


INXS has finally cracked the top ten in the U.S. Spectacular growth in many markets, including WTIC-Hartford 21-6, WZON-Bangor 22-12, WHTT-Boston 15-7, Y107-Nashville

23-16, WEAM-Montgomery 22-8, WKLQ-Grand Rapids 22-16, KKEZ Ft.Dodge 23-13, KZZP-Phoenix 21-13, KPKE-Denver 24-18, KKHR-Los Angeles 13-7, KWOD-Sacramento 22-14, etc. Crossover pick back on January 17 was FORCE MD'S, now definitely headed top ten, nearly doubling in Hit Factor at 35%.



KQ95, WLXR, WLKI, etc. CHARLIE SEXTON slips by Chartbound, picking up 35 new believers and helped by impressive numbers at KEWB 27-18, KOZE 18-10, Z-92.5 (11-7), WYTZ debut #20, etc.

I have once again decided to undertake the massive and Dear Ron, difficult task of organizing and presenting another worldwide simulcast of "We Are The World." This year's broadcast has been scheduled for Good Friday, March 28th, at 10:50 A.M., Eastern Standard Time. As of today, I have received confirmations from Japan, Hong Kong, the British Broadcasting Corporation (BBC), the Mutual Radio Network and the group "Alabama" has given the first celebrity endorsement. Mutual will feed the simulcast to its 5,200 affiliates, with at least 800 of those affiliates airing the simulcast (this is the absolute minimum number of Mutual stations that will air the simulcast).

For this year's simulcast, I have sent a personal letter to Soviet leader Mikhail Gorbachev, urging him to participate in the simulcast through this nation's broadcasting network. If the Soviets truly want peace, I think it would be an appropriate gesture to participate in this simulcast.

The theme of this year's worldwide simulcast of "We Are The World" is world unity. Through this simulcast, I also want to bring attention to the "Hands Across America" event, scheduled to take place May 25th.

Last year's simulcast was a phenomenal success. Over 8,000 radio stations participated in the U.S., as well as 27 foreign countries. I hope to top that success this year.

If there is any doubt in your mind about this second worldwide simulcast, just remember the emotion and unity that people around the globe expressed and felt on Good Friday, 1985. Another reminder: I am merely a small town radio announcer and not a record promoter or bureaucrat.

BETTER IT BUILT



or decades, radio stations granted a construction permit had only a few months to complete the construction, but could be granted extensions of completion time fairly routinely upon relatively uncomplicated showings of this or that causing delays.

The FCC has cracked down on the practice, and under the new FCC rules, any "CP" or construction permit granted after December 10, 1985, will be good for an eighteen month period-but extensions will be granted only under special circumstances. Thus if your station has a CP issued after that date, or more to the point, is about to file a CP request, be advised this rule is now toughly enforced-18 months and they take it away again, unless: (1) construction is complete, the facility is being tested, and a license application will be filed soon; (2) the licensee can demonstrate that construction is well underway, equipment orders have been placed, and nothing is blocking continuation of construction; or (3) the cause of the delay is clearly not under the control of the permit holder, and he/she has done all possible to resolve the delay.

Those who have CP's issued prior to last Dec. 10 will be granted up to 3 six-month extensions under the old terms, but then the new rules go into effect for them too.

You might wonder why there should be any unconstructed CP's that don't fall under the three major exceptions mentioned above. Actually, there have always been a ton of them ... when FM was still a sickly band, 15 years ago, there were a lot of unbuilt stations, with the permit holders simply hanging on to the CP in hopes of the economic prospects improving enough to justify going ahead with construction—or selling the CP. Even today many CP's are sold, unconstructed

and UHF TV, for its entire history up to the present, has seen many of its authorized stations never built. The thinking was that it would someday be a profitable franchise, or a saleable one, and UHF TV stations with high power are enormously expensive to build and operate.

The FCC lately has been cancelling unbuilt TV and radio CP's, and CP's for major changes that were granted and not built within the time limit, so the moral here is that you should not file for a CP till the money and the willingness are there

to go ahead and construct, when it's granted!

One type of station that should be thinking about filing for a CP is the class B or C FM station that is operating at significantly less than maximum power. You have a couple more years to get it up to maximum for your class and transmitter height, or the FCC has served notice they may reclassify your station downward, or drop in another station on your frequency or adjacent frequencies at distances closer to your station than the rules would have permitted. That's because they will assume you don't want more power and then you'll be forever stuck with the power you have. Check with your Washington D.C. attorney for dates and requirements.

Changing the subject, the February 1985 Stereo Review magazine contains (pp. 101-102) a large ad for the latest electronic marvel from the innovative leading-edge audio equipment company, Carver Electronics in Lynnwood, Washington and lo and behold, the new Carver #TX-11a stereo receiver has not only state-ofthe-art FM stereo, but state-of-the-art AM stereo too (Motorola C-Quam-it will work on Harris system signals with the later pilot tone, too, of course).

This is very significant, not only because Carver is so influential with other manufacturers, but because this probably is the receiver of choice to demonstrate AM stereo. I quote from the ad: "The performance of the legendary TX-11 Asymmetrical Charge Couple FM Stereo Detector Tuner is increased by the addition of Ultra High Frequency Wide Band AM Stereo circuitry. With the new TX-11a, AM stereo sounds as good as FM. Yes, contrary to popular belief, most AM stereo stations have frequency response (20 Hz-15 kHz), separation (35 dB), and signal-to-noise ratios (70 dB) audibly indistinguishable from FM stations of equal strength. It's just that only Carver offers the technology to appreciate this hidden performance.

The two-page spread goes on to announce as features in the unit, "unique de-emphasis curve," "whistle stop cancelling circuit," "pilot signal cancelling circuit," "an ultra low noise balanced station detector," and "use of very wide band, minimum phase intermediate frequency amplifiers." I haven't even heard it, and I'm excited! If you want to locate a dealer, the ad suggests calling 800-633-2252, ext. 886.

Guitars, Cadillacs, Etc. Etc.—Dwight Yoakam

(Warner Bros.)

Nothing against PAT BENATAR or RICK SPRINGFIELD, but finally the sympathetic expertise of a technical producer like guitarist NEIL GERALDO is finally taken advantage of by eight feet firmly planted on the street. DEL LORDS writer SCOTT KEMPNER pretty much wears his fears, guilt, and paranoia on his jacket sleeves. He masterfully captures the loneliness and desperations of urban living well within the context of a four minute rock song. After that, the rest of the band and GERALDO propel those core naked emotions to the ultimate level. As PEOPLE MAGAZINE glosses and gleans some of our heroes into the realms of superstatus, we as radio music professionals are driven underground to dredge up the next likely heir apparents. Dredge isn't exactly the perfect way to describe the process. It does connotate work and sweat, and while it's sometimes a chore to extract the gold from the ore, JOHNNY COMES MARCHING HOME is nothing but a joyful traverse. For once the good guys with believeable things to say get the clear production, the lyrics printed, and the cool cover package. With the business hopefully on the dawn of a new era, JOHNNY COMES MARCHING HOME is a well timed victory. LOVE LIES DYING/ the emotional SOLDIERS HOME/ HEAVEN/DREAM COME TRUE/ the

instrumental DRUG DEAL.

It's not that we're crossing formats (and so what if we did), but DWIGHT YOAKAM is one happenin' hellcat and a GAVIN favorite. Remember the first time you heard the original BURRITOS, EMMYLOU, T.BONE BURNETT--artists that sent you reeling into unfamiliar territory, looking, like PETER FONDA, for the lost American essence? YOAKAM is a tug of war between renegade country and an alternative hybrid of modern highway country punk. Unlike most pre-digested country prodigies, DY seems in semi-control of his own careening destiny. Here's a few good signs. The four corners of this LP are all intact from his orginal independent EP. His quitarplaying sidekick produced the LP while YOAKAM himself designed the 50's/80's sleeve. By thanking, on the sleeve, other artists who know what it's like to succeed between the pigeon holes (BLASTERS, LOS LOBOS, MARIA McKEE), DY makes an important association. If you aren't immediately serviced with this fine LP, call up and say, "I'm an exception."

"Stick Around"—Julian Lennon (Atlantic)

"Stick Around" is more an Album Radio grower than just Top Forty ratings fodder. JULIAN takes a different direction on this single, possibly to stave off teen idol status. This song seems to reflect some of the harder edged material that JULIAN LENNON mentioned as being left off the first LP. So here it is.



'Out Of Mind Out Of Sight"-Models (Geffen)

Big new sound from the Aussie producer MARK OPITZ (INXS, COLD CHISEL) and MUSHROOM records (SPLIT ENZ). The band is MODELS and the joint'll rock when you spin this loud. This is modern stuff, not unlike INXS, as opposed to jackhammer metal. Already added at WLIR in heavy.

"Right Between The Eyes"—Wax (RCA)

ANDREW GOLD supplies the sense of humor GRAHAM GOULDMAN no doubt experienced during his tenure with 10CC. "Right Between The Eyes" sure sounds like a runaway multi-format springtime/ summertime hit record. Both GOLD and GOULDMAN have impressive 70's credentials. How they decided to tackle the 80's with WAX (they met when GOLD produced a 1980 10CC LP) sounds like a possible GAVIN story . Stay tuned.

"Impressed"—Charlie Sexton (MCA)

According to a personal private poll of music pros, coming up strong as a potential mega-star is CHARLIE SEXTON. As a guitarist, singer, live performer, and a looker, SEXTON has made some steady inroads. The tragic part of Album Radio today is that we must break our acts single cut by single cut, rather than as artists. Things may seem splintered and spread out, yet there has been and is steady progress at work, enough to impress well over 100,000 buyers. Beware.



attention, he makes no bones about the fact that his music is his priority. We talked to Gary whil he was in the studio in Nashville working on a new album.

LS: Why don't you tell us a little about your background?

GM: I grew up in Ft. Worth, Texas. My father worked for Southwestern Bell and my mom was a housewife. I have a twin sister who currently lives in Arizona, and I have a younger brother who lives in Arkansas. I grew up in middle class USA. I lettered in four sports in high school. At that time in my life, I planned to become a professional athlete.

LS: In which sport?

GM: Probably baseball. I also played football and basketball and ran track, but I thought I had the most ability to play professional baseball.

LS: When did you start singing?

GM: I was about four when I sang my first solo in the Southern Baptist Church. After that, I sang in the church choir and sang in the chorus in Jr. High School, but that was about it. I was playing ball and sports was still number one. Then, right out of my sophomore year of college, I went to Colorado with a couple of guys and we ended up getting a job singing in Denver. So I stayed there five years. I ended up going to school in Denver instead of going back to Texas Tech, which was where I was going to play ball. That's where I started my singing career.

LS: So it was at this point that you pretty much ruled out a career in sports.

GM: Yeah. I'd gotten beaten up pretty bad. I'd ruptured a disc and I don't have any cartilage left in my nose because it was broken so many times. Then all of a sudden I started singing and making money and I wasn't getting beat up. So I decided there might be some potential in a singing career (laughs).

LS: You've said that having been involved in athletics has altered the way you do things.

GM: I was competitive at a very young age because of athletics and I was always fortunate enough to be on good teams and had good coaches. It was instilled in me to be competitive, and now that I'm in the music business—which is highly competitive—it gives me a leg up. I'm used to that kind of pressure. As a matter of fact, it doesn't even bother me. So sports have altered the way I look at things, but in a positive way.

LS: What was the connection between Jimmy Carter and your eventual recording contract?

GM: I worked with Carter in '76 when he was running for president. Some of his guys heard me sing in Ft. Worth and asked me if I wanted to go on the road and open for Jimmy Carter. I didn't know anything about him except that he was running for president. I asked them for some position papers and read them and ultimately ended up going out and being his opening act for a while. After he was elected, I played at the Inaugural Ball. Then he asked me to play at CMA night in Washington, which was a night at the White House in which they had almost

everyone in Country Music who was of some kind of prominence-heads of record labels, producers, big name artists, etc. I ended up closing the show that evening. It wasn't until two years later that the real benefits of that night happened. I had just moved to Nashville from Colorado and II was trying to make something happen. After three months of knocking on doors, I got an appointment to see Norro Wilson, who was head of A&R at Warner Bros. I walked into his office and he said, "I remember you-you sang at The White House. I would have signed you then, but I was working on another act at that time. Let me hear your tape." At that moment, he called Los Angeles and told them he was going to produce my stuff. Two weeks later, we were in the studio. We did three songs, of which they released two as singles-"Sweet Red Wine," and "Fire In Your Eyes." The third single they released was "Headed For A Heartache," which was my first Top Ten song. They've all been Top Ten since then.

I had just come off of having "Song of the Year" at the Academy of Country Music Awards, and it was becoming a good year for me. I didn't really want to divert my energies elsewhere. But my manager and the label kept telling me that I ought to go audition, that it would be good experience for me. So I went to New York to audition. I sang for the director and the producer and left. Two days later, they called me and said, "You're Rodolfo."

LS: Was that your first attempt at theater? GM: Yes—it was my first audition. But then the pain set in because I had to learn three hundred pages of music. The thought of going to New York for three months was frightening, but I ended up loving the city. The folks at WHN took me out, and I get to spend Thanksgiving in upstate New York. The folks in New York were really wonderful to me. I was accepted with open arms for my role. It turned out to be a very pleasurable experience.

LS: How did the cast treat you, being a country boy?

LS: It's been tough, huh?

GM: (Laughs) Well, it sounds pretty easy, but it's really been a lot of work. It's been fortunate for me, because it's really the folks in radio who played my first records and have stayed with me for the duration. They've really carried me through the growing process that it takes to become successful. They're the ones that have made the difference.

LS: How did you get the part in La Roberne?

GM: There was an open call for singers at record companies across the country. There were several pop singers who auditioned for it—I think between three and four hundred people auditioned for the part of Rodolfo. It was not something that I necessarily wanted to do at the time.

GM: They treated me like some dumb hick when I first arrived, but after I sang, they treated me as one of their own. I kept teasing the cast and telling them I was going to yodel during the show. I had this yodel worked into this aria, and I'd do it during rehearsal. They were terrified that I'd really do it during a performance, but of course I never did.

LS: Were the audiences different than what you were used to?

GM: No, in the fact that they were appreciative. That's the kind of response that you always want when you work live. They wore different clothes and had different accents, but they came for the music.

LS: How did the role on *The Colbys* come about?

GM: I went to Los Angeles and signed with the William Morris Agency about five months ago. I told them what I wanted to do, one of the things being that I wanted to get involved in some TV work or some motion picture work. About two days after that, I got a call to go read for Mark Schwartz, who does the casting for Aaron Spelling. Soon after that, I had a screen test and acouple of days later they called

me and told me that I was going to be Wayne Masterson on *The Colbys*.

LS: A while back, you were on a list put out by the Optometric Association as having some of the most recognizable eyes in the country, and now you're playing a blind man in a TV series.

GM: I know—I just did it to confuse everybody (laughs).

LS: How did you train to play a blind person?

GM: I spent a little time at the Braille Institute. The dog I use on the show is an actual seeing-eye dog, so I walked Los Angeles blindfolded and let the dog lead me around. Then I spent time carrying on conversations with people not looking directly at them. I also relied on the directors initially to tell me how they wanted me to play it. It's been a real learning experience playing the part.

LS: Do you think *The Colbys* will hinder your recording career at all?

GM: No, I'm recording an album right now. If I continue on the show next season, it will have to be worked out so that I can continue my music. I'll work around my recording and touring schedule.

LS: Since you play a country singer on The Colbys, I'm sure there are a lot of correlations to your own singing career.
GM: Sure, I started in a bar and I evolved to a place where I'm now working with George Jones at the Houston Livestock

Show and Rodeo, and then I'll be working with Barbara Mandrell, then with Willie Nelson. So I don't have to work those honky tonks any more. The evolvement of my career has gone much like the way they're trying to evolve Wayne Masterson's career.

LS: In the show, they've talked about the fact that Wayne is "just" a country singer and that maybe they could cross his music over. Does that happen with you? GM: Sure, the record companies always approach my music with the idea that eventually it will be played on other formats. I'm not going to try to make records for other formats. I'm trying to make real good music, and hopefully it will evolve to that.

LS: Are you afraid of losing your Country base if that happens?

GM: Oh, no. I'm the countriest guy on the planet. I really am. People just don't recognize it. I've got gold lame tennis shoes on right now, but I don't think tennis shoes have anything to do with being Country. By the same token, the kind of vocal cords you're given don't have anything to do with being Country.

That's just the way I sing. I don't apologize for that at all. It's just that I can't sing like George Jones and shouldn't try. But I'm a hell of a lot more Country than some of the guys who sound really Country. That's the bottom line. My loyalties are to Middle America, and in my opinion that's the Country base of the world.

LS: How do you do it all? You've been on Broadway, you're doing a TV series, you're recording, touring, you're a songwriter, an athlete, a father—that's quite a lot to keep track of.

GM: I manage my time well. I'm taking more time for me. One of the things you said that's most important to me is the fact that I play basketball at the Y. It's important for me to do some things just for me and my general mental health and well being. Besides that, I love to work. I

get bored to death if I'm not doing something in my spare time. My son Sam and I both like to go diving, so that's something we can go off on an island somewhere and do together. I'm not good

LS: What aspect of your career do you enjoy the most?

at lying around and being lazy.

GM: Probably whatever I happen to be doing at the moment. I like performing music and doing concerts, because you get that re-charge and that instant gratification that juices you back up. I like the creative process in the studio, but you don't get back from it what you get when you go live. You don't have anybody clapping and screaming and giving you back the emotion you're giving. You don't get that on TV either. So probably right now performing live is the most rewarding.

LS: You write a lot of your own songs, but do you have a lot of say in which other songs you record and which will be released as singles?

GM: I pick all the songs that I record, and I have the right to pick the singles. At times in my career I've let the record

company make the choice because of their "expertise" and against my better judgment. I've decided that's not a wise thing to do anymore. I mean, I can agree with them, but if I feel strongly about something as a single, then it's going to be the single.

LS: Who chose "Wind Beneath My Wings?"

GM: I did. I had to fight for that one. It's one of my favorites.

LS: Whose idea was it for you to record the duet with Crystal Gayle?

GM: That was the record label's idea for a special project. It was a song that Dave Loggins and I wrote and it worked out well. In fact, Crystal and I are going to do a whole project together.

LS: What direction do you see Country music moving in?

GM: Just up! I think five years ago pop music was at the bottom of the barrel, but now it's evolved and it's doing great business. Country music is supposedly in a little slump right now, but what goes around comes around. My crowds are getting bigger everytime I perform. If that's what's happening, then I feel very good about the state-of-affairs of Country music. There's a lot of new blood moving in and "filling some of the shoes" that George Jones talked about. Whether the old guys like it, or whether anybody else likes it, that's the way it is.

LS: Who are some of the new artists you like now?

GM: I like The Forester Sisters and Southern Pacific. I also like Dan Seals, who isn't a new artist, but is really starting to happen now.

LS: You've said that one of the great things that could come out of being on *The Colbys* would be that it would expose more people to your music and to Country music. Is that still the most important thing for you?

GM: Yes it is. I have the impression that a lot of the world looks down its nose at Country Music, like we're the poor bastard child of the music industry, and I think that's a crock. There are a lot of people that make Country music today that could do any kind of music that they want, and they choose to do Country music. A case in point is La Boheme. I went and did an opera. It's not a big deal to me. I don't want to do operas. I don't want to sing with orchestras. But I'll do it occasionally. I choose to do what I'm doing. Country music is not the low end of the music spectrum, and there are no good and bad music formats. They're all art forms, and we're all communicators who do this for a living. Anybody in any of the arts is a communicator. So I don't feel like we're the bastard child of the music industry. We're something that's maybe special, that's unique to this Country. It began here and it will end worldwide. It's becoming more and more popular as a music format worldwide. So there!

STATION IDENTIFICATION AN UNCOMMON POSITION



KASE/FM and KVET/AM have 20% of the total audience in Austin and Central Texas with KASE number one 12 plus. Steve Gary, music director for both stations makes known to us his two hats and the system of thought at these stations to attain the dominant share of listeners.

KVET/AM and KASE/FM are the only two country music radio stations in Austin. The stations are programmed separately with no simulcasting. KASE is 100,000 watts on a 2,000 foot tower covering 70,000 square miles of Central Texas with a continuous country type of approach to the music. The jocks play three in a row 24 hours a day. KASE DJ's don't lean towards personality bits or humor on the air, but they're informative about weather, sports, community events plus song titles and artists. The station is very stable with the morning man, Tom Allen, having been on KASE since the station went country in the fall of 1981.

KVET is 5000 watts AM stereo at 1300 on the dial and is a heavy personality station with country music. The AM audience seems to respond to the humor of the DJ's on KVET. The morning show includes personality Dave Marcum, who's been on KVET since 1982, a helicopter traffic reporter, a newsman and a sports reporter, plus occasional guest appearances by entertainers. The news and sports commitments on KVET are very strong. The station carries the University of Texas Longhorn football and basketball games exclusively. It has a sports call-in talk show at 6PM weekdays called "Sports-Call" hosted by our sports director, Steve Fallon, Music on KVET leans toward the traditional, although the superstar artists like Dolly Parton and Kenny Rogers receive play out-of-thebox. KVET plays winning music, but you can't win on AM with only the music and that is the reason for all the news and sports elements

Both stations are heavily into contesting with such prizes as cars, pick-up trucks and trips to Europe. Generally the contests on KASE are more passive, the mail-in variety. On KVET we lean towards forced listening type of contests and call-in types. Television spots are used year-round and a sizeable amount of the promotional budget goes for t-shirts, belt buckles, caps and bumper strips.

KASE 101 CONTINUOUS COUNTRY

The challenge for the two stations in the 80's is to keep the country music audience we've got and add new listeners. In Texas, country music has always been a popular format and our two stations present it in a very entertaining way. The AM station also has the added challenge of getting people to sample and stay with AM radio. The top four stations in the ratings in Austin are FM stations, so the FM trend is ever present

I try to listen to all the product that comes in and I listen with two hats on at the same time. Is it right for KVET? Is it the sound for KASE or is it something I feel would work on both stations? There are many records that are for KASE only. There are others for KVET only. The lion's share of the chart, though, is on both stations. The music is chosen by a committee with our operations manager, Mike Carta and the general manager, Ron Rogers. We listen to the new music that's come in and I give them the background information I have on each record. Local sales are tabulated with requests to see what are the most popular songs. I check to see how well it's doing on Gavin's chart, and how well it's doing in other markets around the country. In some cases we get the record before the record stores so we have to make a decision without that sales information. We will go on gut feelings if it is something we feel is real strong, it has our sound, and we feel like our listeners will respond. Many times we'll go on a record out-of-the-box even though it has not yet charted in Gavin or arrived in the stores. We also play some local artists. Austin has a very healthy local music scene. There's a lot of product being produced and recorded here so we have a lot to choose from. We're not able to play every local effort that comes down the pike, but in the last six months we've had a couple of records that were strictly local, did not chart nationally, but did well for us.

On KASE we chart forty records with numbers, plus adds and extras. We have a heavy, medium, and light rotation. We do not wait to see a top chart number for a song to go into heavy rotation. If it's an artist with a good track record for us, say a George Strait who does well in this part

of the country, normally we'll put it into heavy rotation. After three or four weeksthe length of time varies-we'll move it back and rest it in a medium or light rotation. It'll go back and forth a few times before the record is over. On album cuts we feel the listeners do not make any large distinction between a single or album cut. If they like a Steve Wariner song, or an Alabama song, or a Gene Watson song, it doesn't matter to them whether it's a single or an album cut. When most listeners buy a country record, they're not going to buy the single, they purchase the album or tape. We feel it's a plus for us if they can hear a couple of those great album cuts on the radio.

We will not ignore the single to get on an album cut, instead we play the album cut in addition. We have five to seven album cuts rotating on KASE and three to five on KVET. You could go three hours without hearing one, it's not like they come up every hour. The DJ's do mention album titles. We try to make that distinction so folks avoid confusion and they know if they enjoyed that cut they can get it in a particular album.

GAVIN: We asked Steve to tell us a little about his background.

When I was in high school and college and interested in getting into radio my music interest was mainly rock and roll. The first job I got in the radio field was with a country station and that's when I started getting interested in country music. Except for one rock station I worked for earlier in my radio career, I've been exclusively with country music stations. I majored in speech in college and my minor was English at Southwest Texas State University. The speech major helped CONTINUED ON PAGE 37

me earlier in my announcing and DJ days, but the music knowledge came with experience. In 1982 I joined KVET and KASE as music director, having been at KOKE radio in Austin for nine years. I gotta tell ya, I like working with the people here. It's a real professional organization. I respect Mr. Rogers' background-the years he's been in the business in various markets. I do not do an air shift on a regular basis. I'll do some fill in, swing work and vacation relief. I'm a full time music director and I'm real pleased with that. We use a music computer to help us rotate our music evenly. It's not just a DJ picking his favorites.

GAVIN: Steve gives some advice to prospective music directors.

Listen to a lot of music, talk to music industry leaders who have been around for years. Go to conventions and seminars if you possibly can. Talk to the artists.

Artists are people too, and most of them are cooperative and willing to tell you how they got to the point they're at in their careers. I learned a lot by talking to the artists, musicians, song writers and label

promotion people. Everyone connected with the music industry has a story to tell and you can learn from their experiences. At both of our stations our job is to entertain. We're very interested in the

audience feedback. We keep a running log in the control room of the calls the DJs get. We can get valuable information even if it's just a minor thing like a person not liking a particular song, or they like some PSA we've read and want more information. You can get more information out of those calls than you can imagine. We are very interested in what our listeners are doing. We try to stay tuned-in to them because we feel that will keep us on top of things in the market. Out of the last seven A.R.B. rating periods, KASE has been number one overall five times, and in eleven out of the last twelve books KASE was number one with adults 25 to 54. With the two stations combined, country music now has 20% of the market.

We believe in country music. There may be markets where country music is not as strong as it used to be, but fortunately in Austin it's very strong and we plan to stay with it and keep it healthy.

COUNTRY SUMMARY

One of the highlights of this year's Gavin Seminar For Media Professionals was the Country Workshop/Breakfast. The moderating duties were in the capable hands of DON LANGFORD (KRAK-Sacramento) and CARSON SCHREIBER (RCA) who kept the meeting flowing smoothly, making sure each topic was both interesting and informative.

Early in the meeting, DON mentioned that Country radio and the record industry seem to be working hand in hand more than ever to promote Country Music in general. This statement seemed to reaffirm itself over and over again throughout the meeting, as representatives from the record industry and many leading radio stations discussed ways to improve Country's image.

The image of Country Music was one of the main topics of conversation during the meeting. ICHABOD CAINE (KMPS-Seattle) reminded us that while the general public's perception of Country Music still seems to be associated with cowboys and trucks, the true core of Country Music is its honesty and heart. Many program-

mers seemed to feel that quality Country Music videos would go a long way in helping improve Country's image.

Call-out research was another popular topic during the meeting. BRUCE ADELMAN (Warner Bros.) noted that Country stations play so many oldies because call-out research tells you that the listeners want familiar music. MIKE SCHAEFER from KIIS/FM in Los Angeles (who joined our meeting to give us a Top 40 perspective) agreed with BRUCE, saying that KIIS/FM tried call-out research for awhile, and found that newer songs invariably got a negative reaction because the listener wasn't familiar with the music. MIKE said that the staff at KIIS/FM concluded that call-out could not be used to research new product, and that they now depend on listener requests to gauge the popularity of newer product.

The question of how often a new add is played also was discussed. Most programmers at the meeting said that they played their new adds between one and three times a day. CARSON expressed some concern as to what kind of impact a new record could make with only a couple of

plays a day. He used station sponsors as an example, saying that they need their ads run more than twice a day to make an impact with the audience.

A critical issue to programmers and record executives alike was how to give new Country artists a break in a format that's known for being loyal to its established artists. The point was stressed that if you believe in a record enough to add it to your playlist, then you should believe in it enough to sell it to your audience. BILL STEDMAN (KSAN-San Francisco) noted that this is especially true in cities that have only one or two Country stations, because odds are that your station is the only place where your listeners are going to hear new Country artists.

MIKE CHAPMAN (WUBE-Cincinnati) pointed out that many stations try to copy the sounds of "successful" stations. This leads to many stations sounding exactly alike, while others just sound bad. There's no energy, no emotion, and the music is blase. Because of a lack of presell or backannouncing, the listeners don't know who they're listening to a lot of the time.

Let's face it, surviving in the radio or music business has its ups and downs, even for those who are qualified and have paid their dues. And whether you're on the radio side working as an air-talent, music or program-director or a representative from a record label, there's a limited amount of security attached to even the best jobs. How long? How much? and naturally, where? These are all questions that come up from time-to-time.

As Whitney Houston said in her last hit, "How Will I Know?" How will you know when it's time to look for another position? How much should you ask for? Let's pause for a moment and reflect on the cash question. Suppose right now, a prospective employer asked, "How much money do you want?"—one of the most routine questions asked of most of us at one time or another. How would you answer it?

CASH CALL, or I'LL TAKE THE 9TH CALLER

Immediately when you've got to put a price on your services, you're faced with a dilemma. If you put the figure too high, you've priced yourself out of the job you want. Put it too low and the employer may pick you up for substantially less than planned. You've cheated yourself. And this, at great cost to you and your career goals. Or your low figure may inspire the thought that you must not be the hot candidate you originally appeared to be. Again, it's a question of answers.

OPEN AIR MARKET

Often the key is to look at what the market

will bear and then price your services somewhere in the middle. You might even ask, "What does the job pay?" This is a good idea when the new employer is someone you've known for a while. But these are some areas that with a little planning and thought in the beginning usually pay some dividends in the end.

Once you're in a new job situation, you've got to perform to stay there. And it's no exaggeration to say that first-time supervisors regardless of the industry or company, face a tough task. And, let's say it's the first time in a medium to large market. Let's say also that you've just made program or music director. And, you've still got an air-shift to do as part of your duties. That's a big combined responsibility. You've got to find and play the hits, design and produce the contests and promotions, monitor employee attendance, implement policy, cope with time and budget constraints, train new employees as well as being the day-today link between the often conflicting demands of management and employees.

WHICH ONE ARE YOU?

For an on-the-air program and/or music director, the question often comes down to, are you talent or management? Well, you're actually both! But which one are you more of? Again, it depends on what is needed. And most of the time, both are needed. But the question becomes if these positions are so vital, why are they often the most neglected level of management?

A recent survey found that a majority of those polled, which included general managers, owners, as well as program and music directors particularly in the black/urban formats, responded that they felt they were unqualified in many cases and working for companies that expected too much and gave too little.

The reasons both supervisors and employees gave for the preponderance of unqualified program/music directors are significant. To wit: management does not supply supervisors with sufficient information regarding the direction they should take. Often management does not give them a budget to administrate. So when the question of planning for contests and promotions for the future comes up, no one has any idea how to proceed. Should the programmer work down to a price or should he or she put the plan together the way it should be and then cost it out? Often busy program people are not trained sufficiently to communicate with employees, causing respect and authority to erode rapidly; supervisors are not taught how to cope effectively with the sometimes conflicting concerns of management and employees. The general manager wants the job done, but he/she doesn't want to spend any money, make any changes or replace any equipment. "When the going gets tough Huh? Maybe we could work up a trade-out with U-Haul.

Based on these findings, we assembled a list of six skills we feel are critical for success at the supervisory level, for program/music directors:

- 1. Giving Feedback
- 2. Planning
- 3. Problem Solving
- 4. Setting Standards
- 5. Assigning and monitoring
- 6. Handling performance problems.

Like life itself, it's the *application* of knowledge that is the real power in this or any other industry.

Someone once said, the ultimate test of your will power is to see a friend with a black eye and not ask any questions. And if that "black eye" is a circle around some slowly sinking ARBitrons ... well, it's still a "QUESTION OF ANSWERS."



Defamation Of Indepedents

The recent NBC Nightly News series on Organized Crime and its alleged influence on the process of independent promotion has upset the entire radio and music fraternity.

The editorial content of the series was dramatic and as hardhitting as any piece of journalism has been on the subject. But, as is the nature of the medium, expedient conclusions are made. Innocent bystanders get hurt from the fragmentation bombs sometimes indiscriminately hurled during ratings wars.

Innocent bystanders in this instance include scores of legitimate independent record promoters who, as a profession, have had their livelihood cut off en masse as a result of nearly every record label in the business having terminated their policy of engaging independents.

I have long felt that the primary responsibility of promoting records to radio should be vested in label employees, not agents. Nothing replaces the accountability a responsible company gets from direct employee/employer relationships.

For reasons of sheer economy, however, many small and developing labels have had and continue to have undisputable need for multilabel agents, also known as Independent Promotion Representatives.

Independent promotion persons and firms have existed since the first records spun at 45 rpm. Independents have always augmented out of town labels, artists, and publishers. And nearly all have done it with integrity, dilligence,

and enthusiasm.

NBC, which is neither judge nor jury, has apparently given the American public and the heads of every major record company the impression that Independents= Organized Crime= Payola. It is our unprovable suspicion that if \$80 million is spent engaging independents, some of that \$80 mil has trickled down to greedy programmers, stuffing their wallets, stomachs, or noses. But the other shoe has yet to drop.

Reports have surfaced of a Federal Grand Jury investigation. Our hope is, of course, that justice will be done. But beyond the control of any grand jury is the fate of the legitimate majority of independent promotion reps who this week found themselves without next week's paycheck.

I hope that the wholesale slaughter of independent promotion is but a short term move. Once the dust settles I hope that the good guys in the white hats can reclaim their honor. I also hope they can wait that long. I know that the cutting off of independents was not a pleasant experience for the terminators either. Long standing relationships were painfully cut.

As a result of the terminations many labels must re-stock their field staffs and beef up their national offices. I hope offers of staff employment can and will be made to the worthy.
