Coping Strategies For When Your Heritage Jock Crosses Street And Kicks Your Butt

Sooner or later comes the moment of truth when your heritage air personality announces that he or she is leaving. Either that person exits the market for some big-bucks offer, leaving size 12 shoes to fill, or, in a worst-case scenario, he or she crosses the street and attempts to kick your ass.

So how do PDs and GMs deal with losing a heritage jock? Most contacted for this story agree that trying to duplicate the style of a previous personality is a slap in the face to listeners. Instead, they suggest creating as much excitement of your own as possible.

SLEEPING WITH THE ENEMY

On the first day of the fall book, top 40 KQKQ (Sweet 98) Omaha, Neb., watched four-year heritage morning

guy Rockett cross the street to AC KESY. PD Michael Steele, who had been there just three months, was plunged into what he describes as "the worst year of my life."

"Rockett's departure definitely impacted us," he says. KQKQ spent most of the fall without a morning show, until Johnny Danger, hired from WZEE (Z104) Madison, Wis., started two weeks before the book's end. Then, Steele says, KQKQ crammed a year's worth of morning-show promotions into five months as "an accelerated 'Welcome To Omaha' program."

Meanwhile, Rockett left KESY in June. "Apparently, they did not have the financial resources that we had to market him," Steele claims. "Plus his personality was more suited to top 40 and didn't mesh with their soft AC."

R&B KKDA (K104) Dallas GM Ken Dowe says that last year's exit of pop-

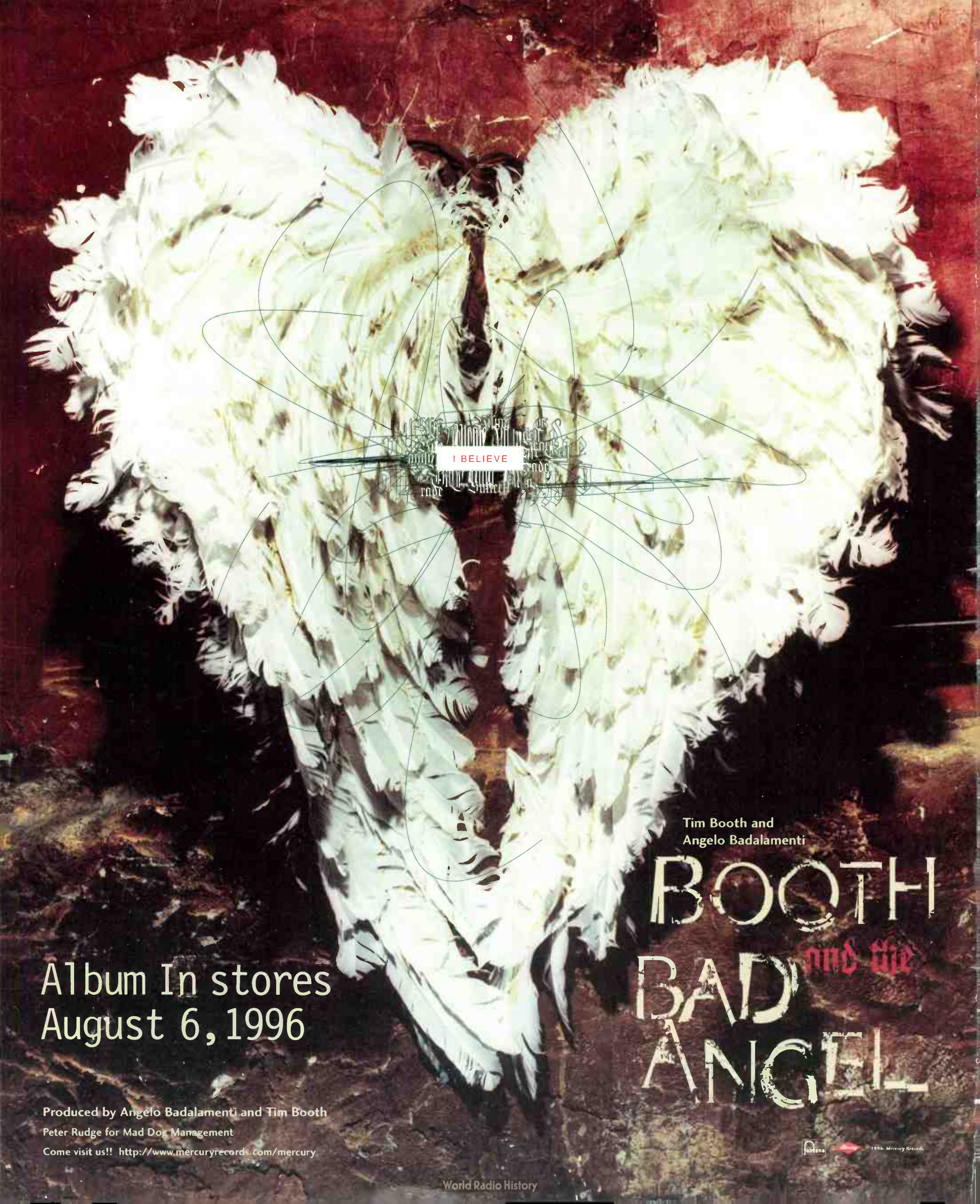

Spring's First Page 13; WFNX Adds Glasser

The first page 13 notices (née 5B) of the spring '96 book are in. **Howard Stern** earned his host station a notice, which refers to him only as "the syndicated morning personality airing on WXRK [New York]," for airing the following comment May 22 after talking to a caller "identified as a rating-survey participant": "You know the ratings people called him... I don't even think you're supposed to talk about stuff like that." Arbitron has also apparently flagged affiliates **KLSX L.A.**, **WJJD** Chicago, **WYSP** Philadelphia, **WCCC** Hartford, Conn., and **WNVE** Rochester, N.Y. (Stern will return to classic rock **WCKG** July 22.) Also, modern **XHRM** San Diego aired a dialog April 29 of a host and caller in which the host reportedly said, "Listeners need to be aware that if you love the station so much, that you are so passionate and loyal to it, you need to show me in the rating books that you guys take the time to write our name."

Former **WVG** Richmond, Va., PD **Bill Glasser** is named PD at modern **WFNX** Boston, replacing **Kurt St. Thomas**, now at Arista Records. Interim PD **Todd Wilkinson** retains APD status.

SFX has closed on its purchase of Prism Radio Partners. **Mark Kopelman**, VP/GM of classic rock **WZZU** Raleigh, N.C., and top 40/modern sister **WDCG**, has expanded those duties to include the rest of SFX's holdings in that market, album **WRDU** and oldies **WTRG**. **Phil Zachary**, who had been GM of the latter two properties, now helms modern **WHPS** Washington, D.C. Look for a similar move for SFX's newly acquired **WKSS** Hartford, Conn., where president/GM **Tim Montgomery** should be overseeing crosstown **WMRQ**, **WHCN**, and **WPOP** by the time you read this.

Desert Communications II, owners of top 40 **KQMQ-AM-FM** Honolulu, are now operating crosstown modern **KPOI** (the Edge). **KQMQ** GM **Bernie Armstrong** replaces **KPOI** owner **Chuck Cotton** as GM of both properties. **KPOI**'s air staff is still in place, and terminated support staffers have been invited to re-apply for their previous spots.

Triple-A **KMTT** Seattle VP/GM **G. Michael Donovan** is named president of Entercom's Seattle properties, which includes album **KISW**/modern **KNDD**/oldies **KBSG-AM-FM**. Entercom is looking for a new GM and still needs a PD for **KISW**.

WLUP-FM Chicago has finally added music to its talk format, outside of mornings. Here's an afternoon sample: **Cars**, "Just What I Needed"; **Gin Blossoms**, "Found Out About You"; **Hootie & the Blowfish**, "Hold My Hand"; **Steve Miller Band**, "The Joker"; **Pretenders**, "Brass In Pocket"; **EMF**, "Unbelievable"; **Goo Goo Dolls**, "Name"; and **Doobie Brothers**, "China Grove."

Modern **KNNC** Austin, Texas, PD **Mike Peer** is named MD at modern **KDGE** (the Edge) Dallas, replacing **Jay Michaels**, now **KRBE** Houston MD.

Jeff Couch leaves PD/afternoons at '70s **KJSR** Tulsa, Okla., to become APD/MD at Phoenix classic hits outlet **KHTC**. He will be the station's second APD, working alongside APD **Alan Cook**.

Modern **KKDM** Des Moines, Iowa, ups late-nighter **Lee Konfrst** to OM/middays.

Citadel Communications has merged with Deschutes River Broadcasting. Deschutes president **Ed Hardy** joins the Citadel management team. When

all pending deals are consummated, Citadel will operate or sell ads for 55 stations.

Classic rock **WEGW** Wheeling, W.Va., PD **Chris Zambito** exits for APD/afternoon duties at classic rock **WCLG** Morgantown, W.Va. . . Charlottesville, Va., gets a new classic hits outlet as R&B **WUMX** flips format but remains Mix 107.5. **Tony Love** remains OM, but look for a new PD.

Classic rock **WARO** Fort Myers, Fla., ups MD/night jock **Mike "Mud" Alan** to PD. He shifts to p.m. drive and keeps MD duties. Weekender **Dave Neuser** fills **Mud**'s shoes in nights.

Following the closing on the station by ARS, classic rock **KKDJ** Fresno, Calif., has opened up its music slightly to include current material by classic artists as well as such new acts as **Hootie & the Blowfish** and **Blues Traveler**.

Triple-A alum **Jonathan Little**, formerly GM of **WMMM** Madison, Wis., will be upped from PD to GM when **WMMM**'s owners buy crosstown oldies outlet **WOLX**.

Album **KRKR** Salt Lake City picks up two crosstown album **KBER** staffers. **Alan Bain** goes to mid-days, and overnighiter **Kevin Eason** takes nights.

Suburban New York rocker **WRGX** (X107) names modern **WMRQ** Hartford's former promotions director **Jason Steinberg** to similar duties, replacing **Tony Couch**, now at indie McGathy promotions. Also, **WHTZ** (Z100) New York inks former X107 p.m. driver **Chris Pellegrino** (aka **Reno**), for swing. And **Christine Nagy** of rival **WAXQ** (Q104.3) is filling the morning sidekick role for **Z100**'s **Elvis** and **Elliott** this week. . . The L.A.-area modern rock trimulcast, **Y107**, has new calls for all its stations. Following last week's call-letter flip of **KBAX** to **KSYX**, **KMAX** is now **KLYY**, and **KAXX** flips to **KVYY**.

With modern **KFRR** Fresno, Calif., middayer **Jason Allen** bound for overnights at **KOME** San Jose, Calif., APD/MD/night jock **Kevin "the Kozman" Koskie** flips to middays; weekender **Kevin "Danger Boy" Ralston** moves to nights.

Nickie Summers joins modern **WRAX** Birmingham, Ala., as MD/night jock as "Luka."

Modern **KDOT** Reno, Nev., PD/mornings **Steve Funk** takes afternoons, moving **Rob Williams** to mornings with former overnighiter **Arnie States**; P/T **Martina Davis** takes overnights full time, and **Lance Avinsino**, who'd been in middays P/T, swaps that post with evening jock **Kevin Smith**.

Former **WDIZ** Orlando, Fla., morning co-host/newsman **Jerome "Fish" Fischer** crosses to **WJRR** for overnights/morning news/commentary.

WWGT Burlington, Vt., gets the **WXPS** calls to fit its Pulse nickname. The new air staff is **Victoria St. John** in mornings, modern **KREV** Minneapolis P/T **Mark Miller** in middays, PD **Chris Fleming** in afternoons, and **R.J.** and album **WKGB** Binghamton, N.Y., middayer **Scott Wells** in nights.

Doug St. John joins triple-A **WXKR** Toledo, Ohio, for P/T. . . Syncom, new owners of rocker **WDZR** Detroit, name former Gannett Radio president **Joe Dorton** **WDZR**'s acting GM.

FMQB's **Ray Koob** joins the glut of trade-magazine writers doing P/T at Infinity stations, as he trades his weekend gig with album **WMMR** Philadelphia for the same at crosstown album **WYSP**.

WATCHING THE DETECTIONS

A New Site Is On & Old Friends Return

This year, Broadcast Data Systems has been in the process of adding four new markets: Allentown, Pa., Greenville-New Bern, N.C., Lafayette, La., and Honolulu. Monitors in the first three markets have already been activated, and most of the stations are either reporting to Airplay Monitor or on the verge of being added to Airplay Monitor reporting panels. The Hawaiian monitor is scheduled to be activated in early August.

Since the announcement of these new markets, which brings the total monitored markets to more than 125, stations in nonmonitored markets have been asking how BDS determines which markets to monitor. Here are the steps taken in adding a new market.

While it may seem simple, monitoring is actually a capital-intensive, complicated process. Expenses for a new market range from \$40,000 to \$50,000. In a best-case scenario, a new market takes a month to set up, and that doesn't count the time taken for all the decisions that have to be made prior to a setup.

Before adding a new market, BDS confers with Billboard/Airplay Monitor staffers—publisher Michael Ellis, editor Sean Ross, and chart managers in the respective formats—as well as our TV broadcast division, Competitive Media Research, to address priorities. We look at radio and TV ratings information. For instance, some radio markets well outside Arbitron's top 100 have been monitored because of their value as TV markets, such as Lexington, Ky., Burlington, Vt., and Paducah, Ky.

Right now, our goal is to fill the remaining gaps in Arbitron's top 100 markets. All four of our new markets are in this category; in addition, Greenville-New Bern and Lafayette have strong TV implications. BDS also monitors certain markets to address specific format or demographic requirements, such as areas where R&B and Latin listeners are concentrated.

The decision to add these four markets was made during the first quarter of 1996. The following are the steps that were taken to place monitors in the four markets.

Step 1. Compile a list of stations. We looked not only for stations in our monitored formats in the markets themselves, but, in some cases,

for stations in adjacent markets that could be heard from the new sites—for example, country WIOV Lancaster, Pa., from the Allentown monitor. Sometimes, we'll use the new monitor to alleviate situations for which we don't have room in an adjacent market; for instance, WYSP Philadelphia is monitored from Allentown, because the Philly monitor was close to its limit. The preliminary decision on which stations to try to monitor was made in April.

Step 2. Get possible leads on sites in the market. Check with CMR to see if there's an existing site in the region. Check the business directories for the area around the ideal monitor site. Call the leads to see if they are interested. (Monitor sites can be anywhere from private houses to, in one market, a dentist's office.)

Step 3. Once a potential site is identified, BDS sends field technicians to test for reception. If the results look good, then we go through the contract process of renting space and ordering the "frame line" that links the monitor site with Kansas City, the phone line that we use as a backup for the frame line (or to dial into the monitor manually), the power supply (and a backup in case of a power outage), the antenna, and air conditioning, if necessary.

Step 4. Physically install the monitor, a beige-colored box the size of a computer hard-drive that we attach to one radio tuner per station monitored. All stations must go through a two-week internal quality-control period before their information is released to the record industry. Stations are activated on a Sunday to coincide with the Monday-to-Sunday monitoring period for Airplay Monitor charts.

Step 5. Stations get calls from labels that never promoted them before. PDs hear from old friends for the first time in years.

At present, Honolulu is the last market scheduled to get a new monitor in 1996. But we're interested in hearing from our radio and label constituents with suggestions for where we should expand next. High Self Esteem

"We spent 14 hours in a van yesterday," says Self's 22-year-old studio whiz and multi-instrumentalist **Matthew Mahaffey**. The journey from Corpus Christi, Texas, to Vancouver was feeling extra cramped, even without the band's former bass player, who decided to stay home with his girlfriend the night before Self set out on recent dates with **Cast** and **the Hollowbodies** (brother and bandmate, guitarist **Michael Mahaffey**, is filling in).

Mahaffey cut his recording teeth producing hip-hop demos for local rappers while at Middle Tennessee State University. He turned his house in college into a recording studio, complete with instruments, studio gear, and a vocal booth in the shower. Although he recognizes his own interest in hip-hop, he admits the genre today "is almost as commercial as country. Kind of saturated." Lately, he says, he's excited by such trip-hop acts as **Portishead** and **Tricky**.

For Mahaffey, who started as a drummer, recent work has included playing piano, laying down a third harmony, and patching a sample on top of a drum track he played live. In fact, the debut Self album, "Subliminal Plastic Motives" on Zoo, was written, recorded, and performed almost entirely by Mahaffey, with a little help from his brother.

Mahaffey answers purists who criticize a rock band's use of computer technology by saying, "We make it appear that they're samples. We treat them as such. We just want the sampler to be accepted as an instrument, [because] that's exactly what it is," he says.

"We play [the samples] like [instruments] and we use it in the context of the music like one. It's not like we're flying in background harmonies with it. To me, that's cheating."

A Good Conclave Starts With A Good Steer

To say that going to the Upper Midwest Communications Conclave, held in Minneapolis July 11-13, was an adventure would be an understatement. Our first dinner in Minneapolis took place Thursday night at Murray's, a steak house, eh. It seems every dinner at the convention took place there. I was particularly impressed by one of Murray's specialties, walleye cheeks. I never knew fish had cheeks. I wonder what other fish body parts I don't know about can be cooked and served in a cream sauce. Before we chowed down on big hunks of flesh, I noted that the barbecued shrimp wrapped in bacon probably wasn't kosher.

On Friday morning, Dave Richards from WRCX (Rock 103.5) Chicago moderated the rock radio panel. Folks on the dais included WK1Q Grand Rapids, Mich., PD Tom Marshall, consultant Fred Jacobs, researcher Tom Kelly, and WEBN Cincinnati PD Brad Hardin. The panel touched upon the evolution of elements "between the records" on rock radio in the past 20 years. Jacobs had the most thought-provoking comment, saying that there's been more development in rock radio in the past 30 months than the past 25 years. He's probably right. It's great to hear snappy production on

rock'n'roll radio, even if most of it is scatological. With the growth of production values on rock radio, panelists noted that many production departments are now stretched to the max. Food for thought that early in the morning made me a little dizzy. Or was it the free coffee?

Marketing guru Al Ries, who with Jack Trout co-wrote "Positioning" and all those other books overquoted in this industry, was one of the con-fab's keynoters. He told a ballroom full of eager programmers, jocks, and wannabees to "focus" on a target and specialize. Everyone agreed.

Then it was time for the alternative radio session. Alternative Radio Confidential's Jim Kerr moderated a panel that included Pollack Media Group's Randy Lane, WHYT Detroit PD Garret Michaels, KKDM Des Moines, Iowa, GM/PD J. Michael McKoy, and KREV Minneapolis PD Kevin Cole. It seemed that except for Michaels, the rest of the guys hadn't made it to Ries' lecture. "Focus" was far from the operative word. Hey, don't get me wrong. KKDM has like a bazillion share, so it must be doing something right with its self-described "hard to put a label on" format. And the panel personified the head scratching going on in the format right now. It was refreshing to note that no punches were thrown during the session.

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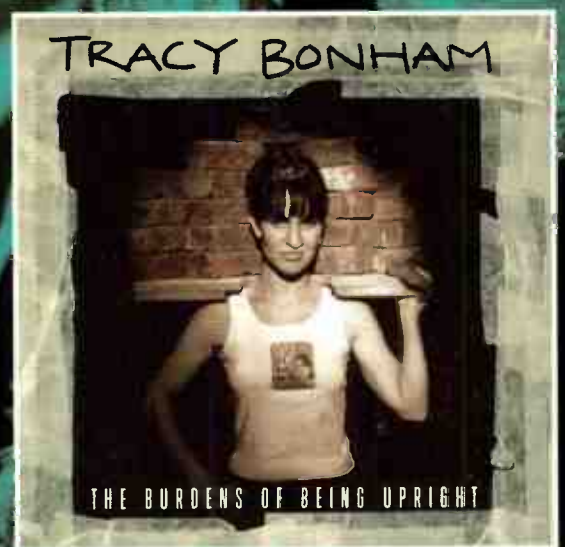
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Coping Strategies For When Your Heritage Jock Crosses Street

ular morning "flyjock" Tom Joyner, who also broadcast on WGCI Chicago, and his January re-entry in syndication on crosstown rival KJMJZ, "was one of the most difficult situations I had to face."

Dowe consulted a pair of successful publicity spin doctors and told them that new morning team Skip Murphy and company were underdogs against the home-grown, popular talent bred on K104. Says Dowe, "After I presented them with all the problems, we drew up a plan: We pre-empt them."

Dowe decided to harness Joyner's power to run his own engine. "We called a press conference. I said, 'Oh, guess what? Tom Joyner's coming back!' They said, 'On K104?' I said, 'No, we have Skip Murphy and company.' We're local. Joyner's marvelous, but we . . . spend all of our time working on local things, we only do what the local listeners want, and we're not syndicated." While heaping praise on Joyner, K104 managed to stress the new team's home-court advantage. And K104 said it expected Joyner to dominate the ratings, thus setting up a public challenge. A subsequent TV ad campaign called Murphy and company "the home team" and pictured them at local events with local sports stars. "That put Tom behind the eightball," says Dowe. The strategy has worked, with the new show pulling higher morning ratings than Joyner in the market.

Heritage R&B WGCI was hit twice, first when Joyner left for syndication and returned on rival WVAZ (V103) in January and again when afternoon host Doug Banks left, only to debut July 1 in syndication on crosstown hip-hop WEJ (106 Jams). "Losing those two personalities would've been major if the product hadn't remained the same," says WGCI APD Don E. Cologne. "[Our heritage] is strong, and the product is focused promotionally, musically, and image-wise."

WGCI countered by placing popular comedian Steve Harvey in mornings and letting him develop some unique routines. To replace Banks, WGCI went to longtime midday jock Crazy Howard McGee, whom Cologne calls "unorthodox." While 106 Jamz trumpeted its acquisition of Banks with live broadcasts and a parade, WGCI announced to listeners for a week that it was "taking over three stations." On July 1-3, WGCI took over three gas stations and gave away gas. On the third day, police had to stop the promo due to the traffic it caused. WGCI also doubled its \$1,000 daily money-song giveaways.

"After the first week, the real battle begins," says Cologne of going up against such a major player as Banks. "They can broadcast live from Michael Jordan's Restaurant [as Banks did], but the [next] week they're out of the market. They can only talk about local things for so long, then it fades."

KISSING YOUR SISTER

Bob Case, as VP of programming for New Century Media, owner of KUBE Seattle, had to prepare for the departure of KUBE's 14-year morning team Charlie and Ty, who moved across the hall to sister '70s outlet KJR-FM. "We felt they would be a better fit with KJR's heritage," Case says. The first step in the transfer was to simulcast the duo on KUBE and KJR, which have vastly different audiences. "They couldn't focus as narrowly as they would on one station, so the show sounded rather generic for the year and a half it was simulcast," he says.

Case's top-secret master plan to replace Charlie and Ty? "We had no idea what we were going to do . . . we were flying by the seat of our pants," he says. Case wanted a different-sounding replacement, and as KUBE has no direct competitor, Case felt the station could gamble on a new direction in the morning. Case drafted Rob "the T-Man" Tepper, who was doing nights down the hall at NCM's sports station. "He talked about everything but sports," says Case. "Just great guy talk."

With some coaching from the sidelines, Case says Tepper's been able to alter his act to appeal

to an 18-34, primarily female audience. KUBE took an expected initial hit, but as of the last book, Case says, the T-Man is No. 2 12-plus, and No. 1 18-34.

PULL OUT THE BIG GUNS

WKLQ Grand Rapids, Mich., faltered with the follow-up to its No. 1 morning show of Rick, Darla, and Scott, who went to crosstown modern WGRD. "Whoever followed them had an extremely difficult task: going against a show whose main purpose is to reposition its old station as no longer the cool station to justify their move across the street," says PD Tom Marshall.

WKLQ's strategy, Marshall says, was "to try something different" and not duplicate the previous morning show. They paired market vet Michelle McCormick and comic Mark McCullum. "On paper, it looked tremendous," Marshall says, "but it didn't click. We gave it four and a half months." While the PD says the duo showed signs of improvement, WKLQ couldn't afford to lose any more ground to WGRD. Then the decision was made to bring in Howard Stern.

"There's only one show out there that we believe has the best track record for [ratings], and that's Howard Stern," says Marshall. "Even if we went out and got a great morning show from another market, the time, cost, and energy to maybe eventually beat them was the same if not more than investing in Howard Stern. I think we'll be proven right in the long run." But, he adds, "it will be the end of the year before we have real good indications as to how that battle is swinging."

WGRD's morning show did "send a plant" to Stern's WKLQ press conference. Marshall says, "That was a beautiful thing, because they basically put their head on a platter and offered it up to Howard. We turned it into a promo, which we've run continuously. Our tactic in the past has been to not bash them, but with Howard being so effective at it, I have no problem with that."

BEYOND OUR CONTROL . . .

"You've got a heritage jock leaving on you, you pray hard to the air-talent god," says country WSIX Nashville PD Dave Kelly, who faced exactly that situation last summer when popular midday host Hoss Burns announced that he had AIDS and would be leaving the station to concentrate on charity work. Because of the circumstances of Burns' departure, station management decided to host a daylong Burns tribute/radiothon to raise money for AIDS charities and let listeners, artists, and fellow jocks say goodbye to Burns. The emotional event made for riveting radio and raised more than \$60,000 for charity.

"When you have a personality like Hoss . . . you couldn't just let him ride off into the sunset, never to be heard from again," says Kelly.

Former afternoon jock C.C. McCartney, who had recently returned to WSIX in a part-time capacity, was recruited to replace Burns and benefited from an on-air endorsement by Burns himself, which Kelly says helped smooth the transition.

Longtime country KMPS Seattle morning man Ichabod Caine surprised station management several years ago when he announced that God wanted him to work for rival station KRPM. "He said that he'd been praying about it, and he felt that God was calling him to go work over there," says former KMPS PD Tim Murphy, now VP of promotion at Rising Tide in Nashville.

KMPS moved Greg Thunder into Caine's slot, then utilized its listener comment line to deflect criticism of the change. "Some people were glad [Caine] was gone; some said they'd never listen again because he was gone," Murphy says. "Some people hated the new guy because he wasn't Ichabod." Murphy and Thunder took turns returning all of the negative calls and asked the disgruntled listeners to give the new show a chance. "We tried to coddle the listeners and bring them in instead of pissing them off," Murphy says.

ROCK GODZ

Moschitta Uses New York Sensibility To School York, Pa., In Modern Rock

John Moschitta was a modern rock vet when he became PD of fledgling modern rocker WQXA (the Edge) Harrisburg, Pa. He'd spent years working the promotions angle of the format at WDRE Long Island, N.Y., and modern-leaning WHTZ (Z100) New York.

WQXA, which went from top 40 to rhythm-crossover to AC and back to top 40 in recent years, "had somewhat of a sordid history," says Moschitta. "People might have given up on the station, because it seemed like every year or so, the station would change format, so there wasn't really any loyalty there to the listeners. It was tough to attract people back."

On top of that, Moschitta adds, "when I came into the situation, the station was just a jukebox with some production. It took a little while for us to get our feet and get grounded."

Moschitta set to work building his air staff

and trying to figure out what music would fly in central Pennsylvania. With Philadelphia and Baltimore less than two hours away, Moschitta was able to find those listeners who were hip to the music, but, by and large, York, Pa., WQXA's city of license, "is a very blue-collar type of town, and they are not as knowledgeable or learned in the music." Since his audience ran to both ends of the spectrum, the early music exemplified a broad selection from the modern fields. Now with a much tighter focus on what's working, Moschitta has largely weeded out the Depeche Mode and New Order from the mix in favor of "the guitar-based [modern] stuff [that] people were more into here."

Here's a sample 6 p.m. hour on WQXA: Garbage, "Stupid Girl"; Nirvana, "About A Girl"; Cure, "Mint Car"; Pearl Jam, "Black"; Rage Against The Machine, "Bulls On Parade"; Green Day, "Walking Contradiction"; Dave Matthews Band, "Ants Marching"; Goo Goo Dolls, "Long Way Down"; Living Colour, "Cult Of Personality"; No Doubt, "Spiderwebs"; Screaming Trees, "Nearly Lost You"; Spacehog, "Cruel To Be Kind"; and Radiohead, "Creep."

The station cleaned house after the format flip. Aside from a few part-timers, former PD Scott McFadden, now MD/middayer, was the only staffer to survive the transition from top 40 to modern. Moschitta attributes this to McFadden's "enthusiasm. He showed me that he wanted to be here and wanted to be a part of it and saw what the potential for the radio station was."

That spirit became Moschitta's guide as he assembled the rest of the staff, always looking for "people who wanted to have fun, wanted to learn, [and] were just totally jazzed about the radio station." Moschitta says, "The potential is huge with all of them." In aircheck meetings, there's a lot of give and take, with each side

open to what the other has to say, according to Moschitta.

The culmination of the rebuilding process was landing the Howard Stern morning show in February. "That just solidified everything," Moschitta says. "The opportunity presented itself, and we said that this is something that we really can't pass up." Moschitta adds that he had complete confidence in Stern: "Going in, I probably knew more than anybody here at the station what was going to occur and what we would hear. You know it's going to work; it's just a matter of when. My concern as a programmer was, How am I going to keep these people who tune in to listen to the rest of the radio station?"

So far, so good. Three months into his stint, Stern has "just exploded this last trend," Moschitta says. "He's only been on for two ratings months, [and] mornings, 18-34, this last trend, we went from an 8.8 to a 15.9 [share]."

And the post-Stern drop-off? "Michelle [Cruz], in afternoons, is second with a 9.1, 18-34. Sure, it's a drop-off, but considering [that] she doubled the ratings there, people are staying around."

Moschitta's Z100 experience helped fuel his York assault. Z100 PD Steve Kingston showed Moschitta "how important production elements are in the mix," Moschitta says, "making the station sound as big as it possibly can." Upon his arrival, Moschitta adds, WQXA sounded "underproduced. There wasn't anything that popped out at you." With the aid of station voice Keith Eubanks, Moschitta brought the high-powered production flavor of his alma mater to WQXA while toeing the rock line and not letting the station slip back toward its checkered top 40 past.

"Z was very street-oriented," says Moschitta. "Teresa [Beyer] and Steve believed in winning over each listener one by one, and if that meant going out and shaking everybody's hand, then that's the way you did it. I saw how successful that was, and that's what I took down here. I saw how well Z100 incorporated themselves with all the different charities and all the different events that were in New York. It seemed like Z100 was there at every one."

"I just tried to bring that philosophy down here. I hired a promotion director who used to be an intern of mine when I was at WDRE, Lenny Diana, who's got that type of spirit. He's very creative. He's got a lot of ideas and loves going out and pressing the flesh. I firmly believe that if you're seen everywhere, then that's what's going to connect with people, whether it's at a mall or at a show. [As long as it's] within the context of the radio station, we want to try and be out as much as possible and tied into the community as much as possible."

Despite being in market No. 103, York lays claim to a healthy modern music scene. Moschitta says, "It's great to have a band like Live living in your backyard and coming from here. Neighboring Lancaster has got a really cool scene. Innocence Mission is from the area, [as are] Solution A.D. [and] Suddenly Tammy! There's definitely a very cool scene here, people are finally starting to realize."

WQXA seems to have become a part of that growing scene. "People are thinking about us a lot more," says Moschitta. "It's good to hear from people who've been in the market forever and say, 'I remember when nobody used to be concerned or cared about WQXA, and now they do,' and that to me is where I think we've made our mark. People are aware of us now."

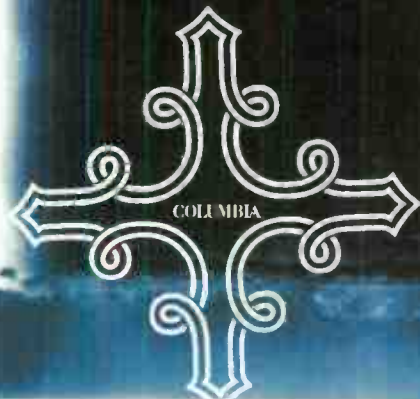

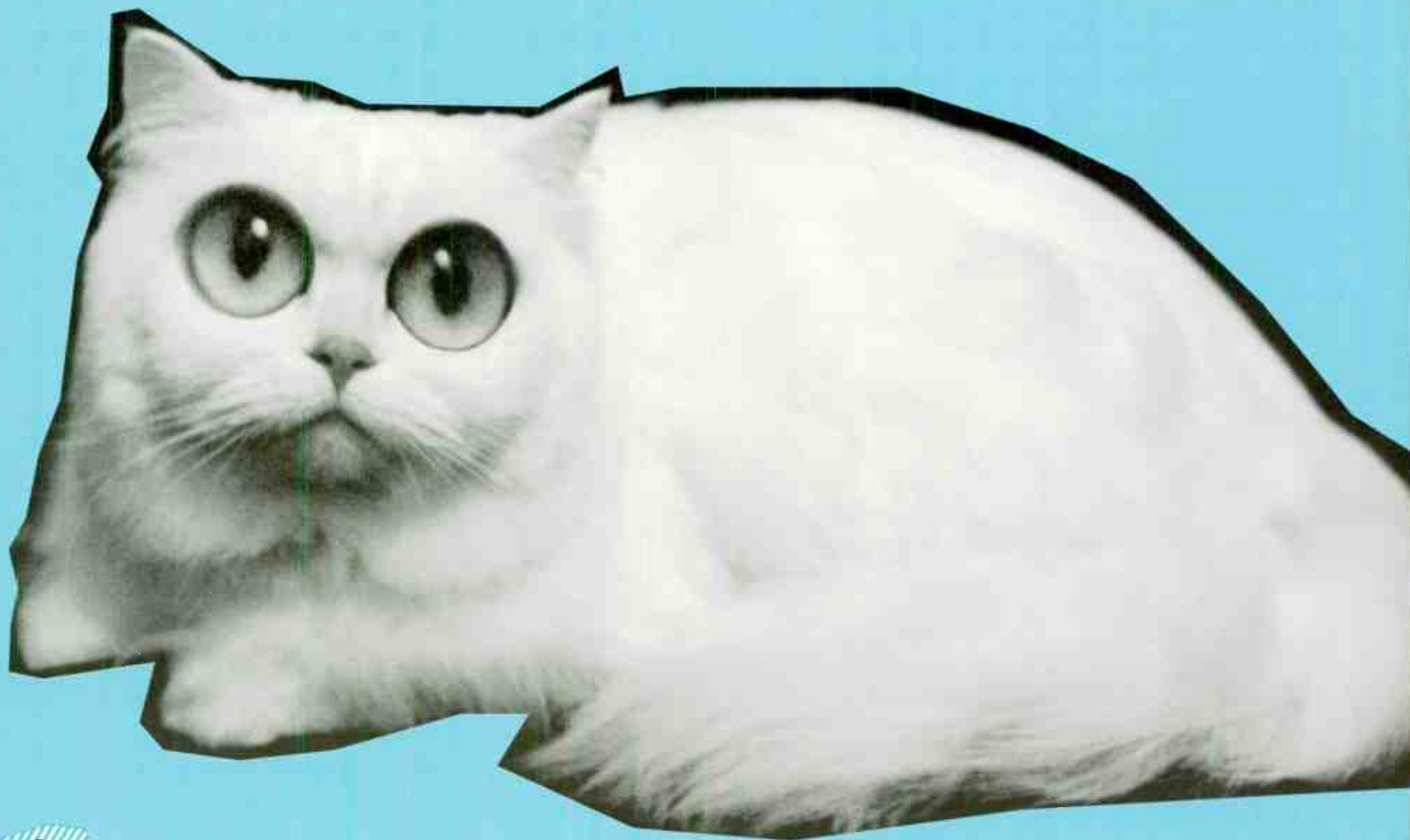
