CHAPTERHOUSE We Are The Beautiful (Dedicated/Arista) - Not only have East Coast stations like WFNX, WENZ, WDRE, WHFS, WBRU and WRAS gone on this record, but the West Coast seems to be opening up the rotations as well with stations like Live 105, KEDJ, X96, KWOD and KTCL. This format was built on records like this. The tour has started this week with the Wonderstuff. Tickets please!

THE DENTISTS Gas (EW/AG) - If you fancy music with brains as well as brawn, Here it is. A great week at radio including One of the most added. Already on WBRU, WHTG, WDST, WLAVAM, WWDX, KLZR, KBAC, WBER and KAVC. Don't let the name persuade you that this is a joke, it's for real! When you lock into the chorus, you're hooked!

BEAUTIFUL PEOPLE If 60's Were 90's (Continuum) - In the two decades since Jimi's passing, his call has been heeded by countless musicians (especially recently). Beautiful People are one of the very few to properly channel his true spirit without completely ripping off his integrity. They totally update his sound for the 90's. Don't overlook the new voice of '94. With all of the clutter of female artists, Mae's voice cuts through the rest. Just ask John Clay who says "If you played bohemia you have to play this. If you missed it-strike one. Don't wait for strike two, you're out of touch if you're not on this." By the way, have you checked out the new TriStar release Hector Zazou I'll Strangle You? Look for it Crammdisk and features Anneli Drecker from Bel Canto, Film star Gerard Depardieu with Tim Simeon and Bill Laswell.





JUDY CHEEKS So In Love (The Real Deal) (POSITIVA UK/ERG) - DJ EFX was right, this is the beat! Sounds like something I would've worked on. Melodic enough to be commercial, but cool enough to be on the cutting edge. It's got my vote.

PATRA Worker Man (EPIC) - It's no longer a man's world when you've got women like Patra chantin'. Much mixes to choose from, and they are all good. I foresee the streets influenced by this track; right out the box. Radio might be a bit slower.

BLACK GIRL Krazy (RCA) - Just when you thought there was no more room for a mid-tempo R&B groove with at least three women blowin' over the top...they're here! Nuff said.



Group PD, Heritage Broadcast Group, Inc. by KEVIN CARTER

TELL US ABOUT HERITAGE BROADCASTING AND SOME OF THE PROPERTIES THAT IT OWNS?

Heritage is one of the up-and-coming broadcast groups in the country. We're very diversified. We have an Oldies station in Ft. Meyers, we have three Top40s, one in Daytona, one in Gadsden-Birmingham, and the station here in Asheville. We also own five Country stations, in Gainesville, Asheville, Gadsden, and we have have a Country combo in Rock Springs, Wyoming.

AND AS EXPECTED, THE COUNTRY STATIONS ARE ALL PERFORMING WELL?

They're all doing very well. In fact, our hat's off to Frank Bird. He's the Program Director at our Country station here in Asheville. They've got a 24 share, very well received by the community, and legendary morning man Scotty Roadarmer has been there for 39 years.

I UNDERSTAND HERITAGE IS IN THE MIDST OF A PENDING SALE?

The group, with the exception of the Rock Springs combo is in the process of being purchased by Frank Osborn. (Osborn Communications, set to take over April 1.) Nothing firm yet, but I'm anticipating my duties will be expanded. Osborn has a couple of great stations in Wheeling, WV and Syracuse, where I worked prior to this job.

TELL ME HOW YOU LANDED THIS PRESTIGIOUS GROUP PD GIG HERE FOR HERITAGE BROADCASTING.

The new president of Heritage came in last July. His name is Steve Humphries, and he has a tremendous background. He's a very intelligent broadcaster. The thing I like most is he's aggressive, direct and to the point, and he is also a believer in the Top40 format, which was a gift from God. He offered me the job after two weeks of working together. Things have been great. We have many of the same philosophical points, yet we still disagree from time to time, which makes for a tremendous product. I have learned a great deal in the last eight months.

IT'S NO SECRET THAT YOU ARE A DIEHARD BELIEVER IN TOP40 RADIO.

I'm very much a believer in Top40 radio. Everywhere I've worked I've always tried to stick to what made Top40 successful: playing the hits. Playing a diverse mix: Rock, Dance,

even Country. Stations that I program all play some of the big Country things like Garth Brooks, Vince Gill, Wynonna. If they're hot, if they're happening in that market, I think Top40 should be playing them while they're hot.

SO YOU'RE NOT A BIG PROPONENT OF NICHE PROGRAMMING?

No, not for contemporary stations. I disagree with niche programming. Top40 is a cume format, and you need to appeal to everybody. It's the most fun, the most exciting. If you've got a great morning show and if you're playing the hits, the people will come.

TELL US ABOUT YOUR BACKGROUND. EARLY INTEREST IN RADIO AND SOME OF THE BIG TIME STATIONS YOU'VE WORKED AT.

I started in radio at an NPR radio station (National Public Radio). I moved from that into Classical in Grand Forks, North Dakota. I worked for that combo while I was still in high school and the first year of college. They moved me over to the FM side to do Classical and Jazz.

That was my real introduction to radio. My mother said, even from an early age, I was always goofing around with the tape recorder with my cousins trying to be a DJ at home,

BACK THEN THEY WOULD LET YOU IN, AND IF THEY TOOK A SHINE TO YOU, YOU COULD WORK YOUR WAY UP BY SWEEPING FLOORS...

That's basically how I started. Running Larry King overnights on the Mutual Network, I would do the breaks, and between those breaks I'd have 20 minute segments to go back and goof around in the production room. We also had an FM in the building and they gave me a shot doing weekends, and that's all 1 needed. I thought I knew it all after six months. I sent a tape out to Bill Richards, who is now consulting, and I went on an exchange program out to the University of California, Sonoma, Bill ended up giving me a job and a few golf lessons.

I WOULD PAY MONEY NOW TO HEAR THAT TAPE,

It is bad. Under the name of 'Wade Foster.' I think Bill, also being from the Midwest, knew that I had a good work ethic. He put me on at KREO in Santa Rosa. He'd have aircheck meetings with me every week and really gave me an opportunity to work on things and grow.

From KREO I went back to my hometown and went to work for Ingsted Broadcasting at XL93 in Grand Forks. They started up a brand new station in Rapid City - KGGG,



So he called Chapin, and without even hearing me, he called and asked me to come work for him in Springfield, MO. He offered me about \$22,000, and I said yes. It was a lot more money than I was making. \$22,000 doing nights back in 1984 was pretty good.

I drove down there and told the receptionist my name was J.J. Cook and I was there to see Mike Schmidt, the program director. I said, "I'm the new night guy and music director." Schmidt comes around the corner and asks, "Who are you?" I told him I was J.J. Cook, his new night guy. "Dick Chapin said I was supposed to come down and talk to you..." Schmidt knew nothing about it. Next thing l know, another guy walks up to me and asks me who I was. I tell him I'm J.J. the new night guy, and I asked him, "Who are you?" And he goes, "I'm the night guy."

"If there's ever only one Top40 station left in the country, I'll either be programming it, or I'll own it."

playing 45s. I was what you'd call a prize pig. Although I never won, I was always trying, and it really got me hooked. My first opportunity to do a commercial radio station was at a Full-Service AM, KNOX, also in Grand Forks, my hometown. They gave me the opportunity to open up and try new things.

DO YOU FEEL THAT RADIO HAS TIGHTENED UP SO MUCH THAT YOU COULDN'T GET THE SAME CHANCE TODAY THAT YOU MIGHT HAVE HAD 10-15 YEARS AGO?

If you're willing to work on AM, just about anything's possible anymore, but to get on a competitive FM that's big in the market it's tough to get anywhere without any experience. LMAs and duopolies have ruined many opportunities.

and took it from automation and went live. I was the first Promotions Director/night jock.

A LOT OF VETERAN BROADCASTERS HAVE COME THROUGH BOTH OF THOSE STATIONS, XL AND KGGG.

Ingsted's a pillar in broadcasting in the Midwest. They own a lot of small market radio stations and they run them very efficiently. They staffed the Rapid City station from within the company. They didn't hire anybody outside. They took good people from different airshifts in the other markets, and put together a great airstaff. The station debuted at #1 after the first book. I only worked there a short time. Dick Chapin, who's a past president of NAB, had a friend in town that I was competing against.

OH NO!

I had left town suddenly and didn't even know if I really had a job. Things could not have worked out better...

A few months later Summit Broadcasting bought the stations, and I stayed with Summit for five years. I worked in Springfield at what was KWTO with some great talent like T.K. O' Grady, Dr. Don Carpenter, Wendy Weiss and Mike DePriest. I stayed there for two and a half years, and Summit promoted me to OM at KFRX in Lincoln, succeeding Tracy Johnson.

WAS THIS YOUR FIRST PROGRAMMING GIG?

That was my first programming gig. Roger Larson, who is the GM of that station, really took me under his wing. He never said one thing about the music or the promotions. He just let me do my own thing. He showed me the business ropes, how to deal with clients, how to do budgets, amortizations, how to accrue things. Actually do a whole financial statement for the radio station because I ran the FM.

He's an older and wiser gentleman and still one of my best friends. I'll never forget the time and effort he put into telling me how to do things.

HOW ABOUT YOUR OTHER MENTOR - MARY CATHERINE SNEED...

If it wasn't for her being behind me and seeing my potential when I was in Springfield, I wouldn't be where I am today. She's the one that made the decision to put me up in Lincoln and Roger took me in and ran with it.

WHEN DID YOU LAND IN SYRACUSE?

After being in Lincoln and taking the station from fourth to first, beating our AM, which is a legendary station. We were always considered the step-child on the FM, and when we finally beat them I knew I had really accomplished something. We kept it #1 for two years and I left it at #1 and went from there to Syracuse.

In between the two gigs I went to the Soviet Union for a couple of weeks as a political ambassador and communications correspondent for the state of Nebraska. Went over there with a group of five people and we traveled the entire country from Moscow all the way to Tajickistan.

WHAT DID THAT TRIP TEACH YOU?

It really helped my communications skills and realizing that there's a lot of universal things that everybody can relate to. I realized that music and a handshake and a smile really gets you a long way. They love music over there.

People over in the Soviet Union are so starved for Western civilization. I try to stay in touch with some of the folks over there.

WHY DON'T YOU BRING US UP TO DATE HERE, J.J.

I left 93Q with really good numbers. Don Benson, one of the best consultants out there, was consulting. We took the station to #1. They just told us both that it wasn't working out for them so we parted company, and I was on the beach for a good six months. Heritage picked me up on waivers from Syracuse for \$10, two second round draft picks in 1995, and four tickets to the Biltmore House.

HOW DO YOU BALANCE YOUR HOME LIFE?

You never get to go home. I'm working even when I'm at home. One of the things my wife doesn't like about the business is that I can't get away from it.

LET'S TALK ABOUT SOME OF THE STAFF MEMBERS YOU'VE PUT TOGETHER THERE. When I had an opportunity to make staff changes, I went in and looked for good employees, first and foremost, and found a bunch of different guys here and there who were out of work. They're the hardestworking group of guys I've ever worked with. Let me know when cloning is available!

SOUNDS LIKE THE BLACK SHEEP SQUADRON.

It pretty much is. They were all either out of work, or their stations were being LMA'd and they were looking, so I snatched them right up. I feel they're dedicated even harder because they know that I went out of my way to give them a job. These guys just wanted to work.

WHAT ABOUT YOUR CORPORSIBILITIES? YOU OVERSEE ALL THE STATIONS IN THE HERITAGE CHAIN?

Basically, I'm Steve's right-hand guy. This gives him the time needed to concentrate on increasing the company's bottom line. I've really been thrown headlong into trying to not only help program, but staff nine different stations. My job was to fill all the holes and gaps that were left in the programming. We needed program directors and air talent at several of the stations. Every one of the stations was looking for people of some sort. To this day we've put in 9-10 different air staffs over the nine stations and all different shifts, all different types of responsibility. I spent a lot of time listening to airchecks and going over resumes. I'm also traveling about every other week.

I need to commend our PD in Ft. Meyers, Marty Berger. He and his staff had a great Fall book. Adults 25-54 went 6.6 to 11.2, sixth to second.

"CHR radio has been its own worst enemy. It started in the late '70s, when CHR over-reacted to AOR and saw the birth of the short-lived Hot Tracks format. Then in the late 80s CHR over-reacted to Rap music. This created a tremendous backlash against the format. Those CHR stations that have remained true to the format (25-34 female targeted) and truly mirrored their local markets have not only survived, but have continued to be ratings and revenue leaders."

was working part-time for me. She was real eager to work and really wanted to get into the music side of the business, so we brought her in as middays and music director. For nights I needed something exciting, something different, something that people could relate to and also somebody that was a little bit strange. I talked to a bunch of people, and I kept coming up with the same name: Toddzilla. In mornings I hired Scott McKay, formerly of K92 in Roanoke. He's doing a fine job for us and we're looking for a sidekick for him Overnights is really the only person that we kept from the original staff. He has since taken a permanent vacation. The position is open at the moment. If I don't find someone today, I'll be filling in tonight.

We recently hired Rich to do mornings and to handle the day to day PD chores. The station was the #4 AOR last spring. We decided to flip it to, you guessed it, CHR. New direction, new logo and new image. Fall numbers just came in, nearly doubling our female numbers from a 3.5 to 6.3. The station is being really well received. They've got a great stick and we're looking to get it back to that double digit place that it belongs in that market. Our in-house research already shows 60% familiarity with the new format with adults.

ARE YOU FINDING THE TOP40 CYCLE IS ON THE WAY UP AGAIN?

Everything is in a cycle, and the reason it's in a cycle is the people who

are making decisions to niche format. Everyone jumps on the bandwagon, jumps on that niche and Mainstream Top40 gets run into the ground. One year it's Rock, so everyone goes Rock40. Next year everyone's going Urban/Dance. Next year everyone went Country, and now it's headed to the Alternative side. I think people are really over-reacting on the musical trends. If you ask any adult, not too many people only like one kid of music. Everybody likes a little bit of everything.

I HEAR YOU KEEP INCREDIBLE AIR TALENT FILES.

I keep stuff for six months to one year, and I actually fill out paperwork on everything I get, so when people call up I can go and look at their stuff: The tape I got in this morning, was program director #75. He's in there as a number, and goes in there with a tape numbered the same way. That way if I happen to be looking at one of our other stations, I can go back and look at comments and instantly have people to draw from. You can make a change overnight if you've got stuff on file and you're constantly keeping tapes and resumes. Every quarter I take out ads for possible future openings.

ANY CLOSING WORDS BEFORE WE WRAP UP?

You have to know where you've been to know where you are going...As Chevy Chase would say, "See your future, be your future, make your future."

I think there is still a future for Top40, and I know years from now I'll still be saying that. If there's ever only one Top40 left in the country, I'll either be programming it or I''ll own it. Todd Storz and Gordon McClendon must be rolling over in their graves every time they read articles about the Top40 beings dead. I have dreams about that stuff all the time with those guys telling me to stick with it. There is a future. Are you doing a good job? That's why I've stuck with the format for so long now. I think the reason Country is succeeding is because they've adopted not only the Top40 style, but they've grabbed a lot of the great Top40 talent who are allowed to do a little bit more personality in Country radio now. If you listen to a well-programmed Country radio station and just changed the music, it would be a great station. The music is inconsequential. Good programming starts with the basics. Good air talent, tight rotations, great promotions and marketing. That's why Country is doing so well right now because they've taken everything that Top40 has let go. It's time to take it back.


