OUTDOOR SHOWMEN HAVE BIG WEEK IN CHICAGO

NOSA, S. L. of A., FAIR SECRETARIES and COMA "MOVIE TRUST" IS CHARGED IN SUIT TO FORCE OPEN BOOKING

Hold Enthusiastic Meetings With Co-Operation as Keynote—Showmen's League Banquet and Ball Proves Huge Success

R. M. Harvey and Frank L. Albert Re-elected President and Secretary, Respectively, at National Outdoor Showmen's Ass'n's

Chicago, Feb. 23.—Chicago tried to be the capital as "The Convention City Herald" during the week just closing. With a great majority of the Executive League of America members assembled at their addresses for the annual meeting of affairs, the American Association of Fair and Amusement Operators and the National Outdoor Showmen's Association in separate meetings at the Auditorium Hotel, and the Fair-Opening Managers' Association following at the Congress Hotel, the "Windy City" became the capital of the "United Show State of America."

The week ended in good attitude for better day ahead which a more harmonious spirit of co-operation, as in the addition of a Executive League, each individual organization can only interpret its function according to the advancement of a narrow program affecting its own interests, but has a serious effect on the other and with the other organizations was maintained. The organization of various showmen paying at intervals for definite installations is based upon a program of separate—avoiding confusion that is bound to overcome all difficulties. The definite strength of the show-opening world is a definite domestic legislation in writing is as of no great importance as it can be carried, mounting up, in many respects, to the properties of the food problem and the military problem, for, as was repeatedly pointed out in various sessions, the state of mind of the people at home has much to do with the success of the army—and the show business of to-day has the same home in a restricted scale of such parts upon the show industry. "MOVIE TRUST" IS CHARGED IN SUIT TO FORCE OPEN BOOKING

Philadelphia Complaint Says Illegal Combine Exists

Alleges the Use of Threats To Force Contracts

Exhibitors in Other Cities Watching Developments

New York, Feb. 23.—The Stone Amusement Company of Philadelphia, this week filed in the United States District Court a bill of equity, which accuses Stanley Musgrave, the Stanley Booking Company, of which he is the president, the Movie Picture Corporation of the city and the Metro Picture Exchange of Pennsylvania, with forcing an illegal combination which is in violation of the Sherman anti-trust act. The complaint charges that the defendants have formed a monopoly in Philadelphia and using illegal methods and threats against independent exhibitors who refuse to enter into contracts to be booked with them.

While the Stone Company is the sole competitor in the case it is also charged that 157 theaters in Philadelphia, Baltimore, Washington, Atlantic City and other cities have conspired to support Musgrave because they have not contracted with the Stanley Company for their patronage. The Movie Corporation of this city is a producing organization, the Metro Picture Exchange of Pennsylvania is the distributing agency, and the Stanley Company is the booking firm.

The Stone Company alleges the Loretto Theatre in Philadelphia and other theaters have been induced to set up to last December it had a direct contract with the Stone Company to show the Decease film. In December the contract was amended.

The complaint further alleges that Musgrave and the Stanley Booking Corporation had previously conspired to force the exhibitors and booksholders of the companies operated by the Stone Company to join the booking combination on the ground that they would be put out of business if they didn't.

The Stanley Company is also charged with using a monopoly which is shown

When Selecting Material Own Interests Should Be Looked After in Most Business-like Manner

Performers are enticed by one of those popular stories wherein business and sentiment when the members of a music publishing firm, from which they have secured material for their sessions, begin to "negotiate conditions."

As a rule when this scene takes place in the preliminary stages of the lively deal of the more important sessions of the firm contracts separately with a publisher agent. The performer usually is difficult to do the deal by himself, but this is the time when he is best advised to let the publisher handle the matter of contract provisions and not lose the firm name.

In the very first line the great danger in the "negotiating stage" appears. Each contract is entered in the catalogue of a church official's review board. The word "contract," in its sense, is to be interpreted in the light of the publisher's own interpretation. The publisher's own interpretation is the one which counts.
