As Heritage Rockers Go More Modern, Classic Outlets Go More Current

Until recently, currents were the last thing listeners expected from a classic rock station. Often, they were also the last thing one expected from many heritage album rockers. But as an increasing number of mainstream rockers lean harder and more modern, a hole has developed for several classic rockers to play new music.

Some classic rockers, such as KRQR San Francisco and WYSP Philadelphia, have evolved into full-blown rockers, while others, such as KSD St. Louis and WNCX Cleveland, mix classic rock with a small amount of current music. Most of their choices in new music are from mainstream or classic artists or the most traditional-sounding modern hits, although all the PDs interviewed for this article stress that this is a song-to-song proposition.

KRQR PD John McCrae credits his station's shift to "a process of societal evolution. The world is moving forward

in all aspects. The listening audience has moved forward. This is true of [people] 25-plus. While they may listen to classic rock and enjoy it as an ingredient [in their lives], everything else about their world is about here and now, and you have to be in sync with that. You cannot afford to be some kind of specialty cable channel that only deals in American movie classics if you're going to be a viable part of their everyday lives. [The music] has to be part of the world they wake up in every morning."

KSD PD Steve Brill agrees. "We found ourselves with a radio station that had a lot of heritage in the market that people really wanted to like, but we were somehow . . . missing the mark. We weren't getting anybody really passionate about the radio station. It's pretty hard to have a successful radio station without those passionate P1 listeners . . . After five or six [focus] groups, the theme was pretty clear. Listeners just couldn't get it all [from us]. We were still

Harrisburg, Scranton Feel Effects Of Flood

The Northeast has had its fill of acts of God this winter, and Harrisburg, Pa., took a major hit this past weekend, as melting snow caused major floods. Most stations in the area stayed on the air throughout the flood, providing essential information to residents. The damage in the disaster area, according to local reports, is estimated at \$700 million.

Lost in the devastation was the Walnut Street Bridge, which was the site of WTPA's "bras across the Susquehanna" stunt last year. The 200-year-old structure was carried downstream and collided with the Market Street Bridge, which sustained little damage.

According to WTPA PD Chris James, the station will raise money for flood victims through

the American Red Cross with flood relief T-shirts. WTPA and modern WQXA (the Edge) aired information on the flood's progress and where residents could pick up drinking water.

Edge promotion director Lenny Diana was evacuated from his home on Saturday and spent most of the weekend at the radio station. His home ended up undamaged, but a few blocks away, Harrisburg mayor Steven Reed was flooded out of his own house.

The transmitter of album rocker WEZX Scranton, Pa.'s sister AM WBAX fell victim to the flood's onslaught. It was submerged, knocking the station off the air. WEZX PD Rob Lipshutz and staff are currently working on ways to help flood victims.

Mancow Decals Make it To NYC; Will He Follow?

A speculation about the future of Evergreen Media's **WYNY** New York continues, The New York Daily News reports that somebody has distributed professional-looking decals reading "Mancow's Morning Madhouse IS Coming, Rock 103.5" in New York. Evergreen's new corporate promotions person **Bev Tilden** says she's received the decals, too. No word yet on whether **Mancow** will really end up on **WYNY** or anywhere else in New York. Meanwhile, Evergreen has closed on its purchase of Pyramid Broadcasting's 12 stations.

Following the Group W/CBS merger, **Rod Calarco**, VP of the CBS-owned FM stations, will exit Feb. 2. CBS station group president **Dan Mason** assumes his duties.

Brown Broadcasting names **AC KRWM** (Warm 106.9) Seattle GM **Dennis Gwiazdon** GM of its classic rock **KGB** San Diego. He replaces **Tom Baker**, now GM at **KGON/KNRK** Portland, Ore.

TK Communications names **Mark Krieger** VP/GM of modern **WSHE** Miami, replacing **Gary Lewis**, who is now GM at classic rock **WZGC** (Z93) Atlanta.

Lee Zapis is upped to president of **Zapis Broadcasting**, owners of **WAAF** Boston and **WRKU** Youngstown, Ohio.

Southern Broadcasting, owners of album **WTKX** (TK101) Pensacola, Fla., have announced plans to acquire crosstown modern **WOWW** from SunGroup Inc., creating the market's first FM duopoly.

Flinn Broadcasting names **Kaysie Plummer** VP/GM of its properties, including modern **KDRE** Little Rock, Ark., and **WNWZ/KFTH** Memphis. Plummer relocated from San Diego, where she worked for **Shadow Broadcasting** as an account executive.

Album **WWBR** Birmingham, Ala., flips to modern as **WRAX** (106X) under **Jacobs Media** and former **WAVF** Charleston, S.C., PD **Dave Rossi**, who assumes the corporate PD title for **American General Media** (the station is in a joint sales agreement with **Dick Broadcasting**, owners of classic rock **WZRR**). The station will run jockless while the staff is re-evaluated. PD **Walt Brown** stays on for now. Birmingham was one of the last of the top 50 markets without a modern rocker.

Modern **WROX** (96X) Norfolk, Va., names morning man **Perry Stone** PD. **KDGE** (the Edge) Dallas PD **Joel Folger** will consult.

'70s rocker **WING-FM** Dayton, Ohio, names former **WMMS** Cleveland and **WEBN** Cincinnati programmer **Michael Luczak** to its newly created PD slot.

New York market legend **Vin Scelsa** will move to triple-A **WNEW** Jan. 28. Scelsa had been doing his show, "Idiot's Delight," a mixture of live performances, interviews, music, and book readings on crosstown **WXRK** (K-Rock) from 1985 until the station's change to modern Jan. 5. Scelsa, who had been an **WNEW** staple in the mid-'70s and early '80s, won't be able to bring the show name with him.

At modern **WDRE** Long Island, N.Y., promotion director **Nancy Gambino** and assistant MD **Andre Ferro** exit. Elsewhere in the New York area, suburban rocker **WRGX** (X107) moves evening jock **Reno** to p.m. drive, overnight host **Savage** to evenings, and promotion/production staffer **Chase** fills overnights.

Modern **WRXS** (X106.9) Ocean City, Md., ended up flagged with a page 5(b) note by Arbitron for a promo it ran last fall telling listeners, "If you're participating in the Arbitron radio survey, lift that heavy pen, and fill out that very important diary. Remember, according to the gods at Arbitron, if you're an adult between the ages of 18 and 24, you don't exist." Other 5(b) notes went to triple-A **KMTT** Seattle, for comments in a station magazine about the importance of filling out diaries, and to **KSD** St. Louis, for a joke about diary tampering on the station's Internet World Wide Web site!

AC WGES Oswego, N.Y., officially becomes part of **Ed Levine's** multitiered Syracuse/Utica, N.Y., empire. It flips to classic rock as "TK105," simulcasting **WTKW** (TK99) Syracuse... Following the station's sale to **Patterson Broadcasting**, **Steve Miller** becomes GM of **KRZR** Fresno, Calif., replacing **Chris Pacheco**.

Adult modern **WJBX** Fort Myers, Fla., has some lineup changes in the wake of PD/morning host **Lingo's** exit. MD **Michelle Buczynski** is acting PD/p.m. drive host. Midday host **John Nichols** and morning co-host **Pat Ray** switch shifts.

Modern **KEGE** Minneapolis loses promotion director **Scott Leif** to the same duties at classic rock **WZLX** Boston. PD **John Lassman** needs to hear from potential replacements... **KDGE** Dallas is looking for a night jock, as MD **Jay Michaels** comes off the air.

Art Phillips is promoted from account manager to national account manager for **Rock Airplay Monitor** in Los Angeles.

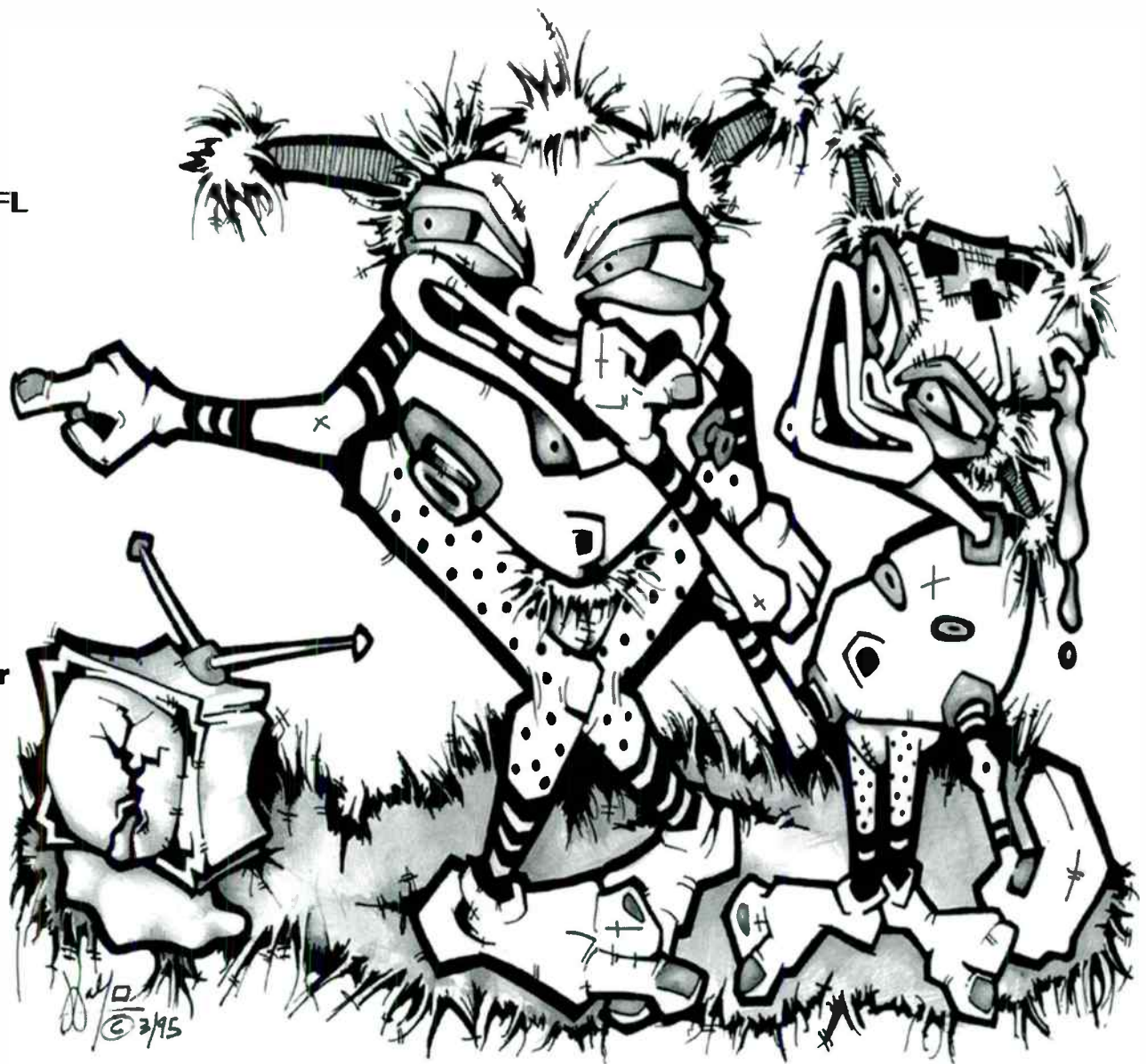

Harder-Leaning Mainstream Outlets Open Modern Hole For Classic Rockers

a choice for those listeners, [but] we just weren't holding their interest. The common denominator was, "There's some really good new music out there that we can't hear on your radio station."

WNCX PD Bob Neuman saw a practical need to add currents, "because [rival] WMMS abandoned 20 years of their heritage [to go modern rock], and there are a lot of people who want to hear new songs from classic artists."

The musical parameters of stations vary, with WNCX and KSD each playing one current and two recurrents an hour. In addition, Neuman says, "we play a lot of stuff that wasn't considered classic rock two years ago, like Def Leppard, Guns N' Roses, and Metallica."

"There's still a place for Crosby, Stills & Nash on this station, even though it's a very small place. It also varies by daypart... You wouldn't hear it at night. The average year on this station is 1979. We don't play a lot of '60s stuff."

McCrae, whose station is still "evolving," no longer plays Bob Seger or John Mellencamp and plays limited tracks by the Rolling Stones, Eric Clapton, or "bands like the Cars. It's a sonic similarity. You need [to find songs] that will fit between 'I Got It' and 'Possum Kingdom.'"

Brill agrees. "I don't think you can go from Crosby, Stills & Nash to Pearl Jam, but I do think you can go from Led Zeppelin to the Gin Blossoms or Pearl Jam. A lot of that older, dated music just didn't have the right feel. [Crosby, Stills & Nash and some Beatles songs] just don't translate anymore."

"A lot of classic rock stations in the past that have flirted with trying to play current music defined it by saying, 'We'll play something new by a classic artist.' That meant, quite frankly, we played a lot of crap. Stuff like the new Tom Petty works for us, [and] we're also finding great success with Hootie & the Blowfish, Gin Blossoms, Pearl Jam, and Stone Temple Pilots. [They] fit into the mix very well."

So how have listeners reacted? In the fall book, the 12-plus number for KSD rose half a share to 3.4; WNCX was down 6.2-5.8; KRQR fell 1.6-1.3; and WYSP nudged up 5.0-5.1, remaining the market's No. 1 rocker.

KRQR's McCrae says, "[When we] began incorporating recurrent rock titles from Pearl Jam, Soundgarden, and Stone Temple Pilots, [they

were] met with some positive response, and in mid-November, we went with a full-tilt active rock mentality." After that, he says, he's seen "a consistent and steady increase in come over the last three months. That's the first indication of audience [response], and that will lead to higher time spent listening."

Like WYSP, WNCX runs Howard Stern's morning show, and WNCX's come has risen in the last year, according to Neuman. "Other dayparts have gone up, while Howard fluctuates," he says, which is a different story from most stations running Stern.

Brill says, "We gained almost instant recognition out of the box for the changes and based upon the fall book. People caught on pretty quickly." The station called back the people who participated in its focus groups to see how the change was perceived. "The acceptance level was 97%. We're off and running at a good clip." KSD enjoyed a large come before the change, and that helped it along, Brill says. "Not every classic rock station is going to be in the healthy position we were in."

Asked about reimagining a longtime classic rocker on the air, McCrae says, "We have dropped [our longtime] 'the Rocker' slogan on the air, [but] not because of its hardness. The station has been 'the Rocker' since 1982, and that conjures up all the baggage of the past, which includes a heavy reliance on classic rock." The station's new position and image will be rolled out in February.

Brill repositioned KSD slightly, from "Classic Rock 93.7" to "Rock 93.7," and changed the voice of the station from Chris Corley to John Wells. The station now positions itself as "today's rock and killer classics."

WNCX has not abandoned the classic rock positioner, although it uses that term less and favors the simpler "98.5 NCX" instead.

As classic rockers move toward the mainstream, many end up where a liberal heritage rock outlet might have been three years ago. So will we see the day when classic and heritage rockers become one format? As Neuman says, "It's a very blurred line. They're almost the same. It depends on how much modern rock a heritage rocker is going to play, and that varies from market to market. I see classic rock stations becoming the heritage mainstream rock stations and mainstream rock stations becoming more alternative."

ROCK GODZ

The New Edge Vs. The Original Edge In Providence "Death Match" (Sorta)

For years, the only modern rocker in Providence, R.I., was Brown University's student-staffed commercial outlet WBRU. That changed last June, when WDGE (the Edge) signed on. In the summer '95 Arbitrons, the Edge debuted with a 2.6 share 12-plus to WBRU's 3.3. In the fall, WDGE pulled ahead with 2.9 to WBRU's 2.6.

There's a certain irony here. In the late '80s, WBRU was the first client of Jacobs Media's the Edge format. Now, it's competing with a newer Edge client, but both WDGE PD Brent Peterson and WBRU PD Alexa Tobin are careful to minimize what Peterson calls the "steel-cage death match" aspects of the competition.

"[WBRU] is a college station and not necessarily direct competition for us," Peterson says. "I don't focus on them at all. I tune into

Here's the same hour on WBRU: Foo Fighters, "I'll Stick Around"; Primal Scream, "Loaded"; Smashing Pumpkins, "Zero"; R.E.M., "What's The Frequency, Kenneth?"; Mike Flowers Pops, "Wonderwall"; Red Hot Chili Peppers, "Aeroplane"; Alanis Morissette, "Hand In My Pocket"; Loud Lucy, "Ticking"; Talking Heads, "Girlfriend Is Better"; Tori Amos, "Caught A Lite Sneeze"; Salt, "Bluster"; Garbage, "Only Happy When It Rains"; U2, "Hold Me, Thrill Me, Kiss Me, Kill Me"; and Ben Folds Five, "Underground."

One place where Peterson and Tobin differ is in their take on the market's concert co-promote situation. Peterson says that WBRU has been aggressive in its attempts to secure co-promotes and caused "a lot of political headaches."

But, Tobin says, "there hasn't been [a situation] that's been really ugly [between] us and the Edge." There have been instances where local rock mainstream WHJY, WDGE, and WBRU were all playing a record, so the shows were neutral. For the most part, Tobin says, "we've gotten a fair shake when we've stepped out on a record."

Peterson recently filled out his air staff by hiring WFNX Boston midday jock Nick Carter for mornings. ("It took me six months to finally convince him to come down here.") Peterson was so bent on getting Carter that he drove the station's Hummer vehicle to Boston to pitch the job.

Also on staff at WDGE is former WEQX Albany, N.Y., MD "Johnny Anonymous" Allers as p.m. driver/promotion director; "production genius" Red Decker, whose contest sounders include one of the infamous error by Boston Red Sox first baseman Bill Buckner in the 1986 World Series (for 1995 playoff tickets) and Green Day's Billie Joe pulling his pants down (for a year of record service from Reprise); and night jock Diana Gannon, who comes from classical radio in Boston and is currently assembling the Edge's World Wide Web site on the Internet.

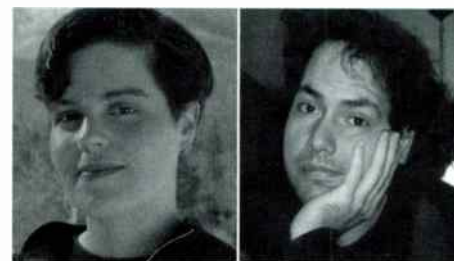
As for Tobin's air staff of Brown students, which changes each semester, "I've got a building full of the brightest people in America who are dying to do this. One of the great things about it is that you're constantly challenged, because every time you decide to do something, there are 25 people going, 'Hey, why are we doing this? Why are we changing this?' It makes you think on your feet."

WDGE's big fall promo was its Expose the Edge contest, the \$10,000 winner of which created "a bat signal" of WDGE's calls and displayed it all over town. Peterson's next stunt will be to hand out foam No. 1 fingers with the WDGE logo at an upcoming nationally televised Providence College basketball game. WBRU was voted favorite medium-market station by readers of Rolling Stone magazine for the third year in a row.

For his part, Peterson says the total shares for modern rock have gone up since the Edge signed on. "I think there's room for two. It's not going to be a steel-cage death match to the very end. We can live together."

WDGE's numbers "are going to come from WHJY or WPRO-FM," says Tobin. "Whether there's room in the long run for two [such] stations remains to be seen. If we split what is now the alternative audience in Providence, we can stick around for a while. We've been here through good and bad times, and we'll be here forever."

WBRU to see what they're doing just as I tune into [local top 40 WPRO-FM. WBRU is] not the target we're going after. They don't have enough of an audience for us to really care about it."

"Our audience is a very different kind of audience," Tobin says. "We skew a little older than they do. We've always pulled better 25-34 numbers than a lot of alternative stations and certainly better than [WDGE] has. We're conscious during the day of not offending people who don't want to rock out all the time."

When WDGE signed on, according to Tobin, "we were confident in what we were doing. We didn't change anything musically, because what they are [doing] is different from what we are doing. It's not like another station came in playing exactly the same music. We're the real tastemaker station; we've always been known as the station that jumps on records early and breaks bands and takes chances. What the Edge [will] want to see [is] MTV support or a sales story... Both [approaches] are perfectly viable in this market."

Peterson, for his part, points out that WDGE was early on Sonic Youth's "The Diamond Sea" and Loud Lucy's "Ticking," but also says, "I never want to get so far in front of the curve that we're too hip for the room. WBRU sounds a little more poppy, a little lighter, and we sound a little louder, more guitar-driven."

HAS ANYONE seen one of these enhanced singles made for CD-ROM? I've just seen the new one from **Bush**, on which I observed the band's videos, live performance footage, interviews, photos; read its lyrics; and played video a game. Pretty amazing stuff. Scary, too, as I couldn't help but think of a musical Twilight Zone in which nobody goes out to see live music anymore and recording artists don't feel the need to play live, as computer technology offers more features, bigger screens, and better sound capabilities. Just pop in the disc and get full-blown live music in your living room. No rigorous tours for the bands, no hassles for the fan.

If multimedia formats become as prominent with today's wired generation as the Internet, virtual reality, and hundreds of cable channels have, the live rock show may go the route of vinyl. When you've observed youths more inclined to compare computer-football features than to round up the neighborhood kids to have a four-on-four game in the park, there should be a bit of alarm about the clutches of technology. Multimedia, the young music fan should be cautioned, is a supplement, not a substitute for people getting together. I suppose it's too late to bring back the full-sized album cover or the concept of an album having two distinct sides, but I do believe there is no alternative to the virtues of live music.

With over 20 new releases at modern rock this week, it's even more evident that the record industry is not immune to information overload these days. With the fourth quarter over and a slew of projects now rushing through the floodgates, it's a wonder any MD can keep his or her head above water these days. Maybe it's time for a Rock Airplay Monitor new-release CD-ROM, with songs, interviews, and videos for all the songs going for airplay.

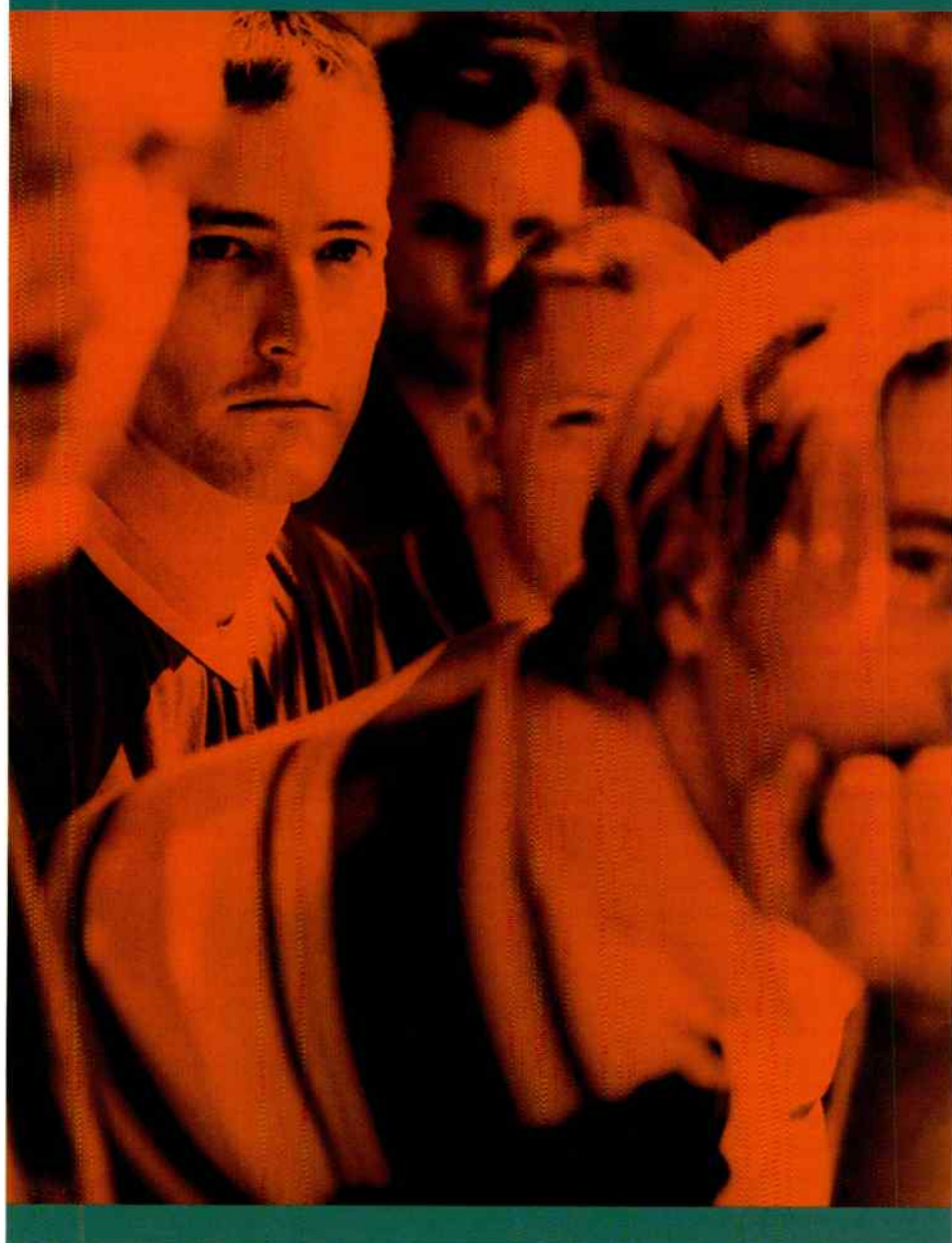

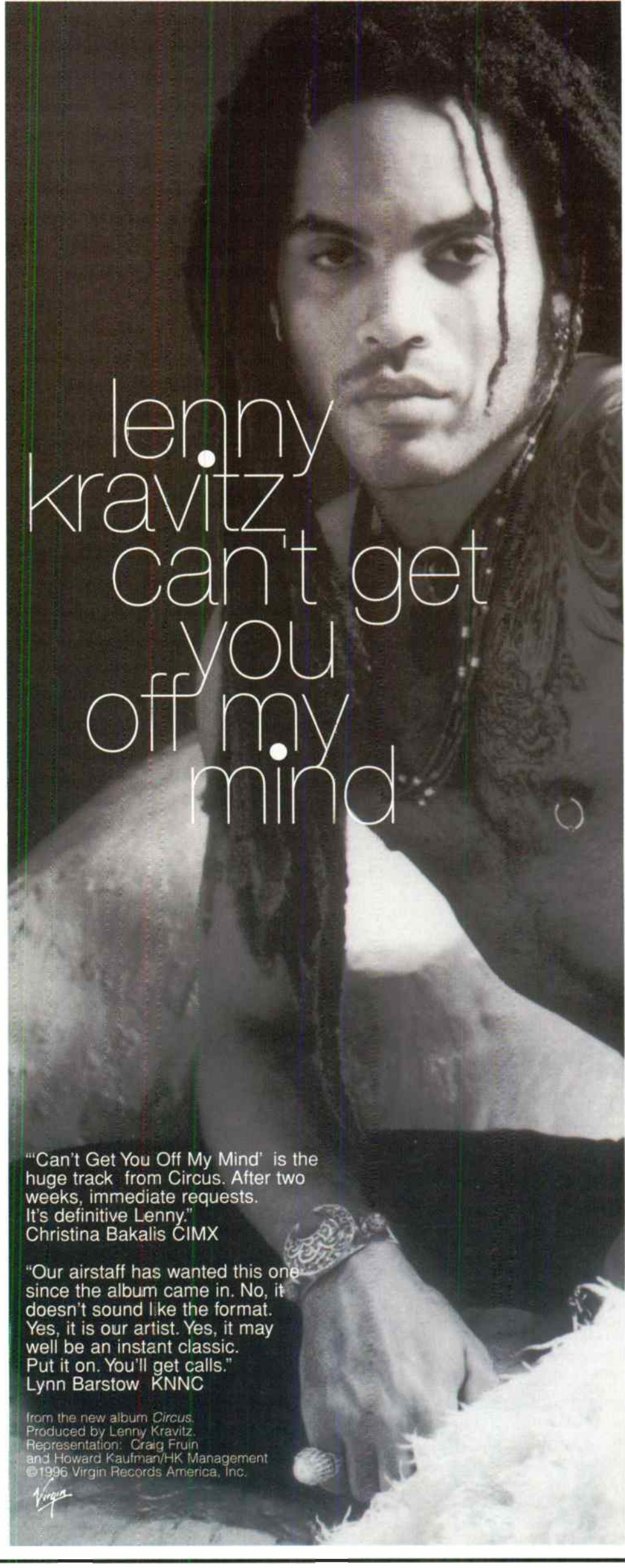

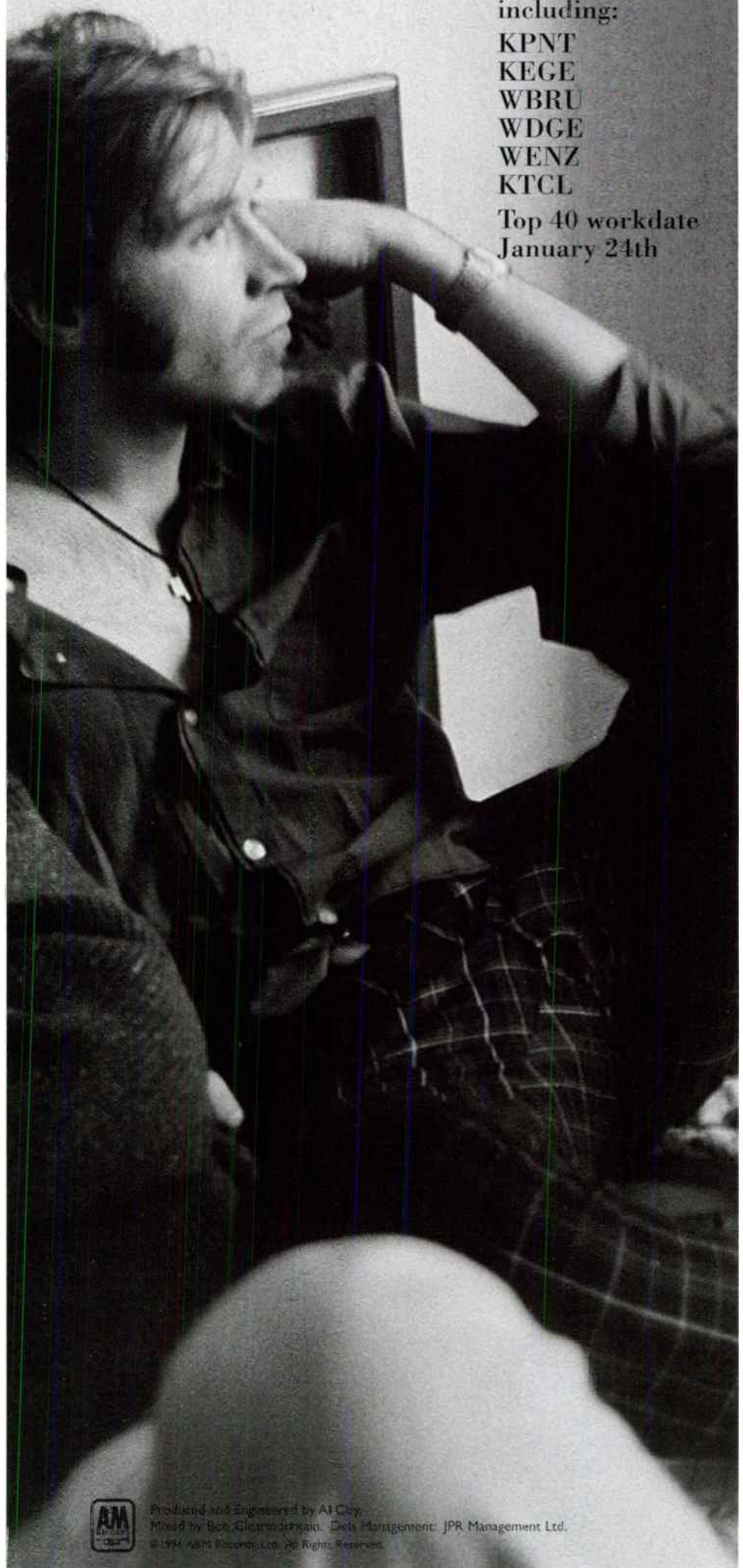
