OFFICIALS OF WHITE RATS SET UP BAD MEMORY ALIBI AT QUIZ

Forgetfulness Comes to Their Rescue Frequently

New York, Jan. 4.—Officials of the "White Hats Action" Union, who took the stand yesterday afternoon in the Hackey row being conducted by Receiver Louis Brandeis, apparently sought to make bad memory their alibi. At critical times, when questions of a most important nature were put to them, bad memory came to their rescue like a true friend and made them out of a bad situation. Doubtful prosecution had necessary, however, as the hapless prosecution proved an unorthodox friend. Not, all to be said, giving the devil his due, bad memory was an important factor and one consideration came up at the trial, which the witness experienced under the investigation.

NEW RULES FOR PROTECTION OF PICTURE FILM FROM SHIPPERS

Bureau of Explosives Submits New Specifications

Searchity of Tin and Sheet-Iron Makes Changes Necessary

War Affects Picture Industry in Still Another Way

New York, Jan. 4.—The war is to have a still further effect on the picture industry. Owing to the scarcity of tin and sheet iron procured by war requirements it has been found necessary to make radical changes in the specifications for the shipment of motion picture film and the Bureau of Explosives has framed a draft of new specifications. The new rules are intended for the protection of film in transit and also to safeguard the public.

A subcommittee of the Transportation Committee of the National Association of the Motion Picture Industry, Inc., has been working for some time with the representative of the Bureau of Explosives for the purpose of amending the present regulations. The members of this subcommittee are: A. E. Vogel, chairman, Greater Pittsburgh; Herbert E. Clark, Parkersburg; Alvin Stock, Pittsburgh; W. E. Williams, Meigs; J. C. Clark and William L. Sherry, Parsons Film Co.; A. E. Thompson, Parkersburg; and J. H. Wilson, Pittsburgh. Previous correspondence World Film Corp.

G. N. THOMPSON PASSES AWAY SUDDENLY AT FLORIDA HOME

Widely Known Showman Victim of Heart Trouble

Was Identified With Outdoor Shows Since Early Age

Longest Period of Service Was With Sells Bros.

Sarasota, Fla., Jan. 4.—G. N. Thompson, one of the best known showmen in America, died at his home on Friday night of heart trouble. He was 61 years old.

Mr. Thompson was born December 10, 1859, at Middletown, Ill., where he attended the public school. He became identified with outdoor shows at an early period of his life and remained in that profession continuously until the time of his death only one month after the close of the season of 1920, which he finished with "Hunting Show" Circus at Memphis, Tenn., November 4, apparently in the heat of season.

MISS 1917 PASSES INTO HANDS OF THE RECEIVER

Friendly Action Against Show at Century, New York, Is Brought by Flore Revalles, the Dancer
— Corporation Said To Owe About \$100,000 to Creditors

New York, Jan. 18.—The theatrical committee of the week was organized in the announcement that Miss 1917 was to be withdrawn from the Century Theater and that the theater and building had been leased to Ethel, Comstock & Co., who on January 14 will open the City Opera House from the Madison Opera House. This was followed by a closed session when the Century Amusement Corporation, which was incorporated last year's January 1917 as well as this year's Miss 1917, passed into the hands of receivers.

Miss 1917 will end her career tonight unless it is decided to net her business on the road. In case of such a trial the production will necessarily be subjected to considerable pruning. For a production on such a scale with such an array of talent is impractical for a working but a multi-million dollar show, and, in fact, it has proved impractical even in that respect in the present business.

If the present agent of Miss 1917's career, Comstock and Co., is liquidated in the hands of theatrical creditors, the production has approximately \$100,000 in assets. It is the object of management would carry such a show to success. It is believed that the show was unprofitably withdrawn in several instances, but from a multi-

Henry Ellsworth Dies

One of Ohio's Leading Theatrical Managers at One Time
