



INSIDE TOP 40 WITH DAVE SHOLIN

Former number one artists Phil Collins, Wham!, and Tears For Fears, are now joined by fellow Brit Paul Young who put up his strongest fight to conquer Top 40. Looking down the road it's Sting, Corey Hart, and Huey Lewis waiting in line to pull into the top spot. Tears charted top ten at Z100 and WPLJ-New York, Bl04-Baltimore, B-94 and WHTX-Pittsburgh, Z106-Philadelphia, Q105 and Z98-Tampa, WLS and B96-Chicago, KAFM-Dallas, KIMN and Y108-Denver, KIIS/FM-Los Angeles, etc. More than a handful of number ones among more than 25 reporters listing it Top 5. Top airplay record of the week is Huey Lewis with 281 mentions and a Hit Factor increase of 10% to 37%! West Coast boasts the most Top fives on Depeche Mode, KLUC, KDON, KJOY, KIIS/FM, KKHR, FM102, KRQK, KSTN, KKXX, etc. Plenty of room for growth in all regions. John Parr

has all the makings of a big hit, with impressive debuts at WZZU-Raleigh #22, WHTX-Pittsburgh #16, WKXX-Birmingham #28, KWSS-San Jose #30, KPKE-Denver #27, KCPX-Salt Lake City #30, etc. Benatar's 47 adds and chart stats pull her past chartbound for one out of only three debuts on the Top 40. Excellent week for Howard Jones with adds at CHUM, WZON, KC101, WBBQ, WKAU, KIIK, WXXQ, KRQ, KTBC, KUAD, KWNZ, KZZK, etc. Guaranteed a chart slot next week. 23 more believers on A-Ha including WKTI, CKOC, WANS, WQLT, WPFR, KQHU, WKMI, KSAQ, KFIM, 14K/92K, etc. First to report Ratt Top 10 is Frank Bell at KQWK-Pittsburgh, Kansas. Frank says Ratt "Is first concert to sell out in Joplin, MO in five years!" The single and LP are selling Top Ten and most importantly, Bell mentioned that

requests are "coming from more than their traditional teen male base"... with response from 25-30 year old demos." REO goes over the 100 mark in total reports with 64 adds including WSPK, B-94, WZYZ, WTCO. G100, WHSY, Q104, KCLD, KDSR, WSPT, KYYY, KMAJ, KKYS, KRZQ, KFIV, KIYS, etc. Finally in reviewing last and this weeks Record To Watch some noteworthy numbers emerge. Growth continues on King in the West Coast at KIIS/FM 34-25, KKHR #30, KLUC-Las Vegas debut at 34 with an add at KMEL-San Francisco. OK95-Tri-Cities moves it 14-10 plus adds at KFIM, KLRZ, KSTR, KSAQ, etc. Motley Crue turning the old Brownsville Station hit into a winner for the 80's. New on WCIL, KITT, KLUC, WDEK, KKRQ, 92X, WQID, WTHZ, WJET, WAPP, B104, B106, WBBQ, WGGZ, WDAY, etc. Many programmers express firm belief in this one.

TEARS FOR FEARS:

BIG HITS FROM THE BIG CHAIR

In 1983 Tears for Fears released their first album "The Hurting." The record was enthusiastically received by Alternative radio and established the band with a concrete base. But before their next LP, the group went through a period of musical re-evaluation. Their latest release represents those changes and they came up with the winning formula. "Songs From The Big Chair" has brought the band to a level of recognition that takes most bands many years to reach. With a number 1 album, number 1 single, "Everybody Wants To Rule The World," and another single, "Shout," racing up the charts, they certainly have become one of 1985's biggest "new" bands. The bulk of their songs are written by lead vocalists Roland Orzabal & Curt Smith, and keyboardist Ian Stanley. We spoke to Roland Orzabal in the midst of the group's first tour of the U.S.

PS: How did you and Curt Smith get started in performing music?

RO: Well, we met when we were fourteen. We didn't go to the same school or anything. We just met by a mutual friend and we seemed to get along. I'd always been in sort of kid groups and that kind of thing, strumming the guitar. I heard him singing along to a record in his bedroom and asked him to sing with the kid group I was in. We've since been in and out of groups together.

PS: What kind of music were you and Curt playing early on? Were you doing covers?

RO: Oh yeah, yeah. Cover versions of the most popular heavy rock songs you can think of, we've done them.

PS: Can you remember any of the specific groups?

RO: Well, the popular side of heavy metal. Thin Lizzy, Alex Harvey, Led Zeppelin. PS: Really?

RO: Yeah. Luckily we grew out of that.

PS: What inspired you to take a change

in direction? That's quite a departure from what you're doing now.

RO: It was incredibly gradual. It was over about, god knows how many years, five or six years. Point is, when you're a kid you don't really know what you're doing. You're into different styles or whatever takes your fancy. It wasn't until I was about 18 or 19 that I started to write seriously.

PS: Were there any artists that influenced your change in musical direction?
RO: Namely the Talking Heads and Peter Gabriel.

PS: After your album "The Hurting," you released a single called "The Way You Are" in England. Didn't you re-evaluate yourselves musically after that record? RO: Well, we were just getting so into the intricacies of making a record together that we forgot about the songs. So we concentrated and made "Songs FromThe Big Chair" out of a bunch of sounds. It took us a really long time to realize that it's sometimes better to start with the song and then make the record, and not the

other way around.

PS: Did you make any other adjustments? RO: We decided to be a bit more simple and direct. A bit more communicative and easier to understand.

PS: Do you think that "Songs From The Big Chair" is very different from your last album "The Hurting"?

RO: Well, there were some similarities, but it's just a lot better. It's more mature. I think that it's more representative of what we're like as people, where "The Hurting" is just one side of us.

PS: What was missing on "The Hurting"?

RO: I think it was just lacking in humor, lacking in cynicism, and there wasn't enough sarcasm there. I think we got all of those elements and a lot more in the new album.

PS: Is the new album more pop sounding to you than your last one?

RO: I don't know really. It's in no way as lightweight as some of the tracks from "The Hurting," like "Change," which I considered to be incredibly poppy. I don't think we've gone anywhere nearly that lightweight on this album. I think it's a lot easier to understand because there's less stuff to wade through.

PS: In the music, or in the lyrics?
RO: Musically. The lyrics are subtle enough for you to not be bothered by them, and you can slide by. Whereas, on "The Hurting" it's difficult to not be bothered by them. "The Hurting" was incredibly blatant and honest, and the new stuff is more poetic.

PS: Do you think "The Hurting" is relatively sad compared to the new album?

RO: I think it is, I mean, "The Hurting" was a plea for emotion. It was asking a lot of questions and offering maybe one solution. I don't know. I mean the first track, for instance, says could you please explain the hurting, a whole bunch of questions. The second album says when the hurting and the pain have gone, we will be strong. It also says it's time to put your clothes on and face the world. We were laying ourselves down on "The Hurting." This time we've put our clothes on and faced the world. (chuckles) PS: Did you do anything different in the production of "Songs From The Big Chair" than your first album? RO: Our whole approach was completely different with "The Hurting." We were like incredibly precious. We were scared to put anything onto tape (on the first album). Unfortunately, that fear wasn't helped by our recording engineer who felt the same way, he just wanted to get everything so right that we couldn't see the woods from the trees. We used a different engineer on "Songs From The Big Chair" and he was a very very mutual element. He just sort of did what he was told. We threw things down and that way you can see how things are developing quicker. PS: How about the manner in which you

recorded it?

RO: The first album was done in eleven different London recording studios without one day off, working really late into the night. I just remember being incredibly tired for a long,long time. The new album was recorded in our keyboard player lan Stanley's house, on his equipment. We took Sundays off, we never worked later than nine o'clock at night, and we had a really good time.

PS: How long did it take you to record it?
RO: Well, "Mothers Talk," which was a big change in direction for us, took two months to record.

PS: That one song?

RO: Yes. Well, just different versions and working on it ... that kind of thing. "Shout" took a month. The rest of the album took about the same as those two tracks and that was three more months. "Everybody Wants To Rule The World" was done in a week. We got into such a rhythm in the end that everything was coming together.

PS: Were many of your other songs written when you started recording "Songs From The Big Chair"?
RO: No, not at all. I mean first of all we did "Mothers Talk." Then we got into a few problems with it.

PS: What do you mean?

RO: Well, we couldn't agree. The producer, Chris, and myself especially, could not agree on what it should be. He went on a holiday and we were told to take a month and to come up with more songs for the album, which I thought was a bit of a joke, just to have one month. But funny enough (chuckles), I came up with about five songs in that period. We'd already had the working of "Head Over Heels" and "Broken," and I just came up with quite a few ideas, "Shout," "Everybody Wants To Rule The World," "I Believe," a couple of other things that didn't make it. (laughs)

PS: When you're writing music, does it come to you in the middle of the night, or do you have to lock yourself in a room?
RO: I lock myself in a room with a synthesizer and a drum machine and just sort of muck about, really. Those two instruments are enough elements to keep you interested for a long, long time, because you can muck about with different rhythms if you're bored. You can muck about with different sounds on a synthesizer, sculpting sound and that kind of thing, making up sounds. And when you find something that inspires you, it all falls together.

PS: What type of things inspire you?
RO: I largely start from rhythm. I tend to nick rhythms of other people's songs if I like the feel and then take it from there. I mean the rhythms end up getting changed, but you've got a song out of it

PS: Synthesizers are a major element in the sound of your band, yet you don't come across as a stereotypical synthopop band. Why is that?

RO: Well, I just think we're pretty good at it, and not a lot of people are (laughs). We just use it and you can do what you like with it. However, people tend to not use it to its full extent.

PS: How do you get more out of them?

RO: We spend a long, long time on sounds! If we're going to use a synthesizer sound we don't just pick one out of the air. We use a pre-set. We think for a long time about it and sculpt it. PS: "Everybody Wants To Rule The World" is obviously a song about power

RO: I don't know, is it?

PS: (laughs) It kind of sounds like it. Is it not?

RO: To a degree. But I mean I just had a tune that goes (humms) "everybody dadadadadada"! I just needed to fit some words to it

PS: (laughter)

RO: It's all quite innocent. But there are a few inside jokies in it. I wouldn't say it was a power struggle of the world, it's not about that at all. It's more possibly about one person than anything else, but you don't know him (laughter).

PS: And I assume you won't tell us who that is.

RO: No.

PS: But it is an inside joke.

RO: Yeah, there's a lot of inside jokes. I mean it goes, "so glad we almost made it, so sad we had to fade it." What that's about is the record company wanting to knock five seconds off the length of "Shout" because they thought it was too long. It's a six minute record and five seconds was like their compromise. I just think that's pathetic.

PS: What's "Shout" written about?
RO: "Shout" works on a couple of levels. The easiest to understand is quite simply, it's about making a noise. Making your opinions known about how you feel about what's going on socially, politically, things that disturb you. One thing that disturbed an awful lot of people last year was the installment of American nuclear weapons in England and that frightened an awful lot of people, including myself.
PS: I get the impression that you were much more relaxed in making this album?
RO: Oh god, much more.

PS: Why?

RO: I think we were getting so much pressure to deliver this second album, that we almost gave up ever thinking or hoping that it was going to be any good. So we just thought we've got to do it and we'll do it. We concentrated on what I call the money tracks, singles, and we did. But because we'd given up on wanting it to be so much of a brilliant album, it became one. It was just a good atmosphere in which to work.

PS: The title of your album, "Songs From The Big Chair," is from the movie "Sybil."

Why did you choose that? RO: I don't know if you've seen the movie but it's pretty good! It's quite a primal movie. It's about a girl with 14 different personalities. She's a poly-schizophrenic. Each personality is a different circumstance which she can't seem to deal with. Like closeness of people and that kind of thing, and having a good time. The "Big Chair" is the chair in a psychiatrist office where she sits and talks about her past. So we just chose that for a very warm and strong image. PS: Did you have any idea that "Everybody Wants ..." and "Shout" would

be this huge?

RO: I thought "Shout" would be. Chris Hughes, our producer, told us that "Everybody Wants ..." would be our first American hit. That's why we did the song, and I guess he was right.

PS: Are you surprised by your success? RO: Well ... I'm happy. I'm glad about it. I don't live on that nice edge of chart positions. If it happens, it happens, and that's great. But that shouldn't stop you from thinking about the next project and how good that's got to be. Do you know what I mean?

PS: I know exactly what you mean. You're only as good as your last record. RO: That's right.

PS: After your current album runs its course, do you think you'll go back and re-release any singles from your first album, "The Hurting."

RO: I don't know. I don't know what the plans are. I mean we always intend to move forward and it would be difficult for us to suddenly turn around and release the old material or re-release it in single format. I don't know why. I just don't feel it would be right.

PS: You were once quoted as saying you didn't care if you make it in the States, whereas England was very important to VOU.

RO: Yeah, I probably said that one, didn't 1? ... (laughs) ... Well, I think it's more important for a lot of other people than it is for us directly, I mean, the record company obviously, and a lot of people who we are involved with. Because it's that kind of pie-in-the-sky pipe dream to have a number one in America. Having said that though, a number one in England has been more elusive so far. We've been number one in virtually every territory apart from England. I'm glad that we've been number one in the States. I'm glad that we've achieved that. At least it gets it out of the way.

PS: You must be getting tired of being mentioned, at least in this country alongside bands like Wham!, and other British pop bands.

RO: Yeah, I find it quite insulting. (laughs) Unfortunately America just has the kind of more glossy versions. There are some great British bands.

PS: Which ones do you really like? RO: Well, there's a Scottish band called The Blue Nile. They're going to be absolutely huge.

PS: Yeah, we're very familiar with them. We like them a lot.

RO: Let's see, what else ... I like Depeche Mode.

PS: Even though you guys have been at it awhile, compared to many bands, you're an overnight success. What have you learned from other bands who have had a similar fate to insure that you can maintain that momentum?

RO: Well, I'm not really concerned about maintaining the momentum. I think it's pretty unlikely that we will. I mean, I'm not . going to rush off this tour and into the studio to make another album for fear of losing our profile. We've already been through that kind of thing. I mean we lost our profile in England terribly after "The Hurting." We didn't do anything for six months and then we released "The Way You Are" which didn't even make the Top 20. Then we took another six months and released "Mothers Talk," which didn't reach the Top 10. But it's down to making

good records and we came out with "Shout" which was bigger than anything that had come before. So I'm not concerned. I like approaching things from new again. Like starting again. If we never ever have a number one again I'm not going to be that concerned.

PS: What differences do you see between the American audience and British audiences?

RO: Well, it seems to me once you've made it in America, you're almost made for life, in the terms of American audiences loving old names. Like, the Kinks can do nothing in England because they're old fashioned. There's always new bands coming along left, right, and center. The emphasis is on new products ... exciting things, fashions, trends. In the States, it's not like that at all. It's very conservative and static. That's a lot of the

PS: From what I've read, the press likes to portray Tears for Fears as a very serious band. Is that an image you're comfortable

RO: Not really. No. I mean we are serious of course, we should be taken seriously, but at the same time we're not glum characters. We do have a sense of humor. PS: Pop songs often center around love themes. Is it fair to say most of your music doesn't?

RO: That's fair, yeah.

PS: Why?

RO: I've just got so many things I want to say that "I love you" seldom crops up. I can't believe every time you hear a newborn scream you just can't see the shaping of a life. I'd rather say that, then "She loves you yeah-yeah-yeah" or, "Wake me up before you go-go," I find that insulting to one's intelligence. PS: So where do you want to go from here?

RO: Well, I'm not sure; we could either decide to become big stars and get recognized in the street and be in the press all the time or we could decide to be a bit more anonymous and just make great records, which I think is probably a bit more realistic.

PS: Yeah, because I've read you wanted to get better, up to the level of The Talking Heads or Peter Gabriel. Do you think you've reached that?

RO: No. not yet, Almost, I think a lot of what we're doing is a lot fresher than what those people are doing at the moment. But there's a long way to go, I think.

PS: What do you think it will take to get there?

RO: Umm ... age. (laughs) I think when you get older it gets a lot easier. I mean, a lot of the differences in the songs on "The Big Chair" and "The Hurting" were that I turned 21 during the middle of "The Hurting" and I turned 23 during "The Big Chair." I think that difference comes across in the music.



PHILIP OAKEY & GIORGIO MORODER

Philip Oakey & Giorgio Moroder (A&M)

Whatever the beLEAGUEd fate of the HUMAN LEAGUE, here's something equally entertaining. PHIL OAKEY's collaboration with synthist/composer/producer GIORGIO MORODER extracts what was brilliant about DARE, adding a bit of pop gloss, minus what was contrived about the next one. I'm a big fan of the original MORODER/ FORSEY school of technology. Also, if you enjoyed last year's Electric Dreams track (included on this LP), this is well above and way beyond. Ten songs sweep into each other dance floor style, so do be agile. Otherwise enjoy this fantastic LP. Why Must The Show Go On/Goodbye Bad Times/Valerie.

Staying Out Late With—Beat Rodeo (IRS)

Lest the sticker on the front misleads you, RICHARD GOTTEHRER only produced the first trax on each side (Just Friends and Without You). DON DIXON (REM/LET'S ACTIVE/TOMMY KEENE) helped etch the rest. Anyone who remembers the BEAT RODEO EP on Coyote produced by RICHARD "Bongo" BARONE, go to the head of the class. The rest of us need to listen to this new slice of Americana. Try Heart Attack and you hear a happy country/folk sway. Guitarist DAN PRATEX squeezes some nice tone's out on lead guitar. This will be a major summertime Alternative hit on our charts. Heart Attack, Without You/Just Friends.

"Tonite It's You"—Cheap Trick (Epic)

Whattaya get at GAVIN? Sometimes you get an open mind. This band's been up and down like a yo-yo. Tonight It's You has a teenaged melodic shrill that does climb plateau by plateau. I actually prefer the more concise single edit. Now, on that last final note, take your finger and slow down the turntable. Sounds cool, huh? Hit record.



"Best of Both Worlds"—Midnight Oil (Columbia)

each and everyone of you could see this band play the roof off of a club (or hall), you would be a believer. True, there's still a presentational gap between stage and studio. Producer NICK LAUNAY (who added a modern twist to CLAPTON's LP) has done his job keeping MIDNIGHT OIL on the cutting edge (politically and) aurally. Pushing Best Of Both Worlds was probably the band's choice. An alternative choice could be When The General Talks . MO will tour this summer with UB40. Having seen both bands play, I'd say UB40 are brave souls.

Cast The First Stone—Urgent (Manhattan)

URGENT fits snugly in between a mainstream medium hard rock sound

with a modern twist. Produced by IAN HUNTER and MICK RONSON, it's no wonder the mix is blatantly cinematic. Such a sound was engineered by the legendary SHELLY YAKUS (PETTY, NICKS) and played by three brothers named KEHR, a KLYPH and a YUL. Start with side one, cut one, Runaway, the single.

"Send My Heart"—The Adventures (Chrysalis)

In a similar vein, THE ADVENTURES also play in a tight mode. The band toured the UK extensively, opening for TEARS FOR FEARS with the probability looking good for the same slot here. Produced by BOB SARGEANT (ENGLISH BEAT, XTC), the fidelity is not only enhanced by the already wide 12 inch grooves, but also by the audiophile pressing.

Return To Waterloo—Ray Davies (Arista)

The last few KINKS LPs haven't exactly bowled me over, and although RAY DAVIES' RETURN TO WATERLOO isn't a big budget masterwork, it has heart. Considering RAY DAVIES' insightfully lyrical glances at his own homeland in his music (especially on his later Reprise work), it should be interesting how he cuts it visually as a film director working with the same subject matter-provincial British middle/working class life. I like the emotional one-man-bandish title track, Return To Waterloo.

WINNING IS BECOMING A HABIT

hey've got an All-American appeal. They don't indulge in drink or drugs. In fact, the only habit they've developed lately is winning. They're Sawyer Brown. And they're hot.

Using their musical expertise, these guys won \$100,000 on a television show. No, it wasn't "Name That Tune." It was "Star Search," the slick, '80s version of "Ted Mack's Amateur Hour." The spirited country band's 12 appearances

culminated in their winning the \$100,000 Grand Prize as The Best New Star Musical Group last year. They've been on a roll ever since.

When I caught them between sets of a concert at Great America amusement park in Santa Clara, Ca., on Memorial Day weekend, they were excited about the fact that their current single, "Step That Step," had just hit the number one spot. Their debut album, "Sawyer Brown," which includes many songs written by band

members, was lodged at number two on the country charts. And they've been playing premier venues as a supporting act for Kenny Rogers. Forget the Jacksons. This is what I call a victory tour.

Not bad for a group that, up until recently, was scratching out a living performing in seedy Southern honky tonks and motel lounges.

Sawyer Brown, named for a road outside Nashville, is comprised of five amiable, young men, aged 24-33: Mark

Miller—lead vocals and rhythm guitar, Bobby Randall—lead guitar and vocals. Gregg Hubbard—keyboards and vocals, Jim Scholten—bass, and Joe Smyth, drums. Two are from Florida, two from Michigan and one from Maine.

"Everybody moved to Nashville to seek their fame and fortune," said Bobby. But first, there were dues to be paid.

"We made the best of a bad situation," said Mark. "For the most part, people touring the club circuit burn themselves out. We did things to avoid that happening to us. We tried to treat every day like a normal day at home. During the day, we'd rehearse, we'd work out, play golf or go shopping.

"As for performing, we had to do songs that were popular, that were on the radio. But we'd do them our own way."

Competing on "Star Search" wasn't a planned escape from the entertainers' twilight zone. "It was an accident," admitted Gregg. "We thought we were going to film a promotional video for a booking agency. We got down to the studio in Nashville and it said, "Star Search Auditions." We just assumed it was too pop-oriented for us to ever fit into the show. So we just clowned around during the audition and left and didn't think anything more about it.

"They called three days later, saying they wanted us in Los Angeles the following week. We were so surprised!

"After the first rehearsal for the TV show, they seemed to take us seriously, so we started to take it a little more seriously too."

"After the first show," added Mark, "we developed a game plan. For groups, the audience seemed to like a lot of energy. So we never, ever did a ballad. Everything we did was uptempo stuff."

They couldn't complain about the pay. With AFTRA union scale plus \$1000 for each win, the band was raking in \$6500 per show. And "Star Search" only needed them Monday through Thursday, so they played their regular bar gigs on weekends.

Pitted against rock, soul and r&b groups in the contest, Sawyer Brown scored the ultimate victory. The exposure led to a flurry of industry interest. They landed not only a first-rate management firm, but a five-year contract with Capitol/Curb Records, which had offered words of encouragement a couple of years before, when other labels were callous in their rejections. These career boosts were the greatest rewards.

Though the band had accumulated over \$170,000 on "Star Search," "The money wasn't as big a deal," Mark claimed, "because in the music business, \$100,000 doesn't go a long way." A large chunk of it went to upgrading equipment. The four married band members, who'd been living in apartments, made down payments on bourses.

Winning the "Star Search" Grand Prize

wasn't the end of the challenge; it was the beginning. "Our goal was always to reach the very top of contemporary country music," proclaimed Mark.

That clear focus was needed. "After we won," said Mark, "we had people talking to us about doing movies; we had people talking about writing us a TV series. We're not actors; we're musicians. We didn't want to be the Monkees. We want to be the Beatles.

In our age group, when you went through high school, rock 'n' roll was the thing to listen to, so we, of course, were influenced by that."

"You didn't drive through McDonald's with Merle Haggard playing," laughed Bobby.

That doesn't mean that Merle was a stranger. As Mark explained, "All of our parents listened to country music. So, at an early age, we'd hear Charley Pride and Conway Twitty. We'd go to all the country festivals. We learned to like all kinds of music."

"We listen to anything," said Bobby. "We may listen to Merle Haggard and we may listen to Huey Lewis. !? all depends on our mood at that moment."

Jim noted, "Joe used to play with a symphony orchestra. I played with rock 'n' roll and jazz bands. Gregg used to play organ and piano in the church. So there's a real wide diversity."

"We're trying not to put a label on our music," said Bobby. "We just play what we want and whoever likes it, fine."

"Our audience ranges all the way from 14-60," added Mark. "It doesn't matter what they want to call it. If they call it rock 'n' roll, that's fine. If they want to call it country, that's fine too. To us, it's just Sawyer Brown music."

Just what is Sawyer Brown music? "It's fun music!" declared Bobby.

"It's got a nice energy. And it's got a country flavor to it," said Mark.

And if critics are less than enthralled with the result, that's okay with the band. "The artsy-type critics haven't a clue of what we're trying to do," said Jim. "We're not here to create art. We're here to make hit songs."

"It's goodtime music," said Bobby. "You don't try to play our records backwards to get some message out of it."

It'd be even more fun for Sawyer Brown if their songs hit pop as well as country charts. But they're not trying to force it.

"We don't put a conscious effort into aiming at the crossover market," said Greg. "You can't calculate a song that will definitely work for both country and rock."

Bobby agreed: "The people have to decide that It's like John Anderson's song, "Swingin'" crossed. That song is just real country. People will cross something you'd never think would cross. So you can't put together a chemical formula for a crossover song."

But a little friendly persuasion couldn't hurt. "We've visited some pop stations and

they've been real receptive to us," reported Bobby.

Mark said, "You have to go in with the attitude of 'Hey, listen, I need your help.' You don't go to a radio station, rock 'n' roll or country, like 'I'm the greatest thing that's happened. You guys gotta play my records.' 'Cause they don't have to play your records. You have to be very humble."

Said Gregg, "Eventually, at least theoretically, program directors have to answer to their audience, regardless of their personal taste. They're playing records for the people out there listening. So, if enough pop radio listeners want to hear our songs, the stations will play them."

"I think maybe program directors could listen to the audience a little bit more," opined Mark. "Some listen. Some don't. Some play just what they want to play. It'd be nice to have a request line to see what people want. It would be easier for new bands to come up through the ranks without having to go through Nashville and the big record labels."

"Loretta Lynn and old Mooney just sent out 100 records and pictures to get the attention of program directors when she was starting out. And her song reached number one in the nation. And she didn't even know what the charts were. She didn't even know she had a hit song. It's a lot harder for a new artist to get airplay today, the way they program radio."

"One of the nicest things to happen to country radio was the "Urban Cowboy" thing."

Bobby concurred: "That probably paved the way for people like us and Alabama to come on with a more contemporary sound."

Added Gregg, "Even if it was a fad as far as what happened on the pop charts, it made being on the country charts more lucrative. Alabama is making a whole big splash and a lot of money. Ten years ago, no one in country music was making that kind of noise or money. And, in turn, D.J.'s are becoming more open. If they weren't, we certainly wouldn't be getting airplay with "Step That Step." A few years ago, country radio wouldn't have touched it."

Said Bobby, "Programming is all up to one guy usually. Some stations are real big on Hank Jr., Waylon, David Allan Coe and that outlaw scene. All the jocks dress up like that—cowboy boots and hats. Other stations will be geared to Conway Twitty and more traditional things like that.

"I like to listen to a station that plays a little of everything—a little Marshall Tucker, a little Conway ..."

"And a lot of Sawyer Brown," quipped Mark.

With a new single, "I'm Getting Used to Blue", out now and a second LP due in September, they should be hearing plenty of Sawyer Brown over the airwaves. There's no end in sight to this winning streak.

Since many of you are already reporting rotations rather than chart numbers (and some of you have both and are willing to report either way), we would like some of your input. If,

when reporting rotations, you can provide us with the closest number of plays-per-day each rotation gets, we would be better able to supply our readers with an accurate listing of singles which merit the numbers they

Our new computer sy:tem, which we fondly refer to as GRIP (Gavin Research Information Process), allows us to feed in both Rotation and Number charts. It takes the information and not

only ranks them in chart order for us, it also does all the math. statistics, and Hit Factor (of which we are very proud).

Because months and months and hours and hours of preparation went into our computer design (which is a custom software program designed by the Gavin Editors on the advice of a good Systems Manager who took many hours to give us what we wanted) we feel that we can contribute a valid chart based entirely on the

P.D. NOTEBOOK

TEST OF A PROGRAM DIRECTOR

It occurs to me that there are two attributes that separate the average PD from the truly exceptional one. See how you compare on these.

First is the extremely-difficult-to-learn ability to place yourself in your listener's head, and perceive the station as they do Any number of PD's know how they want the station to be perceived by the listener, but then turn out a station that accomplishes that to them, but not to the listener. PD's know formats, other stations, business trends ... listeners know no more about radio than they see on WKRP in Cincinnati, and what a station means to them often has no relationship whatever to what it may mean to an industry insider. You've got to be able to get inside the head of the average listener, who may not even remember your call letters, and make it come out the way you intend for

This attribute, as I say, is something some PD's are born with, and very few seem able to learn it if they don't have it to start with. However I have noticed that a large number of such gifted PD's had one or more legendary stations to grow up listening to-stations that have served as inspirations to them once they got into the business-and it could be one learns this attribute as a youth being strongly influenced by one or more stations, later developing the ability (as George Lucas does in films) to translate those emotions and reactions into terms that recreate the same impact on their own stations, updated to be relevant to the target audience, today.

The other attribute is the ability to take that "feeling" about the station that the PD wants to create in the mind of the listener, and reduce it to a pattern of conduct on

the air that will reliably accomplish it, regardless of what person is on the air. The format!

Many PD's know how they want their station to sound, and it sounds that way when they're on the air, but the rest of the staff can't seem to get it to sound that way. The problem, then, is that the PD has to be somewhat creative within his own format to make it come out right; those who don't share his (her) vision of what the station is to be simply follow the rules—and it doesn't sound the same. The rules, in this case, must be refined.

That is not to say that the rules should be so rigid that the airstaff feels like automation equipment; there must be room for creativity, even if it's just some freedom in selecting a record from a designated playlist category, in order for the staff to communicate effectively to the listener. But the rules that are important should be clear and should be required of the airstaff: Things like where the breaks are, how they're handled, what's in them; what the music sequence is; how the station portrays itself as an entity to the listener. And if the PD devises the rules right, simply following them will enable any air personality to make the essence of the station turn out the same every time. There are few programming accomplishments that give a PD more continuous pleasure than hearing a wellthought-out music rotation work right every time!

Of course, there are those programmers who know how they want the station to sound, and devise a set of rules to accomplish it—but fail to take into account the human element of their own staff. If the format is so inflexible that it allows no creativity or even thought by the airstaff, it may be technically right, but it will lack the vital spark of enthusiasm and



imagination that would have made it soar. If the format is defined with such enormous complexity that it becomes impossible for mere human beings to remember everything and execute it all, it matters not whether every last bit is down in black and white-it won't be done right. (And the PD who hounds the airstaff with constant diatribes about mistakes in execution should be shot at sunrise. Nobody does their best work under the shadow of the sword, and the PD must bear ultimate responsibility for making sure that the format is well thought out enough, and presented clearly enough and simply enough that mere mortals to execute it properly.)

From my own experience, I'd offer two tips to programmers in writing their format documents: Don't just list a bunch of arbitrary rules, also include the rationale behind them, so the airstaff understands why they do what they do. This not only gets better cooperation from airpeople, but allows you to be much more comprehensive in the ground you cover, since when it all falls into place and makes sense to the air person, the details will be executed better on the air. And second-reduce everything to its lowest common denominator. That means the smallest number of categories of music before the music sequence repeats; it means fewer rules rather than more. Just enough to do the job right, and no more. Allow staff latitude on elements not essential to the format integrity!

WHAT AN HONOR!

National Secretaries' Week was observed at KDWB-MINNEAPOLIS by morning guys BUCK & O'CONNOR. They had secretaries write in twenty-five words or less why they would want to be seen having lunch with Buck & O'Connor. Winning entries were picked up by limousine and delivered to lunch.

GIRLS NIGHT OUT

As the opening of the general fishing season in WISCONSIN neared, WXYQ-STEVENS POINT decided to come to the rescue of the areas soon-to-be "fishing widows." Using the JUDDS thencurrent hit "Girls Night Out" as the theme, WXYQ sponsored an evening out for the ladies at an area nightspot. Assistant PD/MD DAN OLSEN hosted the event, which featured live country music.
