No Cure For Summer Jam Blues: Begging Resumes, Cuts Coming?

With promoters and PDs at rock and top 40 locked in semiannual negotiations over acts for station concerts, some label execs say they're finally fed up enough to withdraw their support for such events once and for all.

A glance at the number of concerts still scheduled for this summer shows that nobody's made good on this threat altogether, but several reps say privately that they've already cut back on the availability of A-list acts or concentrated their resources on larger markets. As one rep, who, like most of his counterparts, asked not to be named, puts it, the game plan is now "attempting to superserve the major markets, the ones who are actually breaking the record, the markets where it truly makes a difference, without going broke. The payoff has to equal the payout."


And even major markets, some reps say, are getting less. At least two cite the lineup of WXKS-FM (Kiss 108) Boston's Kiss Concert, set for May 31. Long considered the mother

of all station concerts, this year's Kiss Concert lineup remains extensive but relies heavily on developing or re-launched acts.

Many label complaints about station shows have changed from last year only in intensity. Among the perennials: Stations don't support the acts they procure with meaningful airplay; stations want only major acts; and with PDs increasingly obsessed with their shows, it's too difficult to discuss music. "If we can't take care of them right now, they don't want to hear about our records or our priorities," says one exec.

"The whole thing is ridiculous," says one VP of promotion. "Radio shows are just not cost productive, and at the end of the day it's the artist who ends up getting hurt. It's difficult to remain a viable touring act while giving yourself away for free. When an audience can see a band for free or on a discounted ticket along with 10 other acts on a radio bill, that hurts that artist's ability to come back as a solo act at a later date. It dilutes that artist's impact."

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

Hundt To Exit FCC; Miller Vs. Muller

FCC chairman Reed Hundt is resigning his post. In a May 27 letter to President Clinton, Hundt said, "I believe it is time for a new group of commissioners to join Commissioner Ness in carrying out the Commission's future mission; and I know it is time for me to devote much more attention to my family... As the Commission turns to its new challenges, I respectfully request that you commence the process of selecting my successor. I would intend to continue to serve at the Commission until you replace me as chairman." In another bin at the oval office, President Clinton has advanced the names FCC General Counsel Bill Kennard and economist Harold Furchtgott-Roth as nominees for the Democratic and Republican FCC seats.

The Kansas City Star reports that country KBEQ morning man Randy Miller, his wife, and mother have filed a suit charging syndicated morning man Mancow Muller with slander. Muller's program airs in Kansas City on modern KISF. Other defendants in the suit are the station; its owner, SYNCOM; Muller flagship outlet album WRCX Chicago; and Radio & Records for publishing a letter from Muller. The suit is asking for \$975,000 in actual and punitive damages and an injunction forbidding Muller to interfere in the private life of Miller and family. Mr. Cow's good news this week is the addition of active rock KAZR Des Moines, Iowa, to his morning network.

Hot AC KDMX Dallas GSM Dennis C. Frawley gets the GM office at sister album KEGL. Lee Abrams is now consulting the station. Meanwhile, Monitor has it on relatively good authority that morning market leader Howard Stern's contract with KEGL isn't likely to be renewed, now that KEGL is owned by Nationwide. Frawley would not speculate on Stern's future.

Bud Paxson's buying spree continues with the company getting four West Palm Beach, Fla., outlets from ARS, including album WKGR.

Elettra Broadcasting sells its Monterey, Calif., outlets, triple-A KPIG/modern KCDU/jazz KXDC to New Wave Communications for \$5.3 million.

FORMATS: KYYS REFOCUSSES

Now that he's on board, album KYYS Kansas City PD Jeff McMurry has shifted the station's music. According to McMurry, the station is drifting toward triple-A with enough blues in the mix to distract it from its rock mission. He's brought it back to a more current, rock-focused station.

After a week of stunting, former AC outlet WLRS Louisville, Ky., landed in the modern camp after Memorial Day weekend, becoming "the new rock alternative." OM C.C. Matthews is overseeing the station, along with PD John Robertson—held over from the old format. The station is calling itself LRS 102, harking back to its rock days, and is running jockless. Across the street, classic rock WQMF is prepped to dive into the mainstream rock pool before the end of June.

Several weeks after classic rock WMMQ Lansing, Mich., began simulcasting its signal on crosstown album WVIC's 94.9 frequency, the simulcast has been split off. Now WMMQ and classic rock reside on 94.9, while the WVIC calls transfer to WMMQ's old 92.7 frequency, which is now broadcasting a religious format.

Album KOCD Joplin, Mo., flipped to country over Memorial Day weekend. The entire staff exits, with the exception of morning co-host Big Al.

PROGRAMMING: BLOOM BACK IN RADIO

Chancellor shifts management roles among its Minneapolis properties. Triple-A/top 40 KTCZ (Cities 97)/KDWB VP/GM Marc Kalman adds WBOB (Real Rock 100) to his station stable. Album programming vet Andy Bloom leaves Coleman Research, where he was executive VP, to be OM for WBOB/KTCZ. Cities 97 PD Lauren MacLeash adds PD duties at WBOB, moving WBOB PD Bob Wood to the PD seat of oldies sister KQQL.

Album WEZX Scranton, Pa., PD Rob Lipshutz

is now OM, adding oldies WQFM and adult standards WEJL and WBAX to his purview. Promotion director Tony Policare becomes marketing director and WEZX P/T John Pullo is now promotion coordinator for all four stations. Former WEZX promotion director Eric "the Prospector" Logan returns for P/T from the same at rival WZMT. Elsewhere in town, WZMT PD/middayer Jack Meyers exits.

After signing on ARS modern adult outlet WLCE (Alice @ 92.9) Buffalo, N.Y., Mike Edwards has accepted another programming position. Jim McGee joins from P/T at crosstown WEDG (the Edge) for a full-time shift to be announced. WLCE GM Jeff Silver needs a PD.

Album WIXV Savannah, Ga., PD/middays Anthony Michaels becomes director of programming for WIXV/R&B WSGF/talk WBMQ. WIXV afternoon host Keith Hendriks adds APD stripes.

Country WOZOZ Carbondale, Ill., PD Scott Cox is named director of programming of Zimmer Radio Group for Southern Illinois, which includes classic hits WXLT, hot AC WCIL-FM, and N/T WJPF/WCIL-AM.

Triple-A KOTR San Luis Obispo, Calif., PD Drew Ross adds OM duties at mainstream KWBR now that the station is in an LMA with KOTR. KWBR acting PD/MD Joe Alvino gets the official PD title, while night jock Megan Ray moves to middays and adds promotion duties. Brett Daniels segues from P/T to nights. Back at KOTR, Steve R.C. is named production director/middays after a long absence from radio.

With the departure of album WTBB Panama City, Fla., PD/p.m. driver Brian "Beaver Stevens" Holmes, middayer Rob Roberts gets interim PD duties and moves to afternoons. Yoda moves from nights to middays; P/T Diablo gets nights.

Album WMMR Philadelphia PD/afternoon host Joe Bonadonna leaves the air to concentrate on programming. Bubba John Stevens shifts from nights to afternoons; morning co-host Elise Brown takes the evening opening. P/T Frank Lario steps into overnights. Lario remains PD at modern WDOX Atlantic City, N.J.

Modern AC KKBT (the Beat) Portland, Ore., inks Brian and Brian for mornings from album KBER Salt Lake City. To avoid conflicts with the syndicated Mark and Brian show across the street at classic rock KGON, the guys are calling themselves Bob and Bob. Cheryl Kaye remains co-host.

Album WFYV Jacksonville, Fla., MD/night jock Derek Myers has left the building.

Jacent Jackson trades modern WPGU Champaign, Ill., for modern WWDX Lansing, Mich., where he picks up MD duties.

Boise, Idaho, veteran Carl Scheider returns to radio at triple-A KFXD as MD/afternoons.

Modern adult WDBZ (the Buzz) New York middayer Judy Franco exits.

Mainstream rocker WRZK Johnson City, Tenn., staffs up with Dave Barnett in mornings from nights at sister AC WTMF; middays are handled by newcomer Angela, and Scott Highland, former PD at N/T sister WKPT, takes on afternoons. Cole Buchanan will handle P/T.

Luke Sanders, last in nights at WTKI Milwaukee, crosses the street as production director/middays at Saga modern AC WXPT (106.9 the Point). Modern WPLA Jacksonville, Fla., picks up Jacor's syndicated "LovePhones" for late nights.

Album WPYX Albany, N.Y., P/T John Clark gets overnights at the station.

Modern KLYY Los Angeles marketing director Eileen Woodbury returns to crosstown R&B KKBT as promotion/marketing director for the station after a year's absence, replacing Dianna Obermeyer, who exits.

P/T Mike Edwards moves to overnights at album WBYR Fort Wayne, Ind.

Video aircheck magnate Art Vuolo is planning a reunion of Detroit radio personalities, set for next April.

Karmazin Adds TV Oversight To Duties



CBS Radio chairman/CEO Mel Karmazin has been named chairman/CEO of the newly formed CBS Station Group, adding to his oversight of 77 CBS radio stations and additional 14 owned and operated TV properties.

The change is in anticipation of Westinghouse Electric Co.'s planned

splitting off of its media businesses this fall and follows the growth of Karmazin's career from head of Infinity Broadcasting through its merger with CBS and Group W. CBS' TV and cable businesses will report directly to Westinghouse chairman/CEO Michael H. Jordan. That includes network operations and production and syndicating companies. CBS Television and Cable Group president/CEO Peter Lund exits.

EMI Closes New York Office

EMI Music closed its corporate office in New York this week, resulting in the loss of approximately 35 jobs. Among those departing in the wake of the shake-up are EMI Records Group North American chairman/CEO Charles Koppelman and executive VP/GM Terri Santisi. Ken Berry is named president of EMI Recorded Music and will assume responsibility for all U.S. music operations. He was president/CEO of EMI Music International and chairman/CEO of Virgin Music Group since 1994. EMI's North American headquarters is now located in Los Angeles.

The Work Group names Geordie Gillespie VP of alternative promotion. He had been director of alternative promotion since 1995. Gillespie joined the label in 1992, when it was known as Chaos, as national director of alternative/dance promotion.

Earache Records names Rob Gill director of promotion and marketing and Jon Paris director of media relations. They were, respectively, director of metal promotion at McGathy Promotions and senior publicist at Myers Media.

Restless Records names five new staffers to its promotion department. Todd Bisson is named West Coast senior national director based in Los Angeles, and Tod Elmore is named East Coast senior national director based in Atlanta. Stepping in as regional promotion directors are Seth Gershman based in New York and Sharon Doheny based in Chicago. Also, Jeanette Rosen joins as specialty show/promotion coordinator based in L.A.

At Mercury, Baltimore/Washington, D.C., local rep Pam Trickett exits. Lynne Salivaras transfers from the Cleveland local slot to fill the vacancy.

Trauma Sues Interscope Over No Doubt

Billboard Bulletin reports that Trauma Records has filed a \$100 million-plus lawsuit against Interscope Records and its owners, Ted Field and Jimmy Iovine, over the rights to multiplatinum act No Doubt. The suit, filed May 23 in Los Angeles Superior Court, stems from the labels' 1994 joint venture, in which Trauma agreed to produce, promote, and market artists on its roster for the mutual benefit of both labels, with Interscope providing financing and distribution.

In the suit, Sherman Oaks, Calif.-based Trauma claims that before No Doubt's breakthrough, Interscope lost faith in the band, then

an Interscope act, and reassigned the band's rights to Trauma in 1995, agreeing "that No Doubt would be treated as a 'Trauma artist' and therefore subject to the joint-venture terms. Among other allegations, the suit says that Interscope knew all along that it would deny the No Doubt rights reassignment if the band became successful.

The lawsuit seeks the termination of the joint venture and the exclusive assignment to Trauma of all rights to the Trauma roster, including No Doubt and Bush. Interscope could not be reached for comment.

Another VP says stations are still under the impression that labels have bottomless pockets. "It's out of control," that rep says. "Even a track act with a couple of dancers, a road manager, and a sound person can cost us a minimum of \$5,000 to transport across the country." A full band can cost \$20,000. Another rep says that while many stations provide only ground transportation and hotel trade-out, "They don't realize it costs us from \$7,000 to \$12,000 per day to keep a band on the road."

At least one label exec is trying to take a proactive approach to the whole issue. Says A&M VP of rock promotion Mike Rittberg, "Earlier this year, I sent out a letter to radio stations that said, 'If you have a show going on this year or any show that you know about right now, send this form back to me, fill it out, and I'm going to create from that a database. So, basically I have the date, the station, the event, is there a particular artist that you want. Give me a contact. Let me know if there's a budget. What are you going to provide for my band? Is it a charity? Give me the details. From that, now if it makes sense for one of my bands to do something, I have all the information' . . . And then I can tell the people that really have their act together and what events are big or is it something that 'Hey, we're doing it because our competition has a show coming.'"

Still, Rittberg says, "It's still a lot of arguing [about] 'We played them a week before [our competition] did. Why are we getting them second?' . . . If you do something neutral then everyone complains, 'Well, it's not mine. I'm not doing anything.' And if we do something proactive, which is what we have to do because it's in the best interest of our band, then somebody always has to go first and somebody always has to go second. And we just try to tell whomever has to go second to be patient with us and here's our date that we're going to do something with you."

Despite this, Rittberg sees station shows as "a great way to get our bands—and most of these are baby bands—exposed to a great number of people at once . . . Until the positives slip below the negatives, this is always going to happen."

STATIONS RESPOND

WXKS-FM PD John Ivey sees concert dates as the label side of the bargain. "During the course of the year, we're asked to put our balls on the line and take a chance on a new artist. The truth of the matter is, some stations are breaking records; some aren't. Some stations have great ratings; some don't. The point is, we're doing these artists and record labels a great service. This business is not a one-way street, and it never has been."

"Record labels should expect to do this, especially in light of the fact that many of these baby acts alone couldn't sell out a 20,000-seat venue like [Kiss 108's venue] Great Woods, but we're [putting them] in front of all these people," Ivey adds, citing the national coverage the show generates. "It's not like I'm asking them to come here and wash my car. I'm asking them to come and play in front of 20,000 people who happen to like their song."

Other PDs say they're rethinking their shows so that artists don't feel used. Modern WHYT Detroit PD Garrett Michaels says that sometimes includes "making sure they get to play longer sets, so it's not just like they come out and do four songs and they're gone. We want the artists to feel good about doing this show. We don't want the artists to feel, 'Here's another thing the record label made us do, when we could be playing some

other gig and making more money off it.'"

At modern WNVE (the Nerve) Rochester, N.Y., director of programming Erick Anderson tries to hone in on bands that are about to break. "I think there's still an openness from labels to do shows, depending on the bands you pick. If you're going out there trying to get Offspring, you're going to have one bitch of a time . . . If you're going out there trying to get Eddie Vedder to come MC your show, you're smoking crack. The key is . . . to pick those bands months out and make sure you've got hits by the time they get there. It requires an ear and work. It's not as easy as saying, 'OK, who can I get for adding a record this Tuesday.' The people that are doing that are losing."

WDCG (G105) Raleigh, N.C., is readying its Big Shindig for June 1 featuring Shawn Colvin, Duncan Sheik, Poe, Verve Pipe, Sister Hazel, Cowboy Mouth, Barenaked Ladies, and others. G105's Christmas show, featuring Duncan Sheik, Squirrel Nut Zippers, and Barenaked Ladies was, like the station, a major part of the story behind those three acts' breakthroughs and became "a true musical event, not just a party," says PD Kip Taylor.

Taylor adds, "We've enjoyed a tremendous amount of cooperation this year, and I'd like to think that the caliber of this event will cause the record community to look back favorably and want to be involved next year."

G105 took a lesson from other successful summer events like the KMEL San Francisco Summer Jam. "KMEL made their mark by creating a bond with their artists," Taylor says. In the same fashion, G105 has closely aligned itself with many new area bands, including Emerald Pool and Lustre. "We have a personal relationship with these artists, as well as Epic's emmett swimming, who came up through the Carolina region, much like Hootie & the Blowfish, Cravin' Melon, and the Dave Matthews Band. They've already laid the groundwork, and I think it behooves both of us to do something together," he says.

WHY STATIONS SOLDIER ON

So, with the record/radio relationship often strained over concerts, is it still worth it for radio stations to put so much effort into summer concerts, often starting as soon as they finish arguing over Christmas acts? Most say yes, although they wish other stations—particularly those new to the game—would stop muddying the waters.

"It pays off immensely, both in terms of big ratings and image enhancement," says Kiss 108's Ivey. "This is the premiere top 40 show in the country, and I hope that fact gives us some leeway in booking acts."

"There will always be a Weenie Roast at [modern KROQ Los Angeles] because that's history for them," says WNVE's Anderson. "We'll always have a birthday concert. That's history for us . . . [Modern WHFS Washington, D.C.] can't not do the 'HFS-tival. They are one of the gods of doing shows. You look at what they do with their show and you go, 'Wow, that's just so next-level. That's what you've got to shoot for.' And on the scale of what they do, it's amazing."

But Anderson foresees that "someday in the not-too-distant future, there will be less people doing shows," as stations decide to focus again on their on-air product. He also worries that younger PDs think, "We're going to do a show and we're going to get a lot of ratings and we're going to win the book because we had a show." That is just so not how it works. In fact, most times when people have shows, their ratings go down. Ask [former modern WKQX Chicago PD] Bill Gamble. And that's not a rag on him; that's out of his own mouth."

"If you have not done shows before and all the rigmarole, you've got to go through it to get it done," cautions Michaels, "I think it might be something you want to consider not doing. If you are new to the concert game as a radio station and have never done it before, I don't know that it's worth it." If a station is coming to the table late, "the impact of you doing [a show] doesn't really make a difference anymore. The uniqueness is gone. It's not really an advantage."

MONITOR PROFILE

Isley Takes Modern Rocker The Edge Toward A Second Heyday

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odern KTEG (the Edge) Albuquerque, N.M., PD Skip Isley came aboard in January but already has one feather in his cap, as the Edge moves back toward its heyday numbers, moving 5.7-3.6-3.6-3.9-4.6.

Isley was previously APD/promotion director at modern WMRQ Hartford, Conn. There, PD Brian Krysz brought Isley out of his hiatus from radio and gave him a strong hand in station operations. When Jay Beau Jones picked up the PD reins, Isley says, "I was fortunate enough to be in a situation where I had a lot more control and input than I would have had in a normal situation. It's just that those were very extraordinary times and circumstances that allowed that to happen, and I was able to benefit from it."

As for the Edge's winter success, Isley says that was easy. The hard part is bringing it back to its former stature. "There were so many problems when I got here that fixing the problems was going to get us to a 4.6.

"When I got here, they were playing Marilyn Manson and Tool around the clock," Isley adds. "They owned males 12-24, and that was about it. So the first move, musically, was to make it a more inclusive radio station. We were

basically telling women, 'Go listen to something else.' And I don't know of any alternative station in the country that's successful with just men. I realize it's shifted a little more toward the male over the years, but if you look at your P1 core audience, it still never gets out of the 60-40 [range], and we were way out of it."

While Tool remains in the mix, it's more dayparted now, Isley says. "We were also in a situation here where our competition for our demographic, 18-34, is extremely urban. So there were lots of hit records out there, like the Cardigans, Sheryl Crow, the Wallflowers, Jewel, and things like that that were getting no airplay in the market. So it wasn't an image problem for us to go and claim them. And in one book, we were able to see our women numbers just shoot right back up."

Here's a sample hour on KTEG: Tonic, "If You Could Only See"; Smashing Pumpkins, "Today"; Beck, "The New Pollution"; Gin Blossoms, "Alison Road"; Cardigans, "Lovefool"; Green Day, "J.A.R.>"; Live, "Turn My Head"; Better Than Ezra, "Good"; Sneaker Pimps, "6 Underground"; Local H, "Bound For The Floor"; Rancid, "Time Bomb"; INXS, "Elegantly Wasted"; and Cake, "The Distance."

To Isley, KTEG was locked in a battle that was long over. "There was a period of time when they competed directly with KZRR, which went alternative for a year or two," says Isley. "Trumper came in and bought all these stations, did research, found out the Edge had the much stronger image in the market for al-

ternative . . . and decided to switch KZRR, which . . . was a heritage rock station for a long time, back to rock. And so they really weren't competing head to head anymore, but I think the people that were in this building, thought, in their minds, they were still competing with them. And they got into that whole battle of who's going to out-hip whom and who's not going to play the wimpy music."

Between the records, Isley had an air staff with low morale. "My jocks literally had no aircheck sessions for a year, with part-timers who never had aircheck sessions," Isley says. "This is not a slam on the former PDs here, but there was a really good base of talent here, but they just had no direction. Every shift was sounding different. There was no consistency. Nobody had a sense of what the station's goals were or what we were supposed to sound like, who our audience was, or how to talk to them. So there was a lot of Radio 101 basics—just getting everyone on the same page."

While modern stations across the country struggle with creating a strong morning show, Isley sees his morning man, Moxey, as a gold mine of undeveloped talent. "It was just a DJ doing mornings," he says. "And this guy's got . . . the most potential I've heard in small-market radio in the country right now. So, a lot of my attention has gone into that, working with him every day, developing stuff for the morning show. He's loaded with personality. He just had nobody working with him."

With budgetary constraints, Isley can't give Moxey a co-host just yet. For now, Isley and Moxey concentrate on giving the illusion of more than one person on the show through "other elements from the audience, interviews, and stuff like that," as well as better use of the station's show-prep service. "So now we're getting in our one or two interviews a week. He's got callers. He's got contests. We're just trying to create some interaction with the audience in the mornings so that people are paying attention, for starters. We want to condition them to listen to him for what he has to say."

Nights were another problem area. Curiously, while other stations have great success cranking up the volume at nights, KTEG was "playing all this hard music, [and] the night numbers were horrible," Isley says. He gave Julie Hoyt back her MD stripes and then gave her the night shift. "She's got a guy who started out as an intern here," Isley says. "He's 17, and he's part of her show now and just really interactive with the audience. They went from a 6 to a 15 in one book. That was something that I felt we should have had already."

He's followed that up with "LovePhones," which Isley knew from his Hartford days. Curiously, there has been no community outcry. "Which scares me," Isley says. "Where are the calls from the department of education? Where are the concerned parents? This area's kind of new age/UFO . . . but I still thought it would be conservative enough that there would be some sort of outcry. But so far, none. I've yet to talk to a parent or a teacher or get an angry letter or anything. That worries me. We got a lot of that in Hartford, and we had huge numbers right away. I'm hoping that doesn't mean it will take a long time to work here."

"I think that we are in a position in this market to be in the fives solidly and be around for a long time. And that's where the challenge comes in, becoming a radio station, becoming part of this community, long term. And that's what we're working on now."

Summernight Shakes Some (Class) Action

The first time the two creative forces behind **Summernight's** high-energy, hook-laden power pop met, it wasn't over a few beers at a party or the result of a successful want-ad search. It was as classmates during senior year of high school. And for **Beatles**-fanatic **Sean McCue**, who was taking senior economics at Santa Barbara (Calif.) High School, there couldn't have been a better discovery about the classmate whom he was going to have to sit next to for that whole year than that **Tim Cullen**, too, played guitar. After some class-time Walkman listening sessions of each other's 4-track home recordings revealed a shared affinity for pop music, McCue and Cullen struck up a friendship, then a songwriting partnership during their first year at City College together.

A decade and dozens of songs later, that partnership has culminated in the release of their 12-song Maverick debut, "Pure Juice." Besides showcasing their knack for classic pop harmonies and arrangements, Summernight's debut reintroduces elements that have been dormant in pop music of late, particularly the classic '70s guitar solos contributed by McCue and Cullen. Meanwhile, drummer **Tony Sevener**'s grooves and sense of dynamics push the songs ahead, especially live.

Summernight's beginnings are inextricably tied to the Santa Barbara scene. Three of four of its members grew up there, and drummer Sevener, who grew up in central California, has been there for the past eight years. With its small population centered on the tourism and service industries, Santa Barbara has all the ingredients for a close-knit music community to flourish. "Everybody's really supportive of everybody else. The 'scene' is the musicians," says McCue, who remembers Christmases at his grandmother's house that were marked by jam sessions involving his musical cousins and his uncle and session drummer **Jim Keltner**. Friends in other bands such as **Dishwalla** and **Toad The Wet Sprocket** are part of a network that flourishes because of the mutual respect and support musicians show for one another.

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In fact, it was Dishwalla that brought the band to its manager's attention, and McCue recalls a recent conversation where Toad's **Glen Phillips** told him, "God, this is a special place because everybody supports everybody else."

Though McCue and Cullen continued to write together and separately through the years, it wasn't until a mutual friend's birthday blowout that the band took shape. For **Silver Jet** singer **Luke Tierney**'s party, musician friends from the area would put together one-off bands, give the loose ensemble an absurd name, and play some covers and a few original songs on board a boat cruise that became known as Boozecarousa. Summercamp's members, recalls Cullen, played songs from the era they grew up in, namely everything from **ELO**'s "Don't Bring Me Down" to **Rufus**' "Tell Me Something Good" and **Cheap Trick**'s "Oh Caroline." When searching for a name months later after Sevener joined in 1994, the band laughingly recalled the name and decided to reclaim it.

While Santa Barbara proved to be the ideal place to hone their skills and play gigs, allowing them to develop organically, Summercamp eventually had to bring its show down to Los Angeles, but not without the help of its recently migrated friends, **Silver Jet** and **Sparkler**. Both demonstrated goodwill toward the band, offering it the opening slots whenever gigs could be secured. Summercamp would reciprocate by doing the same thing in Santa Barbara. Cullen credits this sort of exchange program with helping the band get the live experience necessary to attract the major labels, which began flocking to see it in 1995. It signed with Maverick the following year.

The June 24 album debut will be immediately followed by appearances at some high-profile festivals this summer, including dates at this year's Lollapalooza shows and an appearance at the Mount Fuji Festival in Japan, which features **Foo Fighters** and **Rage Against The Machine**, among others. For McCue and Cullen, it won't be their first time out of the country together. They spent the summer six years ago busking around Austria and Switzerland with acoustic guitars. But somewhere in their travels this summer together they'll probably be expressing their gratitude for their high school economics teacher's seating arrangement.

Releases And Notes

As a kick-off to a 40-city tour this summer, **Queensryche** will play a secret concert at a remote desert location in New Mexico June 5 to tie in with its seventh album, "Hear In The Now Frontier." The Seattle-based band is expected to play a 45-minute set followed by a half-hour interview session. The performance will be broadcast via satellite to stations around the country.
