Programmer's Think Tank

THE COURAGE OF OUR OWN CONVICTIONS

A friend of mine who does a highly rated morning show recently opened a chain of comedy clubs in his area. A funny and creative talent, he cashed in on his radio presence by naming the clubs after himself. I found it a resourceful thing to do to beef up his income. When the time came, however, to advertise this new venture where did he put his ad money? In the newspaper...not on radio.

In other markets, I know entrepreneurial radio people who own yougart stands, muffler franchises, video rentals and every manner of business. None of them advertise on radio regularly if ever.

What all that says to me is that radio people truly believe that radio is a bogus medium. We don't believe radio can truly motivate the listeners to do anything. Sure, we may talk big and keep fighting to get people to write about us in our Arbitron Diary. On the other hand, when it comes down to forking over our own hard-earned money with our very own business venture living by our decision, we choose any road but radio.

Why don't we think radio is an effective communications medium? Is it because we're too close to it? Because we know the product we produce on the air isn't the best we can do – isn't really touching the listeners? I think it may be a little of all of those things, but more significantly, I think

we don't really pay attention to the big picture. We all have our "jobs" in radio. We churn out quarter hours, produce "spots" and devise "promotions." We select and schedule songs and sets. What's missing is a clear overview of what we're doing and why.

As a program director you would probably say your goal is to guide the station so it gets good ratings and is saleable. The sales department undoubtedly see the ultimate goal as being able to sell out the station at the highest possible rates.

A few years ago, a new six-lane bridge was built on Interstate 84 over the Hudson River in New York State. The crews worked from both spans meeting at midriver. When the time came to join spans, it turned out that the two sections were about two yards apart. Concrete and metal had to be twisted, cracked, retooled and bent. Several million dollars later, a somewhat weird bridge finally opened to traffic—nearly a year behind schedule. Someone was missing the big picture.

Who's in charge of radio's big picture? Who watches out to make sure all the construction parts meet at the appointed place in the big scheme of things? Sure we each do our "jobs," just as the bridge workers on both sides of the river did. We – as they – can all point to the work we do as solid, up to or above specification and good. If it doesn't work – well we neither care nor understand. Hell, we delivered numbers – if sales can't sell them, screw them. Hey, we sold the time – if listeners don't flock to a remote

at a car dealer it's <u>radio</u> that doesn't work. The point is that we don't give a lot of thought to the mission of the radio station. We don't spend enough time reflecting that radio must be tooled to meet the lifestyle of its listeners at midstream and perfectly enter their lifestyle. We must go with them wherever they go – and then encourage them to accompany us through the day and through our participating advertisers. It must be a continuous synergistic relationship, not a manipulative, short-sighted scam.

We have owners now that treat radio as a commodity. We have music directors who want to please the record companies, promoters and trade publications. We have PD's who're going for numbers. No wonder nobody would spend his own money on radio advertising – radio's just a big salvage heap out of which we pick a living. Now, if we know radio's a pile of crap how good are we as poker players trying to bluff somebody into investing in advertising on it.

If all we're going to do is keep our eye on the span of the bridge section we're working on, how can we randomly expect to meet at the appointed target? A program director must program, must direct, must see the big picture, and anyone at any radio station who wouldn't invest his last dollar in radio advertising on your station should be fired and sent to work at the newspaper.

You will note that it was promoted as a "Director's Cut", but, that doesn't appear anywhere on the packaging.

The hottest new camcorder is the SONY Handycam "SNAPSHOT". You can't beat this small affordable 8mm camera. It has a 3 inch color LCD and switchable wide angle/telephoto lens. The sound pickup is very good (mono only) and the picture quality is excellent. You won't believe the color and black level of this little giant.

FOSGATE, whose model 3A (THX surround decoder) is considered to be the best out there, has announced (at the CES) that they will be coming with a new decoder by April. Who has the money to keep changing equipment so

rapidly? Resale on this stuff is terrible. However, the used marketplace is a good way of getting into high-end gear at an affordable price.

Q&A

Can laser discs be played many times without the disc losing its quality?

YES...Unlike conventional video tape, the disc is not touched by anything and therefore can't wear out. Discs sometimes have manufacturing problems, but any dealer selling them should replace bad ones instantaneously. Some older discs had a problem and did deteriorate over time, but that problem has been corrected.

I want to get into laser discs, but friends have told me to wait for the new digital TV discs. Should I listen to them?

Hard question to answer? Laser discs are perfected. In many ways, they're

almost perfect. Why wait when you can have a great picture with great sound right now? You can always sell your hardware and software later while enjoying today's technology right NOW!



Are XXX rated films available on laser disc?

YES.

If I buy a big dish can I see JAY LENO's "schtick" while the commercials are on?

NO...The Burbank Skypath feed is exactly what the studio monitors show. You would probably hear the band playing during local breaks while the screen would be black or show an art card. You would also see all the national spots.



ADX DIGITAL WORKSTATIONS

This is the last in my series of columns on digital workstations. Next week we'll get back to more interesting topics related to radio station imaging and production. I call those topics more interesting, because at this point I am digitally exhausted!

Last week after explaining why I think of the DSE 7000 as the "Mercedes" of digital workstations. I was surprised to find that there is an even more expensive line of digital workstations available, The ADX series. Made by Pacific & Engineering Corporation. Each model in the series has been specifically designed for broadcasters, offering high-quality digital multitrack recording and random access editing expressly for production of commercials, promos, station ID's, music, dialogue, and sound effects.

Each ADX system is designed to cover a wide range of applications while offering tools for very specific tasks. Much like the DSE 7000, the ADX integrates the functions of familiar analog equipment - like multitrack tape machines and automated

mix consoles - into a precision digital recording and editing system. ADX software runs on the very latest high-speed Macintosh computers.

There are three different models to choose from. The ADX Eight, the ADX Ensemble. and the ADX Pro. The later being the least expensive of the three - around \$25,000! It doesn't have separate faders like the other two - more expensive ADX units. If you're looking for something that will give your staff the comfort of an analog style mixboard, the ADX Eight is the way to go. It has been specifically designed for users who want to replace their liner 8-track tape decks with disk-based recording and editing. Its transport interface is virtually identical to conventional tape machines. Operations may take place from the dedicated ADX control panel, keyboard, or via on-screen controls as commanded by the trackball. The ADX Ensemble model does come with an 8-track-like mix board as well. The only difference being its compact

Regardless of the hefty price tag, some radio stations have been lured in by the ADX series. Among them, KBIG in L.A., WPLJ in NYC, and XTRA in San Diego. If you're interested, i suggest calling one of



those stations to get the PR&E directly at 619-438-3911.

It's the '90 ladies and gentlemen. Resign yourself to the cold hard truth that you will be working on a digital workstation. The question is "which one"? Hopefully the latest series has been of some help in your decision - making process. As always I welcome your questions, comments, and suggestions. Feel free to give me a ring. 

HOW LONG HAVE YOU BEEN AT POWER106?

It was three years on November 1.

HAVE LONG **ASSOCIATION WITH EMMIS** BROADCASTING, SPECIFICALLY STARTING WITH RICK CUMMINGS AT THE **CORPORATE HEADQUARTERS** INDIANAPOLIS. TAKE US FROM POINT 'A' TO TODAY.

Point A was working for Emmis corporate as a receptionist during college and through that experience. I got to know Rick. I had a double Communications and Journalism, and when I graduated, he hired me as his assistant, much to my parents dismay, because they had just put me through a private university for me to become a secretary, so they were not happy

MONEY WELL SPENT...

Oh yeah...However, my job quickly developed from a very general secretary position into being much more of a true assistant to Rick and becoming more directly involved in the research and the music programming on the Emmis stations. Eventually, it evolved into where I was traveling and helping with startups like WLOL in Minneapolis and

YOU ACTUALLY PICKED UP THESE SKILLS BY OSMOSIS AND WERE GIVEN A LOT OF RESPONSIBILITY SOMEONE WHO USED TO BE THE RECEPTIONIST.

I also think there were images to overcome within the company because of that. But Emmis at that point was still enjoying a tremendous growth spurt, so I was just in the right place at the right time, and worked with the right person in Rick Cummings, Rick has always pushed me and promoted me with others in the company. That helped a lot.

WHAT WAS YOUR FIRST BIG MOVE OUT OF THE NEST, SO TO SPEAK?

In 1991, when the company started downsizing shortly after Emmis purchased the Seattle Mariners, Rick suggested to me it was a good time to get out and get my 'feet wet.' I had previously worked with Greg Strassell when we did the start-up for 'LOL. and he had always told me that he would eventually like to hire me for that station. Unfortunately that didn't

come to pass because we sold the station, so Greg asked me to be the Music Director of WBMX in Boston. I said yes. It was a really good way to ease myself into a music director position. Even though I knew a lot about Selector and I knew a lot about research, I had never done the day-today duties

A LOT PEOPLE DIDN'T KNOW WHO YOU WERE. ALL OF A SUDDEN YOU SHOW UP IN A TOP 10 MARKET, **EVERYONE WAS WONDERING** WHERE YOU CAME FROM.

I know. Greg's sensibilities were very much in line with what I had learned from Rick and the other people at Emmis, so he was a great person to learn from. He treated me the same way Rick treats me, in that he really pushed me, he really promoted me and helped me learn a lot.

WERE YOU SURPRISED AT HOW QUICKLY THINGS HAD **EVOLVED FOR YOU?**

Yes. I started realizing it when I was flying into markets with Rick, walking into a radio station with the format in a box, basically a disk and some carts and putting a new station on two hours later. That was when it really started hitting me. Wow, this is

AFTER LESS THAN A YEAR, YOU GOT THE PHONE CALL

That's right. I had only been in Boston for seven months when Rick called me and asked, "How would you like to come work for me at POWER106?" I distinctly remember feeling like I was going to faint. I just went cold, my heart started pumping and I couldn't talk for about a minute. so I was very excited to say the least. It had always been one of those dream jobs, especially being inside Corporate in Indianapolis and looking far away at HOT97 in New York and POWER106 here in Los Angeles. It was one of those situations that I had always thought, wow, that is so cool. I would love to work there someday.

YOUR TRANSITION FROM BOSTON TO L.A. WENT DOWN VERY QUICKLY, AS I RECALL.

Yes. I left Boston, stopped at home for one night in Indianapolis, and got on a plane the next morning. I arrived in Los Angeles around 11am. Rick picked me up at the airport and said. "Sorry, we don't have time for lunch, there's a lot going on..." We went straight to the radio station and he told me, "The music is done until 3." He showed me the computer and I sat down and balanced music. To say I



involved in the actual programming in addition to doing the music. As things within this corporation picked up through the Spring and early Summer, Rick ended up on the road more and more, so I was handling a lot of stuff anyway in addition to just doing the music. This format and this station moved so fast that if Rick was gone for a week or two it just put him that much further out of the loop, and he was getting frustrated with that. At that point he decided that he wanted to move me up.

DID THE STAFF TEND TO ALREADY GRAVITATE TOWARD YOU AND LOOK TO YOU FOR LEADERSHIP IN RICK'S ABSENCE?

Yes. It naturally happened as people needed direction or answers on things. I think the most telling thing was when we announced it to our staff, everyone seemed real excited and thought that I deserved it, so that made me feel really good.

GREAT PERSONALLY PROFESSIONALLY, BUT YOU ALWAYS WONDER IN THE BACK OF YOUR MIND, I HOPE I'VE GOT THE TRUE SUPPORT OF EVERYONE ON THE STAFF.

Do I have the credibility?

SOMETIMES YOU WONDER WHO'S GOT THE KNIFE...

Right. I think what made it a particularly smooth transition here was that we had built the staff almost over again over the two and a half years before I was named program director, and we have such an incredible chemistry between staff members and I know that helped a lot.

SPEAKING OF STAFF CHEM-ISTRY, THE BIG PHENOMENON IN LOS ANGELES FOR THE PAST YEAR HAS BEEN THE SUCCESS

"It's more important to find people who fit your format and are inherently talented and teach them radio, rather than find someone in radio and heach them to be entertaining."

incredible. This is fun and things are really jumping.

REALIZE HOW **MUCH** RESPONSIBILITY YOU WERE WIELDING AT THAT TIME.

I guess I never felt like I was wielding the responsibility as much as I was part of the team. At that point in my life, I was young, I was 23 or 24, and I had never dreamed that I would work for an A/C station. At that point I was still going to clubs and loved dance music and hip-hop, everything but A/C, but the cool thing was 'BMX wasn't an A/C per se. It was much funkier than your average A/C station. so I really got into the music there and I learned a lot about the roots of dance music, R&B and Soulwas thrown into the job would be a

AND YOU'RE THINKING TO YOURSELF, WHAT THE HELL IS A 'ZHANE?' WHAT'S THE SOUND CODE?

I know! It was pretty crazy.

YOU WERE NAMED PROGRAM DIRECTOR ON AUGUST 1ST OF LAST YEAR, RICK WAS EASING HIMSELF OUT OF THE DAY TO DAY. CAN YOU TAKE US **THROUGH** THAT TRANSITIONAL PERIOD?

It had been happening over time. I had become APD last Fall sometime. I had inherited those additional duties and was starting to get more and more



OWNING THE SHOW (AND WAYS TO STEAL IT, TOO!)

More and more schools have taken Latin out of their curriculum, and administrators are using the excuse that it's a "lost language" and had no value in today's world. Maybe "Owning The Show" is a Lost Art. That would explain why so few radio professionals have the slightest clue on how to maximize visibility and presence at such high-traffic events, as concerts and festivals.

I know a lot of people in the industry who would consider sending the van with a dozen t-shirts to be Owning The Show. Please, if that's your idea of a good concert promotion, then do everyone a favor, and quit and go work at UPS. You'll probably make more money and you'll be hanging with similar creative people.

An event like a concert should be something that you plan towards, mustering resources and laying out a battle plan for the evening. Because that's what it really is: a battle. The Mother Of All Promotions. I used to treat each concert like it was the only event I'd be doing that year. Instead of just having one jock there, I'd get them ALL out at the arena. If you're a competitor and you show up in your van and literally every employee of the other station is out in the parking lot and at the doors, in t-shirts, passing out stickers or bodypatching people, that's a pretty daunting sight. It almost makes you want to pack up and head back to the station. And that's the whole idea. I mean, how often do you get 20,000 potential core listeners together for one night, in one place. Make the most of it!


Dave Redelberger is the Promotion Director at WGTZ in Dayton and tries to work several different elements into his station's concert presence. He gets airstaff out at the arena and broadcasting from various locations both inside and outside the venue, simultaneously. Additionally he has the 'GTZ mascot greeting fans inside the van, with flashing overhead lights, cruising the parking lots and adjacent streets. "When you have a chance to impact a massive amount of people at once, it's a chance you don't want to blow. Not only do you want to look great, but you have to look better than the competition," says Redelberger. One of his favorite bits is to bribe staff at the arena to find out the plans of his competitors, and then to get their "designated" broadcast spot early to terrorize them a little. He likes to hand out little "annoyance" stickers close to the other station's van, and invariably they end up plastered all over it.

You have to admit that there is some pleasure to be gained from Rambling the guys across the street. And what better place than at a major concert, in front of thousands of people? Larry Hyrb is the Promotion Director at KISS95.7 in Hartford and feels the pinnacle of his "concert career" was last year's Janet show, which WKSS owned with a massive show of visibility. Larry likes to say "there's always a way to one-up them," as he proved at this concert. The Hartford Civic Center is connected to a mall and his competitors were broadcasting from center court prior to the Janet show. Understandably there were a lot of fans hanging around, watching the broadcast,

station's broadcast. The crowd went nuts popping the balloons, trying to find the ones that had prizes inside!

When it comes to such hightraffic events as concerts, signage is the key to winning the on-site battle. This shouldn't be some "thrown together" promotion. Go out a few days ahead of time and do a signage schematic of the arena and the surroundings overpasses, buildings, fences. and neighborhoods. Once you have this, you'll always know where to hang your banners for future concerts too. Check out sight angles and bring some cash in case you need to grease some palms of people who have businesses and homes at busy intersections and on heavily traveled roads into and out of the

Inside the arena it's always a little more difficult. But don't let that stop you. Larry Hryb at KISS in Hartford has got the local arena to use the LED part of the scoreboard that hangs from the roof for contesting and signage during events. The giant beachballs, when logoed, are an

Milwaukee. "You should be able to look left, right, back and center, and wherever you look, there should be some form of stage signage", says Thomas. Peel-off body patches are one tool that he used to increase his presence at concerts when he was at Wild107 in the Bay Area. These can be customized for the specific concert, and can be numbered for contesting purposes. "It's pretty cool to go inside a concert and see thousands of people walking around with your stickers on them," adds Thomas, who has been known to bribe arena security to get the competition's announcers kicked out of shows.

Concerts are promotional opportunities that unfortunately many stations seem completely miss the boat on. These are enormous life-style, music-oriented events that draw huge crowds. Going to a major show is a big deal for your audience. Become a part of the experience, and thus, become a part of their memory of the evening. Your promotion shouldn't end with the on-air ticket giveaway. It should be gearing up and getting ready for the next stage: the total and complete domination of the actual concert.

and waiting to go in to the concert. KISS had been promoting that they had backstage passes for givaway before the concert and to keep listening for details. When the crowds outside and around the arena were at their height, WKSS got on the radio (and outside speakers) and told everyone to rush inside the mall courtyard because they were about to unload all of their passes and front row tickets. Minutes later KISS95.7 staff dropped 1000 KISS balloons (filled with a nitrogen/oxygen mixture to make them fall quicker) onto the crowds around

outstanding way to get some extra presence during a show, plus it gives the crowd something to do between acts. Sneak some banners in and try to get people in the sky boxes to hang them out the windows. Or do your own banner contest with the promoter or the facility. They'll say no and "it's easier to beg forgiveness then to ask for permission," Hryb reminds us.

One of the all-time concert Rambo'ers is Rick Thomas, PD at KSFM in Sacramento. He's honed his skills at stations like Y95 in Phoenix, Z90 in San Diego and HOT102 in



OF THE BAKA BOYZ IN MORNING DRIVE. HOW DOES IT FEEL TO HAVE TAKEN SUCH AN INITIAL RISK AND HAVE IT PAY OFF BIG TIME?

I can't take credit for finding the Baka Boys and taking the chance and putting them on the air. In most people's eyes, it was definitely a tremendous gamble that Rick took because it was so unprecedented, but it's certainly been incredible. They're the kind of people who just have talent. They're entertaining, they're charming, they live the lifestyle, they love the music and all those things add up and that's why they're successful.

WHAT IS IT ABOUT ERIC AND NICK THAT PROPELLED THEM INTO THE TOP FIVE MORNING SHOWS IN L.A.?

That's a tough question because we always expected it to hit. We wouldn't have done it if we didn't think it was the right move. They're an interesting dichotomy. They're only 21 and 24 years old, and yet they are very mature and have an intense business sense. They understand business, they understand the business of radio and the business of the music industry, but they still retain the street flavor that's been so important to their image, and again, they live the lifestyle, they love the music, they know the artists... it all adds up.

DIDN'T THEY JUST BEAT HOWARD STERN IN THE LATEST RATINGS?

Yes, Howard and Rick Dees, It was very exciting.

WHO ELSE IS BACKING THEM **UP ON THE MORNING SHOW?**

We brought Stretch (Mike Roberts) back down from WILD107. He went up with Frank Lozano when Frank left POWER. We were very sorry to see Stretch go, but it was something he felt like he really wanted to do. We were able to get him back a few months ago, and he adds a lot to the morning show. He does a lot of work by himself. I know a lot of morning shows have very big staffs, but ours consists of just Nick, Eric, Stretch and Fernando, so it's lean and mean.

I UNDERSTAND YOU'RE ALSO BREAKING ANOTHER OLD MORNING SHOW RULE: YOU DON'T DO ANY NEWS.

We don't do any formal news on the hour, but of course we cover any breaking stories that may affect our listeners, like earthquakes, floods, etc. We've always done our share of lifestyle-oriented news, which our listeners seem to prefer to the traditional hard news approach. If our audience wants that type of hard news, they know where they can get it, and luckily, they always come back

to us for entertainment. We've seen time and time again in all forms of research that what people care about from this station in the morning is music and entertainment, so that's primarily what we try to deliver.

THE BOYZ ALSO DO LIVE MIXES DURING THE MORNING SHOW?

Yes. Eric mixes everything live. Once in a while Nick jumps on, but for the most part Eric does all the

TAKE US THROUGH THE REST OF THE SHIFTS, STARTING WITH THE FORMER GNARLIE CHARLIE.

That's right. Middays right now is Charlie Huero who is also our Assistant Music Director, Charlie is probably one of our best jocks from the sense of formatics. He really understands the sequence, and he adheres to it. He's a good jock, and that's no small feat on a station like this which has moved more and more over the last three years to a hip-hop style, a much more multi-ethnic style. Let's face it, Charlie's a white Midwestern guy like I'm a white Midwestern girl, so it's no small feat that he's here.

AFTERNOONS, OF COURSE, IS DAVE MORALES.

Dave joined us from WILD107 a little over two years ago. He's great.

REMEMBER THIS JUNCTURE... OK, BACK TO THE AIRSTAFF...YOU HAVE ANOTHER HOMEGROWN SUCCESS STORY WITH BIG BOY.

This Big Boy story is incredible. This goes along with the theory that Rick has developed over the last couple of years, and I think the success of the Baka Boys has really crystallized this for him. He feels it's more important to find people who fit your format and who are inherently entertaining and comedic or talented and teach them radio, rather than to try and find someone who's in radio and teach them to be entertaining. So with that in mind, the Baka Boys had brought Big Boy to a picnic at Rick's house, and within minutes after meeting him Rick was in tears just laughing his ass off. We ended up putting Big Boy on in overnights with a board op and got him warmed up. It very easy to place him in nights after not too long. He was entertaining right off the bat with a board op and two months later he was running his own board, and now he's totally selfsufficient. He started the week after I started - August 8, so he's blowing up big and quickly.

HOW ARE THE NIGHT

The numbers are great. I think they're the highest that they've ever

NUMBERS SUPPORTING THIS **UNIQUE EXPERIMENT?**

On the Baka Boyz: "They understand the business of radio and the business of the music industry, but they still retain the street flavor that's been so important to their image."

He adds a lot of personality to the station. He's a great jock and one of the sweetest people to work with. We put him in nights when we first hired him and then moved him to afternoon drive when we originally put the Baka Boyz on at night. We also gave him a shot in morning drive after Jay Thomas left, but he was just as relieved as we were when we tried something else.

THOSE HOURS ARE NOT FOR EVERYBODY.

No, and Morales is definitely a party guy.

WOULDN'T **KNOW** ANYTHING ABOUT THAT, NOR WOULD I CARE TO COMMENT AT THIS TIME...

Have you ever tried Schlivovitz?

DON'T ACTUALLY been in nights. He's #1 at nights, so he's kicking butt. He sounds like his audience.

After that we have the "Slow Jam Show" from 11pm - 1am hosted by Josefa Salinas, a lovely lady with a gorgeous voice. Filling out overnights right now we have Rosie G. who we brought down from Q105 in Oxnard. She's getting her sea legs and getting up to speed, and she sounds great.

POWER106 HAS ALWAYS BEEN TARGETED TO A LATINO AUDIENCE, BUT YOU'VE ALSO PICKED UP QUITE A SPILL OVER, WHICH IS A GREAT SIGN OF SUCCESS. TELL ME **ABOUT** THE **ETHNIC** BREAKDOWN, I'M SURE YOU **GUYS WERE SURPRISED TOO.**

Our core is still a solid 60% Hispanic, give or take, we've doubled our African-American listenership from six percent to 12 percent, and the rest is classified as 'other,' which includes Whites, Asians and anybody

THE TRADITIONAL OBSTACLE OF ANY ETHNIC-TARGETED RADIO STATION HAS ALWAYS BEEN SELLING THE STATION ON THE STREETS, DEALING WITH AD AGENCIES AND OVERCOMING PERCEIVED IMAGE IN THE COMMUNITY. HOW HAS POWER106 DEALT WITH THESE ISSUES?

I think it's a tribute to our General Sales Manager, Marie Kordus, who has assembled a staff of young account executives who understand the format and understands our target audience. They're very good at selling this station, and I feel perceptions within the advertising community are changing as well about Los Angeles in general and this marketplace. It's not too hard to look around and figure out that this town is comprised of a majority of Latinos, a very lucrative, previously untapped market.

The other thing that helps is our performance with the 18-34 demo, That's really our saleable demo.

DO THEY SELL RESULTS AS WELL AS THE NUMBERS?

Oh, definitely. The other thing that helps in a subtle way is the community involvement the station has. I think it gives the advertising community a feeling that we really are in the community and doing lots of stuff.

YOU OBVIOUSLY GIVE MORE THAN LIP SERVICE TO COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT -YOUR STATION DOES A PRIME TIME PUBLIC AFFAIRS SHOW.

That's correct. We do a public affairs show on Monday nights called 'From The Streets,' and it's been very successful. Most people wouldn't risk putting a public affairs show on during prime time listening. We have, and it's really paid off. It's given us the forum to aggressively attack issues that really mean something to our listening audience.

YOU TIED THE SHOW IN WITH THE VERY CONTROVERSIAL STATE IMMIGRATION BALLOT ISSUE, PROPOSITION 187 RECENTLY.

We did an initial 'From The Streets' show on 187 and the response was so incredible we did a special three hour-long show the night before the election, featuring a number of illustrious guests. We took a lot of phone calls and did a poll that day

The proposition is a touchy subject because it's about denying education and medical services to illegal immigrants. In Los Angeles the census figure for Latinos is about 40%. The unofficial figure is probably closer to 50% or even higher, so you're talking about a large group of the Los Angeles population who was going to be affected. It was a pretty frightening proposition. Ironically, it ended up passing, but it will be appealed.

IT WAS PRETTY AMAZING TO SEE THE POWER THAT THE RADIO STATION COULD BRING TO REAR ON THIS SUBJECT.

We've seen before in this town when there's a topic that people get emotionally charged about it can often times result in violence on the streets, We feel like it's important for us to be a sounding board so that people can use this radio forum to get things off their chest, instead of throwing a rock through somebody's storefront window.

GOTTA TAKE A MINUTE TO MENTION BRUCE ST. JAMES, WHO WAS HIRED AS MD SEVERAL MONTHS AGO, MUCH TO THE DELIGHT OF THE INDUSTRY. BRUCE HAD BEEN A NOT-SO-SECRET WEAPON AT KJYK IN TUCSON AND EVERYBODY KNEW HE WAS GOING TO GET HIS DREAM SHOT EVENTUALLY.

I've known Bruce for a long time over the telephone and always liked him tremendously. Our musical tastes were very much in line, and he just seemed to embody a lot of the qualities that are important to Rick and myself. I had several opportunities to hang out with him a little bit at conventions and I always kept a thought in the back of my mind that I'd really like to work with this guy some day. He was the first and only person that I came up with right off the bat when Rick asked who we should interview for my old position.

HAS HE PASSED THAT PESKY PROBATIONARY PERIOD YET?

Absolutely, with flying colors.

WE WERE A BIT CONCERNED ABOUT HIM...WHAT ELSE HAS BRUCE BROUGHT TO THE TABLE?

Bruce is a neat person for this position in that he understands the music, likes the music, he's good at picking the hits and he easily handles the daily duties. What he brings to the table in addition is a keen sense of programming, a keen sense of marketing and an overall enthusiasm for what we do here. He sees the big picture outside the walls of his office.

FILL US IN ABOUT JOHN BOYLE, YOUR PROMOTIONS WIZARD?

44

John is awesome. He was here when I got here and he's just been a pleasure to work with. He works his butt off and gets it done. We had 10,000 satin concert patches made up for the Boyz II Men concert last week at the Forum, and there was John, standing out in the pouring rain passing out satin patches. He definitely goes above the call of duty.

We have a large promotions staff. We have a lot of kids working here who are in the demo, POWER106 listeners, who run our fleet of vans and go out with the 'Big Ass Bus' and do a lot of street promotions.

WHAT OTHER PROMOTIONAL VEHICLES DO YOU HAVE?

The 'Big Ass Bus' has been the most useful vehicle we have because it has a complete studio inside of it. We're able to take it to a lot of places and do remote broadcasts.

HOW 'BOUT THAT PAUL SANSONE, YOUR MARKETING DIRECTOR?

He's the mastermind behind all those billboard campaigns, and TV spots.

THOSE BAKA BOYZ BILLBOARDS WERE HYSTERICAL.

They were funny. The problem was we pissed a lot of people off in Los Angeles with those billboards. The problem was the slogan - '2 Fat

THAT THE BOARDS WERE EVENTUALLY ALTERED.

They were altered for the remainder of the campaign late summer and early fall. We slugged them with 'Two Fat, Proud Mexicanz.' That series of boards are now down, however we are getting ready to come with a second billboard campaign. They should be up in a week or so and are very much along the same lines and I think, even funnier.

We're also getting ready to hit with a TV spot, so that should be pretty fun.

YOU'VE BEEN IN THE PD CHAIR FOR LESS THAN A YEAR AND YET, THINGS ARE MOVING AROUND YOU AT WHAT SEEMS LIKE THE SPEED OF LIGHT. WHAT'S YOUR GUT TELLING YOU ABOUT THE FEEL OF POWER106 RIGHT THIS MINUTE?

My gut's telling me that we're hot right now. It's just one of those subtle things. When I start getting phone calls from people who are complaining about something they heard, or the phone's ringing off the hook for tickets to an event we're doing, when we factor that all together we seem to be drawing a lot of attention, both negative and positive when we're on fire, and it just feels that way right now.

DO YOU PUT MUCH CREDENCE IN HEARING NEGATIVES?

Mexicanz.' The Baka Boyz have used that slogan on the air ever since they did nights here.

THEY WERE THE FIRST ONES TO POKE FUN AT THEMSELVES.

Yes, and it was very frustrating to have. You know what it was, more than a racial issue, was a generational gap. Our audience adores that slogan because they know the Baka Boyz and they know that they're being self-effacing. It was their parents, their aunts and uncles and grandparents who didn't get it, and consequently, they took extreme offense to that slogan.

WHAT SORT OF RESPONSE DID THAT GENERATE?

Aside from the picketing and the boycotts and all the TV coverage, not much...

HEY, ALWAYS TAKE THE FREE TV COVERAGE... I NOTICED

No, it doesn't bother me at all. I put them in the same bin with the positive things. If we're drawing any attention at all, good or bad, it just means people know we're here.

ANY OTHER TWEAKAGE YOU THINK THE STATION IS GOING TO REOUIRE?

Oh, I'm certain it will. The only constant at this station is change, and Power106 is constantly evolving.

DO YOU NETWORK WITH STEVE SMITH AT HOT97 IN NEW YORK?

Absolutely. We work together on music, although his music tends to be a little bit different, we have the same philosophy as far as both stations serve their audience and what we're here to do, so it's been very helpful working with Steve.

YOU'VE BOTH GOT GROUND-BREAKING HIP-HOP MORNING SHOWS TO BOUNCE OFF EACH OTHER

Yes, in fact we've traded bits back and forth, so that they almost sound the same of course without the personalities.

ANY OTHER CAREER INFLUENCES? ANYONE ELSE WHO YOU FEEL HAS HAD A POSITIVE IMPACT ON YOUR CAREER?

I've had so much help and there's so many people to thank. Some of the names that pop to mind immediately: Joel Salkowitz, Kevin McCabe, Al Tavera, Mary Shuminas and Bill Gamble at Q101 in Chicago. A lot of people like that who've just supported me and helped, and certainly Doyle Rose, our General Manager has been there and pushed me in much the same way Rick has. I feel that Doyle is a unique manager, in that he balances the bottom line and meeting corporate budgets, while at the same time maintains the integrity of our product, which is one of the major reasons that this station continues to flourish.

PLANS FOR THE FUTURE?

Professionally, to keep winning and to keep this thing on top. We've invested a lot of time here. It's taken three long years and we're not about to let it slip now.

ANY CLOSING WORDS OF WISDOM?

There's a lot to be said about being in the right place at the right time, but you have to back up good luck with a lot of hard work and dedication. I have had the great fortune of working with people who are the best at what they do and learning from them. I have also relied on surrounding myself with people who 'get it.' I don't pretend to come up with everything we do here at Power106: I would be lost without a staff full of people who live the lifestyle and love what we do. The most important lesson I've learned, and try to impress upon our staff by example, is to do this job with a sense of humor, with integrity, and honesty. I want to feel good about how I did my job at the end of the day.




