Canadian Rockers Struggle With Stern, Can Con & Consolidation

Album radio north of the border got some attention last month, when heritage rocker CHOM Montreal announced that it would no longer carry the syndicated Howard Stern morning show. While U.S. stations have struggled with carrying Stern, none seem to have had the troubles of his recent Canadian affiliates. (CILQ [Q107] Toronto continues to air the show but has endured its own trials.) All is not equal in North American radio, and be it Stern or ownership or especially musical content, it's a different world programming rock radio in Canada.

For many Canadian PDs, the biggest difference from the U.S. is the smaller number of signals in a market, something that allows rock PDs to combine the music that would be owned by mainstream, modern, and even modern AC stations in the U.S. For example, Seattle has 63 stations, according to The M Street Radio Directory, but nearby Vancouver has only 28, 15 of them FM. "I don't think the competitive level is quite what it is" in the U.S., says album CFOX Vancouver PD Bob Mills. "Compared to the States, we don't have to be as pin-

pointed and niched as they do."

Album CFBR Edmonton, Alberta, PD Greg Diamond agrees. "In Canada, we've always by necessity broadcasted in the literal sense of the word, while American radio has had to niche itself by necessity." That means CFBR holds the sole album flag in Edmonton, with only classic rock CIRK to fill in the rock gaps in the market.

Diamond relishes the spectrum of music he can draw from while walking the tightrope of "How broad do you go before you start dumping the core?" But growing up in this form of radio culture, it's probably a little bit easier for us, being Canadian, because we were indoctrinated as Canadian radio listeners."

Mills says that while American rock radio has spent the last decade fragmenting, "here, we were able to incorporate the Nirvanas, Stone Temple Pilots, and Pearl Jams right into the mix, because that stuff fits in great with AC/DC. The guy that wants Stone Temple Pilots, he likes the Zeppelin stuff," although he sees too much breadth as a recipe for ratings disaster in the U.S.

At classic rock CFMI Vancouver, PD Ross Winters goes wider than a com-



Chancellor/Capstar To Be Largest Group

Chancellor Media and Capstar Broadcasting are set to merge in a stock-for-stock transaction that will create the nation's largest radio broadcasting company, valued at more than \$17 billion. The 463-station group will rank first nationally in revenue, broadcast cash flow, station count, and listenership. Under the terms of the agreement, Chancellor Media will acquire Capstar and rename it Chancellor Media Corp. The deal is expected to be consummated in the second quarter of 1999.

Thomas Hicks, chairman of the boards of Capstar, Chancellor, and the financial backer for both companies, Hicks, Muse, Tate & Furst, will serve as chairman of the combined entity. Chancellor Media president/CEO Jeffrey Marcus will retain that role in the combined company. Capstar president/CEO Steven Hicks will be vice chairman of the combined enterprise and will join Chancellor's board of directors. James deCastro will continue as president of Chancellor Radio Group. Chancellor Media CFO Matthew Devine and chief strategic officer Eric Neuman will retain their positions. In a separate development, Chancellor senior VP Bill Figenshu has announced his pending departure.

And Chancellor barely took a breath after announcing the Capstar merger before going to the till again, shelling out \$930 million for Whiteco Outdoor Advertising, which will make Chancellor one of the top five U.S. billboard operators.

In an attempt to revive its stock, CBS Corp. is spinning off its strongest division, radio operations, into a new radio and outdoor advertising arm to be called Infinity Broadcasting, which, not coincidentally, was also the name of the company sold two years ago by CBS president Mel Karmazin. CBS will retain 80% of Infinity; the rest will be made public via a stock offering.

FORMATS: WKRK GOES TO EXTREME

Album WKRK Detroit modifies its format under recently arrived PD Mike Stern. Modeled closely on his last station, modern KXTE Las Vegas, WKRK is now "Extreme Radio," with Stern

calling it "either the most active modern rocker in the country or the most alternative active rock in the country." MD Erin Carman remains in middays; Jennifer Sabo, new to overnights, was last P/T at modern rival WXDG (the Edge). Stern asks labels to send active and modern product.

After a quarter-century of rock, KTXQ (Q102) Dallas flips to R&B oldies as "Jammin' Oldies, 102.1." The entire KTXQ staff, including PD Andy Lockridge and MD Redbeard, is out. Reach Lockridge at 972-690-5010. KTXQ had been the flagship of Lex and Terry's syndicated morning show. The pair are again based at former host station album WFYV Jacksonville, Fla.

Jacor has taken control of modern XHRM (the Flash 92.5) San Diego and is looping a four-song playlist along with promos directing listeners to Jacor's modern XETRA-FM (91X). The entire staff, including PD Mike Halloran, exit; some staffers are being interviewed for opportunities in Jacor. Plans are for adult R&B KMCG to move its programming from its 95.7 frequency to 92.5 by Labor Day. Then all ears will be turned to 95.7 to find out what new format will bow there. Jacor classic rocker KGLQ Phoenix, the subject of ongoing format-change

rumors, has, at press time, segued to a poppier music mix, say market observers.

Modern KPNT St. Louis parent Sinclair has LMA'd Frischling's adult R&B KXOK and is simulcasting KPNT on KXOK's frequency for now. Will a jazz format crop up on KXOK in the coming weeks? Days before the LMA and simulcast, KXOK production director Mike Mitchell was picked up for production at Sinclair triple-A WVRV, replacing Chuck Jeffries.

WRVI (the River) Louisville, Ky., segs from classic hits to pop '80s with the new positioner "Totally '80s, 105.9, the River."

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Days Of The New Hit Another New Record

OLD HAT FOR DAYS OF THE NEW: Days Of The New reaches another milestone, as "The Down Town" (Geffen) becomes only the sixth track in the Broadcast Data Systems era to spend 10 or more weeks at No. 1 on the mainstream rock chart. Incidentally, one of the other five tracks was the act's "Touch, Peel And Stand," making the group the only act to hit the 10-plus-weeks milestone twice. Other acts who accomplished that feat once were U2 ("Mysterious Ways"), the Black Crowes ("Remedy"), Stone Temple Pilots ("Interstate Love Song"), and Live ("Lightning Crashes").

Eagle-Eye Cherry's No. 1 triple-A hit "Save Tonight" is the first Work title to hit the pinnacle on any of the Monitor rock charts... Fuel's "Shimmer" took seven weeks from its March 8 debut to hit the modern rock top 10. Since then, it has remained in the top 10 for 20 consecutive weeks, logging nearly 50,000 spins... The Goo Goo Dolls tie matchbox 20's record for most consecutive weeks at No. 1 on the modern adult chart, as "Iris" holds the top spot for the 13th week.

PEOPLE: STERN LOSES MONTREAL

It's been tough sledding for syndicated morning man Howard Stern north of the border. Album CHOM Montreal, one of his two Canadian affiliates, threw in the towel despite "substantial listenership," says CHUM Ltd. executive VP Fred Sherratt. Concurrently, sister CITY-TV Toronto will not air the new Stern TV show. CHUM Radio Group president Jim Waters said the editing CHOM had been doing on Stern's radio show was compromised by U.S. border stations beaming the unexpurgated program into Canada.

Top 40 WKRQ (Q102) Cincinnati PD Bill Klaproth is the new MD at classic rock WLUP (the Loop) Chicago.

Former KTXQ morning men Bo Roberts and "Long" Jim White officially return to the air in mornings at classic rock rival KZPS. The pair had been there temporarily since KZPS dropped the syndicated John Boy and Billy program.

Triple-A KINK Portland, Ore., has replaced the recently exited marketing director Martha Nielsen with Candace Gonzales, who had done freelance work for the station. Bob Ancheta, veteran of classic rock rival KGON, brings his blues show to KINK. He'll also do P/T.

Triple-A WZEW Mobile, Ala., picks up Bob and Tom in mornings, moving Sean Sullivan to afternoons, as MD/afternoons Alex Chesley exits.

Album WWCT Peoria, Ill., MD/afternoons

Jamie Markley heads to album WXRX Rockford, Ill., for mornings, joining Amy Cusimano. Markley replaces Pete McMurray, who left in May for N/T WCKG Chicago.

Classic hits WMGM Atlantic City, N.J., picks up Bob and Tom in mornings.

Jennifer Wilde returns to the MD/midday post at triple-A KZZE Medford, Ore.

Modern WRXR Augusta, Ga., MD/middays Kim Varin exits. Afternoon host Derek Madden adds APD/MD stripes. Michelle Mitchell joins for middays from the same at WIXV Savannah, Ga.

Back in Savannah, WIXV acting PD Keith Hendrix moves from afternoons to middays, with Jay Sinclair picking up afternoons.

Modern KROQ L.A.'s Labor Day Flashback 500 will include guest hosts Adam Ant, X's Exene Cervenka, the Motels' Martha Davis, Dramarama's John Easdale, Danny Elfman, Billy Idol, Bow Wow Wow's Annabella Lwin, Howard Jones, Tears For Fears' Curt Smith, Duran Duran's John Taylor, the English Beat's Dave Wakeling, and the Go-Gos' Jane Wiedlin.

Recaps Of Summer Hits Show Two Acts Topping Three Charts

We hate to be the ones to break the news to you, but summer's just about over. The good news is that it's time for our second annual "Hits of Summer" clip-and-save charts.

Last year, there were three distinct chart-toppers—Tonic, matchbox 20, and Sheryl Crow—on mainstream, modern, and triple-A. This year, modern and triple-A each places Goo Goo Dolls on top, and mainstream rock is topped by Days Of The New, an act that came in at No. 20 in '97.

Return performers at mainstream were Aerosmith, Metallica, and the Wallflowers.



While only Aerosmith took up two berths on last year's chart, this year the Kenny Wayne Shepherd Band and Creed each places two singles on the summer rock chart. At modern, only the Smashing Pumpkins return this year, while a comparison with the '97 and '98 triple-A top 10 shows the Dave Matthews Band and matchbox 20 reprising last year's roles.

The charts here cover tracking from the May 29 issue to the Aug. 28 issue. We suggest you keep this recap either for special programming or for picking one-year recurrants next summer.

MONITOR PROFILE

OM Stewart Broadens Music Beyond Guitars But Keeps End A Test Fest

It seemed a curious mix at the time. OM Vince Richards had left KKND (the End) New Orleans, one of modern rock's hardest-rocking stations, and was replaced by Dave Stewart, fresh from the other end of the modern spectrum at modern adult WPLI Miami. But since Stewart was also being handed the keys of top 40 sister KUMX (Mix 104), those AC letters on his résumé weren't so out of character.

Besides, management had other designs for the End. "When I got here," says Stewart, "one of the things that our market manager, Ernest James, charged me with was [changing the perception that] the station was maybe a little narrower and a little younger than it had to be."

Stewart inherited a mind-set that said, "The only thing these PIs were going to accept was Rage Against The Machine and, on the light side, a Pearl Jam [track]. And we've slowly but surely inched it as far as we could to take up as much of the avenue that's available to us on the pop side," he says.

"We've expanded the library, gone back a little further," he adds. That allowed Stewart to

create a retro feature, "Ancient End." Now, '80s cuts from R.E.M., U2, INXS, and Talking Heads pop up in a three-song set at noon, on specialty weekends, and throughout the day.

"I know a lot of people have to straddle the fence between being the male/female station and [answering the question] 'How much Tori Amos and Sarah McLachlan do you play?' The great thing here is my mission's real clear that KKND is a male-focused 18-34 station and Mix 104 is a female station, 18-34," says Stewart. "Compared with some other situations that PDs have to deal with, it's a nice clear-cut picture."

One thing the broadening of the End has meant is that Stewart has the opportunity to play such diverse acts as the Beastie Boys and the Brian Setzer Orchestra. He says, "I'd been a big naysayer and nonbeliever in both. But it gets to a point where it's hard to ignore both ends of the spectrum. I tell labels, 'I can't start every bandwagon,' but I will jump on them."

Stewart says that "when alternative and modern rock took off, a lot of us were guilty when grunge led the way. [We said], 'Wow, what listeners want is grunge rock.' Looking back, what listeners really wanted was new music. And when you look at [the] top five-testing songs at a male-focused station, you can have Creed [and the] Beastie Boys. There's a thirst within this audience for new music [that's] not necessarily grunge."

Because of that, he strives "to not have any preconceived notions about what the audience will accept." That's also the tack Stewart and PD Kandy Klutch have taken at Mix 104. "When you look at what's going on in the pop CHR world, there's a lot of feeding off of the alternative format, so there's a lot of sharing going on there. Roughly 28%-29% of Mix's cume also comes the End. So, there is some sharing, and it's what you would expect. I don't think it's any different than [anywhere] else—Marcy Playground's 'Sex And Candy' and Semisonic's 'Closing Time,' the Fastball's 'The Way.' A lot of

the popper modern rock hits have made the crossover here at Mix, too."

And those shared songs can live comfortably on both stations since the lion's share of each station's listeners doesn't cross cume. "I've still got my call-out, and if, for whatever reason, they get sick of it, they'll tell me with burn scores," he says. "Whether it's because they're sick of us playing it or sick of other stations playing it, they'll tell us."

Here's a sample hour on KUMX: Aerosmith, "I Don't Want To Miss A Thing"; TLC, "Waterfalls"; matchbox 20, "Real World"; Seal, "Crazy"; N Sync, "Tearin' Up My Heart"; Alanis Morissette, "Uninvited"; Jesus Jones, "Right Here Right Now"; All Saints, "Never Ever"; Third Eye Blind, "Jumper"; Commodores, "Brick House"; Barenaked Ladies, "One Week"; and Savage Garden, "Truly Madly Deeply."

Here's a sample hour on KKND: Smashing Pumpkins, "Perfect"; Days Of The New, "Touch, Peel And Stand"; Marcy Playground, "Saint Joe On The School Bus"; Live, "All Over You"; Lenny Kravitz, "Fly Away"; Seven Mary Three, "Cumbbersome"; Embrace, "All You Good People"; U2, "Pride (In The Name of Love)"; Harvey Danger, "Flagpole Sitta"; Flys, "Got You (Where I Want You)"; Nirvana, "In Bloom"; Bad Religion, "21st Century Digital Boy"; and Fiona Apple, "Criminal."

In the interest of promoting the End as a new-music station, as opposed to a modern or alternative outlet, Stewart says, "we've tried to get away from using the 'A' word as much as possible. The logo carried a banner that said, 'The rock alternative.' We changed the banner and are using it for a couple of different reasons in a couple of different areas. We've got one banner that says, 'New rock for New Orleans.' One that says, 'New rock first' . . . We wanted to emphasize the word 'rock' since it is a male-focused station. And it just felt like there was a lot more room for long-term growth using rock as opposed to alternative."

Perhaps one of the most male-focused things the End has done recently has been the month-long Test Fest, or Testicle Festival, which Stewart calls "sort of the anti-Lilith Fair promotion."

He explains, "We did a monthlong celebration of men. We did a bus trip to a casino the first weekend. We did a motorcycle run for charity the second weekend. The third weekend we did the first Test Fest open golf tournament. And the final weekend we did a wrap-up party with bands and bikini contests and cigar smoking and red-meat eating. It was a lot of fun. And no real backlash, actually. The women who listen to the station seemed to take it for what it was—good, clean all-American fun."

Having worked the modern and modern adult sides of the fence, Stewart says, "I really think the modern rock, new rock—whatever you want to call it—is going to have more longevity."

Recalling research during his modern adult life in Miami, Stewart says, "We found after a while it is just damn hard to ignore Celine Dion or Toni Braxton. So, if you're going to define your format by what you're not going to play and be true-blue modern AC, I don't know if you've got a future. If this format is going to target women 18-34, but you're not going to play . . . whatever the more pop-based flavor of the month is for those women . . . if you're going to ignore them by genre, the future is limited."

As his experiment with swing showed him, "my preconceived notion was, 'I don't know that swing will work,'" says Stewart. "I still have to use a little common sense and say, 'I don't think there's room for five or six of them.' But I can't discard what's going on with it altogether. When I was in modern AC, which is when it was taking off, the format was definitely defined by what it was not. It's just hard to make those broad, sweeping statements and take those stances permanently." **MARC SCHIFFMAN**

Canadian Rockers Struggle With Stern, Can Con & Consolidation

parable stateside signal might. "We're not even a pure classic rock station because we don't have to be. There's not another classic rock biting us from the market."

And Winters doesn't worry about alienating classic rock "purists" in his audience by cutting Tom Petty with the Wallflowers. "Some of them don't like it, but there's not enough signals for them to go anywhere else. We do lots of research to find what stuff mixes well with the Rolling Stones' 'Sympathy For The Devil.' We have to know what works with it," he says. "So it's mainstream rock stuff that we would play."

CANADIAN FOR CONSOLIDATION

While consolidation rests as the centerpiece of U.S. radio issues, Canada is just getting a taste of it. The recent purchase of WIC stations by Shaw in Canada signaled some early consolidation movement in a country where duopoly is just becoming legal in most markets. Mill's CFOX is about to become the sister of rival CFMI. Mills thinks that once the two properties start shacking up, there may be a clearer separation of the two. But that is likely to be where the similarities to the wholesale consolidation of U.S. radio will end. "We don't have as many stations to begin with," Mills says. "Already, the majority of stations in Canada are owned by a handful of people." The days of mom-and-pop owners are waning, says Mills, but it's not clear to what level consolidation will take place in such a small pool.

CHOM PD Ian MacLean is scratching his head on the consolidation front. He notes, "Everyone wants to buy, but no one wants to sell."

As he prepares to see what Canadian consolidation will bring, Diamond says, "I'd like to phone someone up in the States and ask, 'How did you get through this thing?' We're going to try and stay as proactive as we possibly can."

DO THE CAN CON

You think you've got troubles answering to a consultant, group PD, and angry record reps about music? Try programming in Canada, where programmers have long been compelled to devote 30% of musical programming to Canadian product. While ownership and some other programming rules have been loosened in recent years, Canadian-content (Can Con) requirements are being expanded to 35% in 1999.

Mills says that he feels "both good and bad about it. It's good from a Canadian music perspective," he says. "[But] for the consumer, it limits what they get to hear." CFMI's Winters laments that it's hard to program a temporally restricted format like classic rock with the addi-

tional limitations of Can Con. "Most of the Canadian music from the '70s and '80s is burnt," Winters says. So, much of CFMI's Can Con compliance comes from the new music file. "You have to play 30% Canadian, and there's just not the product," he says. "There's a lot of good Canadian rock bands, but there's just not enough to be forced by the government to play."

Like many PDs we spoke to, MacLean notes that only 14% of record sales in Canada are for Canadian artists. He says, "We're already playing at 30% twice what they're buying."

"Let's face it, the market is not necessarily here at home," MacLean adds. And even if it were, Canada is too small to yield a lot of multi-platinum sales stories. "Once you've sold to the 30 million people in Canada, that's it. There are 30 million people living in Mexico City." Fearing that growing Can Con regulation will "further inflate the system with second-rate material," MacLean suggests that Canada shift its focus from a culture quota to a national music policy focusing on export. "Get it on a boat or plane or Internet, and get it out of here. Set up a world tour. Set up a satellite broadcast. If you're a mild success in a hundred countries, you'll be a bigger success than being the biggest success here."

MacLean has one more restriction in Montreal that his programming brethren in most other parts of the country don't share anymore. It's the remnants of early Canadian regulation that hold that an FM station cannot play more than 49% hits, meaning anything that has reached No. 40 on the charts. Then there's the way ratings are measured in Montreal, where English-speaking listeners are a distinct category from Francophone and bilingual French listeners. So MacLean has to target a small subset of Montreal listeners with 30% Canadian music, while ensuring that half of what he plays is not a hit. Got that?

Is it any wonder then that you'll hear Aerosmith, Pearl Jam, and Smashing Pumpkins on CHOM with such pop-friendly artists as Swirl 360? Very simply, says MacLean, "if you don't have a larger share of English listenership, you're not on the buy."

And with no heavier rock station covering the market, MacLean finds it easier to ignore acts like Rob Zombie and Aerosmith's heavier offerings. "It's easier to embrace Heather Nova, Natalie Imbruglia, and Natalie Merchant," he says.

"You have to consider as a rock programmer that rock as a format has not really had dramatic share increases in the last decade," MacLean continues. "There's an increasing confluence of pop styles. When I hear Puff Daddy doing 'Kashmir' or Propellerheads teaming with Shirley Bassey, it shows that the lines of definition have become

blurred . . . What's rock? It's a song-by-song situation, and if Chumbawamba fits in, and the people want to hear it," then MacLean is going to play it. "Why not play the most popular record in the world?" MacLean asks. "There's a lesson from guys like David Bowie, who has continually reinvented himself. He's always in the next wave."

STERN ISSUES

With CHOM getting off the Stern bandwagon, an obvious question is, How do other programmers compare America's loudest radio export with homegrown talent, and would they want Stern at their station?

Comparing the two countries, Winters says, "If you take Howard Stern and Rush Limbaugh out of the picture, Canadian and American personalities are interchangeable. There are a lot of Canadian broadcasters that are in-your-face personalities."

For his part, MacLean says that he sees the Stern issue as one of pride. "If any culture lived next door to the largest cultural exporter in the world," it would be reluctant to embrace an export, especially one that's so polarizing.

"What happened when Stern came into Canada," says Diamond, "[is] he was such a different animal from the other personalities that that's what caused the biggest problem for everybody,

from an industry standpoint. All of a sudden, here comes Howard, [who] took what [was] appropriate or inappropriate and stood it on its head and pushed the envelope tenfold just by signing on. I see the good and the bad in it. I don't know how much longer he's going to be in Canada."

Winters adds, "The thing with Stern is, generally speaking, stations that use him are having some real ratings problems, so Stern is a fix. I know there's a number of stations in the U.S. that put him on because they needed something."

Diamond says, "For what we're doing here, I don't feel that I need Howard Stern. I'm sitting in double-digit shares without Howard, and it's costing me a lot less."

Winters also worries that Toronto and Montreal are more in the New York loop, while in Vancouver, Stern's New York focus might directly go against the general dislike of Easterners that folks in Vancouver have.

Mills says, "We're a very-personality-oriented radio station at the Fox. We're a hard-ass rocker and a smart-ass station in stationality and presentation . . . That doesn't mean crack the mike and tell everyone to fuck off, [but] if you're having some fun, and you've got somebody sitting on the edge of their seat with great, compelling radio, let's do it."


