Hard Choice

ASIA, REEFEN

When you get down to it, you can count the real classics on two hands, "Dark Side", "Zeppelin IV", "White Album", "Skynyrd's First"--and you know the rest. Frankly, we can't say if Asia is destined for that level of acclaim, but the set-up at retail is so thorough, the response from radio so ecstatic, the label's confidence and commitment so deep, and the songs so riveting, we give Asia our early ballot for new group, and most probably album of the year. "Solo Survivor", "Heat Of The Moment", and "Only Time Will Tell" make Asia major.

Chain Reaction

RICK SPRINGFIELD, "SUCCESS HASN'T SPOILED ME YET", RCA

As indicated by the on-cue conversion of 98 stations from single to Lp play, Rick's slot in the "heavy/current" file is solidified. The record is obviously an automatic, and radio is relieved that this "must play" item lives up to expectations...Bob Pittens, WHCN, "I'll probably get hate mail from the rock elitists for this, but I think the guy is a damned good pop song-writer. Now, if he can just keep his image from slipping too far into cutesy-piedom, he'll be just fine"...Janel Dolan, KTEW, "His second offering is a complete success. I already hear more than one hit single, and the Lp is already into top 20 sales"...Joe Bonadonna, WMMR, "Springfield is excellent. 'Don't Talk To Strangers' is a smash hit, but I also like most of the other songs on the album"...Dave Krusenklous, WKQQ, "The album is a wall to wall smash. I have to believe that sales for this album will be even stronger than for the first"...Tom Mast, WSYR, "A great follow-up. He is, in my opinion, the most versatile rock and roller in the business today"..."Calling" #5, and "Don't Talk" #41 are still comfortably out front, with "Excited" and "Christina" next in line.

SCORPIONS, "BLACKOUT", POLYGRAM

#2 Most Added with 55, and Radio Action backs the Choice last week--"No One Like You" is their mass appeal career-maker. Duke Meyer, WQMP, "Hate to be a 'me too', but 'No One Like You' is incredible--a cruncher with substance"...Mike Wolf, WDFM, "It's undoubtedly their best album to date and 'No One' is THE track that will take the Scorpions music beyond their metal maniacs to a whole new audience"...Steve Feinstein, WYSP, "I'm totally floored by 'No One'. I'll go Bill one better and say it's not only one of the best metal tracks of the year, but one of the most outstanding tracks, period"...Mary Pillingner, WYMY, "'No One' really caught me by surprise. The breaks from scorching guitar to heart rending vocals will have the hard core rockers steaming"...Roberta Haber, WMJQ, "'No One' is atypical for the Scorpions, which could be why I like it. Already getting phone response after just a couple of days"...From Bobbin Beam, WLPX, "They've tightened up the songs without selling out to mundane formula, and the album is commercially viable. Very 80's hard rock with some soft edges for balance and typical Scorpions signature licks"...And from Jon Russell, KRQR, "'No One' is the synthesis of their previous efforts--very well done"... Other first week raves include Bob Majersky, Joe MacCabe, Craig Martin, Dale Wolter, Ron Nenni, Skyboy, Alan Sneed, Terry Meiners, Bruce Bond and Jim Kinney.

DREGS, "INDUSTRY STANDARD", ARISTA

Take an already respectable sales trend, factor in a great vocalist, an almost anthemic title, and bingo, more stations in one week than any previous Dregs Lp had locked up at its peak. #3 Most Added with 54 reports (to go with 36 mentions on the #2 last week)...Reaction: Dave Lange, WOVE, "'Crank It Up' is totally irresistible"...Doug Podell, WOPB, "Really like the Dregs. They've come up with some serious rock and roll more for the sophisticated radio listeners. 'Crank It Up' is a hit on every level"...Alan Speed, KSRR, "We're one of those stations that uses 'Crank It Up' on the air, so the Dregs is a natural for us"...Ilyse Gottlieb, WRXL, "Not only is the new album a masterpiece, they've confirmed without compromising perfection. What more could one ask for?"...Dana Jang, KOMA, "They already have a strong core in the area with packed halls in the area and strong sales. With the addition of Alex Ligertwood from Santana and Pat Simmons from the Doobies, it will even further their local appeal"..."Crank It Up" hits the Top 100 at #88.

"SECRET POLICEMAN'S OTHER BALL", WARNER BROTHERS

With Sting and Phil Collins taking the lead, "SPOB" is shaping up as a killer live option (em and a relief record of supreme)...#5 Most Added with 37 for 86 in the past two weeks...The week's highest debut on both charts, #38 Index, #40 Memo... On the Top 100, Roxanne debuts at #88... Radio Action: The Doctor, WYFL, "Good phone reaction for Sting, Phil Collins, Clapton and Beck--all in all it's a killer"... Art Phillips, WJLO, "Phenomenal response. These alternate versions provide instant on-air stimulation"... Dave Benson, WMET, "An impeccable production piece. I really think the charitable and well-intentioned concept for the concerts comes across. The album has a great vibe"...Bobbin Beam, WLPX, "Nothing but raves from the audience. Debut #7 sales"... Ed Levine, WAOX, "It's our hottest new album. This record has already surpassed the response generated by the first volume, and 'In The Air Tonight' came in as our third requested piece of music this past week. 'Roxanne' is also drawing top 10 request mentions"... Ann from Susan Christol, WYD, "You know music is top quality when it can stand alone, as in the case in Sting's acoustic renditions. Phones preceded the add on this one."

DEATH WISH II SOUNDTRACK, SWANSON/ATLANTIC

It's obviously not you know who, but billboarding Page's involvement makes for smart short term programming...#4 Most Added with 44, including 19 Level I stations...Cuts: "City Sirens", "Jam Sandwich", and "Hypnotizing Ways"...Comments: Kid Leo, WMMS, "The interesting thing about the soundtrack will be to test the theory that people no longer support groups, but rather songs. My feeling is that we will see sales activity due to the Zep connection. Already we have heavy request activity"...Dick Bascom, WQXM, "The next best thing to Zeppelin. This album is destined to at least partially fill the void"...Ron Nenni, WPYX, "It's not great material, but the listeners are hungry for anything that resembles Led Zeppelin"...Joe MacCabe, KYYS, "We're plugging Jimmy Page, and the phones have been strong. Our problem has been not to mislead the audience into thinking it's a solo album rather than a soundtrack. Actually, they probably don't care--they just want to hear Page"...And from Mike Lyons, WDIZ, "The movie just opened here and curiosity demands some exposure on it".

GAMMA, ELEKTRA

Last week's highest debut comes back with another excellent week. Prime move 23-18 Index, up 24-21 Metro...Also mauling on the Checklist: 47 building, 23 maintaining, 2 dropping, 16 not playing, and 8 considering...Request activity reported at WLUP, KYYS, WLRS, KGB-FM, WOUR, WEBN, WDIZ, KRQR, WPYX, WLAV-FM, KDWB, WPDH, WRAS, and WWCK...Sales and phones from WIMZ, WMJQ, KWXL, WZZO, WFYV, WILS-FM, KQRS, KSHE, WDHA, WRNO, WQVE, KISS, and WMAD...Airplay, 31 same, 2 down, and 13 up, including KMET, KBPI, WMMS, WDIZ, WILS-FM, WRNO, and WXRT...New on WLUP, WKLS, WWCK, WPLJ, WQFM, WRKK, and WTLR--for 91 total reporters in 3 weeks...On the Top 100: "Right The First Time" 21-16 and "What's Gone Is Gone" 95-91.

JAY FERRISON, CAPITOL

A double underline week for Jay, 32-22 Index, and 30-22 Metro...New on WLUP, WKLS, KMET, KOME, WCOZ, WBCN, and 6 more for #8 Most Added and a total of 98 FMQB stations...Overall moves: 23 steady, 1 down, and 7 increases: WMMS, WILS-FM, KRQR, KWFM, KILQ, KEZY, and WYFE...Checklist: 24 not on, 14 considering, 3 dropping, 28 maintaining, and a whopping 33 building: KMET, KSRR, KTXQ, WCOZ, KDWB, WQXM, KISS, WBCN, KYYS, WLUP, KDKB, WMMS, KBPI, and more...Trax: "White Noise" moves 40-37, while "Tonight" debuts at #99.

DWIGHT TWILLEY, EMI

A very strong three-week Index trend for Dwight, 47-33-26...Also a Metro prime mover, 36-29...New on WFBQ, KBPI, DC101, and WGRQ--for a total of 96 reports in four weeks..."Somebody To Love" is up 42-28 with "I'm Back Again" debuting at #58...It's like pulling teeth to elicit comments on the Twilley, but I'm very encouraged by the Checklist--17 not playing, 13 considering, none report dropping, 39 maintaining, and 32 building including KBPI, WMMS, KDKB, KYYS, KLOL, WHJY, KRQR, WMMR, KOME, KZEN, and KMET.

DUKE JUPITER, COAST TO COAST/EPIC

We raved about "I'll Drink To You" in the Pinch Hit on February 12th, and as indicated by the week's strongest Index jump, 49-37, that track has the moxie it takes. Also building Metro, 49-35. New on KMET, WYSP, KLOS, WPLJ, WHJY, WEBN, WSHE, and 7 more for #7 Most Added...WMMS, KDKB, and KSMB and KILQ have increased play. 17 more held steady...Comments: Rob Lipshutz, WHJY, "I have to credit Bill with making people aware of 'I'll Drink To You' from a band I would have otherwise overlooked. What an instantly likeable track this is"...Dave Kane, WCMF, "It's selling very well and the phones are ringin'"...Ron Nenni, WPYX, "Sounds terrific on the radio. We're expecting huge phones and retail, and a drinking problem in the Capitol"...Checklist: 49 not playing, 25 considering, none dropping, 18 maintaining, and 20 building (WAQX, WMMS, KDKB, WGRQ, KISS, KDWB, WYSP, KSRR, and KMET)...On the Song Index "I'll Drink To You" moves 68-32.

CHUBBY CHECKER, MCA

What image problem??? A #48 debut last week, up to 40 Metro (46-41 Index)...Still more quality calls: KOME, WCMF, WHJY, WLIR, WDHA, and WRAS...Steady on 16, up on 6: KTIM, KILQ, KSJO, WBCN, WNEW-FM, and WPYX...On the Top 100 "Harder Than Diamond" moves 92-77...Checklist: 43 not playing, 14 considering, 2 dropping, 26 maintaining, and 16 building: WIMZ, WMJQ, KLAQ, KWXL, WMMS, WLIR, WLVQ, KTIM, WOUR, WHJY, KSMB, WQDR, WDHA, WYFE, KILQ, and WMAD.

BRYAN ADAMS, A&M

Bryan inched up the Index 11-9, but came in with a Metro underline, 13-8. We're still having a tough time coming up with a blowout sales/request story, but understand the record is testing very well. In addition to "Lonely Nights", it's time to consider "Fits Ya Good" (100-57!), and "Don't Look Now".

TOMMY TUTONE, COLUMBIA

Up 17-16 Index, but one point shy of a prime move in the Top 30 markets, 19-15. A very solid 8 station add week, including KZOK, WKQQ, WSHE, and WCCC...Airplay: 19 steady, 4 down, and 10 building: KDKB, WWCK, WMET, WNEW-FM, WAPI, WDIZ, WHCN, WRNO, and WXRT..."Jenny" steady at #9...Comments: Buck McWilliams, WIOT, "Upward retail surprise goes to Tommy Tutone with good phones, too"...Joe MacCabe, KYYS, "Tutone really coming on strong"...Tom Starr, WOUR, "'Jenny' is certainly turning into 'Jessie's Girl' of '82"...Tom Nast, WSYR, "'Jenny' could be album radio's top song of the year. Phones are exploding." As Kal says, "Determination Record of the Year".

JOHNNY AND THE DISTRACTIONS, A&M

We're not hearing that many retail and request raves, but you sure can't argue with the Index success, especially considering the Lp has been charted for 7 weeks now...Up 20-19 Index, with major gains in the Metro chart, 20-15...Overall airplay: 2 down, 44 same, and 8 up: KLOL, KZOK, WIOT, WMJQ, WBLM, WRAS, and KILQ...On the Song Index "My Desire" debuts at #80...We'll take a closer look at active audience response on the Checklist next week.

UFO, CHRYSALIS

Frankly, I wasn't feeling a ton of action on the UFO, but the past two weeks' stats are quite healthy. We calculated 19 building, and 27 maintaining on the Checklist last week, and came up with a 28-24 Metro gain this week...KMET and KISS increased play, 43 reported no change in rotation, and we had 3 dips in play...Top song: "The Writer" moves 29-24 on the Song Index.

BONNIE RAITT, WARNER BROTHERS

Up a tidge on both charts, 34-32 Index and 35-33 Metro, but really cleaning up on the Checklist: none dropping, 20 maintaining, and a very hot 33 building, including KBPI, KDKB, WLRS, WNEW-FM, WOUR, WHJY, WKQQ, WRNO, WHCN, KISS, WMMR, WKZL, WPLR, KOME, KZEW, and KMET...New play on WMYK, WGIR-FM, WIOT, WCMF, WRAS, WWCK, and KMET takes us to 74 adds to date...Airplay: 1 down, 21 the same, and 11 up: KDKB, KOME, WMET, WMMR, WPYX, KBPI, KWFM, WQDR, KILQ, and WBRU...Comments: Chuck Holloway, WKZL, "Bonnie is showing good early phones and retail"...Dave Kane, WCMF, "Finally found room for Bonnie. Immediate phones and debut #13 sales"...Bill Simmons, WMYK, "Amazed at the response to Bonnie after only two days. Just goes to show you can't hear 'em all on first listen"...Dana Jang, KOME, "Continuing to show a strong sale pattern and calls are starting"...Lin Brehner, WDK, "Seems to be among the new Lps flying out the door"...On the Song Index: "Keep This Heart" does 62-42, "Me And The Boys" 91-70.

CHAIN REACTION CONTINUED

SIGNIFICANT SONGS:

"LONG STICK GOES BOOM", KROKUS, ARISTA

KQRS' Doug Podell sums up the Radio reaction, "As a disc jockey, I can't wait to get on the air and spin 'Long Stick Goes Boom'. The reaction should be wild. Most likely they'll all want to know what AC/DC Lp it's from. Krokus has put out some good hard rock that goes boom"...We log in 15 12" adds, and look for serious tonnage when the Lp releases next week...Here's more: Curt Gary, WEBN, "After hearing 'One Vice At A Time', I'm sure Brian Johnson of AC/DC wishes he had another job. 'Long Stick Goes Boom' is a monster. Do not listen while driving above 55"... And from Joe MacCabe, KYYS, "I see 'Long Stick' as one of the major phone items for the entire week."

"MARTYRS AND MADMEN", ROGER DALTRY, MCA

In the absence of back to back superstar releases, it makes sense to consider the unreleased Daltrey stuff, particularly "Martyrs And Madmen". #6 Most Added with 18 reports--#7 for the past two weeks with 38, and new at #50 on the Metro Chart, due for an Index showing next week.

"ONE WORLD", UTOPIA, BEARVILLE/WARNER BROTHERS

31 quick adds in two weeks, including WMMS, WMMR, WLAV-FM, WNEW-FM, KRSS, and KRQR. "One World" may be buried on side 2, but with call letters like this, it's well worth digging for... Jon Russell, KQRS sez it all, "'One World' is no runt of a tune for rock radio. I predict singing in the hallways and writhing on the floors."

"READY OR NOT", RIGGS, WARNER BROTHERS

KTYD, WQMF, and WKZL report now play, and last week's big guns included KMET, WMMR, KLBS, WKLS, and WFYV...Comments: Ralph Tortora, WBAB, "Move over Van Halen, this Lp is a mother. Especially 'Ready Or Not'. We put it into heavy rotation for the weekend to create some interest, and they went for it. Debut #32 on our sales chart"...Susan Christol, KTYD, "Once I got the courage to take the Riggs Lp out of the jacket, I was pleasantly surprised to find a mixture of textures and acoustic ballads a la Led Zepplin to hard driving heavy metal. But who thinks up these covers, anyway?"

"TAINTED LOVE", SOFT CELL, SIRE/WARNER BROTHERS

The "SPOB" debut and Chubby Checker move held Soft Cell at #39 on the Index, but if you're on the edge, let the Checklist convince you: 13 maintaining, 3 dropping, and 30 building including WMLJ, WQFM, WMMS, KZOK, WLUP, KYYS, KLGL, WHJY, KSHE, KROQ, WCMF, WHCN, WMMR, WPLR, KOME, WGBZ, and WPYX. We show 43 not playing and 12 considering....WMMR's Joe Bonadonna reports #4 sales... WQFM's Mike Wolf says, "After only 3 or 4 days huge phone response and not one single negative"... Bill Stambaugh, KMXL, "One of the best gainers in sales this week"...Combine the strong Checklist showing, the intense Sebastian add action this week (WLUP, KSJO, KZOK, KLGL, WMLJ, and WQFM), and the KSHE add and join the party with confidence.

"DON'T YOU WANT ME", HUMAN LEAGUE, A&M

What the label really needs to ignite this record is a credible station/market to come through with some high profile audience reaction, and this week WMMR's Joe Bonadonna comes to deliver the word, "Maximum telephone reaction to the Human League. Song of the month. One of the only new songs that is pulling that kind of major reaction, and the album has debuted top 25 in Philadelphia"...Here's more: Lin Brehmer, WQBK, "'Don't You Want Me' is probably the most requested song on the air right now"...Dave Kane, WCMF, "My favorite is the Human League. It makes it to the #10 retail spot, moving over 100 pieces this week"...And from Ted Burton Jacobsen, KRQR, "Computer rock takes control. Open the data files!! Early response already on 'Don't You Want Me'."

You'll recall "Wrathchild" from their last one was a major airplay item, and the improved production and new vocalist give the new album even more punch. So pay attention, class!!! We especially like "Run To The Hills" and "Number Of The Beast".

Bob Bittens, WHCN: “After a solid two weeks of airplay, the XTC seems to be doing just fine. We’ve gotten no negatives, and a good number of positives on ‘Senses Working Overtime’. Those of you worrying about the weird intro should try and change your frame of reference. Don’t think of it as a tuneout, think of it as the attention grabber. By the time the average earthdog gets a chance to say ‘what the hell is that?’, he or she will be hooked by what is essentially a great pop song. And the more sophisticated listeners will thank you for rescuing them from the boredom of homogenized radio. I firmly believe that there’s a growing number of people who are hungry for something that sounds different. These people are not necessarily the trendies on the fringe of the album rock audience. Radio Action

WQFM, MILWAUKEE, WI M.D.-MIKE WOLF: "First of all, I want to say that I agree with BH on the Scorpions album. It's undoubtedly their best album to date. The song 'No One Like You' is THE track that will take the Scorpions music beyond the metal maniacs to a whole new audience...Milwaukee has always been a special market for the Dregs. Their past albums have been played here on WQFM and, in fact, have sold enough to place Top 5 in our retail reports. There is no doubt about the fact that instrumentally the Dregs have been one of the more innovative groups of the last few years, but adding a vocalist is a great idea, and 'Crank It Up' should send this album into the Top 10...Artie: Sorry to hear of your unfortunate accident. I understand your jaws are wired. I'll miss taking your pizza orders at 3AM. Seriously, I have faith that you will survive. Lee and I hope you get well soon...Soft Cell is very similar to the Go Go's when that first came out. We felt it was a left fielder with the potential to be a negative to the hardcore rockers that comprise most of our listening audience. It's obvious there is a lot of upper demo appeal to the song. After only three or four days, the song has garnered huge phone response--and not one single negative...Huey Lewis up to heavy. Power pop without the obnoxious guitar riffs...Aldo Nova phones are finally starting to taper off, but up until last week, lots of curiosity calls."

WMMS, CLEVELAND, OH M.D.-KID LEO: "The interesting thing about 'Death Wish II' will be to test the theory that people no longer support groups, but rather songs. My feeling is that we'll see sales activity due to the Zeppelin connection. Already, we have heavy request activity. It is by no means a Led Zeppelin album, but a soundtrack that has to work in the context of visuals...Once again, I find myself in agreement with our editor, in that this Scorpions Lp is their best album to date. Before, you always had to work to find one track to please their ever-present vocal cult. 'No One Like You' has quality as formula rock. They've learned their lessons well...We went through the same thing that I guess a lot of cities did with the Tutone. After about two or three days of play, a woman who had that phone number called very, very PO'd. We explained to her that there wasn't much we could do about the problem, but we did manage to get her front page coverage in our local paper, and also got her number changed...Utopia's 'One World' definitely seems to be their final swing, as rumors abound that Todd will be dropped from Bearsville and/or Utopia. Also, if anyone has any confirmation on those rumors, please give us a ring...I feel sorry for Bonnie Raitt. Her last album came out with a cover of 'I Thank You', which was immediately followed by ZZ Top's cover of the same song--and ZZ's version became the airplay favorite. Now Bonnie covers 'Baby Come Back', which is on Jay Ferguson's latest. And Bonnie also does 'Me And The Boys', which Dave Edmunds does on his new album (and does a really bang-up job on it). Bonnie, sometime, somewhere, you're going to get things right."

KDKB, PHOENIX, AZ M.D.-J. DAVID HOLMES: "Adds: Graham Parker's bittersweet killer, 'Temporary Beauty'; also, Paul Collins' Beat; Bryan Adams, at last; a re-add on Novo Combo; and, the new Elton John 12"... Regarding Elton John. It's too bad his finest work in years had to be inspired by the John Lennon tragedy. Nevertheless, it's beautiful, and our listeners are wanting to hear it already...Congrats to the hard-working, committed folks at Polydor for sticking with the Novo Combo. We played the record out-of-the-box on release, but it seemed to stall for a while. It's coming back strong with the airplay of the track 'Tattoo'...Duke Jupiter is exploding on KDKB. Some people think it's a new Seger tune. In any case, the phone response is incredible...Prepare yourself for the tracks 'Happy Man' and 'Testify' on the new Greg Kinn. It's music so fun, it makes you want to dance...Adios for now."

WMMR, PHILADELPHIA, PA M.D.-JOE BONADONNA: "Rick Springfield's album is excellent. 'Don't Talk To Strangers' is a smash hit, but I also like most of the songs on the album, especially: 'Calling All Girls', 'Christina', and 'Tonight'...The Scorpions have an excellent heavy metal track with 'No One Like You'. We've put the album in the studio with a white cover. The original cover is enough to scare air-play away anywhere...Maximum telephone reaction to: The Human League. Song of the month. One of the only new songs that's pulling that kind of major reaction now. The LP debuted in Philly Top 25 sales... 'For The Love Of Money' is a great song from Utopia, also 'One World'. An album that's just beginning to take off here...Like the Dwight Twilley. Now we're down to playing only 'Somebody To Love'...Mixed phones on the Huey Lewis, but I think it sounds great on the air...Top 20 retail for the Waitresses... After 8 weeks, Joan Jett is still #1 in Philadelphia retail...The Go Go's have bounced up to #2 and are holding Top 10 for months...Soft Cell is #4 in sales. Major activity there...Rick Springfield's single debuts Top 10...Nick Lowe is sounding great with Top 25 retail."

KYYS (KY102), KANSAS CITY, MO ASST. P.D.-JOE MACCABE: "Thank you very much for the early Spring heavy metal present. Scorpions and Krokus are melting the Winter icicles off our playlist. The Scorpions rate a notch above all current heavy metal, but let's not write off Krokus (AC/DC, Junior). I see 'Long Stick' as one of the major phone items for the Spring. Playing this record is like having George Brett bat third...Last week we aired both the Elton single and the 'Death Wish II' Soundtrack-- of course, plugging Jimmy Page. The phone response was genuinely incredible, particularly on the Page. My problem is not misleading the audience into thinking it's a solo album, rather letting them know, indeed, it is a soundtrack. Actually, they probably don't care. They just want to hear Page...Rick who? Say, aren't those under-aged poodles on the cover?...Getting calls for: Jay Ferguson's 'Tonight'. I think that's the cut...We get both requests and negs on Soft Cell, so we increased play. That's the way the game works, isn't it?...Still getting calls for: Aldo Nova, 'Fantasy'...Tommy Tutone really is coming on strong...Huey Lewis: picking up good calls...Still behind the Novo Combo. Even though response is light nationally, it's doing well locally."

KLOL, HOUSTON, TX ASST. P.D.-MICHELE ROBINSON SAYRE: "An interesting phenomenon is occurring here in Houston. In the last several months, we've lost three local promotion people. Their respective companies are all thinking about not replacing them. That leads me to the conclusion that record companies are having some second thoughts about the usefulness of their local promotion staff. I certainly speak to many more independents today than I once did. Their strength must have some bearing on the local staff's power and ability. I don't know if this is only happening in Houston. If it is, the attitude of record companies toward a Top 10 market is appalling. If we are not alone, it looks like changes are due on the horizon. Something to watch for...Personal to Steve Huntington: I envy you. Have some stone crabs for me, and please say hello to Jeff Fisher...Mike Bone: Thanks for the mention. Love your comments, too...Drew Murray: I miss you. I'll send you some Music Scenes for next weekend, okay?...Hot old and new music: Dregs; Greg Kihn; Bonnie Raitt; Duke Jupiter; Riggs; Scorpions; Soft Cell; 'Secret Policeman's Other Ball'; and, Human League...Can't wait to hear Asia. I sure am hearing wonderful things about them."

WLPX, MILWAUKEE, WI M.D.-BOBBIN BEAM: "The Franke And The Knockouts advance cassette sounds alright! I like: 'You Never Had It Better' and 'You're Just What I Want'...Man, the Scorpions have polished their recording technique. They've tightened up the songs without selling out to mundane formulas, and the album is commercially viable. Very 80's hard rock with some soft edges for balance and typical Scorpions' signature licks...Nothing but raves from the audience from 'Secret Policeman's Other Ball'...Regarding 'Death Wish II'. Lots of phones. Best vocals on: 'City Sirens' and 'Hypnotizing Ways'...Sales Highlights: 'Secret Policeman's Ball' debuts at #7; Aldo Nova #10 and growing; Shooting Star #12; Prism #14; UFO #15; Nick Lowe #16; and, Rick Springfield debuts at #20...Lots of calls on: Tommy Tutone...Also, I want to mention that we have Craig Kilpatrick from Lafayette, Indiana, joining us for the 9PM-1AM shift...Also, I have a new shift time, 9AM-1PM. I'm available 1-4PM for record calls Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday...And dedicated to Mr. Belushi: I saw they buried you yesterday, tears in the cool New England gray. Now just part of memory's soul, never got a chance to even grow old. A brilliant star who went too far, just flamed out, flamed out, flamed out. Burning so bright, but flamed right out. All we have left besides memories, celluloid and big screen TV's, a lesson learned. Treat yourself right. Don't flame out as you fly toward the light."

KOME, SAN JOSE, CA M.D.-DANA JANG: "Thanks to Steve Feinstein for the wonderful words...Jocks are definitely into the Chubby Checker album, especially 'Harder Than Diamond'. 'Burn Up The Night' also sounds good on the radio...Pretty good improvement over the last album from Jay Ferguson. More consistent in the writing area...Dregs 'Crank It Up' should definitely broaden their appeal. They already have a strong cult in the area with packed halls wherever they appear and strong sales. The addition of Alex Ligertwood of Santana and Pat Simmons of the Doobies will even further their local appeal... Good Top 40 action on the Duke Jupiter 45 at KFRC...Getting spotty Angel City sales at rock accounts... Starting to see some light sales and a small amount of phones on: Johnny And The Distractions...Steady sales pattern on: Nick Lowe, helped by the Cars appearance...Getting a few calls for: Thin Lizzy. 'Angel Of Death' and spotty sales at rock accounts...Bonnie Raitt continues to show a strong sales pattern--starting to get cult calls requesting the record...Dwight Twilley showing sales and a few phones for 'I'm Back Again'...Soft Cell starting to spread now. Sales at retail level starting to be attributed to radio airplay. Also starting to get some curiosity calls on Soft Cell--some mentioning 'Tainted Love' by name...Hot phones for: Aldo Nova, 'Fantasy'. Retail build is steady...Still Top 25 sales for Huey Lewis. Phones for: 'Working For A Living' and 'Change Of Heart'...Gamma still showing Top 25 sales...Still some calls for: Bryan Adams; Donnie Iris; Janis Joplin, 'One Night Stand'; and, the UFO album."

KSRR, HOUSTON, TX P.D.-ALAN SNEED: "I'll agree with the comments in last week's Sheet that 'One World' is the best Utopia radio cut in quite some time. I, however, have been a fan of Utopia albums as obscure as 'Ra'. I just like the band...Continued massive retail on: J.Gaills Band, Joan Jett, Police; -- Go Go's and Loverboy are close behind...Good retail build on: UFO, B52's, Aldo Nova, and Sammy Hagar... AC/DC has definitely peaked, retailwise, and in terms of listener interest...Scorpions album is a pleasant surprise...We're one of those stations that uses 'crank it up' on the air, so the Dregs is a natural for us. Good luck to: Cook, Hock, and Bone on getting the record on KLOL...Rick Springfield makes me more nervous every week. I was especially disturbed by the round of boos that the announcement of his concert drew at a recent Rock show...The Daltrey compilation is interesting. Hearing those great middle and late 70's tracks like 'Say It Ain't So, Joe' and 'Avenging Annie' was great fun."

KZEW, DALLAS, TX M.D.-JANEL DOLAN: "I got my advance cassette, and I'm impressed with the high quality of the Franke And The Knockouts album. They've advanced incredibly since the first album, and this one should get complete album radio acceptance. Beauty. Way to go, guys...RCA's second homerun is the Springfield. His second offering is a complete success. I already hear more than one hit single. It's already in the Top 20 sales...My favorite new song is the theme to 'Cat People'. Bowie is in great voice; and once you see the movie, you'll be hooked on the song."

WKZL, WINSTON-SALEM, NC M.D.-CHUCK HOLLOWAY: "The Adds Are: Riggs and the Genesis 12"...Strong Retail Here: Go Go's #1 in the stores; Loverboy and Aldo Nova tied for #2; and, J.Geils still at #4...The remix of Genesis 'Man On The Corner' is a real superb 25-34 pleaser. Excellent relief record...Super early reaction on the Dregs. They've always done well here, and have sold out several small concerts over the past few years. The first time we played 'Crank It Up', we invited listeners to guess who the artists were. Guesses ranged from REO Speedwagon to Bachman Turner Overdrive. Finally someone guessed the Dregs as they went into the instrumental break...Bonnie Raitt is showing good early phones and retail...We're flipping cuts on Johnny And The Distractions to: 'Complicated Now'...Stevie Nicks remains surprisingly strong. We're not seeing any burnout as a result of earlier play. The live treatment almost makes it a whole new song...Hello, Al Moss, wherever you are."

WEBN, CINCINNATI, OH M.D.-CURT GARY: "Leave it to Charlie Daniels to bring back the war everyone wanted to forget. Ought to be #1 on the survivalists charts soon. A must record for 25-34 males...While we're in the Epic pile, give a close listen to: 'Fashion And Fame', if you haven't already. Angel City has lots of class...Joan Jett opens for the Police here in April. She's been a major influence on ticket sales...After hearing Krokus' 'One Vice At A Time', I'm sure Brian Johnston of AC/DC wishes he had another job. 'Long Stick Goes Boom' is a monster--do not listen while driving above 55...I repeat--do not touch that dial--this is not a test. The quirky pop music of the Cars seems to be shaking up a little interest... Finally, in the quirky pop vein, 'Nonstop Erotic Cabaret' is pulling lots of curious phone calls. It's hard to say whether they like it or not...Many thanks to: Tim Goodman for stopping by WEBN...That's all for now."

WQXM, TAMPA/ST. PETERSBURG, FL M.D.-DICK BASCOM: "RCA is certainly on a hot streak this year. Rick Springfield's success will be a major staple for all of radio...And Franke And The Knockouts' upcoming Lp 'Below The Belt' should be an album radio TKO. 'Never Had It Better' sounds damn good...The Scorpions have given us what we've been asking for for years--something that defies daypart restriction. 'No One Like You' is the best Scorpions' track I've ever heard... 'Death Wish II' is the next best thing to Zeppelin. With tracks like 'City Sirens' and 'Hypnotizing Ways', this album is destined to at least partially fill the void...Phone interest is building on: Gamma and Jay Ferguson. I predict they are bound to explode real soon."

We presented a Cars extended radio spectacular where we gave away lots of tickets and Cars Lp's to lots of happy listeners. We'd like to thank all at Elektra, who made this possible...We'd also like to thank: Rich Little for doing a phone-in with Charles Laquidara and Ken Sheldon. This man is funny...And now here is Raz's Rave Up: 'Post Prince concert remarks: It was so emotional, there wasn't a dry seat in the house (kudos to Ted Cohen and Ona). I had to smoke a cigarette... XTC's 'English Settlement' Lp literally cries out for airplay--the lyrics are perceptive and the music reinforcing. 'Senses Working Overtime' says it all. WMET, CHICAGO, IL M.D.-DAVE BENSON: "MET Adds: Scorpions; Rick Springfield; Roger Daltrey; Dregs; 'Secret Policeman's Other Ball'; 'Death Wish II' Soundtrack; and, Le Roux...Chicago's heavy metal hard-core will, no doubt, find much to cheer about with the new Scorpions Lp. 'No One Like You' is the standout track, and it may even make some of the faithful forget that Michael Schenker isn't with the band...We convert the Springfield 12" to an Lp add. Nice cover, Rick...The Dregs have finally scored with album radio!! and we're pleased as punch to 'Crank It Up'...Roger Daltrey's best bits may not be a 'greatest hits' Lp, but 'Martyrs And Madmen' does hit the spot... 'Secret Policeman's Other Ball' is an impeccable production piece. I really think that the charitable and well-intentioned concept for the concerts comes across in the music and on the record. The album has a great vibe. I think a lot of people will buy the album just to hear God and Moses play 'Crossroads' together...Speaking of guitar gods, 'Death Wish II' is definitely a movie soundtrack, but 'City Sirens' and several other tracks are obviously Jimmy Page, and Zeppelin fans will not be denied...Le Roux has been waiting in the wings long enough. We'll go with: 'You Know How Those Boys Are'...We're also using: Genesis 'Man On The Corner' 12"...Sales Story: Go Go's, J.Geils Band, Bob & Doug McKenzie, Police, and Loverboy in the Top Five...Personal Fave Of The Month: The Ira Sullivan 'Red Rodney' Lp on Musician; the new Karla Bonoff Lp; and, the Jam's latest...Final Note: All of Chicago is very angry with God for taking John Belushi away from us so soon."

WDVE, PITTSBURGH, PA P.D.-DAVE LANGE: "First off the bat, Boy, we could use some fresh hot albums. Right now, I'm dealing with maybe five records that are hot, of which three have been on my list around 20 weeks. Whereas, 6 or 7 months ago, there were 10 or 12 legitimate hot Lp's on our list. It would be nice if we could balance the releases a little bit. There is so much stuff in medium rotation--so much of it new bands that it's feasible that a share of this music will be lost...Looking at the new stuff, there are a couple of things I really hope don't get lost in the above shuffle, one of them being the Dregs. 'Crank It Up' is totally irresistible...And there's always room for some fresh heavy metal. Scorpions lead with 'No One Like You'...Big Movers This Week: The Gamma record showing almost instantaneous response...Sammy Hagar continues to grow. 'Only One Way To Rock' could be as big as Joan Jett's anthem...Aldo Nova starting to show some sales--phones continue in a moderate level...Considering: Asia. Saving lots of room for this one."

WSHE, MIAMI, FL PROG. ASST.-KIM FULTS: "We can't wait to see the Police this Friday night. We're sure they'll be just as good as they were last year."

KRQR, SAN FRANCISCO, CA M.D.-JON RUSSELL: "The Rocker definitely be rockin with this week's adds-- It took a little time but 'Long Night' from Angel City feels right for us, with Daltrey's 'Martyrs And Madmen' we get another fine collection of his best, and two I'm really going to enjoy hearing on the radio...Scorpions 'No One Like You' is the synthesis of their previous best efforts. Well done and always an interesting cover. Who can forget 'Love Drive'?...Last but possibly best this week is Utopia's 'One World'. This handclapper is no runt of a tune for rock radio. I predict singing in the hallways and writhing on the floor...Plugging the local offering, Huey is getting hotter than just 'Working For A Living'...Gamma's right any time...There is more to Tutone than just another pretty number...Listen to the rest, and Hagar's optimistic rock is a definite winner (no San Francisco bias here, eh?)...Dave Roberts, our fearless Program Director, ever heard of him? Probably not, but I'll talk about him anyway. Seems at the outset of the Rocker, some of the industry and local press rarely made mention of him so to set the record straight, we do have a P.D. named Dave Roberts (I'm pretty sure, anyway)--why I saw him just last week once, and I keep getting these memo's signed 'DR'--kind of a tall guy who's heavy into research. In fact I'm learning a great deal from him, and the lifestyle research he's set up is an excellent tool for us--(is this enough, Dave?). Actually though, I'd like to say it's great working with this fine staff of ours and esp. lovable Dave, who is one of the best motivators ever. To anyone who has read this far, I extend an invitation to stop in and say 'hello' when you visit San Francisco...Take care till next time...One final note: Rest in Peace, JB from all your blues brothers and sisters."

WHJY, PROVIDENCE, RI M.D.-ROB LIPSHUTZ: "I have to credit Bill with making people aware of 'I'll Drink To You' from Duke Jupiter, a band I would have otherwise overlooked. What an instantly likeable track this is...Rick Springfield's new album is a well conceived followup. 'Calling All Girls' is the outstanding song...The cut on Chubby Checker we like best is 'Burn Up The Night'. Growing up in Philadelphia, the Twist was the first rock and roll record I remember hearing, so I suppose I'm indebted...Retail Breakthroughs: Prism, Le Roux, and Bonnie Raitt all hit the Top 15...Remember to check out: 'One World' from Utopia...Joel Webber thinks that's Sonny Bono going through all the punishment on the Scorpions cover. Maybe we should submit it to 'You Asked For It'...Hope people don't mistake 'Death Wish II' for a Led Zeppelin album...Finally, to Jimmy Mack: Your comments are hysterical!!"

WQMF, LOUISVILLE, KY M.D.-DUKE MEYER: "I'm absolutely in love with the 'Secret Policeman's Other Ball' Lp. I've been living with it since I got it. The two Sting tracks and the three Beck/Clapton cuts are paper thin--I've played them so much...Hate to be a 'me too', but the Scorpions 'No One Like You' cut is incredible. A cruncher with substance...The Riggs album has some interesting rock and roll on it--still searching for my fave...The jury is still out on the 'Death Wish II' album. 'City Sirens' is the one I like the best, but I've got to listen a few more times...Al Stann, thanks for bringing Tim Goodman by. Tim, it was a pleasure...Aldo Nova is still doing absolutely incredible in phone out research...Still working very hard for both the Light and Glass Moon records...We did a re-add on: 'Nuclear Attack'...Also added: Genesis 12", 'Man On The Corner'; and, Joan Jett, 'Crimson And Clover'."

WMJQ, ROCHESTER, NY M.D.-ROBERTA HABER: "Why I love Rick Springfield' by Roberta Haber. 1) He's fast coming a pop rock master in the great tradition of the Raspberries and some band called the Beatles. 2) Success has not spoiled him yet. 3) He's the only human being who has ever used the word 'moot' in a song...But seriously, folks, the new album is just wonderful. Besides the great songs on the double sided 12", there's: 'I Get Excited' (hot stuff), the Springsteenish 'Tonight', and a great ballad called 'Still Crazy For You'. Please notice that not once in the above comments did I mention that Rick Springfield is extremely cute...If you can get past the sicko cover, there is some good stuff on the new Scorpions album. 'No One Like You' is typical for the Scorps, which could be why I like it. It's already getting phone response after just a couple of days...The people of Rochester, in all their wisdom, have spoken. 'We like "Tainted Love"', they said. Thus commanded, we added Soft Cell this week...Big law suit goes boom! What can I say about the Krokus 12", except that they do AC/DC better than AC/DC does. WBRU, PROVIDENCE, RI M.D.-DAVID FILIPOV: "Moon Martin's new one sounds like a real winner. Strong hooks, subtle yet attractive melody, and the production is startling. Good job by Robert Palmer. A neat mixture of straight ahead rock and dance-oriented synthesizer backbeat...As Utopia's new one seems destined for great things with the song 'One World', let me just point out three more standouts: 'Lysistrata'; 'The Up', straight ahead and catchy; while 'Only Human' looks to be the next in a long line of classic Rundgren ballads. Overall, a strong album with a lot of airplay potential for just about any format...Jonathan Richmond came around last week, and we were real happy to see him...And two members of Paul Collins' Beat dropped by: Paul and his guitarist Larry Whitman. They were doing some promotional visits with Tom Lanzalotti, and they stopped in and spun some tunes. Nice to meet them. Best of luck to both of them and all the Paul Collins' Beat."

WZZO, ALLENTOWN/BETHLEHEM, PA M.D.-BRUCE BOND: "Ladies and gentlemen, WZZO added the Human League. I mean, what the hell. Soft Cell is the third most requested and #10 in sales. If they can do it, so can The League. Call it future music, but it's been grabbing the other jocks and our Listener Advisory Board...And then there's the Scorpions. 'No One Like You' doesn't even need a daypart. They're a heavy metal band, who I used to think was the most obnoxious metal band, but this sucker has potential...We had to add 'Jam Sandwich' on the 'Death Wish II' for the Led Zeppelin following...Sorry, I won't be home this weekend. I'm going skiing in Vermont...By the way, leading both sales and requests this week: Joan Jett...In sales, same as last week: J.Geils Band is #2 and Bob & Doug are #3...Our 'Beerhunter' party was more than successful...In requests: Ozzy Osbourne #2 and Soft Cell #3. (By the way, we'll start playing an edit of the long club version)...Thanks to everyone at RCA and Millenium Records for the preview party for the new Franke And The Knockouts album. I heard a lot of hit material...I got to hear Asia. You're right, it's hot...Finally, glad to be part of Jon Scott's conference call on Monday afternoon. I not only learned a lot about music, but heard some great jokes."

WFYV, JACKSONVILLE, FL P.D.-RAD MESSICK: "Pretty impressed with the 'Secret Policeman's Other Ball', especially the Phil Collins and Sting. Even a real good performance from Clapton and Beck--Where's Jimmy Page when you need him to make the Yardbirds happen one more time?...Speaking of Jimmy Page, 'Death Wish II' is a real decent movie soundtrack. At the same time, I wish his name wasn't on it so it would be treated as a soundtrack rather than 'a Jimmy Page album'. I have a feeling the kids are going to be real disappointed when they bring home a copy of the album and realize there are no real Led Zep flourishes...Riggs is a real good Southern band that has been working their ass off regionally for years. With the punch of the Pat Armstrong organization, plus a real fine debut effort, they could be a headliner band in a couple of years...On the local scene, keep your ears open for a new 38 Special. Word on the street here is it's gonna be their best yet--with 'Wild Eyed' over 1 million, 150 thousand that ain't no laughing matter...P.S. Look for Charlie Logan to return to these pages next week."

KAZY, DENVER, CO M.D.-DOUG CLIFTON: "Our Adds: Aldo Nova, 'Fantasy'; Simon & Garfunkel, 'Mrs. Robinson' and, the Rick Springfield album, which has mucho material to choose from...Retail: Joan Jett bumps the J.Geils Band to #2 and takes over the top position. Following the J.Geils Band at #3 are the Go Go's; #4 Cars; #5 Bob & Doug McKenzie; Soft Cell comes in at #6; #7 Police; #8 Quarterflash; #9 Sammy Hagar; and, #10 AC/DC...Phones: Still no change in hot stuff. Joan Jett, 'I Love Rock And Roll' and 'Crimson And Clover'; along with J.Geils Band, 'Freeze Frame' and 'Centerfold'. All hot...Gaining momentum: Rick Springfield, 'Calling All Girls'; Van Halen, 'Pretty Woman'; and, Prism, Huey Lewis, and Tommy Tutone...Since the first of the year, there really hasn't been the drought of early good releases that we normally have this time of year. Looking forward to several new releases which are coming soon, including: Franke And The Knockouts and the new Rainbow...Special thanks to: Dick Merkle of A&M for bringing Johnny Koonce of Johnny And The Distractions by the station. All of us here wish he and his band the best of luck...Considering: Johnny And The Distractions, Gamma, Jay Ferguson, Dwight Twilley, Bonnie Raitt, Susan Lynch, and Chubby Checker."

KQRS, MINNEAPOLIS, MN M.D.-DOUG PODELL: "New Adds: Scorpions, Dregs, and Krokus...The Scorpions have come a long way with this Lp. What a great sick cover...Really like the Dregs. They've come up with some serious rock and roll for the sophisticated rock radio listener. 'Crank It Up' is a hit on every level...As a disc jockey, I can't wait to get on the air and spin 'Long Stick Goes Boom'. The reaction should be wild. Most likely, they'll all want to know what AC/DC Lp it's off of. Krokus has put out some good hard rock that goes boom...Novo Combo is getting solid reaction in both sales and requests. 'Tattoo' moves to hot; the same for Aldo Nova's 'Fantasy'. Keeping the names straight will be the only problem...Hot phone for: Tommy Tutone; 'Secret Policeman's Other Ball'; Joan Jett; and, Gamma...Gamma 3 has the goods to put Ronnie in the superstar category he deserves. The response to this Lp has prompted us to go back on his other material...Saw Tommy Tutone in concert. It was an extremely tight show, and Tommy did his first television interview on KQ's Twin Cities Beat television program. Thanks to: Buddy and everybody at CBS...Another incredible concert this week from two Twin Cities acts: The Time and Prince. They say seeing is believing, and now I'm a true believer...Considering: Roger Daltrey and the Bowie single...Personal note from our illustrious P.D., Doug Sorenson: To Tommy Nast: 'How ya doing, and who the hell is Harry Castle?'...Those latest Mediatrend numbers are in. KQRS with a 9.1. Third 'up' Book in a row!!"

KZOK, SEATTLE, WA M.D.-CRAIG MARTIN: "The brand new Scorpions is hot. While there is plenty of mind-crushing stuff here to melt the metal heads' minds, the album, as a whole, seems to be a little less manic and there is more for radio to choose from here than on any of their previous albums. The title track, 'Can't Live Without You' (my personal favorite) and 'No One Like You' give you three cuts that sound great--and the rest of the album is crazy. The Pacific Northwest is a hotbed for this band. I've been told that outside of L.A., they've sold more albums here than anywhere else. We've had phone response from the day we received the album that tends to back up those claims...Also on the heavy metal front, Angel City's 'Night Attack' is a killer. This band from Australia plays some of the most innovative hard rock around these days. Songs like 'Fashion And Fame', 'City Out Of Control', and 'Nothing To Win' show that there's room for originality in a heavy metal theme. Call it 'new wave heavy metal' if you want, I call it good rock and roll...Just got an advance cassette on Franke And The Knockouts, and I'm very impressed. It's got a much harder edge than their first album. A couple of tracks have a distinct Loverboy sound to them, which should make it a natural for rock radio. 'Keep On Fighting' and 'Just What I Want' should lead the way when this album comes out."

WYSP, PHILADELPHIA, PA M.D.-STEVE FEINSTEIN: "First, a typo correction from last week: KOMA has an 'irreverant' approach, certainly not irrelevant...Totally floored by the Scorpions track 'No One Like You'. I'd go Bill one further--and say that it's not only one of the best metal tracks this year, but one of the most outstanding tracks, period...We decided to go with the Human League record. A&M is fortunate that Soft Cell has paved the way for records like this that are a bit out of the mainstream...The record that is monopolizing my turntable at home is: The Call. It's so invigorating to hear a band that has a sound that's impossible to categorize. Unusually intelligent lyrics, and the music is playful but provocative at the same time...Still getting good reaction on: Susan Lynch. We decided to open up and also play 'Street Kids'...Had the pleasure of meeting Susan's associate, Larry Whitman, when he stopped by along with Paul Collins from the Beat...We've also opened up on the Paul Collins album, adding a tune with 60's overtones called 'Crying Won't Help'...The Chubby Checker song 'Harder Than Diamond' still captivates me. It's got a number of powerful hooks...Probably the hottest record on our station right now is: Huey Lewis & The News. Talk about records jumping out of the radio--this one grabs you by the throat. It's real impressive that the band produced this themselves. It sounds as if they worked with a world class producer. Also hear that Huey is a phenomenal performer...I had the pleasure of meeting Donnie Jenner at a Franke And The Knockouts listening party. Great guy...Saw Steve Leeds and John Schoenberger from Radio Records. Let me tell you, Steve looks pretty spiffy in his leather pants and red shoes. He was the picture of sartorial splendor...Congratulations to: Mavis Brodey on her A&R job with EMI. Can't think of a nicer person to get that kind of gig."

WLUP, CHICAGO, IL M.D.-SKY DANIELS: "Record Of The Week: Krokus, 'Long Stick Goes Boom'.. Bone, are you listening? There's a lot been happening since you left. You'd be proud to see the effect you had on music. Hell (oops, pardon my expression). Heck, I doubt if even you'd believe it. That a surly, drunken wildman like yourself would be the prototype for rock and roll in the 80's. But it's true. The new Krokus song proves you knew what you were doing. Can you believe it? You were so fucked up, you're even dead...The Scorpions have been stars in Chicago for years, thanks to Sherwood, Sotet, and Cliff Bernstein's belief years ago. They caused a full scale riot (honest) at the Loop's Rock Dock at the Chicagofest three years ago. Now the riot comes to your very own radio station...Rick Springfield has delivered an album on a par with Journey's 'Escape' and Foreigner '4'. At least four cuts are smashes: 'Christina', 'One Last Kiss', 'Tonight', and 'Calling All Girls'. It has to have the cover of the year, too...Before reading last week's Question, I never realized how many people read my stuff. Hell, Hard, you shoulda let me know so I wouldn't make such an ass out of myself. Seriously, I get a sense of camaraderie from the Radio and Record Action forum. I think we all know that the responsibility of keeping rock happening is in our hands. I like sharing in that responsibility with my friends in the Hard Sheet."

WLRS, LOUISVILLE, KY M.D.-TERRY MEINERS: "What in the hell am I wasting my time scribbling out these comments for. As of this writing, the world is supposed to end within 24 hours, when all the planets are fully aligned. (Mr. Bill, could you please forward my mail to Purgatory?) Geez, there are a couple of things I wanted to accomplish before they turned off the big light. I've always wanted to be locked in a fully stocked wine cellar with a box of Disco biscuits, a head of lettuce, Marie Osmond, and Rin Tin Tin. Maybe I can arrange all that this evening...The buzz in this town at the moment is the possibility of a University of Louisville vs. University Of Kentucky basketball game in the second round of the NCAA Tournament (which will be all over but the shouting by the time you read this). There will be bloodshed after that one's over. Mark my words...We're nuts about the new Jimmy Page (HEY, I'M NOT DEAD, I'VE GOT LOTS OF BILLS TO PAY) album. Right out-of-the-box and into a force feeding rotation for this one...Scorpions is another blazer. She's doing nights as a Communist, dates a Honda motorcycle, and does a killer airshift. We've landed a real prize...Personals: McGathy/Catania/Dungan: It was all a badjoke. I apologize. We were just taping a segment for a new radio series entitled 'Candid Telephone'. He didn't mean a word of it."

WTUE, DAYTON, OH M.D.-JIM KINNEY: "I never thought I'd catch myself dead saying this, but the new Scorpions album ranks among the best I've heard this year. I liked one, maybe two tunes in all, by these guys in the past, but every song on this album got some kind of mark when I was listening to it the first time, and you know how many times that happens!!!! 'No One Like You' is definitely the best, but 'Dynamite', 'Now', 'Can't Life Without You', and 'Blackout' are all great songs. I'd also put 'When The Smoke Is Going Down' in there, if it weren't for a short section of horribly off-key guitar somewhere in the middle. This is the kind of thing that makes your blood rush a little faster for awhile. When a group that you don't have much time for at all makes you realize that you just never know where the next great album or great tune is going to come from, you can never rule anyone out. This album has all the maturity that you could possibly ask for. The songs, production, musicianship--it's all there. And Meine's voice doesn't bother me like it has before...Also in this week are: 'Secret Policeman's Other Ball' (due to late mail); and, Utopia. I don't know how long this 'Policeman's' album will be played. 'Roxanne' is best. We're also on: 'In The Air' and 'Crossroads', too, but they're not really great versions. And to all record companies who ever deal with Eric Clapton in the future: You will not be able to beat two of the 157 versions of 'Further On Up The Road' that we already have. Please find something else...On the Utopia album, we're on: 'One World', which I agree is probably the only really good tune...Album cover of the decade: Rick Springfield, 'Success Hasn't Spoiled Him Yet'. Rick, who did the cover himself, really out did himself with the whole concept. If RCA would have pulled a Chrysalis/Trower move and sent the cover with no album in it, we'd have added it...I'd also like to mention the cover of Brian Briggs' album: 'Combat Zone'. It rates a close second, even if the album is not getting any airplay...Epic: My vote goes to 'Stolen Moments' for the next Fogelberg single. It's rock and roll, but soft enough with plenty of hooks...If you haven't listened to the Miles Davis compilation on Columbia, do yourself a favor. It's real nice... Also, check out Mike Harrison's column in the newest issue of Billboard. A good topic for Question Of The Week sometime."

WCMF, ROCHESTER, NY M.D.-DAVE KANE: "Drum roll, please...And the new P.D. of WCMF is: Frank Holler, formerly of WWWW, Detroit; WKLS, Atlanta; and, most recently of Q107 in Washington, DC. Frank will be sitting in his office as you read this. It sure was fun being in charge for two weeks. The latest Birch Report is out, and don't look now but WCMF is the Number 1 station in Rochester; also Number 1, 12+ and 18-34 males. Now then, bring on the ARB's...WCMF adds this week: Chubby Checker; Rick Springfield; Bonnie Raitt; 'Death Wish II' Soundtrack; and, Scorpions...Finally found room for Miss Bonnie this week--immediate phone response. Retail also has 'She And The Boys' debuting #13 in sales... 'Harder Than Diamond' by Chubby Checker proves that rock and roll knows no age limits--a great tune... 'Death Wish II' by Jimmy Page is, personally, a bit of a let down. However, we do like: 'Jam Sandwich' as it sounds the closest to the Zepp we're ever gonna get...Boy, have we got an interesting retail report: Simon And Garfunkel debuts at #4 with no airplay. However, we might have to change that. Apparently, some people want to hear it. Go Go's remain at #1 and Joan Jett at #2...Duke Jupiter is selling very well and the phones are ringing...Likewise, the Soft Cell. All it needed was a chance, and it's performing. You should be playing this song...And my current fave The Human League makes it to the #10 spot in retail, moving over 100 pieces this past week. Keep in mind the Human League is only in a light rotation...For next week, we're considering: Charlie Daniels; 'Secret Policeman's Other Ball'; and, Utopia...Secret Message to Charles Blow, Private Eye: Hang in there, buddy. I don't want to cancel my vacation plans...Steve Feinstein: Hey, it was a pleasure. Let's do it some more."

WIOT, TOLEDO, OH M.D.-BUCK McWILLIAMS: "Had a funny thought while digesting radio on vacation last week. Those bands and names sure don't mean much to the average listener these days. Disregarding whether the music is good or not, what do bands like Johnny And The Distractions, Huey Lewis & The News, Aldo Nova, Novo Combo, Tommy Tutone, and Terry Meiners mean to the average listener? With the exception of the last name, all are making progress right now with little or no previous track record. Most are getting respectable airplay, even though none were well known 6 months ago. And who says radio doesn't play new music?...My short time on vacation gave me the chance to meet some very outstanding people in the field. And I'd like to thank: Denton Mar and Curt Gary from WEBN (boy, does that station have its shit together), Al Stann from CBS, Tom Owens and Duke Meyers from WQMF, and Terry Meiners from WLRS for sleeping in that day. Also to: Workhorse and future talent Tim Goodman for the visits and advice on how to rape a promo man's credit card. The Goodman Lp goes into heavy this week, and that's not just because we all like it...Upward retail surprises go to: Bryan Adams and Tommy Tutone (also good phones)...And unexpected surprises go to: Starvin' Marvin Gleicher from Elektra (good to meet a label rep who knows and loves music) and Mark Wescott and Paul Collins from CBS. That poor guy will be exhausted by the time he gets off the highway."

WBAB, LONG ISLAND, NY M.D.-RALPH TORTORA: "I forgot to mention Riggs last week. Move over, Van Halen. This Lp is a mother, especially the track 'Ready Or Not'. We put it into heavy rotation for the weekend to create some interest, and they went for it. The Lp debuted on our sales chart this week at #32. We're gonna keep it in heavy rotation...XTC is doing well. We're seeing requests and sales...Speaking of sales, Peter Cetera finally debuted on the chart this week; as did XTC, Utopia at #21, and 'Secret Policeman's Other Ball' at a very impressive #7...Food for thought: To keep 'We Got The Beat' alive, we've added the live option on Urgo... 'Death Wish II' has some great music on it. My current faves are: 'Big Band, Sax And Violence' and 'Jam Sandwich'. I like some of the vocal tracks, too. Was wondering what happened to Chris Farlowe. Heavy phones on this one--moderate sales... Look out for the Kim Wilde record. It sounds great. We're going with it next week. When you listen to this one, keep in mind the success of the Go Go's. 'Checkered Love' is the cut. It just jumps out of the speakers at you...To all who care: I'll be on vacation in sunny (hopefully) Florida while you read this. Be back Wednesday, March 24th."

WPYX, ALBANY, NY M.D.-RON NENNI: "Did the world end? I'm not quite sure. But seriously, we'll miss John Belushi. People who make me laugh are the most memorable...With a spoon in ear and a fork in the eye, I'd bet my heavy metal kitchen utensils that the new Scorpions Lp will be the biggest heavy metal album of 1982. 'No One Like You' sounds like it'll be #1 on the Song Index. 'Arizona' and 'Dynamite' are outstanding cuts...On the other hand, judging from the 12", Krokus has become a joke... The Jimmy Page Soundtrack is pulling enormous phones with 'Jam Sandwich'. We like 'Hypnotizing Ways' as well. It's not great material, but the listeners are starving for anything that resembles Led Zeppelin...The Bryan Adams is still pulling more phones than ever, especially on 'Fits Ya Good'...Aldo Nova is still #1 requests--climbing in sales...Duke Jupiter's 'I'll Drink To You' sounds terrific on the radio. We're expecting huge phones and retail, and a drinking problem in the capitol district because of the song...Johnny And The Distractions needs some help. We're going with 'My Desire' to trigger some response...We finally have some music with some meaningful lyrics, and Utopia's doing them. 'One World' is a great radio song. My fave on the album is: 'Shineola'...Soft Cell and Bonnie Raitt are getting great phones and continuing to sell...From what I hear, this Charlie Daniels song 'Still In Saigon' sounds like a smash. Thank god there's no fiddle...I can't wait to hear the new Bowie, and of course, Asia."

WMYK, ELIZABETH CITY/NORFOLK, VA M.D.-BILL SIMMONS: "Really knocked over by the new Rick Springfield Lp. He has definitely perfected the craft of producing albums that are accessible to both album rock and contemporary radio. Bill Hard definitely picked the cuts on this one...Amazed at the response that Bonnie Raitt is receiving after just two days on the air. Just goes to show that you can't hear them all on the first listen...Could not pass up the live version of 'Roxanne' from 'Secret Policeman's Other Ball'. We'll see how the audience accepts it...Krokus gets my vote as the week's best straight ahead rock and roll tune...Getting real good calls now on: Jay Ferguson, 'White Noise'; Aldo Nova, 'Fantasy'; and Simon And Garfunkel."

WDIZ, ORLANDO, FL M.D.-MIKE LYONS: "Big surprises of the week: The world didn't end; John Belushi was using cocaine; and, Sting's performance on 'Secret Policeman's Other Ball'!...We've decided to give the 'Death Wish II' Soundtrack some exposure, since the movie opened here and the curiosity on it demands some exposure at least...Springfield has no image problem here...Spring training is now in full swing, so we're breathlessly awaiting our baseball novelty record from Canada. C'mon, Jon Scott...Our 'Home-grown Album II' should be coming out next week...We'd like to thank: Mike Levine from Triumph and the RCA organization for their successful appearance here last week...As this is being phoned in, Ricky Bell is on his way to San Diego, thank God, and Bob Dylan has been Jewish for three days."

WRXL, RICHMOND, VA P.D.-ILYSE GOTTLIEB: "I was thrilled when I heard the Dregs plan to use vocalists on the new album. I've spent years dealing with limited airplay from program directors who were afraid of instrumentals no matter how good the music was. Not only is the new album a masterpiece, they've conformed without compromising perfection. For what more could one ask?!...Rick Springfield converts to an Lp add. We're using: 'Calling All Girls', 'Strangers', and 'Excited'. 'Strangers' is already pulling phones. And if the Lp isn't in Top 10 sales in time for the equinox, I'll be amazed...Bryan Adams moves into power this week as a result of increased sales and requests for 'Lonely Nights'...Riggs started out hot last week and has gotten hotter...Top Five sales on: Simon And Garfunkel's live collection. How can anyone avoid playing this record in mornings and middays?...Pleasing the kids at night are: Angel City, The Call, and UFO...The 'Secret Policeman's Other Ball' is really a treat. Phil Collins, Sting, and Beck/Clapton really force people to tune their radios up...After I don't know how many weeks, Tommy Tutone finds something other than a busysignal at '867-5309'. I kept saying I'd wait and see what happened and they did it, so I did too, and now it is. Makes sense, sure...Watch for the Robbin Thompson Band single coming out soon on Short Pump Records featuring: 'Train Ride' (re-done and phenomenal) backed with 'Moving On Up' (unbelievable). The single will be available in about two weeks. If you played 'Brite Eyes' or anything else off of 'Two B's Please', you'll love the single. Call producer, Ken Brown, at 804-355-4117 for a copy."

WSYR, SYRACUSE/UTICA, NY M.D.-TOM NAST: "Some great records out, but, unfortunately, not enough room for a lot of them. The response to the 'Secret Policeman's Other Ball' is very strong, with phones on Phil Collins. The same emotion is on the live version of 'In The Air Tonight'...Rick Springfield's album is a great followup. Rick is, in my opinion, the most versatile rock and roller in the business today. 'Calling All Girls' pulls instant phones. If the Babys were still together, I'd swear it was one of their songs...In the almost-added department, the 'Death Wish II' Soundtrack has some real good stuff on it. Not quite up to Led Zeppelin's par, though...The Scorpions is hot, and the cover definitely goes up for the Lp cover of the year. Nothing like getting forked...Krokus is another one of those bands on the verge of supergroup. Their entire album is a smoker...Phones are exploding on: Tommy Tutone. 'Jenny' could be album rock radio's top song of the year...Phones and sales both coming in on: Jay Ferguson. Besides 'White Noise', the cut 'Inside Out' is a vintage Jay classic...I love the way Duke Jupiter is breaking wide open. Looks like a hit to me...Favorite songs of the week: 'Jenny', 'Don't You Want Me', 'I'll Drink To You', and 'Change Of Heart'...Sorry to see Charlie Logan out of a gig. He's a great talent and music director. Now spell my name right on the check, Charlie."

WWCK, FLINT, MI P.D./M.D.-MARK MILLER: "I cannot believe what I've just heard. For the last 45 minutes, I've sat here spellbound. The object of my fascination being the new Asia album. Oh sure, I've raved about some pretty good records from time to time, but unquestionably this is the best I've heard in the last few years. Instead of one or two good cuts, this album has got 9. I dare someone to call this dinosaur rock. This is music for the 80's. This is the future of album rock radio. The direct heir to Pink Floyd and Led Zeppelin. Let's not forget the obvious influences--Yes, King Crimson, ELP. The members of this band have never played better. Considering the egos involved, this is no small feat. Although every track is a standout, my personal favorites include: 'Sole Survivor', 'Time Again', and 'Here Comes The Feeling'."

WLWQ, COLUMBUS, OH M.D.-TIM SMITH: "Jimmy Page was getting a few positive phone calls at the start, but now we're getting some negatives saying it's not all that great. I have to say that it's an album people will buy to put in their collection, but not listen to more than a couple of times at the beginning...With the Dregs album, we've got to echo last week's positive comments on 'Crank It Up'. Plus, we've added positive excitement from our jazz programmer on the cut 'Assembly Line'...AC/DC didn't equal its expectations, so try the Krokus. 'Long Stick Goes Boom' has more than fast energy of the early AC/DC sound...The axe puts to recurrent: Joan Jett; AC/DC; Stevie Nicks; Genesis; Triumph; and, Police, 'Secret Journey'...We're off: John Hall, Soft Cell, and Susan Lynch...Considering: Asia and Charlie Daniels...Still watching: Bonnie Raitt, Jay Ferguson, Novo Combo, Roger Daltrey, and Utopia."

WAAF, WORCESTER, MA M.D.-ROB BARNETT: "I don't know if 'Death Wish II' will be around the airwaves a month from now, but it seems that new music from Jimmy Page has got to be exposed to the audience so that they can decide... 'Secret Policeman's Other Ball' is another hot record for the moment. The Beck/Clapton stuff is strongest, and the Sting material will probably sound good late night...I got a big kick out of the Rick Springfield cover. If we're all making a little fun of him, it's nice to see that he's playing along with it. 'Calling All Girls' is still the #1 rocker, and 'I Get Excited' has been dissected to be 'Jesse's Girl' backwards...Gamma's sounding like it'll grow into a very strong radio record with the great production of 'Right The First Time'...The quick-to-recurrent decline of the new AC/DC album is interesting. The band is, and will be, a staple of the format. But it seems that new metal has got to have more than just the same old metal ingredients in order to work. A few new records have come out thinking about this theory, and their success or failure will tell us something about the metal forecast for the coming year...Tommy Tutone and Peter Cetera are hanging in there very strong...The big Loverboy cut in New England has become 'Take Me To The Top'. Didn't hear this one at all in the beginning, but it's getting tremendous response. The record has moved to the #3 sales spot...With 5 million ten-year-old requests a day for 'I Love Rock And Roll', 'Crimson And Clover' is working very well as a followup on Joan Jett...Our third Sammy Hagar cut now is 'Baby's On Fire'. That's all for now...Here's Rosenberg: 'Added to the Stiff List: The world--Just in case it did, in fact, end on March 10th (what a finale)...RIP; John Belushi."

WAQX, SYRACUSE, NY P.D./M.D.-ED LEVINE: "The hottest new album we have right now is: 'Secret Policeman's Other Ball'. This record has already surpassed the response generated by the first volume. 'In The Air Tonight' came in as our third requested piece of music this past week. 'Roxanne' is also drawing Top 10 requests. The stock is still sparse, but this could be a very big seller... The Human League is the kind of record that you will definitely notice on the radio. It's not formula, but then again, a lot of hit records aren't. 'Don't You Want Me' has got the goods for album rock and Top 40...The Jimmy Page Soundtrack was disappointing. I think the people calling this 'the next best thing to a Zeppelin record' are stretching the point a little bit, but there is no doubting its importance for at least a few weeks...My surprise album of the week has got to be the Rick Springfield. Some pretty good rock on there and very little wimp...The Duke Jupiter is probably going to do better than any of their other albums because of the fact that 'I'll Drink To You' is the ultimate party song... Speaking of parties, good luck to Tommy Nast as he goes for the Hattrick this week...And a personal from Dino at WZIR-FM to George Hawras: Congratulations on your new job. After reading your comments last week, I realize now that you are truly one helluva guy, and a piece of work to boot... Requests: Aldo Nova 'Fantasy' pulling major phones; as is Joan Jett's 'Crimson And Clover'; and, Tommy Tutone's 'Jenny'."

WHCN, HARTFORD, CT M.D.-BOB BITTENS: "Rick Springfield is on this week. I'll probably get hate mail from the Rock elitists for this, but I think the guy is a damn good pop songwriter. Now if he can just keep his image from slipping too far into cutesy-piedom, he'll be just fine...Dregs; Roger Daltrey; and this week's AC/DC clone, Krokus also got added...And we'll give the Zep freaks a taste of Jimmy Page from the 'Death Wish II' Soundtrack...After a solid two weeks of airplay, the XTC seems to be doing just fine. We've gotten no negatives, and a good number of positives on: 'Senses Working Overtime'. Those of you worrying about the weird intro should try and change your frame of reference. Don't think of it as a tuneout, think of it as the attention grabber. By the time the average earthdog gets a chance to say 'what the hell is that?', he or she will be hooked by what is essentially a great pop song; and, the more sophisticated listeners will thank you for rescuing them from the boredom of homogenized radio. I firmly believe that there's a growing number of people who are hungry for something that sounds different. Those people are not necessarily the trendies on the fringe of the album rock audience, instead, they're starting to make up a larger portion of the core audience. The success on album radio of a song like 'Tainted Love', and what I believe will be the future success of XTC, shows that those people are out there. Give your audience a chance to surprise you, and they probably will...I'm a little perturbed about something this week that I've seen other people mention before, and that is the practice of some record labels of sending only one copy of new albums. I'm not asking for huge shipments of every release, but I do think the company should send at least two copies, particularly of the so-called Major releases. What if I want to play two or three cuts in a row? What if we get a defective copy? What if I want to get the record into the studio for immediate airplay and live with a copy overnight? How about it--two copies would really help."

WLIR, LONG ISLAND, NY M.D.-RAY WHITE: "Thanks to Orchestral Manoeuvres In The Dark for a very special radio concert. The band's sound and pacing was top notch, and it's just a matter of time before they break much like Soft Cell and the Human League. We've been doing radio concerts on a regular basis for over 10 years now, and it's nice to see one every once in awhile become an lp release. Back in March of 1973, Graham Parsons and EmmyLou Harris, along with a top notch band, did a live show with us that's been a real collector's item. Sierra Records out of Pasadena, California has just released that concert on disc in a beautiful package. GP's music has always been extra special to me, and his death was a sad blow to music lovers everywhere. Do me a favor and listen to this record and tell me this guy wasn't an original. Needless to say, we're very proud of this release...While it took a while to happen, the Kim Wilde record finally got released in the States. Somebody at EMI said, 'It sounds like the Go Go's meet Pat Benatar.' Good comparison for a good record...Heard the Greg Kinn tape the other day, and it's taking a lot of self-control not to fly in the air studio and put it on...Thanks to Karla Bonoff for lunch last week. Spent a few days with her tape, and I must say 'Personally' is one of the catchiest pop tunes I've heard in a long while. Hats off to: Glen Frey's production; and yes, it's going to be a big hit...De Bella's Screamer Of The Week goes to: The Dregs for their tune 'Crank It Up'. Audience response has been very hot, and Long Island has got to be their second home...Didn't mention XTC last week because I wanted to spend more time with the record. It's subtle, and I wonder if album radio will give XTC and those subtleties the time to surface...The new Genesis B Side 'Summarine' is a treat--a flashback for old Genesis fans...And finally, before I forget, the 'Secret Policeman's Other Ball' was our #1 record this week."

WOUR, UTICA/SYRACUSE, NY M.D.-TOM STARR: "Thanks to Mr. McGathy and Louise for the hand delivery of the new Rick Springfield. It's nice to see the boy is a shoe-in this time around. I think that Belle, Bittens, and I got tired of bending skeptical ears last year over 'Working Class Dog', but it sure payed off... 'Jenny' is certainly turning into the 'Jessie's Girl' of '82. T. Nast: Great to see you on the Tutone bandwagon. You're right about 'Jenny', 'If you can't hear it, you're deaf', but that's a funny quote from someone who ignored the record for five months. It must be nice to have your hearing restored. Keep listening--because we'll have you playing catch-up with Nick Lowe, Bonnit Raitt, Dwight Twilley, and Chubby Checker next...The 'Secret Policeman's Other Ball' is a real gem of a record. We're recording megaphone response already to Sting, Collins, and the Beck/Clapton collaboration...Getting real good response to Bonnie Raitt. People are acutely aware we're the only station in the market playing it, and they're highly appreciative...Thin Lizzy is a bubbling-under kind of record. The old Lizzy fans dig it. If it's going to attract new ones, they have yet to present themselves on the phones."

WRAS, ATLANTA, GA M.D.-DANE VENABLE: "What did I tell you? I said the Dregs would blow your face out, and it does just that. Any album rock station that will not consider this record is very out of tune with their audience. Not only do the instrumentals provide some great relief, but the vocal tracks fit right into your album format...Two records that we've been testing are officially added this week: Chubby Checker and Susan Lynch. 'Office Love' is already drawing major calls."

WHFS, BETHESDA, MD P.D./M.D.-DAVID EINSTEIN: "When you get to the Bowie single, please listen. It's called 'Putting Out Fires' with superior state-of-the-art production featuring the artist-of-state on lead vocal...The new Dave Edmunds will have a Springsteen tune called 'From Little Things Big Things Grow'. Very impressive guitar...Speaking of guitars, the new Phil Manzanera is doing very well in night programming, and selling well in local import stores...Standard requests these days are: Soft Cell, Human League, Pete Shelley, and Godley/Creme, and XTC."

KNAC, LONG BEACH, CA P.D./M.D.-JIMMY CHRISTOPHER: "Hey modern rock fans, here we go for another rock week in Southern California. This week let us talk about the ex-Squeeze head man Jools Holland. He has a solo lp on IRS and it has some great piano boogie bop...Utopia's newest release contains a nice remake of the O'Jays 'For The Love of Money'...Thank you Stiff Records for releasing one of my favorite bands, Simple Minds. They have a definitive collection of 1979-81 stuff all on one album, and that's now available domestically...Pigbag is back with another Ep on Stiff, and it's funky but chic...The Bowie soundtrack to Christiane F' contains a nice German version of 'Heros'...And, speaking of funky, the advance Viage Ep is real funky and great dancing music...And lastly, but surely not leastly, The Surf Punks are back with a single called 'Shark Attack'...Captain Organic, who used to be on-the-air here at KNAC, returns with an interview show on Wednesday nights called 'Up Close'...The hottest sales and requests are: The Human League, Waitresses, Joan Jett, OMD, Go Go's, Soft Cell, The Blasters, and The Police."

WQBK, ALBANY, NY M.D.-LIN BREHMER: "XTC has become one of my latest obsessions. They've reached the #1 airplay slot this week. 'Senses Working Overtime' sounds better every time I hear it on the radio. Also playing: 'Ball And Chain' and 'English Roundabout'...Human League's 'Don't You Want Me' is probably the most requested song on-the-air right now...Has Capitol Records moved its central offices to Muscle Shoals? Levon Helms' distinctive voice and the Muscle Shoals session people combine to make 'You Can't Win Them All' a quality Lp. I've been making sure I get plenty of Vitamin Q every day...Comments from **CO-MUSIC DIRECTOR-ELLEN MCKINNON:** "What strange reports from market stores this week. Is anyone buying anything? Well, Bonnie Raitt seems to be among the new Lps flying out the doors, as does the double-set from Simon and Garfunkel. Other than those two, reports vary wildly...One name bobbing around on the surface of the moderate waters is Lou Ann Barton. Q104 has been playing Lou Ann for a couple of weeks now, and the people must be catching on...Chubby Checker isn't selling too well, but, gosh o'mighty, it does sound so good on the airwaves. My personal fave is 'Running', but I can stand 'Harder Than Diamond' real easily too... 'Snack Attack', the cut as opposed to the entire Lp, is a great tune. Real funny...Also in out-of-the-box last week was 'X-Ray Vision' from Moon Martin. 'Johnny And Mary Part 2' is the subtitle. Great song. We've played all of Moon's Lps, and based on the one tune we have now, I dare say 'Mystery Ticket' will be his strongest. Dare say. Where did that come from? Maybe the Human League. If you ain't spinning 'Don't You Want Me' you ain't being listened to...Happy 'Women's History Week' all!!"

KTIM, SAN RAFAEL, CA M.D.-TRISH ROBBINS: "It's raining again, but we in the Bay Area don't care, do we? I guess if your house is sitting on a newly formed precipice, you might say we do. Honestly, I don't want to see the Waldo Grade sitting on top of the houseboats in Sausalito. On the other hand, today is the heaviest day of the Jupiter Effect, and this might be it for everyone. If so, it was great knowing you. Thanks a lot. If not, check these pages next week to make sure I'm okay...The Bammie Show was a lot of fun. This event brings out everyone. I was lucky enough to meet Joe Montana there. Boy, is he a sweetheart! Also Boz Scaggs, who awarded Marty Balin his Best Male Vocalist Bammie. Look for some pictures featuring me and Boz, as I was happy to accept for Marty. Turning in performances at the show: Huey (he's popping up all over), Greg Kihn (Musician of the Year), Starship (Best Group), Tubes (can't get enough of them), and on and on. This area is fat with great talent. Other awards went to: Juice Newton, Lacey J. Dalton, Carlos Santana, Romeo Void, Journey, Neil Schon, Stan Getz, Narada Michael Waldon, Pete Sears, John Lee Hooker, Richie Cole, John Kane (Keys for Journey), and best club band, Y and T. I had a super time. Thanks, BAM, for being there...Can't stop now, I'm on a roll. Full Moon, featuring Neal Larson and Buzzy Featon, played over the week, and delivered excellent sets to an enthusiastic crowd. I enjoyed the band thoroughly. I hope they'll return to the area to do more gigs and, hopefully, a Kay-Tim live broadcast--and thanks for the interview. Of course, the night didn't end there, as Larry Butler, from Warners, is no quitter. We went to another club to hear Maria Maldaur and, after that, to a popular night spot which we closed at 4:00 AM. I guess I better get out of here right now, so be good to yourself and to me, if you've got any left over."

KBLE, DES MOINES, IA P.D./M.D.-RON SORENSON: "Hey, I don't care what Rick Springfield does in his spare time. He's made a good rock and roll record here, and he deserves to have it played. We're about 6 cuts in (4 more than the last Lp), led by: 'Calling All Girls', 'What Kind Of Fool', 'Strangers', and 'Black'... As movie music, 'Death Wish II' sounds like it's pretty good. As rock radio music, thoroughly mediocre. Since Jimmy Page's name means instant request and adds, at least go for the best stuff. Of the vocals, it's 'City Sirens', and from the instrumentals it's 'Prelude' for daytime and 'Jam Sandwich' for nighttime... Robert Palmer's assist on Moon Martin's 'X-Ray Vision' is very apparent. No additional looking for clues is necessary, as the single 'hit', 'Evidence', is in plain sight. Instant add...Carole King's single on Atlantic sounds like her best in sometime. The feeling is very similar to the 'Tapestry' album, which always was my favorite...As players, the Dregs from Dixie have set industry standards for several years. The vocals should, deservedly, expose their talents to a wider audience...Adds: Dregs, Rick Springfield, Patrick Hazell, Waylon Jennings, 'Death Wish II', Godley/Creme, Conductor, Jeff Lorber, Dan Siegel, Jools Holland, Moon Martin 12" and Carole King 12"."

KSMB, LAFAYETTE, LA P.D.-SCOTT SEGRAVES: "Howie bout three record conglomerate consultants? Each would take one third of the majors plus volunteering independent companies. Some companies would clientize two or even all three consultants to be sure their releases would fit perfectly on one or more of the major programming master grids. Of course, there would always be a few eccentrics who would do their own thing and not worry about pre-fitting but would stick to their deck chairs when they left-fielded into the great 'what is'. (Hell, I don't know what it means either. I'm suffering contemporaneous industrial strength brain damage from staying home with the flu and missing Jimmy Buffett.)"

WKQQ, LEXINGTON, KY M.D.-DAVE KRUSENKLAUS: "The Dregs record already starting to get some phone reaction. This band always had a nice underground following and now with an accessible track like 'Crank It Up' we can do business on the radio. I also have to believe that the title of the album, 'Industry Standard', has to be tongue in cheek with the fact that The Dregs put vocals on one of their songs...The Rick Springfield album is a wall-to-wall smash. I have to believe that sales for this album will be even stronger than the first. If there's one heavy metal band that has really cleaned up their act the past couple of years, it's Scorpions. We had great success with the song 'The Zoo' from 'Animal Magnetism' and the tunes 'No One Like You' and 'You Give Me All I Need' sound real good from the new album. Sammy Hagar sales and requests picking up nicely, also getting positive reaction on the Jay Ferguson, Angel City and Thin Lizzy. Nice sleeper track on the Ferguson record 'Inside Out'...The time is now to switch to 'Fits Ya Good' from Bryan Adams. For this station, one week on 'Fits You Good' has equalled one week of positive response. The album is also showing nice sales gains. Other sales gainers include Loverboy and Aldo Nova."

WQDR, RALEIGH, NC M.D.-BOB WALTON: "We just completed WQDR Rock Video Night IV and again it was a resounding success. Keep in mind we do not have access to any of the cable music channels. A special thanks to RCA Records for their prompt response in sending their videos. I hope to be hearing from the rest of you very soon--it's to your benefit!..Let's talk records again: We got Human this week! I think the Human League record can be a very big one for us, especially in the female demographic... Ditto for the Rick Springfield, obviously. It will be a huge record--it's already pulling constant requests. If someone doesn't win an award for that Lp cover, I'll make one up myself...We're still getting lots of requests for the Abba record title track and good comments from those who don't and even those who do know who it is...Glass Moon has taken a major jump in sales--it's now our number 2 selling record, right behind the J. Geils Band. Look for them on the road soon...Upcoming events: Jools Holland has a mega hit on his hands as will Franke And The Knockouts, and the Dave Edmunds will be superb!"

WKWF, KEY WEST, FL M.D.-BRUCE YOUNGBLOOD: "Talk about hometown radio, we just finished a remote from the Monroe County Fair. Thanks to the Miami Records reps for promo albums, especially Train at Capitol, Rich Pachter at A&M, Jeff Shane at Epic, Larry Mundello of RCA, and Chris Bailey, late of MCA... The 'Policeman's Ball' is a real magical record. Phil Collins just about takes your breath away... Airplay moves on: Duke Jupiter, Jay Ferguson, and Aldo Nova...Peter Dayton's 'Stuck On The Same Refrain' is starting to take off...Album adds: 'Secret Policeman's Other Ball'...New 45s: Carole King, Rich Little...New Wave Feature: The Innocents...All That Jazz: Lee Ritenour."

RADIO ACTION CONTINUED

WBLM, LEWISTON/PORTLAND, ME M.D.-JOSE DIAZ: "It looks like 'Crimson And Clover' is gonna do well as a follow-up to 'I Love Rock And Roll' by Joan Jett. I have to admit I'm always suspicious of cover versions of classics like this, but this one is gonna make it!...The new Scorpions record is indeed their best to date. 'No One Like You' is an obvious song. Unfortunately, the cover of the album is a bit bizarre...The Gamma song 'Right The First Time' is one of the better sounding things on the radio right now--when that comes on, all heads definitely turn!"

WMAD, MADISON, WI M.D.-DALE WOLTER: "First off, I'd like to clear up a misquote from last week! Our problem is not with album support from Columbia records--that has always been right up there. Rather, it has to do with the attitude of one certain employee of the company! Okay? Okay...Sales: #1 Go Go's, #2 J. Geils, #3 Joan Jett, #4 a revitalized Journey, #5 the Cars still hanging in there. Some surprises in the Top 10 include: Tommy Tutone, Bonnie Raitt, and Angel City...We've been on the U2 for only a couple of weeks but it's already registered at #6 in requests and #12 in sales. Hip town this Madison...Bill hit it right on the button with the Scorpions. 'No One Like You' leads the way...Utopia's 'One World' is more than just an anthem. It's finally somebody taking a stand against the bullshit, but done in an almost joyous way--we love it...Duke Jupiter's 'I'll Drink To You' has a springtime feel about it which makes it most welcome up here...And we finally got the Human League on the air! This is truly a can't miss item...Quick thanks to: Bob Tarentino, Rick Sudakoff, and Scott Nono for investing some time up here in the tundra!"

WPDH, POUGHKEEPSIE, NY M.D.-STEW SCHANTZ: "Three newcomers to our Top 10 this week: Utopia, Rick Springfield, and 'SPOB'. All are very h-o-t at PDH. Joan Jett is still on top though...The Dregs album is dynamite. From 'Crank It Up' to 'Blood Sucking Leeches' (my favorite song title), the album is good through and through...Another album which merits mention is Springfield which is perfectly put together, certain to be a s-m-a-s-h album. I notice nobody is talking about his cover of 'Black Is Black.' It's working real well for us...Moon Martin's 'X-Ray Vision' had damn well better be a hit single. With Palmer's production and Moon's distinctive vocals, this song is slick and really should do well...On PDH's music test a couple of songs of interest: Human League 'Don't You Want Me' a 5.8; XTC 'Senses' 6.3; Rick Springfield 'Black Is Black' 6.4; and Utopia's version of 'For The Love Of Money' a 7...Otherwise, all is well. Till next time."

WYFE, ROCKFORD, IL ASS'T. M.D.-THE DOCTOR: "Fortunately the Jupiter Effect hasn't taken place, otherwise this report wouldn't be visible...Speaking of visibility, that new Dregs Lp is a killer! We don't have room for it this week but hopefully next...The book starts in a week, so we're tightening up and gearing up. It should be fun...Scorpions and Rick Springfield are our only adds this week...I still can't believe how good Chubby Checker's latest is. We're getting response from all age groups on this one... Another album that I personally like, and is getting good phone reaction, is 'SPOB'. Sting, Phil Collins, Clapton and Beck--it all is a killer...Talk to you next week as long as we don't get a delayed reaction from the Jupiter thing!"

KILO, COLORADO SPRINGS, CO M.D.-ART PHILLIPS: "First out-of-the-box hot award of the year goes to Rick Springfield. The good doctor has at least 4 hits here including 'I Get Excited' and 'Christina'... We're getting phenomenal response to the 'SPOB': Collins, Clapton/Beck, and Sting are the easy choices. These alternate versions provide instant on-air stimulation...Roy Orbison is to Van Halen as the Guess Who is to Krokus? Killer cover, the kids will love the AC/DC sound alike vocals and the adults have grown up with the song...Susan Lynch makes her debut this week and I can already sense some great promotions around National Secretary Week...We're approaching 'Death Wish II' with extreme caution. This is not a Zeppelin album or a Jimmy Page solo record. 'Jam Sandwich' makes the most sense and initial response has been favorable...Moving up: Johnny and the D's, Bonnie Raitt, Duke Jupiter, and Chubby Checker."

WRNW, BRIARCLIFF MANOR, NY M.D.-PAT PRINCIPATE: "After a year of silence from remaining members of Led Zeppelin, it's nice to hear Jimmy Page on 'Death Wish II'. Jimmy sounds as good as he ever did. We're getting a decent amount of phone response on the record...Moon Martin's 'X-Ray Vision' is cleanly produced (courtesy of Robert Palmer) and it even sounds a little like Palmer's 'Looking For Clues', yet at the same time, sounds reminiscent of Moon's prior works. Confusing isn't it? Actually, I could've just made it simpler by saying it's a great blending of 2 artists without losing their individuality... Elton John's single for John Lennon is great. That's it, great...Rick Springfield whose 'Working Class Dog' has graduated to a life of champagne, chilled doggie biscuits, limousines, and french poodles (2 of them mind you) says 'Success Hasn't Spoiled Me Yet'. Keep that life up and it will! Ah, the dogs life...\$4,000 was our contribution to the other 5 stations in the county who together raised over \$30,000 for the American Heart Assoc. Radiothon this past weekend. My t-shirt was auctioned right off my back, while I was on-the-air, to a listener in New Jersey for a \$150 donation to the Heart Assoc. Ron auctioned off a Genesis album cover, oddly enough autographed by Peter Dinklage, for \$110...Thanks to Michael Plen and IRS Records for our Renaissance promotion coinciding with the show at the Paladium March 6th. From all the album winners, we chose 2 people. Those 2 folks got a pair of Renaissance tickets, a Polaroid camera, and were taken backstage to get their pictures taken with Renaissance...And, if you haven't added the Gamma record yet, what are you waiting for? A shark to come up and bite you in the ass?...Adds: 'Death Wish II' soundtrack, the Carole King single, Moon Martin single, XTC domestic, Rick Springfield album, Jools Holland, Elton John single, Jeff Lorber Fusion and the Dregs."

KWXL, ALBUQUERQUE, NM P.D./M.D.-BILL STAMBAUGH: "My favorite song of the week has got to be the Godley/ Creme 'Snack Attack'. I'm sure in the hearts of all of us 10cc fans there lingers the hope that the boys would get back together for just one album...On the local concert scene, Gray Star appeared last week with Ruby Star and Michael Gray leading the group. Ruby's come a long way from her days with Black Oak and has an album on her own label with several good rock and roll songs on it. Needless to say her personal appearance was magnificent...Looking forward to a Doc Holliday and Hue Lewis concert later this month...In sales, no surprise with Joan Jett, the Go Go's, Geils, Loverboy and Sammy Hagar leading in the Top 5...UFO, Aldo Nova and Soft Cell make the best gains in sales this week...In the Top 20 sales, an album by a local group, the Phillisteens on RFA Records. We're playing two cuts from the album and it's great rock and roll from a local band. If anyone's interested in getting a copy, the number for RFA Records is 505-897-0770."

WTPA, HARRISBURG, PA P.D.-JEFF KAUFFMAN: "Adds: Rick Springfield and Scorpions...If the Scorpions didn't already exist, Central PA would have invented them!...Thanks to George and Stu from WB for the sneak preview of Asia. It's the music that will get us through the 80's!"

KKRQ, IOWA CITY, IA M.D.-TED BURTON JACOBSEN: "He was an original. We're going to miss John Belushi... Dregs kicks out the most natural rock and roll lyric. I'm surprised nobody came up with it before. With a good commercial edge this time around, 'Crank It Up' wallows in this week's Silver Sow Award... Computer rock takes control. Open the data files for the Human League. Early response already on 'Don't You Want Me'...Grab the gauze, you'll get a snake bite listening to the Scorpions 'No One Like You'...The Midwest leads the way on 4 Out Of 5 Doctors. A good commercial effort. Give it another spin...Adds: Dregs, Human League, Scorpions, Rolling Stones (re-add), 'Death Wish II' soundtrack, 'Christiane F', Rick Springfield."

WDHA, NORTH JERSEY, NJ G.M.-BOB LINDER: "Invitation--Everyone's welcome to come play at our big party on Wednesday, St. Patrick's Day. Musically, a tip of our hats go out to the featured Good Rats, it does matter that you're seen! Grand Prize trip to Ireland for the most outrageous wearing-of-the-green! Thanks to Valerie for the advance cassette...At the risk of overkill, I've got to shout out the new Asia is definitely going to be one of this year's best. Advance concert sales have been phenomenal, Heavy rotation as soon as it's officially released...According to an article in the latest issue of D.I.Y., WDHA is one of the Top 20 stations in the U.S. playing 'Modern Music', based on a compilation of station playlists over 1981 and the first part of '82. That's not to say that we play all new wave -- but WDHA is an alternative to big city tight playlists...New Music we're excited about this week: Moon Martin (with the return of 3-D movies we're ready for 'X-Ray Vision')...Scorpions: Mark's pretty enthusiastic about this but with only one copy no one else knows anything about it yet...Carole King is nice...We're giving Chubby Checker a roll...The Dregs album is enjoyable but 'Crank It Up' is the cut that's going to break this one...Elton John has gone back to his roots for 'Empty Gardens'--we're going with it for awhile but it's just not enough energy for sustained airplay...Jimmy Page on 'Death Wish II' is definitely a commodity the kids want to hear but again, I don't see long term action...We added another cut for airplay (Excited) from the new Rick Springfield in light airplay...We're giving some exposure to the 'SPOB'...Glad to hear the rumors of the Go Go's lead singer's death were just that, rumors. It's difficult enough accepting John Belushi's death. We all want our heroes to live forever, but alas, they're only mortal and in many cases even more vulnerable to extreme pressures...Thanks to Don Davis for the tour of DC 101--let me tell you, he has his hands full with Howard Sterns. The advantage a real personality like Howard can give to a station is definitely a hassle. But one block from the FCC takes courage. Speaking of the FCC, after 24 years of prodding AM stereos will finally exist in 60 days. It may take 5 to 10 years before an appreciable number of quality AM stereo receivers are out there but there may be more competition with music again returning to AM."

WRKI, BRIDGEPORT, CT M.D.-BRUCE GOLDSSEN: "Adds: 'Death Wish II' soundtrack, Rick Springfield, & Dregs. Ed ...Go Go's go-go to heavy...Testing: Utopia...Phone reaction continues on Soft Cell, Tommy Tutone and Aldo Nova...Like to get to the Duke Jupiter and Moon Martin as soon as there is some room... 'Death Wish II' is picking up interest from those who are into Jimmy Page. Programming that kind of soundtrack record is tough because it's so short lived...Was in Washington this past weekend for the college radio convention. Thanks to Larry Braverman for everything. Next time, can you get a room for two nights?...Thanks to Diana and Bart and everyone at my alma mater WXCJ for inviting me along. It's nice to get away for a breath of fresh ideas...Forgot to congratulate Elektra local guy Marty Markiewicz on his terrific success with the Fred Parrish medley he produced. It's a hit! Now, what Gamma record?...Gotta taste of the new Kim Wilde record when Howard Bernstein stopped by this afternoon. A little Blondie, Joan Jett, and maybe Howard says, the Go Go's. Definitely another different sounding album rock record...Today it's been snowing all day. The groundhog just looked outside and had a heart attack and I'm dreaming of the beach...Finally, let's all get together for one last toga party. John Belushi has gone off to that great 'animal house' in the sky!"

KLAQ, EL PASO, TX M.D.-ROB ROMAN: "Joan Jett has another great week, on Top of both sales and requests...Cars also showing sales resurgence following last week's concert, and Donnie Iris showing increased requests which have run the gamut from 'who's that', to 'that's weird, but great'...Arista gets both adds this week and I say 'crap' and that's being kind to the comments about the Dregs' vocals. Alex Ligertwood has an unusual voice which has stood out since his days with Brian Auger, Oblivion Express. This will help the Dregs, and time will back me up on that...The other whammy goes to Krokus. 'American Woman' is a very strong cover plus the production on this album will give these folks the success they deserve. Besides, they love to eat chocolate and bread together...Personal to Mike Bone: What do you mean Krokus will stop here twice? I heard it was a minimum of three times--you know, the beginning, the middle, the end...Looking at Riggs and Roger Daltrey plus a few others for next week."

WYMX, AUGUSTA, GA M.D.-MARY PILLINGER: "This month WYMX celebrates our 2nd anniversary of rocking in Augusta, affectionately known as 'disgusta' before rock 106 came on the scene. And the timing was perfect for our hometown musical wizards to release their state of the art album 'Industry Standard'. By now you should be cranking it up to the Dregs and what will be a standard on the album charts in the weeks to come...Jay Ferguson gives us his best versatile album to date. Practically every cut deserves airplay. For starters we're concentrating on 'Inside Out' and are looking at 'Tonight' and 'I Come Alive' on the more pop mainstream side; while 'White Noise' would be the catalyst on the heavy noise side. It'll all depend on which way the record takes off in our market...The Scorpions, 'No One Like You', really caught me by surprise. The breaks from scorching guitar to heart-rendering vocals will have the core rockers steaming...As for our journey into yesteryear and catch all upper demo record, you gotta go for Van Morrison and Simon and Garfunkel...The 'SPOB' is another music add. Live options, at least, on the Phil Collins (it's an acoustical orgasm)...A final note: We've moved our nightly marathon music meeting to Tuesday night so adds won't be ready until Wednesday which will give you an extra day to tell us what's hot, what should be hot, and what will be hot if we'd add it to our playlist."

WXUS, LAFAYETTE, IN M.D.-BOB MAJERSKY: "I feel Rick Springfield is about to become the male equivalent of the Pat Benatar. Not because of his production and musicianship but because of the style and material that he uses. We are already 5 cuts deep: 'Calling All Girls', 'American Girls', 'Christina', 'I Get Excited' and the single...Krokus does AC/DC style rock and roll better than AC/DC. Blazing guitar riffs and vocals impress themselves upon the listeners' mind on 'Long Stick Goes Boom'...If you ever wanted to say 'Crank It Up' on the radio, the record by the Dregs gives you this chance. They have hit upon the formula of becoming successful with the mass audience on 'Industry Standard'...The Scorpions have a real scorcher with 'No One Like You' which is already stinging the airwaves...And finally, Carole King 'One On One' gives you that personal touch with your upper demos...Adds: 'Death Wish II', Rick Springfield, Krokus, Dregs, Scorpions, and Carole King."

WDEK, DEKALB, IL M.D.-BRIAN LEONARD: "Adds: Weather Report, Dan Siegel, Red Rodney/Ira Sullivan, Jeff Loerber, Rick Springfield, Jools Holland, Roger Daltrey, Fay Ray, Third World...Singles: Stevie Wonder, Moon Martin...Hits: Jimmy Destri, Gordon Lightfoot, Van Morrison, Nick Lowe, Jean Luc Ponty, 'SPOB', Human League, Huey Lewis, Buggles, Bonnie Raitt, J. Geils, Poco, Al Di Meola, Quarterflash, Police, Larry Carlton...March 19th we're going ahead with our local video simulcasts. I'd like to thank everyone who has supported us thus far and if you have any videos that could help us out, it would be greatly appreciated."

RADIO ACTION CONTINUED

WWNV, CHARLOTTESVILLE, VA P.D.-JAY LOPEZ: "Our adds for the week: Rick Springfield, Roger Daltrey, Tommy Tutone, and we went one cut deeper on Chubby Checker's album with 'Harder Than Diamond'...We added another album, but it deserves far more than a mention. We all get loads of brown wrapped discs every day, and rare is the day when one goes straight to-the-box in hot rotation--immediately. Some might think the action a rash move, but considering the depth, feeling, and intensity of the 'Secret Policeman's Other Ball', that is not the case. An album of such fantastic quality and emotion deserves far more than mere thought. It demands action and acute airplay. For this reason, we have added every single cut to our hottest rotation. It is impossible to miss the seductively, powerful impact of Sting on 'Roxanne' and 'Message In The Bottle'. Never before has sincerity and musicianship been better portrayed than Jeff Beck and Eric Clapton on 'Could We End It As Lovers', 'Farther Up The Road', and 'Crossroads'. 'I Don't Like Monday's' by Bob Geldoff and Johnny Fingers is better than their original--and when Phil Collins sings 'In The Air Tonight' and 'The Roof Is Leaking' with heart and soul, the album becomes timeless. It's hard to believe that after all that, Donovan--Donovan of all people--follows it all with an unbelievable deliverance of 'Universal Soldier' and 'Catch The Wind'. To think these men should be on one album is unbelievable. 'The Secret Policeman's Other Ball' is simply and wholeheartedly an epitome of rare class and true performance. We thank Dave Kimmel for coming down to see us in Charlottesville, and we thank him for representing such an outstanding album."

WGIR-FM, MANCHESTER, NH M.D.-KAREN ANDERSEN: "Could 'Crimson And Clover' be the next 'I Love Rock And Roll'? If preliminary phone response is any indication, Joan Jett will continue to make the phones ring and her Lp will continue to rank among the best sellers here in New Hampshire for quite awhile. That makes two in a row for Joan...We're seeing phones for Huey Lewis, Tommy Tutone, and Prism. Top phone honors go to 'Freeze Frame', 'I Love Rock And Roll', and 'Take Off'...Our Top Selling Lps: Loverboy, J. Geils, Joan Jett, Bob And Doug, and the Police...We're also seeing sales pick up on S & G, Soft Cell and Huey Lewis...It took a couple of listens but now I love the Bonnie Raitt Lp. I want to put in a strong plug for her version of the old Eagles tune 'Baby Come Back'. Sounds like a hit record to me...On the Rick Springfield Lp I think I'll have to agree with last week's Easy Choice. Along with the two songs on the advance 12", I also like 'I Get Excited', (Jessie's Girl' Part 2), and 'How Do You Talk To Girls'."

KTYD, SANTA BARBARA, CA M.D.-SUSAN CHRISTOL: "Adds this week: 'SPOB', Utopia, Riggs, Fay Ray, and Simple Minds...You know music is top quality when it can stand alone, as in the case of Stings' acoustic rendition of 'Roxanne' and 'Message In A Bottle'. Phones preceded the add on this one... 'Swing To The Right' is a monument to Todd Rundgren's highly crafted production skills...Once I got the courage to take the Riggs Lp out of its jacket, I was pleasantly surprised to find a mixture of textures from acoustic ballads ala Led Zeppelin to hard driving heavy metal. We started out on 'One Night Affair' and 'Ready Or Not'. But, who thinks up these album jackets anyway?...On the home front, Santa Babylon was visited by our country's fearless leader this week and the National press were duly entertained by our Ronald Reagan station IDS. The question remains: Are we Reagan Country, or are we Reggae Country?"

FMOB JUST TAPED his 27th and 28th music specials with MERV GRIFFIN. They'll be seen this week. Show 1 features: GORDON LIGHTFOOT (Who was great. He did 2 songs from his Lp plus a medley of hits); BONNIE RAITT (She and her band "burned the sucker right-down-to-the-ground"); SISTER SLEDGE doing "My Guy".....Show 2 features: RICK SPRINGFIELD doing his new Lp. MERV and KAL's interview with RICK will melt your heart. His fans will surely weep. Wait till you see it!; CHILLIWACK (like RICK and BONNIE, they play live. Smokin'! They do both hits); SHEENA EASTON (Beautiful and fluent); BERTIE HIGGINS sings "Key Largo"...The national air dates are: Show 1 on Friday, March 19th...Show 2 on Tuesday, March 23rd (Show 2 will be seen in Phila. over WPVI-TV, Channel 6 on Monday, March 22nd).

Question Of The Week

As noted by Leo in his answer, it seems that a lot more artists are mixing it up with radio-types. Sooner or later, it gets around to "What do you think of the record" or "How is my album doing on the air?" So this week, we asked our reporters, in that situation do you come across with constructive criticism, change the subject, clear your throat, or what?! Also we asked respondents for a rundown of what artists they felt were most adept at radio interaction and self-promotion.

LIN BREHMER, WQBK: "A great deal of the time, if the album isn't doing very well at all, or we're not playing the album, we probably aren't going to be too interested in having the artist up to the station. Other than that, I don't think I rub anything in the artist's faces. I generally am very positive towards them when they are on the air. I'm a nice guy."

TERRY MEINERS, WLRS: "I like to think I'm a pretty good goodwill ambassador, and I hate to admit it, but I do bullshit people on occasion, as some of you may know. I have a hard time telling somebody their record blows. I always stick by the old expression, if you ain't got nothin' nice to say, don't say anything at all."

MICHELE ROBINSON SAYRE, KL0L: No, I do not. I don't feel that it's my job to tell them how to make a record, how to make changes in it so that it will have more appeal. My interest is only in telling them positive things about a record, and if I have nothing good to say about something, then I'll avoid that part of the conversation at all costs..Specifically, I had Grace Slick call me shortly after the 'Wrecking Ball' album came out. She was aware our station wasn't playing it and wanted to know why. I sort of did a dance around the reason, saying that I was waiting to see more happen on it, and it was really too early for a station like ours. Part of that is true, because we do wait a while in terms of new adds. We're very rarely out-of-the-box on anything. Part of it was that I just didn't feel it was my job to be her A&R person. If I don't like the record because I think she's doing an imitation of Ted Nugent, then that's my own personal opinion, and I don't think that I feel like sharing that information with her, even though she was curious to know."

J. DAVID HOLMES, KDKB: "I would be as cordial as possible about it if I didn't feel the record was really happening for us. But I would try to explain to him what I thought possibly the problems were with the market or maybe the positioning of our radio station. It may not be that his record is not good, but is just not right for us at the moment."

CHUCK HOLLOWAY, WKZL: "We're on the level with anyone. The record is happening if the artist visits the station. Often times, it's in conjunction with a concert appearance in the area, so it's usually a major act. We will also try to be candid about things that might be improved or if the record is in trouble...Usually those artists with the best track are easier to deal with. Artists like the Doobie Brothers or The Who are easy to reach. Sometimes it's the newer acts who are a little more inaccessible and Rush comes to mind here."

TED EDWARDS, WCOZ: "When an artist comes to visit, we approach him like we would any other human being. If they're an accessible honest person, we'll approach him in an accessible, honest way. If they're a hothead, we treat them like a hothead. Just like any situation, you have to deal with it and that person as an individual...The best person that I've ever had to spend any time with was Charlie Daniels."

BOB MAJERSKY, WXUS: "Very rarely do artists come to the station, but when they do, I like to turn over the station to them and they can do what they want. The audience seems to respond real well to this."

ILYSE GOTTLIEB, WRXL: "To avoid any embarrassment, I usually tell the label people not to bring somebody by if we're not even considering the record. If it's somebody that we are considering, sometimes the visit is real helpful. We've cut back considerably on on-air interviews, because of their limited appeal. But we appreciate having the opportunity to meet the artist and put them in the production studio for a few minutes...Ted Nugent, David Lee Roth, any one of the surviving Beatles, Foreigner, Journey, or REO make for good interviews. I would rather they take over the radio station and get absolutely insane, then have a dj who is semi-familiar with their material try to pull off a decent interview."

TOM NAST, WSYR: "I try and be as honest as possible. But on the same level, if a group or an artist's record isn't doing anything, I'm not gonna tell him it's a stiff, but I'm also not gonna say it's the greatest. If I'm gonna have an artist on the air, the record is gonna be in good shape so I'm not lying. There's some criteria for having an artist on the air...Best interviewees: Benny Mardones, Michael Levine from Triumph, Bryan Adams, Peter Wolf, and Rusty Burns of Point Blank."

THE DOCTOR, WYFE: "When an artist comes to our station, we're always very honest with them. We don't try to hide anything and hopefully the artist doesn't either. We tell them what's happening with their record in our area if it's doing well or not doing well...Top 5 that we have had here are Ozzy Osbourne, Craig Chaquico from Starship, Greg Kihn, Survivor (the entire band), and one of the best interviews was with Ann Wilson from Heart."

ART PHILLIPS, KILO: "New and developing artists seem more willing to talk frankly on the radio and are more appreciative of your attention, so we prefer to do new artists. We prefer established artists like Jon Anderson or Rick Nielsen to do guest dj stints. It's more entertaining for the audience. If the record isn't doing well, the labels don't bring them down."

JOSE DIAZ, WBLM: "We've really never had a situation when we've been playing the record and the artist visits. The case is when we do well with a record, the artist visits the station...The most memorable has to be about 3 years ago, Alvin Lee came and he took over the airwaves, not in an overbearing sort of way, but in a very creative and informative fashion. He put together one hell of a radio show--picking a lot of songs that we had forgotten we had in the library...Top 5 artists: It's really hard to pick a top 5, but they would be Donnie Iris, Point Blank, Foghat, Ozzy Osbourne, and Alvin Lee. The Ozzy Osbourne interview was actually his own interview. He was asked how he got the scream off at the beginning of 'Crazy Train', and then, in a very cool, calm, collected fashion, he answered he had his balls put in a vice grip!"

DICK BASCOM, WQXM: "First of all, if an artist were to come to the station and ask me honestly about their album, I would be very honest and give what solutions I might have to them. The best anecdote is when the Scorpions visited me in Binghamton. They saw the American album cover for 'Love Drives', and asked me on the air what happened to the cover with the tits! The preceding answer should answer the next question. We try to avoid on-air live interview from now on, although we are not adverse to taping the interview for future on-air use."

BILL SIMMONS, WMYK: "We generally try to be very straight with them about how their record is performing. I feel that if they're going to be in this business, they're going to be more interested in the fact of how they can improve their product rather than being told how great they are."

DAVE LOGAN, WLAV-FM: "I love having artists come by the station because it's still a thrill for me. I always go out of my way to give them a fair and accurate assessment of their album in the market. Oddly enough, most of them shrug it off as if they are not really interested. I've had numerous humorous experiences during these visits, but the one I like best was the time Jerry Smallwood brought Melissa Manchester by the Loop. Jerry brought her in the studio while I was on the air, and tongue in cheek suggested, 'Why don't you play one of Melissa's album cuts?' To her credit, she winked at me and said, 'Don't bother. It's during the book, you know.'"

STEW SCHANTZ, WPDH: "As far as interviewing artists on the air, obviously it has to be someone we're playing. Frequently, it's to support a local club who's featuring the act. It's positive in two senses. First, it's good for the station's relationship with the club, and secondly, it's good exposure for the artist. The best person I've interviewed, and the funniest, is Robin Lane of Robin Lane and the Chartbusters. She spent more of the interview going through the albums in the library than she did on the air. It's good to play not only the artist, but some of the music the artist is influenced by. And make as much out of the interview as you can."

DANE VENABLE, WRAS: "We always welcome anybody who comes to town. A lot of times it's difficult when you're not playing their record, however, I will be honest with them if the record is not working in our market. If they ask why the record isn't working, I basically try to explain to them what our target audience enjoys. The best interview I've ever had was with Steve Marriott of Humble Pie who could barely walk in the radio station, much less be coherent. However, it ended up being one of the funniest interviews I've ever done with Steve, making slurs about blacks, Jews, and his wife's boobs. He ended it all by setting some of our program logs on fire. Even Ozzy Osbourne couldn't top that one."

BUCK MCWILLIAMS, WIOT: "When an artist comes to the station, it shows me that he's willing to go out and pound the streets to work the product. That shows me commitment on his part. Still, I'll handle his visit the way I would anyone's with an honest opinion and an honest outlook. If his record's doing poorly, I'll be on the level and try and pinpoint a solution. Either way, I greatly respect the effort. Artists who I do not care to talk to are those that are stoned (at least not on the air). They've proven in the past to be a huge mistake. For instance, trying to interview Ian Hunter was like squeezing juice from government processed cheese, and the interview was just as sour. Then there was Ozzy. Our first question to him was, 'Where are you calling from?' His reply was, 'I don't fuckin' know.'"

QUESTION CONTINUED

JON RUSSELL, KRQR: "It's not for me to tell an artist how to make his music, but if he asks...Best: Greg Kihn, Sammy Hagar, Ronnie Montrose."

DAVE BENSON, WMET: "I always try to be gentle with virgins...If it seems that the artist has a very realistic view of the business, I'll tell them exactly what's going on. If not, I tend to try to soften the blow...Best: Peter Wolf, Bob Welch (has a very realistic view of how it (radio) works), Mike Levine and the guys in Triumph."

ED LEVINE, WAQX: "If I don't believe in an artist or the album, they're not gonna be at my radio station to begin with! If the album is doing well, I'll be more than happy to show them. I like introducing bands as much as anybody. If the album is stagnating or worse (for instance I can't stand it) I have been known on occasion to mention it to them. Generally, I wait for them to ask rather than volunteer the information. If they ask, I give it to them very sugarcoated but very honestly!"

BOB BITTENS, WHCN: "I hate having to listen to something for the first time in front of an artist. 'Resent' would be a better word than 'hate' because I don't like to be put on-the-spot...Generally, I try to say positive things about the music, and minimize the fact that sales or calls are lacking. I should not be put in the position of giving the bad news to the artist...Most impressed with Bob And Doug (did a great job promoting their record)."

DAVID FILIPOV, WBRU: "We have a general principle where we, for the sake of not embarrassing us or the artist, don't usually have visits from someone we're not playing. Say if AC/DC came by and we weren't playing their record, it would be sort of silly to have an interview with them."

BRUCE BOND, WZZO: "We don't even get the artist in if we're not playing the record!"

JIM KINNEY, WTUE: "I personally try to come as close to the truth as possible without hindering whatever momentum they might have. The reason being, because as truthful as we have to be as programmers, in reality, anybody who makes an album and goes out and tours for it is just a normal human being who's trying to do the best he can. So, there is really no sense in telling him that the record is failing, if it is. I usually tell the record company the truth about that."

ROBERTA HABER, WMJQ: "I usually A&R the record, give them what I feel is legitimate constructive criticism. They can take that opinion and do what they want with it...They usually ask me what I think, so I'll tell them the truth but I don't see the need to tell them that their album is fading into oblivion...I was really impressed with Rick Springfield. He called twice when 'Working Class Dog' was out when I was at a small market station, and I remembered."

JOE MacCABE, KYYS: "If the artist can communicate, I'll tell 'em. I preface it with a line like, 'of course you can write a song a lot better than I can, but for what it's worth, here's my opinion'. I've done that a few times and some like it, some don't. Most of them seem genuinely interested in feedback--pros and cons. The only real negative I ever got was from Ian Anderson, who just looked at me. Best: Mike Levine, Sammy Hagar, anybody from REO, Quarterflash, Pat Benatar (surprisingly accessible)."

DAVE LANGE, WDVE: "I like to try and tactfully explain the situation to them, but I think that if they listen to enough of this stuff, they come out with turntable records for radio that are too often contrary to their creativity. It probably stifles them to listen to radio comments. Perhaps there is so much criticism that they end up shooting for lowest common denominator...Best: Probably Charlie Daniels, Styx."

JOE BONADONNA, WMMR: "I'd rather tell the truth because if you start flinging the bull around, it will usually wind up back in your lap...If the artist seems to be open, then you say something--if they ask, I tell them...Billy Squier is the most easy going to work with, Joan Jett is in that class too, and Southside Johnny is a long time friend of the station."

ROB LIPSHUTZ, WHJY: "It all depends on how big the artist is, and I'm talking height! Actually, rarely get a chance to talk to artists. Usually, if I do get the chance it's with performers with whom we do not have any trouble at all...The worst was Johnny Lydon (Rotten). I recorded an ad from him once and it's a good thing I removed everything that wasn't nailed down in the studio! At the end of his remarks he stormed out of the studio and said 'I hope somebody dies because of this'...Best: I've had enjoyable times with David Johansen and Greg Kihn."

MIKE WOLF, WQFM: "I always check with the record rep who is bringing the artist around the station the day before to check out such things. A lot of artists are sensitive to criticism but then there are others that just want to improve themselves and get big, and they respect the opinions of people in radio...Van McClain of Shooting Star would have to be at the top of my list, Mike Levine of Triumph, Steve Perry of Journey, and Bob Welch."

KID LEO, WMSM: "They don't want no song and dance so I give it to them straight. You don't have to be cruel about it but honesty is the best policy and that's why we have made so many friends with artists who remember...Over the years I have become very close to Peter Wolf, Ian Hunter, Bryan Ferry, and Southside Johnny (in his case I think it was just charity) and a few others as well. One interesting thing I have seen lately is more people taking the approach that Mike Levine and the entire Triumph organization use--that is to actually go out, and actively relate to radio. It seems that over the past several years a lot of the new bands from the 'new wave' ilk have been very careful to not talk to radio or press and to remain aloof but in the recent weeks I've seen a swing back to closing the distance with radio ala Paul Collins and Johnny & The Distractions."

ALAN SNEED, KSRR: "If specific questions are asked by the artist, I'll attempt to give them an honest answer, otherwise, mums the word...Journey is #1 no question about it, Sammy Hagar, Rick Springfield, Quarterflash, Stevie Nicks, Tommy Tutone and Mike Levine."

RALPH TORTORA, WBAB : "To be quite frank, and to try not to be too cliché-ish, honesty is really the best policy. Just recently Susan Lynch came to visit us. We weren't playing her record and I explained to her that we just didn't have the room for it. She didn't seem to respond hostilely. She was understanding, and I would assume most artists are understanding, especially with radio, the way it is today. Besides, usually they can tell when you are lying."

JUDY MCNUTT, KGB-FM: "I think I probably would try and handle an artist the same way I would handle any person I had constructive criticism for. My guiding words are consideration, tact, and professionalism. Honesty is a good word too. I assume that a record person would not bring in a terribly sensitive artist and expose them to god knows what. You never know what the public is going to say...I like the artist who really seems to know what's going on in radio. They make it their business to find out. They read the trades and they know who they are talking to on the phone...For instance: Mal and Val--not big artists, but they behave like they are, Billy Thorpe does too, and Taxi--the best self-promoted band I know of, and Rick Springfield (at least while the last album was out)."

QUESTION CONTINUED

STEVE FEINSTEIN, WYSP: "I try to establish a rapport before giving any kind of constructive criticism in order that I can develop some sort of credibility with them. You establish a common ground and at least a little bit of mutual respect. Before you can be 'painfully honest' with someone, you've got to determine whether you have any common sensibilities. If that's the case, the criticism will be received much more graciously. By the same token, before anyone gives me advice on my radio station, I'd like to develop a rapport with them...The most pleasant experience I've had in dealing with an artist was with Jon Anderson who was completely unpretentious and remarkably so, for someone of that stature. It's no coincidence that he also dealt with the fans who waited outside the studio to meet him in a very gracious and gentle fashion."

DAVE KANE, KCMF: "A little white lie never hurt anybody. I mean, you don't want to piss them off or anything."

BOB LINDER, WDHA: "Yes. We really appreciated hearing from Tim Goodman. That man's got determination. Sorry we couldn't add the album. We told him it wasn't an immediate possibility."

JANEL DOLAN, KZEW: "If they ask me I try to put it in a diplomatic way. I don't want to lie. I don't think that does the artist, the label, or the station any good. It's good to keep lines of communication open between the artist and the station and maintain a feeling of good will for future projects, if not the current one. Pat Travers, Tommy Tutone, Robin Trower, Rick Springfield and Triumph are all very good with radio."

KAREN ANDERSEN, WGIR-FM: "That depends on the artist. Some artist's egos are so big they believe they cannot do any wrong, but I think if one has a sincere desire to work with people, then I think it's pretty easy to be open and candid with someone about his or her product...Charlie Daniels is real good at working radio. He's all over the place. He would have to be the most friendly and down to earth guy."

CURT GARY, WEBN: "When an artist visits WEBN, 9 times out of 10 his record is already being played. But if we're not, and we're pressured to give a reason for not playing it, I imagine we'd try to break the truth to them easy, being careful to avoid personal preferences in our reasoning. The last Van Halen tour exhibited the most scripted artist visit in history. They spent more time rehearsing their radio visits than they did their show."

MIKE LYONS, WDIZ: "Always, just ask Steve Miller or Greg Allman, who never send me flowers. Someone's got to tell them. However, diplomacy is helpful and they do have to be coherent when you talk to them. Kevin Cronin is one of the best, also Mike Levine and Phil Collins."

RON REGER, WNOR: "It all depends on the artist themselves. I think it's the hardest thing I have to do to tell anyone (from local artist to big name), what honestly might be wrong commercially with their product from my point of view. That is something their managers should do. If at all possible, I will try to not answer the question. It's a great opportunity to start talking about the weather...The only comfortable call I've ever had was Rick Springfield. Otherwise, it's a very unnatural situation."

DOUG PODELL, KQRS: "I lie so they don't feel bad. It's that simple. Mark Pernau always told me, when in doubt or bored, always lie...Tommy Tutone is real receptive. Also the Go Go's. Of recent, those would be the two best."

DOUG CLIFTON, KAZY: "Normally we do tell the truth. Johnny was up the other day. He's out really trying to meet people and get some exposure. I have a lot of respect for someone who's out there working that hard. There's not too many times that I meet someone whose music I can honestly say I don't like...Ozzy Osbourne is a strange interview. All in all, you're going to try to be as positive as possible. One of the best that I had is Greg Kihn."

TOM STARR, WOUR: "It all depends on the artist's attitude. If it's someone who we don't play or anticipate playing, I generally advise the record company against coming to our station. If it's somebody we are playing, we're always happy to have them come by and discuss any aspect of the record they feel like talking about, including what we perceive as its strongest points and cuts, and from a radio perspective, its weaker points and cuts."

NORM PATTIZ, WESTWOOD ONE: "In light of the tragic passing of John Belushi and the sincere affection and interest in John shown by all rock fans, we are offering to our affiliates, free of charge, a one hour program, entitled 'A Tribute To John Belushi'. It will contain interview material with John, Dan Akyroyd, Gilda Radner and others, plus segments from many of John's well-know projects. We're offering them to any of our affiliates who request the program. Again, the program is free and contains no national commercials. I'd like to congratulate the Go Go's on the #1 position on the Billboard charts this week. We'll be repeating the exclusive concert that we did with the Go Go's last December, very soon. As is obvious, we're getting the fastest moving concert acts and we're getting them first. Obviously, we are very pleased about that. On the concert scene, look in the near future for some interesting news about Westwood One & Westar I, but we'll leave that for a later report...That's 30 from Beverly Hills."

JAY GOLDMAN, CLAYTON WEBSTER CORP.: "Rolling Stone Magazine Rock Review, the random notes of the air, offers two 90 second programs per day, five days per week. This week featuring interviews with Henry Small of Prism, Rick Offick of the Cars, Brian Johnson of AC/DC, Sting from the Police, Clarence Clemmons, and Bob & Doug McKenzie. (Jon: You'll like this rap, cause it's a record I'm not working, er, at least not quite yet anyway). I swear, this is one of the greats. Tremendous music, musicianship, groove, beat, sound, etc., etc., etc. This record will bring Toto all the way back and sling-shot them into the future... Thanks to everyone on the Paul Collins' bus. This is one of those records that continues to grow week after week. Hope you're all getting a chance to meet this fine songwriter and his ace guitar player Larry Whitman on their journey (at 4 million units, I like to get that word in whenever I can) across sountry. Larry is also responsible for a lot of the Susan Lynch Lp...Speaking of Susan, I hope you're proud of me, Heiss. This is three weeks in a row! (Susan: 'You bet I am!')...On to other beauties. (Susan: 'How kind!') Hope you're all getting a chance to get into the new Karla Bonoff. 'Personally' promises to be a big single. Again, also check 'Please Be The One', 'Don't Wanna Miss Ya', and 'Wild Heart Of The Young'. Perfect for those female demos and lyrically hip enough to keep those 18 year old boys glued to the radio...Had a great road trip about two weeks back. Met some new folks and saw some old friends. I'll spare you my day by day antics, but I wanted to especially say Hi to Rick Balis and John Ulett, two of the greatest radio guys ever plugged into the airwaves. In the age when you meetway too many eight balls in this business, you two are quite refreshing. Thanks!...Also a tip of the hat to Gene 'the music machine' Denonovich for one of the best excursions ever...The Tommy Tutone story continues with even more craziness. No sooner does Leo and the G-Man add '867-5309' when a mad dog husband shows up at our Cleveland branch office! I mean, we've had our experiences with this record, believe me, but no one has been flipped out enough to physically come down to the record company! I guess they've got real moxie in Cleveland, or something...If you haven't yet, get into 'Try Jah Love' off the Third World Lp. This band is sensational. They are coming to NY and LA at the end of this month and must be seen. Call me or Mac for tickets...Congrats to the Grand Martine. You've found yourself a great home, buddy."

DREW MURRAY, POLYGRAM (213-277-1412): "Thanks to all for your support of the Scorpions Lp. Between 'No One Like You' and Krokus 'Long Stick Goes Boom', the Germans will be owning your airwaves--just like they own our company. Just don't ask for a raise...Speaking of Krokus, Mike Bone, please send this poor ole Southern boy a Dregs Lp. So what if I was late on Mike Green?...On your desk now: The Jam, with an album that I won't say is their most accessible to date, but rather an album that deserves to be heard. With the success of records like Soft Cell, Human League, etc., the combination of radio's gradual receptiveness to 'new/progressive' bands along with the music on 'The Gift'--the Jam's time has come. I will say that the Jam Lp is good enough to allow Dr. Double J. more time because he hasn't had to send you scathing memos about it...Also on your desk now: Welcome back, J. J. Cale. Play 'One Step Ahead Of The Blues', before Eric Clapton does...Notes on driving from Houston to LA: Thanks to Arin Michaels and Dave Mariano (converts to 'more-zep-ya-fukker-dom') for taking time out to say hello. Also, I-10 between San Antonio and El Paso will give you a good idea what the world will look like after Ronnie and Leonid push the button. BORING! I did however, pick up WYNF for about 20 minutes just outside Fort Stockton. Nice signal jump, guys...And finally, what the fuck is 'The Thing'?"

BETH ROSENGARD, INDEPENDENT (213-462-4204): "Two points of interest regarding Carmine Appice: First, the cut 'Be My Baby' has been remixed, and will be released as a single at the end of the month. The remix is incredible--hot vocals and guitar--so watch for the 7" record coming soon. Secondly, the American tour starts next week, and, after hearing rave reports about the current Japanese dates, I can't wait to see the band in LA...I am amazed and aggravated at the number of people who have not yet listened to The Innocents. Considering the mass exposure resulting from their network TV special, and the consequent curiosity calls in quite a few markets, I would think at least one listen was mandatory. Hey, maybe you will like The Innocents and maybe you won't, but, if you never listen, how will you know? Meanwhile, look for the band on tour with Rick Springfield in some markets, and Tommy Tutone in others...If you missed The Blasters on 'Fridays' a few weeks back, hopefully you caught them on 'American Bandstand' this weekend. And if you're wondering why you received a Blasters single in a Warner Brothers package, it's because the band has just signed a distribution deal with the Burbank Bunny, and you'll have a reserve on the Lp before too long. P.S. #6 sales on the Blasters in San Diego where KPRI and, as of last week, KGB-FM are wailing on the album...Aldo Nova is now top 10 on the airplay charts, and moving steadily up the sales charts. There's no stopping this one!...Good first week Top 40 action on the new Eddie Schwartz single, 'Over The Line'. Keep your eyes and ears on this record, it's going to be big...I listened to the Dregs' 12" last night, and while I really liked 'Crank It Up', I loved 'Bloodsucking Leeches' (what a title!)...And, if you haven't heard Girlschool yet, you're in for a treat--metal by women who can rock and roll with the best!"

MIKE BONE, ARISTA (212-489-7400): "The Dregs' album has detonated. Can you say mass hit? Fifty-four adds last week, and another 47 so far this week. 'Crank It Up' has proved to be so successful that the Dregs are working on their follow-up to be called 'Yank My Crank'. Should be strong...The G.P.Ep 'Temporary Beauty' continues to build with impressive adds like KDKB. The album, 'Another Grey Area', is rave reviewed in the next issue of Rolling Stone, the one with Warren Beatty on the cover. The Top 40 action on 'Temporary Beauty' is beginning with KEGL (Drake: You're late again!!) and WBOS in Boston. Graham told me 'Temporary Beauty' is the best song he has ever written (and that boy has written some boss songs). If you are a Graham Parker fan, you owe it to yourself and your audience to play this song. It's like a fungus that grows on you. Play it ten times on the air and I guarantee response. The WMMR play has sold Bill Hard, and he's a tough sell...The piss poor shipping of the Krokus Ep is rivalled this week only by the incoming phone service at FMQB. Only 1 out of 5 people I spoke with had the Ep by Wednesday, and we still managed to crank in mondo majors like WEBN, KYYS, KQRS (Podell: Did you get my message? I freaked the receptionist out), and many other majors. Next week tonnage on Krokus. The Ep 'Long Stick Goes Boom' is a rock classic. If you can't hear it as a hit, call me, and I'll send your deaf certificate out immediately. The 'One Vice At A Time' Lp will be there on March 22nd and the Krokus tour starts April 9th. Jaffe's crew better not miss a step, cause Swiss Bliss is on their ass (Drew: The album's in the mail, don't be late on this one)...THE SECOND BRITISH INVASION: Realizing fully that if most P.D.'s taste were converted into gasoline, there wouldn't be enough to start a pissant's motorscooter, it is with mixed feeling that I announce the second British invasion, four acts coming on Arista. We have signed the hottest British acts out today. #1: Haircut One Hundred's album 'Pelican West' debuted in the British charts at #6. The sales on this album are explosive. The single 'Love Plus One' will be a huge hit in America. (Richard Palmese said it, you know it's got to be the truth). #2: The Thompson Twins. 'In The Name Of Love' Ep ships to you this week. Rhythm as infectious as influenza. This is a Bone-i-fide hit. #3: Buck McWilliams has been raving about A Flock Of Seagulls. The word is spreading, and we will ship an Ep of 'Space Age Love Song' and 'I Ran' on March 31st. This act is going to be huge in America. Will break AOR first. #4: Arista also just signed Pete... well, I'll fill you in on this later, or call Michael Plen and he will have the import on the air before you can say Go Go...Personals: Gloria: How's your tan?...Jimmy Mack: What's this about jock strap night at Fort Dix? JIMMY MACK, STIFF RECORDS (212-431-1600): "So this is radio promo. Well kids, it's even better than Mike Bone would have you believe. I'd especially like to thank all the little people in radio--the pygmies, dwarves, and mutants who have made my transition from serving drinks to servicing stations so damn unpleasant. It's heartwarming to have so many music directors bend over backwards to have their asses kissed. Well, in keeping with our Stiff tradition, bend over and we'll drive you home... In much the same manner, we intend to drive home Girlschool (segue! segue!). If you ask me, the cut is the title, 'Hit And Run'. If you ask Gloria Johnson at KGON, 'The Hunter' makes your heart beat faster (thanks Lena Horne). Oedipus at WBCN will use your toes for a pincushion if you don't use 'Take It All Away'. Christol at KTYD would add 'Race With The Devil' and 'Yeah Right' to that rundown. What's a mother to do? Is it soup yet? Am I having fun? All four ladies from Girlschool should be showing up in your town for a random reality check come April, so be sure to have plenty of crazy foam on hand...Lastly, finally, to end with--Thanks to Bill and George and Susan and Sharon and Judy for the grand tour of the orifice. I'll move my stuff in this weekend. (P.S. Industry Secret: Kal Rudman takes all his singles out of their sleeves and stacks them on top of each other! No respect!)."

HARRIET BELLUSH, STARFLEET BLAIR, (617-262-0220): "All of us at Starfleet Blair are excited about our new relationship with NBC's 'Source' network. They're a great bunch of people who share our love for radio and live programming. We're also pleased to be back in production, and are announcing our first - with the 'Source' - live-as-it-happens concert--OZZY OSBOURNE, the Madman himself, as he performs at the Providence Civic Center in Rhode Island on April 6th! 'Source' stations can expect to be hearing soon from George Taylor Morris, Andy Denmark and Frank Cody with more details so you all can be there LIVE on satellite with us. We'll be announcing more live concert events as well as some innovative new programming concepts shortly. This is the beginning of a new era for Starfleet and it seems to be right in time for a rebirth of radio in general...Instead of all competing with each other, we are starting to pool resources with people in many facets of program production in order to impact radio, rather than merely react. In this way, we can generate excitement and create music events, and not just 'safely' ride the coattails of what already is around. This is a time of expansion and reawakening of talent--are you ready?"

KATE INGRAM, DB RECORDS (415-928-6952): "Fortunately there exists in the Bay Area an extremely supportive musical community. This is most evident every year when the Bammies are held to award Bay area talent, and to honor the poeple who have made headway over the previous year. This event has grown from an industry-only crowd to this year's Civic Center Auditorium crowd of around 5,000 including many from the public at large. It's quite an extravaganza as there's a full orchestra who perform as well as the likes of Greg Kihn, the Doobie Brothers, Tubes, and the Jefferson Starship. Last week the entire event was broadcast on KMEL. One of the more humorous interviews was with Deborah Iyall of Romeo Void who won two awards. During the interview with Tony Kilbert she said, 'Maybe one day our records will get played on KMEL', and well they should!"

MICHAEL ABRAMSON, MICHAEL ABRAMSON PROMOTIONS (212-243-2972): "Well, here we are again, faced with that proverbial question of 'How do we break new acts'? There are so many new groups on the scene, and with only a limited amount of space on play lists, how do you break a group with only light airplay? Seems a bit elementary to me, my dear Watson. It's time again to play fewer new acts and concentrate more on the acts you have added. We will all suffer equitably, but in the long run, new groups will be established and hopefully everyone will win...Now---Let's talk about some of those newer groups deserving airplay. X-15 has been causing some reaction east of the Mississippi, but we need that midwest and west coast exposure. C'mon guys, X-15 is good solid rock and roll and needs your ears and a spot on your playlist. Try 'Danger Zone', 'Gimme Your Love' and 'Jennifer'...How about Lou Ann Barton? She exemplifies that mid-60's funk sound that producer Jerry Wexler has always been so adept at. And when coupled with the Glenn Frey production touch of the 80's, you've got a knock-out piece of product. Give a listen to 'I'm Old Enough', 'Brand New Lover' and 'Stop These Teardrops'...Last but not least, I can't believe you programmers are having so much difficulty in hearing Fay Ray. Well, maybe I can. It seems that when anything breaks form or tradition, it scares the shit out of everyone. Fay Ray is no exception. This group is a bit different - the kind of different that you'll end up going back and kicking yourself in the butt for not hearing initially. So, before you kick yourself black and blue, check out 'Modern Lovers', 'Waiting For The Heatwave', 'Family Affairs' and 'Clean Lines'...Music from the 'Rocker Doctor'--the 'SPOB', Jeff Beck/Eric Clapton/Phil Collins tunes are devastating...Try 'Tainted Love' from Soft Cell--it's a bitch...Congrats to Paul and all Columbia promo reps on the Tommy Tutone song 'Jenny/867-5309'--a job well done on a super song...Don't overlook Duke Jupiter's 'I'll Drink To You'--what a record...Till next week."

KEN BENSON, EMI (800-421-4155): "With the world about to end because of the Jupiter Effect, I propose 'Bad Moon Rising' be the theme song of the day...As for last week's Question, the part I like best about the FMQB is the opportunity it affords us to communicate with each other. It's also a lot cheaper than conventions...On with the tunes. Twilley's got a record and he don't mind. A major album Index move of 33-26 with 'Somebody To Love' making a more impressive move on the Song Index from 42-28. The boy does ID's also so give me a call...Geils grows even stronger with 'Freeze Frame' going to the top of the pop charts while even more album stations are getting on 'Rage In A Cage' and 'Flame-thrower'. The band from Boston continues to destroy the world on tour...New on your desk is Kim Wilde and David Lasley. Kim is from England. She's 21 years old, looks like Bridge Bardot, and sounds like a cross between Pat Benatar, the Go Go's and Blondie. (What's he talking about?) 'Kids In America' and 'Checkered Love' have both been top 3 singles, and sales on the album worldwide are in excess of 2 million...Imagine a cross between Eddie Kendricks and Rickie Lee Jones, and you come up with David Lasley. 'On Third Street' and 'Treat Willie Good' are standouts. You'll also find a touch of Steely Dan on 'Take The Money And Run'...I've got to run myself right now so I can go watch my house sink into the sea."

RECORD ACTION CONTINUED

MIKE COOPER ON IMPORTS, (404-627-2834/355-8686): "Glad to see domestic releases of The Jam and Pete Shelley imminent. The Jam's 'Town Called Malice' single reached #1 on the British charts on its first week of release, aided by the fact the group put a studio version on the 7" and a live version (and a much better one) on the 12". The single and album are heavily Motown influenced, and show a change from previous Lps...Pete Shelley, meanwhile, is having chart success in Australia with the title track to the 'Homo Sapien' Lp, though I personally believe that 'Yesterday's Not Here No More' is a much stronger track for airplay...There seems to be an even larger number of singles out in Britain that are unreleased here than usual. Female singer Toni Basil has the #2 single with 'Mickey', a fairly exciting, slickly executed new-wavish tune...Haircut 100 stay in the Top 5 with 'Love Plus One', a pleasant tune that isn't lastingly memorable, but sounds good on the radio...The Stranglers' 'Golden Brown', previously mentioned here, really reminds me of Renaissance, and the rest of the album 'La Folie' is far more civilized than you might expect from a group who had such a bad reputation. The entire Lp merits attention...Also on the upper portions of the UK charts: 'Deutsche Girls', an early Adam And The Ants track; 'Go Wild In The Country' from Bow Wow Wow; 'Senses Working Overtime' an absolutely great track from XTC; 'Stars On Stevie', a Stevie Wonder medley from the Stars on 45 people who are called Star Sound in England; 'Some Guys Have All The Luck' from Robert Palmer, which sounds heavily Todd Rundgren influenced, though not to the record's detriment; and 'I Won't Close My Eyes' from British reggae band UB40 which is unfortunately fairly slow and uninteresting...Also out in the UK and moving up the charts are Gary Numan's single mentioned here in January on the basis of rough mix, 'Hollywood' from Thin Lizzy, and 'Seven And Seven Is' done live by Alice Cooper...Elsewhere in the world, U2's 'October' album has just been released in Australia, Soft Cell's 'Tainted Love' remains #1 on the Canadian single charts, and Dutch band, The Meteors, have a Bowie-ish album called 'Hunger'...Back in the US, UB40 have a newer single 'Politician', which is a bit more up to their standards, and Jona Lewie's second Lp, four years after his first, is another charming compilation of quaint, clever tunes...Rico & The Specials AKA have emerged with a new single that is more true reggae than ska...Have just heard a couple of tracks from new Cold Chisel 'Circus Animals' album just released in Australia. Track called 'Forever And Ever' stands out...In music news from overseas: Glen Shorrock has left the Little River Band, though it took a while to confirm this, as I seemed to have gotten word from Australia before anyone else did...Speaking of down under, The Stones are said to be ready to tour Aussie later this year, according to Bill Wyman...Adam Ant has reportedly fired the rest of his band, aside from guitarist Marco...Glad to see U2 opening for J. Geils and getting exposure that they well deserve."

BRUCE MOSER, COULD BE WILD, (716-885-5200): "Aldo Nova goes gold in Canada, and top 10 on the Airplay Index within 6 weeks of release. Not too shabby for a new act, these days. 'Fantasy' continues to build at the Top 40 level, and the album is already selling top 20 in many markets. Starting in April, Aldo will be opening for Sammy Hagar on about 30 dates. This record is getting ready to explode... Duke Jupiter debuts on the Airplay Index, not to mention at the top of the Red Page in Kal's sheet this week. Duke Jupiter's 'I'll Drink To You' is destined for the top of the charts, and on all stations coast to coast...Welcome to Frank Holler at WCMF. And congratulations to George Hawras as he moves to WYNF. It's a small world since Tampa is also the home of Johnny Velchoff, the new PD at KX...Could be the big time. John Gorman now has a car phone. I wonder if that was Wayne Gretsky's idea...Love Kid Leo's favorite feature in the sheet...Anyone looking for a great jock and an even better Music Director should contact Charlie Logan at 904-241-3987...Last Thursday, WZIR co-sponsored a show with Moonlight Drive, and sold out a 1200 seat house and turned away another 600 people...Hats off to Dave Kane for his keen observations that The Waitresses, Romeo Void, and Soft Cell all are played in a tight rotation and are top 20 sales and outselling the combined retail of 3 more commercial-sounding bands in a better rotation. The fact that people are buying these records, which is the real bottom line these days, means these records warrant your attention, or, as the Kinks say, 'Give The People What They Want'...Call me if you want a copy of a great new single by Lou Rera called 'Why Bother'... Coming soon from A&M, a great heavy metal band called Fist...Looking forward to spending St. Patrick's Day in New York City at the Ritz with U2."

BILL MCGATHY, RCA (212-930-4095): "This week on your desk is a cassette of an upcoming Lp that we at RCA/Millennium are very proud of. It's 'Below The Belt', the second round from Franke And The Knockouts. It's the absolute goods!! Plug it into something and be astounded by 'Never Had It Better', 'Keep On Fighting' and 'You're Just What I Want'...Thanks to album radio for the hits on Le Roux and Rick Springfield. 1982 will truly be the Year of the Dog---Go Nipper!!"

WYNN JACKSON, INDEPENDENT (404-321-5228): "On your desk today--Asia. Get it to the control room fast before your desk catches on fire...Eat a hearty breakfast today, because Scorpions will definitely eat your lunch!...Attention programmers: With good air talent as hard to find as it is, you should listen to that Charlie Logan tape you just received. He's a former MD at WFYV and a hell of a jock. If you misplaced his number, it's 904-241-3987...As you're listening to your Light record, please remember the old quote 'art completely understood at first glance is mediocre at best', so listen again and go do what you gotta do. That quote came to mind last week while in the studio taking in some of the second Producers Lp, being done by Tom Werman again in Atlanta...Also from Atlanta, the Riggs boys didn't start with a bad group of call letters. Just put on cut one, side one, and let it track...Attention record companies: By now your A&R department should have received copies of the 96 Rock Home Cookin' II Lp. Check it out...I'm crazy about the Human League--thank you Allen Frey. Not bad for an illiterate Southern, eh, John?...One year ago we were screaming to get album rock to listen to a song called 'Jessie's Girl', and now you can't seem to get enough of Dr. Noah Drake. Warmest congrats to Rick and his manager, Joe. Also congrats to Mr. Bill for picking it and McGathy and Bettancourt and their locals, regionals, and indy staff on establishing this Grammy-winning superstar...In heavy rotation at WYNN: Huey Lewis, Bonnie Raitt, Dwight Twilley, and the Graham Parker cassette hits the spot!!!"

DON WASLEY, MCA (213-508-4020): "No doubt in my mind. After seeing Wabbit open for Black Sabbath, I'm convinced that they are on their way to stardom. A typical Sabbath crowd usually welcomes opening acts by throwing large objects at them. Our Canadian contribution was met with overwhelming response. Try and catch them if they visit your area...Chubby continues to build with not only rotation increases and retail activity, but people realizing that Checker is a valid commodity and good for radio. Finally open minds prevail!...Keep in mind three tracks on Daltrey's 'Best Bits' have never been released. They are 'Martyrs And Madmen', 'Treachery', and 'You Put Something Better Inside Me'...Now a few words on 'Cat People'. First the record. David Bowie. Enough said. Now the film. The most bizarre, haunting, freaky, gruesome, and sexual film I've ever seen. It's absolutely excellent and you'll acquire a whole new respect for your kitty...Lastly, Point Blank's classic 'On A Roll' Lp should be everywhere by April 1st...Stay well."

JEB BRIEN, CHAMPION ENTERTAINMENT (212-765-8553): "IF YOU PLAY HALL & OATES, DON'T READ THESE COMMENTS! For my friends who aren't playing H&O, maybe it's time to redefine your priorities. The act is an 18-34 demo, and obviously we can pull lower, depending on the cut. Their image doesn't require reams of research and Ph.D's to tell you, yes, they do have great pop appeal. It's time that this is used as a positive, not a negative. Look at all the success album rock acts are enjoying at Top 40 this year. Like the others, our combination works. Check out the new 12" of 'Did It In A Minute' b/w 'Head Above Water'. It's time to rediscover Hall & Oates at album radio...I'm proud of you, Sky, for going on the wagon. See you in Chicago on the 20th, and let's see how long it lasts."

MICHAEL PLEN, I.R.S. (212-980-6874): "Rumor has it that Belinda Carlisle, lead singer of the Go Go's, died of a drug overdose, car accident, stabbing, rape--all sorts of weird deaths. The fact of the matter is, she is still alive. So if you're still getting a lot of listener calls concerning this situation, I'd be happy to give any station a live actuality of me stating that she is still alive. Just call the above number...I've been in Dallas, Austin, and the west coast the last few weeks, and met a lot of weird people...Another rumor is true. Drake Hall has perfect hair, not one out of place. How do you do that, Drake?...Listen to Jools Holland. 'Bumble Boogie' is a great 2½ minute instrumental and is great for morning programming to start. Please don't be locked into a stereotype that album rock can't play instrumentals. If the song fits, play it...Also still getting good support on the Flestones. Check out 'Shadow Line', 'Hope Come Back', or 'Ride Your Pony'...Check out the Anti-Nowhere League on WXYZ Records. It's a killer...Are you playing the Plimsouls or XTC yet? If you're not, you're bad...Let's start a new rumor--Jimmy Page just became a female black rock singer. I can't handle any more of these Go Go's death calls...My VEJUR QUOTE: Keep on Mike Bone to make 'Homo Sapien' a hit by Pete Shelley."

SEAN COAKLEY, ATCO (212-484-6400): "The lead tracks from Jimmy Page's 'Death Wish II' soundtrack are 'City Sirens' and 'Jam Sandwich'. Don't be surprised by your massive listener response--this is Mr. Zep himself and the kids know it...Still winning friends and influencing people department: Eddie Schwartz and 'Over The Line'...Coming soon: The Jim Carroll Band's 'Dry Dreams'...The Scorpions album cover is disgustingly ugly. I'm talking gross. Makes Ozzy O. look like a member of Up With People. I still don't believe it's Drake, though. Is it?"

JOHN SCHOENBERGER, RADIO RECORDS (305-565-7700): "I was in the Northeast this past week and was pleasantly surprised to hear some very refreshing radio, especially at WNEW-FM, who has some really great established artist promos running. And, to actually hear a real R&B record on WMMR absolutely made my day. Long live creative radio... 'On A Carousel' by Glass Moon is beginning to look like a hit. If you're on another cut, getting little reaction, perhaps you should consider this one. JUDY LIBOW, ATLANTIC (212-484-6063): "John Belushi had that special gift of laughter that was both infectious and memorable. His passing makes it that much harder to smile."

THOM OHAIR, AUDIO INDEPENDENTS (415-864-0700): "Nude body found. Over and over this scenario takes our heroes away. This model does not work. The cost of being in is out. The world needs laughter not another tear. There's nothing natural about being dead at 33."

JIM SOTET, POLYGRAM (212-399-7813): "My Bic lighter is lit and held high in the air. Thank you album radio for the instant reponse on the Scorpions album. Check out next month's Omni Magazine for a different view of the cover art. And if you think the Scorpions cover art is 'out there', wait until you see the Rainbow album...The Waitresses on KMET. Obviously there's something happening and my thanks to Jack and Hugh for realizing it. You two, along with Steve Feinstein, win my award for playing music, not worrying about preconceived notions...My only words on The Call this week are the suggestion you listen closely to the lyrics, immediately watching the CBS, ABC, NBC (take your pick) evening news...I'll let my co-workers talk to you about our other current music, and other than a thank you on Novo Combo, may I also suggest you check out the following current music: the new Pylon 45, Black Uhuru Live, Panther Burns (especially side 2), and the new Birds REM...RIP: John Belushi...Finally: Michael and Marko. #1 was one of the best things to happen in a long time. Enjoy! You and your staff deserve applause. Ditto Scott and staff for Joan Jett. New innovative music makes it all worthwhile. Human League and Soft Cell deserve to be next!"

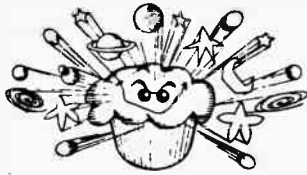

FOR YOUR INFORMATION:

When reading the individual station report, please remember that there are three ways in which album rotations are tracked.

1. **PLAYS PER DAY** - This refers to the actual number of exposures an album gets between 6 AM and Midnight on an average day of the reporting week.
2. **PLAYS PER WEEK** - Most of our weekly play reporters go back over their music logs for the previous week, and those totals are relayed to us and printed up.
3. **AIRPLAY EMPHASIS** - Be careful not to confuse this with **PLAYS PER DAY/WEEK**. EMPHASIS is a system of relative scaling, based on 5. If the highest rotation album gets 8 spins per day, it receives 5 points. If another album gets 4 spins, it merits 3 points, etc. This allows a much more detailed rundown than the conventional light/medium/heavy system.

The Airplay Index is our ranking system for the amount of play on albums as a whole. We determine rankings by converting all daily and weekly play reports to a 1-10 emphasis system and totalling the points on a given Lp. We use a simple percentage breakdown to indicate the amount of play on each track.
