
When 'At Work' Really Means 'At Home' And Not 'Some Other Place'

There exists a small but growing (sometimes literally) underground band of former radio programmers and other industryites who are learning how to do business from a home office, a stark contrast to the bustling radio station environment they once inhabited. They voice the obvious benefits: a sense of creative freedom, no office politics, and the flexibility to live virtually anywhere. Now, if they could only recapture the day-to-day hallway camaraderie they once enjoyed as captain of a team.

Casey Keating, most recently PD of AC KIOI (K101) San Francisco, still lives in a Bay Area suburb operating his own burgeoning consultancy and voice-over business. "A big part of any programmer's job is being the head cheerleader and coach.

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FCC Aims Indecency Fines At WEBN, WCMF

ARS and Jacor have been served with Notices of Apparent Liability by the FCC for broadcast indecency. ARS was flagged for broadcasts in August '94 on album **WCMF-AM-FM** Rochester, N.Y. The \$2,000 fine was for a broadcast of the **Brother Wease** "Morning Circus" and its explicit discussion of mud being thrown at a naked man. Jacor is being fined \$4,000 for a discussion of lesbianism and masturbation on album **WEBN** Cincinnati by **Bubba the Love Sponge** Feb. 25-26. Both companies have 30 days to respond to the fines.

And in the FCC in box, ARS and Jacor swap properties in Dayton and Kansas City. That puts album **KYYS** Kansas City into the ARS portfolio and album **WTUE**/modern **WXEG** Dayton, Ohio, into Jacor's possession.

MERCURY SELLS BUFFALO STATIONS

Mercury Radio spins off four Buffalo stations to Broadcasting Partners in a deal valued at \$62 million. Included in the package are classic rock **WGRF** and modern rock **WEDG**, where MD **Rich Wall** adds APD stripes.

MANAGEMENT: CHICAGO SHIFTS

WTMX Chicago GM **Drew Horowitz** is upped to president of Bonneville's Chicago division, which includes **WTMX** and newly acquired modern AC and adult top 40 (for now) outlets **WLUP** and **WPNT**. **WTMX** VP/GSM **Chuck Williams** becomes GM of **WPNT**, and market vet **Cristina Wilson-Orr** is named VP/GM of **WLUP**. Chicago Sun-Times radio correspondent **Robert Feder** reports that the contract for **WLUP** morning host **Jonathon Brandmeier** is not being transferred to Bonneville. Feder cites speculation that **Brandmeier** will wing west to recent Evergreen acquisition modern adult **KYSR** Los Angeles and

may also be simulcast on its sports outlet **WMVP** Chicago, which this week taps former **WHYT** Detroit GM **John Cravens** as GM.

Pilot Communications Syracuse, N.Y., GM **Michael Schiefer** exits. Included in his oversight was album **WAQX** (95X). Pilot owner **James Levin** picks up the reins while a search goes on for Schiefer's replacement.

Will Douglass, GM of New Wave's Sarasota, Fla., properties (including album **WYNF**) shifts to the West Coast as corporate VP of programming, overseeing the Monterey, Calif., properties, modern adult **KCDU** and triple-A **KPIG**.

FCC Mass Media Bureau deputy chief **Mary Ellen Burns** has tendered her resignation.

PROGRAMMING: SAN FRAN SUMMIT

Sources have confirmed that **WXRK** New York PD **Steve Kingston** and **KROQ** Los Angeles PD **Kevin Weatherly** were spending some quality time in San Francisco last week, taking a hard look at how to best maximize the synergy between moderns **KITS** (Live 105) and **KOME** and modern adult **KLLC**.

KIOI San Francisco MD **Jay Nachlis** returns east for the PD post at modern adult **WLCE** (Alice @ 92.9) Buffalo, N.Y., trading markets with **Mike Edwards**, who left **WLCE** to program **KOYT** San Francisco.

No official word at press time, but former top 40 **KIIS** Los Angeles PD **John Cook** is expected to resurface as PD at modern adult **KKPN** (the Planet) Houston.

Modern **WCNC** Asheville, N.C., interim PD **Mark Keefe** gets the official nod as PD. He'll keep his afternoon shift but give up his OM stripes.

Album **WRQR** Wilmington, N.C., PD/MD **Laura Smith** exits.

Eastern Long Island, N.Y., country outlet **WLIE** flips to WWL's Adult Rock format as **WBSQ** (Q102.5) under new owners.

Modern **KISF** Kansas City gets new calls **KCCX**, to match its new "107.3 the X" handle.

PEOPLE: NORFOLK HAS A COW

Norfolk, Va., undergoes a pair of syndicated morning-show changes, as triple-A **WKOC** drops its **Howard Stern** feed and sister modern **WROX** (96X) picks up **Mancow**.

Here's the lineup for new classic rocker **WXCD** (CD94.7) Chicago, effective July 4: Market vet **Bob Stroud**, currently holding a weekend shift on rival **WLUP** and **WMVP**, will do middays. Former modern **KEGE** Minneapolis jock **Lisa Miller** is slated for afternoons, with evenings going to **Joe Thomas**, last with crosstown classic/talk hybrid **WCKG**. **Allan Stagg** shifts from morning news at **WXCD**'s previous country format to overnights; he's also a **WCKG** veteran. Mornings are jockless for now.

Modern **KLYY** (Y107) Los Angeles MD **Sandy Horowitz** is upped to APD, and AMD **Mike Savage** takes the MD title.

With album **KAZR** Des Moines, Iowa, MD/p.m. driver **Michael Cross** gone, PD **Troy Hanson** (last in mornings before the arrival of the **Mancow** feed) takes afternoons. Former modern **WDRE** Philadelphia overnighter **Leigh Taylor** takes nights at **KAZR** and picks up MD stripes.

At modern **XHMR** (the Flash) San Diego **Todd Kelly** picks up mornings from afternoons at crosstown album **KIOZ**. His arrival moves **Robert O'Quinn** to middays as **Steve West** exits that shift and the station.

Night jock **Woody Carlson** officially becomes MD at album **WFYV** Jacksonville, Fla.

With modern **WRXQ** Memphis, Tenn., MD/afternoon driver **Diana Gee** out, night jock **John Michael** becomes MD/middays, moving **Dave Spain** to afternoons.

Market vet **Mike Stapleton** has been auditioning in middays at album **WBOB** Minneapolis.

The latest celebrity DJ? How about **Shoney**, goalie for the double-A East Coast Hockey League's Louisiana Ice Skaters? (Yes, that's the real name of the team.) He joins modern **KFTE** Lafayette, La., for weekends.

Album **KBER** Salt Lake City pairs night jock **Uncle Nasty** and production guy **Hammer** in mornings. P.m. driver **Evan Lake** exits; **Mark Cruz** from nights at AC rival **KUMT** takes his slot.

Top 40 **WXKS-FM** (Kiss 108) Boston P/T **Jeff Clark** takes production director duties at modern adult **WMBX** (Mix 102.3) West Palm Beach, Fla. Also in Beantown, **Mat Schaffer** returns to modern **WBCN** to host the public-affairs program "Boston Sunday Review."

Assistant promotions director **Gabriel Camacho** is upped to promotions director for modern **WPBZ** West Palm Beach, Fla., replacing **Danny O'Brien** who segues to modern adult sister **WMBX** for promotions duties.

P.m. driver **Joe Limardi** relinquishes his promotions duties at classic **WZMX** Hartford, Conn., and will continue to do P/T at ARS sister station modern AC **WBMX** Boston. Former promotions coordinator for CBS affiliate **WFSB** Hartford, Conn., **Joseph Downton** joins as promotions director.

Album **WCLG** Morgantown, W.Va., hires former country **WDNE** Elkins, W.Va., afternoon jock **Tyler** for nights replacing **Matt Gregory**.

Country **KNFM** Odessa, Texas, weekender **Kaysie Tyler** joins crosstown modern **KQRX** for nights ... P/T **Hollywood Rob** goes to nights at classic rock **KCRR** Cedar Falls, Iowa, replacing **Nick At Night**.

When adult modern **KAEP** (the Peak) Spokane, Wash., tapped **Pete Hansen** (ex-**KHTY** Santa Barbara, Calif.) for mornings, PD **Scott Souhrada** plugged Hansen's debut by running promos shamelessly announcing, "Hansen: In-studio, Monday morning at 7:30," while "Mmm...bop" played softly in the background. Hansen joins MD **Haley Jones**. Morning co-host **Mike Stone** shifts to afternoons, as **Geoff Scott** moves to nights, pushing **Jeff Downz** to overnights.

Clear Channel Adds Paxson Properties

Clear Channel Communications has pact ed with Paxson Communications to acquire the latter's radio group. The \$693 million deal includes 46 radio stations (42 in Florida), six radio news and sports networks, two minor-league sports teams, and 526 Florida billboards. The deal is indicative of Paxson's new TV-oriented direction. Paxson owns 55 TV stations across the country and has plans to develop a new broadcast TV network. The

deal has to pass muster with the FCC and meet the Hart-Scott-Rodino waiting period.

Florida radio stations in the deal include Miami's album **WZTA** and modern adult **WPLL**, triple-A **WHPT** Tampa, Orlando's modern adult **WSHE** and album **WJRR**, album **WKGR** West Palm Beach, modern **WPLA** Jacksonville, album **WTGX** Pensacola, and modern **WXSR** Tallahassee.

EMI Closes Doors, Acts In Limbo

More than 130 staffers were let go as EMI Records permanently closed its doors last week. Execs now available include senior VP of promotion **Peter Napoliello** (212-226-3299) and senior director of rock promotion **Diane Gentile**. The Enclave and Guardian are expected to retain some key execs. A number of EMI acts are expected to move to Virgin, but the fate of much of the label's roster remains undetermined. Virgin will work **Queensryche**'s current single, "You," to radio; it hasn't been decided if the band will move to that label.

HARD TIMES: Trauma Records has laid off six of its 15 employees, including national alternative promotion director **Rebekah Jones** and national promotion director **Ben Brooks**. Billboard Bulletin suggests the cuts stem from economic hardship resulting from the label's dispute with Interscope over multiplatinum act **No Doubt**. Once the suit is resolved, the label could return to full staff, according to VP/GM **Jim Martone**.

SCOPE 'EM OUT: Former American Recordings VP of promotion **Mark Neiter** joins Interscope Records as an L.A.-based regional ... Interscope national singles and marketing person **Carol Magbojof** forms Spark Marketing. **Ani DiFranco** is the triple-A/Americana focused company's first client.

TECHNOLOGY: Techno veterans **Philip Blaine** of Kingfish Entertainment and former Revolution head of alternative radio promotion **Gary Richards** have formed 1200, a joint label venture with A&M Records. 1200's initial signing is electronic rock band **God Lives Underwater**.

NEXT: **Lida Galka**, former West Coast regional for Roadrunner, has joined Next Plateau Entertainment as national promotion director.

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Midyear Recaps And Good Things To Come

If you're reading this column in Rock Airplay Monitor, you've already seen our special midyear recaps. If you're reading it in our country, top 40, or R&B publications, you'll find them on page 4. Whether you're planning ahead for a fall music test or just keeping it pinned to your bulletin board to get a head start on the year-end countdown, it's something you'll want to clip and save for future use. Congratulations to all the No. 1 artists and labels.

Since the last time you saw this column, Top 40 and Rock Airplay Monitor have seen the addition of the enthusiastically received Modern Adult chart, the first of our Broadcast Data Systems custom charts. When we rolled out the Modern Adult chart last summer as a BDS-only online chart, critics said there were too many charts. But the response to Modern Adult proves that there can't be too many charts if radio and the industry consider a format or sub-format valid and want a new, accurate, honest way of measuring it. That was the same response we received when we debuted two more BDS custom charts—Active Rock and Heritage Rock—in Rock Airplay Monitor last month. (We even got some nice comments from labels about our first-ever Classic Rock chart, proving that the industry doesn't care only about new music.)

It's also the same initial response we've received to our plans to split the top 40/rhythm-crossover chart into two, more precisely targeted charts—Rhythmic Top 40 and Crossover.

There'll be more details in July, but we feel that we have the solution to the long-running format-definition controversy and have given programmers and the music industry a more useful tool than any rhythm-crossover chart available now.

And there's more coming. We've added recurrent charts to the R&B book, and they're on the way in other formats. Regional charts are coming to R&B, and we're only now starting to develop more tools for Country Airplay Monitor. After a lull at the beginning of the year, we've also started adding new BDS-monitored stations at a good clip again; if yours is one of the stations that's still waiting, we appreciate your patience. We hope it won't be much longer. If you have any questions or comments about BDS, reporting, the magazines, or any other issue, please call me at 212-536-5039. Or call our managing editors directly. You'll find their numbers and E-mail addresses on their columns starting this week.

A few shout-outs are in order here. 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Buck-O-Nine's Town Skates To The Beat

Although a perennial flavor in the modern rock universe, ska has received new punk-infused interest of late. And it's no secret that fans of the genre aren't all wearing porkpie hats and black suits with ties. San Diego's **Buck-O-Nine** has been influenced by the British ska of the late '70s but recognizes that ska has found new support with the street-sports set.

"The scene when the **Toasters** were [happening] probably wouldn't [encompass] kids who would ride skateboards, but it's all mingling in now," says lead singer **Jon Pebsworth**. Saxophonist **Craig Yarnold** adds, "'Thrasher' magazine would put out their own punk-rock compilations. There's always been a history between skateboarding and punk, and it's trickled over into ska a little bit as well."

Punk influence aside, Buck-O-Nine adheres to ska's time-honored characteristics—frenetic, upbeat, dancehall grooves infused with a good-time, positive message. Through a combination of touring since 1992 and three albums on independent label Taang! and its first for TVT, "Twenty Eight Teeth," Buck-O-Nine has built up a respectable following. And because playing shows and connecting with an audience is the lifeblood of any ska band, Pebsworth believes that the group's optimism helps him as a performer as well.

"Being able to play the happy music makes it a lot better. We're not getting up there and having to dig deep down inside for some emotional, hardcore shit like a **Pearl Jam** song, which is really deep and almost sad," he says. "I like to keep lyrics upbeat and positive, because to sing the same songs every night, I don't want to be singing about depressing stuff all the time."

In fact, part of Buck-O-Nine's appeal stems from Pebsworth's unpretentious, everyday-people narrative, ranging from the whimsical parody of

"Jennifer's Cold," in which he wryly compares a hypochondriacal girl's common cold to a worldwide state of emergency, to "Little Pain Inside," in which he ponders his hunger pangs, various fast-food franchises, and easy-to-make packaged foods for those on a low budget. "I do that a lot of times just to make myself feel better. It's like when you have something on your mind, you can get it off your mind by writing about it," he says.

It was being on the road and thinking of home that prompted Pebsworth's paean to "My Town." While its lyrics conjure up a universal theme, that song's inspiration was Pebsworth's life in the beachfront apartment he shares with his soon-to-be wife on a cul-de-sac in La Jolla, Calif. "I believe I live in the most beautiful city in the world, and La Jolla has the most awesome coastline," the singer says about his home of the past eight years. "The people living there are locals and are super-friendly. I just love being there, because everyone knows me and I know everyone and it's comfortable, relaxing, and beautiful," says the Los Angeles-born singer.

But Pebsworth won't be hanging in his 'hood this summer, because like any self-respecting ska band, Buck-O-Nine will continue to spend the season doing club shows until it joins the Warped tour July 7 for some dates, followed by radio-festival appearances through August and then a full-fledged U.S. tour in September. A lifelong fan of the genre—his introduction came as a fifth-grader fascinated with the **Specials**, **English Beat**, and **Madness** patches on the jacket of an older cool kid in the neighborhood—Pebsworth says happy ska is making a resurgence, but he suggests that along with the current wave of interest comes a swell of bands not prepared for the subtleties and nuances—such as room temperatures affecting horn tunings, the demands of playing unwavering fast tempos, etc.—of this highly specialized genre. "It's really hard to find seven people who can all play, get along together, write good songs, and make it work. It's a lot different from having a four-piece rock'n'roll band."

their personal lives and families. Now, it seems very quiet," he says. Except when Davis' 5-year-old daughter, Alex, comes home from school. "Then, the noise level is comparable," he adds.

Tom Taylor recently left the publication Inside Radio for home-office life with rival The M Street Journal. He cites a recent TV show that forced him to postpone some of his work until late in the evening. "I knew I could do that, because I didn't have the consideration of who else is going to be in the building. Are they going to turn out the lights? Do I need to get home?" Besides, Taylor says, at home "you can make whatever kind of coffee you want. You don't have to worry about leaving the last cookie or piece of cake in the lunchroom for somebody else. Parking's no longer a problem. You can take care of minor house chores that have been staring you in the face."

THE VIRTUAL OFFICE

Far from using a corner of the dining-room table like some home-based businesses, Beasing and Keating took over existing bedroom space in their homes. Davis converted a corner of his semi-finished basement into an office. Keating commandeered two spare bedrooms. One room is a dedicated voice-over studio complete with a digital work station, ISDN, and racks of equipment; the second bedroom is a working office, with fax machines and three computers.

Now with considerably less available living space, Keating notes that unexpected out-of-town guests find it difficult to stay overnight, "which is actually one of the biggest advantages of having a home-based business," he quips.

At Casa de Taylor, they've converted a room into an office, but, in addition, "the M Street folks were able to find a laptop that had enough capacity to put the M Street database on [it]," Taylor says. "I can take the laptop downstairs, and I can work out of the kitchen. Or I can work upstairs, here in the office." That became necessary as workers renovating Taylor's bathrooms were banging on the walls next to his new home office.

SELF-DISCIPLINE

Someone once suggested to Beasing that anyone who works from home should wake up early, shave, shower, get dressed, and drive around the block in order to trick the mind into thinking it has arrived at work and is ready to do some business.

Keating at least follows the getting up early part—he rises at 5:30 a.m. and is in his chair by 6:30. He usually takes a short break about noon, walks his dogs on the beach, comes back, and works until he has to deliver client packages to FedEx, Airborne, and UPS by 4:45 p.m. Davis also enjoys brief, built-in breaks when he walks his daughter to and from school each day. His wife, Nancy, is news director of the local NBC affiliate, which means Davis usually stops work to prepare dinner.

"I actually get out of the office less now than when I was working at a radio station," Davis says. "Since it's only me, every phone call is money or potential money, and I can't afford to miss any calls." However, he adds, once he comes upstairs, the office phone and fax can't be heard.

Keating has found that by working in a service-oriented career that adheres to other people's deadlines helps keep him within a disciplined structure. "Even when I was programming, I found that my most creative hours were at my home office," he says. "I found less outside distractions and a more comfortable, low-stress environment that was conducive to higher creativity."

The discipline issue as Taylor sees it, comes down to self-knowledge. "If you've spent some time in the work force, then you have some sense of your work habits and your tendencies," he says. For him, the TV is not usually a black hole of time. "I know that I very seldom can sit there in front of a television for a long

period of time. I'm a bad couch potato. I tend to want to get up and do stuff. [On the other hand,] I can sit in front of a computer screen for hour upon hour. I also know that about me. So I know that if I need to sit down and do that, I can, and that's no problem."

BOXERS OR BRIEFS?

One of Beasing's personal secret pleasures: "I enjoy participating on corporate conference calls while no one else suspects I'm actually in my underwear," he says. "I've had to master the knack of sounding like I have a tie on." He's also had to do some fancy explaining when the call was repeatedly interrupted by his two dogs barking for attention.

But there are drawbacks.

Beasing: "You and your roommate meeting at the beeping fax machine at 2 a.m. fighting over who gets to throw it out the window."

Davis: "The refrigerator is right upstairs, much too convenient. I've put on more weight than I had anticipated."

Beasing notes that during bad weather, he sometimes finds no reason to leave the house for two or three days. "Things do start to get a bit gamy sometimes as I gaze out the window, watching for the Meals on Wheels truck."

And Taylor admits, "I've literally not been off the property in two days. It comes back to knowing who you are and what you need. Hopefully, I recognize the signs of stir craziness before the guys in the white coats come. I think you need to plan some interaction."

That interaction includes water-cooler talk. "Just the 'Did you see "Seinfeld"?' Did you hear about that?" he says. "You have to work harder to create that sort of stuff on the phone." But Keating notes that "talking to my 20 voice-over clients and with consulting five others, I spend a lot of my time on the phone gaining a lot of outside perspective and listening to their widely different concerns and challenges." Plus, he adds, "thanks to E-mail and fax, it feels like we're all working in a giant global office."

And Taylor acknowledges, "The reality is that I spent most of my time at work in the previous job on the phone and on a computer, sometimes both at the same time. Now I've got more time to do that, and I'm used to that as a mode of working. It's not as if I went from a job where I was mostly interacting face to face with somebody. This is mostly what I did. I happen to be doing it now in a place where there aren't any human beings, but they're at the other end of the telephone line. They're that close. I've got more time to do that." In fact, taking the commute out of the equation means "two hours a day back in my work life."

Still, working at home can encroach on the rest of your life. Taylor tells of a friend who is a home-based consultant working with another well-known consultant. One Saturday night the home officer was kicking back with some entertaining Web surfing. Taylor says, "He gets an E-mail from his associate asking about music tests. And he E-mails back saying, 'Would you go to sleep? Just let me be a human being and have interests outside the business.'

"He was saying to his friend, 'You're a little obsessed with this thing.' And the technology gives us the tools to be even more obsessed than ever. We're always available, whether it's cell phone, pager, E-mail. I remember a couple of years ago, there was either an NAB or RAB board meeting in Jackson Hole, Wyo., and it was a delightful problem, because they discovered that nobody's cell phone would work."

Then there's the image issue. One prominent rock consultant didn't want to publicize his home office. And many home-office types rent mailboxes to establish a separate business address. Those boxes are usually referred to "suites," thereby allowing the consultant to convince clients that they work in a swanky, high-rise corner office.

MONITOR PROFILE

Rock Vet Robinson Helps WRCX Drive In Its Own Lane In Competitive Chicago

Active WRCX Chicago APD/MD/midday woman Jo Robinson has more than a decade of experience in the rock world. Heck, she spent that much time at album WIVQ Columbus, Ohio, alone before setting foot in the halls of WRCX nearly three years ago, just as the station was dropping its old handle, the Blaze.

Despite a wide variety of rock flavors in the market, WRCX gets to pretty much drive in its own lane, especially since modern WKQX (Q101) has taken a turn to the pop side. "We've had our hands full with them," says Robinson. "As recently as a year ago, 80% of our music was shared. Now, it's probably down to, with our currents, 10% or 15%."

On the other end of the demographic spectrum, the classic baton is being passed from WCKG—which Robinson says "is now talk from 6 a.m. 'til 7 p.m. [and] appears as

though they will be a full-time talk station in the near future"—to the recently launched WXCD under the guidance of former Q101 PD Bill Gamble.

Gamble is relying on enough Cat Stevens and Crosby, Stills & Nash to cast his station as a classic-hits outlet. Robinson says, "It's certainly leaning that way. I haven't heard a lot of tempo-driven classic rock on that radio station, but it's brand-new and Gamble's no dummy, so I'm sure he's going to be monitoring the market very closely and adjusting [what] he feels is necessary to do."

Then there's the phenomenon known as triple-A WXRT. "No other station in the country could probably get away with what they do as well as they do it and continue to make money doing it, so they're certainly not going to go anywhere," Robinson says.

Although WXRT and WRCX share some audience, Robinson claims to have a unique relationship with WRCX's triple-A competitor. "Even though we're owned by different companies, we've got a good relationship with [WXRT PD Norm Winer and MD Patty Martin], and a lot of times we will co-present shows that are coming to Chicago," she says. "We admit that they're a competitor, but we had a shared competitor at one time in Q101. So I think that that's actually what instigated everything."

Lastly, the adult modern set represented by WLUP and WTMX shares a segment of the WRCX audience.

Part of the WRCX plan is to cull a "gold library [of] the *crème de la crème* of rock records, the AC/DCs and Van Halens and harder Zeppelin tracks," she says. "The guys still like to hear Pink Floyd every now and then. Right now, we are fortunate to be able to own that in our gold. With the cur-

rents that we play, WRCX is very tempo-driven, and we're hesitant to play bands like Matchbox 20 or the Wallflowers or crunchy granola-leaning artists, because at this point, our guys are telling us that that's a little bit too soft." But, she adds, "we're keeping an open mind to that, because obviously they sell a ton of records, and we're here to play hit records."

Here's a sample midday hour on WRCX: Stone Temple Pilots, "Interstate Love Song"; AC/DC, "Hard As A Rock"; Rolling Stones, "Doo Doo Doo (Heartbreaker)"; Offspring, "Gone Away"; Pink Floyd, "Welcome To The Machine"; Ozzy Osbourne, "Shot in The Dark"; Faith No More, "Last Cup Of Sorrow"; Soundgarden, "Pretty Noose"; Rush, "Driven"; Alice In Chains, "Angry Chair"; Stevie Ray Vaughan, "Crossfire"; and Soundgarden, "Rhinosaur."

Here's a sample night hour on WRCX: Collective Soul, "Precious Declaration"; Smashing Pumpkins, "Today"; Offspring, "I Choose"; Pearl Jam, "Daughter"; Sammy Hagar, "Little White Lie"; AC/DC, "Moneytalks"; Living Colour, "Cult Of Personality"; Our Lady Peace, "Superman's Dead"; Metallica, "King Nothing"; Nirvana, "Dumb"; Guns N' Roses, "Sweet Child O' Mine"; and Local H, "Fritz's Corner."

Robinson considers WRCX pro-active, and its currents policy often reflects that. "There are a lot of times that we drive record labels crazy," says Robinson, voicing a common theme among today's active rockers (Rock Airplay Monitor, June 6). "We understand that they have a marketing plan, but we'll listen to a CD, and we'll say, 'This tune, actually, is a better song for us than the single that they're going after.' And we'll play it, and we won't play the single, and we just take a lot of flak for that."

Robinson understands the diverging agendas. "The record company's job is to sell records," she says. "They're doing the best thing that they think to be able to have their artists played on many radio station formats. So, if they think that they can get a band played on triple-A, alternative, and rock, be it mainstream or active rock, then they're going to sell more records. It only makes sense . . . Along the same lines, we're here to get ratings, so we're going to play the best new music that we possibly can, and if that means that we're not playing the single that the label wants us to play, so be it. Then it's the label's job to prove to us that we're wrong and that the song that they're promoting is a hit record."

With the industry still enduring the post-Telecom Act tempest, Robinson would seem to be in the middle of the storm by being in ever-changing Chicago and at Evergreen (soon to be Chancellor), one of the more active participants on the consolidation, station-swapping front. "The potential is there for some pretty huge changes, as companies are acquiring more and more radio stations, and particularly Evergreen, which likes to focus in the top 10 markets," Robinson says. "But we've got enough to deal with here in Chicago right now . . . You ask me in six months, and I'll probably have a different answer for you. We like to plan and scheme, and we would like to see things happen, but we don't have any concrete decisions being made just yet, but there are a ton of irons in the fire."


