





Programmer's Think Tank

TOP40'S PSYCHOLOGICAL WAR

A few years ago, we had a radio station party from which we wanted a particularly prissy staff member excluded. Since you can't single out one person to not be invited, we had to devise a more subtle strategy. About a week before the party, we all started bitching about what a lousy event was going to be whenever we were within earshot of that person. We complained that the food, the venue and everything about the event, was going to out and out suck. Then, the day of the party, we all, independently of each other, started working the "Hey, what's wrong - you don't look well at all - are you feeling OK?" By noon he'd left sick and begged off on attending the party. You'd be correct if you said this was a pretty juvenile and immature thing to do, but it did work.

Top40 radio used to be a format broadcast on over 1,000 radio stations not long ago. The latest count by "M Street Journal" puts the number of stations in this format at only 334. Lots of folks – including some publications – are telling us, "Hey, what's wrong – you don't look well. I think you're sick." The more this goes on, the more we buy into it, and one by one, Top40 stations leave the party. Lots of people have bought into the "It's a lousy party and you look really sick" boogie. The question is, how lousy

is the party and why are we being discouraged from attending?

I know why we didn't want that guy at the radio station at the party – he was judgmental. If someone brought out a doobie he'd be mortified. Basically, he was too politically correct and not much fun.

Now, chew on this...what's at the Top40 party from which we're discouraged? To start with, Top40 stations who do the format well get excellent ratings and do admirable billing. The sought after young adult demos are very lucrative. Furthermore, record companies still expend the largest promotion budgets per station on Top40 stations. If record companies, hypothetically, could break new product through Alternative stations or clubs, it would cost a lot less than through Top40. A lot of owners get spooked, too, by all the negative press on Top40. It's hard for the corporate investor-types who own radio stations these days to present a glitzy portfolio of Top40 stations when the press says the format is dying. Then comes another ingredient in the mix - The PD's themselves. Because Top40 stations are very important to record companies and other vendors, Top40 PD's and MD's get lots of attention and strokes. Sometimes that routine gets people to buy into the whole thing and start being demanding and territorial. The more we're patted on the back, the more we let down our social exterior and let


our quirks and tempers show through. Praised and nurtured on one side, yet threatened with extinction on the other. No wonder Top40's perceived to be in trouble.

I wish I had a clear-cut bottom line to all this. I'm pretty sure there is one, and it's not necessarily where we've come to think it is. Top40 is a viable format. Hit music is, after all, hit music. It's music people like, broadcast on the radio surrounded by elements that best showcase the music and its moods.

On the other hand, we're surrounded by people who don't want us at the party. These people say Top40 is difficult, can't be done, is fragmented, needs endless research, isn't practical, on and on it goes. My question is, are we being manipulated out of the format? By who? Why? And why would a company purporting to survey Top40 music want to decrease its sampling base rather than studying an "endangered format" more closely? You may say that I'm being very paranoid – that I should buy into the conventional wisdom that Top40 is over. But I don't buy that yet. I still think somebody doesn't want us at the party. Who? Why? Think about it.







CHRIS ISAAK <u>Somebody's Crying</u> (REPRISE) - This record is doing wonderfully for us. In fact, it's probably doing better for us than it is for some other stations because it's getting very positive callout here.

JOHN CANDELARIA

PD, KPRR, El Paso

HOW LONG HAVE YOU BEEN IN EL PASO?

I've been at KPRR for seven years. I've been programming it for a little over a year. Before that I was the Music Director.

WHERE DID YOU START? GIVE ME YOUR WHOLE BACK-GROUND IN RADIO?

I started back in 1982 in Albuquerque. There was a technical school in Albuquerque that taught broadcasting. Initially what I wanted to do was get into sports broadcasting. I wanted to do play-by-play. Although they didn't teach a course that just focused on that one particular curriculum, they said, "Hey, just learn radio broadcasting in general, you'll never know, at least you'll have the skills and some experience that you could put down on your resume." So sure enough I took the course. I had a great time. I wound up getting a job full time at an AM radio station, KAMX. From there I basically jumped around at every single radio station in Albuquerque. Then after awhile I kind of got down and out on my love affair with radio. I was disoriented and got disenchanted with the business. I couldn't really get a good gig. Then I met a guy named Bob Perry. He hired me for production duties and a midday show at KPRR in El Paso. The rest is

WAS BOB THE CONSULTANT OR THE PD THEN?

Bob was the PD. From there I basically reestablished my love affair for radio. Bob was doing the music that I grew up with and I loved back in Albuquerque and just the way that he did business; Bob was so organized and so promotions-conscious and so consumer oriented. He gave the listeners what they wanted and I was just amazed at the product that they turned out. The music that we were playing was right on the money with what I loved and the ratings were reflective of that. I was surprised that a radio station focused like this could actually be successful, because in Albuquerque there were a lot of stations that had tried it and they just weren't very successful. So I fell in love with radio again all over again, and from there I worked my way up to PD. It's been a little over a year. I started in November of '94 as Program Director.

WHAT KIND OF CHANGES HAVE YOU MADE?

There's several feature programs and theme shows that I've done differently from the past program directors. I got a chance to learn a little bit of everything from every PD that I worked at KPRR, good and bad.

YOU'VE HAD THE OPPORTUNITY TO LEARN FROM A LOT OF GOOD PROGRAMMERS. YOU ALSO HAD A LOT OF KNOWLEDGE ABOUT THE EL PASO MARKET FROM YOUR LONG TENURE THERE. FROM THAT LEARNING AND WITH THAT KNOWLEDGE, HOW DID YOU EVALUATE KPRR ONCE YOU WERE MADE PD?

The radio station was unfocused. I thought that Bob Perry did a very good job of keeping the station right on the money. Although you hear a lot of things within the station, sometimes you fight more people within the station than you do on the outside. They're very active and I think that though POWER102 was very successful, some of the program directors were in it for their own success...they really didn't get out and listen to the streets. They basically programmed out of the office. One of the other PD's thought that though we were number one, they wanted to capture the 18-34 UTEP (University Of Texas, El Paso) student, which in

The core records on KPRR right now are the Montell Jordan's of the world, the Selena's of the world, Boyz II Men, TLC.

WAS THERE A PARTICULAR GENRE? FROM WHAT YOU'RE SAYING, IT SEEMS LIKE THE ALTERNATIVE STUFF GOT DROPPED?

Exactly. It was more Alternativeleaning. And we dropped most or all of it.

AFTER BOB LEFT, WHO CONSULTED KPRR?

Actually, Bob was kind of consulting the station indirectly. He was very busy in San Antonio and there was a while there that we had Don Kelly. When I became PD, I worked without a consultant for the most part for about six months. However, Bob was calling me biweekly and giving me pointers and directing me in the right area. He was going over my music list with me and he was doing it just for the love of the radio station. When U.S. Radio took over, they had wanted to go after a fulltime consultant, someone who actually could spend more time with the radio station and Bob, quite honestly, at that time, he didn't know whether he wanted to get into the



OFTEN LOSE IN THOSE SITU-ATIONS AS MANAGEMENT DEFERS TO THE CONSULTANT. HOW DO YOU AND BOB GET ALONG, AND HOW DO YOU RESOLVE THOSE TIMES WHEN YOUR IDEAS CLASH?

Well, it's a give and take situation. Bob and I, number one, are great friends. We're pals, so it's not like an ego situation where someone's going to take it personally. I think for the most part Bob Mitchell has got tons of experience. I respect that. So if he has something that I don't necessarily agree with I'll go with it, for the most part. I think Bob gives a lot more than he takes and I'll tell you why: because we've been very successful. Over the last part we've been lucky enough to have nine consecutive number one books and Bob Mitchell pretty much trusts my judgement now. When we first hired Bob, he was astonished to find out how much hi-energy and freestyle music is loved and how long Hispanic listeners are loyal to particular records. When it comes to liking a record, Hispanic listeners are slow to get on and slow to get off. For Bob, he was used to 'PGC and WILD where they're very progressive in accepting new music. On the other hand, El Paso is very conservative and it takes them awhile. You've got to beat them over the head with it before they really decide, "Hey that's not a bad record. We want to hear it a little bit more." It's changing with the population and I like to think of it as a Los Angeles seven-years ago. El Paso is very influenced by first of all, Mexico, which is two minutes from where I'm sitting, and secondly by Los Angeles. In Mexico the big rhythm, hi-energy music is the love of the town and with the Hip-Hop West Coast rap flava from Los Angeles it tends to come over to El Paso. Bob was surprised by those influences. I think after participating in auditorium tests that we conducted and also

my mind was way off target because anybody who goes to UTEP, the lifestyle is a whole lot different than the target of a POWER102 listener. From there the station just took a tumble. We played a lot of records that didn't make a whole lot of sense, which was not the core and eventually, as you know, once you start playing a lot of those wrong records, you just chip away at the core. So the first thing I did when I came back was reestablish the core records and we took out about 130-140 titles from the station and got it back onto a tight playlist. That was numero uno.

WHAT WERE SOME OF THE RECORDS YOU TOOK OUT? AND ALSO, WHAT ARE SOME OF THE CORE RECORDS?

consulting business because he had his hands full in San Jose fighting off the guys from the Bay Area. So I don't think Bob was too interested in becoming a full-fledged consultant at that time because of his obligations in San Jose. So then Bob Mitchell came in and applied for the job and actually got it, and he's done a terrific job.

SO HOW LONG HAS HE BEEN THE CONSULTANT THERE?

For one year.

participated in focus groups, Bob Mitchell said, "Yeah, that's some of the things you've been saying for quite some time." Again, we have had some real good books, not only 12+but with the money buys 18-34 and 25-64, and I think that with Bob, he now understands that there's not a whole lot of repair that needs to be done in El Paso. It's just maintenance.

SINCE YOU MENTIONED HIP-HOP, LET'S TALK A BIT ABOUT RAP. HOW MUCH DO YOU PLAY? HOW EARLY DO YOU PLAY IT? HOW IS IT PROGRAMMED?

We don't have a competitor in the market, so we're not really forced to get on the rap records. We play the cream of the crop. The Mary J. Blige with Method Man, Naughty By Nature's Feel Me Flow, Skee-lo. Those are the three rap records right now that are working well for us. We don't saturate the sound. We like to balance a little bit of everything. We play everything from the Real McCoy, which is a very, very popular record with the female Hispanics especially, to the Naughty By Natures. We play a variety and at night we bump hard. We rock hard. We hit the streets. We're hip-hoppin' and we're more of a 12-24 year old radio station come 6 p.m. We daypart pretty heavily and like I said, we don't have a direct competitor in the market. So we get to expand our demos a bit.

ARE YOU PLAYING MORE OR LESS THAN YOU WERE SAY A YEAR AGO?

We're playing less.

WHY IS THAT?

Our target demo in El Paso tells us that Rap is not a priority. We ask the people what they want, and they tell us. You always have to keep your target demo in your mind. And secondly, you need to go ask the people what they want. We spend a considerable time in night clubs. Most of my mixers are night club DJ's, so we get a good feel on what the nightclub scene is all about from them. My mixers bring the hottest club records into my music meeting. We just ask what our listeners want. We don't have THE BOX here. We have BET and MTV and as you know, but MTV is very limited. They have their certain shows, Yo! MTV Raps with Dre and Lover, which comes on and that has a heavy influence. But Rap is predominantly a 12-24 year old audience with the rap music at least in El Paso for that matter. That's what we're finding with our research and it's predominantly male in nature. And I'm not saying all females do not like rap, but if it's a very select minority group we just play the hits, whatever it is. If it's

Hip-Hop, if it's hi-energy dance, whatever the hits are, that's what you're going to hear out of your speakers. The station recently it's kind of shifted gears just a little bit and we're now tweaking it a little bit more rhythm, more hi-energy in nature. We're finding that those records are working better for us at this time. With Rap, we don't have anything against it. We like to play it, but it's going to take awhile for the listener to get it and once they do if they start calling for it, believe me we'll be on it

NOW WHAT KIND OF RESEARCH DO YOU DO THERE?

We do callout and perceptual. We do hooks, absolutely.

TELL US ABOUT YOUR STAFF. LET'S START WITH YOUR MORNING SHOW.

The morning show is the Breakfast Club. It's a very, very young team. In El Paso we don't have the big budgets to go out and hire a well-established morning team, if you will. We're working on it right now. It's music-driven obviously because in the marketplace we're up against people like Howard Stern.

HOW DOES HOWARD STERN DO IN EL PASO?

Not real well. He finished either number four or five. He finished Mills. He does great character voices. The guy is extremely creative. We did a morning show stunt this morning where we actually got on the local television morning show. We didn't have Batman. We did Fatman this morning. We dressed our stunt boy in a Batman costume. This guy weighs about 295 pounds and he dresses up like Batman. He arrived on the morning set of Channel 7, our local ABC affiliate. He brought them Super Hero Breakfasts. Of course he took the liberty of eating half their sandwiches on the way over there. It was crazy. Then he delivered POWER102 tee-shirts. Then he needed a ride, since his '73 AMC Lime Green Fatmobile Pacer ran out of gas and he didn't really want the exercise and he needed a ride back to the bat cave. We asked the listeners to pick him up and take him to different points in the city and he'd hook them up with Batman Forever movie passes and POWER102 summer tees and concert tickets to our upcoming Summer Jam. And we had a traffic tie-up around the city. It was a good vibe. Quite honestly, we're trying to build a strong morning show from what we have. We try to fill the void by being music intensive.

JOHN, IT'S REFRESHING TO HEAR YOU TALK ABOUT DEVELOPING KPRR'S MORNING SHOW. SO FEW COMPANIES ARE WILLING TO DO THAT THESE DAYS. AND YOUR BEING PART OF THE SHOW

We sit down and conference and just spit out ideas on what we don't like about the other person and we just hash it out and iron it out. Daily we have a show prep meeting that lasts no longer than about an hour and no less than a half hour and we talk about the next day and we aircheck what went on that day and how to improve each and every day. It's discipline. We show map, we do the basics, nothing fancy because to be honest with you, we don't have the brilliance of a John London or Scott Shannon. We do the basics and we show map and we prep hard. We cut out things out of the newspaper. We read the magazines. We make it a point to watch Entertainment Tonight, the local news, the national news. We even sit at our televisions at home jotting down notes, taking along little tape recorders and recording things that happened in our lives and how we felt about it then and how we can relate that to our audience.

WHAT TIME DO YOU GO ON?

We go on at 5:30 a.m. and we're off

WHAT TIME DO YOU GET THERE WITH ALL THIS PREP?

Gordon gets there at 4:30 a.m., I get there at 5 a.m. and we're on at 5:30 a.m. It's tough!

NOW DO YOU DO CLUBS AT NIGHT TOO?

We just started our Friday night dance party live from a local nightclub. We've turned the club around. They went from 15 paying customers to 1600 there to see Adina Howard this past weekend.

NOW WHO'S ON MIDDAYS?

We've got a fantastic midday guy from New Orleans. This kid is incredible. He's 22 years old. His name is Sean Powell. This guy is a production genius. This guy sent me a tape and when I heard his production skills, I knew this was the guy I wanted to help me image and present KPRR. Very dynamic, very energetic. With fresh sweepers and promos on constantly, it takes the station to a whole different level. When I heard his tape I said I've got to have this guy.

THEN WHO'S ON IN AFTER-NOON DRIVE?

Afternoon drive is Victor Star. He's been around for years. This guy is our community-oriented guy. So much so that when he once got into it at a City Council meeting with the Mayor regarding the juveniles as far as things for them to do within the city, we made the 6 p.m. news. It was kind of embarrassing, but it was pretty

number four 12+ and number four 18-34 and number three 25-54. You would think that he would be number one or two in every demo and he's not. And to be honest with you he's been up and down. His comments about Selena and the Hispanic market, that obviously had some impact. And the station that's carrying him right now, it's going to be real interesting to see what they do, because they were just bought out by their competitor there, the Rock station in town. So I don't imagine that they're going to try and go against each other. They're going to probably flip formats. It'll be interesting to see what they do and I don't anticipate Howard Stern staying on in the marketplace.

SO WHO'S ON THE MORNING SHOW?

Myself, Veronica Chavez and a gentleman by the name of Gordon

BRINGS UP THIS POINT: WHAT TYPE OF THINGS DO YOU DO TO DEVELOP YOURSELF AND YOUR PARTNERS, WHO ARE ALSO YOUR STAFF MEMBERS, AS MORNING PERSONAL-ITIES?

I'll be honest...we're not overly talented. So the first thing we do is discipline ourselves. That's the number one rule and that's the hardest thing. Being a Program Director and working on the morning show, I find it almost impossible to find time to do it. But Bob Mitchell comes into play. This guy is very creative. That's probably the primary reason that we hired Bob Mitchell. He's very creative and he does extremely well with working and developing air personalities and bringing the best out of them. He's insane. He drives you nuts with ideas and he won't shut up. So we meet once a week with Bob Mitchell to discuss the morning show.

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hype because the guy really wholeheartedly believes in trying to help the youths of the community. He's got his own organization. As a matter of fact, it's non-profit and they go out and get jobs for gang members. He produces a program called Street Pulse, so he's very active in the community. He's been here for three years. He did nights when Charles Chavez, who is now the MD at KTFM, left. We moved Victor up to afternoons to do 3 p.m. - 7 p.m. and it's worked like a charm.

WHO'S ON 7 P.M. - MIDNIGHT?

This guy started, believe it or not, washing cars. He kept bugging us to get on the radio. He'd say, "Put me on the radio. I've got the flava. C'mon put me on." So we hired him as a board op and now he's our nighttime disc jockey and he's been on for about two years now and he sounds great at night. I tell you what, this guy could work in Los Angeles at a Hip-Hop station big time. He's got the flava for nights, and he does well with the teens. We've got a 27 share at night, by the way. Over 49 percent of the teens listen to us at night.

WHAT'S THE GUY'S NAME?

His name is JoJo McKay.

AND THEN WHO DO YOU HAVE OVERNIGHTS?

Overnights is our Mix Show Coordinator. His name is Frankie Dee. He coordinates our mix show. He's our lead mixer. He works midnights - 5:30 a.m. and he's also our mix show coordinator.

SPEAKING ABOUT MIX SHOWS, HOW MUCH MIX SHOW PROGRAMMING DO YOU HAVE ON THE AIR?

We do 10 hours on Saturday and eight on Friday. A total of 18 hours a week. We go from 11 p.m.-3 a.m. on Saturday and Friday night 7 p.m.-3 a.m.

WHAT DO YOU HAVE IN THE WAY OF OTHER SPECIAL PROGRAMS?

Monday-Friday, noon - 1 p.m. it's a Power Classic Hour. Flashback Fridays with retro/hi-energy dance music from the late '70s/early '80s. That's for a full hour noon - 1 p.m. We have the Power 9 At 9. Nine hottest songs from the request lines counted back. 10 p.m. midnight is the show, the one show that's getting us our 25-54 year old numbers. We finished 35-64 as of the last ratings book. We finished number three 25-54. We finished number four in the rating book and on the weekends we finished number one, Saturday and Sunday from 6 a.m. - midnight, number one 25-54.

WHAT ARE YOU DOING TO DO THIS?

We're playing a lot of the Old School jams Malo's Suavecito, the Tom Tom Club, Atomic Dog, One Way's Cutie Pie, Gap Band. Also we air the Quiet Storm. This program was developed by Bob West when he was at 93Z in El Paso and it was a huge show. It went on from 6 to midnight. It was a legendary show. An institution in El Paso. When the station went away and decided to do Classic Rock the program was dropped and I sat here and thought, "This is great. This is a perfect opportunity for us." We picked up the show. We do it from 10 - midnight, and it brings in our 25-54 numbers. It's the number one show at night.

ARE YOU ON ANY SORT OF COUNTDOWNS ON SUNDAYS?

Yes. Friday we run El Paso's only hometown countdown. It's called the Hot 20 Countdown and it starts from 4-6 and it's the 20 biggest songs of El Paso counted back. Sunday mornings we have a syndicated show with Gary Spears on Westwood One. A retro show. Street Pulse, which is patterned after KMEL's Street Soldiers. It's Sunday nights from 10 p.m.-12 a.m. It's the only call-in talk show where the listeners are the stars. We bring up the subject, open up the phone lines and hey, anything goes. We don't just talk about problems, but solutions too. Not only do we try to educate our listeners, but we try to find real solutions to some of the problems that afflict our community, our city. Not just

But I think you get a lot of these record companies, a lot of management, who don't want to do these things and they don't think it's necessary. Well let me tell you it's very necessary. That's what's going to keep Top40 at least our format in music alive in our area. And at so many times people say, "Where's Top40 going?" It's all going to go Mainstream or Alternative." But not if we try like hell to keep it alive and these are some of the things that are going to do it. It's like the baseball players. They just screwed up. They screwed with the fans, they didn't want to do autographs, they didn't want to play baseball, so the fans are just basically saying, "You know what, forget it. If you don't want to do these things for us we'll go somewhere else for our entertainment." And Top40 is going to find itself in the same situation as far as this style of music if the stars don't start reaching down to give some of it back

I THINK THEY ARE DOING THEM. ALMOST EVERY STA-TION IS DOING ONE. EVERY STATION DOES ONE EVERY SUMMER.

I'm just saying a lot of the management companies are tough. They don't want to do these things but it's very, very important to give back, not only to the station but to the people

NOW IS IN A LITTLE BIT OF A SLUMP, BUT RHYTHM ALWAYS COMES BACK AND ALWAYS WILL COME BACK BECAUSE PEOPLE ALWAYS WANT TO DANCE.

And that's exactly what El Paso is all about. It's funny you mentioned that. We sat back one night having a couple of beers, thinking about what the lifestyles were like and the jocks and there's one thing that Hispanic listeners are all about is they love to dance. I'm not talking about freestyle or hi-energy music, I'm talking about Cumbias and Salsa and the popular radio stations in town are the stations that have a lot of energy.

RIGHT NOW YOU'VE GOT DOUBLE DIGITS. WHAT WAS YOUR LAST 12+ NUMBER?

A 13.5.

AND WHAT WAS YOUR CLOSEST COMPETITOR?

11.5

YOU'VE GOT THEM BY TWO POINTS. SOUNDS LIKE YOU'VE GOT A HANDLE ON THE MARKET. WHERE DO YOU SEE YOURSELF GOING IN THE NEXT YEAR OR TWO?

Man, I want to program in a major market. That's my goal. You never know how good you are until you get to the majors. I know that I've listened to a lot of P1 radio stations and although we don't have the greatest air personalities, but I would like to think promotionally, musically and the way that the radio station is packaged, we could compete seriously with some of the big Pl markets. We really give the listener what they want and it's evident with the ratings period. I would love to program a major market, Hispanic in nature. Love San Francisco, Phoenix, San Antonio would be great, but as you know once these guys get in it's hard to get them out so a Hispanic major market station would be like taking candy from a baby. It would be sweeter than anything in the world. I love El Paso. I love it here, but we want to see what it's like to be in the big leagues one day.

WHAT ELSE DO YOU THINK WE'VE MISSED HERE THAT YOU WANT US TO ASK YOU? OR IS THAT IT?

"Ups" to all Rhythm/Top40 management and staffs, in particular my GM Bill Struck, U.S. Radio's CEO Don Kidwell for continuing to fight the radio war with Top40 and proving that the format is a formidable product and that yu can sell and win at it.

nationally. That's not national events. The one thing, the rule is it's got to be local. It's got to be topical. Things that are happening in our city and again, .

YOU JUST WRAPPED UP YOUR SUM-MER JAM. HOW DID IT GO?

It was the best ever. Last year we sold about 600 tickets, total. This year we had a sell-out of 12,500 people. We had a lot of groups come to Sun City on July 1st. Da Brat was our headliner. Skee-lo and Max-A-Million were just terrific. What stole the show was Intonation flew in from Canada, S.F. Spanish Fly flew in from the Bay Area. Our only live band was Fantastoc. Dis-N' Dat got the crowd rocking. Total and U.N.V. rounded out the show. The show was also a success because of the great ticket price: \$5.00 for 10 groups...that's 50-cents an act! And it all benefitted the Special Olympics. It's now become our big annual event, and next year it ought to be bigge and better.

that are going to buy the records. Or more importantly, what I'm saying is everybody wins in a situation like that – record company, radio station, the listeners – everybody wins. So that's just one of the things that would help in my mind. Keep the Top40 format alive.

Right. I agree with that statement wholeheartedly. Alternative is challenging existing ideas about the format, and we helped create a new Top40.

I'd like to be the first to go on record as saying that these same spiffs should be extended towards the hard working folks in radio promotions. I mean, considering the numbers of people we send on trips and vacations, it would only seem natural that we should nab some benefits from all of this traveling.

In 1992, I sent some contest winners from the "Show Us Your Wild 107" promotion to Australia to go scuba diving on the Great Barrier Reef, thus completing my un-official tour of the world: since 1981, I've been involved in contests and promotions that have sent winners to all of the continents. (My other goal was a little too lofty: to send winners to all of the countries where "CPO Sharkey" appears once daily on the cable system.) I often found myself living vicariously through my winners. While I was hanging banners and drinking watered down beer in 102 degree heat at some festival, my winners were scaling the Alps. Or at least they were enjoying a nice air-conditioned room in another city as they waited to attend that evening's concert by a band that would soon be making a swing through our fair city. In fact I usually asked my winners to send a postcard from wherever they were, and years later I've still got dozens and dozens of these messages from far off and exotic places. Or at least a hell of a lot more far off and exotic than wherever I was.

Radio's known for a while how good a trip giveaway can be. These promotions allow you to tie-in with anything exciting or topical that is happening in the world of entertainment or sports. Boom. Look no further. You've got your promotion. The Grammy's are coming up? Send some winners. Mike Tyson's got his first postfelony fight coming up? Send some winners, "Friends" is the hottest new show on the tube? Send some winners. And have them ask Jennifer Anniston why she hasn't returned one of my phone calls. Of course, the "how" is the allimportant factor with this. Trips can be boring if you let them be. You've just got to find the hook that makes it work for your station. I once sent a pair of winners to McDonalds. Granted it was a McDonalds in Tokyo that was across the street from the arena where later in the day the winners would be sitting in the front row at a Prince concert. But the McDonalds part became the whole focus of the promotion. The Tokyo/ Prince element was so down-played that It was comical. And that was the point. It stood out.

"Trips need to be tailored to your audience" says Duff Lindsay, the Program Director at 102 Jamz / Orlando. If you know your audience, you'll know the 'sparkplug' destinations for them, "For us, Jamaica and the rest of the Caribbean are hot spots for our listeners to go to. They might not be the most expensive or flashiest places to go to, but they're what appeals to my audience," says Lindsay. Finding the "hook" is critical for Duff. "If you can get a trip to go see Madonna, then make it a trip to a sexy city. Las Vegas would be a great place to send winners to see her. Look for cities with romance. If you had a trip for the Fourth of July, you wouldn't want to send them to just a 'regular' city. You'd want to send them to Philadelphia or Washington DC," adds Duff. He says that as a PD,

their hands on it the longest got to go and see a Hammer show in the Bay Area. Another "Touch & Go" contest was when I was at WLOL and we had five listeners "lay their hands" on a Bon Jovi stand up (in conjunction with his single "Lay Your Hands On Me") to win a trip to see him in London. Putting airplane tickets in an airport locker and giving away keys to the locker on the air is a new twist on the old car giveaway.

Amber Pope is the Promotion/ Marketing Director at KS-104 in Denver and tied in a bumpersticker promotion with a cruise trip giveaway. They held several Friday afternoon sticker stops where the station stickered lots of cars and awarded individually numbered prize cards to everyone who drove through the Traffic Jam event. On Monday morning they called out some of these numbers to qualify for the cruises they were giving away. "Adding the element of a trip can often be the perfect hook that your event or holiday promotion needs," says Amber. A prime example of that would be her station's Earth Day promotion when KS-104 did a "Tree Hugger



he's constantly being approached with concert trips to give away. "I'll toy around with it and try to establish a theme for the contest. For instance, if a label brought me a trip to go and see Anita Baker in Atlanta, I'd try to create some Olympic theme or methodology to the contest," he concludes.

Qualifying winners to go on a trip is probably the most popular way to award trips, but there are many more, less obvious ways to do it. In the past I did a "We Bet You Can't Touch This" promotion where we had ten listeners place their hands on a stand up display of M C Hammer and the person who kept

winners getting seedlings and bags of dirt, qualifying for a weekend of communing with nature in the spas at Glenwood Springs. The trees and bags of dirt were topical and perfect for Earth Day. The trip to go soak in hot springs while breathing clear mountain air was just the dash of pinache that the contest needed.

Since qualifying does seem to be the most recognized and popular form for awarding getaways and vacations, Robert Scorpio at 97.9 The Box makes it his goal to qualify as many people as possible in as short a period of time as he can. "You don't want to drag a concert trip out for two weeks. That's a



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great weekend contest. Even a week would be pushing it. But there's no reason you can't get a ton of qualifiers," says Scorpio. For the recent Superfest stop In Houston, his station gave away a trip to see the tour in another city and opened up the phones for five minutes at a time, qualifying everyone who got through. "You've got to take the tour itinerary and find the spot on it that you can really have fun with. Like with TLC and Boyz II Men; you've got two songs 'Water Runs Dry' and 'Waterfall'. You should be sending winners to Niagara Falls or someplace like that," says Robert. The Box has had a lot of success with qualifying people for trips. "We did a ton of trips in Winter and Spring and it really paid off with our TSL," concludes Scorpio.

Even if you don't have a hefty budget to work with (and who does any more?), trip promotions are always something that are available and easy to come by. Often for free. But even disregarding the financial reasons for doing lots of trips, they are great prizes. Plus they allow you to tap into whatever is topical happening both in and out of your market. And that's reason enough to work hard at continuing to improve this aspect of your marketing and contesting.

MORE RANDOM THOUGHTS

FROM A RANDOM MIND

RADIO

I've been collecting airchecks lately from radio stations across the country. Maybe because the radio here in Washington is so poor. Maybe just because I can't afford a vacation. Maybe a little of both. Why is it that all AC's sound alike? Whether it's a tape from Minneapolis, or from Palm Springs, there seems to be no difference in the playlists. It's as if these stations come off an assembly line, (or satellite dish). I'm a firm believer in regionality, second only to locality, whether the format is AC, AOR, CHR, or even Country. I'm here to tell ya', either every AC I heard had the same consultant, (which isn't necessarily out of the question), or they just don't get it.

RESEARCH

Then there's the fragmentation, and "niching" between the various slants of AC's, and CHR's. Most of them sound as if they're aftempting to "niche around a niche," as my friend Rick Thomas called it n a recent conversation. He added, "it's

like they're shooting at the rim instead of through the hoop." That's a great analogy.

You can't tell me that just because a listener has 5 different presets on the dial, each with a different radio station assigned to it, that combining the music of all 5 preset stations constitutes a niche format. When listeners say they want variety, that's not what they mean! The reason they have 5 presets is to get a variety of music, determined by their musicai mood at the given moment. The goal is to first, be one of the 5 presets, and then, when they tune in to you, to get credit for the most TSL. It's like a grocery store. You have seperate isles for similar items. You don't put fruits in the meat isle. If you want fruit, you'll go to the fruit isle. If you want meat, you'll go to the meat isle, and so-on... Obviously the meat supplier wants to stock the finest VARIETY of meats so that the needs of any meat eater are satisfied when in that meat isle. That way the consumer doesn't have to go to another store altogether. (meaning- a cassette, a cd, cable, etc...). God, I'm hungry!

DUOPOLIES

Radio stations are getting fat right now. Most of them at least. Duopolies are working, (for the owners- and working against programmers AND listeners).. Why pay a high priced "premium" consultant when you've bought your competition? You can use some new, "wanna-be" consultant

who'll do it for half the price. You've bought your competition. You don't have to sound good anymore. You've bought your competition. Know what that means? Say it with me now- BAD RADIO!

Out of all the companies I know of, only INFINITY does it differently. They keep the duopolized stations in separate locations, continue to program to WIN, and actually sell against each other- making for healthy competition, and GREAT RADIO!

MUSIC 101

You play music all day long. Do you ever think about the people on the records, the artists? Who are these people we play?

Do you know the artist who, before she had a hit, was the manager of a video store in Arizona? I'm talking about Adina Howard. Adina had been wanting to become a singer since she was seven. Now she's 20 years old. Her smash, "Freak Like Me," was written especially for her and about her by Mass Order. You may recognize the melody, it's the Bootsy Collins classic "I'd Rather Be With You."

Maybe you're new to D'Angelo. D'Angelo is a 21 year old son of a preacher man from Richmond, Virginia. D'Angelo got his start in music by playing the piɛno. He'd listen to the radio, then he'd play the song. The first two songs he learned to play on the piano were "Hot Stuff" by Donna Summer and "Boogie Wonderland" by Earth, Wind & Fire. Eventually D'Angelo got on Showtime At The Apollo and won it three times in a row!

Stick with Mark In-The-Dark, I'm gonna educate you! Do you know Notorious B.I.G.? Your audience sure does. Did you know Biggie Smalls sold nearly a quarter of a million records in New York City alone? Biggie has his own clothing line comin' out called Big Man Clothes. Notorious is an expert on BIG, he's 6 foot 2 and weighs 250 pounds. Favorite food? Italian.

Naughty By Nature is an interesting group. They're three guys, MCs Treach and Vinnie and their DJ, Kay Gee. They're out of East Orange, New Jersey. Born there and still livin' there. Naughty By Nature was winner of The Source magazine's 1991 New Artist Of The Year award.

Vanessa Williams was crowned Miss America in 1983. Both of Vanessa's parents were and still are music teachers. She grew up in Milwood, New York. Vanessa majored in musical theatre at Syracuse University and now lives in New York with her husband and three children.

For excitement, you can't beat TLC. At presstime TLC was back on tour after a slight delay. 



FLASH....THIS JUST IN!:

We wanted to title this one, "George Michael Consummates Union With Virgin," but we thought better of it, even though that would sum up one of the week's biggest music biz stories. Pop star GEORGE MICHAEL has been released from his contract with Sony Music Entertainment. The announcement was made in a press release issued this past Thursday (7/13) by Sony Music, which stated that both parties agreed to keep terms of the settlement confidential. That same day, KEN BERRY, Chairman of Virgin Music Group Worldwide and President of EMI International, announced that Virgin Records had signed GEORGE to a new international deal for the world out-

a new international deal for the world outside the U.S. Stateside, GEORGE MICHAEL signed an exclusive contract with DreamWorks/SKG. That deal makes him the first artist to ink a deal with the SPIEL-BERG, KATZENBERG, GEFFEN imprint. Look for the superstar's next album to be released within the next year. Before leaving the Sony Music Group though, G.M. will record two new songs for the company. The tracks will be featured on a greatest hits compilation to be released in 1997.

The other big news this week could be titled "Evergreen Buys Into Pyramid Scheme," but we thought better of it as well. But it's true, because, as expected, SCOTT GINSBERG's Evergreen Media will acquire RICH BALSBAUGH's Pyramid Communications. The merger adds Pyramid's 12 stations to Evergreen's 22-station portfolio, giving the newly expanded firm 34 stations, including five FM's in Chicago and four FM's in Charlotte. The pact also increases Charlotte. The pact also increases Evergreen's presence in many other major markets, and puts the Irving, Texas-based company in control of the most stations and duo-

plies in the nation's top 10 markets. As a result, the company will need to divest itself of certain stations and/or seek waivers (as it currently has in Chitown) in order to meet current FCC ownership requirements. Since in fact, it is the likely slackening of those ownership limits, (expected to be a product of current Congressional efforts to further de-regulate broadcasting) that helped in part to precipitate this deal, look for Evergreen to apply for waivers until a Telecommunication bill is completed. The price tag for the agreement was \$306.5 million in cash plus an adjustment in net working capital. The transaction is expected to close in the first quarter of next year. For the moment, it is unclear just how the merger will

affect Pyramid programming honcho STEVE RIVERS.

Like a HIDEO NOMO forkball, this one came hard and fast, and took a lot of people by surprise. Just before we went to press last week, we told you that it looked like programming vet and current free-agent TOM GJERDRUM had joined WZPL/Indianapolis as that station's new PD. And it's true. DID YOU KNOW!

A just-completed study of national music tastes completed by Coleman Research shows Classical and Motown (defined as a music category) as the musical sounds American's most enjoy. The study, conducted in the top 50 media markets, indicated that 17% of all 12-54 year old listeners claim to

have a strong appreciation for both Classical music and Motown. In addition, the study shows that socalled Grunge Rock is extremely popular, with 14% of those surveys claiming a strong affinity for the sound. In comparison, the survey indicates that such musical styles (hard to say how they were defined) as Country, AOR and AC scored considerably less in listener appreciation, with scores of 9%, 8% and 13% respectively.
