

Programmer's Think Tank

GOING BACK TO SCHOOL

School's back in session. I can tell because it takes three times as long to drive home behind yellow buses with their flashing red signal lights. Seeing those buses and the kids at roadside with their books brings back not just memories but gut reaction. First there's kind of a momentary dread—"Damn, summer's over." Then I realize school's a long way behind me. and I think of the good things about school—like seeing my friends and, of course, more vacations and teachers conventions when we get to skip school.

I think I was at least a teenager before I understood what a teacher's convention was, beyond being a couple days when school was closed. I doubt if many students know or care that these conventions are refresher courses for teachers to bring them up to date on new teaching techniques and methods. Last week my doctor was out of town taking a mandatory refresher course. Another friend of mine, a chef, was sent for the month of August to The Culinary Institute for classes on new cuisine and its presentation.

This year I went to eight radio conventions and I've got one more to go. One might think that if a couple weeks every four years is sufficient for a doctor and teachers can keep up-to-date with a couple of two-day confabs a year, we in the radio business must be the best prepared, most supereducated professionals on the face of this Earth. On

the other hand, using reverse logic, I find it hard to imagine my old English teacher, hair in a bun, lurching through hotel corridors singing the school fight song and then vomiting ferociously into the swimming pool. Indeed, I think radio conventions are more fun than those for virtually any other profession. We have record people to swine and dine us, live entertainment and a camaraderie second to none. We have a wealth of resources both in each other and in the panels at our various conventions. These resources, in the case of radio conventions, are often in conflict with the entertainment.

At radio conventions, record people often take many of the key programmers who can offer the most in sessions off the grounds for lunch or to a ballgame. Attendees stay up partying all night and sleep through the morning sessions. This is not an indictment, but an observation. You know me, and you know I'll have a helluva time at conventions, but I do attend sessions and I learn things. Maybe there's not as much meaningful idea exchange in those radio sessions as in a teacher's convention, but part of the fault of that is that the key players are off somewhere screwing around.

I've been embarrassed this year at the conventions I've attended to see how few people went to sessions vs. how many were registered, Sure, the cocktail parties and ceremonies were sellouts but the panel rooms were nearly empty.

Keynote speakers – leaders of our industry with a message about our future – were ignored.

As professionals – and it's high time we recognized that's what we're supposed to be – we have an obligation to "go back



to school" and bone up on the latest ideas. We also have the duty to our peers to share new ideas and tricks of the trade, not just argue about B.D.S. and plays per week.

Hey, go ahead, puke in the pool and play grabass all you want. that's the fun of being in radio. after all. But when you've got the chance, accept a little input. Read all the trades, attend seminars, talk about things beyond music on your conference calls and network with others in the biz. School doesn't end at graduation.

SIXTH ANNUAL "STOP THE VIOLENCE DAY" SCHEDULED FOR NOVEMBER 22, 1994

La Jolla, CA – For the sixth straight year the station's in Jerry Clifton's New World Communications network are joining together to call for a one-day moratorium on violence. Modeled on such one-day campaigns as The Great American Smoke Out, the concept originated at a brainstorming session that Clifton hosted at WPGC in Washington DC in 1989. When he asked the assembled station staff what the #1 issue facing their listeners was, they responded as a group, "violence." From that consensus, they decided to call for one day of peace in their community. November 22nd, the anniversary of the death of President Kennedy, was chosen as the date, and has been proclaimed National Stop The Violence Day in markets across the country, every year since.

In 1989, the first year that this date was observed, over 20 stations participated in the event, and worked together, sharing resources, ideas, and information. The scope of the campaign has grown dramatically, with many of the original participating stations choosing to use Stop The Violence as an umbrella for many of their promotions and events through out the year. In 1993, the number of stations joining in the campaign for a one-day moratorium on violence had grown to over 50.

There is a wide range of promotions and activities that the stations have implemented in observance of Stop The Violence Day. These include gun buy-back programs, peace

rallies, on-air "moments of silence" in recognition of the victims, gang truces, passing out thousands of white ribbons to be worn as arm bands at NFL games, police ride-alongs, broadcasts from prisons and adopt-a-corner events. Some stations are planning to dedicate Victims Of Violence memorial Walls in their markets. Other stations are enlisting the assistance of local and national celebrities in their efforts. Domestic violence will be the focus for many stations on November 22nd, and they hope to raise consciousness about this issue, as well as provide resources for victims.

Any station that is interested in committing to finding a solution to the national crisis of violence are encouraged to call Paige Nienaber at 612-929-2865. Paige will include participating stations in all the faxes and mailings on Stop The Violence Day, and will help the station create and implement their plans for this very important day. This is a very real opportunity for radio stations to do something significant for their community, and raise themselves above the competition, to become leaders instead of followers.







MARK SHANDS

Have you noticed??? Something is happening out there in radio land. Our audience, our listeners are making a move to a new medium. It's the entertainment and information world you find on-line with a computer. I'm not talking about something that's about to happen. They (the audience) have made the move. Check this piece of information: just one year ago America 300,000 Online had about subscribers...today the figure is slightly over one million. If only our ARB's would triple like that.

There's a lot there for the audience; news and weather, stocks, TV, books, movies, video, and much more. These online services are also a great tool for broadcasters. The other night I listened in as a group of 20 young adults discussed their favorite artists. They talked about the release date of the new Boyz II Men CD. They talked about Lisa Loeb and her glasses. They discussed rap and alternative. In other words, a great

place to meet the actual users of the product that we work with every day. A way to go beyond the facts and figures *instantly*.

And what about the radio bulletin board on the Prodigy Online Service? Check in and see the fans of radio discuss the current line-up at the Miami talk show stations. Today there's a note about Bubba The Love Sponge, another talks about Jo Jo leaving Wild 107 and going to Philly. A listener in Tampa is talking about characters on a morning show, and she wants to know why a certain character sounds canned. Not the industry perspective...the listener perspective.

Some people in radio are already there. Z-100 in New York has about four bulletin boards up on Prodigy. There's a station in Birmingham with a note up encouraging their listeners to write a comment. Here's a note from a jock at Wild107 in San Francisco. Sometimes you get a surprise, you turn on your computer in the membership directory, or saw your bulletin board comments in the radio bulletin Board area.



The record industry is just beginning to show up. Warner/Reprise has it's own area on America Online and CompuServ. You can listen to the new Prince release. The new Neil Young is there, Karyn White is too. I'm saying you can down-load the song and listen to it if your computer is properly equipped. The album cover is available too. You probably heard about Geffen Records having Aerosmith's "Head First" ready to down-load on CompuServ Seven thousand music fans responded...and that's just the first well-promoted one! You know it's going to get easier and faster very soon.

HALLOWEEN: NOT JUST FOR KIDS

In the late '80s, I was working at a station were the General Manager was going through his quarterly "Teen Crisis;" Translated: the account executives thought we had far too many of them.

It was late August and I was uncharacteristically planning 60-90 days ahead. I took the air staff out to a bar and we brainstormed a load concepts for some outstanding Halloween events. When we had all sufficiently recovered from our afternoon "creating," I took my list of ideas to the GM, so that we could start the process of getting this stuff done. Feeling quite proud that I wasn't waiting until October 20 to start thinking about Halloween, I strutted into his office where he took one look at my list of ground breaking and incredible promotional ideas, dismissed it with, "If a haunted house wants to buy the schedule, we'll take the money. Otherwise, it's a holiday for kids and we've got enough of them listening as it is." I was briefly put-off, but rebounded and almost lost my job (Albeit for the right reason) by getting the station involved with a major "Safe Halloween" event at any local community center.

Unfortunately, there are managers who still believe Halloween is a "kid thing." In fact, that couldn't be further from the truth. In the past decade it's become one of the big adult party nights of the year, ranking right up there with New Years. And what about the kids? They make Halloween one of the prime promotional opportunities each year to impact young adult, 18-34 year olds, parents.

Michelle Linn, Promotions Director at KKXX/KRAB in Bakersfield says, "Halloween is a great chance to do a promotion that targets families, for example "Safe Halloween," or trick or treating in a mall." She couldn't be more correct. Fewer and fewer parents have the comfort level necessary to allow their children to go house-to-house knocking on strangers door, even escorted and chaperoned. This isn't a trend that's specific to the inner-city. Suburbs and outlying communities are putting together events that allow kids to still taste that Halloween vibe, yet do it in an atmosphere that's positive, safe, supervised, and well lit.

Here lies a tremendous opportunity for radio stations to step in and take that initiative to spearhead, and or create these promotions or events. If park will be sponsored corporately, decorated and supplied for thousands of children who will turn out for the event. "I think the days are gone when a radio station can sponsor a haunted house and have it be their Halloween promotion," says Michelle Linn.

The holiday has outgrown being a one-day-a year happening and is no longer a throw-away event that a station feels obligated to do. Many Halloween promotions start ten days to two weeks prior to October 31st, and many haunted houses start the first week of October. Like Christmas, there's a Halloween atmosphere and attitude; the stations that ignore or give it a minor acknowledgement are missing the boat.

Chuck Field, Operations Manager at KSFM in

A haunted house is one obvious direction for a radio station to channel its energies. These have come along way from the days of charitable spook houses in high school cafeterias. Today they're big While business. important/imperative/critical/all of the above that your station ties into the biggest and best haunted house in the market, that can sometimes be limiting. There will be perhaps dozens these establishments operating, and if you're not out there every night, cruising them, you're missing a chance to impact tens of thousands of people who will be out for an evening of fun and fright.

you can't get a mall to open its heart and doors for an evening of indoor trick or treating, pumpkin carving and costume judging, then contact a neighborhood group, close off a street and host a block party with all the prerequisite Halloween elements. At KKXX the station is doing it in a local park called Pioneer Square. And yes, they have even found the sales department a chance to jump in on it. All of the various buildings in the

Sacramento, says, "You should adjust your station to completely fit the Halloween vibe. Your listeners are out there preparing, buying candy, planning parties, carving pumpkins and getting costumes for themselves and their kids. The station should reflect all of that with its liners, promos and general attitude." According to Field, if you're tapped into Halloween you'll be on the tip of what people are "into" during that week prior to

While there <u>may</u> be a lot of teens at these haunted houses, there will be an equal or greater number of families and young adults.

If you aren't already tied in with a haunted house, now is the time to lock down Halloween Central '94 for your station. While the biggest is usually the best, if someone is doing something unique like a haunted cave, bridge or boat, you should be out there this afternoon to sign them up as your "official" haunted house. don't forget the haunted houses that are run by civic groups and organizations. In smaller communities, a house that's run by someone like the volunteer fire department, is a good place for a van "hit" some evening. Bobby Z, Promotions Director at 97.9 THE BOX in Houston, once worked with a major haunted house that was operated by a re-hab center for recovering addicts. "This was their main fundraising source of the year and they (the patients) worked on it for four or five months. The efforts showed. It was Killer!" says Bobby.

Unfortunately things outside of your control (Sales, upper management) will play a hand in who you get involved with. I've had to direct time and energy to promoting a dinky, out-of-the way haunted house because they spent money on station, while competition was doing the biggest one in town for the promotional value that comes with nightly visibility in front of thousands of people. Don't let yourself get caught in that trap. "I got committed by a GM to do a series of haunted houses sponsored by a major charity. The intention was right, but none of these places were remotely near where any of our listeners lived or would dare go" adds Bobby Z. Ticket giveaways for haunted houses

are always hot, but often you'll end up in the situation that Bobby Z brought up. Last year 100.3 JAMZ in Dallas worked with two haunted houses; one in Dallas and one in Ft. Worth. Contest winners were able to pick their tickets, so they could go to the one closest to them.

Pumpkins are to Halloween what trees are to Christmas... and there's a lot you can do with a pumpkin. You can bowl them, you can carve them, you can drop them from large buildings on the morning of November 1st, you can steam roll them. Promotionally speaking, the world is your pumpkin.

With any family-targeted promotion or event, make sure you have hundreds of pumpkins available to give out to the kids. Anything you can do with a tree at Christmas or an egg at Easter, you can do with a pumpkin at Halloween. For a warm 'n fuzzy angle,

Halloween events. Linda Blair and several other "scream queens", along with Freddy Krueger and Jason, are coming in for the nightly parties at the park. Leslie has also planned ahead and isn't waiting until the last minute to order ten thousand bags for trick or treating. These will be distributed to children and their parents at the station's haunted house and at all of the JAMMIN' 94.5 appearances and remotes.

"Be Safe And Be Seen" is a good theme for Halloween, and if you're talking safety on the air, you can bet that you'll have the ear of the parents in the audience. Contact your specialty items person and ask for a quote on "anything that glows." I've done xyalume light sticks and gave them out for the kids to wear when they were out trick or treating at night. The kids could hang them around their necks which made them much more visible

funky outfits, and head out to hang with your mid-day listeners. Maybe you could host a "Scariest Boss" fax contest. Whatever you do, going out and visiting your audience at work is an outstanding promotional opportunity. Unfortunately not enough radio stations take advantage of it. Halloween is a good excuse to grace your loyal at-work listeners with your presence, and make a great impression upon them while you're at it.

With all of the major holidays that are looming just over the horizon, you should make a conscious effort to devote some time and energy to creating something new and exciting for your station. If you've done the same Thanksgiving promotion every November for the past 20 years, perhaps this is the year to take it to the next level. If it ain't broke...break it.

Dare not to be boring. Last year Welch & Woody broke all the radio rules by marrying a couple on the air at midnight on Halloween night. Radio tradition dictates that wacky weddings, can only be done on Valentines Day. Nonsense. "Love At First Fright" was a home run because it was original and stood out among all of the radio stations that were doing haunted houses and giving out candy from their vans. "Standing Out" is the whole idea of Promotions. If you do it well and consistently, you have a winning formula and nobody's going to play "catch up" with a station that is always the first with a new promotional idea or concept. Put on your blinders, don't look back and enjoy the success that's deservedly yours.

have your jocks deliver them to kids in hospitals or shelters is always a great "from the heart" kind of thing to do.

More and more stations are using Halloween as an excuse to throw a major concert or show. Last year JAMMIN' 94.5 in Boston did a series of "Monster Jams" at local clubs with a different artist every night. That turned into a programming nightmare, although the actual events very successful. Promotions Director Leslie Cipolla says that this year the station will be tied in with Spooky World, which is the name for a local theme park's

How about mid-days? The Halloween vibe doesn't exist just after dark. Many offices and businesses host "dress up" days around and on Halloween, and encourage their employees to come to work in costume. This is a great opportunity for your airstaff to go out to some atwork office parties. It's not rocket science. Get some pumpkins, cider and cookies, dress up the jocks and promotions people in some




