PD, KRQ, Tucson by KEVIN CARTER

BRING US UP TO DATE ON SOME OF THE EVENTS THAT HAVE HAPPENED TO YOU SINCE YOU ARRIVED AT KRQ.

I arrived at KRQ on February 9 of '93, about three or four days after the Prism takeover.

It was the right thing at the right time for me. I had just seen a duopoly rip the station apart in St. Louis and did not want to get into another such situation. Market size was not a consideration. People and company were my priorities when looking for my next position. I hit the motherlode here. I'm overwhelmed by this company. The CEO, Bill Phalen and COO, Mike Cutchell are great people who operate a great company. They are radio people.

GEE, YOU MEAN THEY'RE NOT BEAN COUNTERS?

They're not bean counters. They are radio people who give us the tools and resources necessary to do the job. There is an understanding of programming as well as the bottom line. So while the company grows financially, they also understand that they must continue to re-invest for continued ratings growth. When I say Tucson is home, it may be more accurate to say Prism is home.

YOU'VE DONE THE PIRATE RADIO THING IN L.A. AND YOU JUST MENTIONED A PRETTY HECTIC SITUATION IN ST. LOUIS. WHAT WERE THE MAJOR DIFFERENCES YOU NOTICED WHEN YOU JOINED PRISM RADIO PARTNERS?

There are two major differences. The biggest difference in Tucson is that we are not format-competitive. We are radiocompetitive. That is not to say that one is any more difficult than the other. It's just different. When you are in a larger market and you look at the smaller market situations, you think, 'Man, that guy's got it made. He's the only game in town.' Then you get in the situation and you find out it's just as difficult. Now, rather than targeting a direct competitor and their shares, you have to figure out how you are going to get the Country, AC, and AOR listener to choose you.

HOW DO YOU MARKET A CONTEMPORARY TOP40 RADIO STATION AND HOPE TO DRAW LISTENERS FROM OTHER FORMATS?

I think one of the mistakes we made in '93 was that we were a little too wide. Wide, not in the musical sense, but in the number of titles. That is something we have since corrected with the help of one of radio's brilliant minds, Bill Richards, our consultant. We now concentrate on tight rotations and we're looking towards cume. In the past six months we have gone from fourth in cume to second. We play our currents over and over and stay with them a lot longer. Even when the burn gets a little high, we feel we're better off playing a proven, familiar record rather than jumping early on things. I think that's one of the keys. It takes a lot longer for the AOR, Country or AC partisan to key in on a record. It still comes down to playing the hits over and over and over.

YOU ALSO GOT YOUR RESEARCH DEPARTMENT UP AND RUNNING LATE LAST YEAR?

Our company, Prism, has estab-

something both Bill Richards and I wanted to find out. Bill had done something similar at KIIS, and we felt it applied to KRQ as well. The goal was to get our listeners' feelings toward Rap. We found out that people do not consider a Salt-N-Pepa-type song with a melodic hook a rap record. Now we only spoke with 18-34 year old females, so we are not dealing with youngsters. They could definitely differentiate between Salt-N-Pepa and Snoop Doggy Dogg. The melodic hook is the key. Unaided, these women referred to P.M. Dawn and Salt-N-Pepa as Pop or Top40 records.

AFTER THE RESEARCH PROJECT YOU FILTERED THE MORE MELODIC STUFF INTO YOUR MIX.

Absolutely. But slowly and carefully.

THAT ALSO GAVE THE STATION MORE DIMENSION AT THE SAME TIME.

Yes. Exactly. We made the investment in research, found the good and the bad, and made the adjustments necessary.

WHAT ELSE DID YOU DIS-

lished its own research division based in our Jacksonville facility (WKQI), and handles research for the entire chain. That is a big undertaking. It took a while to get everything ironed out and running efficiently. Especially since we had a lot of major projects in the field while trying to tweak the system. Again, hats off to our CEO Bill Phalen who was the driving force and made it happen.


THROUGH THE COURSE OF THIS RESEARCH YOU FOUND SOME MISCON-CEPTIONS ABOUT YOUR LISTENERS. SPECIFICALLY, THEIR PERCEPTION OF RAP MUSIC VERSUS MASS APPEAL MUSIC?

We specifically did that. It was

COVER ABOUT THE TUCSON MARKET? OBVIOUSLY A LARGE HISPANIC CONTENT, BUT MANY SUNBELT MARKETS ARE VERY MISLEADING IN THAT REGARD.

We didn't see any major influence of rhythmic records in our auditorium test or in our weekly callout. It really depends on the record. What we found out is the expectation of this radio station, musically, is pure, downthe-middle Pop records, i.e. <u>Dreamlover</u>, <u>River Of Dreams</u>, Ace Of Base, Richard Marx, etc. Unfortunately there few pure Pop records out there at any one given time. A Celine Dion or Jon Secada come along every once in a while. Our research, which


included cluster analysis, perceptual questioning, focus groups, and auditorium testing really points to these down-the-middle Pop records.

WHAT ABOUT THE PREPONDERANCE OF ALTERNATIVE RECORDS FINDING THEIR WAY ON TO MAINSTREAM TOP40 STATIONS. WHAT'S YOUR STANCE ON THAT ISSUE?

It's an issue we're battling at the moment. To be quite honest, it's pulling us in two different directions. We found in all this research that Alternative music was at the bottom of every stack for this radio station. It's not an expectation, nor does it score well for this radio station and its audience. Yet in order to reflect today's younger lifegroups and the music they seem to be gravitating to, we feel the need to play some of this genre'. We don't want to ignore the trend and get left behind. Yet, based on the research, we must be cautious. Every record takes on its own life. If it's a hit, it will become a Pop record. Counting Crows or the Gin Blossoms are good examples of Alternative music that became Pop records. When they reach a Pop status, they become records

Absolutely. It happens a lot. While Rick and I have not had many opportunities to speak, we did speak briefly when he first made changes at KKFR. His situation and goals are completely different than mine. It's

two very different markets. Rick has a lot more signals to contend with. At the same time he has more signals to expose some of the newer music, thus lower some of the unfamiliar risk that we face. With the exception of limited play on our local AOR, we are the only outlet.

HOW BIG OF AN IMPACT DOES MTV, THE BOX AND LOCAL RECORD SALES HAVE ON MUSIC THAT ENDS UP ON YOUR STATION?

It's significant. If The BOX and MTV are playing it and we see an immediate impact on the in SoundScan, we take it seriously. Just because those two outlets are playing it doesn't necessarily mean anything. When it has a local impact though, then it's time to sit up and take notice.

HAVE YOU EVER FELT THAT YOU HAD TO SEIZE THE MOMENT ON A RECORD FOR THE PURE "HIPNESS FACTOR." AT LEAST AT NIGHT, TO REFLECT YOUR ACTIVES?

Yes, it's happened. Most recently with Green Day. Talk about a record that stuck out on this station. But, we felt a buzz and therefore chose to jump, take advantage, and get off. But, we are not overly aggressive like that. Again, we are not format competitive therefore we feel that conservative is more the course for us. We don't want to be too hip for the room, we want to play hits. While we know it is the record industries job to get new music played, it's not ours. Ours is to get ratings. We feel in order to get ratings, we need to play proven hit records over and over. Use 'em...abuse 'em...lose 'em.

WHAT ABOUT THE MAR-KETING OF THE STATION BEYOND MUSIC? KRQ HAS A HUGE HERITAGE IN THE MARKETPLACE. HOW HAVE YOU KEPT KRQ TOP-OF-MIND?

We've been very aggressive in both television and billboards. In '93 and '94. Our outside campaigns would dwarf a lot of major markets. We needed to improve on an eroding cume. Felt we had to get outside the station in a big way, and did so. The station was carrying same bad baggage from the past and we needed to invite people back into the store. Year long billboards and a heavy TV campaign were the strategy and so far so good. We are now turning our attention to TSL.

LET'S TALK ABOUT THE KRQ AIRSTAFF. YOU JUST BROUGHT TIM RICHARDS IN FROM WVIC LANSING.

He's been here about two months as MD and middays. I met Tim when he was interning at B96. Baltazar, a former jock of mine, and Tim came down to St. Louis to see the operation. We have stayed in touch since. Todd Cavanaugh and Jim Lawson did a great job with him. They gave him great skills on Selector. And as far as air work, he had one of the best teachers in the business, Gary Spears.

TALK ABOUT YOUR MORNING SHOW AND RUN AROUND THE SHIFTS.

The morning show is Mojo and Betsy. Mojo was doing afternoons. He had done such a great job of getting into the community that even though mornings was not something he had done before, I felt Tucsonans would be a little more forgiving of someone they truly liked. That feeling would give him a three to six month window to hone his act. We have not been let down. He has done a super job and has really worked hard at it. I have to give a lot of credit to his producer, Eric Gebo, as well. Eric worked with Eddie and Jobo in Chicago. He's a real sharp guy, knows his

Jose and others. Most recently Chris and I worked together at WKBQ in St. Louis. The nice thing about having Chris here is his experience and friendship. Not only do I have an ally in the building but I have a guy who's been around and can teach these young guys the ropes. We'd also like to get Chris to the point where he could help Prism out in a programming position someday within the company.

WHO'S DOING NIGHTS FOR YOU?

I've got a killer at night. His name is Ryno. We hired him from WVIC as well. He is one of the most uninhibited jocks I've ever seen or met. When he walks into the studio there are no inhibitions whatsoever. He has no tendencies to be a disc jockey. This guy hits the studio and has fun. He truly loves what he does and it shows.

On overnights it's Action Jaxon. He has been a mainstay for us and done a great job. He knows the market, knows the club scene, and the streets. He's a great, great way to round out a great staff.

DO YOU EVER GET THE URGE TO PUT THE CANS ON AND GO BACK IN ON THE AIR?

I do every once in a while just to get a feel for the clocks, music We're real tempo conscious. Recent conversations with Brian Bridgman and Dave Robbins heave revealed the same thing. Each of us has mentioned how our radio stations got away from the expectation of our audience. As Dave says, we got 25-54'itis. Each of us has made a move back to where we belong and you've seen or heard about the results.

YOU'VE BEEN VERY GLOWING IN YOUR PRAISE OF PRISM RADIO PARTNERS. GIVE US A CAPSULE ABOUT THESE GUYS BEFORE WE WRAP UP.

I guess sometimes I raved to the point of being sickening. I like these people, this company and the way they do business. A lot of that also has to do with my GM, Mark Kopelman. He really goes to bat for us. When we feel we need something, he finds a way to get it done. Whether it's personnel, research, equipment, merchandising, etc., Mark is there to champion our cause. So let's give credit where credit is due.

Bill Phalen and Mike Cutchall are aggressive people. They are radio-aware and always looking for new acquisitions. Bill is one of the founders of Western Cities Broadcasting. They started with no stations and ended up with stations like KZZP-Phoenix, KWSS-San KWSS-San Jose, KZAP-Sacramento, KLUC-Las Vegas, and KRQ. Look at some of the people that came out of that company. Don Benson, Bill Richards, Guy Zapoleon, Dave Van Stone. And we are starting a new tradition at Prism with Brian Bridgman in Raleigh, Jack Oliver and Michael Lee in Wichita, Buzz Casey in Louisville, Dave Parks here in Tucson and Dave Anthony in Jacksonville. Not to mention our corporate PD, Bob Bedi. Great people and great talent.

MARK, HOW ABOUT THOSE RATINGS?

We had an up and down '93. The 12 plus was soft, but we have maintained in the 18-34 and 25-54 demos. Of course we were hoping for big growth in '93, but it didn't happen. We are starting to see that growth now. The cume, as I mentioned has gone from fourth to second in the market. We are seeing the 18-34 and 25-54 growth. While 12 plus, the ego demo, is nice, we are more concerned about the saleable demos. It's early in our changes but we really think '94 is our year.

stuff, stays focused and works very hard to make it happen. Betsy Bruce is a station veteran. She too has done a great job of getting out into the community. I think she knows or is involved in every service organization in town. She worked with Tim and Willy and has that association going for her as well as a fantastic working relationship and chemistry with both Mojo and Eric.

WHO'S DOING AFTER-NOONS FOR YOU?

Afternoon drive is a consummate professional, Chris Knight. Chris and I have known each other since 1979. Our career paths took us in the same places a number of times. He's a great jock, a super guy, fantastic with the public and has a ton of experience. He's worked in Boston, Los Angeles, Denver, San

and phones. My passion for airwork left me years ago. People always ask how I knew it was time to get off the air. I remember it like it was yesterday. I see myself reaching for the door to control room KKBQ/Houston thinking, 'I don't want to do this anymore.' I'm burnt out. I can't relate to the people on the phones and the fun is gone." I wanted to do more. I wanted to program. I wasn't the most talented jock in the world. I was a very basic, formatic, getthe-job-done jock. So, I knew some day it would come to an end and I wanted to stay in the industry.


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


