FMQB ALBUM REPORT

Chain Reaction

SAMMY HAGAR, "THREE LOCK BOX", GEFLEN

With 119 Lp reports, the Red Rocker rolls right into the #1 Most Added slot with a cushy 90 station margin...Radio Action: Mike Wolf, WQFM, "After listening to the new Sammy Hagar Lp, I've decided that there have been no other album releases this year which, song for song, are more consistent or stronger than 'Three Lock Box'...Sky Daniels, WLUP, "Some people, no matter how long they've been in the business, continue to learn and grow and no matter how many trials it takes to attain success the best continue to grow after that. Sammy's in that category"...Kid Leo, WMMJ, "'Three Lock Box' has the capability of doing for Sammy Hagar what 'Don't Say No' did for Billy Squier. Sammy's been a favorite here in Cleveland since his days with Montrose. I think it's about time for him to become a super-favorite"...John McCrae, WKX AM/FM, "The new album sounds great. We're getting the best initial, positive response of any album this year"...Bill Weston, WGRQ, "The timing on Sammy Hagar's record couldn't be better. The folks at Geffen must be pretty sharp operators. This one will put the Red Rocker right on top of the first quarter heap. The Mike Reno duet should work wonders with the ladies"...Ron Nenni, WOVE, "By the time we reach '83, 'Remember The Heroes' by Sammy Hagar will be a monster"...Jeffrey Heidel, KKDJ, "Sammy has given us his best to date with 'Three Lock Box'. 'Heroes' is a well-produced consultant's dream, and beyond that, it's a good song"...Obviously, 'Heroes' leads. Also hot, the title, "Growing Up" and the single (21-7 on the Song Index).

BOB SEGER, "SHAME ON THE MOON" b/w "HOUSE BEHIND THE HOUSE", CAPITOL

Your basic automatic--as 116 first weekers roll in, including 39 Level 1's...Radio: Bob Welch, WPYX, "Segar pulled in phones after just one play of 'Shame'. We're using both sides for now with 'Shame' dayparted. 'House Behind The House' is classic Segar. Good rockin' stuff Segar fans have been hungry for"...Steve Feinstein, WYSP, "Segar's 'House' is refreshing. A real honest-to-goodness cooker. Also nice to see him pick a Rodney Crowell tune on the A side"...Owen Holmes, WYMX, "'Shame On The Moon' has a make-love-to-your-favorite-lady sound. It was added this week directly into heavy and the phones have been nothing but positive since"...Jack Silver, KSHE, "The B side of Bob Segar is infectious as hell. 'House Behind The House' sounds fine to my ears, especially that sax solo. Bring on the rest of the Lp!"...Jose Diaz, WBLM, "At first the Bob Segar 45 didn't do very much for me, but the more I hear it, the more I appreciate the subtlety of the song. Rodney Crowell, as a writer, certainly deserves the boost he'll get by having Segar cover one of his songs."

WAITRESSES, POLYGRAM

We had topped in 22 adds prior to this report, including KBPI, WPYX, WHEW-FM, WXRT, and KROQ, and this week the time for "Christmas Wrapping" has come. New on 29 FMQB stations for #2 Most Added. New's include: KZAP, WMMR, KLOS, WBCN, WSYR, WOVE, KGB-FM, and WCMF...Should be a top priority seasonal song.

MICHAEL JACKSON, EPIC

Michael builds on early believers KTXQ, KQRS, and KBPI with 22 more stations for #4 Most Added. New on: KGB-FM, KQFM, WRAB, KDKB, KLAG, WMPD, and WXRT...Beat It is the track...Radio Action: Ron Sorenson, KBLI, "'Beat It' was the musical high point of the week. It's a great rock and roll song and issues like the color and ethnic heritage of the performing artist are simply not germane"...Rosie Pisani, WLIR, "Michael Jackson debuted out-of-the-box and received an inquisitive response"...Bob Lindor, WDMA, "Michael Jackson and Van Halen whip it good on 'Beat It'"...Joanie Williams, WDEK, "'Beat It' can do very well for several formats and the album, in general, proves this guy is a lot more versatile than most of us AOR types might be willing to admit. Congratulations, Michael, you sure showed us"...Stew Schantz, WPDH, "I listened to 'Beat It', thought a while, and thought, what the hell--it's a good song, let's give it a shot. We did a midday test on the air, not identifying the two well-known artists, and on a scale of 1 to 10, it received a 7.5. Not bad, so it's in"...As for the "image" question, KQOS' Brian Taylor comments, "The problem is with the image 'you' the programmer perceives of Michael Jackson. The majority of your audience does not hear color on the radio. All they hear is the song and whether they like it or not, and this one they'll like. Now go on and 'beat it'."

DURAN DURAN, CAPITOL

20 adds brings the station count to 85 since our Front Page Tip 3 weeks ago, and you've got to be impressed with the week's highest #25 Index debut (#30 Metro)...New heavies: KYYS, KLOS, KQWB, WNET, KFUG, and WAPP...Hungry Like The Wolf debuts #14 on the Song Index...Checklist: None dropping, 17 maintaining, and 43 building including WLVD, WLPX, KQRS, WGRQ, WYSP, WSHE, WZXR, WMMR, KLDL, KROQ, WQXM, WELS, KZAP, KSRR, KQAN, WNET, KDKB, WNET, WSYR, KTXQ, and WOVE...With this kind of momentum, we're forced to haul out the old adage--if you're late, you're light.

ROBERT HAZARD, "ESCALATOR OF LIFE", RCA

Of course the Philly stations have been banging "Escalator" forever, and maybe it's the local element, but this track will not burn out. A nice chunky hook, and plenty modern.

CHAIN REACTION CONTINUED

FRANK MARINO, COLUMBIA

ATI that recent add ak-shun comes through to give Frank the biggest Index jump this week--up 47-37. Up an even stronger 44-33 in the Metro Chart...#6 Most Added with 12, including WIOT, KWK AM/FM, WLVQ, WQFM, WAPP...6 play increases: WFBQ, KZEW, KMET, KBPI, KAZY, and KLAQ...Heaviest play: KISS, KATT, WHJY, KDWB, KLOS, KPKE, KRQR, WEBN, and WLLQ...A top 5 request item: WEBN, KPKE...On the Checklist: 11 maintaining, 1 dropping, 17 building, including KPKE, WFBQ, WKLS, KLOS, WIOT, KISS, KWK AM/FM, KDWB, WLVQ, and KMET...WEBN added the record early in the resurgence and Curt Gary updates, "It's a bonafide hit here now, after only 3 weeks"... "Strange Dreams" jumps 43-28 on the Top 100.

NIGHT RANGER, BOARDWALK

Last week's strongest Index mover continues the trend 47-28-19 and powers up Metro 29-15...#6 Most Added with 12 (including WKLS, WHCN, WFYV, WGRQ, KLOS, WLPX, and KMET) to take the 3 week station count to 65...Airplay: 48 steady, 1 down and 15 ups, including WEBN, WAPP, KZOK, KWK, KRQR, KPKE, KBPI, WZXR, WSYR, WPYX, WAQX, WAAF, WSKS, KZEL, and KWXL...The Checklist confirms: 29 maintaining, 39 building, only 1 dropping...6 of 17 not playing are considering. "Don't Tell Me You Love Me" is up 22-12. Also consider "Sing Me Away".

PSYCHEDELIC FURS, COLUMBIA

They inch up the Index 50-48, and just miss that Metro underline, 50-46...New on 12 of our reporters for #6 Most Added, led by KPKE, WILS-FM, KAZY, KISS, KDKB, WLVQ, WCOZ, KWFM...Checklist: 22 maintaining, 3 dropping, 10 building: WHJY, WILS-FM, KROQ, WZZO, WDHA, WXRJ, WLVQ, WMET, WAAF, and WSYR...23 of 44 not playing are considering. "Love My Way" moves 60-57.

KISS, CASABLANCA/POLYGRAM

We were looking for a chart showing this week, but came up with a #51 near miss. New on 11 more reporters, including KRQR, KYYS, and WMYK...Airplay: 1 down, 19 steady, and 4 up: WZZO, WKDF, WSKS, and KLAQ...Now top requested at WPYX, WIMZ, KSMB, KZAP, KZEL, WZXR, WAPI, KGON, KISS, WKCF, WBAR, KSRR, WWCK, and WSYR...On the Checklist: None dropping, 9 maintaining, and 28 building including phones and sales at: WAPI, WHJY, WILS-FM, WZZO, WKDF, WWCK...Phones: KZAP, WKLS, KZEL, WKZL, KISS, WGRQ, WLPX, WOUR, KSRR, WAAF, KTXQ, WSKS, KTXQ, WSKS, 18 of 50 not playing are considering. "Love It Loud" remains at #4 on the Request Chart.

OZZY OSBOURNE, JET/CBS

Up 23-21 Index, 26-17 for the Metro underline...Play stats: 51 steady, 6 down, 6 ups: KLOS, KQAK, KISW, WDVE, WMMR, and WMS...Top 5 requested at KPKE, KWXL, WPYX, KSMB, WQXM, WHJY, WKDF, KZOK, WDVE, WLUP, and WSYR...Trax: "Paranoid" is a #33 underline, "Iron Man" follows at #65 on the Top 100.

VANDENBERG, ATCO

It was a week to week builder early on, but at this point there is no denying the momentum...New: WPLJ, KISW, WMS, KBPI, KLPX, KKCI...Airplay: 39 steady, 5 down, 8 ups: WAPP, KRQR, KMET, KGB-FM, KILD, WSKS, WDHA, and WPDH...Heaviest on KSJO, WSYR, and WQFM...Checklist: 18 maintaining, 3 dropping, and 20 building, including: KSJO, KRQR, WSYR, WMET, KGB-FM, KMET, DC101, WMMR, WILS-FM, and WHCN...18 or 38 not playing are considering.

ADAM ANT, EPIC

At this rate, Adam will still be building well into January. Steady at #10 Index, up 20-14 Metro... New: KATT, WYNF, and WGIR-FM...Airplay: 58 steady, 11 down, 13 ups: KISW, WMS, KZEW, KSRR, KLOS, WRNO, WQDR, WMYK, WKZL, WHJY, WDIZ, WAPI, and WHFS...Top 5 request mentions include KGB-AM/FM, KSRR, WQXM, WCMF, WFYV, WBCN, WHJY, WZXR, WMYK, and WAQX... "Goody Two Shoes" is #3 on the Song Index, moves 3-2 on the Request Chart as the Lp breaks into the Top Retail Index at #19.

TONY CAREY, ROC SHIRE

New on 10 of our reporters, including KGB-FM, KWK AM/FM, and KATT...WYSP's Steve Feinstein comments, "Look past the Tony Carey cover (I realize that he doesn't exactly challenge John Barrymore for being the great profile), and give a listen to 'I Won't Be Home Tonight'. Check out the impressive call letters on the record, too, including WNBC"...Chris Geisen, WSKS, "When I played the Toney Carey on the air last night, it got immediate response on the phones"...As noted by Steve, the single is the tune to consider.

SCANDAL, COLUMBIA

Finally that big Back Page breakthru the label has been hoping for--up 49-39 Index, 42-38 Metro... Another sound add week, too: WCOZ, WIYY, KSHE, WRIF, WSKS, and WRXL...Checklist: 18 maintaining, 5 dropping, 12 building: KTXQ, WBCN, WSYR, WYSP, KMOD, KATT, KLOL, WZZO, WILS-FM, WMS, KAZY, and WHJY...Airplay ups: WNEW-FM, WBCN, KZEW, KLOS, KBPI, WFBQ, KATT...Heaviest on KISS, KLOL, and KRQR... "Goodbye To You" jumps 48-35 underlined.

FRIDA, ATLANTIC

Up 30-26 Index, 31-25 on the Metro Chart...Airplay: Ups KISS, WBRU, KWFM, WFBQ, KAZY, KSRR, and KISW... 39 steady and 2 down...Max play on KDKB, KBPI, WHJY, KATT, and KWXL...Other airplay heavies: KQRS, KZOK, WABX, WAPP, WLLZ, WMET, WPDH, and WOUR...The single moves 23-19-16.

MOVING PICTURES, NETWORK

Another solid week--#8 Most Added with 10, including WDVE, WCMF, WIOT, WILS-FM, and WPYX...Key calls to date: KBPI, KLOS, KQRS, KZEW, KGON, KDKB, KGB-FM, KZOK, and KISS...Comments: Doug Davis, KWXL, "Moving Pictures is moving in great stride. 'What About Me' is pulling great 18-34 female phones"... Owen Holmes, WYMX, "Moving Pictures has performed well over the last week with 20 units sold. Not bad for a first starter"...The single is still building nicely Top 40. Keep an eye on your competition's playlist, and consider when things thin out over the holidays.

A FLOCK OF SEAGULLS, ARISTA

The re-adds of "Space Age Love Song" now add up to Chart progress--29-27 Index, 37-32 Metro Prime Move. If you haven't played "Space Age", now's the time to seriously consider.

TAXXI, FANTASY

Out Forever, and still locking up majors--new on KMET, KQAK, KDKB, WRXL, WBLM, KZEL, and WRXL... If we have an award for long haul left-field performer of the year, these guys would have it locked up. "I'm Leaving" is performing beautifully. If you rolled with "Cocktail Queen" early on, give "Leaving" a shot now.

LITTLE STEVEN AND THE DISCIPLES OF SOUL, EMI

New play on WHCN, WMYK, KILO, KWFM, and 5 more bring the overall station total to 19, including: WLPX, KISS, WDHA, WILS-FM, WYNF, WAQX, and WAAF. The single leads.

ROSE TATTOO, MIRAGE

Metal is not the current format-darling, but there is plenty of variety in these call letters, DC101, WLPX, WBCN, and KISS. "Scarred For Life" leads. On's include: KYTX, WYFE, WAAF, WHCN, WILS-FM, WAQX, WSYR, WYSP, KLAQ, WDVE, WIYY, WPLR, and more.

ROBERT PLANT, "FAR POST", IMPORT

More quality calls led by KRQR, KLOL, KDWB...Recent adds: WQDR, KFMX, KKRQ, WRKI, KQRS, KFOG, and KLAQ. Great accent piece.

Music has been with human culture for thousands of years. The Romans played music and the Greeks often depicted their lute instruments in their artworks.

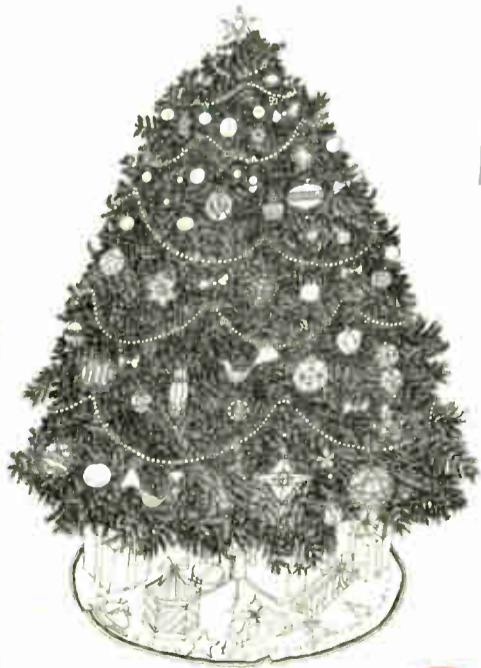

NATIONAL TALENT SEARCH: "We are looking for a host for USA Cable Network's 'Hot Spots' show. Tapes and resumes to: Denny Somach, 19 Rockhill Road, Bala Cynwyd, PA 19004."

WQFM, MILWAUKEE, WI ASST. P.D.-MIKE WOLF: "I've still got chills running up and down my spine from the fantastic performance put on by the Who here in Milwaukee. There is no doubt in my mind that this will be the best performance that I will ever see any group give. I want to thank the Who for heeding the cries of 75,000 petitioners and including Milwaukee in their farewell tour. We will never forget you!!!... Re: new releases. After listening to the new Sammy Hagar Lp, I've decided that there have been no other album releases this year which, song for song, are more consistent or stronger than 'Three Lock Box'. Because of his ailing throat Sammy didn't visit Milwaukee last time. Hopefully he will include Milwaukee this time."

RADIO ACTION CONTINUED

We've noticed KBPI has been adding quite a bit of new music lately, and last week P.D. Phil Strider explained that the station was running three-song "Surprise Attack" sets of new artists on a regular basis and getting strong positive audience response. We learned this week that Carroll, Schwartz, and Groves will be working with the Sandusky album stations (KBPI, KWF, and KDKB) and called Toney Brooks, President of Sandusky Radio, for a comment.

"Jeff Pollack is our corporate consultant, not just for album radio but for all stations. From time to time, he sees the need for additional input in areas of expertise that might not be down his alley, and he is responsible for involving people who will keep us on track. Basically, Rick's and Marty Schwartz's involvement with our album stations will be to keep us up to date on new music releases, trends, acceptance at KROQ of certain product, and just to make sure that we are as in touch as we need to be with the right groups. They will also assist us with service and acquisition of some of this product as much of it is imports.

We were motivated to expand Rick's responsibilities to our album stations by the enormous success of KROQ, Los Angeles; KYYX, Seattle; and Sandusky's KEGL, Dallas. The Eagle was an CHR/AOR hybrid, and we felt that the modern music would fit nicely into our programming position in that market. There was very little risk if any with an infusion of modern product there. It just seemed like a natural evolution since modern music has basically the same demographic appeal of a CHR station which is predominantly women and teens.

The question occurs as to whether the demographics of modern music are compatible with the psychographics of album radio. The format has definitely burned out the core library, and that aspect of the AOR psychographic has yet to be reckoned with. People do not want to hear Jackson Browne, the Doobies, Led Zeppelin and all that stuff over and over. Not to pick on these artists, but they are album rock retreats. We cannot maintain freshness any longer without dramatically upping the current-to-library ratio of the music mix. The specifics of that mix depend on a number of things. How long the station has been positioned as album rock, how many times this burned out music has come up, what is the market competition doing, and basically, how innovative do you need to be in order to service the core demographic.

The compatibility of modern music with large AOR audiences has surprised us. It's working in Denver with no negatives at all. We added this dimension to our already successful station in Phoenix last week with no negs, and it's off to a fast start in Tucson. We are not offending or alienating the core audience with this product. Indeed our core audience has been as responsive to modern music as its natural constituency of clubs, alternative retail, etc. We are still at the vanguard of this movement as far as album rock programming, and there are certainly others who have dealt with it effectively; KBCO, Boulder, KISW, Seattle (in reaction to KYYX and perhaps even before then). We have taken the light to moderate treatment with this music to date, now it's a demonstrative shift. This is not a format change, but a very discernable modification. We don't know the retention value of some of this music. It may burn a little faster than some traditional AOR product but, on the other hand, it may surprise and have a long life. What we do know right now is that this music is fresh and exciting and people want to hear it."

WQDR, RALEIGH, NC P.D.-RON PHILLIPS: "Will album radio play Michael Jackson or not? Personally, I think it will be very interesting to see what develops. We've decided to give it some daytime airplay and test the waters. I admire Bill for picking the record, 'cause otherwise programmers would never even have given it their ears. Seeing the record in print on the Front Page gave me some thoughts which I would like to hear other programmers' reaction to. It seems album radio has been forced on many records this past year by Top 40, records which many of us felt were not in tune with the bulk of the records we play. For example: Soft Cell, Human League, Joe Jackson, and Marshall Crenshaw. I think that shows the shortsightedness on our parts. I'm not here to toot a horn about how early QDR added these records, but just to pose a question: Are we going to continue to be beaten to the punch on new fresh-sounding hit records by our competition? It's dangerous if we are. A year ago we were pounding REO into the ground. Now we're scared of it. They certainly didn't change their style, we just seem to have changed our thinking midstream. If radio listens to research, how come we didn't see this coming? Perhaps it's time to trust our own professional instincts a little and make sure our stations are fresh and exciting. If album radio is going to broaden demos, we need to be ahead of our time. As I saw in a recent memo, we've become so concerned with avoiding tuneout that we've forgotten the ways to encourage tune in. Unique vibrant records such as the ones listed above or Michael Jackson just might encourage some of this tune in. These are records that might make people turn up the radio instead of being satisfied with just music that has the same general sound. I firmly believe that album radio needs to incorporate a broader specter of musical styles in order to stay healthy. What does everyone else think?"

WAPP, NEW YORK, NY M.D.-CHIP HOBART: "Here at the end of 1982, which has been a very exciting year for us at Doubleday, I want to take this opportunity to sincerely thank the New York record community for being such a positive influence and truly a first-rate great group of people. The Apple couldn't have been a success in New York without the great input from a lot of men and women in the record industry. I wish to single out a few people to thank by name: Scott Regan, Paul Yeskel, Mel Phillips, Jimmy Del Balzo, Ray Free, Jim Sotet, Sue DeBenedette, Fred DiSipio, Herb Rosen, Barry Resnick, Dave Morrell, Howard Lesnick, Howard Bernstein, Judy Libow, Alan Wolmark, Joe Ianello, Al Cafaro, Jeff Backer, Mike Bone, Jerry and David Ross, Michael Abramson, Jim Sellars, Willis Demalt, Larry Braverman, Walter Winnick, Jack Hopke, Valerie Goodman, Steve Leeds, Harvey Leeds, Sammy Vargas, John Boulos, Bob Catania, and Bill McGathy....May 1983 be a very prosperous and vital year for records and radio, and I look forward to a closer association with all of you. WNEW-FM, NEW YORK, NY M.D.-JIM MONAGHAN: "The 11th Annual WNEW-FM Christmas Concert, held last Monday at Radio City Music Hall, was a resounding success. 5,600 people saw a great show from the P-Furs, Joe Piscopo, Gary U.S. Bonds, and Little Steven And The Disciples Of Soul. The highlight of the show for all was the onstage appearance of Yoko and Sean Lennon. Miami Steve also invited the WNEW-FM staff on stage to sing John's 'Christmas Song'; and, when we got on stage, we found Eddie Brigati of the Young Rascals right up there with us. Net proceeds from the show are going to United Cerebral Palsy. Extra special thanks to: Howard Lesnick and Howard Bernstein of EMI, and to Jim Del Balzo from Columbia for their efforts...It's also very reassuring to see a record company support an act the way EMI has supported Little Steven. After hearing it on the air, I'm convinced that 'Goodbye To You' is a hit...The same goes for the Psychedelic Furs 'Love My Way'...A personal to Troy Edwards at KGB: I'm really sorry that you're not still here to enjoy our 28° temperatures...And finally to everyone who reads this may your holiday be overflowing with true happiness and peace. See ya next year...P.S.: Remember to give the gift of music--no cut corners, please."

WYNF, TAMPA/ST. PETERSBURG, FL M.D.-RON DIAZ: "Don't miss the hot ride, catch that cab and jump into the Taxxi track 'I'm Leaving'. It's one of those records that quietly slipped into our power rotation and sat there idly for weeks...I don't know much about Tony Carey except that 'I Won't Be Home Tonight' hits you right from the first listen. Catchy as Drew Pearson on a Sunday. The musicians on the Lp sound like the Third Reich. We wish Teddy the best of luck in his new position with RCA. Ted is living proof that Italians can succeed in this business. WEBN, CINCINNATI, OH M.D.-CURT GARY: "Well, here we go. It's all down hill from here. To end up '82, WEBN just got Fixxed up. KSHE, ST. LOUIS, MO M.D.-JACK SILVER: "The Who's farewell tour of the United States stopped in St. Louis this week. The concert almost defies description. It was that good. Except for the fact that my car stereo was ripped off while I was in the arena, I had a great evening. Thanks to Dave Stein of Warner Bros. here in St. Louis for help in securing interviews with Townshend and Entwistle...Song of the week has got to be 'Remember The Heroes' from the Red Rocker, Sammy Hagar. Any track that puts Hagar, Reno, and Cain altogether has got to be a monster. I look for this to be a huge album radio song. As for the rest of the Lp, 'Your Love Is Driving Me Crazy' is still going strong and the title track is real interesting...'Shame On The Moon' from Bob Seger really has disappointed me, but the B side is infectious as hell. 'House Behind The House' sounds fine to my ears especially that sax solo. Bring on the rest of the Lp!...Looking back, it would have scared me had I picked Men At Work to be the success it has become. The album is still #1 in sales with 'Down Under' grabbing top requests and airplay honors at K-SHE. The video for 'Down Under' is even good...Songs doing well here at K-SHE include Pat Benatar's 'Tell It To Her', 'Stand Or Fall' from The Fixx (by the way, the album is starting to sell), and 'Far Post' from Robert Plant... Glancing at the sales chart we see 'Coda' debuting at #4, Geils 'Showtime' taking a big jump up to #14, Joni Mitchell at #27, The Fixx stands at #39, and Chilliwack at #50...Finally, I'd like to extend a warm wish to all in the radio and record industry for an excellent holiday season, and we'll talk to you in 1983."

WMMS, CLEVELAND, OH M.D.-KID LEO: "'Three Lock Box' has the capabilities of doing for Sammy Hagar what 'Don't Say No' did for Billy Squier. Sammy's been a favorite since his days with Montrose here in Cleveland. I think it's about time for him to become a super favorite...If we were going to give an award for country of the year in rock and roll, it'd have to be Canada. The Great White North has provided us with much good music in '82. However most Canadian bands are thought of in the sense of formula rock a la Loverboy, Rush, Triumph, Aldo Nova, etc. But lately we've seen a diversity in the Canadian sound a la the Payolas and the Spoons. Based in classical rock with a touch of the new techo-pop sound, this band sounds very, very fine on the speakers...Surprised to see Seger doing a Rodney Crowell song for the A side of the 45. It is in the vein of 'Fire Lake'. Hopefully Bob didn't go to the wall once too often with that sound. The B side rocks and rocks hard. I'm sure the album will follow along that path...The Kinks. What can you say about them after 19 years of putting out great and always danceable rock and roll. Actually all you can say is 'Come Dancing'...We all know that the novelty hit of the year was 'Valley Girl'. Well, Frank Zappa obviously wasn't just fertile in the mind, and his other offspring Dweezil is back with a loving tribute to mom called 'My Mother Is A Space Cadet'. His father is out in orbit as well...The Men At Work single, which is an import, should be had if possible. It's a good continuation of their sound and a sound that will be with us for some time. It's called 'Dr. Heckle and Mr. Jive'...The season's best from all the Buzzards to all of you."

WLRS, LOUISVILLE, KY M.D.-TERRY MEINERS: "Let me throw out the standard 'Noel' before I start slinging the mud. Noel!...Now let's get to the meat of the act. I'll have to give Yoko Ono the proverbial combat boot in the butt routine for that crass 'I'm John's widow remember' back cover on her new album. I'm laying for ya...Please go easy on Duke Meyer this week. His younger brother ran off with Prince after last weekend's sellout concert at Louisville Gardens... Happy Holidays! Let's knock 'em dead in '83."

WRXL, RICHMOND, VA P.D.-ILYSE GOTTLIEB: "'Three Lock Box' by Sammy Hagar will do for him what 'Don't Say No' did for Billy Squier. It's by far the most accessible piece he's ever done. Having been a fan for years, I'm glad to see him break into his own...People all over are talking about MTV's effect on our audience, but what about its effect on us? I've gotten turned on to some new things via MTV that I never would have thought twice about otherwise. Without really taking the music out of its medium, we have a whole new perspective! Some thought this to be a novelty when it was first released. Not so weeks later as "Shock The Monkey" remains in heavy airplay and as it does well in clubs, especially those in San Francisco.

New music radio is Lene's source of strength, but sales in the Boston area, at Rocket and the Harvard Coop, and major reaction reported by Albert O. at Spit show that the focus is in New England. Some sales in New York and club action in L.A. indicate a stretching horizon.

The retail activity coming out of NYC seems to be just the beginning. Universal radio play, mainstream and modern, is laying the foundation for a hit album to come. It's just a matter of time.

This past week the original members of Iron Butterfly got together for a reunion concert at Hopsings in Los Angeles. This may lead to a permanent reunion.

FOR OUR INFORMATION:

When reading the individual station report, please remember that there are three ways in which album rotations are tracked.

1. PLAYS PER DAY - This refers to the actual number of exposures an album gets between 6 AM and Midnight on an average day of the reporting week.
2. PLAYS PER WEEK - Most of our weekly play reporters go back over their music logs for the previous week, and those totals are relayed to us and printed up.
3. AIRPLAY EMPHASIS - Be careful not to confuse this with PLAYS PER DAY/WEEK. EMPHASIS is a system of relative scaling, based on 5. If the highest rotation album gets 8 spins per day, it receives 5 points. If another album gets 4 spins, it merits 3 points, etc. This allows a much more detailed rundown than the conventional light/medium/heavy system.

The Airplay Index is our ranking system for the amount of play on albums as a whole. We determine rankings by converting all daily and weekly play reports to a 1-5 emphasis system and totaling points on a given Lp. We use a simple percentage breakdown to indicate the amount of play on each track.
