

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More On The Picks . .

R.E.M., "Green", Warner Brothers.... It's sometimes strange the way numbers can get you crazy. Using the same logic as the Monty Python "witch and wood" theory, since R.E.M. had 162 OTB adds (#1 Most Added), and there are 162 games in a baseball season, and baseball is the American national pastime, is it safe to assume that R.E.M. are the best American rock and roll band? Excuse me, Geraldo Rivera is waiting to discuss whether or not I have been overcome by Satanic powers. Seriously, "Orange Crush" has surpassed even the highest expectations. WIZN's Tom Van Sant gets right to the point, "You've got to love a band like R.E.M. Year after year, album after album, they just keep putting out top-notch quality material. 'Orange Crush' delivers it all: Guts, harmonies, a hook to die for, and hey, you can even dance to the sucker! R.E.M. will be around into the 21st century, and they'll keep getting better along the way".... Now that you have the entire "Green" album at your disposal, the initial depth tracks are sure to be "Pop Song 89" and "Stand" for the typical R.E.M. sound. Other standout cuts are; "World Leader Pretend", "Turn You Inside-Out", "I Remember California" and "Untitled". A great effort that will leave any talk of sell-out or compromise buried.

HARD REPORT

THE

The Pursuit Of Happiness, "Love Junk", Chrysalis.... As expected here in the Hard playpen, the reaction to "I'm An Adult Now" has been swift and strong. In fact we've all stopped sucking our thumb, now if we could only figure out how to put the diaper on our new intern. New adults this week at 34 reporters, including KBPI, WDVE, KBCO, KEZE, KEZO, KISW, KLBJ, KXRX, WDIZ, WDRE, WGLF, WLAV and WCCC where Joe Marino says, "The Pursuit Of Happiness strikes a chord with this guy who doesn't really want to grow up. 'I'm An Adult Now' could be a holiday anthem. I mean, think about how you have to act at family gatherings through the holidays, listen to the song, and I'm sure you'll relate".... The second Biggest Move on the Hard Hundred, with a 77-46* step up, this first taste of the "Love Junk" album has plenty of potential depth tracks waiting in the wings. WNCS' Jody Peterson, "The Pursuit Of Happiness has been a favorite pastime the last couple of weeks. The majority of the rest of the songs on 'Love Junk' are really catchy. Turn your attention to the Pursuit Of Happiness and you too will see how much more pleasant life can be".... We suggest the Canadian smash, "Hard To Laugh" or the highlight of their live show, "Killed By Love". Also, "Walking In The Woods" and "She's So Young" deserve to be singled out from this fine debut LP.

Kiss, "Let's Put The X In Sex", Mercury.... Even though this band has turned Gold or Platinum with 20 out of 22 releases, AOR always seems to time it a little off center. What's the deal? It seems make-up or not, the Kiss camp has to wait before the requests, sales and research confirm that, indeed, this is not just a band for lower demoland. "Let's Put The X" could be Kiss' "Dude Looks Like A Lady", a funkier foray in the red light district, with the emphasis on beat. Complete with synth/horn flourishes, and a perfect catch line sing-a-long. Co-written by Paul Stanley and Desmond Child, it's one of two new tunes from the forthcoming retrospective, "Smashes, Thrashes & Hits". Drew Murray has made this startling promise, "I will drop my pants in Times Square if this record goes Top 5 AOR!" If the legacy of this band and the sure fire sound of this track isn't enough for that insta-add, the de-pantsing of Mr. Murray should do the trick.

RECORD OF THE WEEK

Joe Satriani, "The Crush of Love", Relativity.... When it comes to getting the job done on that trusty six string, Joe's the King. As good ole Charlie Logan sez, "Joe has mastered the art of expressing his emotions through the fluid fingering of his fretboard. 'Crush' takes up where 'Always' left off. While expressing the same heartfelt sentiment, 'Crush' has more of a bite to it. This song is guaranteed to set your phones ablaze".... From WIZN's Tom Van Sant, "With the phenomenal success we had with 'Surfing' the new one is an automatic--and I predict top 5 phones within four weeks".... Ditto KGB's Pam Edwards "This is a stunning new track that's already racking up sales for the Ep....If you're unconvinced about Joe's viability at AOR, please give me a call. His music should be heard on your radio station".... And judging by the OTB action, it will soon: #3 Most Added with 69 reports-including 8 heavies, and top 5 phones at KDKB and KPEZ.

NEW PLAY PRIORITIES

Paul Kelly, "To Her Door", A&M.... Between constant club dates and the opening slot on the latest Smithereens tour, Paul Kelly continues to hammer away at the American music fan's subconscious. "Dumb Things" didn't get the play it deserved, but not to worry, "To Her Door" is just too damn catchy not to click. This is the track that worked best in his native Australia, and we think it's the perfect next step in establishing him on our turf. If you're familiar with the album version, rest assured that the nasty F word has been removed for maximum exposure. With Steve Earle proving country tinged rock is welcome in the format's mix, we see no reason this isn't worth serious consideration as well. Believe us when we say this man will eventually be a star.

'Til Tuesday, "(Believed You Were) Lucky", Epic.... Considering Epic's desire to let radio bring this project to the fore, it's a strong vote of confidence to see 9 more adds this week including, KTYD, WDHA, WNCS, WPLR and KQWB. Combine that with the other early birds, like CHEZ, KBCO, KTAO, WGIR, WIZN, WMDK, WMJY, WOXY and WRCN, and you have 25 stations on board before the priority button is pushed. The tune itself is quite possibly the best thing Aimee has ever wrapped her larynx around. A beautiful Jules Shear/Aimee Mann original, the acoustic guitar and Rhett Davies production are outstanding in their subtlety. This has multi-format smash written all over it. Just ask WGIR's Karen A. Small what she thinks, "Aimee Mann and 'Til Tuesday continually come up with strong songs, and '(Believed You Were) Lucky' is a well-crafted piece of work. This is another one of those bands which should be a lot bigger than they are--they're very tasteful"....Debut at 94* on the Hard Hundred.

Phil Collins, "Two Hearts", Atlantic.... The second of three Phil Collins tunes to be culled from the "Buster" soundtrack, "Two Hearts" recalls Mr. Collins previous flirtation with the Motown sound. We all remember how big his rendition of "You Can't Hurry Love" scored, this track could be an old Supreme's tune--but it isn't. A Phil Collins/Lamont Dozier composition and production, it sounds like a mix of "Baby Love" and "You Can't Hurry Love" and is a perfect song in context with the movie, which is set in the mid-60's. Already on WNEW, WSHE, KATS, KFMQ, KZEL, WPDH, DC101 and another 5, there's no time to waste on this obvious crossover hit. KZEL's AI Scott warns, "Those who delay on getting next to that old Phil Collins magic will probably live to regret it."

Jim Capaldi, "Some Come Running", Island.... "Something So Strong" continues to pile on the adds, with newcomers CHOM, CILQ, KEZO, KLAQ, KOME, KTAO, KZEW, WEBN, WHJY, DC101, WRFX, WNPQ, WYNF and another dozen bringing the base to 141. A 25-18* move on the HH and increases at more than 20 point to Jim's best ever solo radio success, and we can't think of anyone more deserving. Neither can WYNF's Charlie Logan, "Jim Capaldi's solo career has certainly had its ups and downs--but his work with Traffic cannot be denied. He has written or co-authored some of my favorite songs of all time. 'Something So Strong' will follow the lead of ex band mate Steve Winwood and with the superstar talent all over this Lp it can't miss".... How right you are Mr. Logan. We suggest starting with the title tune, featuring Steve Winwood and the haunting "Love Used To Be A Friend Of Mine". A first class effort. Do yourself a favor and check out "Oh Lord. Why Lord" for your own head.

New Play Priorities

Omar and the Howlers, "Wall Of Pride", Columbia.... "Rattlesnake Shake" nailed down over the century mark in station support, paving the way for some heavy damage on this swamp boogie follow-up. Omar hits us with a "Who Do You Love?" riff drenched in lowdown hoodoo. The vocal is as nasty as they come with Mr. Dyke spitting out the lyrics as only he can. Omar shows that he's got plenty to be proud of when he cuts loose with a six string wail wallop of a guitar break mid tune. All in all rock on the southern side, with a gumbo Dr. John like vocal approach. "Wall Of Pride" should do well at any smokehouse cookout, or better yet your station.

DOUBLE PLAYERS

Traveling Wilburys, "Last Night", Wilbury/Warner Bros... Supergroups are again the hottest thing this side of baby therapy, and this foray into ego mergers is leading the pack. This group of talent-charged musicians is warmly welcomed into the chart with a super debut, and the action hasn't stagnated with this secondary track. New air at 18 stations including KISW, KTYD, KZLR, WAPL, WDHA, WIXV, WLUP and WXLP, increase the station count up to 38. Phil Maicke of KFMH is getting a jump on the future of the album, and he says, "Play the Wilburys 'Tweeter and the Monkeyman' and see the phones light up for that 'new Dylan thing.' 'Tweeter' on next week's HH, while "Last Night's" 88-62* leap is the third biggest move this week.

HARD REPORT -

Colin James, "Five Long Years", Virgin

This guitar slingin' neighbor from the North, has earned more than a modicum of respect for this mighty fine debut long player. The first track, "Voodoo Thing", cooked up a storm at radio with well over a hundred stations proving that AOR indeed is interested in making and breaking exciting new acts. This second dip into Colin's wax pool yields new adds from KRZQ, KTYD, WLLZ and WTPA. Steady on CFOX, CHEZ, CHOM, KBOY, KOAS, KXRX, WDHA, WIMZ, WLZR, WMMR, WRKI and another 10. This time around it's the song and not the riff that's gaining attention--an important point to note in the development of a budding star heretofore more noted for his guitar technique than his songwriting. Steadily climbing the Hard Hundred, 90-83*. **Steve Miller, "Just A Little Bit", Capitol....** Critical ears have been raving about this track from day one and it's a pleasure to see radio taking this masterful piece of playing to its collective bosom. "Infinitely more suited to our sound", is the way **WIZN's Tom Van Sant** put it and we think he's right on the money with that call. An 84* debut this week on the HH sees Steve getting the nod at KATT, WLZR, WLLZ, KEZE, KISW, KTXQ, KMOD and KXRX where toes are tapping in a near uncontrollable frenzy of rhythm rocking. Few players have the chops, let alone the stones, to go out and cover a buncha standards and expect the format to react. Well, Steve has always been one for cutting his own path to the listener's hearts and minds and those stations that tag along have been getting big reaction from a supportive audience.

Hothouse Flowers, "I'm Sorry", Polydor.... The blue ribbon mover this week on the HH has got to be the Hothouse Flowers. Check out that huge 92-59* leap and prepare to testify with the likes of WHCN's Kim Alexander, "I think of a gospel choir when I hear this song. What a cool sound".... Or the right reverend David Sadof at KLOL, "This band possesses the energy and conviction upon which great bands are made".... No mistake about it, this band is shortcircuiting their way to fame with solid support from KEZO, WLZR, KOME, KRXQ, KZOQ and KFMQ. Phones are already sizzling at KTYD for this uplifting track and WOXY, WBRU and taste maker KBCO are hammering this one in Heavy already.

Keith Richards, "You Don't Move Me", Virgin.... With three songs on the Hard Hundred, only U2 can rival Keith when it comes to album depth. Although "Take It So Hard" is still spending time in the top 5, "You Don't Move Me" is emerging from a crowded field to become the next emphasis track from "Talk Is Cheap". This is the cut that conjures up the strongest Stones images and the trained ear will detect more than a coincidental stab at you-know-who hidden in the lyrics. WLZR's Kelly Wallace reports strong response, "Keith Richards is number one phones with adults and we love it. Nothing else is generating quite the same 25 + reaction".... New to KAZY, WLVQ, KZAP, KILO, WTPA and KKZX and in Heavy at DC-101, KWHL, WAPL and WRQK. Tour dates have been announced starting November 24th in Atlanta with stops in most major markets in the weeks to follow. Debut 95* on the HH.

IMPACT TRACKS

Crosby, Stills, Nash & Young, "American Dream", Atlantic.... Though R.E.M. narrowly edged CSNY in the Most Added this week, the fearsome foursome did manage to return that favor with a higher 9* debut. Radio rave-o-la's are more than plentiful as well: "CSNY takes me back to the golden days of early 70's radio. I'm glad that Neil is featured on the lead vocal but it's always a pleasure to hear harmonies this beautiful. An automatic add on first listen", Elise Vander Borght...."Crosby Sills Nash and Young surprised me with a Neil Young song to lead off. This song is very infectious, but may be too poppy on first listen. But then, the harmonies kick in, and then the guitars kick in, and then I'm clapping my hands and then -- I realize how much I've loved this foursome all my life", Charlie Logan "I can't get 'American Dream' out of my head! The studio monitors are at full-tilt whenever I spin the disc. If the rest of the album sounds as cool as this, there's no doubt it will be a retail scorcher", Kim Jefferies. Don't worry Kim, it's even better than expected. Wait til you hear Graham's "Soldier Of Peace", Steve's "Lose That Girl" and David's "Nightime For The Generals"

Sam Kinison, "Wild Thing", Warner Bros.... It was a real treat to see Sammy hosting the Headbangers Ball on MTV this past week, with his two teenage girl friends. Ah yes, Mr. Mellow ... uh, yeah. We love Sam around here; the only problem with trying to convey his message and humor in print is the tendency to USE ALL CAPITAL LETTERS and lots of exclamation points!!!!! This track is no laughing matter, as it more than holds its own musically. OTB on 19 including KGON, KRXQ, KZAP, KZEL. WAAF, WCCC, WDIZ, WEBN, WIMZ, WRIF and more. If this doesn't inspire off the scale phone response, we would recommend Novocane enemas for your entire audience. Call WCCC and ask Joe Marino, better yet read on, "If you thought Sam Kinison was just a hilarious comic, check out the way he handles 'Wild Thing', This screamer can sing!! His irreverent cover of this classic rocker with an all-star cast insures this one a place in rock and roll history"....WBCN's Carter Alan sums it up perfectly, "The number one request in two days is Sam Kinison--I think I love it!!!"....Debut at 93* on the Hard Hundred. OOOOHH OHHHHH OWWWW!!!!!!!!!

Dreams So Real, "Rough Night In Jericho", Arista.... It's a pleasure to see this fine tune crack the the halfway mark on the Hard Hundred, with a 57-49* move. A total of 60 reporters are crankin' this perfect example of American rock and Roll, and you can count KEZO, KISW, KLBJ, KRXQ, KZAM, KZRR, WAVF, WBCN, WLLZ, WPDH among the 14 new adds this week. WLZR's Kelly Wallace explains, "Dreams So Real deserves a shot. My instincts tell me it could be real big at radio".... Let's not forget WBLM's Robin Mathieu, "Dreams So Real is a strong add this week, and we are really getting into it. I've spent a lot of time with the album and it definitely has numerous other tracks for airplay consideration. I particularly like 'California' as a depth track".... We're kind of partial to "Open Your Eyes" and "Bearing Witness", but who's arguing? If you delve into "Rough Night" now, you'll be building a base for a band with a future. Don't be the last in line on your block.



Big Country, "Peace In Our Time", Reprise.... On their recent visit to the Hard Ranch, Stuart and Mark confirmed a few suspicions. First they solidified their amateur comedian status by asking, "Where's Hoss?" and "If you run out of firewood, do you take the cabin apart?" Then they impressed and amazed with their knowlege of and excitement about all kinds of contemporary rock styles. Then they picked up the check and totally took over the jernt! This latest variation on their always changing theme is new at KRNA, KRZQ, WCCC, WDHA, WDRE, WZZQ and four more, with a Hard Hundred debut at 81*. Steady on CFOX, KBCO, KEZO, KKDJ, KLBJ, WBCN, WEQX, WHFS and WHTG where Rich Robinson says, "A staple of our core, Big Country is a band that lends themselves to a mainstream AOR crossover, without compromising their musical smarts. 'Peace In Our Time' is closer to the sound that put them on the map in the first place, and I think it's one of their finest efforts".

Joan Jett, "Little Liar", Blackheart/CBS.... This just keeps on building and could turn into the Trump Tower of her career. New on KATT, KBPI, KLOS, KLPX, KRQR, KXRX and 5 more, bringing the base just a shade under the century mark. With increases logged at another dozen including, KQWB, KRIX, WBCN, WBLM, WLLZ, WONE, WRKI, WXLP and WZZQ, it's apparent that this track hasn't neared its peak. WBCN's Carter Alan met with Joan in the flesh, "I got a chance to congratulate Joan on the success of her not so new LP. 'Hate Myself For Lovin' You' must be in the top ranks of Billboards chart singles with long chart runs. The follow-up 'Little Liar' is devastating on air and should take the LP past platinum"....WBLM's Robin Mathieu has a word or two of her own to add, "This has always been a big market for Joan Jett and it's really funny because even the audience is surprised that it's Joan".... 36-22* on the Hard Hundred.

Mike and the Mechanics, "Nobody's Perfect", Atlantic.... Mr. Rutherford's second go round as Mr. Goodriff is just the ticket for 140 stations after just two weeks. It's new on CHEZ, CILQ, KEZO, KGB, KLAQ, KLBJ, KLPX, KQWB, KTAO, KTXQ, WIOT, WLUP, WRIF, WRKI, DC101, WXRT and 26 more, make Michael the 5th Most used Add ramp this week. 19 reporters kick it up a gear, including, KLOL, KOZZ, WAOR, WBAB, WBCN, WDVE, WIMZ, WLLZ and WPYX who push it to Power play status--with WEGR and WLAV the first with top 5 phone follow through. "Nobody's Perfect" speeds 28-17* on the Hard Highway, and with the full album at your disposal it's only a matter of time before the title track turns up on playlists from coast to coast. Head mechanic and backseat backbeat specialist Paul Carrack will have motorists everywhere reaching for the tissues before sixty seconds of roadtime.

Ratt, "Way Cool Junior", Atlantic.... Our 4th Most Added record finds 45 stations welcoming the style shift with open arms. First week adds are in from KAZY, KILO, KISS, KKDJ, KLOL, KSJO, KTXQ, WAOR, WBAB, WCCC, WDVE, WEZX, WIMZ, WLLZ, WMMR, WRIF, WYNF and many more. The radio community has outdone itself when it comes to the rave department concerning the Ratt boys. Witness **WMMR's Erin Riley**, "The very last thing I would expect to hear myself rave about would be a new song from Ratt. But here I go, it's all I've been able to listen to for the last week. I was hooked right from the 'Ant Music' intro through the brass at the end. 'Way Cool Junior' is hot!---HELP, I just can't stop dancin'".... Somebody throw a bucket of water on that young lady! While you're at grab a towel and check in with **WYNF**'s sun god **Charlie Logan**, "Ratt's 'Way Cool Junior' is just that. The horns are inspiring, this could be the record these guys really needed".... Get on it now, because we're not alone in picking up that CHR crossover scent. Ask **WNPQ's Eric St. John**, "The new Ratt is not only a change for them, but looks like it has a legitimate shot at CHR success. They've added some blues and horns and come up with a winner"....Debut at 60* on the Hard Hundred.

MORE HARD ACTS

Julian Cope, "Charlotte Anne", Island

Julian's not exactly a stranger to AOR success. You'll recall that "World Shut Your Mouth" enjoyed Top 25 status and was played on well over 100 stations. And now with "Charlotte Anne", Julian has delivered a much more even tempered and more obvious hit which should in no way be considered exclusive domain of the alternative stations. The track is haunting and addictive and impossible to resist after just a couple spins. WVVV's Butch Lazorchak says, "Julian Cope is one of the true geniuses of contemporary music. It's a shame that more programmers cannot see past his 'alternative' Image. 'Charlotte Anne' ushers in Spring six months early".... Julian rambles 87-80* on this week's chart with adds at CHEZ and WCKO along with steady play at KBCO, 91X, WHFS, WEQX, KFMH and KACV and early rotation increases at six others.

Brian Spence, "Come Back Home", Polydor.... It was a deadline night and we were slaving in front of our computers. (In fact, we were starting this very write up.) We had heard his music, but knew little of the man. And then, as if by some cosmic coincidence, Polydor's hard working rep Bobbi Silver arrives at our comfy cabin with Mr. Spence in tow. Brian charmed us with his warmth and stunned us with impromptu acoustic renditions of two tracks from his current Lp, "Reputation". Brian informed us that he will be joining the Tommy Conwell tour ASAP (also playing acoustic solo), and based on our exclusive mini-concert, all we can say is show up early when you go to check out da Rumblers. "Come Back Home" is already on more than 30 stations including WYNF, KSHE, KBER, KEZE, WDHA, WLLZ, KMOD. WFYV, WYBB and KICT. Chart-watchers will be impressed by the 95-82* move. Already a major success in Europe, this Scottish native is primed to break big in the States.

Dokken, "Alone Again", Elektra.... Give this forthcoming double live Lp about a week on the shelves and then start calling around for sales figures--you'll be amazed at the rate it blows out of the stores. Elektra has wisely selected the definitive Dokken track "Alone Again" to lead off the collection, and top 5 phone reports are already coming in--witness WNPQ's Eric St. John: "I wasn't going to deal with this Dokken track, but with top phones before it was even an official add, there was no question it's a must. This is Dokken country, and we give the people what they want".... KQRS was there first and they're joined this week by KILO, KEZO, WLLZ, WLZR, KSJO, KFMG, KKDJ, KRZQ, WRIK and WNPQ. Look for that list to expand as fans of the band call up to demand more from their heroes.

Alice Cooper, "I Got A Line On You", Epic.... Alice lands on the Hard Hundred at 99* with this spirited remake from the "Iron Eagle II" soundtrack. 19 stations are OTB including WNEW, WBCN, WDVE, KAZY, WRIF, WCCC, WLLZ, KZAP, WPLR and WLAV. Anthony Alfonsi of WDVE says, "I Got A Line On You' is the best I've heard Alice sing in a long time. He takes a proven hit and adds his own special touch to make it sound as good as the original".... A good percentage of your younger audience has probably never been exposed to this track, so allow Alice to introduce them to one of the best guitar-driven tunes of the past two decades. It's a proven song from a proven crowd pleaser, so you can't go wrong. Also featured on the soundtrack are efforts from The Insiders, Henry Lee Summer, Mike Reno and Britny Fox.

Big Audio Dynamite, "Other 99", Columbia.... Mick Jones has penned a track that all but the perfect among us can relate to. "Tighten Up Vol. 88" has sold very well in markets where it has been supported by airplay. KFMH's Phil Maicke has a point, "Sure, everyone will add R.E.M., but what of B.A.D.? Mick Jones' dynamite songwriting is most accessible on 'Other 99'. It's in heavy here and we have top 5 phones to show for it".... Steady play from the likes of 91X, WBRU, WFNX, WRIK and WVVV along with adds at WBCN, WPLR, WIZN and WDRE bring the station cume to near 20 and the song closer to a Hard Hundred debut. **Tom Van Sant** at **WIZN** nails down a good call here, "B.A.D. was a pleasant surprise to say the least. 'Other 99' has that 'Sandinista' sound, but executed to a 'T'. This one should catch on".... No doubt it will if given the chance.

ALBUM PLAY PRIORITIES

Cinderella, "Bad Seamstress Blues", Mercury.... A big move for these Philly rockers this week sees "Bad Seamstress Blues" powering up the Hard Hundred a solid 96-78* with major rumblings of more in the pipe for next week. KILO, WLLZ, KDJK, WCCC, KNAC and KRQU join up this week, creating a 27 station base that looks prime with KAZY, WAPL, KEZE, KTXQ, KOME and KSJO where the track is already in a Heavy rotation. "A real performer for us... We are getting consistent phones", according to Chris Herrmann at WHJY.... "Look for Cinderella to hammer big retail points all across the country", sez WNPQ's Eric St. John.... You don't have to count toes to figure that this is going to be a strong follow-up for those demo dominant stations out there.

Pat Benatar, "Let's Stay Together", Chrysalis.... The album is already Gold and the songs sound better and better with every successive single. This release has been long awaited and satisfying beyond the mere expectations of her huge fan base. A debut at 77* for this track comes on the heels of adds this week at KDKB, WLZR, KJOT, WMJY helping that 28 station roster. **Sean O'** at **WWZU** shares a common sentiment at radio, "Pat is definitely back!".... There's no mistaking that fact, Jack, especially with such quality calls as KLOS, KEZO, WLLZ, CFOX, KGB, KISW, WMMR and WEZX leading the way. Rock and roll mamas may be a dime a dozen these days, but few have the platinum shelf life of this bankable lady. Jane's Addiction, "Jane Says", Warner Brothers.... The buzz on this band has a familiar ring to it. Remember how many of you ignored the street feeling developing on Guns N' Roses? Don't make the same mistake with these guys. We know that it's hard for the layman to keep up with the plethora of L.A. acts currently on the rise and if you can't trust your own instincts just put your ears to the street and we bet that you'll be catching raves regarding this band. KISW has been giving liberal airplay to the "Nothing's Shocking" Lp and Mike Jones reports, "The Jane's Addiction phenomenon continues to grow in Seattle with top 5 phones and top ten sales out of the box".... Also on at KBCO, WHCN, WBRU, 91X and several more. Before you write them off as being too "anything", take another listen to "Jane Says", a song suitable for use in every daypart we can mention.

Lloyd Cole & The Commotions, "My Bag", Capitol.... Take a good look at the cross section of stations embracing the third effort from Lloyd & the Commotions: KLOL, WHFS, WKLS, 91X, WCCC, WBRU, WLLZ, WFNX, KPEZ and that's merely the tip of the iceberg. Pretty good variety represented there--from the cutting edge of alternative radio to the heritage rockers. Few acts can pull in such across the board support. Apparently there are a lot of fans of intelligent pop music out there, and they've found out that Lloyd is among the best of the genre. It's something that David Sadof of KLOL has known for some time, "I've been a fan of Lloyd Cole since the 'Rattlesnake' days, and the new album continues a string of fine work".... With the above mentioned major market stations leading the way, "My Bag" debuts on the Hard Hundred this week at 100*.

John Mayall, "The Last Time", Island.... John is just one of many reasons that the folks at Island have been grinning from ear to ear of late. His much awaited return to the airwaves has met with critical approval from old and new fans alike. "The Last Time" moves 76-72* on the Hard Hundred and notches adds at KPEZ and CHOM while maintaining steady play at more than 30 others including WNEW (recent top 5 phones), WLVQ, KGON, KSHE, KOME, WLZR, WPLR, KEZO and WDHA. With so-called living legends bombarding us like a thousand points of light these days, it's a pleasure to have an excellent release from one of the format's truly underrated originals. "Chicago Line" is strong throughout--be sure to give a listen to "Cold Blooded Mama" as well.

Tracy Chapman, "Baby Can I Hold You", Elektra... The legend is already set in stone. This woman has effectively zipped into the fast lane and in remarkable fashion has established a reputation that lesser mortals would have taken years to achieve. This latest chapter in the story continues the development of her image rich lyrics and the end result has clocked healthy reaction at WYNF, WNEW, KDJK, WMAD, WDHA, WKLS and KMOD. A move up the Hard Hundred of 98-92* gets in gear with that Heavy play on CHOM and Power rotations at WRXK leading the way. In the expanding world of 25 + radio this talent has carved a niche for herself that will prove a staple in years to come.

Cheap Trick, "Ghost Town", Epic.... No doubt about it, these guys are back in the saddle with this lyrical tour de force that frameworks the band at their best. Those pseudo Liverpudlian rhythms really work in the hands of these guys and Robin's voice has rarely sounded better. KLAQ, WYBB, WBCN, WONE, WEZX, WGIR and CHOM all come in this week to join early believers like KATT, WRXK, KILO, WAPL, KISW, WNEW, WLAV, KZAP, WLLZ and KKDJ. The station count is up to 55 with 10 reporting Heavy airplay for this stylistic set-piece. Few comebacks have been as well attended as this one being staged by the Trick-sters and if "Ghost Town" doesn't do even more to drive the nail home then color us blue and bark at the moon.

ALBUM PLAY PRIORITIES

Tommy Conwell, "If We Never Meet Again", Columbia.... Now that Tommy has set the hook coast to coast with a rollicking lead track and some very well received live performances, it is time to sweep the bases with a great second track. This Jules Shear composition has the legs to work a huge run at radio for Tommy and his delivery is up to snuff no doubt. "If you thought that Tommy and the Rumblers were just George Thorogood Part II, this song definitely disproves that", according to WPLR's Tom Bass. The station count is racking up points at KDKB, KTYD, WNEW, KRQR, WOUR, KMOD, WPYX and KMOD helping propel this track into the fourth biggest mover this week with a 63-44* jump that has smash written all over it. Heavy or better rotations at KISW, WMMR, WZZO, WIYY, WCCC and WBAB indicates yet another turn-key hit for The Young Rumblers and Mr. Tom.

CHARTSTARS

Randy Newman, "It's Money That Matters", Reprise.... Could this be the answer to some 21st century Trivial Pursuit question? (Q: Name the artist that knocked U2 from the top of the charts in 1988. A: Randy Newman with "It's Money That Matters".) Randy earns his #1 status by locking up 175 AOR reporters--an amazing 150 of those in power/heavy rotation. 19 stations increase rotations including WTKX where Steve Smith remarks, "Randy Newman moves into heavy rotation on the strength of his best song in an age".... The request action hasn't waned a bit with top phones still reported at WYNF, KGGO, WDIZ, WONE, KMOD, WRFX and 20 others. Randy's reign at the top spot will certainly rank as one of 1988's most satisfying memories. There's not much else to add, except don't forget to congratulate your Reprise rep on the company's first #1 since being reformed.

Steve Earle, "Copperhead Road", UNI/MCA.... How do you segue into a great comment ilke this from Jon "DEA" Austin from WXRC "I'm really impressed with the phone response to Steve Earle. 'Copperhead Road' has special meaning being that we're nestled between two of the largest pot producing counties in North Carolina".... If Bush has it his way, Danforth will be the new drug czar come inauguration Day. Jon had better keep his usage habits out of print and in his pipe. But when it comes to smokin', there's no outdistancing this track, which has saturated the cores, and moved onto convert even the most reticent. What turns a head quicker than insta-phone action? Consistent, long-term phone action. Number six on the most requested list right on the talls of its release, and a HH increase 23-20*.

Little Feat, "Long Time Till I Get Over You", Warner Bros... As many of you will undoubtedly be poring over the HR year end ballot, note the "Comeback" category. Little Feat may be only one nominee, but some consider the band the most pleasing re-entry of the decade. In one fell swoop, it has moved from the most inner reaches of the cerebral sanctum to the forefronts of our impressionable memories. And it's not about to sink back, now with thrice-successful singles. The newest release garners 14 new plays from KLBJ, KZEW, KZLR, WAQX, WDIZ, WIZN and WWDC. CFOX, KEZE, KGON, KOME, KRXQ, WCKW, WKFM and WTPA count themselves as early conversions now in an exact century level station count. On the HH, three times is a charm, and it moves 33-24*.

Jeff Healey, "Confidence Man", Arista.... Any being with a pulse who ever picked up a Stratocaster is doomed to be paralleled to the legends, especially those who attempt any tangible level of competence. But, now the Jimil comparisons are flying fast and furiously, with none more physically convinced than our own KXRX's "Rain-R-Us", Brew Michaels, who says with a gleam in his eye, "A fire and brimstone guitar fest with the amazing Jeff Healey saw a possessed young man who sprayed the SRO crowd down with a Hendrix-like 90 minute set".... The adds keep rollin' in with six this week from KAZY, WDVE, WGTR, WLZR, WYNF and WZZO. Stuff those in with a 145 station count, and the number of believers is pretty vast. Just outside the top ten, but hardly stalling on the HH 11-11*.

Bad Company, "One Night", Atlantic While other 70's powerhouses are softening their sound and blending in with the mid-stream masses, Bad Company returns with more of what got 'em to the top in the first place. "One Night" is another example of a Bad Co. song that sounds best when firing out of your car speakers at full volume. The 43-38* Hard Hundred move is aided by adds at WKLS, KJJO, WKFM, WWWV, KFMF, KFMZ, WOUR, WNPQ, WDHA, WRKI and WZZQ along with rotation increases from KAZY, WLLZ, WRIF, KILO, KGON, WAOR, WONE, WIMZ, KZOQ and KMJX. As with the first cut, audience reaction is early and favorable -- WXLP and KBPI are already reporting top 5 phones. KPEZ's Elise Vander Brought adds, "Radio Is heaven right now. I'm so glad 'One Night' is the new Bad Company track, it's been my favorite right from the start" Filled out that bailot for comeback of the year yet?

U2, "Angel of Harlem", Island.... Are there any more hurdles this group could clear? Whip out your statistical decoders, guys and gals. "Rattle and Hum" is the first double album in the Billboard top five albums since Stevie Wonder's "Original Musiquarium I" in 1982. The last double album to go to number one was Bruce's "River" in 1980. On our own Hard album chart, "Rattle and Hum" remains at number one. Banking on some hard-core album shelf-life is **KZEW's Andre Gardner**, "After some intense deliberation, we have gone with 'Angei' as our next depth cut from U2".... Talk about a tough followup, but given the band's apparent domination, anything is probable. As the initial track depth gets whittled down, 137 stay with "Angel", 13 adds from KGB, KRQR, KRXQ, WAOR, WKLS and WNOR. Just short of having two songs in the top ten simultaneously, it moves up 13-12*.


Tom Cochrane, "Big League", RCA.... The raves stack up for this cross-continental fave. Onward march the sports metaphors, here's KZEL's AI Scott with the color, "Tom Cochrane is definitely in the majors with this one. There's no high sticking here, just a great song for everyone in the format".... And the single is not just banking on its strength alone, "Victory Day" holds at 11* on the album chart. 158 stations, and the single plunges even deeper into the HH top ten 9-8*, after adds from KBCO, KZEL, WCMF and WTKX. Also worth noting is 17 increases from the likes of KGB, WLLZ, WMAD, WQFM and WZZO, and a total of 74 power and heavy rotations from CFNY, KOAS, KSJO, WLZR, WCCC, KWHL and WLUP. The roster will get hefty before it gets wimpy, so don't settle for second string.

Bon Jovi, "Born To Be My Baby", Mercury.... Jon broke a lot of Eastern Seaboard hearts when he taped his video in LA, but he probably wasn't thinking along the lines of scrub pines and sand. Ah, the details of shooting logistics, but here's a radio wonder that'll travel anywhere. The dreaded follow-up jinx have definitely been shaken, and a multi-platinum watermark doesn't seem such an impossibility. Check out the convenience of 125 stations, the likes of CFOX, KEZE, KFMH, KLOL, KOMP, WBLM, WMMR and WRQK, as well as new play from 12 stations, like KGB, KZRR, WCKO, WCMF and WPDH. 22-19* move on the HH is a tasty reward for those plaguing annoyances like cloying female teenage grouples. Grin n' bear it, dudes.



Thanks to the CMJ people for making us feel so welcome and opening the doors to their big weekend of sound and light. The panels were well attended and initiated much encouraging banter and those everlovin' showcases seemed even more diverse and widespread than ever before. Those post Tylenol breakfasts and early evening shmoozatoriums dictated that a healthy, hazy glow pretty much prevailed everywhere. As usual, it's the people that make the difference in these affairs and we were fortunate to deal with some of the best. Jackie and Danny were perfect, as always, and what a gas to finally see the Fatal Flowers. Mike Bone was even courageous enough to give Bwana a few samba lessons, tough duty. And let's come clean here, when it became absolutely imperative that I get a little downtime, it was only with the help of my lovely wife Kristi that I was able to negotiate those Third World Taxi drivers. Let's face facts, I was a little beyond exercising my renowned gift for diplomacy. Thanks go out to Mr. Sutter for his unstinting hospitality and, yes, The Pursuit Of Happiness still ranks as a highlight of the weekend. It was great to run into Gavin's Peter Standish, Michael Schnapp celebrating his signing The Cycle Sluts From Hell, Jill Maxick of Chrysalis, Steve Wagner of The Balancing Act, Rhino's Dave Darus, The Master of Mink himself, John Sigler from RCA and other assorted seedy industry types. All of whom I enjoyed very much, thank you. Then it was time to wolf a couple of those famous ten buck burgers, pull on my neoprene suit and get ready for the night action all over again. As for the shows in question, a lot of action got churned out over the Marathon and much of it was remarkable. Our elite Hard Strike Force clocks in now with a blow by blow description of some of those sets.

BULLET LAVOLTA-- I made the trek to a pre-CMJ showcase since the opening ceremonies fell on our weekly <u>dead</u>line. A big live show distraction for me these days is Bullet LaVolta from Boston, master blasters of punk/rock fusion and a real high voltage experience. Loud, sweaty guitar powerchords mull you over, song after song, as lead screamer Yukki Gipe glares and thrashes with a bittersweet mix of anger and disgust (also found on their recent Taang! Records debut). The blaring effects stayed with me the whole day afterward - my eardrums buzzed and my soul felt the effects of a new adrenalin high. The Lazy Cowgirls also played that evening, ragin' a war on their amps that you can't deny.... Friday morning I sleepily wandered into the Vista in search of Moe Berg, and The Pursuit Of Happiness interview. Great guy, as you'll soon read after I dig the tape out of a sea of Seminar promo-stuff and get down to business.... Dawn Hood

JUDSON SPENCE-- When it was all over, Judson Spence showed himself to be twice as charismatic as his press clippings. The band was tight as an epoxy fitting and hizzoner Judson got the crowd upfront and howling for his set which showed off a remarkably strong set of pipes. Club performers come and go but Judson showed an amazing facility in keeping the crowd on a roll that never lagged one iota. This guy has some grit to him and that's no lie and, if this show was any indication, Mr. Spence is going to be working out his mojo on audiences for a long time to come.

SEDUCE-- One of the highlights of the CMJ Convention was getting to see Seduce play live. This band has such a gritty and natural street sound that New York City was the perfect place to let it all loose. Unfortunately, the set was too short to give the people that were unfamiliar with them, the chance to really "experience" their music. And the vocals of Mark Andrews weren't mixed right so he was fairly inaudible for much of the set. For those of us who know and love them already, seeing them play was like the icing on the cake. The most impressive element of this band is by far the guitar army that exists in David Black. One man with one guitar - but you'd swear there were at least two other guitarists up there somewhere. Seduce is one of the most talented power trios out there.... Christine Black

PAUL KELLY-- Paul Kelly and The Messengers took to the stage for a set of expertly done material, much of it from the new album. The band has been together for a few years now and the guitars just swam into each other in a perfectly balanced mix. Paul proved that his charm during our sound check interview was no sham as he turned in a set of surprising intimacy given a warmly appreciative but fairly inattentive audience. The strength of the bottom end in this band is remarkable and the clarity of Paul's vocal work is reassuring. It's nice to hear a gifted songwriter who is capable of turning the trick live as well.

MALLET-HEAD-- A few memories stand out from my first trek to Sanctuary and Mallet-Head, a long-time Hard Acres turntable veteran, was tops. Everything after their set became a visual blur as the only elbow room available was the room I forcibly made with my/elbows. The normal body temperature leaped exponentially and the adrenalin factor made a \$4 beer look pretty damn affordable. I must commend the amiable door staff for compassionately controlling the traffic and, by the way, do Manhattan codes permit the use of cattle prods in an entertainment establishment?... Beth Renaud

SMITHEREENS-- Another big shot in the musical biceps came when the Smithereens blasted New York on the last date of their current tour. Pat and his boys jammed and slammed through a joyous collection of their best material and it was obvious that the hometown folks couldn't have been happier to have their Jersey Giants back. Although I have heard that the band can be a bit stationary in performance, I didn't see any evidence to support that position. Quite the opposite, the group jumped and swung and stomped around during a set that was a lot of fun for all concerned.

WRATHCHILD-- Trapp won't let me say that Wrathchild is God, but they are. The band played on Saturday night and practically tore the place apart. I had been hearing about this band's awesome stage prowess for a good six months prior, but I still couldn't be prepared for the incredible spectacle I was to behold. These guys take every major metal band, chew them up and spit them out. No belligerent nation is safe so long as we have guys like this around. Atlantic probably doesn't know it yet, but they've got the next Metallica on their hands with this one.... Jeff Luttrell

THE PURSUIT OF HAPPINESS-- Then came the much anticipated showcase with The Pursuit Of Happiness. These Canadians with a Todd fixation are doing more than just flirting with America on this go-round. Randy stage stories about chocolate bunnies and their relevance to proctology and some very impressionistic sex slave dancing certainly piques interest when seen in person. But the pay off is the impeccable playing and nonstop energy that this combo from up North brings to the stage. Especially fun was **Moe Berg**'s overall rap and crowd control personality. Those in the know tell us that the band was bouncing off the walls for this Gotham show and it certainly looked that way from my section of the vibrating bar.

COWBOY JUNKIES-- The Cowboy Junkies lived up to every bit of hype and then some. Lead singer Margo Timmons was nothing short of riveting, with a voice as beautiful as you're likely to hear. This is a voice from Heaven. From the soundcheck of "Dead Flowers", to the unique rendering of "Sweet Jane" and the best version of Patsy Cline's "Walking After Midnight" I have ever heard live--- this show was pure magic. Don't get the impression that this is a cover band, these were the only non-originals performed. Hailing from Canada the blend of accordion, pedal steel, electric mandolin, guitar, bass and drums was not the basic but the sublime. I can't remember the last time I could hear a pin drop during quiet music in a club. When it happens at CBGB's with a convention crowd, I count that as a warning of big things to come.... *Mike Marrone*

FATAL FLOWERS-- The Fatal Flowers may have hit the stage but it was the audience that did the reeling once they kicked it in. These guys came all of 4500 miles for a scant 45 minutes onstage but the result was well worth the effort. As chess enthusiasts, the band can appreciate a good strategy when they see one and this opening move in legitimizing these talented Dutch dudes was perfectly timed for the Marathon. Get your hands on the CD and if you're not hooked by the time "Second Chance" rolls past, then you're life has been too easy....

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

American Music Club "California" (Frontier) Mark Eitzel and his San Francisco based quartet embark on their third, and most prolific release to date. It's a discriminating, sensitive ear that will be aroused by their slow, rainy acoustic guitars and passionate lyrics. The tender interplay of soothing, moody peaks and valleys leaves you to ponder the sense of balance and musical strides that make them so special. It's an everyday bore to hear bands mimic blatant country influences. But it's a wonderful and rare moment to experience AMC's selective flavoring and haunting atmosphere in songs like "Highway 5", the tired innocence of "Blue And Grey Shirt", or the breathy solitude of "Laughingstock". Their tempered use of pedal steel and occasional twang of "Firefly" encourage you to look to the west and clear a corner of your heart for the shining excellence of this precious band of melody makers. The lonely, forlorn expressions brought forth by Eitzel's sober vocal tones solidifies their intentions and makes these songs ring true. The most refreshing aspect surrounding AMC is that this group does not subscribe to trends or conformist modes of thought, yet offers an irresistible tug at the vulnerability in all of us. Soak up the energy of "Somewhere" and the reality of "Lonely" and confirm your notions about "Bad Liquor". To know 'em is to love 'em.


Rainbirds (Mercury) If there is a more intriguing and beautiful voice than Katharina Franck's to arrive this year, I haven't heard it. Germany's Rainbirds have a unique effect on the senses, conjuring up acoustic, beat conscious Euro-pop that serves as the textured canvas for Franck's free spirited voice work. This group does not emulate the mainstream, they just borrow from the basics and build upon them with a substantial and creative schemes of sound that instantly take effect on you. We're not talking cliches here, one-listen insta-hits, but more like a Sugarcubes listening mentality that forces you to discover a new state of mind in the music. Simply stated, the lyrics are rich and compelling in songs like "No Greater Love", with a beckon call that would have most masculine types on their knees. The mid-tempo swing of "Boy On The Beach" unveils a tempting dance piece that the remix takes even further, and they pull the reins in for "7 Compartments" with its bluntly focused theme. "Blueprint" moves along with urgency and the smooth, tension filled challenge stands out as a symbolic invitation to revel in their fresh blend of song styles. This is pure pop that does not follow the leader, but veers off in its own confident direction with rewarding results. Fans in Germany are already hot on the trail, and one listen to this debut will tell you why the Rainbirds deserve major attention.

Sarah McLachlan "Touch" (Nettwerk) This young woman's talent for writing and performing enchanting originals is only just beginning to be realized. Just turning the corner of her 20th year, she sings with the experience of a veteran and the classical influence, a divine musical inspiration makes this debut album a sheer pleasure to spend time with. Sarah treats songs with the delicate, intricate touch of a true artist and distinguishing them apart can be similar to that of a Cocteau Twins album, where an overall theme ties each track together with a solid base to draw from. From the hymnal tones of "Touch", her soaring voice matched with the percussive energy in "Vox" and the hypnotizing force of "Out Of The Shadows", these tracks prove without a doubt that Sarah's accomplishments will help her find a place in the spotlight she so richly deserves. She is a songbird set free, one who has focused on an individual flair that is best witnessed first hand. Go ahead and "Touch". Mute Records announces the new Laibach album "Let It Be", an interpretation of The Beatles album, whose first focus has been a hard line rendition of "Get Back". Laibach are a puzzling bunch to most free thinking individuals, but on the

other hand, free thinking individuals would be the only group to fit these puzzle pieces together. They are part of the New Slovenian Art movement which began in 1980, a group whose goal is to present politics and art in the same sphere of thought. The Yugoslavian troop launched out to test the tolerance of the state toward militant forms of theater and art and so far the idea has become popular in neighboring countries of Germany and Austria. Formed in 1984 <u>That Petrol Emotion</u> immediately stirred the scene with the reemergence of former Undertones, the O'Neill brothers. And since then the band has since created its own unique statement with a wild blend of guitars, percussion and the strong presence of lead vocalist, Steve Mack. "End Of The Millennium Psychosis Blues" is their third album and second Lp produced by Roli Mosimann, best known for his involvement with the Swans and Wiseblood. The earlier releases seemed inspired by a paisley-psychedelic pool, and eventually turned into beat driven songs with punchy, challenging lyrics. They have a knack for questioning the values of society and government while stressing the idea that rock music is meant to be most importantly, fun. Steve Mack sets the record straight...

Dawn: "End Of The Millennium Psychosis Blues" is quite a mouthful for an album title.

Steve: Our manager's response was "Oh great! It just rolls right off the tongue, doesn't it guys. People are just gonna love this. And don't you know that records with long titles don't get played?" We said, "Sgt. Pepper's Lonely Hearts Club Band" and he said nothing after that. There's a cartoonist in England who does cartoons for <u>Melody Maker</u> and in one strip the character was singing, "I woke up this morning and had the post nuclear holocaust blues..." and we thought it was really funny. Reamann thought of the title and he always wanted to write a song about it but never quite got around to it. When R.E.M. came up with "End Of The World As We Know It", that was the song Reamann always wanted to write. From there it just became the new album title. People take it <u>so</u> seriously! They ask what we mean by it. Well it's just a little bit of everything that we like. The collage on the cover is a combination of serious things, some political stuff, or favorite musicians, our favorite directors, it's got cheesecake, skateboards, soccer, it's got everything.

Dawn: Do people tend to characterize the band as being more "serious" than it really is?

Steve: Constantly. I think it's a real pain in the ass basically. Up until recently we haven't had interviews in the British press because they just harp on the politics and they keep asking us political questions and how would we solve the Irish problem. We say we're not politicians. The term "political band" is a non sequitur. It does not work. You are either a musician or a politician. We chose music obviously. Our lyrics tend to be frustrated, but who isn't frustrated in the modern world? The design is to give people a little bit more information on what's happening in Northern Ireland, because they certainly aren't going to get it from the press because there's a very effective media clamp down on news coming out of Northern Ireland. It's more insidious in Britain than South Africa, because in Britain you just don't hear about the Irish problem at all. We decided early on to stick to humanistic and civil rights themes early on. We did get a little bit heavier on this Lp, but in England there's this big resurgence of "20th Anniversary of 1968" nostalgia. Well fine, it was a great year with a lot of history being made - Paris riots, the Chicago race riots and everything under the sun except what happened in Northern Ireland. And we're saying that they are <u>still</u> not mentioning it in Britain.

Dawn: Did you move to England wanting to join a band?

Steve: I just got fourth year of college panic. I applied for a couple of jobs, but there really weren't a lot of jobs that I wanted. I was a computer science student and there is a side of me that loves science and computers but I didn't want to work in a big business system, but rather get into computer graphics. I put myself through school and as time went on the jobs got worse and worse. I bailed. I made sure I got a one way ticket to London and I wound up with \$20.00 and that was it. Within three days I found a job and a squat which is a place where you don't pay any rent. I just love London. It's the entertainment capitol of the world - there are so many bands, films and plays to see. I decided to just hang out here for awhile.



Dawn: Did you live in Ireland at any point?

Steve: No. What happened was Reamann and Sean started in Derry playing gigs using a drum machine. Ciaran called them and said, "You do not need a drum machine, you need me. I'm your drummer." As soon as he moved to Ireland, all three moved back to London because they realized you could play the same little pub in Ireland once a week or go to London and play to a lot more people.

Dawn: I noticed the percussive energy is more obvious on "Babble" than "End Of The Millennium..." What direction is the band headed in?

Steve: Five different ones, or even more. We just listen to so many kinds of music and the reason why the new album is so diverse is simply because we listen so much. Sometimes you'll hear an Lp that's <u>so</u> good you just want to write a song and suck up that influence somehow. We each have huge record collections and continue to be vinyl junkies every day of our lives.... "Groove Check" for example, was written in light of an Afrika Bambaataa record of just bonus beats and Ciaran but on the record, started jamming to it and came up with the beginning of the song. Reamann and I sat down and hacked out lyrics and the melody and we wound up saving it for the Lp.

Dawn: "Under The Sky" was a real surprise.

Steve: There is a funny story to that as well. Ciaran was messing around on the guitar when he discovered the tuning to Sonic Youth's "Expressway To Your Skull". He shouted, "This is it!" So he just played for a while and eventually came up with "Under The Sky".

Dawn: How has the band changed since the first album "Manic Pop Thrill" was released?

Steve: Our only goal has been from the beginning to make music that we're proud of and be able to put the records in your collection and say they stand up. When you say "Yeah I can play MC5 and then 'Manic Pop Thrill' and it works". We have absorbed more influences in the last year than in our whole existence. We're playing around with more styles that we were scared to do before. For me personally, I have a little more confidence with my voice and I'm not afraid to do certain songs live. As far as our future, I'd really like to make more songs like "Tension" and "Groove Check". I like that hard, danceable sound. But if I ever told the guys I wanted to sound more like early Killing Joke they'd kill me because they all hated Killing Joke.

Dawn: Is this the first band you've ever been in?

Steve: This is the first band that I ever tried to do anything with. The Fellows (Young Fresh Fellows) used to rehearse in our house and we told them to leave the amps so we could fool around and sing songs like "Cherry Bomb" by the Runaways and jam on guitar. We had this concept called barf music which was playing just what comes up naturally. After I left they actually formalized the band and called it the ThrownUps! I like to say that I was one of the founding members of the ThrownUps.

Dawn: What can we expect from That Petrol Emotion in 1989?

Steve: We're moving over here for six months to tour everywhere from Wala Wala Washington to Greencastle Indiana!

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Kiss, "Let's Put The X In Sex", Mercury 22 releases down the road, and this band refuses to say die. In fact, they've been through some very significant changes in style (losing the make-up) and personnel (Peter Criss, Ace Frehley, Mark St. John, Vinnie Vincent) and yet they still pull top phones and gold and platinum records with barely a flick of Paul Stanley's raven curls, or Gene Simmons' tongue. And guess what folks, Kiss is back with their umpteenth greatest hits collection. BUT, "Let's Put The X ... " is an original track that will no doubt hit the airwaves on both sides of the fence (AOR/Metal) and will quickly get a buzz building. The cut combines elements reminiscent of recent Aerosmith songs and "The Best Of Both Worlds" a la Van Halen. Of course it's done in that inimitable Kiss fashion, which is easily distinguishable from the many current bands who they had such a huge influence on. Question: How do you put the X in Sex? Umm, never mind, I get the picture and I'm sure your wild imaginations will take even that one step further. Anyway, also featured on the forthcoming album is the new version of that favorite Kiss classic "Beth" (our own Beth is weak and trembling with anticipation) as sung by Eric Carr. Look for a November 15th release date. For now, slam this on the T-table and watch Kiss fanatics wreak havoc on your phone lines. (C.B.)

Ratt, "Reach For The Sky", Atlantic The "Rockin' Rodents" first Lp in almost three years shows off even more of the new, bluesier direction that the band's music had begun to take on "Dancin' Undercover", and adds some shades of their older, "Out Of The Cellar" style. Warren DiMartini's playing has been steadily maturing since "Invasion Of Your Privacy", and his licks on this one are more restrained and tastefully placed, but still just as dazzling as when you first heard his chops. Another thing which has matured quite a bit within the band is the unique sound of Stephen Pearcy's voice. Instead of his usual trademark, growling style, he's actually singing a bit more and therefore adding a new dimension to the band's sound. Bobby Blotzer's drums are way up-front in the mix, but that's to be expected on a Beau Hill produced Ratt record. The 12", "Way Cool Junior", (with sax solo intact), pulled in some heavy adds on both sides of the radio fence with respectable showings on both the metal and mainstream Most Added chart, (#1 Most Added Metal and 45 AOR adds), and should enter the Hard Hitters next week. As for the album, check out "City To City", "Don't Bite The Hand That Feeds" "Bottom Line" and "Chain Reaction". (J.L.)

Realm, "Eleanor Rigby"/King Diamond, "The Dark Sides", Roadracer... The strongest of Roadracer's recent releases, these two records are sure to make their presence known on the major metal charts for a time to come. With the waning success of King Diamond's "Them" Lp and with the subsequent tour still in progress, this collection of previously rare and/or unreleased material is sure to bolster his chart life. The record features the seasonal numbers "Halloween" and "No Presents For Christmas" as well as the previously unavailable instrumental "Them". Also appearing are "Phone Call" which was the B-side of the "Welcome Home" 12", "Shrine" which was "The Family Ghost"'s

B-side and "The Lake" which only saw the light of day on the limited-edition "Halloween" picture disc Realm is one of Roadracer's latest bands and they're sure to make a big splash with this re-make of my all-time favorite Beatles' classics. Who would have believed that this tune sounds great thrashed-out too? Not only do they do the song justice, but they cut the time down to 1:58 and still show that they have the talent to make it with their original material. Realm has created a bright spot in a year that has been deluged by poor covers. Look for the 12" this week. (J.L.)

Alice Cooper, "I Got A Line On You"/Iron Eagle II Strk, Epic.... As most of you probably already know, this is a copy of the old Spirit tune. In other words, it's yet another in a seemingly endless stream of songs which have been born-again in the minds of today's

performers. What that means is that while you've undoubtedly heard the original countless times on the neighborhood classic rock station, now it's coming to you in a form you never would have guessed, because when Alice records a song, he holds nothing back. Whereas most recent remakes have been of poor quality, or have lacked the feeling and energy of the original, this one just digs in and doesn't let go. As usual, Kane Roberts' guitarwork is second only to the vocals of the man himself in the mix and he puts the original nuances of Randy California's songwriting style in an entirely new light. This comes to us by way of the soundtrack for the new film "Iron Eagle II" (for the uninformed, it's the sequel to "Iron Eagle I") which also features new stuff from Mike Reno (ex-Loverboy) and Britny Fox. But hey, don't just take my petty words for it, listen and see for yourself. Have a nice day. (J.L.)

"Take It Or Leave It" Vengeance, "Take It Or Leave It", Columbia.... We first wrote about this band a couple of weeks ago, and I'm afraid I still don't know much more about them bio wise. What I do know is that some of you were quick to agree and saw the same things in this band that I did: A talented singer, strong songwriting, skillful musicians and an easy, accessible sound. Yes, with the growing awareness of thrash and hardcore in the metal arena, it's important that there remain some hard rock bands that can hold their own and I really believe this is one of them. Some of those who were convinced are KUNV and WHMH (Heavy), with adds the previous week on KZEL, WCWP and WHJY. The album features some really energetic cuts including one with a horn section thrown in. Some of the best tracks are "Rock And Roll Shower" (could be an interesting segue from Kiss' new cut), "Looks Of A Winner", "Take It Or Leave It" and "Women Of The World". For a record that was mastered at 30ips on 1/2 inch tape, I have to say, the sound quality is outstanding. Kudos to producer/engineer/mixer John Sonneveld. It just goes to prove that even with all the "state of the art" equipment that exists these days, a great band will shine through whether they're recorded digitally or on a four track or what have you. Check this record out because these five dudes from Holland sure make a lot of good noise and could really work for you. (C.B.)

Drive, "Gimme Gimme", Nalli Warp Records.... Who are these guys? A week or two ago a couple of copies of this record land on my desk and Bwana Bill's. Another comes in the mail the next day, along with a couple of cassettes. I think, "Wow, cool cover art".... So, driving up to N.Y.C. the other day we pop it in the ol' deck and voila! Hmmm, this band's not to bad. In fact, they're pretty good. They have a sound that reminds me a lot of the very first Bon Jovi album (not the new stuff) and fall into that vein of music now occupied by the likes of Britton and Only Child and to a lesser extent even Winger. It's hard to pinpoint what it is that's so appealing about this record. Maybe it's the harmonies, or Van Halenish guitar work, or the not-too-heavy keyboard textures. The word "fresh" seems to best describe their sound.... So, this week Phil Hardy calls and he mentions this band and I can see he's really, really into them. Wow. Out of

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nowhere WKNC adds it too. Hmmm, we're really onto something here. Looking at the liner notes I see that Rick Medlocke even lent his vocals. Coolness. What I'm getting at here, is that all you middle of the road type hard rock blocks out there in musicland (and AOR's for that matter) might want to give this Lp a listen. It contains ten rockin' tracks, especially "Bang The Drum", "Crying Girl", "Eyes On You" and an especially nice ballad called "I4U". (C.B.)

leanstreak, "Roadkill", Mercenary/ Celluloid I hope you've all noticed the very healthy trend currently underway in the wild world of metal. It seems those women are beginning to really create a stir within the metal community as well as on the airplay charts. While some have gone the "sex-kitten" route to sell their records, there remain a few bands that have the "right" idea. Meanstreak is one of the harder rocking all female bands to have ever come down the pike, and therefore are fully deserving of the accolades they're currently receiving from college radio jocks across the nation. This band has some great talent that, as good as it is on this record, will no doubt really blossom in Lps to come. The vocal talents of Bettina France are noteworthy for their power and show surprising versatility. She is able to adapt to the ever changing musical rhythms that guitarists Rena Sands and Marlene Apuzzo keep (adeptly) throwing her way. The magic touch of Alex Perialis only reinforces what this record easily has to offer. Some really decent thrashing from a very promising band. I won't lie, I found it hard to imagine girls moshing it up as well as their male counterparts (call me a pessimist if you must, but never to my face, I rather fancy myself quite the opposite actually) but this record has turned that all around. We begin with the break-up of one of the original New Wave of British Heavy Metal bands. Grim Reaper have apparently called it a career. According to guitarist Nick Bowcott, the band have broken up. He told the Earl that all the members will be going their separate ways. It seems that unforeseen circumstances have followed this band throughout their career. Bowcott and vocalist Steve Grimmett have always maintained that they were given the short end of the stick by their european label. The band did manage to release some critically acclaimed albums beginning with "See You In Hell" followed by "Fear No Evil" and their latest, "Rock You To Hell". The band always recorded gut-wrenching metal which featured the fire-breathing guitar work of Bowcott and glass shattering vocals of Grimmett. Grim Reaper is a band that will always have a place among the great NWOBHM acts. Bowcott also mentioned that he is planning to put a new band together but will not call it Grim Reaper. For all intensive purposes, according to Bowcott, Grim Reaper is a dead issue.

Recently the announcement of a pioneering hardcore band signing to a major independent label was made. Caroline Records announced that the Bad Brains had inked a five album deal with the label. The lineup includes Dr. Know on guitar, Daryl Jennifer on bass, Mickie Jayson on drums and ex-People vocalist Taj. The band is currently preparing to go into the studio to record their debut Caroline release. No release date or producer has been named. Look for the album to hit the stores in February. By the way, Bad Brains just completed a virtually sold out 10 date tour of the northeast.

In other Caroline news, look for the new Warzone album entitled "Open Your Eyes". According to publicist Yvonne Garrett, Warzone will be making some lineup changes. We'll keep you posted on those. Also, Caroline will be releasing the "best of" collection from the Misfits. The self-titled album was only released on compact disc prior to today. The album features 20 tracks and is all classic Misfits. Finally, White Zombie are preparing to go into the studio to record their next album with Bill Laswell (Iggy Pop, Motorhead) producing. Look for this one to be out in February.

House Of Lords recently held a listening party at a restaurant in Las Vegas appropriately called the "House Of Lords". The restaurant is located in the world famous Sahara Hotel/Casino. Reports say that Gene Simmons and members of L.A.'s Warrant were present. The band also got up and performed several tracks from their brand new album.

Let's talk about the recent CMJ convention. The Earl was able to attend the Friday session where I received the compliment of compliments from WDHA's Cheryl Richardt who reads this column religiously. Thanks. Anyway, back to the convention. Bon Jovi's world tour began on Halloween in Dublin, Ireland.

Censorship is creeping up once again. According to an article in the November 6th issue of Billboard, Guns N'Roses controversial artwork is causing a stir for some California record stores. According to the article, on October 22, between 150 and 200 protesters representing a women's group known as Media Watch picketed Santa Cruz' Cymbaline Records. The controversy was caused by Robert Williams' painting that originally adorned the front cover of G N'R's "Appetite For Destruction" album. At that time, Geffen Records agreed to substitute a second cover following protests from rackjobbers and retailers. But, the painting was kept on the inside sleeve. Now, Media Watch would like to see the cover removed - period. Because of the protest and the media coverage, Cymbaline Records has removed the album from their racks. According to the article, the 30 store. San Francisco based Rainbow Records has also removed the record after being contacted by Media Watch. I ask one question, when will all this nonsense end? We will keep you posted on this situation. The Earl will also try to contact the parties involved and get to the bottom of this situation.

MUSIC NOW!

The Who are looking for a drummer to join them for when they go into the studio to record a new Who album for release by the middle of next year, as Kenney Jones has left the band to pursue other projects. A 19-track greatest hits album, "Who's Better, Who's Best," is just about to be released. There's a chance of a Who tour next summer.

John Fogerty testified for more than two days in the San Francisco federal court trial of a copyright lawsuit that claims he based the song "Old Man Down The Road" on his song from 14 years earlier, "Run Through The Jungle." He spent time in court describing how he came up with songs for Creedence Clearwater Revival and his solo career, and he played "idea" tapes to show the evolution of his "swamp music" songs. "There are so many ingredients to a record, there is more than one facet to inspiration," Fogerty said in response to a question from Fantasy attorney Malcolm Bernstein. He testified that the ideas for his 1985 "Centerfield" album came from a childhood dream of playing centerfield for the New York Yankees. "The allusion of a ball player saying 'Put me in coach, I'm ready to play' was based on my feeling that I want to get back in the game," Fogerty said.

There was a big riot outside a stadium in Jakarta, Indonesia, when **Mick Jagger** played there. About 70,000 people showed up for Jagger's show, but many couldn't afford the \$14.50 ticket price, which represents two weeks wages for the average Indonesian worker. They started a disturbance outside the Senayan Stadium that damaged over 100 cars and left some people injured, including 30 military police officers. They also burned tires creating a heavy black smoke around the arena. There were major riots in Jakarta four years ago, when 30 people died and many Chinese-owned businesses were burned. High youth unemployment in the city apparently helped lead to this week's disturbance.

Del-Lords guitarist Eric Cambler will have a solo album out in January, called "Loud And Lonesome." The next group album will be a half-live, half-studio release. The band has recorded dates on its current tour for the planned release. Vocalist and songwriter Scott Kempner says he wants to have a truly "live" album. "When people talk about live recordings they love -- The Rolling Stones' 'Get Yer Ya-Ya's Out!', Peter Frampton's live album -- 30 to 80 perecnt of those records aren't live at all," he says. Kempner says he's also contemplating a solo record, saying he has "10 times more songs than necessary" for one. "It would help me release a great deal of the Brian Wilson damage I've accumulated over the years," Kempner says. "I just have to exorcize the demons once and for all."

Why did R.E.M. call their new album "Green"? "There's all the different aspects of the word green," says Michael Stipe, "all the different ways it can be taken. One of them is definitely the (conservationist) political party but there's all these other meanings...one being money, one being a sense of innocence or naivety." Stipe says this album is "much more inner landscape stuff" than the last album, "Document." He adds that he thinks "Pop Song" and "Stand" are "big, dumb songs." "The guys had the music in the works and I just thought, 'God, this is the stupidest music I've ever heard.' It takes a great deal of courage to write a really stupid song, but those guys did it and I really admire 'em for it. I really think it was great and I wanted to match that with a lyric or voice that was equally as stupid but...really kind of great." Stipe is less than enthusiastic about the just-released "Eponymous" compilation of earlier material, even though he collaborated on it. "I don't think I would ever listen to it," Stipe says. "There are only two songs I like on it -the two I say I like in the liner notes. My greatest hits of the last five records would be very different from that and would

probably be incredibly boring. I don't think anyone would really enjoy listening to the songs that I find really moving and I've found have stood up well over a couple of years' time."

Jack Bruce will have a double-album retrospective out early next year that will include previously unreleased material and three new songs he's written and recorded with Eric Clapton. He also hints that Cream might reunite next year. "I think it looks very possible," Bruce says. "We're talking about doing it. Eric (Clapton) said to me, 'Not enough people had the chance to see the band the first time around,' and I agree. I've spoken to (drummer) Ginger Baker recently, and he said he would be very happy to do it."

James Brown has been indicted in South Carolina on two counts of assault and battery with intent to kill and one count of failure to stop for a blue light. The charges stem from an incident last month which police say began when Brown barged into a seminar carrying a gun. Authorities say Brown then led them on a two-state chase, during which Brown tried to run officer two officers who were setting up a roadblock. Meanwhile, Brown's wife, Adrienne, is in a suburban Atlanta hospital recovering from a nervous breakdown. Her uncle says she admitted herself to the hospital, saying she had been suffering severe depression because the problems she has been having with her husband. Charges of possession of PCP are pending against Mrs. Brown.

Harry Dean Stanton's current tour with members of the Call comes before the Call record a new album for a new label (MCA Records). "Harry wants to do his own album," says singer and guitarist Michael Been, "but he needed to learn how to play with a rock & roll drummer." Stanton, who is 62, calls it "an ideal situation" to be touring with members of the Call. "I don't want to be put in that category of frustrated actors who want to sing," Stanton says. "People shouldn't think of me like Don Johnson or Bruce Willis. I'm serious about this. I'm not dilettante." Stanton says he's been singing since he was about two years old. He met the Call's Michael Been while filming "The Last Temptation Of Christ" in Morocco last year.

UB40 expect to continue touring until next July, promoting their latest self-titled album. Their 1984 album, "Labour Of Love," has been doing even better, though, because of the success of "Red Red Wine." "Everything that's happened to us lately has been a total surprise and a bit confusing, actually," says guitarist Robin Campbell. "When we brought 'Red Red Wine' over in '84 to promote the album 'Labour Of Love,' we thought we've got a hit record, because it had been number one in 12 countries. We thought 'this is the one that's going to do it for us in America.' Then we got here and it sort of didn't do it for us. But all of a sudden it's doing it four years later. So it's a surprise that it's happening now, but we always thought it should have done well."

John Mayall's new album, "Chicago Line," features the line-up of the Bluesbreakers that has been around for the last four years, including guitarist Walter Trout, formerly of Canned Heat. "There's a lot of new interest in it (blues)," Mayall says. "I think that's because every 2Q years you get a new group of fans. A lot of blues music is now infiltrating into jeans commercials and into movies. Anytime something hits big, then it commands a large audience."

The members of U2 have received the gold medal of the city of Madrid, Spain, in a ceremony before the premiere of "Rattle And Hum." Mayor Juan Barranco praised the band and described the medal as a "symbol of the gratitude and friendship of the people of Madrid, who are always appreciative of altruistic causes." Proceeds from the premiere in Madrid went to Amnesty International. There was also a big crowd at the London premiere of the film, attended by Bono and The Edge, who tried to mix with the crowd but were stopped by police.

Tiffany is going to review the new Sonic Youth album, "Daydream Nation," for Spin magazine, according to Kim Gordon, bass player and vocalist for the band. Gordon wrote a review of a Tiffany concert earlier this year for New York's Village Voice. "I was surprised, frankly, that she had a real natural ability to sing, and I said as much in the review," Gordon says. "Compared to Madonna, who really struggled when she first began touring, Tiffany was great." Gordon says that "Daydream Nation" is the band's "political record." "At one point, we were thinking of calling it 'Rock & Roll President,' but it was too obvious."

The world premiere of a concert video featuring **Peter Tosh** has been held in Jamaica, and the event benefited the United Way's Hurricane Relief fund. The video, "Peter Tosh - The Last Concert, Live at Reggae Superjam," was filmed in December 1983 at Tosh's last concert. The video should be out in several parts of the world by the end of the year. It was shortly after the Superjam concert that Tosh released his "No Nuclear War" album and he was about to begin a U.S. tour when he was shot and killed at his Kingston home.

Duran Duran singer Simon LeBon almost drowned when his \$2 million yacht "turned turtle" during a sailboat race in 1985, according to testimony before a High Court in London. The owners of the yacht are seeking damages from the people who built it. Testimony in the trial revealed that LeBon was trapped with five crew members in an air pocket for 40 minutes when the boat overturned because welds on the boat failed.

The controversy over "acid house" music continues in Britain. The BBC television program "**Top Of The Pops**" was to include Jolly Roger's "Acid Man" last week, but the program producers pulled it from the line-up at the last minute. There have been a lot of claims that the "acid" in acid house refers to the drug, not to a musical style, and the idea has been given heavy play in Britain's tabloid newspapers. There had been complaints the week before when D-Mob performed their single "We Call It Acieed," and BBC's Radio 1 has refused to put the song on its playlist. A BBC official says record companies have been told that lyrics containing the word acid are "not acceptable."

Johnny Thunders canceled a British tour at the last minute because of a throat infection that would have damaged his larynx if he had continued to sing. There have been reports, denied by his record company, that Thunders suffered a heroin overdose in Spain. He's said to be resting at home in Sweden.

George Harrison hints at an upcoming Beatles collaboration, in an interview with a Brazilian newspaper. Harrison says he and Paul McCartney have spoken a few times in recent months about composing together. "We never stopped being friends," Harrison says, adding that business and other commitments "didn't permit us to be very close to each other."

Michael McDonald has recorded a duet with his wife. "We did an old Jimmy Webb song," he says. "We're looking for a deal right now." But he says he doesn't want to become known as a "duet artist." "The song is always the main criterion for me," he says. "You can only do so many without putting a strain on your relationship with your record label."

John Denver says he's setting aside his hopes of becoming an astronaut anytime soon, partially because his wife is pregnant. "I am seriously limiting my activities for the next year to nurture my wife and child," Denver says. The child is due next June. The commercial arm of the Soviet space program, Glavkosmos, had set a deadline for Denver to pay \$10 million if he wanted to become an astronaut, and that date has now past. "There are still unresolved issues regarding my collaboration with the Soviet space project," Denver says. "However, in informal discussions with policy makers from both the United States and the Soviet Union, I have received clear support, and I am committed to continuing the pursuit of this project."

UK MUSIC NEWS

The Dublin World Premiere of U2's movie, "Rattle And Hum" took place Thursday 27th October, where crowds filled the streets. The British premiere was held the following Monday in London, attended by the band. On the eve of the UK showing, the whole band did a two hour interview for Britain's national pop and rock network, BBC Radio One. Thousands lined Dublin's O'Connel Street to meet their native heroes, while the local police mounted one of their largest security operations. (There was a rumour at one point in the proceedings of an IRA death threat). Among the guests were Terence Trent D'Arby, Jon Bon Jovi and their biographer Eamon Dunphy (who remarked sourly: "If they'd had their way, my book would have been all photographs too." in an apparent criticism of lack of personal detail in the movie.) A similar scenario took place in London on Monday, although the group was prevented by the police from performing an impromptu acoustic set in Leicester Square, although they spent about fifteen minutes talking to people and shaking their hands. As in the United States, the movie will already be on general release by the time you read this.

Early reviews of "Rattle And Hum" are extremely positive. Gavin Martin writes in "The New Musical Express": "It recalls the force and passion of past icons like Jim Morrisson and Lou Reed. U2 have traveled to the heart of rock's hoary myths and turned its long fascination with dodgy, radical chic, into righteous indignation." Max Bell writes in Melody Maker: "Rattle And Hum' entertains, excites and informs. Joanou's concert footage matches U2 punch for punch, while Jordan Croneweth's design and lighting illuminate them with an epic glow. The transition from the grainy black and white to the blood red colour in the Sun Devil's Stadium, Arizona, is a

spectacular concert as it aligns the movie with the director's heroes **Scorsese** and **Coppola**, but then this is not a film about humility... The original working titles for the movie were "U2: The Experience" and "Freedom Like A River" (after **Sam Shepherd**) but the bullet metaphor still suits it best. "Rattle And Hum" goes straight to the heart of the matter. Like **Woody Guthrie**'s guitar, this film kills fascists."

One of the more amusing moments in the Dublin premiere came when the film shows Bono, spraying his by now famous graffiti on the statue in San Francisco. In the cinema audience, shaking his head was Bono's father, who still tells off his son, as Bono explained to his UK audience in the band's interview with BBC Radio One: "I thought the San Francisco love and peace police got a bit heavy actually. It was all in the spirit of the work on which I sprayed. It was this rather extraordinary sculpture, which I personally thought was sort of cosmic litter. I thought it was graffiti in itself so I thought he wouldn't mind if I graffitied it! But it was a stupid thing to do and I really don't recommend that people go around putting a moustache on the Mona Lisa or anything, but it was tour madness. It seemed like the right thing to do at the time. My father gave me hell about it. He turned up in the San Francisco newspapers saying "He deserves everything he gets." When I got home I said; "Thanks very much for double crossing me." He said "I didn't double cross you." I said "Look! Don't talk to the press, please." He said "I never talk to them. Listen, this fella rang up and he said that you'd sprayed on a sculpture. And I said I didn't know whether he had or not but if he has, he deserves everything he gets. But I didn't speak to the press." So I said, "Thanks a lot Dad, that's great." The group seemed unanimous in regarding their visit to the Sun Studios as one of the highlights of the tour captured on film: "A remarkable studio." says Bono. "There are all these photographs of Elvis Presley, Jerry Lee Lewis, Johnny Cash, Sam Philips; this is the room where rock and roll was born and it was a totally mindblowing privilege to playing there. I am embarrassed to say this, but I saw this big old fat valve microphone in the corner and Cowboy Jack Clements, who recorded all those old great singles like "Mystery Train" said that Elvis used to use that mike! He added that it doesn't work. I asked him if he was sure and he said "Well, I don't think so, it's been lying around kept as a souvenir over the years." He plugged it in anyway and it worked. It may sound like total bullshit, but it's the truth and all those songs; "Angel Of Harlem" and "Jesus Christ" were recorded on Elvis' mike." Adds Adam Clayton: "The talk of the day was that we couldn't use the air conditioning unit and it gets really hot at night in Memphis. And you could talk to Cowboy Jack about the nights when musicians were sweating in there, they'd run the air conditioning and sometimes you'd hear the air conditioning on the record. When you think of it in those terms, that's where rock and roll was born. It's mindblowing. There's so much inspiration." Larry agrees: "We couldn't believe the sound of these rooms. We'd walk into the studio, go into the control room, turn up the mikes and suddenly there was that sound!" Although sales of "Rattle And Hum" in Great Britain have slowed from their first week sales of 320,000 to 80,000 this week, the movie release is expected to give the album a shot in the arm, not to mention the national radio interview. In the interview, Bono explained how the album's unusual format came about. "Instead of putting out a double live LP, we chose to put out "Rattle And Hum". The double live LP has been exciting over the years, but generally it's a pile of crap and basically a cash in by big fat rock bands, like U2, to extort more money from their fans. We felt that if we were going to put out a soundtrack to the film, we better come up with something more interesting. So it was our way around the problem. We wanted to show where U2 are going, but we also wanted to put in where we'd come from. The best example of where we're going is probably "God Part 2" or "Hawkmoon 269" and the best example of the sort of things that got us through our last tour are things like "Angel Of Harlem". The Edge adds his own thoughts about "Rattle And Hum", the album: "When we first put the idea of the album we thought we'd have a live

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album with maybe two or three original songs. But when we got into the studio, we just couldn't stop writing. Suddenly we had six studio songs, then it was up to nine and then fifteen then we were going to put out a studio album with no live tracks. At this point our manager was called. We had no idea where it was really going to go and in the end we ended up with the album we did. There were still about four or five live tracks we left off and one or two studio things we didn't finish." For the group, to have scored such a massive hit with "Desire" comes as something of an amusing surprise. They call it "Bo Diddley getting to number one." and admit that it's one of the quickest tracks they've ever conceived and performed. Explains Bono: "We recorded it in five minutes. It's a demo we put out. We nearly chickened out of it but didn't. It's about ambition; about wanting to be in a band. But it's about wanting to be in a band for all the wrong reasons. People think U2 want to save the world, in fact U2 wants to save their own asses - as well as the world, as it happens. The song is about lust lust for success. I've been in Los Angeles for the last six months and we've met with some very shady characters at various times in the night and they're doing terrible things in order to survive-and I had to say that rock and roll was our way out and we wanted that way out: No big deal, no wanting to save the world. Guilty your honour. "Desire" is a record of that. It's a beautiful three minute rock song and I'm delighted the BBC play it as much as they do". One for the most original and stirring renditions of a familiar U2 song is "I Still Haven't Found What I'm Looking For" performed with gospel singers from Harlem at New York's Madison Square Garden. Says The Edge: "Although we had written the song, we'd borrowed the style because it is really a gospel song. When you're in Harlem and suddenly this choir opens up, it is humbling. You suddenly think, "Fuck! this music is much bigger than us or anything. We'd never done anything like this before and so after we arrived at the church in Harlem we thought "Let's just go for it!" So when the choir came to our show, the first thing we realized was that if we played at full volume, no-one's going to hear them - so we literally just tapped the strings and the drums. Towards the end, we stopped playing altogether and they just took over. To see the choir and the audience all singing together...We just stood by the side of the stage with our mouths open. Wow, what an experience" as had been rumoured, the film of Bono taking a tumble in Washington was excised from the final product.

But another scene in the film remained, but only after intense discussion in the group. Filmed on the day of the Enniskillen IRA massacre, Bono delivered a from the gut reaction to his American audience, before launching into "Sunday Bloody Sunday". "I'm, sick and tired of Irish Americans coming up to me who haven't been back to their country in years talking about the glory of the revolution". Says Bono from the stage. "Where's the glory in taking a man out in front of his wife and children?...Dying for the glory of the revolution. Fuck the revolution!" Bono says that in one sense he wishes it hadn't been left in the film, but in another sense he's glad it is. He credits Joanou for talking the band into it and in the BBC interview, clarifies his position: "We stand against the IRA we stand against the UDF - we stand against any men of violence. Our movie makes that very clear. But I will say that I'm also against the British army being in Ulster. I don't think they want to be there and I don't think they should be there. But it is a complex situation with no simple answers. But we are against violence in whatever way it manifests itself. Let's face it. Ireland is a small island off Europe and the fact that the British Government divided it into two countries is ridiculous and I recognize that. It was the British Government who started the problem and I would hope that they can find a solution to the problem. But I know one thing; the solution is not in violence wherever it comes from and U2 stands against that. And personally I don't know if we'll ever play that song again. I've had it with "Sunday Bloody Sunday" as a song and the weight that it carries." It will be left to the music historians to pass judgment on whether U2 will be The Beatles of the 1980's. Whether they are or not, their respect for the fab four is evident

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in "Rattle And Hum". Bono says he covered "Helter Skelter" because it was an excellent McCartney song and he felt that the man received a lot of stick in the press, when really he was always an equal talent to Lennon. But the comparisons between Lennon and Bono are not lost on U2's lead singer. He certainly took great exception to Albert Goldman's book about whom he wrote "God Part Two". Explained Bono: "John Lennon is someone I really respected. I really resented Albert Goldigger's (sic) attempt to pick a fight with a dead man. To point out the contradictions in John Lennon's life, do not negate his brilliance as a musician. He said himself he was crippled inside. We're all full of contradictions. He was just brave enough to own up to them in his songs and we certainly didn't need to read a book to find about them. But the more dangerous thing about Albert Goldman's books on Lenny Bruce, Elvis Presley and on John Lennon, is that he's really attempting to write off the culture from where they came. He is a New York intellectual who is attempting to write of Elvis as an idiot and Lennon as a screwed up guy. We knew these things. Rock and roll is an expression of people who haven't been university educated and has its own culture - that's all we've got. I really objected to Goldman and "God Part Two" is my statement on that." "Rattle And Hum" the movie will be showing across Europe and North America from 4th November.

lan McCulloch has left Echo And The Bunnymen, confirming several months of rumour that the group had split up. Band members Will Sargent, Les Pattinson and Pete de Freitas are continuing to work in the studio without McCulloch. Some sources say they are looking for a new vocalist and it is unclear at the moment as to whether the remaining members can, or will want to continue using the group name without their long serving lead singer. According to one source, Will Sargent may also be working on a solo album. Rumours of a break-up first began last June. At the time McCulloch said: "Maybe this is the big one. I don't know." McCulloch has spent the last six weeks at Liverpool's Amazon Studios, which would indicate that he has already started work on solo material.

IN BRIEF

Julian Cope has been forced to cancel the last four dates on his UK tour after being diagnosed with simple exhaustion... New Order release a new single "Fine Time" 21st November, An album "Technique" follows in January after a short tour of Brazil and Argentina...According to "The New Musical Express", Morrissey is planning to get back together with other former members of The Smiths Andy Rourke, Mike Joyce and Craig Gannon - plus Vini Reilly who played on Morissey's solo album. Morrissey's former songwriting partner in The Smiths, Johnny Marr, will not be involved in the project... George Michael raised over half a million dollars for the Adam Walsh Child Resource Centers project,

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through his recent benefit concert at LA's Irvine Meadow's Amphitheater. The centres offer help to families of missing, molested and abused children...Pet Shop Boys will follow up "Domino Dancing" with "Left To My Own Devices"...Rumours of a Communards split have again been denied...Gaye Bikers On Acid are allegedly known by their record company as The Lesbian Dopeheads On Mopeds...Number one single in Britain this week - the absolutely beautiful "Orinoco Flow" by Ireland's Enya. Number one album, "Money For Nothing" by Dire Straits with "Rattle And Hum" at 2 which has just passed a worldwide sales figure of 7,000,000. Within Britain it has sold 500,000.

This is Greg Mull, Program Director of 96 K-Rock, with an important announcement concerning our second anniversary concert this November 13, at the Lee Civic Center. As you know this concert is part of 96 K-Rock's annual food drive to bolster area food banks for the upcoming holiday season. For this concert there will be no coolers allowed, and regrettably I must announce we will not be selling beer. While the sale of beer is not illegal at this event, the Lee County Sheriff's Office, and particularly Sheriff Frank Wanaka, will not provide officers for security for our event if we sell beer. We have investigated alternative security forces but local regulation requires that security be complimented with deputized officers of Lee County. By Denying us duly sworn deputies the sheriff has killed the beer. I must reiterate, the sale of beer at functions of the Lee Civic Center is not illegal. In fact the Lee Civic Center holds all alcoholic beverage licenses provided by the state of Florida. Officials of the Civic Center gave us the O.K. to sell beer, but in not allowing his deputies to provide security the sheriff has made it impossible for us to conduct our food drive concert if we sell beer. This is a blatant act of discrimination upon those who enjoy rock music since the Sheriff's office has not acted in this way at country concerts, the fights or even wrestling matches. Beer has been sold by the gallons at these events. We have contacted sheriff candidate Mason Scott and asked his position on the sale of beer at rock concerts in Lee County and his response was very favorable. His stance is that this decision should be left to the management of the civic center. Scott says, the County Commission has invested a great deal of time and money hiring responsible leadership for the Lee Civic Center and Mr. Scott says the sheriffs office exists to enforce the law and protect the citizenry, not mandate law through one's own prejudices and opinions. The other candidate for sheriff, John J. McDougall, comments that he feels rock and roll events and the crowds they draw have, quote, a greater chance to insite riots and potentially volatile situations, end quote, therefore he is in keeping with current department policy which will not allow to provide security at rock events where alcoholic beverages are sold. Again I repeat we will not be selling beer at the upcoming Bad Company, John Kilzer and Winger concert because the sheriffs department will not provide security if we do. On November Eighth you have an opportunity to send a message to those who put their personal beliefs above your personal freedoms. There is no legal reason why this beer situation should prevail except that a large portion of Southwest Florida's citizens are being discriminated against, by the very department sworn to protect their rights. Simply because we enjoy a music that is native American rock and roll. Our generation fought in Vietnam, we have earned our position within the community, I urge you to make a difference this Election Day!

What a stellar week for great new product! I was "crushed" by Love and Oranges! This R.E.M. tune proves these guys have kept their edge (as if there was ever any doubt). Can't wait for the full CD. Joe Satriani's "Satch" and "Surfing" were the perfect uptempo rockers, and "Always" is my pick for 1988's track of the year. Likewise, "Crush of Love" is a great mid-tempo instrumental, and goes right into heavy!! Quad-City rockers and "X" staffers alike are real impressed with Joe.... 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


