extreme after dark A New Breed of Nighttime Programming

When the phrase "Active Rock" was coined four years ago, it conjured up images of Rock stations targeting Men 18-34 that knew there was more to life than Def Leppard. Taking chances on newer artists, these stations would be "active" in breaking bands. Since then, the Active Rock format has splintered. Then-current bands like Alice In Chains, Nirvana and Soundgarden have broken-up or fallen into periods of inactivity. Meanwhile, bands like Rage Against the Machine, Tool and KoRn have shifted from fringe artists to the mainstream. Stations targeting the lower half of the 18-34 demographic risk alienating those at the upper end. A handful of Active stations have chosen to address the dual nature of Active Rock in 1999 by adapting the "Extreme" handle for nighttime format positioning.

dates back to 1996, when ARS

TREME

launched KXTE/Las Vegas, the idea of imaging night programming as "Extreme" is a new phenomenon. This lets Active Rockers play both sides of the coin. During the day, when listenership is at it's highest, the stations can play it safe. However, after the sun goes down, Actives can punch-up their presentation and attitude via irreverent DJs, clever production and a more aggressive stance on new music.

When WLZR/Milwaukee became "Extreme Lazer 103" at night, they brought in Julio from WRCX/Chicago for the irreverent attitude that the new positioning encompassed. The station also began bending some presentation rules, like talking over song intros.

The goal of any station calling itself "extreme" is to target the most available audience for the time period: younger males loyal to the station. 'NOR eliminated virtually all of their pre-'90s still fit the "extreme" definition. Kojan likens the Extreme format to the "Outlaw Radio" concept of the late '80s, with Hard Rock and



Driving Listeners To Your Web Site

A recent Media Audit study revealed some interesting facts about the Internet. Heavy Internet users now make up 21% of the total population. More heavy radio listeners (21.9%) are going online than heavy TV viewers (16.2%). When the number of hours a consumer spends online increase, so do the number of hours they spend

listening to radio. Seven of the Top 10 rated radio station Web sites belong to the Rock format.

Great news for us! But are we, as a format, taking advantage of our listeners' desire to communicate with us online? Are you making a conscious programming effort to drive your audience to your station Web site?

A great way to pull the listener in is by creating exclusive contesting within your site. WDVE/Pittsburgh (www.dve.com) lures listeners to their site with Internet-only contesting. Visitors to the site are invited to register to win concert tickets that are given away exclusively online. 'DVE airs liners for their Web site two or three times a day, explaining the various features of the site. With a high



profile morning show such as Paulsen & Krenn, it makes sense to convert their huge listening audience into Web site visitors. The 'DVE Web site serves as a visual aid to the many morning show remotes and events. The site also acts as a one-stop visit for anyone looking for information on recent guests to the show.

"When we have guests on the morning show we create links to their sites on ours," WDVE Promotion/Marketing Director Kevin Battle explains. The 'DVE site offers discounts to Web visitors for their mountains of station swag. Currently in development is a feature that will let listeners plug in their email addresses to receive special notices and newsletters from the station. "It's a great way to keep in contact with our listeners," Battle adds.

KFMW/Waterloo (www.rock108.com) also created Internet-only contesting by running liners and promos enticing listeners to log-on and crack the code that opened the Rock 108 Rock-Vault. "It was great way of getting our name out and having listeners view the site," PD Jave Patterson recalls. Those listeners who crack the code (Rock 108) then register to win prizes and, in-turn, become part of the stations' database. The Rock 108 morning show poses questions online for their listeners to ponder, the results of which are posted on the site. Some of the newer music being played on Rock 108 is highlighted online with links to featured artists.

WZZO/Allentown (www.wzzo.com) has seen a significant increase in hits to their site since promotion of a new Web fea-YOUR ture called Z-mail began. Promos JO and liners are aired drawing listeners to the site, where they can enter their e-mail address to receive Z-mail. The Z-mails are sent out a couple times a month, giving listeners the early scoop on upcoming concerts and contests before the regular listening audience catches wind of them. Keeping the 'ZZO site fresh is a priority: "We religiously update our site, two or three times a week," PD Robin Lee says.

Arbitron's People Meter: It Works!

Preliminary test results of the "Personal People Meter" are being hailed as successful by Arbitron. The beeper-sized device has been touted as the future of radio ratings, and the solution to sloppy diary-keeping errors. A field test was conducted in Manchester, England from October '98 to January '99. Arbitron Exec. VP/Worldwide Media Services Pierre Bouvard told the Radio Advertising Bureau board last week-



end that stations were able to encode their Pierre Bouvard

signals, and the devices successfully picked up the codes. Respondents readily wore the device, and they were good about "docking" it each evening so that the data could be retrieved. The next phase of the Manchester test will focus on audience estimates reported by the new technology.

Bouvard says Arbitron is working to develop "a viable business and economic model for this personal portable metering system." Translation: This stuff's expensive, and if there are other things that can be measured by these gadgets, to spread the cost around, radio will save money, and Arbitron will make money. Bouvard said that "radio alone, at this time, cannot support the cost of this measurement technology."

WNAP/Indianapolis: "Classic Rock That Really Rocks"

Emmis Classic Hits WNAP/Indianapolis has hardened-up their sound and adopted the slogan "Classic Rock That Really Rocks." Recent playlist additions include titles from Aerosmith, AC/DC, Metallica, and Ozzy Osbourne. No currents are being played "at this time," WNAP WENS OM Greg Duncan told fmqb. The station ran jockless last week (minus Howard Stern in mornings) while the musical tweaking was implemented. Duncan claims crosstown WFBQ has reacted to the changes at 'NAP by also incorporating the "Classic Rock That Really Rocks" handle. 'FBQ OM Marty Bender disputes that, claiming Q95 air talent began sprinkling the tag-line in last fall, "when we

found our music mix had become much more uptempo." Bender says 'FBQ usage in recorded promos began in January. Still, Duncan says Emmis is investigating legal issues related to the slogan's use. 'NAP is also giving away \$5,000 to anyone who answers their phone saying, "WNAP is kicking Q's ass," when randomly called by the station.

Radio Listening Decline Slows

Radio's long term listening decline is slowing down but it hasn't stopped. That's what **Arbitron** topper **Pierre Bouvard** told an audience at the **RAB** Board's March meeting. In the three years leading up to the 1996 passage of the Telecom Act, Persons Using Radio (PUR) slipped 4% from 17.6 (Spring '93, 12+) to 16.9 (Spring '96). Post-consolidation PURs have moved from 16.9 (Winter '96) to 16.2 (Fall '98), only a 3% decline. Total 12+ cume is mostly flat: 96.2% in Fall '93 to 95.3% in Fall '98.

de Castro Fills NAB Board Vacancy

The major market group representative seat on the NAB's Radio Board had been vacant since the death of Greater Media radio chief Tom Milewski on February 8. Now Chancellor Radio Group President Jimmy de Castro has been appointed to fill the vacancy. NAB also announced the results of run-off elections for two regional seats: WZOE Broadcasting President/ GM Steve Samet won the seat in District 17 and Sunburst Media President/CEO John Borders, who was elected in District 19.

Russ Bach Named Walt Disney Worldwide President

Russ Bach has been appointed President of Walt Disney Records Worldwide. In the newly created position, Bach will oversee the day-to-day operations of the label on a worldwide basis, reporting to Buena Vista Music Group President David Berman and Chairman Bob Cavallo. Bach was formerly President of EMI Music Distribution from 1989-1997. Since then he has acted as a consultant to Buena Vista Music Group and other music companies.

Harris Heads To St. Louis

Longtime Washington, D.C. personality Paul Harris is heading to AM Talker KTRS/St. Louis where he'll cover 10:00 a.m. - 1:00 p.m., starting March 22.

Embracing DVD Technology

Remember the first time you heard *Dark Side Of the Moon* on compact disc? Even though you experienced the album dozens of times, that first spin in a CD player was astonishing. Not only did the elevated quality give audiophiles a reason to celebrate, the music industry was invigorated by droves of consumers inspired to re-purchase all of their favorite albums on the new format.

While the compact disc has flourished for almost 20 years — overpowering challengers such as the minidisc and digital compact cassette — the home video industry is only just beginning to follow suit with a new technology that rivals the CD's success. It's name? DVD (Digital Versatile Disc or Video Disc).



While its bulky predecessor, the laserdisc, offers high visual and audio quality, the DVDs fully digital picture and SurroundSound are unparalleled. Boasting a wealth of archival material and numerous interactive features, such as changing camera angles and language (in case you'd like to hear *Scarface* in French), DVDs are the size of a regular CD and the players double as standard CD players. With a single, standard digital format, the DVD can eventually infiltrate just about every technological and entertainment medium. including home entertainment, computers and business informa-

tion, eventually replacing the audio CD, videotape, laserdisc, CD-ROM, and video game cartridges. With this in mind, the new format has the potential to push the videotape into virtual extinction in the same manner the com-

pact disc nearly exterminated the vinyl album. As of this writing, DVD players are selling four times faster than CD players did at their launch, and ten times faster than VCRs.

So, how can radio utilize this new and advanced technology in their promotions? Well, if you're KSJO/San Francisco, it's a great way to give away porno. The station's "DVD-eviant" promotion offered listeners the chance to win a DVD player and DVD porno flicks with titles like *Freshman Fantasies* (this is where changing camera angles comes in quite handy) over the course of a weekend. Using a simple "whenever you hear us" approach, KS_JO hung the hook of the contest on the name "DVD-eviant." "The audience dug it," PD Jim Richards told *fmqb*. "DVD is the next generation of VHS." In addition, the station also gave away players



in conjunction with the release of Metallica's recently released DVD/Video, Cunning Stunts.

WPYX/Albany has been giving away DVD players since February by challenging their listeners with "Classic Movie Clips." Using soundbites from films ranging from *Austin Powers* to *West Side Story*, the station plays clips on a daily basis, and if identified correctly, callers win movie rentals from a local video store and qualify to win a DVD player. One player is given away each Thursday. "The reaction to giving away DVD players was even better than I thought it was going to be," PD.MD John Cooper commented. "We do contest after contest here, but we actually got people call ng in and saying `this is one of the best ones you've done in a while,' and we never get that."

Alternative replacing Hair Metal. For stations, the adjusted for-

mat is less about adding new music than subtracting older music that didn't fit at night. "Musically, we were already close to where we are now," Lazer PD Keith Hastings states.

One of the biggest benefits of the "Extreme after dark" positioning is the fact that new music, once relegated to minimal spins in overnights, can now be heard more frequently and in more than one daypart. KoRn, Limp Bizkit, Orgy, and Kid Rock are a few examples of artists that have benefitted from the new stance. It's an undeniable fact that the new format twist has helped sell records that saw increased exposure. "Let's map it out in simple black and white," comments Atlantic's Jon Nardachone. "Four of the first six top 100 markets that Kid Rock charted SoundScan were "extreme radio" markets (St. Louis, Dallas, Philadelphia and Detroit). Those four stations were spinning "I Am The Bullgod" even before the video was submitted to MTV. These, along with 10 or 15 other essential Active Rock stations, originated the Kid Rock airplay=requests=sales phenomenon while most others were still laughing at the name or balking at the whole Hip-Hop/Metal/ Hardcore genre."

While one might expect that essentially changing the station at night might draw some criticism from longtime listeners, the opposite has proven to be true. Since White started doing nights, 'NOR's the ratings have doubled. "I'm shocked at the lack of negative reaction," Kojan comments. Similarly, WLZR has reported nothing but positive responses since the switch. "I thought there might be some negatives when we got a little newer and edgier, but there's been none of that," Hastings reports.


While the Extreme format is still in its infancy stages, the acceptance of Extreme-at-night programming on 'NOR, 'LZR, KEGL/Dallas, and WYSP/ Philadelphia indicate the average Active Rock listener has no problem adjusting to their favorite station when they crank things up a notch at night. With ratings and record sales increases par for the course so far, under the right circumstances, going to extremes could be a viable alternative for some Active stations. (Airchecks of Extreme stations, both full and parttime, will be featured on CD Aircheck Vol. 39: Extreme Radio out April 2.)

BIA Re-Ranks Top Billers... Again

It's been a tough go for BIA Research in ranking the 10 highest billing radio stations for 1998. In explaining their second revision in as many days, BIA says it "received new station and market revenue information creating a re-ranking of the Top 4 radio stations." The snafu came from BIA inadvertently combining KIIS' revenue with that of its AM sister (KXTA) in its first two press releases. Additionally, WXRK's revenue estimate is slightly higher and WLTW's figure is somehwat lower than the billings BIA first reported (fmqb 3/5). 

• Washington, D.C, activists have vowed to boycott any radio, TV or other media outlet that hires **Doug "Greaseman" Tracht**, according to a report in the

Washington Post (3/7). The boycott is being instituted by Rev. Willie F. Wilson, pastor of Union Temple Baptist Church, who arranged a protest to show their dissatisfaction with Tracht's public apologies. "I call upon all people of goodwill in America — black and white, Jew and gentile, rich and poor — to denounce the Greaseman and ensure that he never, ever gets another chance to promote the killing of people just because the color of their skin," Wilson said. "He advocated violence and the killing of African Americans once," Wilson continued. "He did it a second time and he should never have the chance to do it again."

• Jim Bryant, President/GM at Infinity's WKRQ/Cincinnati has settled a \$1 million lawsuit with Jacor out of court, according to the Cincinnati Enquirer (3/4). The suit stems from a letter sent to Jacor advertisers from "Margaret Flanagan," protesting programming on Jacor's WEBN-FM and WOFX-FM. Bryant admitted that it was him that was behind the letter campaign. "No one by the name of Margaret Flanagan had anything to do with the letter," he said in an apologetic letter he sent to 1000 advertisers as part of the settlement. The letter Q102 sent out to Jacor advertisers also accused the company of ignoring "Flanagan's" complaints. "There were no 'voiced concerns' and Jacor's management knew nothing of this matter," Bryant continued. Although no amount was disclosed, the Enquirer believes Infinity sent Jacor a check for more than \$100,000.

• CBS VP/Programming Rick Torcasso has been installed as President of The Research Group. Torcasso replaces Larry Cambell who exited last week and is acting as a consultant to the company.


• New Jersey-based Lucent Technologies will begin testing its IBOC Digital Audio System on New Jersey NPR affiliate WBJB-FM, a public radio station licensed to Brookdale Community College. The on-air testing will run for 18 months and includes Lucent's Multi-Streaming feature, which simulates reception characteristics of current FM analog signals.

• XM Satellite Radio has teamed up with LCC International, a tower company. LLC will help consult XM with the implementation of a nationwide terrestrial repeater network. While it's been acknowledged that DARS satellites might not be able to reach urban areas and other parts of the country, the construction of towers and a repeater network could help.



• Big City Radio's Los Angeles trimulcast, Y107, has announced their new airstaff. Joining the new morning show of Mark Wilson, Frank Murphy and Ted Schermerhorn (*fmqb* 3/5) is KCRW/Santa Monica *Pop Secret* host Anne Litt, who will handle news and traffic. Taking the midday slot is WYSP/Philadelphia night talent Jesse Jessup. Former XHRM-FM/San Diego PD Mike Halloran has been tapped as APD and will cover afternoon drive. In nights it will be *The Harrison Crew* made up of Harrison and Dave Wittenburg, most recently swing talent at WBCN/Boston. The new airstaff will debut on March 22, not March 17, as earlier reported. Musically, Y107 will focus on '80s and early '90s Modern Rock, while incorporating some Modern Rock titles from the '70s, with a target audience of 25-35 year-old male and females. "We're going to carve out our turf," PD John Duncan told *fmqb*. "It's a niche, separate from KROQ and Star [KYSR], staked-out in the middle."

• Jacor's WKLS/Atlanta has added the syndicated *LoveLine* program to their onair lineup. The sex-talk show airs Sunday through Thursday, from 11:00 p.m. - 2:00 a.m.

 According to a report in the L.A. Times (3/10), Warner Music Group is on the verge of hiring former PolyGram Music Group President Roger Ames to head a top post at Warner's international music division. The deal also includes bringing Ames' London Records into WMG. The Times also reported that Ames in having discussions with WMG officials that could combine London's U.S. division with Warner's Sire Records label, and that Sire President Sevmour Stein would have a key role within the company. Sources told the Times that Ames has yet to work-out a release from Seagram's Universal Music Group, which acquired London last year in the PolyGram deal, and that WMG will

most likely end-up distributing all of London International's recordings and may eventually out-right buy the label in the future.

• EMI Music has appointed United Biscuits CEO Eric Nicoli Executive Chairman-Designate, effective May 1. Nicoli will replace Colin Southgate, who is retiring July 31. Nicoli has served on EMI's board as a non-executive director. EMI Recording head Ken Berry and EMI Publishing chief Martin Bandier will continue running the company on a day-to-day basis reporting to Nicoli and EMI CFO Simon Duffy.

• Epic Sr. VP/Worldwide Marketing Steve Barnett has been promoted to Executive VP/Worldwide Marketing for Epic and 550 Music... Universal Records promotes Jean Riggins to Executive VP/GM of the label. Riggins previously served as

President of Universal's Black Music division... With Freddy DeMann settling his exit package with Maverick (fmqb 3/5), one wonders, will DeMann wind up with another (new) label within the Warner Music Group family?... Is Danny Goldberg readying up a launch for a new label? We understand that the financing's in place, and now it's a matter of distribution and staffing ... Al Cafaro's been busy as of late. Many intriguing options await the former A&M CEO... Speaking of busy, former A&M Sr. VP/Promotion Peter Napoliello has been exercising his entreprenurial muscle. Peter's onto a couple of great new ventures. The Roadrunner Records Head of Promo saga continues with Derek Shulman focused on one super candidate in the East ... Craig Lambert's on the loose and fielding some interesting opportunities.

• The ongoing battle over low power radio stations took a couple of interesting twists and turns last week. The NAB, as well as every single state broadcasting association, along with CEMA - the consumer electronics manufacturing group -has petitioned the FCC for an extension of the deadline to file comments on the Commission's Low Power FM proposal. They want the deadline pushed back 90 days, to July 12. The NAB has been opposed to the licensing of low power radio stations from the start. Now, it appears that the organization representing receiver manufacturers is concerned about the technical ramifications of squeezing more stations onto the radio dial.

• There was another development last week that will potentially have even more of an impact on low power broadcasters, albeit the illegal variety. The 8th Circuit Court of Appeals reversed a district court ruling regarding Alan Fried, who operated an unlicensed radio station in Minneapolis. Fried, a club DJ, was using his pirate Beat Radio operation for live broadcasts. The 1996 decision allowed his station to be shut down, and his equipment to be confiscated. The Appeals Court reversal means that illegal broadcasters can now use a constitutional defense in Federal District Court. Prior to this decision, the FCC took pirates to court solely on the basis of their lack of an FCC license. A constitutional defense could not be raised. Now that it can, the FCC could find itself in an interesting position: opposing microbroadcasting, despite the fact that Chairman William Kennard supports it. If the ban on microbroadcasting is deemed unconstitutional, pirate broadcasters may be allowed to stay on the air pending appeal, and/or the formation of FCC rules to license them. Needless to say, this could open somewhat of a Pandora's Box.

• A pair of acquisitions by **Cumulus** and one by **Capstar** are the latest deals to be held up by the FCC. Cumulus is buying Solar's WDAK-AM & WSTH-FM/Columbus, GA and Mountain Wireless' WSKW-AM and WCTB-FM/Augusta, ME. Capstar is acquiring American General Media's WENN-FM/Birmingham. In all three deals the Commission is using its public interest standard to solicit public comment on how the proposed acquisitions would impact competition and diversity. Lawmakers have repeatedly blasted the Commission for getting involved in antitrust issues related to license transfers, saying that's the domain of the Department of Justice.

Format Evolution

From time to time, radio gets caught up in a cycle of "what's new?" and "what's the next format that's going to save us?" Rock radio is talking that way again. Under consolidation, the pressures are greater than ever for a magic bullet that pumps up the ratings. More than ever, record executives and radio owners would like to anticipate what format or music breakthrough is coming next. A combination of hard audience research and trend analysis helped us create a theory of music evolution that tries to explain how each new wave of original music is created.

ICONS, A&R DREAMS AND COPYCATS

Elvis and The '50s

Starting with Elvis, there's a fascinating theme that runs through American music. The three-part cycle follows this course. 1) Two musical "sounds" come together that have never been blended before. This sound is personified by an artist or group who become an "icon". 2) This generates what we call "A&R dream" time; which leads to 3) a third wave of copycats which signals the end of that era.

This three part cycle seems to work all the way from Elvis to Alanis Morissette. During the mid-'50s, Blues music was being mixed with Country and Western to create an original sound that had never been heard before. It was the first phase of Rock & Roll. One artist, Elvis Presley, captured that sound and became the icon or lightening rod for the new sound. It was fresh, caught the popular imagination and everybody wanted a piece of it.

This triggered phase 2 which is the A&R dream period. Simply put, no musical style ever emerges in a vacuum. In other words, once one person breaks through, there are usually hundreds of others who have been doing exactly the same thing and no one has noticed them. Many are making fabulous music. This is a "dream" for A&R people who sign these bands, unleashing so much music it either creates the basis for a format or significantly changes an existing format.

Once the format is on the air, the professional "copycats" enter the picture. They listen to the radio, hear what's working and figure out how to write great songs that sound just like those on the radio. Often, some of the greatest music of the entire format's history is written during this period. However, because it's merely copying, it doesn't lend originality. Bit by bit the format fades in strength. To boost it, the programmer adds in Oldies from both the "icon" and A&R dream period, giving the format new life for a while. If the timing is exactly right, the next breakthrough comes and saves them. But if the time is too long, the format either becomes Oldies or changes to something else. For example, look at what followed Elvis.

The Beatles and The '60s

After the Elvis era, Top 40 was plunged into the Bobbys - Bobby Vinton, Bobby Rydell, Bobby Darren, etc. In other words, "copycats". Then the Beatles became the icons for a new form which blended American Rhythm and Blues with British music hall sounds and photography. In other words, the look of the artist was almost as important as the music. The A&R dream phase followed with enough British bands to drive an "invasion". Copycats followed.

In the '60s there was a little time between explosive innovation. Bob Dylan was the icon who blended folk music with electric guitar technology and created the brand new sound called Folk Rock. Then, icon group Led Zeppelin mixed electric guitars, technology and Blues to create a brand new sound called "Heavy Metal".

Post-'60s - Rap and Garth Brooks

After Led Zeppelin, there was a long wait until The Eagles became the icons for a blend of Country and Rock. The next breakthrough mixed

Pop/Dance music with cable TV. The icon was Michael Jackson. The music video came of age and remained a powerful force for over ten years.

Another huge leap was Rap and Hip-Hop which combined street poetry with a technology of scratching records on a turntable. Unlike almost every other breakthrough, there was no standout "icon". This might be a case where the exception proves the rule. Then, Garth Brooks reinvented Country when he took Rock's performance power and blended it with Country music.

Estrogen Rock - So Now What?

Perhaps the most unexpected breakthrough of all came next - the intersection of estrogen and Rock. Alanis Morissette was the symbol for Rock music created by women on their own terms. "Modern" AC followed.

If the theory holds, real breakthroughs have to incorporate a blending of two sounds or technologies that haven't been put together before. They become bigger than life when manifested by an extraordinary talent or icon. It explains why the "Alternative" wave of the early '90s didn't really sustain a "new" format. Because it didn't put two things together in a new way. Rather, they were almost later day copycats.

It's hard to call the next musical style in advance. However, smart people with their ears to the ground can pick up what's happening and be ready for the next wave by paying attention when two musical "sounds" are mixed together in a brand new way.



With drummer Max Weinberg sprung from Conan O'Brien's show for six months, the European leg of Bruce Springsteen & The E Street Band's reunion tour has been announced. The first leg of the tour kicks-off on April 9 in Barcelona, Spain, touching down in Madrid on June 7. Springsteen and company will hit a combination of stadiums, sheds and arenas on the European trek. The North American leg will begin in mid-July and run through the end of September. Dates will be announced soon. Look for the band to do multi-night engagements at both arenas and sheds on our shores. The reunited E Street Band will consist of: Roy Bittan and Danny Federici on keyboards, both Nils Lofgren and "Miami" Steve Van Zandt on guitars, Clarence Clemons on sax, Garry Tallent on bass, Bruce's wife, Patti Scialfa on vocals and percussion, and Weinberg on drums. On April 13, Columbia will release 18 Tracks, a single-CD culling highlights

from last year's *Tracks* box set. *18 Tracks* features three bonus cuts: A version of "The Fever" recorded in 1973, a new solo acoustic version of "The Promise" recorded earlier this year in New Jersey and a track recorded during the Human Touch sessions, "Trouble River." A TRAUMATIC SITUATION FOR BUSH

Bush has been slapped with a \$40 million lawsuit by their label, Trauma Records, for failure to deliver their recently completed LP, *The Science Of Things*. The suit, filed last Friday (5) in California Superior Court for the County of Los Angeles, claims that the band violated terms of their 1996 recording contract by not delivering the album or a budget for said album. It also alleges that Bush is currently shopping the album to other labels. Trauma is seeking an injunction against other labels from releasing *The Science Of Things*, an injunction for Bush to deliver the album to Trauma and \$40 million in various damages and attorney fees. Trauma also seeks to enforce the 1996 recording contract until 2003. *The Science Of Things* was to have been the last album under Trauma's old distribution pact with Interscope. Trauma has since inked a new distribution agreement with BMG, which has been in place since June. We'll keep you posted.

THE OZZ-FEST RETURNS, SABBATH SAYS GOODBYE

To the delight of Metalheads and the dismay of PTA groups everywhere, Ozzy Osbourne's annual Ozz-Fest is hitting the road again this summer, with a line-up of truly Hellacious proportions. As has been rumored for weeks, the reunited Black Sabbath, Rob Zombie, Godsmack, and the Deftones (who are set to begin work on a new album later this month), will all be working the main stage. The tour will be Sabbath's farewell (really, they mean it), so that Ozzy and the rest of the band can work on their various solo projects. Also taking part in the main stage activity is Slayer, Primus and System Of A Down. The second stage line-up includes veter-

ans Judas Priest, Grammy-nominees Nashville Pussy, Puya, Pushmonkey, and unsigned acts Flashpoint and Apartment 26 (which features the son of Sabbath bassist Geezer Butler). Dates haven't been released yet, but look for a kick-off in Florida (location TBA), on May 28. *Ozz-Fest* is slated to wrap-up July 17 in L.A.

NEW VERVE PIPE DUE IN JUNE

The Verve Pipe will follow-up their platinum-plus Villains LP on June 15 with an as-yet-untitled disc. The 12-song album, which may just be called Verve Pipe, was produced by Michael Beinhorn (Hole, Soundgarden, Marilyn Manson), and is currently being mixed by Tom Lord-Alge (Wallflowers). The first single hits radio in early May, the same time the band embark on a low-key club tour to roadtest the new material. Among the album's tracks are "She Has Faces," "Hero" and "The F-Word." A collaboration between singer Brian Vander Ark and XTC's Andy Partridge, "Blow You Away," will not appear on the album, but could pop up as a Bside somewhere down the road.

September looks like when we'll finally see the long-awaited solo debut LP form former Soundgarden frontman Chris Cornell. The album, which is presently untitled, was rumored to be out in April, then June, but was pushed back in the wake of the recent Universal-PolyGram merger. Cornell, formerly with A&M, now records for Interscope. Eleven members Alain Johannes and Natasha Shneider back Cornell throughout the album, with drumming duties split between studio

whiz Josh Freese (Guns N' Roses), and ex-Soundgarden skin-basher Matt Cameron.

To follow-up on our Limp Bizkit item from last week, their new album, Significant Other, will be in stores on July 7. The band has recorded 17 songs for the album (co-produced by the band and Terry Date), one of which is a reworking of Loverboy's "Turn Me Loose" featuring Eminem, which may or may not be on the album. The track "Nookie" looks like the frontrunner for first single. Limp Bizkit will be in the headlining slot when KoRn's Family Values tour returns to the road in late summer or early fall. An appearance at Woodstock '99 and a headlining tour with Kid Rock and Staind opening are both likely.

Motley Crue drummer Tommy Lee avoided a return to jail after a judge ruled that sightings of an allegedly drunken Lee were not enough to constitute a violation in his probation. He did, however, warn Lee to stay out of bars. Lee was in a Malibu courtroom Monday (8), for a conduct hearing following reports that he had been drunk in bars in both Miami and Long Beach; a breach of his probation that could have landed him back in jail for three years to complete his sentence for spousal abuse. Lee's lawyer defended the

drummer, explaining that he advised him that it was alright to be in bars where food was served. The judge reminded both that Lee is to stay out of any place where alcohol is the primary item being sold. Motley bassist Nikki Sixx also came to Lee's defense, stating that contrary to reports, he was the one who was spotted drunk, not Lee. With Lee free and clear, the band return to the road. Their current tour wraps-up in ancouver on March 28.

f Steven Tyler gets his way, you won't be seeing photos of him in the raw any time soon. The Aerosmith frontman won a court order from a New York state Supreme Court barring his ex-wife, Cyrinda Foxe-Tyler, from using nude shots of Tyler in the paperback version of her tell-all biography, Dream On: Living On The Edge With Steven Tyler And Aerosmith. The judge has ordered a trial to determine if the nude photos must be returned to Tyler under terms of the couple's 1987 divorce. Tyler's suit claims that his ex-wife has no right publishing the photos for commercial use without his consent. The photos reportedly feature both parties nude, striking funny poses and wearing funny hats and shoes. No date has been set for the trial. Aerosmith return to the road, fully-dressed, on April 11 in Columbus, Ohio.

Epic/Legacy celebrates the memory of Stevie Ray Vaughan with the March 23 re-issue of Vaughan and Double Trouble's four studio LP's - Texas Flood, Couldn't Stand The Weather, Soul To Soul, and In Step - and the release of the 16track The Real Deal: Greatest Hits Vol. 2. All four re-issues are newly remastered and expanded, containing previously unreleased live or studio tracks and new liner notes. The Real Deal features SRV staples like "Love Struck Baby" and "Voodoo Chile (Slight Return)," along with the out-of-print, Grammy-nominated instrumental duet with surf-guitar legend Dick Dale off the Back To The Beach soundtrack, and "Leave My Girl Alone," only available on a promotional disc until now.

And you thought the Smashing Pumpkins solved all their problems when drummer Jimmy Chamberlin re-joined the band. A Princeton University music professor is suing the Pumpkins, claiming his hearing was damaged during a January 1997 show in New Haven, even though he was wearing earplugs. Peter Jeffrey, 45, is suing the Pumpkins, the city of New Haven, and the venue, the New Haven Coliseum, Also named in the suit is opening band Fountains Of Wayne and earplug maker Siebe North Inc. Jeffrey's lawyer claims his client has chronic tinnitus and also suffers from sleep depravation, both of which are taking a toll on his career as a music professor. Jeffrey was at the show for about 20 minutes to look for his son, according to his lawyer. After leaving the coliseum, he felt a sharp pain in his left ear, followed by nausea and dizziness. The suit seeks an unspecified amount of damages. In other Pumpkins news, word is that the band may do some surprise club shows in New York or L.A. soon.

Sugar Ray has landed the opening slot for the last three dates of The Rolling Stones' *No Security* U.S. jaunt. The band join The Stones April 16 in Las Vegas, and April 19 and 20 in San Jose.

Word out of the U.K. is that the new Jamiroquai album will hit the streets over there June 7, with a stateside release soon after. The band tour the U.K. for two weeks in June.

Just as her new album, *Central Reservation*, hits stores, **Beth Orton** is undergoing tests and treatment for Chrone's Disease in a London hospital. As a result, she has been forced to cancel a number of promotional appearances. Orton has had the condition for a number of years.





It features KoRn, Limp Bizkit, Ice Cube, Rammstein, Orgy, and Incubus, who did the tour together from September 23 to October 31. Included in KoRn's segment are "Got The Life," "Freak On A Leash," and "Shot Liver Medley," a 10-minute medley of bits and pieces from various KoRn classics. Limp Bizkit does their current single, "Faith," "Cambodia" and House Of Pain's "Jump Around," while Ice Cube's set includes "Straight Outta Compton/Fuck Tha Police." Over 243,000 fans saw the 27 shows on the tour, which grossed \$6.4 million. Last weekend in Albuquerque, New Mexico, KoRn fans clashed with police, injuring three cops and 39 fans. The violence erupted after KoRn was an hour

later getting to Tingley Coliseum. They got a good crowd though. Both the mayor's daughter and governor's son were at the concert.

Radiohead Documentary Due

The Radiohead documentary Meeting People Is Easy will be released on video and DVD on May 4. The film will have its U.S. premiere at the SXSW Music And Film Festival in Austin, Texas on March 20, but it will be screened theatrically only in four cities: Los Angeles, New York, San Francisco, and Chicago.

Petty Opens Seven Night Stand At The Fillmore Tom Petty And The

Heartbreakers opened their seven-night engagement at The Fillmore in San Francisco on Sunday (7). It was their first concert in over two years and was on the very same stage as their last

one. Petty introduced the opening act, Lucinda Williams. War was set for the second show with other opening acts to be announced. Petty's two-hour set contained three new songs including "Free Girl Now." An acoustic segment included "Even The Losers," "American Girl," "Mary Jane's Last Dance," "You Wreck Me," "I Won't Back Down," and "Listen To Her Heart." After The Fillmore shows, the band have scheduled an April 10 Saturday Night Live appearance followed by an April 13 Letterman slot. Fans can expect a massive summer tour beginning in mid-June.

Westerberg Hopes To Make Film With Don Was

Now that Paul Westerberg has received unanimous rave reviews and made the charts with Suicaine Gratification, next up is a big tour, right? Wrong. Westerberg wants to head back into the studio with his brother and producer Don "Wasterberg." It's lucky Don Was also happens to be a filmmaker in addition to a record producer, because instead of a tour, Westerberg would like to make a film of the band performing the songs. "I'm not prepared to tour right now," says Westerberg. "When I sat down to write these songs, I thought; no more playing live, no more tours, no more labels, no more nothing; and just sort of started over and wrote how I felt. It's almost betrayal now to say, 'oh well I've changed my mind, I'm going to put together a Rock group and go tour the world with this.' I can't quite come to grips with that." Westerberg said a couple of months ago he didn't even want to do TV, but he's now warming

how I feel right now. I don't want to go out there half-assed. I feel like I need to recharge my battery. If I'm a writer and a musicianartist-performer, performer is now pushed to the back of the lot. I'd like to consider myself less a performer and more of a creative person."

Beastie Boys Return To The Road

The Beastie Boys, who cut short their Australian tour last month due to an unspecified family problem, go back on the road April 19 when they begin a European tour in Stuttgart, Germany. They will appear on one of the two days of this year's Tibetan Freedom Concert taking place June 12 and 13 in Chicago, but they won't globetrot around to the others in Amsterdam, Tokyo and Sydney. Last month, The Beasties became the first artists ever to win Grammys in both the Rap and Alternative categories.

Creed Goes Global

Creed, whose debut *My Own Prison* was certified triple Platinum in the U.S. last week, is now taking on the rest of the world. They leave for their first European tour next week (15). The album is charting in several countries including Germany, Holland and Italy. *My Own Prison* is currently No. 1 in New Zealand. It will be released in Central and South America on March 15, and in Japan on June 21.

Bacharach Joins Cuban Caravan

Grammy winner Burt Bacharach has added his name to the list of musicians heading to Cuba later this month for a songwriting summit. He joins the previously announced Peter Buck, Joan Osborne, Indigo Girls, Montell Jordan, Lisa Loeb, Kris Kristofferson, Mick Fleetwood, Jimmy Buffett, and McCoy Tyner. Organizers at Music Bridges say interest is already so high in Cuba, they're probably going to have to place speakers outside the 40,000 capacity stadium where a concert will close the week of music making. Attorney Bill Martinez says there's already a big buzz about the project throughout Cuba. "It's a noncommercial, totally goodwill, humanitarian project," he said.

Sponge Helps Guitar Center Launch Unsigned Bands CD

Sponge will help the Guitar Center and Beyond Music launch the new CD Musician's Choice, featuring the unsigned bands discovered last fall on the Guitar Center's "Kickstart Your Career" nationwide talent search. Sponge contributed an unreleased track, "Chameleon." The only other song by a name band is Motley Crue's "Kick Start My Heart." Sponge began appearing at nine Guitar Center stores this past week (12) in Los Angeles. Sponge's new album, New Pop Sunday and Musician's Choice will both be released on April 13. Sponge's Vinnie Dombrowski says his band wanted to participate because they come from Detroit "where there

were few opportunities to get discovered. *Musician's Choice* provides a great outlet for local talent to get heard nationally," he said. The winning bands will join them at the Guitar Centers.

Private Services This Friday For Dusty

A private, invitation-only funeral service will be held in England today (3/12) at St. Mary's Church in the town of Henley-On-Thames, where Dusty Springfield lived. This will be followed by a reception at a nearby hotel to celebrate the life of the singer. "Dusty wanted a real knees-up party for her friends," said Vicki Wickham, her longtime American manager and a close friend. Complying with Springfield's wishes, there will be no memorial services in London, New York or Los Angeles. Furthermore, it has been requested that if flowers are being sent, they be sprays rather than wreaths. Commenting on the phenomenal reaction of fans and peers and the outpouring of love since news of the singer's death became public, Wickham said, "Dusty would have been really delighted." Elton John will induct her into the Rock And Roll Hall Of Fame next week (15). The Mercury/Chronicles label, which had five classic Springfield albums set to be reissued on March 23, says their releases will now serve as a tribute to Dusty.

Idol To Star In Animated Film Billy Idol has landed his next movie role. He won't be seen, but he'll be heard in Heavy Metal: F.A.K.K. 2. Idol, who last played himself in The Wedding Singer, will provide the voice of a genocidal character named Tyler, who is being pursued by a female warrior out for revenge. The movie is based on the novel The Melting Pot. F.A.K.K. stands for "Federation Assigned Ketogenic Killzone," a title for The Warrior. The film's soundtrack features music by Idol, Axl Rose, Sammy Hagar, and Stone Temple Pilots.





Warner's New Wunderkind: Talking With Shelby Starner by Sybil McGuire

Ignoring Warner Bros.' new recording artist, Shelby Starner's, tender age would be like trying to ignore an elephant in the kitchen of a studio apartment. That being said, we'd



that you ignore the fact that she's just fifteen immediately, if not sooner. Her songs and presentation are mature beyond her years, with subjects including taking

like to suggest

emotional risks and making difficult transitions, and her understanding of the industry is astonishing. Starner began taking dance lessons when she was two, and piano lessons when she was just four. Her songwriting career

commenced when she was eleven. She came to the attention of the label after her father bought her three or four hours of time in a recording studio as a Christmas present and those recordings were subsequently heard by Warner Bros. Vice Chairman David Altschull, who wasted no time in calling her. We're convinced that you'll find as much to like in Starner's music as we have.

How did you get interested in the poetry of songwriting?

I got interested in Aerosmith and Guns N' Roses, and realized that they wrote their own music. I wasn't ever really attracted to the people that are considered the poets. Later on I got interested in Stevie Nicks and other songwriters, but that was already after I started writing. It just sort of came out of my pores.

Who do you like listening to now? I still listen to Aerosmith and Guns N' Roses, and even I love The Sex Pistols. I started to get into Stevie Nicks and I like Blondie and Hole.

Most of the acts you've talked about are a little older.

I'm disappointed with a lot of contemporary music. I don't think it has as much passion. The artists that I like all built careers for themselves, and lived through so much. Their performance was spectacular, it wasn't just about a hit song. It was about careers and music. The live show is so important a lot of the new acts seem so formulated. It doesn't do it for me.

Your songs are very mature. Who or what inspires you to write?

My songs are about what goes on in my life, and there are so many things that go into my songs it's hard to really narrow it down. The actual lyrics are about specific things. "Don't Let Them" is about a time where I felt like everyone that I'd ever met in my entire life was trying to tell me what was good for me and what wasn't, and what I was capable of and what I wasn't. I decided that those people didn't know me well enough to make decisions for me. And I wrote that song to myself saying, "Don't let anybody make any decisions for you that you don't think are one-hundred percent the best thing." I was trying to raise my confidence in myself.

What did your parents think of Warner Bros. offer?

At every step throughout the process we figured that would be the end. This record could come out and do nothing, and I'm sure there are things that my parents would rather have me doing. But, it's so rare that someone gets such a big opportunity, and the people at Warner Bros. are really great. They signed me because I wrote songs, not because they were going to have a hit. They pull me aside all the time and say, "You know, this is about a career. This isn't about a hit song," and, "you're going to be in this for the long run." That really means a lot. I was given complete freedom on everything while we were in the studio, and it was great.

What are your favorite songs on the album?

I like "Suspicions." I love the mandolin that Kevin Bright, the guitarist, added. I really like to perform "Prisoner" just because it Rocks a little bit more.

Tell me what "Prisoner" is about?

"Prisoner" is about doing things that you know aren't the best for you, and then not being able to get out of bad situations. You try and make your own decisions and do what's best, but every once in a while you do stupid stuff. That's part of being human.

You worked with Craig Street, who's produced k.d. lang, at Bearsville. What was that like?

Craig's awesome. He's very funny, smart, and good at what he does. He was like the musical 'father' of the album. He took on this role as my mentor for life. He can play so many instruments, and he's just amazing.

You're going to have to tour. Are your parents planning to be with you?

My mom goes with me most of the time. She doesn't go everywhere. She doesn't go to the parties and she's not always sitting behind me. She doesn't intrude, or overstep what is reasonable.

She's there if you need her.

Exactly. My mom does not like to leave my three-year-old sister and she tries her best to keep her commitment to both of us.

What did you want to be when you grow up?

I always wanted to be a dancer. The first show I ever saw on television with music was Aerosmith, and I saw **Steven Tyler**. I thought, "This must be the most fun thing in the whole world to do for a living. There's singing, there's dancing, and there's this wild theater happening. That is the perfect combination. That's what I want to do." I didn't think that was realistic, and here we are today. I fell right into it.

The E Street Band line-up includes both Steve Van Zandt and Nils Lofgren on guitar; the "Big Man" Clarence Clemons on sax, Roy Bittan and Danny Federici on keyboards, Garry Tallent on bass, Max Weinberg on drums and Patti Scialfa on backing vocals and percussion. To coincide with the tour, Columbia is releasing 18 Tracks, a compilation of highlights from The Boss' Tracks box set, plus three bonus cuts. A 1973 version of "The Fever." a solo acoustic version of "The Promise," recorded last month in New Jersey, and "Trouble River" a song recorded during the Human Touch sessions.

R.E.M. Promotes Debt Amnesty

When the fabled G8 Summit of leading industrial nations meet in June in Germany, R.E.M. hopes to perform at a protest concert. Michael Stipe wants to take part in the protest on behalf of Jubilee 2000, a movement designed to persuade wealthy nations to write-off debts to the world's poorest nations in time for the new millennium. R.E.M. has five concerts scheduled in Germany from June 26 to July 13.

Mann Gets Good News

Aimee Mann recently received some good career news; she still has a home at the newly merged Universal Music Group. Mann, signed to Geffen, was afraid she'd be one of the artists dropped after the \$10.4 billion merger with PolyGram. According to the singer's manager, Michael Hausman, Mann has been told her next record, tentatively titled Bachelor Number Two, will be released by Interscope, sometime this spring. "It was a little frustrating because they didn't come right out and say, 'You guys are in," said Hausman. "Finally they said, 'We only told people who were dropped, not people who are staying with us." Mann, the former lead singer of 'Til Tuesday, was relieved since she's in the final stages of completing her new record. Mann has already gone through one label trauma in her career. Her 1995 album, I'm With Stupid, was recorded for Imago Records, but the company folded before the record could be released. After much legal wrangling, Geffen finally issued the album. Mann is scheduled to hit the road this summer with Lilith Fair.

Matthews On The Road

The Dave Matthews Band will return to the road May 1 in Tampa, Florida. The first leg of dates, released Saturday (3/6) by Matthews' official Web site, keeps the band primarily indoors, working arenas from the Southeast to the Northeast before ending the month with a trio of stadium shows. The tour allows Matthews a month-long break after wrapping his acoustic tour with Tim Reynolds on March 25 in Buffalo, NY. The spring tour will unveil a new fan club ticketing arrangement for the band, utilizing the facilities of the Warehouse, the official fan club operation of the Dave Matthews Band. Fan club members will be allowed to enter a lottery system prior to public sale in which they can attempt to purchase seats from an allotment set aside

for the fan club. Because of the massive fan base Dave Matthews enjoys in the U.S., tickets for most Matthews shows tend to sell out quickly. Information posted on the Warehouse site notes that fan club orders found to be placed by brokers will be voided without return of the \$30 membership fee charged by the service. Ticket orders placed through the Warehouse system are additionally not guaranteed, based on an expectation of larger demand than supply for the fan club allotment. General ticket sales for the May itinerary begin with the release of the three stadium stops on the tour in Philadelphia, Boston, and East Rutherford on March 20. The remaining eleven May performances will go on sale March 27. Santana and The Roots have been named to play on the stadium dates. Other openers are expected to be announced as additional dates are added. Dusty Albums Reissued

The Mercury/Chronicles label will release five classic Dusty Springfield albums as planned on March 23. Originally slated to coincide with and celebrate Springfield's induction into the Rock & Roll Hall Of Fame (March 15), the five influential album reissues are now also being seen as a tribute to the late legendary singer of Blue-Eyed Soul. Springfield passed away last Wednesday (March 3) after a long battle with breast cancer. A private, invitationonly funeral service was held in England on Friday, March 12 at St. Mary's Church in the town of Henley-On-Thames, where

Springfield lived. The following albums have been newly remastered: Stay While/I Only Want To Be With You, Dusty, Ooooooweeee!!!!, You Don't Have To Say You Love Me, and The Look Of Love. A 3-CD box-set anthology entitled Dusty Springfield was released by the label in November 1997, and The Very Best Of Dusty Springfield came out in April, 1998.

Tap-Dancin' Ice Queen

While the world waits for her next album, Icelandic chanteuse Björk will grace the silver screen in Dancer In The Dark. Described as a musical in the classic '40s Ginger Rogers-style, the film will be directed by Danish filmmaker Lars von Trier and cost a reported \$70 million. The film will feature over-the-top tap dance sequences set to new music from Björk. Shooting for the film, which is set in 1940's Washington, D.C., will be done in Sweden. Björk plays Selma, an Eastern European factory worker with an incurable eye disease, who moves to D.C. in hopes of raising money to help cure her son. Björk is expected to dance, perform and sing in the movie. She has also penned the film's score, which she is currently finishing in London. Her previous film credits include Pret-A-Porter and The Juniper.

New Old 97's

Get ready for a bit of a departure from cowpunks **The Old 97's**, when they drop their new LP, *Fight Songs*, on April 27. The band describe the album as having more of a "Poppier" feel than past efforts, which left them a little uncertain as to how fans and friends would react. They sent copies to friends and family to gauge reaction, and one friend, ex-Pixies frontman **Frank Black**, gave it a ringing endorsement.

Stting On Film

In case you haven't heard, Sting has returned to the big screen as one of the characters in the hit British comedy, *Lock, Stock and Two Barrels*, which just opened on our shores. In the wake of the Seagram/PolyGram merger, it's uncertain where Sting will be making music from now on. He told his fan club he's already demoing material for an album tentatively called *The Lovers*, which may appear this year.

The music is presented just as Hedges left it, a work in progress, with the exception of "Spring Buds" which David Crosby and Graham Nash finished. There's a goldmine of amazing music on this album. "Fusion Of The Five Elements," "Shell Shock Venus,"

"Arrowhead," "Gospel Of Mary/The Holy Flame," and the live track "Free Swinging Soul."



all It What It Is (Move Around/ PolyGram), the new album from Lee Nestor,

is a hallmark of the return to Rock-based female singers. In the vein of Alannah Myles, Lee combines insightful lyrics with a Pop-Rock groove. Without becoming preachy, she creates social commentary on this album. What words can describe the magic that is **Mojo Nixon?** His new album, *The Real*

Sock-Ray-Blue (Shanachie), is chock-full of nonsensical lyrics, with a drunk cowboy vibe, backed with some seriously fantastic music by the **Toadliquors**. This is <u>not</u> novelty music, this is real music, with funny lyrics. Don't pass over this album. In the way that **Frank Zappa** took making stupid themes seriously, Mojo makes sarcastic, biting music with fierce pride. You've

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tried the rest, now try the best: "The Ballad Of Country Dick," "Drunk Divorced Flooze," "Machines Ain't Music," "Disney Is The Enemy," "Rock N' Roll Hall Of Lame," "Orenthal James," "Redneck Rampage," and "When Did I Become My Dad."



The blurring of genres continues as more singer/songwriters take cues from

Hip-Hop. Sampling music and generating beats to the rhyme is really catching on. Doug Hoekstra does a little bit of that and twists it into his own unique vehicle. Make Me Believe (One Man Clapping) blends Folk with a bit of Soul and that street sensibility that is atypical to the "Urban Folk" movement. For a taste of something different: "Sam Cooke Sang The Gospel," "Choices," "Every Lover's Breath," "Behind The Shuttered Blinds," "Stolen Gun," "Atticus," and "Kudzu."



What do you get when you cross Blues with Country and throw in some

Bluegrass? You get a legend like George Jones or Steve Earle, right? Well you almost forgot the pioneer, Jimmy Murphy. It's quite possible you've never heard of him. Plagued by poor distribution in the 1950s and 60s, his records never got the nation-wide respect or sales that he deserved. Thanks to Sugar Hill, we now have Murphy's music to keep his memory alive. Every song on here is a classic, it's not just Country or Blues or Rockabilly, it's the sound of a real singer/songwriter. Check out: "Electricity," "Shanty Boat Blues," "Wake Me Up Sweet Jesus," "I Get A Longing To Hear Hank Sing The Blues," "Mother Where Is Your

Daughter Tonight," "Louise," "Corbin Stomp," and "John The Baptist."



Stephen Bruton brings his brand of Texas Soul-Rock to life on Nothing

But The Truth (New West). He was originally influenced by the cornucopia of music in his parent's record store. He honed his skills playing with Kris Kristofferson and as Bonnie Raitt's lead guitarist for two years in the early nineties. Bruton recorded his first album in '93 and hasn't looked back since. We liked: "Nobody Gets Hurt," "That's Love," "Trip, Stumble And Fall," "She's The Reason," "The King Of Everything," and "Spirit Lake."



Bocephus King is not the name of that preacher that comes on television

on Saturday nights on the local cable access channel. It's the name of a group of Roadhouse musicians that like old movies and have a singer reminiscent of **Tom Waits**. A Small Good Thing (New West) combines elements of

Country and Blues into a Waits-

like narrative and a Canadian

laid-back-bacon style. Here's a

few songs to listen to Eh?: "The Haunting Of A New York Moon," "Ruby," "I'll Die In Mine," "Think About You," "Tired Of Waiting," and "Heart Like Yours."



The monks of Tibet have a singularly unusual vocal style of chanting. Called Tuvan

throat singing, the style allows the vocalist to suggest, if not actually produce, several notes at a time. Putting this style to music is the idea behind Ondar's new album Back Tuva Future, The Adventure Continues (Warner Bros.). Willie Nelson, Randy Scruggs, and Bill Miller all appear on this album. Ondar says "Our throat singing has been passed down from countless generations. It is the immortal part of ourselves." World music shows must check this out, Rock on, Ondar.



FEAR FACTORY OBSOLETE, ROADRUNNER



Why are you reading a review of last year's *fmqb* Metal album of the year? Because the fine folks at Roadrunner have reissued the album in a special collector's edition digipack. What does that mean? It means that not only do you get extra artwork with the new edition, you also get five new songs! The most interesting track (and the one that will

cross them over to Modern Rock) is a cover of Gary Numan's "Cars," featuring Gary himself on vocals. With the success of ORGY's version of "Blue Monday," expect this to be a surefire hit. The other four songs give good reason to rediscover FF too, especially the precision syncopated riffs of "0-0 (Where Evil Dwells)" and "Concreto."

SOIL THROTTLE JUNKIES, MIA

You've already been spinning their two EP's, and *El Chupacabra* is still in the Top 10. Now with their hard driving, guitar riff-laden grooves and classic Metal influences, **SOIL** offers-up their powerful full-length album *Throttle Junkies*. The Chicago five-piece display their thunderous sound with 10 fresh tracks to sink your teeth into. Some of these full throttled tracks include "Everything/Road To Ruin," "Damning Eden," "Concrete Slave," "Shining Man," and an acoustic offering of "Damning Eden," showing just how diverse these guys are.

SIMON SAYS *JUMP START*, HOLLYWOOD

SIMON SAYS' debut shows tons of promise. Co-produced by Rob Cavallo (GREEN DAY), the band got a jump start on their career (pun intended) with a song on the *Varsity Blues* soundtrack. Even though the kids only range in age from 19-22, they've been together for five years and have two independent albums under their belts. The band's sound ranges between upbeat Pop-Punk and a touch of Emo-core, kinda like a jam session between QUICKSAND and GREEN DAY. Dig on "Sever," "Life Jacket," "Nucleus" and "Trip Wire."

NEBULA *SUN CREATURE,* MANS RUIN

It seems like **NEBULA** puts out a record every other week. Their 1998 release, *Let It Burn*, was recently re-released on Relapse with a few new tracks. Now the So-Cal stoner Rockers have unleashed an EP on Man's Ruin. The band's been on-tour since their last album came out, which has honed their talent for **SABBATH**-ian, cannabis-drenched jams. All four tracks will make you feel like breaking out the lava lamp and blacklight, but we're grooving on "Rollin' My Way To Freedom" and the title track.

The Offspring, "Why Don't You Get A Job" (Columbia/CRG) Another dark horse to replace Sugar Ray at #1 is the latest hit from The Offspring's brilliant *Americana* release, which vaulted into the Top 10 (12*-9*) this week by getting major spins from KWOD (53x), KNRK (43x), KPNT (41x), and KTEG (41x).

No Doubt, "New" (Sony/550 Music) After last week's 52 adds, eight more jump on board, bringing the cume to 69 stations. "New" snags this week's chart jumper title (41*-18*), sliding in behind the Goo Goo Dolls' "Dizzy" (22*-17*) as the only other track to break into the Top 20.

The Cranberries, "Promises" (Island) So, The Cranberries were beat to the year's first 50+ add week by No Doubt's performance last week. That's alright, Muira and Langton went out and grabbed the first 60+ add week (65 total) of the year! There are way too many call letters to list here. Next week we'll just start listing those not playing this song.

Citizen King, "Better Days" (Warner Bros.) With seven new adds (WXDX, KMYZ, WIXO, and KQXR among them), Biery and Goldklang now have over three quarters of the panel on this track. MTV is also supporting this with prime spins. Uhh, what is everyone else waiting for?

Blur, "Tender" (Virgin) Okay, we'll admit that this song is going to stretch the boundaries of your radio station, but many of you said the exact same thing about "Song 2" and look how that turned out! This song deserves a shot, don't discount it as "Tender" is infectious and leaves a lasting impression. KROQ, Q101, WBCN, WHFS, CFNY, CIMX, KEDJ, WLIR, WBRU, and WBTZ are among the stations already spinning this. Hey, we even heard it on Kingston's WXRK!

The Living End, "Prisoner Of Society" (Reprise) Divney's dedication to this band has paid DIVidends as sales are starting to take-off in key markets (New York City, Los Angeles, Detroit, Seattle) where spins have been significant. "Prisoner" cracks the 1,000 spin barrier (1026) this week. If you have an open night slot, this is worth a shot!

Silverchair, "Anthem For Year 200," (Epic) A strong move (39*-26*) and spin increase (+242, 857 total) keep these Aussie boys on a quick line to the top stratosphere of the chart. The band is currently making a swing across the U.S., dazzling fans with a great live show.

My Friend Steve, "Charmed" (Mammoth) Sean Maxson continues to develop this track and cracks the *Modern 40* (42*-39*) this week. Fans of this song are out there. For "Charmed" to keep its upward momentum, now is the time to give this a shot. WNNX, KMYZ, WRAX, WXSR, WPLA, WMRQ, WKRL and thirty other stations have made friends with this song.

Dangerman, "Let's Make A Deal" (Sony/550 Music) Nine more stations deal Klaiman and add (including WQBK, KDGE, KRZQ, and KBRS), as this NYC outfit cracks the chart (60*-46*). Prime players dispensing this to listeners are KTBZ, 91X, KKND, WPLY, and 40 others.

Kid Rock, "Bawitdaba" (Atlantic/AG) Kid Rock is starting to capture many of the open night slots with the second single from *Devil Without A Cause*. Seven new adds bring the cume to 28, but it's quality over quantity at this point as call letters playing "Bawitdaba" include WXRK, KROQ, WXDX, KPNT, WQBK, WBCN, KEDJ, and WNFZ. Both hometown stations - WXDG and CIMX - have great phone stories.



Back so soon? That's what many of you were probably saying when this new release from Frank Black & The Catholics arrived. After all, it was just last September that Black and his new backing unit pulverized us with their self-titled, recorded live to two-track, effort. Carrying on in that vein, *Pistolero* (SpinArt) is another batch of spontaneous noisemanship from the former Pixies leader. The guitars are cranky and dissonant (new guitarist Rich Gilbert moves serious air), the rhythm section is tight as a drum and Black's ever-tuneful shout is in fine form. Tracks like the Punk-Boogie hybrid "Tiny Wire" and "Bad Harmony" stack-up to some of Black's finest moments with The Pixies. And the manic shuffle that is "I Switched You" brings to mind Black's grossly under-appreciated 1994 solo effort, *Teenager Of The Year.* At this rate, Frank and his Catholics should be ready for a box set by the first quarter of 2000. With the aid of a hand-picked, all-star cast of pals (Jakob Dylan, Chris Whitley, Daniel Lanois, The Dirty Dozen Brass Band, and T-Bone Burnett among them), Joe Henry had quite a few folks to exchange ideas with for his new longplayer, *Fuse* (Mammoth). Getting inspired rather than lazy, Henry takes the ball and runs with it -- real far. Like his past production efforts (most notably with his wife, Sam Phillips), Burnett frames Henry's wobbly character sketches with sparse, yet musically diverse production. Henry's songs benefit immensely, as the slow and smokey "Angels" sizzles with an understated grace, and the lead track, "Skin And Teeth," rolls along at its own pace. Treasures are found elsewhere with tracks like "Monkey" and "Great Lake" While you wait for new music from folks like The Wallflowers and Elvis Costello, turn your audience on to this oft-overlooked songwriting genius. The Moa/Bjork comparisons are inevitable. They're both from Iceland. Both posses voices that will leave you breathless and make the hair on the back of your neck stand up. And, most importantly, both weave seductive aural tapestries that defy categorization. Moa's debut LP, *Universal* (Tommy Boy), will make you want to dance. It will also make you want to lay back and breathe it all in. It's a schizophrenic waltz through the annals of Pop music (recalling Trip-Hoppers like Massive Attack, the vocal stylings of one Eartha Kitt, Drum n' Bass, and everything in between), that shows Moa shares similar traits with that other Icelandic chanteuse, but she's got skills of her own. "Toy" trots along like a futuristic roller-disco, while the lead track, "Joy & Pain," is dance music for the mind, and the soul. Contact: Liz Koch (212) 388-8493.

Analog And Vulnerable

The digital revolution is happening at a time when radio may be vulnerable. Spotloads are rising, listening levels are declining, albeit slowly. And many people detect a post-deregulation blanding creeping into large market radio. Arbitron reports 17% of listeners are dissatisfied with over-the-air radio.

XM VP of Programming Operations Dave Logan (another terrestrial radio refugee) sees these trends only getting worse. "As stations continue to push inventory levels up and tighten down playlists, it's only going to drive people more that way. The reason people are flocking to Internet radio and MP3 sites and away from commercial radio is because commercial radio is too restrictive. We believe that people are ready for adventurous radio stations and compelling content."

As the Marconis of the millennium employ digital technologies, radio continues to rely on analog delivery, at least until IBOC arrives. "Radio is being pulled by a horse and the automobile is here," says *MStreet* publisher Robert Unmacht. "Analog technology is ending."

Internet access is highest among young people: 81% of 12-17 year-olds and 71% of 18-24s are online. Men are more likely to surf the Web than women. Internet usage is highest among core Alternative listeners (91%). "Think about these kids being raised on the Internet," says **Tom Barnes** of **Sinton, Barnes & Associates**. "That's going to be their defining cultural thing. They're the Internet generation."

And this generation experienced its first grand scale Internet event last fall, when the notorious **Ken Starr** Report was released. Out of 40 million to 53 million wired U.S. homes, an estimated 24.7 million unique users logged on to the Web during the first two days the report was available, according to Web measurement service **Relevant Knowledge**.

Barnes says it's frightening to consider how few radio people see how big the Web has become: "They comfort themselves by saying it's still in its infancy and it will only increase as bandwidth increases. As more people get more bandwidth, they're going to be able to take more and more control of what they listen to." Today's computers, he says, are the digital equivalents of vintage radio crystal sets.

Though there's no hard evidence to support the claim, expectations are that online's biggest impact will be on TV usage. There are conflicting

reports on the Web's tangible effects on radio time spent listening. Arbitron and Edison say radio TSL among online Americans averages 90-minutes less per week than among those who aren't using the Internet. As Internet usage continues to grow, radio TSL may see continued erosion, they say.

But a recent study by The Media Audit reports a positive correlation between Internet usage and radio TSL. As minutes-per-week logged on the Web went up, so did time spent listening to radio. "That's good news for radio," Media Audit's Philip Beswick says. "Radio could be enhanced by the Internet."

Radio's weathered plenty of new technologies that were supposed to put the hurt on it: CBs, cell phones, digital cable radio, even MTV. Says RadioWave's Fiddick, "the wolf was cried [in the past] and there was no wolf. But now I think there genuinely is a wolf."

Yet satellite and Webcasting could actually expand the radio market. "Any time there's more competition, two things happen," Fiddick says. "Market shares of the existing competitors go down, but over-all shares of the sector generally go up, because competition expands the market." In that scenario, the availability of more programming choices will net more "radio" listening. Although local radio shares could be diffused, Fiddick thinks most at-work listeners will, out of sheer habit, continue to choose their favorite local station- even on the Internet. "If local radio stations continue to do a good job of serving their local audiences, I think they'll hold up well on the Internet,

assuming they're there in the first place."

What about the 1000-and-still growing Internet-only radio stations? Their market is likely to be "a mile wide and an inch deep," Fiddick suggests. Like satellite radio, Web-only stations have the potential to siphon small numbers of listeners from individual markets. Add it all up and you may have an audience that's salable on a national basis.

Frank Wood's seen the radio industry from several vantage points since founding WEBN/Cincinnati in 1967-programmer, manager, owner. Since selling Secret Communications at the height of degreginduced deal-making, Wood's kept a low profile, focusing on what he calls "cattle egret deals", dabbling in venture capital, syndicating radio Web sites. "Radio's always been under siege," he points out. "It got clobbered by television and reinvented itself. It's really under siege now with new technology. The question is whether they can technologically replace what radio really is. Radio has infinite portability; it's everywhere, it's ubiquitous. And it's not the most important thing in your life. You're not glued to a single place with a wire coming out of the wall. It doesn't occupy your eyeballs. Most of the attackers don't fit that model. Online radio is a pretty neat idea for limited use but it only works when you're on your computer."

Broker Gary Stevens—another guy with a multi-dimensional perspective, from WMCA/New York "good guy" to President of Doubleday Broadcasting thinks it's all just part of an ongoing radio erosion that began when automakers began putting tape and CD players in cars.

"The radio business is going to hurt from a thousand cuts," not unlike the way scores of new low cost channels eroded network TV programming, Stevens says. Satellite and Webcasting are only the latest intrusions. "Radio has to be careful," he warns. "If it becomes more neutral, if it's no longer 'come down to the remote' or 'let's do a free concert in the park,' then the floodgates are open. With so few owners, one would assume they would protect their proprietary interests."

The public hasn't reached media overload... yet, says Tom Barnes. "They're consuming more and more and, eventually, there will be a peak of what they can take," he says. "But there will always be a place for radio. When Edison invented the light bulb, it didn't stop them from piping gas into everybody's house."

As the public embraces new media, Barnes feels radio's audience will become diffused. "It doesn't mean everyone will run away from radio. Radio will continue to be the least expensive [medium] for people to use and that will always give it an economic relevance. But there are some huge threats, specifically Internet and MP3 technology. MP3 is putting an incredible amount of power in the hands of individuals. It's a scary thing if you're in the business of building a consensus audience."

Others, like MStreet's Unmacht and First Union Capital analyst Bishop Cheen don't think the threat to radio is immediate. Cheen says any satellite radio challenge is at least a couple years away. "That's a fragmentation challenge that terrestrial radio is going to have to deal with," he says. "They have 75-years' experience of dealing with fragmentation. History should count. Radio has survived. Movies and TV were supposed to kill the radio star. Some people thought the Internet would kill the radio star. It's ridiculous."

Cheen perceives the Web as a creative and promotional offshoot of radio, not something that will challenge it economically. "There's no economics to Internetonly radio at this point," he says. "Someday there will be, but that's many moons away." Fiddick agrees, saying Web radio represents more of nuisance than an economic threat: "It's very difficult to build a local audience big enough to compete with local radio stations. And how do you build a national audience? The niches that are there to be filled are small national ones that require no small amount of marketing. For Internet radio to make money on an advertising model is very problematic. But it's a lot easier to put up Internetonly radio station than a terrestrial one."

The Satellite Radio Model

The satellite-to-car concept came to David Margolese shortly after he'd invested in a 1989 cable radio startup. "I concluded, 'Gee if you're going to do for radio what cable did to TV, you'd better do it where people really listen to the radio," says the Chairman/CEO of CD Radio, holder of one of two Digital Audio Radio Service (DARS) satellite broadcast licenses granted by the FCC in 1997. Both New York-based CD Radio and Washington, D.C-headquartered rival XM plan to beam 100 channels of digital-quality music, news and audio entertainment to small, palm-sized antennas in cars, homes and other places, beginning late next year. Their credo: Do for the car what cable TV did to the home, namely, offer more choice. That means designated channels for Chamber Music, Boleros, Reggae, Folk Rock, Alternative Rock I, Alternative Rock II... you name it. Both subscription-based models (around \$10 a month) will require users to purchase plug-in radio cards or special receivers costing between \$200 and \$400. Alpine, Pioneer and Sharp are building receivers. Satellite-delivered signals will be augmented by extensive terrestrial repeater networks, cause for some political consternation among standard broadcasters. (If CD Radio relies on seven repeaters to cover the New York market and five to get the job done in San Francisco, can the FCC justifiably still call it a new "satellite" service, opponents say.) When they launch next year, both CD Radio and XM will have invested nearly \$1 billion in the service. Detroit's already feeling the love. CD Radio has opened a Motor City office and hired an automotive

audio vet to oversee marketing alliances with car manufacturers. GM subsidiary Hughes Electronics has a 26% stake in XM.

Satellite radio's target audience is the 13% of the population who tell Arbitron they're dissatisfied with conventional radio. Standard broadcasters have always attempted to occupy the largest, most profitable format positions in local markets. You don't spend \$68 million on a Class C FM to go Reggae. That strategy leaves room for the next level of narrowcasting, what Logan tags "niche filler formats"— positions unoccupied or underrepresented on conventional radio. Formats left in the dust by some consolidators, like Adult Standards and Classical, could be more economically



viable as national satellite formats. "National gives you an opportunity to create these kinds of formats and assemble an audience on a national perspective that becomes a very big audience when it's all added up," says Logan. "There's a significant number of people that don't have that richness of choice."

He's right. More than 10 million Americans receive less than five FM stations. Half the commercial radio stations in America are either Country, News/Sports, or Oldies. And 27% of annual music sales are of genres unavailable on traditional radio. Even in radiosaturated L.A., no station plays Metallica with any regularity.

For satellite broadcasters, pro-choice doesn't just mean fringe. Both services have partnered with media brand names like USA Today, C-SPAN, BET, Bloomberg, and One-On-One Sports to develop specific channels.

Satellite radio's initial appeal may be limited to an audience with very specialized tastes and people who spend a lot of time in their cars. XM estimates it will need 2.5 million customers to break even. Logan says satellite will eventually broaden to a mass market, like cable television has... but not overnight. "We're not going to put commercial radio out of business," he says. "But we are going to be in the business of radio in a big way." XM's 100 channels will be "real radio stations," he promises, with "elements of companionship, entertainment, personality and emotional glue. We're packaging our service in a mode that a traditional radio consumer is already comfortable with. Our goal isn't to knock off WDVE in Pittsburgh. Our goal is to give listeners who want a new unique compelling product an opportunity to experience that, by offering diversity, adventure and stylistic differences that disenfranchised and disenchanted listeners will seek out."

The Webcast Model

But with a sound card, modem, and a decent computer, disenfranchised listeners

can already create their own Web jukebox... for free. ImagineRadio.com tags itself "the leader in customizable Internet radio." Users select the genres and the specific artists they like from lengthy lists. Using a 1-5 scale, they assign a rotation frequency to each. Voila! You hear only what you want to hear, how often you want to hear it. Or you can select one of the site's 23 "professional stations," with names like Friction ("experience constant motion in this world of drum n' bass"), Julie ("Alternative music for thirty-somethings who think they're twenty-somethings"), Jerry ("Jerry, Janis, Jimi. Hippie Rock and jam bands), K-FAT ("some call it Americana, but fatter"), The Pit ("serious head-banging for serious rockers")

In June, all of ImagineRadio's offerings will fall under the MTV Networks umbrella. The Viacom unit is acquiring the Webcaster with plans to leverage MTV and VH1's music clout as part of a Webbased brand extension. Viacom has earmarked \$250 million worth of advertising on the cable channels over the next five years for what it has dubbed "The Buggles Project." Plans call for more than 100 preprogrammed audio music channels, and, in time, the six new digital music video channels recently launched by MTV and VH1. Buggles enables Viacom to offer Jazz, Classical and other niche genres not currently served by either cable TV channel

ImagineRadio has plenty of company on the Web already: There's broadcast.com (the Web home of Dr. Laura Shlessinger and Rush Limbaugh), spinner.com, radio-directory-com, sunsetradio.com, talkspot.com, and others.

All of which will sound much better over a pair of Microsoft Digital Sound System 80 speakers. The software giant in November unveiled what it hopes will become a new product category: "high quality speakers that deliver superb digital audio to the PC." The three-way system includes a subwoofer and two satellite speakers.

> Web As Radio Brand Extension While Webcasting's ultimate impact on over-the-air listening levels remains to be seen, radio is increasingly using the Web for brand extension. At last month's *Gavin* convention, WPLY (Y100) PD Jim McGuinn floated the idea of an onlineonly station to complement the Philadelphia Alternative outlet. Modeled after MTV's M2 channel, Y100-2 would be a whole new station that broadcasts exclusively online. Listeners would have the choice of listening to the Webcast of the original product or a deeper, more experimental version.

> Meanwhile, the radio station Web site model is changing. Information is the No. 1 thing onliners want from station Web sites, not jock pictures or email addresses or how to buy station swag. Another startling fact to emerge from Arbitron and Edison's second Internet study was this: eight out of ten online people say they would be "likely" to seek information on products and services from a station Web site. (31% said "very likely," 53% "somewhat likely.") The bad news: Radio station Web site content is not compelling enough to drive frequent visits. "Radio station Web sites are not igniting the imagination of surfers," the report concludes.

> If the radio industry gets serious about the Web, they may find their next non-traditional revenue frontier looming in cyberspace. E-commerce offers the promise of a new revenue stream that simultaneously reduces on-air clutter. Entertainment Commerce Network is a model advocated by Forrester Research. The Web-based

concept is defined as "an integrated set of internal and business partner sites that shepherds real-world audiences to online commerce opportunities." (See above.) With a combination of Interactive contests, e-mail-delivered purchase incentives, and on-air promotions, stations would work to convert listeners into "online shoppers."

The most obvious commodity to sell? Music, of course. It's already the top product category for online purchases. When Arbitron and Edison asked Web surfers what kinds of products and services they'd like to buy from a radio station Web site, music ranked the highest. Purchase partnerships with music companies seem like a natural for any musicbased radio station.

One outfit poised to surf the e-commerce swell is RadioWave. They claim they can turn conventional stations into "radio with pictures." The music you play on the air has a simultaneous Webbased visual, thanks to digital audio stream encoding. While isteners are hearing The Offspring's latest on their radio or PC, they're also viewing the album cover, the artist's name and song title, and a "buy now" button linked directly to Amazon.com. It's the same deal when spots run. Stations design visuals that accompany their commercials-a map, a logo, a link to the advertiser's Web site, even an application for car insurance that gives you a price quote. "It's a way to make the spots stickier," says RadioWave's Paul Fiddick, and another avenue for the Web to become an extension of broadcast radio, offering more ser1) Ford places national, multilevel, on-air/online ad buy with Cox Radio.

> vices to listeners and advertisers. "It may have been a reluctant destination for a lot of broadcasters but it's going to be a place where we're happy that we landed," Fiddick says of the Net.

By driving its cume to the Web, radio has the ability to become an Internet portal. But streaming live audio on the Web isn't cheap. The ability to handle just 500 simultaneous users can run you \$1000 a month. Forrester pegged the cost of serving 1 million simultaneous Web radio users at \$25 million a month!

Despite all the new choices, Robert Unmacht feels companies that have invested in programming are safe because they can leverage strong programming content anywhere. Frank Wood's advice to programmers? "Go out and make great radio and people will flock to it. It's still a superior delivery medium. It's here, it works, and there are a billion radios out there. Smart young programmers should be thinking, how do I create great radio again."

For XM's Lee Abrams, the medium is definitely not the message: "AM, FM, Internet, satellite... who cares? The people that deliver the stellar, brilliant programming will win." That content-is-king sentiment is echoed by Bishop Cheen. "At the end of the day, the ears go to the best show," he says. "Media consumers always have this bottom-line knack of finding the best content and they really don't care if its over the air, through the ground, or through the bathroom window."

Do To Radio What Cable Did To TV?

ddressing the industry during the 1996 NAB convention, a former group head made the point that radio is the only media "not under siege by some great competitive thrust eating away at their base." While newspapers suffered dramatic circulation declines, and broadcast television shares were getting pummelled by cable TV penetration, radio was in for a much easier ride. Usage declines were minimal. Radio's exclusive ability to broadcast audio to the car went unchallenged for decades. It remained ubiquitous, portable, and free.

Two-and-a-half years after that "not under siege" comment was uttered, radio's competitive plot is thickening. Satellite radio is just around the corner. Internet audio services from established brand names like MTV and *Rolling Stone* are popping up like weeds. FCC Chairman **Bill Kennard** is hell-bent on initiating a new class of low powered FM stations.

Is it radio's turn now? Are we under siege? As the millennium approaches, does radio need to reinvent itself... again?

TV executives know all too well how a multitude of new, fragmented, programming choices can erode audiences. Nielsen figures document the mass reach broadcast networks' downward spiral. The Big Four TV networks had one million fewer viewers for the 1998 season premier week than the year before. And the Big Three saw a 13% drop in adults 18-34, which happens to be one of the fastest-growing demos online.

There are Internet parallels to cable TV's beginnings. Both are subscription-based, neither are portable. Satellite radio pundits echo comments heard about cable when it was first introduced: Who'd pay for something you can get for free? And in the case of Internet radio, why flock to a service you can only receive through a wire?

The answer to both questions: choice.

Many satellite and Webcast radio advocates think the new services could erode conventional radio the same way cable impacted broadcast TV— only faster. The online audience is growing quicker than cable— 4 million to 7 million households are coming online each year. "Online will reach 75 million homes before its growth begins to slow," AOL CEO Bob Pitman said during a Forrester Research conference last fall.

The implications for radio are substantial. The percentage of Americans who have listened to Web radio has doubled in just six months, from 6% in mid '98 to 13% in January '99, according to Arbitron and Edison Media Research. At this rate, 25% of the entire population could have sampled Internet radio by the year 2000.

"Internet is to radio what cable is to TV," declares RadioWave.com Vice Chairman Paul Fiddick. "Cable TV did it to network TV and satellite will do it to FM, the same way FM did it to AM," adds XM Satellite Radio Sr. VP of

Both new media cheerleaders spent nearly three decades working in terrestrial radio before joining the competition. "If you're a local television station, can you afford not to be on your local cable system?" Fiddick asks. "And yet radio broadcasters are a little behind the curve in seeing that the Internet is that same kind of thing to them in the offices. 75%-80% of a radio station's billing runs between 6a and 7p, Monday through Friday, when most listening is taking place in a workplace environment. Make the assumption that in the workplace of the future, if not today, everybody's got a computer and broad-band Internet access. If they're inclined to listen to some kind of audio at work, why would they bring in a radio set from home and maybe pick up 20 stations when they can go to the Internet and, today, pick up 2000 radio stations or radio equivalents."


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
