Interest indeed. It's pure pop, but with crossovers happening so big these days, you never can tell. Interesting

Speaking of cop,put an ear to the new <u>States</u> album on Boardwalk. The title tune is the best Chinnichap pop I've heard in months, and could be a great teen/car single. Bring on the compression.

I'm looking for the strongest play yet on <u>New England</u> with their new album "Walking Wild" due late this week. I've lived with the tape for a couple of days, but on first listen I hear more variety (especially in the vocals), much better production (Todd?), and a number of playable tracks. We'll see a good buzz on this one.




JIM STEINMAN "Bad For Good"







Question Of The Week

Columbia's Jim McKeon dropped us a note suggesting the following question. "What was the first record/album/ song that really jolted and affected you significantly?" We also asked our respondents for their first single and album bought, first concert and most memorable concert attended (and year if they could remember).

- JIM MCKEON, COLUMBIA: "The first single I ever bought was 'Sink The Bismark'. Aside from the obvious Beatles on Ed Sullivan event, my mind was musically altered by two things. Arthur Lee and Love's '7&7 Is' which was truly psychedelic before psychedelic was. Also, everything by the Byrds, especially the first two albums which really got me deep into lyrics and other things. Aside from that, my Detroit roots were heavily Motown oriented. My friends and I were the only white kids at the Fox Theater during Christmas vacation where we got to see the Supremes, Marvin Gaye, Temptations, and my favorites, The Four Tops...All for 50¢."
- MARKO BABINEAU, A&M: "The first one to knock me out was 'Hot Smokin' Sassafras' by Bubble Puppy." The first one I purchased was Little Richard. A side was 'Tutti Fruitti'. The first album I bought was Roy Orbison with 'Crying' on it...Most memorable concert had to be back in 1967, a three-bill act. The opener was Led Zeppelin and Raven, and the headlingr was MC5."
- JIMMY DEL BALZO, POLYGRAM: "My first musical memories is going ga-ga over my sister's Platter's; Kingston Trio; and Peter, Paul & Mary Lps (I was a very hip kid). But the real turning point for me was the Beatles' first appearance on Ed Sullivan. Shortly after, I remember sneaking a copy of a Beatle newspaper into my house complete with lyrics of 'She Loves You', and conspiring to buy a Beatle wig. Both schemes got thwarted by my parents because they were convinced that listening to Beatle records would cause hair to grow on my palms. Similar to the way many program directors feel about the New Wave music...Some things never change."
- SEAN COAKLEY, ATCO: "'Pipeline' and-err-and, what was the last Hard Choice? Actually, the first album I ever bought was 'Meet The Beatles'."
- <u>ROY ROSENBERG, STIFF</u>: "Without a doubt, the first records that affected me were by the great Four Tops. Songs like 'Bernadette' and 'Standing In The Shadows Of Love' are without lables--to me they are the epitome of music. Just to relive a famed high school argument, I still say that the Tops are a 100 times better than the Temptations."
- are a 100 times better than the remptations. <u>BONNIE SIMMONS, WARNER BROTHERS</u>: "In 1959, my older brothers used to listen to the R&B station in New York . There was this record 'Sea Of Love' by Phil Phillips. I bet one of my older brothers it would be a hit record because I kept walking around the house (okay, I'll admit to age 10), singing it. I won \$5.00 which was at least a couple month's allowance. So, I guess that was quite important to me--Whether it was important because of the record or the \$5.00, I'm not telling...It was probably also the first single I bought, discounting the little golden records my mother bought me...The next record that really jolted me was Smokey Robinson's 'Ooh Baby, Baby' cause I was in love...All those minor jolts through the years led to a re-vamping when I heard the first Elvis Costello album. See, this is endless, because just last night I heard the new Rickie Lee Jones record and the same thing happened to me. This morning on the radio I heard 'Oh Pretty Woman' by Roy Orbison and the Drifters doing 'Under The Boardwalk'. I guess it's incurable...When I first switched over to buying albums from buying singles, I'm woman enough to admit it might have been a Johnny Crawford album. Or it might have been the soundtrack to 'My Fair Lady'. Okay, that gives you enough fodder to make fun of me again."
- BOB FEINEIGLE, EPIC: "'Cannonball' by Duane Eddie was the first single to knock me out, so I bought it. I was in the geriatric section of the market even at that young age...First album I purchased? Probably either a Booket T and the MG's Lp or the Standells, I can't remember for sure. No, it was Junior Walker and the All-Stars...The earliest recall of a concert I have is in 1969. I saw the Santana/Janis Joplin concert and in the same year I saw the Doors...Seeing Bill Haley and the Comets on TV and the movie 'Rock Around The Clock' were very close together as he was doing something on TV that made me want to see the movie. It basically sucked me into music--it lit that little fire inside me."






ALAN WOLMARK, ATLANTIC: "Listening to WMCA while driving in my neighbor's car, hearing 'Does Your Chewing Gum Lose Its Flavor On The Bedpost Overnight' on my way to my very first Yankee game. At that moment, music became more important to me than sports."

STEVE LEEDS, INDEPENDENT: "Probably Peter, Paul and Mary's first album. It was my first exposure to alternative music lifestyles, and served as my introduction to FM radio."


- MICHAEL PAPALE, INDEPENDENT: "Danny And The Juniors 'At The Hop', Del Vikings 'Come Go With Me', and Buddy Holly's 'That'll Be The Day' all knocked me out. My first purchase was Danny And The Juniors and Clarence 'Frogman' Henry, while my first album was Martin Denny 'Quiet Village'--I'll never forget it...The best concert was the Drifters, but I don't remember the year...I was up on the roof in the sun. I guess I was about 13 or 14."
 - MIKE BONE, ARISTA: "My first rock and roll experience was Elvis Presley and I think it was 'Hounddog', but I'm not really sure. My parents have a picture of me doing an air-guitar scene when I was 5 or 6 years, to an Elvis Presley tune. It should be noted, however, prior to this my brother (who is ten years older than I am) listened continuously to WIBB, the daytime AM rhythm and blues station in Macon. So, I was exposed to R&B from the time I was four years old, which accounts for my intense interest in heavy metal (you figure it out)."
 - J.B.BRENNER, A&M: "I guess it was seeing Elvis Presley perform on the old Milton Berle Show. The reaction of my family made me take note that something new and different was going on. It was not long after that I traded my Davey Crockett hat in for a copy of 'Hounddog'...Not long after, I was motivated to run to the record shop to pick up a copy of 'Great Balls Of Fire' by the killer himself, Jerry Lee:Lewis."
 - RAY TUSKEN, CAPITOL: "The first record I bought was 'Heartbreak Hotel' by Elvis Presley in 1956 on 78 cause that's all my parents had, and traded it in the next week for a 45. All my first records were either early Elvis or Little Richard or Buddy Holly. Coming into adolescence with Elvis Presley was terrific and going to college when the Beatles were in was great."
 - PAUL RAPPAPORT, COLUMBIA: "I was in the 7th grade and 'I Want To Hold Your Hand' by the Beatles was the song. I combed my hair down in front of my face and immediately was thrown out of algebra class. I knew then I was different."
 - <u>KID LEO, WMMS</u>: "First album Four Seasons singing 'Big Girls Don't Cry', but I was buying singles for years before that. I listened to Alan Freed when I was 4 or 5. I think it was his scream that hooked me...First concert: Four Seasons at Euclid Beach--I was about 12 at the time...Most memorable: Our MMS tenth anniversary show with Bruce Springsteen at the Agora--for a variety of reasons."
 - <u>JOE MCCABE, KYYS:</u> "'Signs' by the Five Man Electrical Band. I made my sister write down all the lyrics of that song so I could sing along every time I heard it...First single: Shocking Blue and 'Venus'...First album: Led Zeppelin II, I bought it for my sister...First concert: Herman's Hermiits in Atlantic City, followed by the Monkees in Philadelphia...Most memorable: A couple; McCartney and Wings, The Who, and Dylan when he was touring with the band in 1974."
 - DAVE LANGE, WDBE: "First Lp 'Meet The Beatles' (I sold my Boy Scout uniform for it)...First single: 'Please Please Me'...First R&R experience: The Byrds 'Mr. Tambourine Man'...First live show: The Who in Detroit at the Grande Ballroom in 1968...Most memorable: Pink Floyd's 'Dark Side Of The Moon' tour."
 - RAD MESSICK, WFYV: "First song that brought my attention to rock and roll was 'Swablr' by Cream, or the Yardbirds' 'Heart Full Of Soul'...First single: 'Spirit In The Sky' by Norman Greenbaum. (one of the only three singles . I ever owned. Others were 'Make Me Smile' (for all the edits), and 'J'Taime' just for the French noises)...First Lp: Actually a gift from my parents for Christmas. It included 'Inna Gadda Da Vida', 'Best Of Cream', Santana, Zeppelin I, Vanilla Fudge (with 'You Keep Me Hanging On') and 'The Yardbird's Greatest Hits'...First concert: Jimi Hendrix with the Monkees and the Mitch Mitchell trio, 1966...Most memorable: Ithad to be the first time I saw a band called Tranquility at Duke University in 1972."
 - <u>ED LEVINE, WAQX</u>: "'Young Girl' by Gary Puckett And The Union Gap. That's the one I played bongos to in the 6th grade and that tune inspired me to keep a list for two years of WABC's top 20 records every week...First single bought: Something by the Beatles...First Lp: 'Meet The Beatles' (hey, I'm original!!)...First live show: Being the youngster that I am, it was the Concert for Bangladesh (not a bad way to start)...Most memorable: Bob Dylan at Madison Square Garden in 1974...Worst show: Joe Cocker on the tour booked as 'The Concert' where he came out for 2 hours and did absolutely nothing familiar. It's the only show I paid to get into and walked out."
 - <u>SKY DANIELS, WLUP</u>: "Big Bopper 'Chantilly Lace'...First single: Contours 'Do You Love Me'...First album: Bobby Vee--the one with 'Will You Still Love Me Tomorrow?' I combed my hair like Bobby for two years...First concert: With my own dough on my own go, it was Sly and the Family Stone with James gang opening--1967...Most memorable: Bruce Springsteen, John Carroll University, 1974."
 - EDDIE WAZOO, WPLR: "For me the first song that I can really remember sticking in my head was the Everly Brothers' 'Wake Up Little Suzy'...The second tune that comes to mind is Ian Whitcomb's 'You Turn Me On'...First single bought: The Who, 'I Can See For Miles'...First album: Beach Boys' 'Little Deuce Coupe'...First concert: Either Jimi Hendrix (with Soft Machine'and'Enchanted Forest') or else the Association and The Union Gap...Most memorable concert: Probably one of the Little Feat shows on the tour right after 'Waiting For Columbus'."
 - STEVE KOSTAN, WABX: "First song, 'Sink The Bismark' (I was about 5 years old laid up with the measles, and it was my first experience with skipping school. Ironically, it coincided with my first rock and roll infection)...First album bought: 'Meet The Beatles'...First concert: Savoy Brown at the Birmingham Palladium, 1970...Most memorable: You usually can't remember the best ones. For obvious reasons--probably The Who on their 'Tommy' tour 1970 (with the James Gang)."
 - DAVE KRUSENKLAUS, WKQQ: "'Satisfaction' by the Stones. I was an infant then, but I remember rocking my crib to 'Satisfaction'...First single bought: 'Penny Lane/Strawberry Fields'...First album: Association's 'Greatest Hits' (I still have it!)...First concert: Elton John 1972, Dayton Ohio... Most memorable: For musical value, probably the last Springsteen show, but for news value, The Who in Cincinnati last December."
 - BOBBIN BEAM, WLPX: "'I Wanna Hold Your Hand'--when my whole record buying awareness happened...First album bought: 'Meet The Beatles'...First concert: Jimi Hendrix at the Seed in Milwaukee (with the Soft Machine)...Most memorable: Rolling Stones in Chicago in 1978."
 - BELLE, KTIM: "'One' by Harry Nilsson. Every summer I want to Pasadena to visit my girlfriend, and I'm sure I heard it on KHJ...First single: Never bought singles because my cousin Arte Kornfeld always gave them to me...First album: Procul Harum 'A Salty Dog', or the Nillsson 'Aerial Ballet'...First concert: I'm sure it was Tull or Zeppelin, but the impact of the group was meaningless. We all went just to get high and socialize...Most memorable concert: The Paul Simon concert last year. It was very sentimental because he carried me back to my childhood."




- WARD HOLMES, WDEK: "'Along Comes The Association' was my first plug-in to what was happening musically. Other than that I just stuck WLS in my ear all day...First Lp bought: Peter, Paul And Mary in concert...First single: I've never bought a single in my life. My sister always collected them...First concert: Beach Boys in 1965...Most memorable: Eagles and Beach Boys when they played Chicago."
- JUDY MCNUTT, KGB-FM: "When I was about 6 years old, I thought the 'Flying Purple People Eater' was real neat. I remember dancing to it. I made my Mom buy me the 45 (first one)...First album: "Meet The Beatles'...First concert: Buffalo Springfield in Albuquerque--I was about 14...Most memorable concert: Springsteen at Red Rocks and Joni Mitchell at Rocks--both 1979."
- LARRY BRUCE, KGB-FM: "'Jailhouse Rock' by Elvis Presley...First single bought: 'Green Onions'... First album: 'Meet The Beatles'...First concert: The McCoys in 1965 at St. Joe's college in Rensselear. Most memorable: A tie--Bruce Springsteen at Red Rocks, Denver, and Bob Dylan's return with the band in 1974, also at Red Rocks."
- JOE BONADONNA, WMMR: "'I Saw Her Standing There' by the Beatles, coming out of 77 WABC, New York, with Bruce Morrow pushing the Beatle button. I was still in elementary school, but became instantly addicted to the little transistor and the Beatles...I do remember 'The Purple People Eater', and also vague memories from early childhood of 'The Happy Organ' from Dawe 'Baby' Cortez...The first single bought had to be the 'I Saw Her Standing There'...I bought 3 records the first time I went out--aside from the Beatles album, I got 'Disreali Gears' and 'Are You Experienced'...First concert: Led Zeppelin at the Pavillion Theater 1969 in NYC."
- <u>ROB BARNETT, WAAF</u>: "'Crimson And Clover' knocked me out. First one I bought was 'Build Me Up Buttercup'. In 1967 I attended the Monkees concert in NY. The opening act was Jimi Hendrix, and all I can remember is a vision of girls being clubbed over the head by cops. My hearing was impaired for almost a week... My first musical experience was the first time a record rep called me."
- DAVID BERNSTEIN, WAAF: "First single was 'Monday, Monday'. First single bought was 'She Loves You'... Most memorable concert was Stevie Wonder opening for the Rolling Stones (I'm so mainstream) in 1968... First experience was getting high to Led Zeppelin."
- RONALD REAGAR, WNOR: "The first single that really knocked me out was 'Rock Around The Clock'. I was a nasty little brat. I was completely unsufferable until my parents took me to the record store... The first album was 'Hard Day's Night'...The first concert was in 1974, Minnie Riperton."
- CHARLIE WEST, KMOD: "The first rock and roll record that really got me excited was the Beatles' 'I Wanna Hold Your Hand'. It was in a real small town, I just happened to hear the song and it really struck a note. I found out they were going to be on TV, and was hooked ever since then. I was a victim of Beatlemania."
- WENDY RICE, WWCT: "The first album I ever bought was The Who live at Leeds, which, at the time, was pretty unusual for a 'girl', but I was heavily influenced by my older brothers who were <u>true</u> believers."
- MARK MILLER, WWCK: "My first real rock and roll experience was Bobby Boris Pickett doing 'The Monster Mash'. I spent days and days trying to walk like Frankenstein and learn the words to the song."
- JOSE DIAZ, WBLM: "It has to the the Beatles on Ed Sullivan. They definitely blew me away. I'll never forget how they flashed the individual names on the TV screen."
- <u>MICHAEL MCKAY, WWDC</u>: "'Sukiyaki' by Kyu Sakamota...Beatles first album...The Who in Denver, Co, 1970. They played the Mammoth Gardens which had a great logo--a gigantic elephant standing on the back of a hog in a policeman's uniform...My mother singing to an old Doris Day song 'Que Sera Sera' was my earliest musical experience. About the same time, I purchased the'Ballad Of Davey Crockett'. When I went out to buy the Beatles album, I picked up, by mistake, an album that looked almost identical. It was a group called the Beats. It was a sound alike album, all the same songs. That's when I realized it didn't sound right, so I guess that was my first album."(Later he admitted he bought 'Domenique' by the Singing Nun).
- SEAN SCOTT, WMAD: "'Get Back', Beatles...Quick Silver Messenger Service 'Shady Grove'...Any Rolling Stones concert in 1968, and a Guess Who concert in 1968...When I started playing harmonica around 1973, in college."
- <u>PEYTON MAYS, KZEL</u>: "First single was 'Summertime Blues' by the Blue Cheer. Probably that one. That's what made me buy it...Cream 'Disraeli Gears' was the first album I bought...Bruce Springsteen in 1975 is easily the most memorable...How about playing with my organ when I was 12?",
- <u>STEVE KELLER, WZZQ</u>: "It has to be Elvis doing 'Hounddog' because I can remember lying in my Grandmother's room with a fan on me down in Miami listening over and over and over again. In fact, she bought me no less tha 25 records...Either 'Jumping Jack Flash' or 'I Can See For Miles' was the first single and the first album I bought was Stones, cause I was not into the Beatles...Yea, I saw Springsteen in 1975 at the Coliseum that holds 20,000. I was one of 1900 there...We go back to Elvis doing 'Hounddog' for my musical experience. I was set early in life."
- JOHN LOGAN, KLBJ: "The first single that knocked me out was Presley's 'Hounddog' and I bought it... I don't know what my first album was. I think it was one called 'Blues, Rags And Hollers' by Spider John Koerner, David 'Snaker' Ray, and Tony 'Little Son' Glover...I'd have to say George Benson at the Keystone Corner in San Francisco about 1970...Musical experience? Listening to Martha Raye saying 'I don't need no richochet romance'."
- TIM BEDORE, KZAP: "The first 45 I bought was 'Ticket To Ride' and the first one that knocked me out was 'I Wanna Hold Your Hand'...Introducing the Beatles on DJ Records was my first album...There were two concerts: Springsteen this past tour, and Wings Over America in 1976...Yes, I remember. I think it was Perry Como 'Catch A Falling Star'---I was three at the time."
- MARC MILLER, WBCN: "First single would be 'I Wanna Hold Your Hand', and the first album would be the Four Season's singing 'Sherry'...'96 Tears' by Question Mark and the Mysterions was the first song to knock me out...I would have to say seeing the Beatles on Ed Sullivan was definitely a musical experience."
- JIM KINNEY, WTUE: "Oh God! Well, I would have trouble coming up with the first single, but I'll never forget the first album and that was Motown Hits', Volume 5...No doubt. Pink Floyd 'The Wall' 1980 was the most memorable concert ever, followed very closely by Pink Floyd, 'Kent State', 1973... Experience? Being sick home from school one day and listening to the radio all day. Being turned onto rock and roll when 'This Diamond Ring' was the song played most oftem that day."
- LISA RICHARDS, WYSP: "'Moving In Stereo' and 'All Mixed Up' from the Cars' first album...My first single 'Mony, Mony' by Tommy James & The Shondells... First album: Had to be the Stones 'Hot Rocks'...First concert: The Beach Boys...Most memorable: Stones at JFK, or maybe the Cars and Babys in Nashville."



- PAUL PAYTON, WCCC: "It's hard to pinpoint the exact first, but discovering rock and roll as it was in the mid 50's was the key moment. The thrill of untrained voices making edgy, exciting visceral harmonies, and the raw energy of rock-a-billy and bop all combined to set my classically oriented mind free and turn loose the monster that I have become. A debt of gratitude to Frankie Lymon, Arleen Smith of the Chantells, The Rivieras, Phil Spector, and The Teddybears, and all the pickup do-wap groups I've harmonized with in school and in railroad stations throughout NYC. (To get a taste of the excitement, watch the movie 'American Hot Wax' where Lorraine Newman is teaching the group 'Why Do Fools Fall In Love')...The excitement of it happening instantly is what it's all about and why I still love rock and roll."
- BOB WALTON, WQDR: "Part of my problem is that when I was young, most of you guys in radio were starting to get old, so a lot of the dates are mixed in my mind as to which happened first...Well, I remember 'Layla' and the last instrumental part having profound effects. I remember picking up an album at the Alabama State Fair that was on a local label that had a tune on it called 'Freebird' (I'll always kick myself for losing it)...There is one thing I really remember (and I don't remember the year) and it's a single that I'd give my left turntable to get a copy of. It's a band called Coven and a song called 'One Tin Soldier'. It always struck me."
- PHIL KIRZYC, WWWV: "I think I was 12 years old. I didn't even own a record player, but I went out and bought my first album which I thought was the greatest rock and roll around. It was 'More Of The Monkees'. It took me until 1968 to buy my first Beatles record. Within two years, I managed to own a complete Beatles library...My first 45 was 'Hanky Panky' by Tommy James & The Shondells."
- DAVE BENSON, WMET: "'Satisfaction' by the Stones. My parents gave me a little red portable transistor radio the week that tune hit the airwaves (WLS). The radio was under my pillow and in my pocket during church with the earphone on, and 'Satisfaction' was the song...First single, 'You Were On My Mind', the Wee Five--with the flip side 'Small World Isn't It' on A&M...First album: 'Best Of The Animals'...First concert: I stood outside a Paul Butterfield Blues Band concert on the university campus at Madison in the Bloomfield/Butterfield days. I remember being too young to get in... Most memorable: Impossible."
- MOBY, WQXM: "'Are You Experienced'. Before I ever got high I used to listen to that and freak out. First single bought: Something by the Beatles...First album: A Ray Charles album...First concert: Uriah Heep, Jim Croce and Poco...Most memorable: Volunteer Jam VI, when those members of Skynyrd first got together in public after the crash."
- LARRY GROVES, KROQ: "Rolling Stones' 'Last Time'...First single: Same...First album: The albums that had 'The Last Time'...First concert: Yardbirds 1966...Most memorable: Stones, Winterland 1972."
- DANA JANG, KOME: "For me it would probably be a Rick Nelson song, maybe something like 'Travellin' Man'... First album: Peter, Paul and Mary...First single: Probably a Philadelphia sound like the Dovells or something like that...First concert: Crosby, Stills and Nash at the Fillmore West. Lamb was on the same bill...Most memorable: When I was in college, the Jefferson Airplane came to the campus and Bill Graham was giving out apples at a Santa Clara university...Also, was totally impressed with the energy of the James Cotton Blues Band on stage, they played with It's A Beautiful Day circa 1968-69."

- <u>JIMMY MACK (617-536-7035)</u>: "Lest anyone misinterpret my departure from WBCN this week, I wish to extend all the gratitude and love I can muster for the support and growth afforded me at the station over the past four years. I leave with a sense of total completion knowing that my successor, <u>Marc Miller</u>, is the only person I can think of who can take the station to its next level. My own plans include a period of rest and recuperation (sickness sucks), followed by something better. Three minutes of fighting guitars should chase at least half the audience down the dial for keeps. I suggest you splice in the Phil Rizzutto from Meatloaf over the guitars, drop the Steinman record, and be done with it. I mean, sincerely, we're gonna play it, and I know it will be a huge radio track, but whatever happened to originality? At least, he put some wind effects at the front. That's a step in the right direction. Gee, Danny, did you make those wind noises yourself? Gosh, was it tough to mike?...At least Gary Wright isn't as bad and fruity as Gary Numan and the Tubesteak Army, but he's close. Love that vacant expression on the back cover. <u>Gary</u>, if you're so proud of your lobotomy at least put it on the R&R picture page, where it belongs. WMMS, CLEVELAND, OH M.D.-KID LEO: "The Kid finally succumbed to the 'Temptation'. Squeeze goes in. It' very non-typical for what the general idea of Squeeze is--a very good move from the band. I agree with the comments that it will work along the same lines as the Steve Winwood, which we all know is doing quite well for itself...The Wild Giraffes is the finest piece of product albumwise to come out of this city in quite some time. I recommend the A&R Departments of the various majors contact us and we'll give them an album...It seems to be shaping up as the fad of the year--rock and roll comebacks--Steve Winwood, Gary U.S. Bonds, Moody Blues, Elton John, Peter Frampton, and now Bachman-Turner Overdrive--or Union, as they're calling themselves nowadays. 'We Can Get Together'. <u>Michael</u> <u>Abramson, Mike Scheid</u>, and <u>Joe Brom</u> got me with the best promotion they could come up with--they played it for me. It barely beat out Blue Oyster Cult's 'Joan Crawford' for honors, mainly because as a new record it needs the DSA (Daniels Seal Of Approval)...Kim Carnes goes to <u>#1</u> in <u>retail</u> at 28 rock outlets. <u>We see new action on</u>: Tubes, Split Enz, and Jim Steinman...As you know by now, we have enlisted the services of <u>John Sebastian</u> as consultant. With the recent hiring of one of our competitor's main jocks (and the recent exodus of two of their others), we feel very confident of the Loop's future. Thus, those who had mistakenly navigated us into rough waters had better check their charts and man the life-boats...I must admit that Squeeze may have a hit in 'Tempted', but it is not Squeeze--it's a <u>Song</u>. This is a radical departure from the Squeeze of yore, and most New Wave fans don't even know it's them... The last two minutes of Danny Joe Brown are the key, considering his vocal prowess. Listeners who cume in think it's 'Freebird'...Tubes almost cracked the Top 20 in retail. Reportedly, the new show will be a full scale Tubes production, instead of the earlier reported slimmed down version...Yes, I hear Point Blank as an ARS-type hit. So <u>Bill Ham</u>--when's lunch?...Having problems with Silver Condor. Personally, I'd like to make a <u>note to Mike Flicker and CBS</u>: A roughed up remix with more balls-out guitar would help 'For The Sake Of Survival'...Moodies kicked in <u>Top 10</u>."

- WMET, CHICAGO, IL M.D.-DAVE BENSON: "No additions to the airwaves this week--lots of interesting songs, but no crucial records. The A's tune has an infectious groove...Blackfoot's latest is a good rocker... Split Enz has grown on me quite nicely, (the Hollies meets the 80's).....Icehouse deserves further investigation...<u>Sales story</u>: Ozzy Osbourne's 'Crazy Train' may be the hard rockin anthem for Summer '81. The Lp has made major sales gains again this week...Moodies looking very good, Santana and Joe Walsh had their first strong showings...Frampton slow out of the gate and Steinman seems stuck there...Last week's Content of musical powers are Santana show was a double pleasure--a beautiful evening of music by a band whose musical powers are unlimited. The show's entire presentation showed taste and style probably because it was handled by Mr. Bill Graham. Our thanks to him for spending time in our remote broadcast facility. For trivia buffs, the Heavy Hitters have been revived, last playing in 1970 when they were managed by <u>Billy Martin</u> who also did our AM morning sports on KDWB."

MKQQ, Lexington, KY ASST. P.D.-DAVE KRUSENKALUS: "Have you heard that hot rendition of "Mississipp! Queen' from Volunteer Jam VII I'll give this thing 7days to become the top request item. Even the sales manager here is raving. It's a valuable tool for all album rock demos, and it's refreshing not to hear Ted sing. This is a cut I'd sure as hell call a radio station about...Danny Joe Brown will ring phones as well and garner interest, but maybe it's just the formula that's boring me. 'Edge Of Sundown' is reminiscent of classics like 'Freebird', 'Green Grass', 'Ghost Riders' - songs in that vein with real soft beginnings. Maybe a keyboard thrown in and then dueling fenders by the time that the song ends...Beginning to get request activity on Split Enz. I think 'History' should have been the single; also, 'Secret Policeman's Ball' seems to be doing well, the the Tubes record won't be denied...Moody Blues is real strong although I'm getting a few.negatives on the single...Judas Priest is still a hot phone item...Finally looks as if Billy Squier's stroke will come home Top 40... I'm having trouble getting response on Marshall Tucker...Surprisingly, Johnny Van Zant is slow. Speaking of Van Zant, I personally feel the single is weak. I'think this album's worth is in the track 'Shot Down'...Also action is a little slow on the Frampton. Looks like this could be an uphill fight...Got the Icehouse album in today. Upon one listen to the cassette, I see no problem with this. Love the title piece, and I think 'Sister' is reminiscent of Early Beatles. Nice record, esp. side 1...Also check out the Blue Oyster Cult 12" - it's very good. The last two records just lost me. The two songs from the new record are shorter, tighter and more straight ahead....It's Hee Haw week on double Q with <u>our adds being</u> Nugent, Molly Hatchet, Blackfoot, and Danny Joe Brown '...Considering: Barbara Mandrell and the Mandrell Sisters. Also selling well right away - Top 18 sales...Gary Wright at Top 30 sales...I think the BOC is extremely strong. I've been hypnotized by the Ep...Frampton #14 sales this week, but calls are light...Steinman #16 sales, mostly a draw with females at this point...Moodies #3 sales... We also added another track to Ozzy Osbourne this week now using 'Mr. Crowley' in addition to 'Crazy Train' and 'I Don't Know'...Considering: Union 'Mainstreet'; Silver Condor, Icehouse (Let me commend <u>Bill</u> on that pick. The Australians are starting to fill a hole in the American void - I foresee a return to this style of rock.)."

KYYS, KANSAS CITY, MO M.D.-JOE McCABE: "I, like many, missed it on the Squeeze the first time around. 'Tempted' is such an infectious cut; it's easy to understand the consistent movement I'm seeing in the Sheet. Should be with us for quite a while..Also added the Blackfoot 12"-despite the fact there was no snakehead accompanying it. It's a nice ballad, let's see how it develops Top 40 (get a real job SeanII)...Danny Joe Brown seems to be selling as well as the last one. The calls are honestly rather light..Let's get him back in the Duck suit, get rolling, get hot again Elton. What you need is a whole new line of Elton designer cigarette holders...Steinman not working yet...Tubes getting light calls, extremly light sales, yet we're moving it up in rotation. Sounds good on the air...Van Zant is coming on well. Pretty good sales; calls are solid...Frampton is stable...Moody Blues now in maximum rotation. Good reaction all the way around phones and sales...Strongly considering:the Gary Wright single; and 'Dogtown' from Yoko (just kidding); Blue Oyster Cult 12"."

KLBJ, AUSTIN, TX M.D.-JOHN LOGAN: "The stunner-of-the-week is, of course, Danny Joe's Southern-fried swamp music fiesta. There's a lot more here than the classic 'Edge Of Sundown', but we'll start there. Skynyrd, Hatchet, Outlaws and some good songwriting touch of blues, and Danny Joe takes the Hatchet to the Outlaws. Your move, guys...We certainly seem to be in a period of change for lots of artists. Elton John, Moody Blues, George Harrison, Gary Wright, and now Kim Simmons comes out with a great track aimed at more than blues fans. 'Lay Back In The Arms Of Someone' is right in the comfort zone... Blackfoot's 'Fly Away' leaves the days of 'Train, Train' behind. A band has to develop and expand to survive, and this Blackfoot record shows development, expansion, and guts...Most positive response this week has to be Gary Wright's 'Really Wanna Know You'. All the jocks here think it's stamped 'hit'... Arlo Guthrie's album is a very pleasant surprise. A great deal stronger than anything of his in recent memory. How he and Rickie Lee managed such a striking duet on so-tired a song as 'Jamaica Farewell' is the question-of-the-week. Unlikely pair, unlikely tune, and a likely likeable sound."

I firmly believe this is hit material and album radio should stick with it. A lot of times, people don't go crazy buying records when they're hearing the artist for the first time. But I think if we give it more of a chance, tremendous <u>sales</u> will follow...The Blackfoot is certainly as <u>accessible</u> as I was told it would be. I don't think we can miss with it. Besides, it sounds pretty good...Danny Joe Brown doesn't thrill me to the bone, but I'm sure it's going to work extremely well...<u>Sales</u> are getting more and more <u>consistent</u> on Jim Steinman. Looks really solid...<u>Considering For Next Week</u>: Gary Wright, who sounds real good and back on track in more of a rock and roll record. The writing is real solid."
- KGB-FM, SAN DIEGO, CA M.D.-JUDY MCNUTT: "I love the Squeeze record. 'Tempted' is what we're going to go with, but I also think 'Messed Around' is strong. It's so much fun, and it's so camp. If I were doing video, I would do one to that song...'The Edge Of Sundown' track from Danny Joe Brown could be a Western/Southern soap opera. I love it, though. To the people who are worried about playing it, I say listen to the last half of the song first, and the first half will seem more uptempo--that works. If you're worried about the piano intro--skip it. I know that's kind of sacreligious, but whatever works... Silver Condor sounds good on the radio...Frampton is not getting much response yet...At first I thought I should avoid a discussion of Yoko's latest work. I had already made that decision concerning the person who murdered John Lennon. Why give such a horrible person press coverage and sensationalism-what he wants? So, now I'm faced with another ugly situation. Yoko Ono's new album. Yoko's therapy. When does my therapy come? I'm cold, my spirit hurts and I resent being dragged back into the whole thing. I suppose this is another case of 'I don't understand, therefore I reject'. I feel I have been subjected to shock tactics. I'm sad. Yoko has made a very cold statement."

Greg Kihn is still building with very strong response to the 'Breakup Song'...Billy Squier is picking up slowly but surely Split Enz is probably the biggest success story in San Diego this week. Up to #4 retail with very favorable phones...We continue to experience phenomenal reaction to 'In The Air' by Phil Collins, and Mr. Dove himself broke into the Top 10 this week and picked up an airplay increase. What a crazy train!! I saw Rush perform at the Sports Arena last night. Although I may not be personally involved in the music, they did put on a very tight and professional show. The visuals added a lot to the show. Technically the music was very strong. Good thing that my sonic plugs blended in so well with my ears."
- WDVE, PITTSBURGH, PA P.D.-DAVE LANGE: "This week's music: Out of all the adds this week, the following things I'm really into: The Silver Condor, The A's and The Blackfoot. All three albums should do fairly well with most of the A's success coming from that single. I don't hear anything else on the album...The Danny Joe Brown will probably do very very well, esp. 'Edge Of Sundown', but maybe I've heard it before... Gary Wright is jumping on the bandwaqon of retread rock and rollers, although there is some very playable stuff on it......Considering:Ice House (there seems to be a lot of cuts, and I think in the next week I have to narrow it down. It can originate and spread from almost anywhere in the Western world. It is now fully infiltrating the 'Communist' world and through the efforts of Bob Marley and many others, it is now part of the Third World, too. The Third World awareness of rock and pop is growing at an amazing rate and the major 'Western' stars are turning more and more to the basic Third World rhythms. The most obvious influence is the reggae sound pervading everywhere now and especially popularized by the Police. But it gets much more basic than that! In the solo works of Peter Gabriel and Phil Collins, we see a new trend toward basic, primitive, tribal sounds on the drum. We feel that it is highly relevant to include the number of weeks a station has been on a given album--so we're listing that information in a third column at the far left...We list debuts with a small "d". That indicates that the Lp is in the second week of play. So--this week, we took last week's debuts, and gave them a <u>3</u> in the "weeks on" column. Next week those 3's will change to 4's--and so on. It's pretty simple.

FOR YOUR INFORMATION:

When reading the individual station report, please remember that there are three ways in which album rotations are tracked.

1. PLAYS PER DAY - This refers to the actual number of exposures an album gets between 6 AM

- and Midnight on an average day of the reporting week.
- 2. PLAYS PER WEEK Most of our weekly play reporters go back over their music logs for the previous week, and those totals are relayed to us and printed up.
- 3. <u>AIRPLAY EMPHASIS</u> Be careful not to confuse this with PLAYS PER DAY/WEEK. EMPHASIS is a system
- of relative scaling, based on 10. If the highest rotation album gets 8 spins per day, it receives 10 points. If another album gets 4 spins, it merits 5 points, etc. This allows a much more detailed rundown than the conventional light/medium/heavy system.
