

Radio's 20 Year Love Affair With Elton John Continues

ELTON'S BACK

Guns Boom, **Roses Bloom**

There's a certain feeling you get when a project is about to turn from hit to mega-hit, from smash to monster, from Platinum to Multi-Platinum.

That's how they're feeling right now at Geffen about Guns 'N' Roses.

"They've definitely emerged as one of the premier bands of the year," said Geffen President Ed Rosenblatt. "Diligent, hard work by the band and everyone concerned has helped us reach this plateau. Now, we're about to go to an entirely new level. A whole new story is about to begin."

The dawning of this new era is the result of the band's new single, "Sweet Child O' Mine," which debuted in the Top 5 requests for MTV. It was MTV which played a crucial role in bringing this band to the 2,000,000 unit level.

"MTV has been the driving force behind the breaking of this act," said Geffen's Promotion leader Al Coury who is now convinced he is coming to Top 40 at the right time with the right cut.

"We did it with Whitesnake, we did it with Aerosmith, now we'll do it again with Guns N' Roses," said the Promotion executive.

Van Halen lead singer Sammy Hagar sustained fractures to his minor tailbone (ouch!) and lower vertebrae during the band's very first performance on their current "Monsters of Rock" tour at East Troy, WI last Friday (not Stevens

Point, OK?). The singer was admitted to a local hospital after finishing his performance and was released the following morning. Hagar fell on the slippery stage, but seemed to suffer no ill effects from the injuries.

He's back at his old home, back to that trademark sound, and back to his old tricks at Top 40.

The team that brought Elton John back to Top 40 last year with "Candle In The Wind" is going for it again.

The first-week returns are in and Elton's "I Don't Wanna Go On With You Like That" scores as the most added record of the week. This one's a runaway.

Among the monsters adding the cut from John's forthcoming album. "Reg Strikes Back" (street date 6/20) — KMEL, WMMS, KRBE, WXKS, PROFM, WKTI, B97, KKRZ, 94Q, KATD. WHYT, KKBQ, KXYQ, WKBQ, and on and on and on.

Many programmers have commented that the uptempo cut from a highly visible image artist is exactly what their ballad-saturated playlists have been needing.


And from what we hear from the label, the single is only a hint of things to come.

'This is a major, major comeback for Elton. He's inspired again," said MCA Executive VP Promotion & Marketing Richard Palmese. "Everyone who has heard the record is saying, 'This is the old Elton, this is the Elton I grew up with.' It's a happy, exciting record. I'm very proud to be associated with it."

Artist Vs Record

RADIO MUST DECIDE: It has become clear in discussions over the past few weeks that radio programmers have become more and more aware of the problem of playing artists versus playing just records. Up until now it has been an easy process for They simply records that have requests or single sales in the market, and give the best rotation to those with the most requests and the most 45 sales. Now, however, the process is becoming a bit more difficult. With quality artists like a Ziggy Marley (Virgin) or a Tracy Chapman (Elektra) selling large quantities of albums, cassettes and CD's, drawing big numbers in concert and receiving mega-mentions in the press (yet lacking in the two prime research categories) radio executives are being faced with one of their most difficult decisions to date. Are they simply to play the flash hit singles that appeal immediately to the active radio listener and not really develop artists with long-term potential for not only the record companies but for the stations themselves, or should they broaden their horizons and consider

The continued growth at radio on these two essential projects will reveal how much leniency the radio community is willing to extend to the record business in general. And how much potential exists for develop-



ing quality, adult-appeal artists on not only Top 40, but on all formats of radio. We recommend that all parts of the business closely watch the developments on these two projects and root hard for important artists with a vision, with something special to say. We need something more than dance ditties and novelty hits. We need real artists.

VAN HALEN'S THE ONE: It looked for a brief moment as if Enigma/Capitol's glamrockers Poison were going to be the ones to finally break the George Michael (Columbia), Dirty Dancing (RCA) stranglehold on the #1 Album Chart position, but they just missed. Then, it looked like Prince (Paisley Park/WB) would be the one, but he too stopped just short. However, the end came this week as Van Halen (WB) explodes in the top slot in only their second week of availability. The album, "OU812," far outdistanced Michael. Poison, Sade (Epic) and everyone else to nail down the #1 position. The king is dead, long live the king.

EPIC VP, Promotio
Dan DeNigris

ike every good promotion man, anywhere Dan DeNigris hangs his hat is home. Before settling in as VP, Promotion at Epic, the worldly DeNigris had crossed the country frequently, first as an air force brat, then as a musician ("anything from Black Sabbath to Mickey Gilley"). When an offer came to join CBS in sales, he was ready. While working for the ten-store Karma Records chain in Indianapolis, he was about to submit one last batch of demos to CBS. "It was all or nothing," he recalls, "but the branch manager of CBS in Chicago said, 'I've heard your tapes are good. If you're gonna come with me, I need a commitment. You've got to forget about being an artist.' I said okay and never looked back."

If DeNigris thought his travels were over he had a surprise in store. CBS moved him six times in ten years. Starting as inventory clerk in Chicago, he was sent to Indianapolis to do sales, then to Minneapolis, a year later to Omaha, then back to Minneapolis in local promotion

and finally to New York as National Director of Promotion in 1984 before assuming the VP's role, the current stop in his twelve-year CBS stint

The heavy background in sales, DeNigris believes, gave him a clear perspective on the different needs of the promotion and marketing staffs and has been a big help in pitching such disparate artists as Miami Sound Machine and The Rave-Ups to radio. The amiable Eric Clapton freak urges a musicianly spirit of cooperation among those involved in breaking new artists as well as an articulate and wideranging view of the music business in general. He even cites "Hits" as a positive force in development of Post-Modern acts. Although shaken by this loss of credibility, we were relieved when he later suggested the trades inadvertently contribute to stranglehold playlists. We breathed a sigh of relief and pressed on with the interview.

How did the time you spent in sales with local CBS branches help prepare you for promotion?

Inventory was the best experience for coming into this company, because it helped me

Do you see penetration beyond college and alternative stations for the format?

I think there are stations that are interested. It depends on what the market will bear. Certainly WXKS has been a leader in that

learn the branch distribution system and the CBS catalog. No matter how much you love music, you can't know a catalog the size of CBS' without getting in there and doing the nitty gritty. So the inventory clerk was a great precursor for going into the sales territories, and that was a great background for going into local promotion.

What's the outlook for promoting Epic's Post-Modern acts?

For a long time there were some great alternative records out there that were really struggling. We have a lot of those records, from Prefab Sprout to Godfathers, and I salute *Hits* for bringing it to the attention of radio programmers and making a big deal out of it. I think it's going to gain more and more significance all the time, but I still think there are major roadblocks.

area, but Sunny Joe White is smart to counterprogram radio stations like WBCN, which have always been on the progressive side. Boston's been a great market for that. I get a thrill when I go to Boston because there are great radio stations and because the whole community is involved. You go to a record function there, and the radio stations really want to come, they all know each other, they hang out together, they invite each other to their functions, and even though it's highly competitive, it's also very friendly.

What other stations have contributed to Post-Modern exposure?

KITS in San Francisco has been a tremendous asset to Top 40 in general, just because of the type of records they've been able to play and get exposure for in the Bay area. There are a lot of radio stations around the country, not just Top 40, but Album Rock as well. In N. Y., we have WDRE (the old WLIR), in Chicago, WXRT, 91X in San Diego, to mention a few. Thank God there are people out there paying attention to this kind of music, because I think it's very viable.

What's the best way to create more exposure for these acts?

Well, along with *Hits* exposure in the Post-Modern section, the thing that we're finding more and more is that the real opportunity to

get these groups across is to put them on the road and let people see them. Godfathers is a typical example, because anyone who walks out of a Godfathers show is just in the clouds. It's just a tremendous rock 'n' roll show. It's just pure energy. Ultimately the public's going to decide. I think the market share's much bigger than what we're achieving right now.

Are you actively involved in setting up the acts' concert schedules?

In some cases, I am. When the shows are integral to breaking a record, I have input as to where. Concert appearances, however, are usually coordinated by product management.

Do you see the market opening up for Post-Modern acts, or is it in a niche that will always be a start-up area for new acts?

That's going to be dictated by several different factors. First is always the artistry. As long as there's music coming our way that has that kind of sound and that kind of feel, we'll be interested in it. Post-Modern music, by its very nature, is not mainstream. I think all along Post-Modern artists are more concerned with letting their talent show through and with being themselves rather than trying to come up with hit singles. By the time they did that anyway, it would be passe. How long

groups are going to be able to support themselves is a question I can't answer. It's not a mass appeal situation right now, and it's tough. I think the overall conditions of the economy may be the most significant factor. If the economy is strong, it will be easier to concentrate on the alternative means necessary to break these kinds of acts.

Do you draw on any of your own experiences as a musician in dealing with artists?

Definitely. I think about it all the time. It's ironic that most people around here don't even know I was a musician. As a matter of fact it came out about three weeks ago because I went to Indianapolis for Henry Lee Summer. We had the governor there, accounts and radio. We wanted to go in and really make a statement because we believe in the artist. I started by talking about the fact that it was like coming home for me because I got my start in the music business in Indianapolis at Karma Records. Mentioning that I played in local bands around the area, for four years I was directly

I think so. It's difficult because you're always walking a fine line with the musicians and their managers. They're concerned about their particular project, and in this job, you have to be concerned about all of the records, which ones are going to make the most impact and which ones really have a shot. It's very hard for me because I'm very honest with these people. I've found in the long run it's far better to be honest up front than it is to come back later and say, "What happened?" At the same time, it's very difficult because any piece of vinyl you get isn't just a record, it's a career. It's something that in many cases people have been working for all their lives. Henry Lee Summer tried to get signed for six years and every label turned him down.

What finally sold CBS on him?

Tony Martell flew to Indiana and saw him and signed him on the spot. He had had a sales base in Indiana alone of 50,000 units on an independent label with no distribution, no promotion, no

involved in the music scene on the streets in Indianapolis. And as it turned out, the bass player in Henry Lee's band was my old bass player. So I think it's hard when you're a musician at heart not to draw on those experiences, and believe me there were plenty of days when we ate peanut butter with no bread or jelly just to survive. I feel for a lot of the artists, and I have to say quite honestly after being on this side of it, I'm glad I am. Even when you make it, it's phenomenally difficult. When you're successful and the money comes into the picture, anything that's there to destroy you is right there in front of your face. It's hard to overcome that and keep your cool.

The artists here must see you as a real friend and soulmate.

nothing. To sell 50,000 albums on an unknown artist in one state is unheard of. And he could sell out 10,000-12,000 seats at a time anywhere in Indiana or Ohio. But no one would touch the guy. There are a lot of acts that we'll put out first time around and we're lucky to see 20 or 30,000 units.

What was the reason for the initial resistance?

By virtue of the system, it's almost impossible for artists to get their foot in the door, even if they have a great record. Sheer volume alone is a major deterrent. Tapes come in every day. Just sorting through the stack can be difficult. I'm not even in A&R and I receive a couple of tapes a week. A&R people have a phenomenally difficult job. How do you find a

record that's going to be a hit two or three years from now? The marketplace changes so rapidly. A&R has to go out with no thought about what's happening today and just make a judgement on the talent and artistry.

When you begin to promote a new act, do you get your strongest support from the hometown market?

It depends on the type of format you're dealing with because each of the formats has its own idiosyncracies. At Top 40, we were fortunate with Henry Lee to have a base laid in the midwest where they knew his strength. These stations are so phenomenally supportive it's unbelieveable. But I remember when I was in Minneapolis and Prince was really huge. We'd go down to First Avenue and watch him every night, and there would be a thousand people jammed into the place taking their clothes off and getting crazy and he'd sell 50,000 copies. But Minneapolis radio will be the first to admit that they were the last stations in the country to support him.

Is that one of the typical problems for you at radio?

It just depends on the artist, what groundwork has been laid, and timing. All the formats are tight right now. It may be a good record but the wrong tempo. It's just not what they need at the time or they feel there's another record that's stronger. I don't know how many times recently I've heard from Top 40 radio, "If you give us

another ballad, we'll bomb your label." And, of course, our comeback is, "If you have so many ballads on the air, why don't you pull them off?" "Well, because they're hit records." "Then why don't you eliminate the formula and go with what the record companies give you because those are ultimately either going to be the hits or they aren't." It's a Catch-22.

So how do you eliminate this logjam of product and open up the formats to new music?

It's a long hard road. Radio stations have their own formulas for the amount of mix they want to play on new records or current records as opposed to old records, and that's something you really can't tamper with. They have to do what they feel they need to do to win in the market, and I agree with that. A lot of radio stations have a tight-listed format. It's been proven time and time again that if you play fewer records and you rotate them properly, you're going to pick up your ratings. By the same token, in any business, not just radio, it's an axiom that you don't win unless you take a risk. We see a lot of activity now with major market programmers networking to find the hits. I feel that this alone has helped to discover a great many new artists. Ultimately, by developing credible relationships with programmers and by being cognizant of their needs and problems—what they do for a living-more of the right records will make their way to the radio. The logjam will still be there, but both sides will be a lot happier and more prosperous.







Now it's time to start again, with a new push for a new cut. "It can be really frustrating," said Capitol National Director of Progressive Rock Promotion Harry Levy (Ed Note: Let's get rid of that stupid title, Harry). "But when you go for overnight successes, it can come back to haunt you because you don't have a base." Capitol's Fagot summed it up succinctly: "The key with a band like this is perserverance. We are determined to break this band if it's 1988, 1989, or 1990. However long it takes."

THE HORIZON

THE LATEST ON UP AND COMING BANDS by John Sutton-Smith

The Smithereens played a four-night stand at the Roxy on their recent L.A. swing and laid into some extended encores with Replacements-like renditions of Kinks and Who nuggets played with the kind of raucous revelry and righteous irreverence that was unexpected from the previously moody New Jersey foursome. CAPITOL laid on a bash in their honor at the Whisky just down the street where the order of the evening was "think green" in line with the band's latest album, "Green Thoughts". The unusual fare, all laced with the requisite verdant tint, included such delicacies as mini-steak mignons with green bernaise sauce and strawberries with green chocolate.......Fiery pop group the Sugarcubes, possibly the best new pop band since the Smiths, have had to postpone their U.S. mini-tour due to visa problems and hope to re-schedule their first visit here for August. The Icelandic band have their first single, "Birthday" on ELEKTRA out on 12" now and lead singer Bjork is set to cut a track with Sinead O'Connor, another wild vocal dervish from neighboring Ireland.....Australian combo Big Pig, starring colorful vocalists Sherine and Oleh Witer, did manage to penetrate the borders and played a lively concert to a largely industry contingent on the L.A. stop of their first American tour behind their acclaimed A&M debut "Bonk"...I.R.S.' brave foray into farm-club labels is coming to an early demise with the news that PRIMITIVE MAN, the label formed by the I.R.S. principals little over a year ago, is closing down next week. Under Sam Gennaway, the label had signed a number of interesting acts, including the exciting and eclectic folkie mix of the Balancing Act, whose new album is produced by ex-Gang of Four guitarist Andy Gill, and the darker cadence of Arizona band Caterwaul. Both these acts' new releases will be incorporated under the I.R.S. logo while other acts like Adrian Belew's innovative Bears; top reggae/rap maestro Pato Banton and dance outfit Tirez Tirez will probably be put on waivers. P.M.R.C. was a great idea that was possibly too good in that their signings were fairly successful fairly quickly and immediately required the greater marketing attention of I.R.S., thus draining resources from their own projects. The obvious solution was to merge the smaller company........CELLULOID releases two more albums in the Brazilian series on their BRAZILOID label with the first self-titled release from Obina Shok and "Batuqueiro," the latest from renowned singer-composer Martinho Da Vila, one of the major figures at the annual Rio Carnaval.....Ranking Roger's first album since the break-up of General Public last year is finally due this month on I.R.S. Called "Radical Depature," it is reportedly a blend of Big Audio Dynamite and the English Beat, which can't be bad. The tour gets underway this month, reaching the West Coast at the beginning of July, and if you never saw the Beat or General Public, Ranking has probably taken over the title of "hardest working man in showbiz" when he hits the stage. Meanwhile, former partner Dave Wakeling is holed up in L.A readying his first solo album for the same label, with Mark Goldenberg slated for production duties......The new Pre-Fab Sprout album, "From Langley to Memphis," has been out on EPIC for a few weeks and deserves some attention.



White Lion Roars To The Top



An exclusive Hits interview with White Lion's Vito Bratta by Gerry Gittelson

his band has already gone through some really hard times," admits White Lion lead guitartist Vito Bratta, his heavy New York accent passionate with emotion.

White Lion has learned quickly that the rock world can be a jungle, when their previous label dropped the band just before not releasing their aptly-titled debut album, "Fight to Survive." On the other hand, their new album, "Pride," for Atlantic, has succeeded in a big way. Produced by metal vet Michael Wagener, it was just certified gold, and is firmly lodged in the Top 20, with a hit single in "Wait."

Bratta, a self-taught guitarist whose virtuosity recalls Eddie Van Halen, co-writes the bulk of the band's material with lead vocalist Mike Tramp. Bassist James Lomenzo and drummer Greg D'Angelo round out the band. Hits spoke to Bratta in between tours. They are about to join labelmates AC/DC on their upcoming North American jaunt after opening for Aerosmith on theirs.

What happened with Elektra (your previous label)?

We got signed by the head of the company, Bob Krasnow, and the whole company loved

the band. Everything was great. Then one day they just said "We're not putting out the record." Nobody wanted to talk to us. Nobody gave us a reason. They had one of those housecleanings where they

fired everybody and got all new people.

Do you feel on the edge of the kind of success experienced by Bon Jovi and Cinderella?

It's hard to really judge. I knew Bon Jovi before he made it. I met Cinderella when those guys didn't even have enough money for gas to get to a gig. Then I see how big they made it, and I know what I want. I really don't know how it feels. I can just hope that it happens. We've gone through so many things and had it all fail that it's hard to really feel anything until it does happen. But it feels good to be right on the edge, as you put it.

What were the first records you bought?

Cream and Elton John. They were the first two actually...and

parisons. I mean, if you get compared to the best, how could you not want that? I wouldn't want anybody to say I'm copying him. When I first started playing guitar, I was always looking for a certain sound. When the first Van Halen record came out, I said "That's what I'm hearing! That's exactly it!" I didn't know the two-handed technique. I didn't realize that you could plug one pickup in a Strat and play like that. Eddie made me realize you could do it.

Songs like "Lady of the Valley" and "When the Children Cry" show a more serious side to the band that most young heavy metal fans aren't accustomed to.

We're not afraid to do serious stuff. A White Lion album isn't gonna be all about partying on a Friday night and getting drunk. Some people

Do you find those bands influencing your songwriting now?

My songwriting comes out of *me*, but probably my biggest influence is Elton John because that's all I really listen to right now. Van Halen is one band I really got into. Whatever got soaked up into my head through all the years of listening is coming out, I suppose. I really don't know how to pin out exactly who.

What about the comparisons between you and Eddie Van Halen?

I don't mind the com-

What was it like to work with Michael Wagener?

He's unbelievable. He gets a great guitar sound and a great overall sound, but the thing is with Michael, he's not the type of producer who pulls in with his expensive car, sees how everything is going, turns a few knobs, and leaves. He's just there every minute of the day and night. He even took me to the music store when I had to buy a pick. He doesn't have to do that. He makes himself a part of the band and gives total freedom, too.



Life in The Post-Bond Age

An exclusive Hits interview with Sean Connery by Craig Modderno

Sean Connery is a genuine movie star who seems to be more at ease as a character actor. Ever since he became the legendary super-spy James Bond in the 1962 film version of Ian Fleming's novel, "Dr. No," Connery and moviegoers have had an enduring love affair.

The romance has been a test for his fans because the Scottish-born actor has often done very offbeat films: "The Hill," "A Fine Madness," "The Man Who Would Be King," "Time Bandits," "The Name Of The Rose" and "The Untouchables," which earned him the best supporting actor Oscar this year.

Live from Spain, where he's portraying Harrison Ford's father in the third "Indiana Jones" installment, Connery came across during this trans-Atlantic satellite interview with Hits as polite, tough, candid and sexy, a living advertisement that hard work and talent breed success.

There's a crucial scene in your new film, "The Presidio," where you deliver a eulogy for a fellow soldier. Since you used to be in the British military, the scene seemed to have a personal feel.

I wanted to show a human side of the American soldier, which, in a funny way, has been lost since the Vietnam War. That side of fellowship and passion is very pure. I find myself getting very emotional when I hear the American national anthem. I think the opening scene, set in the Presidio military base in San Francisco, captures the majesty of your armed forces.

Has there been any role that you wanted that you didn't get?

When I read the book

"Doctor Zhivago," which I loved, and I discovered David Lean was directing the film, I wanted to play the lead, but he went another way with the role and cast Omar Shariff, I talked with [director Michelangelo | Antonioni about playing the lead in "Blow Up." I liked the script, but I could never understand what he was talking about when we discussed the film. I didn't think I was prepared to submit myself to philosophical discussions each day on the set, so I passed on the project.

Are there any roles that you did that you regret?

(Laughs) Do you have the entire day to hear me talk about all of them?

You still have an immense appeal to women. How does it feel to be an

older sex symbol?

It's quite flattering.
Being a sex symbol is not really a job, it's a career.
But when you're getting on a bit like I am, it's nice to know women enjoy looking at you. I'd still like to play a romantic lead and see how women would respond to me now.

new actors you've worked with recently?

They're of a different school of acting. They have a spirit that gets you going. I look at actors like Kevin Costner, Charlie Martin Smith and Andy Garcia, who I worked with in "The Un-



touchables," and I admire the professional way they go about their work. A lot of people may think I'm competitive, but I'm happy to give any scene to an actor who can take it. Mark Harmon (his costar in "The Presidio"] thinks I'm very competitive, but he came across quite well in the film so I can't be too tough on young actors, can I? If you really want to see how competitive I am, then try playing golf or poker with me!

There's a trend in films towards doing sequels. What do you think of sequels in general?

for the Bond films. The strange thing is how popular the six Bond pictures I did still are. Bond has made me quite rich and given me a lot of freedom to do what I want. All and all, I like the old chap.

Which of your Bond movies do you think is the best?

"From Russia, With Love" because the film didn't have a lot of hardware. It has the flavor of what I thought the best features of the Bond films were and the books, too. My fear, which came true, was that the Bond films would

Not much. (Laughs) But that's probably because I die in most of my films, so I'm rarely asked to do one.

Would you ever come back to play James Bond?

Not really. I think I'm too old, the same as Roger [Moore] was. Timothy Dalton does very well. I'm amazed that the Bond films continue to do so well 26 years since the first one. I say good luck to them, but I don't visualize going back to do another one.

Do you ever wish people would stop asking you questions about playing James Bond?

Not anymore. I'm not destroyed by the association, quite the reverse. There's no question in the past that my career has been torn between doing something different and making myself available

get away from the human elements and into the hardware. I'm a big fan of humor and I thought the humor of the character got lost as the hardware increased.

What's wrong with Hollywood?

People tend to go to bed too early there. They eat too early. Michael Caine once invited me to a party for one of his films. At a dance afterwards, the crowd had shrunk from 150 guests to 30, most of them Europeans. I asked Michael why everyone had left and he said, "Americans all go to bed early in this town, whether they want to or not, because if they're seen out people will think that they're not working."

Are you a tough critic when you watch yourself on film?

Yes. I think you have to

be very tough on yourself when you see the dailies. You have to able to look at your work while you're doing it and say to yourself that I'm not getting this character down pat. A lot of actors won't even see dailies and think they're doing good work just because they've got the part. Acting is like any craft— you have to respect it and constantly work to improve your talents.

You did an interview on American television this year where you said women should be hit at times to keep them in line. What kind of response did you get from that remark?

I was staying at an apartment in Los Angeles when it was aired. The next day, the black kids who parked the cars made a complimentary sexual gesture at me. Then I was driving to Paramount studios and an elegant lady pulls up in a car next to me and raises her middle finger at me! What I did say was somewhat lifted out of context. What I did say was to strike a women is not the worst thing you can do to her.

What's the secret of your film success?

I was fortunate to have a lot of black curly hair when I started! (Laughs) I've had a lot of good luck in my career. I've had a lot of enthusiasm, idealism and respect for the work itself. I never take anything for granted.

Do you take risks regularly?

Well I've been married twice. I like to take big risks in my career rather than small ones. For example some of the smaller films I did after Bond either worked or they didn't! But I made those pictures because I liked them and wanted to take a risk. not because I wanted to erase the Bond image.

Would you ever write a kiss-and-tell book?

I've been asked, but I'm not interested in doing that. There have been three books written about me and you can rest assure those writers heard from my lawyers!

What did you think of the disappointing lack of beautiful women in "The Living Daylights"?

I always thought the Bond women added a lot to the films. I certainly know I approved of Bond's appetite for pretty women. Maybe the Bond producers thought the women wouldn't work in this AIDS-type climate.

Do you ever regret tossing off your toupee in an era when most leading men over forty seem to wear hairpieces?

I would use a hairpiece if I thought it would be right for the character. But I don't think people really care. I remember when I made the movie, "The Hill," I thought a lot if I should wear my hairpiece or not. I figured if I did wear it, as I kept running up the hill, people would be wondering when it was going to fall off and not be thinking about the film. My ego is not very fragile. It was very nice to win the Academy Award for example, but if you want to know my real fantasy it would be to win golf's top prize, the U.S. Open. And I would be happy to win it with or without my hairpiece!
