting and Saga Communications.

"Evergreen is 'Son of Infinity," quipped Paul Kagan Associates VP/Broadcast Bishop Cheen, who also noted that the financial markets tend to like sequels. That's particularly true when the original feature was as successful as Infinity, whose stock has lately been trading at double last year's offering price.

At an anticipated offering price of \$15 per share, Cheen said Evergreen would be selling its stock for $9\frac{1}{2}$ times cash flow – a bit less than Infinity (about 10 times), but richer than Saga (nine). Saga is a much smaller company with all of its stations in medium markets.

But Evergreen, like Infinity, is a major market radio group.

Cheen said Evergreen's track record of growth should make the stock attractive to investors. He noted that the company's revenues grew from \$41 million in 1989 to \$116 million in 1992, and that Wall Street will be expecting continued strong growth in revenues and cash flow. "When [the market] pays 91/2 times, it's looking for double-digit cash flow growth,' Cheen said.

One negative Cheen found in the offering was Evergreen's statement that first quarter cash flow would be off for its Chicago and Los Angeles stations. He said that could be offset somewhat by stronger cash flow in Washington and San Francisco.

Timing Perfect

Star Media Group Managing Partner Bill Steding also said that Evergreen has positioned itself for dramatic growth in both revenues

Satellite DAB Applicants Attacked By Broadcasters

Four applicants for nationwide satellite DAB licenses came under attack at the FCC by broadcasters fearful of being driven out of business by new competitors. But the four were also blasted by original satellite DAB applicant Satellite CD Radio and, in some cases, by each other.

A group of 19 broadcasters, including Shamrock Broadcasting and Franklin Communications Partners, said it was premature for the FCC to do anything other than dismiss the applications until the Commission resolves "critical issues" about the proposed service. In particular, the broadcasters said the FCC needs to explore the "issue of undue concentration of media ownership raised by the proposed common control of multiple stations with national reach."

Contrary to claims by satellite DAB applicants that they would provide expanded service to underserved rural areas, the broadcasters said the impact would be just the opposite. "[Small market stations] likely will be devastated by new services that are projected to triple or quadruple the number of channels available in an area," the coalition of licensees told the FCC.

'Resist Temptation'

"The Commission should resist the temptation to let loose new service proposals before it considers



the big and future picture," said the NAB. The trade group reiterated its position that no satellite DAB applications should be considered until the FCC charts a course for terrestrial DAB and decides whether it is in the public interest to devote any spectrum to satellite service. NAB urged the Commission to deny all of the applications.

Satellite CD Radio, which has said its satellite DAB proposal will leave spectrum space for up to three competitors, found reasons to urge the FCC to deny all four of the new applications.

It accused American Mobile Radio Corporation of being a "stalking horse" for its co-owned sister, American Mobile Satellite Corporation. AMSC, which SCDR referred to as "the insatiable spectrumeater," holds the U.S. monopoly license to provide mobile satellite services, primarily mobile telephone service outside cellular markets.

SCDR charged that the proposals by AMRC and Primosphere L.P. were wasteful in their spectrum use. And it claimed that applications by Sky-Highway Radio and Digital Satellite Broadcasting Corp. should be denied because neither application articulated a "concrete satellite proposal." AMRC also got in some licks at other applicants, claiming there were technical deficiencies in the Primosphere and Sky-Highway proposals.

National Public Radio, which has been a promoter of satellite DAB as a way to expand NPR's rural coverage, filed a petition to deny all four applications, citing "lack of concern" for public radio's needs. NPR wants the FCC to set aside 25% of satellite DAB spectrum for public radio.

Peeking In Partech's Pocketbook

artech Holdings Corporation is well on its way to acquiring a string of Southeastern radio stations. But a recent **SEC** filing by the publicly traded computer leasing company shows it's not putting much cash down for the stations — and even that money is borrowed.

Partech bought **WDZD/Shallotte**, **NC** for \$260,000 cash and \$202,000 in seller paper and 49% of **WKKB (FM CP)/Key Colony Beach**, **FL** for \$20,000, but estimates it will have to spend an additional \$150,000 to build that station. It's buying **WGMX/Marathon**, **FL** for \$20,000 cash and \$180,000 in seller paper. In addition, Partech said it has a deal pending to buy an unnamed Tallahassee combo for \$50,000 cash and \$225,000 in seller paper.

Partech's SEC filing said it borrowed \$625,000 on March 8 to close the WDZD purchase and fund other operations and acquisitions. To get the loan from **Funder's Trust 1992-A** — identified as a short-term business lender of which Partech CEO **John Rayl** is a trustee — Partech incurred fees and interest totaling \$125,000. And if the loan isn't repaid by May 7, a 30-day extension will cost \$62,500. Rayl didn't return **R&R's** calls.

The collateral for the loan is the stock of Partech's radio group subsidiary, **Partech Communications Group.** According to the SEC filing: "In the event the loan is not timely repaid, the lender may foreclose upon the collateral and the company could potentially lose its ownership interest in [the subsidiary], which includes all radio stations previously described herein."

Marshall To Exit FCC For L.A.

ame-duck FCC Commissioner Sherrie Marshall has announced plans to step down on April 30. She plans to open a Los Angeles-based consulting firm.

The commish, whose term officially expired last June, told **R&R** the **Marshall Company** will provide policy guidance and acquisition advice to cable companies and other firms looking to cash in on new video technologies. She will also serve as consultant to **Ziffren, Brittenham & Branca**, an L.A. entertainment law firm. A Republican appointed by **George Bush** in 1989, Marshall was never particularly visible on radio issues.

Among those who have been mentioned recently as possible replacements for Marshall: Senate staffer **Regina Keeney**, Maine television executive **Bruce McGorrill**, and **Federal Elections Commission** official **Frances Hughes Glendening**.

Also at the FCC:

• The agency said it is difficult to estimate what impact proposed stricter RF radiation rules will have on radio stations. But it cites an eight-year-old **EPA** study for some ballpark figures.

The report estimated that only 100 to 500 AM stations nationwide and about 750 FMs would have to take corrective action. However, the FCC noted that the study didn't take into account all of the RF restrictions in the new guidelines and didn't figure the cumulative RF effects where several stations have their transmitters at a single site.

• The FCC has launched license revocation proceedings against two dark radio stations: WKLO/Danville, KY and WJHH/Soperton, GA. WKLO has been silent since 1989 because of financial trouble. WJHH has been off the air since 1990.

Fairmont's Portland AM On The Block

airmont Communications is shopping KMJK (AM)/ Portland, OR following bankruptcy court approval of a deal to sell its FM sister, KMXI, to Bay-Com for \$3.6 million.

But Frank Osborn, whose Osborn Communications manages Fairmont, said no other stations are being put on the market — at least not yet. Osborn said negotiations with Fairmont's creditors over the company's fate are "still in flux." He doesn't expect to see a reorganization plan confirmed by the Manhattan U.S. Bankruptcy Court until late May.

Deals cut just prior to the NAB convention, but with prices not yet announced:

• Clear Channel is buying Inner City's KSJL (AM)/San Antonio (completing a four-station duopoly), with Lee Hague of Hague & Co. as broker.

• Ray Lamb's Radio One is acquiring Duke Wright's KFMQ/Lincoln in a deal brokered by Dick Chapin of Chapin Enterprises.

• Michael Cutchall's New West Broadcasting is purchasing Sherman Broadcasting's KKRD/Wichita (FM duopoly), with Elliot Evers of Media Venture Partners as broker.

• Penn Par Associates is buying WHUN & WLAK/Huntingdon, PA for an as-yet-undisclosed price. Brokerage honors go to Jack Satterfield.

• Robert F.X. Sillerman and Bruce "Cousin Brucie" Morrow can proceed with plans to take Multi-Market Radio public after settling an EEO dispute with the NAACP. They'll pay the civil rights group \$8884 for its legal fees.

Westwood One To Market R&R

Westwood One Inc. has announced plans to commence the marketing of wholly owned subsidiary Radio & Records Inc. The move reflects WW1's continuing efforts to reduce debt, strengthen its capital structure, and allow management to focus on its core network radio business. Investment banking firm Lazard Freres & Co. will coordinate the divestiture process.

"Westwood One intends to use proceeds generated from the potential sale of **R&R** to further reduce its outstanding debt," remarked Chairman/CEO Norm Pattiz. "The marketing of R&R comes on the heels of two other recently announced divestitures

NAB Backs C-Quam AM Stereo

NAB has urged the FCC to adopt Motorola's C-Quam as the official AM stereo standard.

The trade group's support for C-Quam is based on the technology's current market dominance over a competing system created by Long island inventor Leonard Kahn. Motorola claims some 615 stations are equipped with C-Quam, while Kahn recently reported that between 150 and 200 stations have installed his gear. And while many GM vehicles are equipped with C-Quam-compatible receivers, there are no Kahn receivers currently on the market.


Last year Congress passed legislation requiring the FCC to set an AM stereo transmission standard for the U.S., something the agency has refused to do for over a decade.

Kahn believes broadcasters would be better served if the government would bow out and let the marketplace set a standard. And he remains optimistic about the outcome of the standard setting — despite NAB's endorsement of his rival: "I think the FCC will listen to the [individual] broadcasters. They should be listening to them instead of lobbyists."

R&R is also expanding into interactive real-time information services products. The company is in the rollout stage of the R&R Online interactive information system and the R&R AirCheck monitoring system. The R&R Online system provides up-to-the-minute music airplay information and business news on a real-time basis. R&R Online will incorporate airplay reports generated from the R&R Air-Check system, a computerized self-learning system that has the capability of tracking all current and non-current music played on monitored radio stations. R&R is committed to continuing the rollout and completion of its new systems throughout the selling process.

Once the sale of R&R is completed, WW1's remaining subsidiaries will be the Westwood One Radio Networks, Mutual Broadcasting System, the Source, NBC Radio Network, and Talknet.

Osborn, Katz, Partech, WW1, CBS, Westinghouse

sborn Communications Corp. (NASDAQ: OSBN) reported a net loss of \$4.5 million (65 cents per share) for 1992, compared to a net loss of \$8.3 million (\$1.19 per share) for 1991. Net revenues were \$26.9 million, up 8% from \$24.9 million the previous year. Operating cash flow was \$5.0 million, up 44% from \$3.5 million

Increased revenues were attributed in part to improved operations at WWVA & WOVK/Wheeling. The company reported operating losses



for WAZU/Dayton and WFXK/Raleigh, but said that should not be the case in 1993 because both stations are now in LMAs.

Osborn's annual report revealed that the company has agreed to sell a \$2 million note (which had been for five years at 10% interest) back to **Keymarket of NEPA** for \$1.4 million as part of Keymarket's financial restructuring. Osborn received the note when it sold a Wilkes-Barre combo to Keymarket for \$12 million in 1989.

In addition to those named above, Osborn's radio properties are WBYB/Jacksonville, WNDR & WNTQ/Syracuse, and WTJS & WTNV/Jackson, TN. It also owns 25% of Fairmont Communications Corp., which owns nine stations and is in Chapter 11 reorganization. Osborn also owns TV properties, a hospital cable TV service, Capitol Music Hall in Wheeling, and Muzak franchises.

atz Corporation (bonds) reported a net loss of \$2.0 million for 1992, compared to a net profit of \$1.7 million for 1991. Preferred stock dividends were \$9.6 million, compared to \$8.6 million in 1991, leaving a net

loss attributable to common shares of \$11.6 million (\$7.63 per share) for 1992, compared to a loss of \$7.0 million (\$4.69 per share) for 1991. (The preferred stock was retired in conjunction with a \$100 million public bond offering in December. The common stock is not publicly traded.)

Operating revenues for 1992 were \$146.0 million, up 24.3% from \$117.5 million. Operating income was \$18.5 million, up 17.4% from \$15.7 million.

Katz Corporation owns Katz Communications, a national radio and TV rep firm whose Katz Radio Group includes Banner Radio, Christal Radio, Eastman Radio, and Katz Radio.

Partech Holdings Corporation (NASDAQ Small Cap: APHC) reported a net loss of \$143,000 (five cents per share) for its fiscal third quarter ended January 31, compared to a loss of \$1.2 million (96 cents per share) for the same period a year ago. Total revenues were \$12.0 million, down from \$21.6 million. (The period did not include any broadcast revenues, since Partech acquired its first station in March. Its primary business has been computer leasing.)

Partech owns WDZD/Shallotte, NC; 49% of WKKB (FM CP)/Key Colony Beach, FL; and has deals pending to buy three other stations.

estwood One Inc. (NAS-DAQ: WONE) reported a net loss of \$9.2 million (61 cents per share) for its fiscal first quarter ended February 28, compared to a loss of \$7.2 million (49 cents per share) for the same period a year ago. Revenues were \$20.4 million, down from \$23.4 million.

WW1 has deals pending to sell WYNY/New York and KQLZ/Los Angeles. In addition, it has an-

nounced its intention to sell **R&R** (see Page 6). Considering those as discontinued operations, the company reported a first quarter loss from continuing operations of \$5.4 million (36 cents per share), compared to a loss of \$5.1 million (35 cents per share) for the same operations a year earlier.

WW1's continuing operations are Mutual Broadcasting System, NBC Radio Network, Talknet, the Source, and Westwood One Radio Networks.

estinghouse Electric Corp. (NYSE: WX) reported first quarter earnings of \$64 million (15 cents per share), compared to a loss of \$246 million a year earlier. Revenues for the first quarter were \$1.86 billion, up slightly from \$1.85 billion.

The company attributed its improved earnings to gains in its broadcasting and power systems units. Westinghouse's **Group W Radio** operation consists of 17 stations in 11 major markets, including **WINS & WNEW/New York, KFWB & KTWV/Los Angeles,** and **WMAQ/Chicago.**

BS Inc. (NYSE: CBS) reported first quarter earnings of \$54.2 million (\$3.50 per share), compared to a loss of \$64 million a year ago. Revenues were \$878.9 million, off 19% from \$1.08 billion a year ago (which had included Winter Olympics and Super Bowl TV revenues).

The company said radio profits increased, primarily because of sales gains by its FM stations and cost controls instituted throughout the radio group.

CBS's radio group consists of 21 stations in 13 markets, including WCBS-AM & FM/New York, KNX & KCBS/Los Angeles, and WBBM-AM & FM/Chicago. It also consists of CBS Radio Networks and CBS Radio Representatives.

ABC Buys Piece Of UK Distributor

ABC Radio Networks has invested in Satellite Media Services, a London-based program distributor that provides programming to virtually all of England's commercial radio stations. This is the first venture for ABC's overseas unit, ABC Radio International.

"We're delighted to become partnered with some of the most successful radio companies in the United Kingdom and Europe, in a business that we understand and one that is very well-managed," remarked ABC Radio Networks Exec. VP Bart Catalane. "The UK radio market is poised for significant growth and we want ABC to be a part of it."

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
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MANAGEMENT

What Secretaries Want From Their Bosses

f managers spend 30% of their work week on secretarial chores, the company could be wasting much as 15% of its annual payroll, according to Management Review.

In light of Professional Secretaries Day being just around the corner (April 21), the editors of the Blackwood, NJ-based *Communications Briefings* newsletter recently conducted a series of focus groups with secretaries and administrative assistants, asking them for suggestions on how to increase their productivity:

Allow secretaries to make decisions. And – once they've proven

their ability to deal with specific situations - give them the authority to *act* upon those decisions.

Value secretaries' time. If a chore can be handled by someone else, have that person do it. And - if your secretary is working on something important - don't interrupt the process with other jobs that can be done later.

Communicate your priorities clearly. It's frustrating for a secretary to work late wrapping up one job, only to be asked to produce a different finished project the next morning.

Discuss your plans daily. By setting aside some time to meet with your secretary each day, you can avoid missing appointments, as well as talk about little things you might not have time for later.

Treat secretaries as team members. Always introduce office visitors to your secretary, so that when they talk on the phone, both parties will feel more comfortable.

Use a Dictaphone (or other recording device). They make it much easier for your secretary to get to your work.

Keep secretaries informed. Always tell your secretary where you're going and when you plan to return. Trying to find someone in an emergency can be difficult and time-consuming.

Controlling The Company Grapevine

For many companies, the grapevine is still the primary source for information. Instead of fighting the grapevine, Sam Deep and Lyle Sussman, authors of "Smart Moves" (Addison-Wesley), suggest the following four ways to make it work for you:

Acknowledge that few employees get the information they feel they need. Anticipate their inquiries and be more forthcoming about information – before they start asking questions.

Correct erroneous or false rumors as soon as they start to surface. Set the record straight in person — written messages are more likely to be misunderstood.

Create a well-publicized rumor hotline. Make someone available to answer all questions as honestly as possible.

Keep your most-respected group leaders informed and rely on their support. Put them in charge of spreading the truth and catching rumor sparks before they become sweeping fires. Remember: You couldn't kill the grapevine if you tried, so devote your efforts to knowing what's on it and taking the appropriate action.

Increasing Productivity: Seven Styles That Work

Productivity is affected when employees aren't suited to their work styles. **Stephanie Winston** — head of the NYC-based **Organizing Principle** time-management firm — suggests you experiment with the following seven basic work styles and choose those that feel most comfortable:

Tackle your most difficult assignments first. Nevertheless, make sure not to dismiss your simpler tasks completely.

Ease into your tougher tasks by warming up with smaller assignments. However, don't procrastinate by filling up your entire workday with secondary chores. Set an ease-in time limit.


Focus on one project. Many workers immerse themselves in one assignment for hours — even days — at a time. Still, it's important to recognize when you should quit: Once you've read the same sentence three times, move on.

Vary your tasks by working in short "bursts" of time. Organize your workday by completing certain assignments between appointments and meetings. *Beware:* Don't spread yourself so thin that you leave an array of unfinished tasks behind.

Concentrate on producing raw material. Some people are good at conceiving ideas, but falter when they try to work them into final form. These employees should turn their first drafts over to others for critique and execution.

Transform raw materials into finished products. Detail-oriented people should take staffers' ideas, proposals, and plans and adapt them into practical form.

Determine how time constraints affect your work. Even if you thrive under deadlines, failing to secure all the back-up information you need can sabotage your efforts. If you're the type who withers under pressure, schedule *twice* the amount of time you think the assignment will take.



SALES & MARKETING

The Evolution From PD To Brand Manager

s the radio industry continues to mature – seeking new ways to create a more sophisticated and profitable franchise with listeners and clients – consider the value of evolving PDs into brand managers.

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Successful packaged-good manufacturers usually are led by brand managers. These leaders not only provide vision and strategies to create brand equity with consumers, but also provide profitable and top sales positions for their brands.

Theory Of Evolution

A PD's evolution into a brand manager starts with the understanding and practice of consistent marketing strategies. There are three components to be concerned with when it comes to radio marketing:

- 1. Listeners
- 2. Advertisers

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3. Successful client investments These three areas – which comprise programming, sales, and marketing – often conflict with each other rather than work together. A successful brand manager first must identify where the three can meet to create mutually beneficial synergies.

To help the three areas come together, formulate a mission statement. For example, "Create and develop a profitable, market-leading brand that enjoys a franchise with listeners and clients that goes beyond the commodity that radio is to consumers and advertisers."

Consider this question: Is perception the reality or is reality the perception at your station?

Perception Vs. Reality Consider this question before beginning the transition: Is percep-

tion the reality or is reality the perception at your station? In other words, does your station enjoy a franchise in the market that transcends the last good or bad book, staff departure, or sale rumor?

Developing a brand franchise is the most critical step in creating the "perception is the reality" position: Even if a book goes down, it doesn't have to be *perceived* as detrimental.

With the "reality is perception" position, however, such *short-term* realities as a drop in the book, personality loss, and management

turnover could develop into perceptions. Consequently, people may believe things are falling apart at your station.

Since carefully created perceptions can help brands go beyond day-to-day realities, PDs who view themselves as brand managers of a packaged-good product – rather than focusing only on rotations, liners, etc. – are the future of programming.

Knowledge Is Power

Owing to the mind-boggling number of media impressions consumers are exposed to daily (commonly referred to as "garbage data"), brand managers must know the characteristics, shopping By Chris Beck

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habits, product purchasing profiles, and lifestyle needs of current *and* potential users. (As if garbage data wasn't enough, consider the tremendous time pressures placed on people these days — it's a serious challenge just to break through.)

Possessing the above-mentioned knowledge gives you absolute power to reach a target by developing marketing strategies, soliciting cross-marketing and promotional partners, and analyzing direct marketing and advertising opportunities.

To create your brand – or strengthen your existing one – consider the following four components:

- 1. Using direct-marketing
- strategies.2. Compensating PDs not only for ratings, but also for revenues and/
- or profitability. 3. Transforming the marketing
- and promotions department into a profit center.
- Selecting advertising media based on breakthrough opportunities.

For more information about the first component, refer to the above story, "Building A Better Brand." I'll address points 2-4 in a future column.

SEVEN STRATEGIES Building A Better Brand

irect-marketing information can be used to build your station's "brand." The following seven strategies can help PDs-turned-brand managers with the task:

Create listener information files (LIFs) containing lifestyle and product-use characteristics. This will allow you to have tremendous flexibility when offering premiums and incentives to help build relationships with listeners.

Depending on the sophistication of your LIFs, you may be able to analyze when a listener starts and stops using your product. Determining which listeners are departing — and their reasons for doing so — is extremely valuable in the quest to reconvert them.

Target new users by compiling direct-marketing data on consumers who have music-purchasing profiles that match the format.

Evolve your current in-house or ongoing research into "selling under the guise of surveying" (SUGS). This technique not only anonymously surveys, it also uses consumer response to suggest trying the product. For example, if the survey elicits the response, "Traffic reports are important," you then can say, "You might consider listening to 'KXXX' tomorrow morning; they have traffic reports every 10 minutes."

Use your listener information files and potential partisan data to create



Invent a mascot whose market position can be manipulated to touch the lives of current as well as potential listeners. For example, the character can be used at listeners' birthday parties not only to entertain, but also to sell the brand by distributing materials. This strategy can be extremely effective when one of your partisans' characteristics is households with preteens.

Collaborate with record labels and TV stations to create a music video or entertainment program hosted by your station's talent.

Force brand trial through partnerships with various local establishments: Have them agree to play your station, or provide prerecorded entertainment showcasing your frequency.

ina Turner will make her Virgin label debut with the soundtrack to her forthcoming film biography, "What's Love Got To Do With It." As reported earlier (R&R 12/18/92), the Touchstone production stars Angela Bassett and Larry Fishburne (who last teamed in "Boyz N The Hood") as the reel-life Tina and Ike. Based on the vocalist's 1986 "I, Tina" autobiography, the film is set to open June 25

he majority (68%) of Americans believe economic growth and a clean environment are possible. This figure is up 7% since 1991 and 19% since 1989, according to a recent survey conducted by Cambridge Reports/Research International.

When asked to choose between economic growth or environmental quality, however, 56% sided with economic growth. Nevertheless, that figure is down 7% from 1991.

Although a majority (55%) say there is not enough government regulation, 22% say it's sufficient, an increase of 6% from 1991. Moreover, 40% feel the costs of lost jobs and declining international competitiveness outweigh the environmental benefits.

Wishy Washy

Surprisingly, while 40% of the Americans surveyed believe the water they drink and the air they breathe is worse than five years ago, only 8% feel the environment is one of the two most important dilemmas facing the country today. In fact, assuming 95% of pollution was already eliminated, Americans were asked how important it would be to wipe out the remaining 5% — only 81% responded it would be very important.

And . . . if the cost of cleaning the remaining 5% would cost as much as the first 95%, only 53% said it would be worth the money.

Auto Aftermarket Services Explode

merica's automobile owners spent a staggering \$111 billion – up from \$107 billion in 1990 – on aftermarket (postcar purchase) products and services in 1991, according to the Research Triangle Park, NC-based Motor & Equipment Manufacturers Assn.

The majority of that money – \$83 billion, a \$2 billion (1.7%) increase from 1990 – went to automobile aftermarket products.

However, the real growth was in service expenditures: \$28 billion in 1991, up 7.2% from \$26 billion in the previous year.

High Caffeine Diet Soda Bows

he Rochester, NY-based Jolt soft-drink company recently announced plans to market a diet beverage ("Diet Citra Soda") that will boast 72 milligrams of caffeine per 12 ounces – but with only one calorie per can.

This means the new diet drink will pack the exact same caffeine punch as "Jolt." introduced seven years ago. This caffeine content is just below the maximum permitted by the U.S. Food & Drug Administration and double that found in regular "Pepsi" and "Coca-Cola"

Cellular Phones Expected To Ring Up Sales Success

ellular phone sales are expected to escalate by more than 75% in 1993, according to a recent survey conducted by the Houstonbased Media Audit local market consumer research firm.

While 9% of the 41,400 household heads surveyed presently own cellular phones, 7% plan to purchase the portable units within the next year.

Interestingly, men are more inclined than women to use cellular phones. Males comprise 60% of current cellular phone owners and 62% of future buyers.

Dialing For Demos

Americans aged 25-34 are most likely to purchase cellular phones this year (32%). However, 24% of expected buyers are in the 35-44 age cell, and 21% are 18-24. Future purchase percentages among older demos are 13% (45-54s), 7% (55-64s), and 4% (65+).

Hot Markets

Of the 40 markets studied, Dallas/Ft. Worth houses the most consumers (11.3%) who intend to buy cellular phones in 1993. Houston (10.3%), Atlanta (9.5%), Greensboro (8.5%), and Chicago (8.2%) round out the Top 5.

What's more, prospective cellular phone buyers' average family income is \$52,627 — almost \$16,000 less than that of current owners.

State Lotteries Vs. Sports Betting

he majority of Americans (75%) feel state lotteries are the most acceptable way to increase state revenues, according to a recent Gallup poll. Bingo for cash prizes is the secondmost acceptable form of gamblingbased revenue, supported by 72%. However, 65% of Americans find

professional sports betting an

unacceptable means of generating state revenues — and 48% want sports betting banned outright. Only 33% say sports betting should be expanded to other states.

Nearly two-thirds (64%) of the U.S. adults surveyed believe sports betting affects the integrity and honesty of pro sports (21% disagree, and 5% have no opinion).

Currently, more than 100 companies and groups are seeking federal approval for their personal communications networks. Among them: IBM, which is working on a personal communicator capable of cellular voice and data communications, and AT&T, which is offering a phone-fax-PC hybrid that, like the Newton, can read handwriting.

The market for these high-tech products is expected to become as large as, if not larger than, today's cellular market. Motorola projects that by the year 2000 as many as 20 million Americans will own these advanced wireless telecommunications systems.

less technology on the horizon. These new communications devices will act as telephones, fax machines, and personal computers - and they'll be small enough to hold in your hand.

Motorola's "Iridium" system (pictured) will provide a wide array of services, including worldwide data communication, paging, and global locating - not to mention basic telephone services.

The system will operate within cellular grids when possible, but 66 satellites circling the planet will enable users to access the system from anywhere on the globe.

Incoming data communications. such as faxes, are stored by the Iridium and may be viewed on the unit's small screen or - using the handset's data connectors printed out on a printer or fax machine or transferred into PC memory.

Motorola and its global consortium of backers have been granted an experimental license to develop the technology. The first satellite launch is projected for 1996, and the entire Iridium network is expected to be in operation by 1998.

In a recent filing, Evergreen warned that the FCC's "unprecedented, aggressive attack" on allegedly indecent programming is "punishing speech which occurs not at the periphery of America's cultural tastes, but rather at center stage, among the most popular radio programs in the United States."

Safe Harbor Hearing Date Set

In another indecency development, the U.S. Court of Appeals for the DC Circuit has set a September 3 date for oral arguments on an industry coalition's suit to overturn a pending FCC rule that would limit indecent programming to midnight-6am. Observers say the three judges who will hear the case - Patricia Wald, Abner Mikva,

and Harry Edwards – are among the federal judiciary's strongest free speech advocates.

and cash flow. The stock offering, he added, is hitting the market at the "perfect" time, since Infinity's success has educated many investors about radio. "It'll probably be the hottest pure radio IPO yet."

Steding also valued the Evergreen offering price somewhere between Infinity and Saga. His calculation was 9¼ times cash flow. According to Steding, Evergreen may have even better prospects than Infinity, owing to its diversification of markets, depth of markets, and strong management team.

One thing Infinity had that Evergreen lacks is a high-profile signal that actually covers Wall Street. "That certainly helped Infinity," said Cheen, noting that many brokers were WFAN or WXRK listeners.

Steding said Evergreen's lack of a New York station shouldn't matter now that Wall Street is more familiar with the radio industry.

Evergreen's lineup includes stations in the other two "Big Three" markets, KKBT/Los Angeles and WLUP-AM & FM/Chicago.


KWAC GM Mike Allen told R&R that he queried his on-air staff as soon as he found out about the violation earlier this week. "Finally," Allen said, "One DJ came forward and said, 'Yes, I did say on the air, if you have received cash in the mail [issued by Arbitron as an incentive to fill out the diary], give me a call.'"

Allen wouldn't identify the personality, a 15-year station employee. Allen said he occasionally gave restaurant certificates to staff members as a perk, but said the DJ in question claimed he received no diaries in response to his solicitation. "If our own investigation finds it went deeper than that, he will be let go.

"Our position is that we take the blame for this," said Allen, but he stressed that station management had no prior knowledge of the transgression. "We're just as shocked as everyone else."

Allen said the station has ratings distortion guidelines posted in five places in the studio in Spanish and English. He feels it's not coincidental that the station canceled its Arbitron contract last quarter after 15 years.

Arbitron's Mocarsky declared, "The fact that they are no longer a subscriber has nothing to do with this. They would have been delisted no matter what."

Study offers insight into industry's success and clues for its future

The '90s will be known as the Decade of Change. Sweeping changes are evident everywhere, including radio. In an effort to make sense of these developments. we've been collecting information from contemporary music radio listeners over the past two years. We wanted to know how their music and radio tastes have changed over time. We categorized the issues into

follow

since the late 1980s?

music has changed . . .

A lot = 15%

We've all spent a great deal of time lately deciphering the significance of change in our industry. Who'd have thought, even five years ago, that four radio groups would some day operate 13 stations in Denver, or that the same jock would be heard on 15 stations in five different formats? Who'd have guessed GMs might manage four stations at once? And how many PDs expected to be programming two or more formats in a market? No one could have predicted the changes in radio, and it's too early to tell if these changes will be positive or negative in the long run.

Radio has always lagged behind society in terms of change, and now is no exception. Yes, changes have been rampant in our industry lately, but most of our listeners' lives changed several years ago, in the mid- to late-'80s. While our industry is just now facing up to the "new reality," listeners have al-ready dealt with major lifestyle changes and are well on their way to adjusting their social patterns. As lifestyles continue to change, stations must stay current and develop strategies to meet the moving target.

Within the industry, the most adept radio groups and managers have prepared for change. In all likelihood, they won't just survive the Decade of Change, they'll succeed because of it.

CHR/AC Bias

Our survey collected data from 930 music test respondents who are core listeners of CHR (62%) and AC (38%) stations. Therefore, most of the respondents are female (94%) and 18-44 (95%). The re-

search is based on contemporary music listeners and excludes AOR and Country listeners. Some of the information retrieved is surprising, and most of it confirms widely held suspicions. All of it helps us understand how these radio listening lives have changed in the past few years.

Generally speaking, the desire for "harder" music declines with age. Even among the 18-24s, 26% are listening to "softer" music, compared to 20% who listen to "harder." Yes, changes have been rampant in our industry lately, but most of our listeners' lives changed several years ago, in the mid- to late-'80s.

Interest in news and talk - a radio forte is up substantially among these listeners, even among 18-24s and 25-34s (41% and 46% say "more," respectively). The figure rises to 50% among 35-54s.

If many of these respondents are listening to more News/Talk, much of it must be on the FM band, because AM listening continues its 15-year decline.

Talents, Video Up

When asked if air personalities were "better" or "worse" now than they were five years ago, 45% responded "better." Younger demos showed greater support (53% of 18-24s), but even 39% of the 35-54s responded "better." Only 14% of the total said "worse, while approximately one-third said "about the same."

While radio listening is up 14% among those surveyed, music video viewing has risen only 5%. Videos' highest net gain is among 18-34s (8%), compared to a 9% net loss among 35-54s.

Break It Down

The study offers insight into radio's overall success and clues for its future success. Knowing that most people's music tastes change over time, stations may elect to mature with their audiences; e.g., CHR evolves to Hot AC, or Young Country evolves to Mainstream Country. Upper demo stations may attempt to capture listening from like-formatted stations as listeners age; e.g., Classic Rock pulls from AOR. Evolving music tastes also hold promise for acceptance of new and original music formats.

The fact that many people see positive change in music over the past five years is good news for all music stations, and especially for the ground-breaking formats that have provided the greatest impetus for changing contemporary music styles. Our industries are doing a better job of giving the people what they want to hear, as compared to the 1980s, when, it could be argued, much of the contemporary music on radio was years behind reality.

While the music alterations on franchise-formatted stations have been subtle, fresh and exciting new music on New Rock and other niche stations has changed the landscape of many markets, and

the listeners have noticed. New music is still a major attraction for most 18-34s, and even among some 35-44s.

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Most listeners are aware of radio's fragmentation. While they probably could not verbalize this knowledge in radio terminology, they recognize additional format choices exist today, and their satisfaction has increased. More than two-thirds of our survey respondents listen to a station that's very close to perfect for their tastes, which counteracts an '80s research trend that found many listeners complaining that "everything sounds the same." Once again, these findings bode well for niche stations and not so well for second, third, and fourth choices within a given format.

Perhaps most encouraging for our industry is that, at least for this sample of almost 1000 listeners, radio listening is up. Despite the competition radio's faced in the past decade from new media, the industry's future appears strong.

Finally, listeners are pleased by the changes in presentations over the past few years. Perhaps even more than music, presentation styles have lagged behind listener tastes. As they've softened and become more realistic, if not humanistic, satisfaction has increased among listeners.

Across the board, this study shows extremely encouraging re-sponses to the on-air changes radio has instituted in the past few years. Stations are doing a better job of understanding and catering to listeners, who are reciprocating with positive reviews. Stations that have recognized and capitalized on the changes in their audience bases are well-positioned to grow. Perhaps the industry is finally on the verge of "growing up."

Charting Listeners' Prevailing Moods And Attitudes

In this final look at the results of a recent Alan Burns & Associates national radio study (R&R 1/29, 2/26), I'll focus on active listeners – who they are and what they buy, request, and listen to – along with an overview of listeners' attitudes toward various types of music.

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Mood Swings

More than 8% of respondents in the 14-44 age cell don't have a favorite radio station – that's about eight shares of 12+ listening to whatever fits their moods. You certainly can't afford to chase these people; they're too unpredictable. But you can take advantage of these listeners by defining your station's mood – and executing that mood consistently.

What mood are people looking for? Country, Modern Rock, Dance, and Oldies were tapped as formats that "help get [listeners] going." Along with Soft AC, Country also was named as a "relaxing" format. (There are two kinds of Country listeners, as proven by Young Country.)

Respondents said CHR, Adult Hit Radio, and mainstream AC serve both functions. With about as many "relaxing" as "get going" votes, these formats must take care to avoid being too up or too down.

Today's Music

As expected, the younger the listeners, the more they want to stay in touch with today's music. A majority of listeners aged 14-17 (73%) and 18-24 (64%) want to be up-to-date musically. While 53% of 25-34s also want to stay in touch, 35-44s (42%) aren't as concerned. Meanwhile, Modern Rock, Country, and Dance partisans are equally or more interested in to-day's music than their CHR counterparts.

Listeners generally are satisfied with the existing formats and stations. The demo showing greatest

dissatisfaction, however, was 25-34 (both male and female). Most people who agreed with the statement "There's really no station that does a good job of playing the music I like best" tended to be shifting to or from soft stations; some 25-34s may be ready to mellow out a bit but don't care for the "soft"

About 30% of the national sample said they "regularly watch MTV." MTV viewing regularity also declines with age. However, AHR partisans watch MTV more regularly than CHR or Dance fans. One possible reason: AHR adults like to know the artists and titles of their favorite songs, and MTV consistently provides that information. Conversely, radio does a poor job of back-announcing songs.

'Active' Activity

In this study of 1019 people, we asked two questions geared toward locating those who are the most active consumers of recorded music and broke out the extremes: those who buy five or more units of music (in any form) per month, and those who call or attempt to call a radio station 5+ times in a month. (Note: AOR partisans were not included in these figures.)

The following chart breaks down the results to both questions, respectively:

Clearly, heavy consumption of recorded music is not confined to teens; there's some heavy buying going on among 18-24s. Request action, however, practically ceases after age 24.

The ethnicity of your target audience should significantly influence the emphasis you put on record sales and requests: Blacks (33%) and Hispanics (20%) make five or more music purchases a month, compared to 17% of whites. What's more, 19% of blacks and 15% of Hispanics make requests five or more times a month; whites comprise only 8%.

Breaking out heavy actives by format, we see that CHR is not now

the format of actives: It's very likely that the people who are most passionate about their music – and thus most likely to request and buy records – have gravitated to stations that specialize in the kind of music they like (Dance for dance fans, AHR for pop fans, etc.).

As a result, Dance and Country listeners buy the most recorded music (5+ each). Soft AC and Modern Rock (two each) and AHR and mainstream AC (one each) round out the list. Looking at these numbers, is it any wonder the record industry is cranking out country and dance music as fast as it can? Also, country and dance lead in "heaviest requests."

Incidentally, rap fans are by far the heaviest consumers of recorded music. More than a third of rap fans buy five or more pieces of music a month. It makes sense for Dance and CHR outlets that strategically play rap to look at "active" music indicators; others should not.

Study High Points

Here are some of the high points of the national listener study:

• Formats which base themselves in some variant or descendant of rock still account for the plurality of listening by Americans age 14-44. However, there's a new generational gap developing: While the '60s saw the gulf between

parents' music (pop) and kids' music (rock) develop, the last five years have marked a third (and equally large) split into rhythmic music.

• Country isn't the most popular music form in the U.S.; it's actually No. 3. But the country audience's relative lack of fragmentation makes it the *most-listened-to* format. Two major forces driving country's recent popularity are America's shift toward conservatism and adults' desire for more relevant song lyrics. Once the country ball got rolling, publicity and peer pressure added to its momentum.

• Hard Rock, AHR, Soft AC, and Modern/Alternative Rock showed the most growth. If you're looking for a format to move into, take a good look in these areas.

America's Musical Preferences

n its national radio listening study, Alan Burns & Associates asked respondents to listen to 14 music styles.

The following chart displays the scores these styles earned by age cell (artist and title information is included in parentheses). These scores are based on a 4.0 scale, 4.0 being best. (Note: C/R refers to current/recurrent.)



· Big losses were registered by both mainstream and danceoriented CHR. Does this mean CHR is "dead?" I don't think so, and neither do the operators of winning CHRs in cities like Los Angeles, Boston, Providence, and Chicago. Those are just a few of the cities where well-done CHRs operated by people who believe in the format are making a lot of money. CHR is, however, going through a period of redefinition: In highly fragmented markets, most CHRs are finding it necessary to stake out very rhythmic or very popbased positions.

• Contemporary music stations (CHR, AOR, and AC) now fall into the following four broad segments:

- Rock: Classic Rock, Modern Rock, Hard Rock
- CHR: primarily rhythmic hits
- Young Pop: current and recent pop, '80s pop, and some pop-dance and poprock.
- Older Pop: softer pop, and '80s and '70s pop.

Finding your target and position within one of these segments is the key to success. Remember: National studies are no substitute for local market research. But a national overview like this can help you put your specific format and market into perspective.

The hypercard program is playable on most any Macintosh. The menu offers several routes through the information. In addition to a (semi-conventional) text bio, viewers may peruse the group's various lineups since its September 1975 inception, as well as minute details on all recordings, production credits, recording locations, and labels.

Brief biographical notes on selected former members and producers are included. A fair number of graphics are featured, most of them based on the band's album covers. You'll also find every band contact, from publicity to merchandising, listed in the program,

Run-D.M.C. Return





A Plea For Professionalism

Do unto job-seekers as you'd have them do unto you

Not a week goes by without someone asking me, "Why don't you write about the inconsiderate ways PDs treat job applicants?" I explain that I've written about that . . . more than once.

The stories are the same:

The PD says, "I've got to fill this position right away. Use an overnight delivery service to get your package to me tomorrow morning!" Two weeks later, the PD still hasn't opened your package.

The PD says, "It's down to you and one other guy. I'll make a decision this week and call you by Friday." The PD never calls and won't accept or return your calls.

This week I got a call from a jock who was told by a PD in Cleveland, "I've heard your tape and definitely want you to fly in for an interview. Find out what flights you can get for Wednesday, and call me tomorrow."

The jock did what she was told and called back Wednesday morning, but the PD was in a meeting. He didn't return her call, so she called again that afternoon. He was unavailable. She called him every day for two weeks. He never

was available, and he never returned her call.

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Finally, disillusioned and disgusted, she wrote to ask him why he'd led her to believe he wanted to interview her and then refused to accept or return her calls.

This drew a response from the PD. He wrote back, "If you really wanted People shouldn't be required to act 'creative' to get you to behave like a professional.

to talk to me, you should have come up with some real creative way of getting my attention."

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Widespread Problem

I beg to differ. People shouldn't be required to act "creative" to get you to behave like a professional. The lack of professionalism in our industry is appalling. From the way receptionists handle callers (i.e., customers) to the ways managers motivate employees (by giving feedback only for screw-ups), to the manner in which PDs treat job applicants, we have a long way to go before we can expect to be treated as responsible businesspeople.

The root of the problem, of course, is that no training is required to become a PD or GM. The initial programming job usually begins when a PD leaves, and the manager points at someone – maybe you – and says,

"You're the new PD."

Do you then go to a special school to learn how to be a program director? Does the station enroll you in management courses?

Well, no. You're just supposed to know all that stuff somehow.

So you learn what you can by reading programming books and trade publications. Perhaps you attend conventions and an occasional seminar. Mostly, however, you learn by watching other PDs. Many of them act unprofessionally. You've probably already observed that as a disc jockey. Now that you're the PD, it's your turn to act like a big shot. And the way to show everyone you're a big shot, of course, is to be too important to be courteous to "the little people."

Too Hip For The Room

A couple years ago I conducted a couple of seminars in Michigan. On Sunday I worked with a station in Grand Rapids. On Tuesday I did one in Lansing for the Michigan Association of Broadcasters.

Lansing Community College was holding its annual Radio Day on Monday. When the event organizers heard I'd be in town, they asked me to speak to their students. I accepted the invitation.

I awoke Monday in Grand Rapids to find a fierce storm in progress. As a Californian, I'm not used to driving in heavy weather, and the trip to Lansing took forever. I was scheduled for noon. I reached the hotel at 11:15am, threw my bags in my room, and plunged back into freezing rain for what was supposed to be a 10minute walk to the auditorium.

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Naturally, I got lost. I reached the auditorium at 11:50am, exhausted, wet, and cold . . . but on time. I found the professor who'd organized the event and said, "Sorry I cut it so close!"

"At least you showed up," he said. "I had scheduled a panel of five local program directors for this morning. All five gave me firm commitments two months ago. We printed

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Courtesy Made Easy

ou should treat job applicants with the same courtesy you'd expect to be shown. Here are a few tips on how to stay polite and professional with a minimal expediture of your own energy.

For starters, don't tell someone to Fed-Ex a job package unless you actually plan to review it the next day. Similarly, if you ask someone to call back at a certain time (or on a certain day), you should honor the commitment you've implicitly made to accept the call. If you're unable to accept the call when it comes in, call back promptly, even if it's a busy day. When are your days not busy?

Follow-Up Calls

Set up a system to handle followup calls. To handle the inevitable calls from job-seekers who haven't yet received your form letter, provide your assistant, secretary, or receptionist with a list of people whose tapes you've heard and rejected.

When someone calls to see if Mr. PD has heard my tape yet, the caller can be transferred to the appropriate person. That person checks the list, finds the applicant's name, and says, "Yes, Ms. Reilly, I see your name right here. Mr. PD has heard your tape and wants me to tell you that although he appreciates your taking the time to apply for the job, you're not exactly what he's looking for at this time."

Create A Form Letter

Reply to all solicited job applications. If you've advertised a job

their names in our programs and in our press releases. We sent them reminders. Yesterday, we called each one to remind them of the time and place of their panel session. Two of them said they couldn't make it — they're too busy this week."

I hit the roof. "What? I broke my neck to keep my promise to you, and two out of five local PDs are too busy to drive a few blocks to keep their promises?"

Inconsiderate? Yeah. Irresponsible? Sure. Unusual? Sadly, no.

The Fish Stinks

From The Head Down Those two PDs were much too important to keep their words to a bunch of college people. Of course, one presumes that if their appointments that day had been with the VP of a major radio group or the GM of a Detroit station, they somehow would have managed to honor their commitments.

In a coincidence so great that I can only beg you to opening or specifically asked a jock for a tape, you owe a response to any good faith submission. A form letter is your easiest option. This letter might include several possible replies, such as:

• The position has been filled Thank you for expressing an interest in working at WXXX.

• The position has been filled, I think your style might fit in well here, however, and am keeping your tape on file for future openings.

 I have listened to your tape, and you don't fit my needs at this time.

• Owing to the volume of responses to our ad, I have not yet been able to listen to your tape. You will, however, receive a response once I've had a chance to hear your work.

• I don't think you're quite ready for WXXX, but I hear a lot of potential and invite you to send me another tape six months from now.

Simply check the appropriate box for each tape and give the form letter and job package to your assistant or intern or secretary. Have that person address an envelope and insert the form letter for you. And now with a minimum of effort, you've discharged your obligation to that eager job-seeker

believe me, just after I wrote the above I received a phone call from **Robert Ottaway**, who formerly owned and managed a station in Lansing and now has a thriving business as a radio management & sales consultant.

I told him about those two Lansing PDs. He wasn't surprised. He pointed out, "The owners set the standards for their stations. If they act unprofessionally with their staff, that's how the staff will treat everyone else."

If you're not lucky enough to work for a professional owner or manager, then it's up to you to seek and maintain your own high level of professionalism.

IF IT PLAYS IN PEORIA . . .

KZ93 Refocuses For Generation X

"But will it play in Peoria?" Heritage mainstream CHR WKZW (KZ93)/Peoria is about to find out. The station has reinvented its traditional sound to target the much-hyped Generation X listeners in a market that has traditionally reflected much of middle America (see "Talkin' 'Bout Generation X.")

Attitude Adjustment

Will the new KZ93 play in Peoria? According to Station Manager Lindsay Wood Davis, "We've had a landslide of positive reaction from everyone, including clients." (See "Zagging While Everyone Else Is Zigging.") PD Scott Wheeler adds, "A change like this takes the full cooperation of programming and management, as well as an adjustment of attitudes and expectations for sales and clients."

This modification in direction – which aims KZ93 at the 18-29-yearold male *and* female X'er audience – kicked off April 1 with 24 hours of David Bowie's "Changes." The new music debuted the following day *sans* airstaff, and the personalities returned April 3.

Davis and Wheeler are both familiar with the market's tastes. Davis joined the station in 1989, and Wheeler, who became PD in April 1991, has been with KZ93 since 1981 (except for a brief detour to WGCL/Cleveland).

Davis explains the 18-29 target and how KZ93 is attempting to capture it. "We're trying to home in on the target not only with the music, but with the promotions and the technical air sound. Generation

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X'ers have grown up with MTV, and they know how to use a channel changer, so we had to do something to keep them enthralled with the radio station."

What precipitated the change? Falling ratings, to be sure. Including the Fall '92 Arbitron, the last five 12+ scores had dropped 15.4-15.2-13.8-11.7-10.3, bringing KZ93 to fourth place among 17 signals.

Davis explains, "This is not a failing station. We still have great demos, but we had to ask ourselves

how long we could realistically keep heading a CHR northward for upper demos. The older segments of our audience felt we were too wild, while the younger demos felt we were too conservative. Our cume was giant, but the TSL was dropping, which we believe was a function not only of the music, but of listener comfort with our presentation."

Radically New Music

Compared to the sound the station had featured in recent months, KZ93's music profile is now radically different. Still, it isn't as extreme as New Rock-leaning CHRs WENZ (The End)/Cleveland or WNNX (99X)/Atlanta, for example. Wheeler says, "KZ93 sounds totally different from just about anything else in America. The closest comparison would be Z100/New York's current approach. Our music now comes from three main areas: rhythmic crossovers, New Rock crossovers, and the big pop hits in between.

"We're leaning away from the Michael Bolton-Wilson Phillips-Celine Dion-type records. The only exception is Whitney Houston, which had to get as big as it did to finally get on the station. In a sense, KZ93 is almost like MTV on the radio. We're identifying the records that are most important to this demo and playing them, almost regardless of sound. The audience is just happy to hear fun, en-

ergy, and tempo again, which goes right back to what it's expected from us all along. [We had gotten to the point where] our DJs would come in and tell us we were playing the same song at the same time as the Soft AC and AC/Gold stations.

"The music presentation is still very tight: The powers still turn up every two and a half hours, and we're still current-intensive. We lifted a lot of the dayparting, because we'd become schizophrenic, going from Hot AC in the daytime to super-youth-driven at night. Now we're more consistent around the clock, and we're only dayparting a handful of records.

"The biggest changes were the songs within the categories – especially gold, which now features the big hits from **Depeche Mode**, **INXS**, and **U2**. Recurrents are a bit thin because a lot of AC music came out, and we purged some of the older corporate rock stuff, like

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REO Speedwagon, Bon Jovi, Whitesnake, and Firehouse, from the gold category. We'll still play their music, but it has to sound contemporary."

Finding The Songs

Davis says, "It's sad to hear CHRs all over America that sound like ACs, loaded down with ballads and midtempo records. Yes, we're taking a lot of cues from MTV, but KZ93 can be even more effective than that channel in reaching this Generation X target, because we're airing the titles that actually do 'play in Peoria.' The music is more urban than the market is used to hearing from us, but the metro is about 8% black and the city itself is roughly 20% black, so this music will play here.

"The closest thing to an Urban outlet here is WBGE, which airs SMN's 'Touch' format. We've introduced some of the most mass appeal rap records, like Naughty By Nature and Wreckx-N-Effect. We in the industry may categorize these records as rap, but we've seen them evolve into hits," says Davis. "MD Gene Stern, who does afternoons, goes out almost every night, so he's very in touch with rhythmic and New Rock music from the clubs."

"He's also quite aware of what's selling in town," adds Wheeler. "A lot of the input for our music now comes from retail sales, which showed me that records like Silk's 'Freak Me' and the Stereo MC's' 'Connected' were hits here, even though they might not have fit, according to my ears. We found the market based its initial reactions to these records on MTV.

"Most importantly, KZ93 has shifted from being passive-based to active-based," says Wheeler. "The [request] phones have become important to us again. We're very interested in what the audience wants to hear, and we're finding some of the New Rock stuff is getting huge phone reactions. A good example is Tasmin Archer's 'Sleeping Satellite.' Many of our request callers also involve the question 'What was that song?' Unlike many CHRs that place format form over format function, we're



trying to front- and back-sell all newer music."

More Natural Delivery As part of its presentation renovations, KZ93 has replaced the jingles with Premiere's "Anti-Jingles" and a new sweeper voice. Wheeler notes, "We're using Jim O'Brien out of Rhode Island because he has a friendly voice, instead of the growly delivery that's become so prevalent. KKLQ/San Diego's Dave Dhillon has done the mixing on the sweepers, which has made all the difference in the world. The jocks are still very uptempo, fun, and youthful-sounding. The mission is to become a part of this demo and talk to it, not at it.

"We've also canned the tried and true contests and promotions things like song of the day — because we believe they're over. We're into marketing and promoting without a lot of hype. We offer activities surrounding things these listeners like to do. A good example would be a 'Workout Weekend,' when we'd gather listeners together for a bike ride, a run, or a workout-based event. We're still making lots of personal appearances, and we're finalizing plans for an Earth Day event."

the 'New Music Challenge,' and other things that remind listeners of what the station used to sound like. These things will eventually return, but we'll have reinvented them with a focus toward the Generation X listener."

The station moved morning man Gary Olson, a six-year station vet,

to afternoons at Full-Service sister WMBD, in order to capitalize on his strongest cell, women 35-44. Davis points out, "Our salespeople can still sell him as a known commodity, *and* they can be excited about a new product, KZ93."

Wheeler's still hunting for the right morning person, but all the other personalities have made the transition to the new presentation. "The timing is wonderful from a sales point of view, now that national attention is focusing back on this demo. Also, we're into spring and summer, when any CHR should be thinking about being uptempo again. To back it up, we just got an auditorium test back that says the listeners are sick of the music we just got rid of. While I don't think this will evolve in one book. I believe we'll move from fourth to first in this spring's Arbitron.

"Our consultants, Alan Burns & Associates – Jeff Johnson specifically – have expressed some real excitement and genuine support of our concept. They believe that if this is successful, it will offer them a new challenge to spread the concept. They also feel it's time to go back and be true to the format and play what's happening in the market. But most of all, they've complimented us for not just sitting on our hands and doing nothing."

Zagging While Everyone Else Is Zigging

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he rest of the market is zigging toward 25+, and we're going to zag," says WKZW (KZ93)/

Peoria Station Manager Lindsay Wood Davis. "We have this huge, unserved market, and we've lost sight of the common thread to reach the mass market because we've been narrowcasting to the wrong demos for too long."

Davis presents practical business reasons for focusing KZ93's demos away from 25+ in market No. 133 (12+ population is 278,600). "If I was doing this for national business, I'd never have made this decision, because that's still a 25-54 meat grinder. Only the bigger markets are getting any sizable national teen buys. But our local advertisers who know KZ93's heritage want to reach that 20-year-old who's buying a car, buying clothes, spending money on beer and soda, and developing brand loyalties.

"This is not a niche — it's a huge market that radio has done a pretty piss-poor job of reaching for the last seven or eight years. In 1993 it's 46 million strong and growing, so if you're not going for 25+, then go for this group.

"The watershed for CHR seems to have been 1985 — that's when the problems began to creep in. Advertisers and programmers were justly scared of having a format targeted at this [younger] group when the boomers' spending was in full swing. I was a proponent of Adult CHR, and we shot ourselves in the foot doing it, like many stations."

PD Scott Wheeler adds, "It's a matter of education. I've been amassing as much information about Generation X as I can find. We've used this data to help with the music, but also to bond with the sales staff and fully explain to them and our clients what's going.

"In a sense, we've made the sales staff experts on the demo and on our format. The clients have responded that they want to attach themselves to the excitement and buzz the new sound of KZ93 is generating — whether they like the music or not."

"We're doing this to make money, and that may come as a shock to some other managers," concludes Davis. "I fear many of my fellow managers and the ad agencies with which they do business have failed to realize that this group has matured, that it's very different from the preceding generation, and that it carries tremendous clout."

Format's Success Depends On Unconventional Wisdom

The right signal, positioning, talent, music, and promotion can make any AOR the top-rated station among adults 18-34 and 25-54. These days, however, the number of AORs achieving No. 1 adult rankings is trending down.

Here's an overview of why:

• Increased competition within the format. Since the late '80s, the success of Classic Rock has cost many AORs 30%-60% of their audience, depending on the stations' vulnerability. The recent proliferation of such splinter formats as New Rock, Progressive/Adult Alternative, Rock/AC, and Hard/Z-Rock has fragmented the rock audience even further. What's more, it's becoming common for one market to house three or even four rock stations.

• Increased interest in other formats. The infusion of popular and talented new country performers has made that format more appealing to the AOR audience. And an awakening interest in current affairs has drawn AOR listeners to Talk radio and its superstar personalities.

• Stagnant AOR programming and reluctance to change. Any successful station eventually will be challenged by fiercer competition. Although we can't control our competitors, we can control what we do about them. Ideally, your station should anticipate competition and position itself accordingly. A new competitor's growth can be blocked or delayed by swift action. AORs that are afraid to change and adopt a "wait and see" attitude are those that are most damaged by new competition.

Embracing Change

AORs need to change their thinking processes to discover new possibilities. Unfortunately, conventional wisdom opposes change. This is especially true at many AOR stations, where "executing the format" means playing the same overresearched music and recycling the same old ideas.

Many AOR programmers believe the format has a set of universal, unbreakable rules and make their decisions accordingly. They fear any break with tradition is liable to alienate their core listeners. But when AORs maintain the status quo and stop evolving, they become boring for their listeners and sitting ducks for the competition.

Taking A Break

In his book "If It Ain't Broke ... Break It!," human performance expert Robert J. Kriegel advocates "Break-It Thinking," which replaces outmoded conventional wisdom with *unconventional* wisdom. This concept has helped many businesses and is especially needed at AOR. Consider how the major points of Break-It Thinking apply to radio:

• Things don't happen in cycles. Since unpredictability and 66

change are the norm, things never will get back to "normal."

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- If you don't mess with your success, someone else will.
 The best time to change is
- when you don't have to.The biggest risk is not to take risks. Playing it safe is danger-
- ous.When you play not to lose, you don't win.
- Competition encourages conformity. You can't jump far ahead of the pack simply by being better at playing by the rules. To excel, you need to reinvent the game, break the old rules, and create new ones.
- Breakthroughs are found in the exceptions to rules.
 When you think of limits, you
- create them. • Get in the habit of breaking
- your habits. Round up the sacred cows.

Note: I'm not suggesting AORs are in such a crisis that radical change is the best cure, nor am I advocating change for change's sake – AOR stations are doing a lot of things right. But reluctance to change has resulted in missed opportunities. Risk doesn't mean making snap judgments or taking foolish chances.

Shattering Myths

It was Break-It Thinking that created AOR and has helped it develop into a more popular format. It wasn't long ago when many AOR programmers believed their listeners would stop liking a record once their Top 40 competition began playing it. If a current crossed over and became a hit, the AOR stopped playing it. We now know avoiding the hits is a good way to guarantee your station a two share.

Many of the format's biggest successes have been achieved by doing the unthinkable. Noble Broadcasting helped pioneer the New Rock format with XTRA-FM (91X)/San Diego. Its mainstream AOR competitor, KGB-FM, has been well-positioned, well-researched, well-programmed, and also has had popular morning shows. Rather than compete head to head with

KGB (as most secondary AOR stations would have done in those days), 91X blazed its own trail. The station championed new artists and literally created a new audience. Over the years, shares rose steadily as listener tastes matched 91X's programming. It took vision, commitment, and passion to make 91X a success – qualities that unfortunately are now found in many radio groups.

For years, AORs were reluctant to employ air talent with "personality" because that trait would "get in the way of the music." (Besides, it was cheaper and easier to deal with generic DJs who read liner cards.) Now we know how crucial it is to have outstanding talent in as many dayparts as possible.

Many people did a double take when Bill Sommers hired KLOS/ Los Angeles morning team Mark & Brian. They didn't fit the perceived requirements for AOR major market morning talent: They came from a CHR; previously worked in Birmingham (not a Top 50 market); didn't play any music; and sounded like a couple of "hicks from the sticks." Would this play in cosmopolitan L.A.?

Simulcast Success

Philadelphia's simulcast of "The Howard Stern Show" represents another example of Break-It Thinking. Network radio talent was the norm in the pre-TV era. But since that concept hadn't been used for so long, it became foreign to modern broadcasters. Conventional wisdom dictated that local origination was essential to a morning program's success. But the Stern show's New York City tone and news content haven't hindered its popularity in other markets.

Hiring a syndicated mega-talent is becoming a game-breaking tactic for the '90s. It may not be long before Stern and other syndicated talent like Stevens & Pruett, Ron & Ron, or the Greaseman pop up in your market.

Another Break-It Thinking trend we'll probably hear more about is the addition of nonmusic content outside of morning drive. For example, some AOR stations have unconventionally made sports a greater part of their programming. WDVE/Pittsburgh is broadcasting the Penguins' hockey playoffs. And WYSP/Philadelphia has benefited from covering the Eagles' football games.

Break-It Thinking requires us to free our own minds from the confines of "the way it's supposed to be done" in order to see beyond our limitations. Innovations come from breaking the rules. Research won't identify what to do next; it can only confirm or deny what has already happened. Furthermore, research tends to survey the most inactive people — those least likely to want change. By the time stagnancyrelated trouble appears in the perceptual study, it might be too late to do anything about it.

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

Managing Your Music Library

Which gold titles are relevant today? Which ones aren't? Programmers fight a never-ending battle to keep their libraries fresh. This week, two format vets explain how they do it.

Kevin Stapleford

Noble Broadcast Group VP/Programming and XTRA-FM (91X)/ San Diego OM Kevin Stapleford utilizes research to help keep his library up to snuff. "A lot of people cringe when they hear the word research. I believe in it. I research my library once or twice per year.

"My active library is 1300 titles segregated into three levels: primary, secondary, and spice. The primary category consists of 300 titles, each played about twice a week. Secondary has 500 titles rotated about once every 10 days. Spice consists of 400 titles rotating approximately once per month.

"Primaries are the hits – they research and request well. I still

have **UB40**'s 'Red Red Wine' and X's 'Walk On The Wild Side' in my primary category, because they're *still* requesting and researching well.

"I use the spice category to frame currents and recurrents they're interesting, familiar, and fun songs that people remember Modern English's 'I Melt With You,' Devo's 'Whip It,' B-Movie's 'Nowhere Girl,' etc. They need to be researched to see if listeners still want to hear them. Off-thewall stuff is also part of the cate-- for example, Nancy Singory atra's 'These Boots Are Made For Walkin'.' It's a double take for the listener - it has that 'wow factor.' These songs are heard every few months, so you've probably forgotten the last time you heard them. Stapleford has a category of ap-

proximately 50 burnt songs that don't get scheduled. "The biggest burnt song right now is 'Money For Nothing' by Dire Straits. I can't play that song, but someday it might be heard again. They're not forgotten. Midnight Oil's 'Beds Are Burning' and Sinead O'Connor's 'Nothing Compares 2 U' were burnt for a while – people liked them, but they were fried. I recently put them into my secondary library, and they sound good again after the rest."

NEW ROCK

Adding, Subtracting

Stapleford doesn't have any problems with adding gold titles he never played as currents. He recalls, "We didn't play the first **Black Crowes** album, but when we added 'Remedy' and it got requests, I added 'Hard To Handle' and 'She Talks To Angels' to the library, even though I never played them before. We play so much new music; we need the anchors. That's the library's purpose.

"Right now we're in a period of strong currents that will become strong recurrents, then strong library songs. In about a month, I'll have 20 titles to put in my library and 20 to take out. I've taken out a lot of bands that never went anywhere – I can't even remember who they were. And we used to play Genesis, but I don't think we'll play them anymore because they've turned into a bland AC-type band."

Mike Summers

"I've made adjustments, making sure songs don't play too often or in specific dayparts," explains KXRK (X-96)/Salt Lake City PD Mike Summers. "In working with Selector, I've discovered that having a wide variety of artists helps the scheduling process. The core doesn't get burned completely with the 12-15 artists we play constantly. But there aren't a lot of things I schedule 24 hours a day, seven days a week. "I have 2500 titles in my data-

"I have 2500 titles in my database, although only 600-800 are in active rotation. It won't get much larger, because as I add artists, tracks are subtracted from other artists. I base my gold on artists — I don't get rid of many artists, just the irrelevant tracks. Most of those are album tracks that only get played six to eight times a year. They're used to expose artists who

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are relevant at the time. The active library changes about every eight to 10 days.

"It takes a long time for a recurrent to turn into a gold. It really depends on what the artist is doing. I have Cure and Depeche Mode songs from their last couple of records that are still in recurrent. I look at it every month and base my decision on: Will there be anything else from the album? Are they producing? Is it something I want to give more exposure?"

Summers uses the same basic gold categories as Stapleford. "I

move bands back and fourth between categories. I have 10-15 primary artists — some of which have 25-35 songs rotating — scheduled 60% of the time. Obviously, we play a lot more New Order than Jesus Jones, based on the artists' longevity. Secondary has about 40-50 artists scheduled 35-40% of the time. Tertiary consists of 40-70 artists scheduled 25% of the time. Many of these artists are bands in limbo."

One-Shot Wonders

Summers programs 50-75 "oneshot wonders" once an hour during the week and twice an hour on weekends (including Fridays). "We have an audience that enjoys artists from 10 years ago – for instance, **Dexy's Midnight Runners**' 'Come On Eileen.' These have a rest category like the rest of the library. Songs move in and out based mostly on gut reaction. These songs are limited because the majority of my audience isn't familiar with them.

"I also have a daily feature called 'File 13' for the station's early '80s library. I stole it from [MD] George Gimarc at the Edge [KDGE/Dallas] a long time ago. It's worked well for showcasing rare and live tracks that don't warrant regular rotation . . . for example, a live Cure album called 'En-

treat' or Rhino's 'D.I.Y.' series. The majority of our audience isn't familiar with what's gone on in the past like the junkies and core audience. This category is played only five to six times a day – rotating every eight to 10 days."

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Summers feels research is necessary, but bases many of his decisions on gut. "I'm not looking forward to what research is going to tell me. I still count on the jocks. They have the best feel as to what's going on. They talk to the listeners constantly and get valuable info from them. The most important thing a PD can do is step away from the station as much possible and make it for the listeners."

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THE HIRING GAME

Unsolicited T&Rs Don't Go Go Unnoticed By Programmers

What do PDs do with unsolicited airchecks and resu-

mes?

Since many air personalities become distressed - and possibly discouraged - when those in charge don't respond, three PDs discuss the abundance of unrequested T&Rs and offer advice to job applicants.

Honest Response

WQQK/Nashville PD "Majic" Jackson says, "I respond to every tape I receive. I don't just trash them like some other PDs have been known to do. I don't want someone [believing] no one would respond to their inquiry or that it wasn't received. Frankly, that's how I was treated early in my career; I don't think that type of

treatment is professional. I try to be as honest as possible, so I write a letter to thank them for [considering] our station as a possible place of employment and [inform] them of any openings. I want to treat people the way I wanted to be treated.'

When Jackson hears a tape he likes, he writes the person's name on his "hit list": "Things happen quickly in our industry, so I keep a list of people I would hire if a posi-

tion opens. I tell people they're going into my ready-access file. which is constantly updated. I also tell them to call me if anything changes - like their phone numbers or if they've changed jobs so I can stay up to date with them. This helps me respond rapidly when I need to find someone."

Jackson shares his opinion on what comprises a good aircheck and resume. "An aircheck should be short - no longer than five minutes. Some people think more is better; in my opinion, that's not the case. PDs don't have a lot of time - if you don't make an impression within the first two minutes, it's over. PDs have other tapes to listen to and other duties to perform."

According to Jackson, applicants' resumes should include "good, concise, honest, and verifiable information about [their] professional careers.'

Talent Test

WILD/Boston PD Steven Hill likes to receive unsolicited airchecks. "Two of my fulltime personalities were hired [after they sent unsolicited tapes]," Hill notes. "One day a week, I listen to airchecks to see if anyone has the talent to work here. Then I separate who I can and can't use if an opening occurs.

'While I'm listening to airchecks, I call the people who have potential and tell them what I like about their tapes. I also give them advice if they ask for it. When we don't have any openings, I tell people I'll get in touch with them [when we do]. I also recommend other places to try if I know other PDs are looking for on-air talent at that time."

Hill adds, "Just because a PD doesn't get back to you in a week or two doesn't always mean that PD has forgotten about your aircheck or your work. Our afternoon person was hired one year after sending an unsolicited aircheck to our station." And what about those people who don't register high on Hill's talent meter? "I must admit I'm

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I want to hear a person's show, not a 'best of' collection. I want to hear how people recover from mistakes . . . That [proves] what they can and can't do. — Steven Hill

not consistent with writing letters or calling people who send unsolicited airchecks; I don't have an assistant to help me. I do keep all the airchecks I receive for about a month. When [prospects] calls me, I can listen and respond immediately - but only if they take the time to call me.

"It's really surprising how many people send unsolicited airchecks don't follow up with a phone call. If you want someone to take the time to listen to your aircheck, you should be willing to call and find out [your status]. When prospects follow up, they show me they are the types of people who will follow through on assignments as employees here at the station."

Hill believes applicants' resumes are secondary to their tapes. "I'll always pop in the tape to take a lis-

ten before I even look at the resume. I want to hear personality. I also want to hear people who know the music and the cities they're

working in. This comes through in what they say and how they say it. Hopefully, I'll hear some of those things in the first few breaks."

A short tape also is in order, ac-cording to Hill. "The first couple of breaks should be killers. I want to hear a person's show, not a 'best of' collection. I know something is remiss if I don't hear a mistake in the presentation. I want to hear how people recover from mistakes and how they sound when making adjustments; that [proves] what they can and can't do. I want to hear what's real about them on the air. I don't want to hear a cut-up tape anybody can do that."

Avoiding The Masses

KYEA (K98-FM)/Monroe, LA PD Rockey Love holds applicants' cover letters in high esteem. "I want to see who's sending [tapes]

and why. Since I don't receive many unsolicited tapes and resumes, applicants are looking where they think they may have a better chance of getting someone's attention - and, possibly, a [job]. Then I listen to the tape to see what they sound like and what they have to offer as an air talent.'

Love believes an aircheck should be no longer than three minutes and adds, "If someone's tape and resume impress me, I immediately give that applicant a call. In our business, things can change at a moment's notice. If we have an opening at that time, I invite the person to come by and talk to me. If we don't have any openings, I still let applicants know I like what they do and want to stay in touch with them; we'll already be communicating with each other if something opens up later."

Love responds to all aircheck submissions, regardless of their quality. "It's important for talent to know someone cares about their feelings and is taking the time to listen to their airchecks. People in positions of authority must realize they're dealing with other human beings who'd like to be treated in a thoughtful manner. When I was

trying to get my first gig in the industry, I often got no response to my tape and resume; I don't want to treat people like that. I want applicants to know the human side of radio is still in our business - we are a people business, first and foremost."

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

New Day Dawns For WKHX & WYAY

Cap Cities/ABC's Schrutt discusses Atlanta duopoly

Cap Cities/ABC and **NewCity**'s nine-year battle for Country supremacy in Atlanta has been one of the most fierce in Country radio history. In this age of duopoly, however, that war is about to conclude: About a month ago, Cap Cities/ABC – owner of Country combo WKHX-AM & FM – purchased WYAY from NewCity for a reported \$19 million

Prior to the sale, the ratings lead often changed hands: WKHX-FM had the upper hand during the early years, increasing its lead after the purchase of Country WPLO and its subsequent simulcast as WKHX (AM). The tide shifted dramatically when NewCity bought WYAI; it was a masterful preduopoly maneuver enabling NewCity to cover a part of WKHX's stronghold where WYAY had a weak signal. WYAY & WYAI went on to beat WKHX-AM & FM many times. The battle also has involved the morning men. WYAY's Rhubarb Jones often had things his own way until WKHX's Moby arrived from AOR KLOL/Houston two years ago. The mornings have belonged to WKHX ever since.

As the war comes to a close, Cap Cities/ABC President/Group II and WKHX-AM & FM President/ GM Norm Schrutt outlines his plans for the company's duopoly and offers his thoughts on the nineyear battle with WYAY & WYAI:

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If you had one highly rated morning guy named Moby and another named Rhubarb, which station would you tilt younger?

R&R: How does it feel to know you'll soon have control of all Country radio stations — and the 14 shares they deliver (12+, Fall '92 **Arbitron**) — in the nation's 12th largest city?

NS:It took me two days to wipe the smile off my face. But we're not going to [change] the competitive mode in which both stations have been operating. Somebody might say, "Let's take a shot at those two." Everybody believes they can do it better than the next guy. Who would have ever thought there would be five Country stations in both Dallas and Houston? R&R: When will you take over

WYAY? NS: I'd be surprised if [the FCC approves the sale] before the end

of July. R&R: Are you going to get programming control of WYAY before the actual FCC approval through some kind of LMA arrangement?

NS: No. NewCity will run the station until the deal is final. That's the way we prefer to do it.

R&R: NewCity had a duopoly with WYAY and WYAI. Why didn't you buy WYAI as well?

NS: NewCity acquired WYAI to cover an area where WYAY was weak. In fact, our initial losses [to the combo] came from that area. But WKHX's signal covers that area very well; once WYAI [ceases as a Country outlet], its listeners will go to either WKHX or WYAY. WYAY covers Atlanta's fastestgrowing counties – Gwinnett and Hall counties – very well. Together, WKHX and WYAY will cover the 15 Atlanta counties like the proverbial blanket.

R&R: Will you continue to operate WKHX and WYAY as direct mainstream Country rivals, or will you reposition one or both to cover the entire audience spectrum?

NS: We plan to run them as separate stations in a combined

facility. This actually comes at a good time for both stations: Both are bursting at the seams, and both have equipment that's more than 10 years old. We'll either move to the WYAY facilities [the stations currently are located across the street from each other] or to a different building in the same area, then expand to accommodate our three stations. We'll have the chance to upgrade the equipment on the stations at that time.

R&R: How will the two be positioned from a programming standpoint?

NS: We may tilt one station a little younger. That will give us a traditional Country outlet on the AM, a mainstream station, and one on the young end.

R&R: Which will you skew toward the young end?

NS: If you had one highly rated morning guy named Moby and another named Rhubarb, which station would you tilt younger? The music they play isn't that different; it's mostly a matter of presentation. Therefore, we'll target WKHX to a younger audience.

R&R: You now have two of the most prominent morning personalities in Atlanta. How do you think this new arrangement will affect them?

NS: There's no question they'll be competitors. I have great respect for Rhubarb. In fact, we tried to hire him once. Moby is very special to WKHX. When he came in, he worked hard and played a major role in helping WKHX beat WYAY & WYAI. But Moby and Rhubarb are very different. I'm not sure they laugh at all the same jokes; each has his own style and presentation.

The numbers show people who like Rhubarb and WYAY [only] like Rhubarb and WYAY; those who like Moby and WKHX [only] like Moby and WKHX. The shared

audience is very low: 37% of WYAY's audience listens to WKHX; 22% of WKHX's audience listens to WYAY. As far as I'm concerned, that's a great position for us to be in.

R&R: How would you characterize the stations' nine-year war?

NS: The only wars worth winning are the tough ones – and this has been a tough one. NewCity is a good company that has possessed and used the resources to make this one of the most competitive Country fights in the nation. It's

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been like a chess game; they had us a couple of times, but we were fortunate to have been the one to proclaim "checkmate." Our goal was to keep them at a five share. [We succeeded] until they bought WYAI.

But it's also a credit to the top people at Cap Cities/ABC who let their managers manage and who provide the resources to help us figure it out. When one station fights two others, the one station has to fight hard. Everybody from the receptionist to the top person must be on the stick. If that happens, one can beat two. But it ain't easy – I had hair nine years ago! **R&R:** Isn't the "beat 'em and buy 'em'' scenario a bit familiar to you?

NS: We did it a few years ago in Atlanta when we bought what was then WPLO. And when I was the GM at KZLA/Los Angeles in the early '80s, we bought [crosstown] KLAC.

R&R: Can one company run two stations in the same competitive manner that two separately owned stations run against each other?

NS: It happens all the time. Many companies have an AM and FM fighting for the same demo. And when the 25-54 buy comes along, both hands go up. It's up to the manager to set the standard by which the players operate. The two staffs must not be polarized. Everything from the sizes of departments, offices, and studios to the sizes of the logos must be the same – separate, but equal. If one side has a bell and whistle, the other side must have them, too.

R&R: What's the most important aspect of operating the two FMs?

NS: The most important aspect of *any* station is marketing. You can't walk around afraid to make mistakes. You must continue to be aggressive. Both WKHX and WYAY will remain aggressive; it's that spirit that will galvanize the two stations.

R&R: How will the personnel be divided?

NS: [WKHX-AM & FM] PD Neil McGinley will be the OM for all three stations; we'll hire a PD for WYAY. We'll have separate MDs and promotion directors, but we'll combine sales. There will be one GM.

R&R: There's been a little bad blood over the years — and a few dirty tricks. Do you have any concerns about the relationship between the two staffs as you prepare to bring them into the same building?

NS: There were some black roses and nasty faxes that flew during the very early days of the battle. WYAY was in an attack mode at the time, but we never reacted. Those days have been gone for quite a while. Things have been on an extremely professional level in recent years. Since WKHX and WYAY will be

Since WKHX and WYAY will be run as two separate stations, there will be some fighting for promotions and dollars. If we can't reach the ideal case of melding the two into a camaraderie, at least we'll strive for mutual respect. Daddy's just gonna have to put his arms around both kids – and there's enough of me to go around.

BNA Entertainment is betting the dance promotion created around John Anderson's new single will be "Money In The Bank." Melanie Greenwood (of "Achy Breaky" dance fame) choreographed a line dance titled Breakin' The Bank" to the tune, and it will appear on Vol. III of her "Hot Country Dancin'" instructional dance videos.

As part of the "Breakin' The Bank" promotion, the label has elected to hold a dance contest in 50 clubs nationwide. Country Club Enterprizes' Wynn Jackson and AristoMedia's Jeff Walker were recruited to service the clubs with an instructional video, CD single, and song video. 

How To Handle Those Swinging '60s

Nearly 30 years have passed since the British Invasion, and many ACs still play music from that era. Although some AC PDs insist '60s music doesn't mesh well on contemporary stations, others remain loyal proponents. Here's a look at both sides of the issue.

"Not playing '60s music makes us different from many other [market] stations," maintains KSTP-FM/Minneapolis PD Bob Davis, who formerly programmed [Gold] WWSW/Pittsburgh. "People can hear '60s music on the other AC [WLTE] or the well-programmed Gold station [KQQL]. We aren't going to 'out-gold' them, so why try?

"Research also indicates that our core listeners don't feel '60s music is as powerful as '70s and '80s music. Our female listeners aren't very interested in '60s music. With our target, the really great '80s power oldies test as well or better."

Satisfying Expectations

KSTP-FM plays early '70s music, but that's where it draws the line. "If a Gold station is programmed correctly, it can make a strong statement for what it is. Any station playing oldies to compete

with the market's Gold station won't help itself."

Content with his station's '70s, '80s, and '90s configuration, Davis comments, "You must give your audience what they expect from you. We play adult music . . . without the rap, hard rock – or '60s music. 66

"There's enough '80s music we haven't touched yet that can be expanded. The danger with AC is that it may get too narrow and burn out. We can't ignore 35-44s, especially females. This format needs the older demo to survive."

Change Is Possible

An important key to KSTP-FM's music equation is the market's current complexion. "Without a Gold station in town, I'd definitely play '60s music. The absence of a Gold

station would probably cause the market's ACs to pursue older demos. The great thing about oldies is that they [attract] older demos. I'd try to occupy as much of that territory as possible. "But there's a big problem when you put '60s music on a Mix AC the station becomes very broad. It's difficult to tie everything together. Playing '60s music on an AC is like a Gold station playing [dated] '50s music.

"This format is so unpredictable – playing '60s music sometimes works. At one time, it was OK to do so on KSTP-FM; it may be OK in the future. It doesn't fit what we're doing now, but I'd never say it's right or wrong."

KJSN Feasts On Older Songs

K Paying '60s music is another course we offer on our menu," notes **KJSN/Modesto**, **CA** PD **Gary Michaels**, who believes '60s oldies appeal to 35-54s adults. KJSN placed first in last fall's **Arbitron** among 25-54s and 35-64s.

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"The occasional 'oh wow!' song is very nice for in-office listening. Oldies tend to work better in highly ethnic markets. They do especially well here because of the large Hispanic population [approximately 40%]. There's a certain type and texture of music we program. Since our music mix is about 90% of what we do, we're careful about the '60s

Accent On Dayparting

music we pick

Commenting on the placement of the station's approximately 150 '60s songs, Michaels notes, "They're strategically placed — we try to target different audiences in different [dayparts].

"The **Carpenters** are too wimpy [for morning and afternoon drive], so we put them in middays and overnights. I'll play 'The Letter' **[Box Tops]** on weekends, but it's too rough to play during the week. The beauty of AC is that we can fall back on oldies when current [product] isn't very good."

Acknowledging that other ACs may purposely avoid '60s music,

Michaels opines, "We bring a 'hipness' to a Soft AC. Our musical depth is greater than the traditional

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300 safe records." For those interested in incorporating '60s gold into their libraries, Michaels urges that songs should not "sound archaic. The further back in time you go, the more [important it is] that the song was a hit. But chart position doesn't always dictate relevance."

Trolling For Timeless Tunes

A typical WLTT/Washington music clock includes one '60s tune per hour.

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"There's a trend for some ACs to play music only from the '70s, '80s, and '90s. But '60s music is important to [WLTT's] sound," comments PD Chuck Morgan.

"Our music's tested frequently, and in these tests, we ask people if they feel '60s music fits. By a large majority, the answer is yes. I don't think '60s records have been overplayed here. When WYNY/New York was AC, they'd play four '60s songs an hour – if ACs did that today, listeners would tell us to [stop]."

According to Morgan, females are more likely to appreciate music from that era. "[25-54 females] tend to accept them more than males. Even some younger women we test don't object to these songs. We turn over the '60s music category several times a week, compared to a day and a daypart with our power gold."

Like KSTP-FM/Minneapolis PD Bob Davis (see top left), Morgan is faced with a fulltime Gold competitor (WXTR) that plays a significant amount of '60s product. Additionally, Washington is home to a crowded AC field that includes WLTT, WASH, WGAY, and WRQX.

"Our perceptual and music research remind us that we have to be careful about the types of music we play," explains Morgan. "Our audience strongly suggests we continue playing '60s music. But if the music sounds dated, our audience won't be interested in it. We yank songs that are no longer appropriate.

"Listeners want music that has a contemporary feel to it and fits in 1993. There must be a timeless quality to it. You'd expect us to play Beatles and Motown music." some ACs to play music only from the '70s, '80s, and '90s. But '60s music is important to [WLTT's] sound. -Chuck Morgan

Are You Ready For Liddy?

Fourteen months ago, renowned Watergate figure G. Gordon Liddy debuted a midday talk show on Infinity's WJFK/Washington. "Radio Free D.C." was an instant hit with young men - such a hit that this week (4/15), Unistar was slated to begin distributing the show nationwide.

Should you consider Liddy for your lineup? Would he pose a serious threat in a competitor's hands? To help you decide, I present the answers to some of the questions most frequently asked about Liddy's program.

NATIONAL GABFEST DEBUTS

Q: How has Liddy done in Washington?

A. In the Fall '92 Arbitron. WJFK was No. 1 with men 25-54 in middays, a period encompassing Liddy's 11am-2:30pm show as well as Howard Stern's last hour (or so) and the Don Geronimo and Mike O'Meara show's first 30 minutes.


While WJFK was No. 1 with men 25-54 in both drivetimes, the Liddydominated middays generated the station's biggest numbers - a 10+ 25-54 figure that put him marginally ahead of Stern and two full shares beyond Geronimo and O'Meara.

And those numbers are holding. WJFK finished No. 1 in middays with men 18+ in both the January and February Arbitrends. It was No. 2 with persons 25-54 in January and No. 1 in February.

Q: Is there a pattern here or are these numbers a fluke?

A: Liddy has only three full books under his belt Spring, Summer, and Fall '92.

In the spring book - which was marked by a ton of publicity for the show - Liddy was No. 1 with men 25-54, scoring in the mid-sevens.



That was followed by a dreadful summer book in which all of WJFK's numbers tumbled precipitously. Despite a huge gain among men 18-24, Liddy lost half his male 25-54 audience. WJFK GM Ken Stevens blames the setback - which was more than overcome in the fall on summer listening patterns and diary placement.

Q: Does Liddy really beat Rush Limbaugh?

A: The fall book marked Liddy's first clear victory over Limbaugh. Liddy lured significantly more men 25-54 in each of their two full hours of head-to-head combat. Although Rush scored a narrow victory in males 35-64, Liddy ran away with men 18-49.

Bear in mind that Liddy follows Stern (No. 1 among men 25-54), while Limbaugh is preceded by an interview show with mediocre ratings in that demo.

to challenge their statements, Liddy is unfailingly polite to callers . maybe too polite at times. He's slow to interrupt ramblers and will answer the same question over and over during the same segment. Nevertheless, phone segments tend to be the best parts of Liddy's show because they showcase his quirky personality.

Q: How does Liddy's style compare with Limbaugh's?

A: It's very different. While both are extremely entertaining, conservative personalities, Liddy generally takes a more serious, sober tone than Limbaugh.

Liddy's show also lacks the slick production and flawless delivery of Limbaugh's program. There are no preproduced bits, song parodies, or hip bumpers. It's not unusual to hear Liddy knock the mike or fumble with his headphones.

Because he's not a radio veteran, Liddy has no qualms about breaking programming rules. Some of the resulting innovations have proven successful. For example, Liddy spends roughly the first hour of his show reading newspaper articles to his audience. While that could make for tedious listening, it works well for Liddy. In fact, WJFK staffers say listeners consistently identify that segment as one of their favorite parts of the show

Q: Reads the newsmaper? Is this guy an over-serious stiff?

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A: No. Liddy's a born showman. Some of his monologues are absolutely gripping. He also has a quick wit and a self-deprecating sense of humor

Q: So what's the worst part of the show?

A: You think I'm going to answer that? Don't you realize that Liddy knows 412 ways to kill a man with his bare hands and wrote an autobiography ("Will") that Bob Woodward described as "a study in psychopathology?"

But seriously, the one minor weakness in Liddy's act is his tendency to fade into the background while moderating on-air debates. While it's nice of him to let his guests make their arguments, the show isn't as captivating when Liddy strolls offstage.

Q: Does Liddy still use the show to peddle his version of Watergate?

A: No. During his first few months on the air, Liddy beat that drum obsessively. In one of its few interventions, WJFK management asked Liddy to limit his Watergate talk and John Dean-bashing. Of course, if callers to the national show want to talk about it . .

Q: What happens if I take Liddy's show and later drop it?

A: Liddy and his son, a Navy SEAL, will do a night parachute drop onto your transmitter site, blow up your tower, and hold your overnight board op hostage. If that doesn't bring you around, you'll get a call from the one person even Liddy fears - Mel Karmazin.

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NAC/CONTEMPORARY JAZZ

Hybrids: The Best Of Both Worlds?

"Yes, but is it jazz?" That's a familiar refrain to anyone involved with jazz music, be it on the radio side or the records side. And it's an especially pertinent question as a new breed of Contemporary Jazz/NAC hybrid stations blur the genre's formatic lines.

When Bernie and Jane Perry bought WOTB/Providence in 1986, they committed to programming some form of jazz. But they couldn't decide whether to lean in an NAC or Contemporary Jazz direction. WOTB PD Bill Gray reflects, "When I came to WOTB last May, the station had gone back and forth between NAC and CJ for years. I wanted to focus it and make it more accessible.

"This is a business. We're not lucky enough to be state- or federally-funded. We can't play whatever we want – we have to get numbers. I decided to start playing more familiar cuts, fewer extended jams, and fewer solos. It made the station more listenable. Our TSL has increased and our ratings are improving." In fact, WOTB posted the most dramatic improvement of any CJ/NAC in the Fall '92 Arbitrons, jumping to No. 13 after a No. 25 showing in Fall '91.



marginal music as well. We take the best of both worlds. People wonder how you can play contemporary jazz and NAC and the same time and make it fit. The secret lies in dayparting.

"I know the sound I want on the air. If a CD has a track that matches that sound, we add it. We stay away from labeling artists as NAC artists or Contemporary Jazz artists. We simply decide whether the music fits our station or not. We don't play some records that chart in the Top 10 at both NAC and Contemporary Jazz because they don't fit. It's not really a rule, but if a track is five minutes or less, has a melody, and doesn't have any blaring solos, we can probably play it.



"Some people call what we do 'Smooth Jazz.' We're really a combination of all the different flavors of jazz. We do the bluesy stuff, the urban stuff, the fusion, and we play pop artists who have delved into the jazz arena. One thing that separates us from a 'pure' Contemporary Jazz station is that we play a lot of vocals. We play about five or six an hour in the drives and four per hour in middays and evenings. Basia, Sade, Carmen Bradford, Al Jarreau, and Kenia are some examples of vocal artists you'll hear on the station. Basia might be considered a core NAC artist, but we'll play her alongside John Pizzarelli and Nancy Wilson."

Mood Swings

Combining contemporary jazz and NAC music allows WOTB to adopt different personalities throughout the day. "A station is

like a human being," says Gray. "In the morning, when you're getting ready to go to work, you want something peppy. So the music we play in the mornings is uptempo and we have more of a latin flavor. We keep this uptempo approach through morning drive, then we bring the tempo down a little bit in middays. That's when we'll throw in some of the melodic contemporary jazz stuff. For example, Gene Harris can be played during middays along with David Sanborn, Grover Washington, or Steely Dan.

"The longer tracks play at night because the listener has more time to listen at night. We play more blues and mainstream jazz artists at night. As we get to 9pm, we slow the tempo down to do our version of 'Quiet Storm.' We don't get as urban as most quiet storms; we stick with more soft, melodic jazz."

Cool World

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Along with the changes in the music mix, WOTB altered its identity when it chose to take the hybrid approach. Gray explains, "We were calling the station 'Rhode Island's Jazz Station.' Now we identify it as '100.3 Cool FM.' The transition seemed to cause some confusion, so we made an effort to push the call letters and our positioning statements on the air.

"It all goes back to basic formatics. You play good, familiar music and you tell the audience what they're listening to. We do frontsells, backsells, and IDs as often as we can. We came up with an ID – "Serving three states, two islands, and a sailing paradise" –

that's unique and memorable, yet conveys the feeling of the station."

When it switched, the station had problems with some of its older listeners who still wanted more traditional jazz. "They wanted to hear the Miles Davis and Coltrane extended jams," says Gray. "It's not the same station they were used to, but they seem to like the new direction. We don't target any specific demographic other than the 25-54s this format pulls. But we're very strong 35-54 and we're hoping to pick up some more listeners in the 25-54 range. The familiarity of the music has made us very strong with women and we're holding on to the men from before."



Gray thinks stations like WOTB are a natural offshoot for NAC or Contemporary Jazz stations. "We're going to see more and more of these hybrid stations. Radio's a business and you have to adapt with the times. Listeners pay our

salaries, not sales departments. If you aren't reaching them, it's not going to work. But you have to find some middle ground. Listeners' tastes are changing. I remember when NAC was all waterfalls and rainbows – everything used to be Windham Hill and Narada. Now it's all over the place."

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Niche In Time

Why did JAZZ-FM 103.1/Los Angeles PD Lawrence Tanter and station owner **Ken Roberts** decide to go with a CJ/NAC hybrid approach? "We didn't have too many directions to go in when we were looking at formats," says Tanter. "We could have been the market's fifth AC or sixth AOR. We decided to go with something that filled a



"Frank Cody of Broadcast Architecture handled the research. It showed us that, with the loss of

"There's a well-positioned and well-programmed NAC station already entrenched in this market [KTWV (The Wave)]. On the jazz side of things, there's KLON/Long Beach. Consequently, there was a void. Research told us there was room for a facility that would incorporate elements of both stations, combined with elements of the two defunct stations, KKGO and KACE."

Without A Net

With the decision made to go with a hybrid approach, Tanter began the daunting task of selecting the music. "This format presents enormous programming challenges. Every CD has to be listened to with the competition in mind. You can't lean too far one way or another because you'll confuse the listener. We can't play music that's too synthesizer-based because of the New Age connotations; conversely, we can't play music with too much improvisation that'll appeal only to the jazz listeners.

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NAC is going through a major metamorphosis right now. We're moving away from the ambient, New Age material that used to dominate the format and toward more saxophone-, keyboard-, and guitar-based music. -Lawrence Tanter

ing about a 70/30 ratio of instrumentals to vocals now. We do a lot of dayparting, but we try to maintain one station personality 24 hours a day. There's obviously a difference in the music's tempo throughout the day, but we don't lean NAC in the morning and Jazz at night."

Border Crossing

Tanter sees the widening of NAC's boundaries as encouraging. "NAC's going through a major metamorphosis right now. We're moving away from the ambient, New Age material that used to dominate the format toward more saxophone-, keyboard-, and guitarbased music. If you can have facilities like KBLX/San Francisco, KOAI [The Oasis]/Dallas, and WQCD [CD 101.9]/New York all under the same umbrella, this is healthy.

"There shouldn't be a cookiecutter approach to this. We have to push the envelope if this format's going to be successful. This exists in CHR, AOR, and Urban... why shouldn't it exist in NAC? NAC is the most embryonic of the formats. Every time there's a new movement within the format, people look at it and think this fragmentation is odd, when it's really just a natural evolution. JAZZ-FM was designed in layers: the layer we launched with, the second layer, the third layer, and so on. The envelope is still unfolding."

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

There are some artists I can't program at all because it would send out a signal that we're not really a Jazz station. For instance, it's difficult for me to program Sade because she leans pop. Her crossover success has moved her into the mainstream, and you can't afford to offend your core listeners. You have to massage these core listeners and be very careful with the peripheral elements you bring in.

"This is still an instrumentalbased format and vocals are an added sprinkle. One of the challenges I've faced is getting the right amount of vocals. We're play-
