



Artists Fight Stickering

They've been surprisingly quiet until now, but recording artists are beginning to speak out against album stickering.

Don Henley and Alannah Myles are among the acts scheduled to perform at an anti-stickering rally set for April 12 in St. Louis. Missouri is one of several states with album-stickering legislation under consideration. The event is being organized by - who else? - Danny Goldberg, who manages Myles, among other name artists.

And in Nashville on March

20, Emmylou Harris testified in opposition to a bill in the Tennessee senate that would require certain "offensive" albums to carry yellow fluorescent stickers.

Said Harris to the State Senate Judiciary Committee: "The bill would severely inhibit an artist's ability to speak honestly about difficult social concerns. Passage of [the legislation] would only serve to decrease the freedoms guaranteed by the First Amendment."

A new national Promotion topper and national Promo staff appointments will be announced next week, while Sales, Marketing, Creative Services, International and Publicity will be serviced by the existing Geffen apparatus.

DGC's first releases will be Warrior Soul, the Sundays, Lori Carson, Little Caesar and John Doe.

A more comprehensive report on the new label will appear in this week's Billboard.



AN EXCLUSIVE HITS INTERVIEW WITH ED ECKSTINE BY ROY TRAKIN



If there's one thing the son of jazz/R&B great Billy Eckstine likes to do more than make hit records, it's talk. His rapid-fire conversation is peppered with jive, yiddish and sports references, a tribute to his eclectic upbringing. Born into the biz. the 36-year-old Eckstine was raised in the San Fernando Valley, with neighbors like the Ostins, Rob Kahane, Ed Rosenblatt, Sue Sawyer, Steve Baker and, later on, the Jacksons. He remembers great parties held in his parents' home, with a who's-who of the black musical world in attendance. After leaving college in Boston, Ed was a writer for Soul and Phonograph Record magazines before landing a job with family friend Quincy Jones' fledgling production company. He stayed with his mentor for more than ten years, through Owest Records and such hits as the Brothers Johnson, George Benson, James Ingram, Patti Austin and New Order. During his twenty months at Arista Records, he placed three songs on Whitney Houston's second album, helped Kenny G. cross over and played a major role in Expose's success. Dick Asher and Dick Wingate brought him to PolyGram to head up the label's West Coast offices and to start a new label. Wing, in January of '87. Since then, he has developed hit acts like Vanessa Williams and Tony! Toni! Tone!, along with such up-and-comers as Sharon Bryant, Michael Morales and Brian McKnight. Wing continues to expand into other musical areas, with such signings as comics Sinbad and Robin Harris ("Do The Right Thing"), as well as Post Modernists the Chickasaw Mudd Puppies and Xymox. In his current post. Ed Eckstine gets to do what he does best — chase hit records even if he does have to take time out of his busy day to talk to HITS' own ambulance chaser. Roy Trakin.

What was it like growing up black in Encino?

I used to hear constantly, "Roses are reddish/Violets are bluish/His name's Eckstine and he's not Jewish?" I used to date valley girls and their parents would freak out until they found out Billy Eckstine was my father. Then it was, "Geez, 1948, the Paramount Theatre... it was me and Sylvia's first date... blah, blah, blah...." Meanwhile, I'm doing their daughters. "What a nice boy...." I was like Eddie Haskell. What are your earliest memories of the music business? My father's publisher used to come by the house carrying manila envelopes with songs for him. I used to listen to the demos on acetate. And I'd tell my dad

which were the cool songs. I was doing A&R even then. All five boys used to go out on the road with him. I was responsible for making sure my dad's shoes were shined and his tuxes came back from the cleaners. We all got bit by a combination of bugs. My dad gave me a sense of the whole fan-artist relationship. We couldn't understand why people bugged him for autographs when we went to restaurants. We were taught it was a sacred relationship; that these were the people who made it so we could live in a nice house by buying dad's records. What hit us all was the reality of why we didn't want to be on his side of the stage. Because of the responsibility that came with it. But I've always found this business alluring and sexy. And since it was the family business, it was only natural I grow into it, though my parents would have preferred I become a doctor or lawyer. When I flunked out of Boston University, they flipped. What did you study at BU? I used to sit in my room, smoke

pot and listen to "Zircon John" Brodey on BCN. It's really weird working with him now. I used to tell him how many girls lost their virginity to me listening to him. How did you get hooked up

with Quincy Jones?

The two most important influences in my professional career as well as my personal life have been my dad and Quincy Jones. Now, I'm working for the label where Q. was the first black senior executive, back when he headed A&R at Mercury. Back when I was writing, A&M called me to do an interview with Quincy, who had just released his "Body Heat" album, the record when he decided to come out of his big band phase and go in a more commercial direction. I hadn't seen Quincy in years: when I arrived to do the interview, it was like a homecoming. I ended up hanging with him for a week and he told me about his new direction, how he wanted to start a production company. And he said he needed someone young and enthusiastic to help him and would I be interested? At the time, I had aspirations of

being a record producer myself, but as Quincy so eloquently put it, "I do that, so I guess you gotta do something else." In 1974, he formed Quincy Jones Productions, housed on the A&M lot. I worked for Q., but I was paid by A&M, which made for some pretty interesting situations. The first thing we did was the Brothers Johnson, which turned out to be the label's first black platinum album. By 1979, it had evolved to where Quincy wanted his own label. so he left A&M to go to Warners, where Qwest was born. What were your job

responsibilities?

I started off as Quincy's publicist - I tried to take his volume of credits and present him to the world as a larger-than-life musical renaissance man. As the company expanded, I just filled in the holes and spaces. It was a great environment to grow in. He should have fired me at least twenty-five times. If I had been anywhere else, I probably would have been. I was completely naive and ignorant, but I must have been doing something right. How involved were you with the making of "Off The Wall" and "Thriller"?

Not so much. My function at Qwest was to trumpet the fact that Quincy was involved. I hung out, but that's all it was. There was a very special relationship there. At the start, there wasn't an enormous amount of pressure. There was intensity, but it was all self-generated. Of course, when "Off The Wall" sold ten million. there was pressure for "Thriller" to top that. But Quincy really internalizes the pressure. I still remember how Michael during the making of "Thriller" kept saying, "This is going to be the biggest record ever made." You finally left Qwest to do A&R at Arista in New York. Quincy and I parted company in

September of 1984. It hurt at the time because we were so close. We still are close. He was a father figure, a big brother, an uncle, a crazed friend and all of that. But it had come to a point where I stopped growing. I had to hit a wall — and that wall was Quincy saying he's going this way and I wasn't going with him. I had to get out there and do something else. A month later, Neil Portnow, then of Arista, called and said Clive was looking for someone to the publishing and songwriting fields, funneling material to Clive, who ultimately decides which ones to use. The A&R job at Arista is more "R"-oriented than "A"-

replace Gerry Griffith as a black A&R guy, and would I be interested? It entailed leaving L.A., and that seemed like a good idea at the time. I'd always dealt with New York like a scared, intimidated Valley kid who takes a cab from 57th and 5th to 56th and 7th, looking over his shoulder the whole time afraid to get mugged. Little did I realize what everyone in N.Y. fears is what I am: a 6'3" black man. I started at Arista a week after the 1985 Super Bowl and worked until October 1986. How did you get along with Clive? You don't sign a lot of acts doing A&R there. You work on projects for Clive - you find songs for his divas, you work as a conduit to

oriented. Ultimately, that helped me tremendously. I respect Clive a great deal. I sure the fuck don't get Milli Vanilli, but he sure does. He can really focus in on the core of something pop and not see the color of the act. The fact that Whitney Houston's black is immaterial in Clive Davis' world. And I really tip my cap to him for that, because virtually everywhere else in this business an act like that would have to be a black act first. It was my first experience in a corporate environment and I wasn't used to Clive not communicating with me a whole lot. As an A&R person there, you're making records for him, but I really learned how to be song-oriented.

Quincy taught me the primacy of the melody, but Clive really refined it. As a result. I learned how to listen to mounds of dreck to ultimately find that one great song, like "Dreamin" for Vanessa Williams. Everyone at Arista believes in every record the label puts out, because A&R and Clive make the records. He puts artists and producers through changes galore, but when he gets on the other side of that, 99% of the time the records are competitive in the commerical marketplace. Clive's a music auy, a great A&R auy. Which made it hard for me there. I fashioned myself as a more creative person, not just a quoteunquote A&R guy. It was real tough bringing in things I felt a real passion for and being told, "No, they're not hits..." Roy Lott once told me, "It's his candy store." And it wasn't easy for me to deal with that notion. If I'm in charge of chocolates and he doesn't want chocolates in his store. I'm fucked!!

So you started your own shop. PolyGram was looking for someone to run their black A&R department. They also wanted a troubleshooter, someone to restore groups on the wane commercially — almost like a roving minor league hitting instructor to go in and make sense of where groups once were and where they could be. Dick Asher brought me in to head up the West Coast division with Jeff Sidney. We wanted to rebuild PolyGram's West Coast presence, as well as to build an L.A.-based boutique label. They wanted something to rise out of the ashes of Casablanca. It was basically a glorified A&R department, with a marketing and promotion guy. PolyGram didn't have a great many quality black acts at the time, though. And since that's where my own qualifications ran that's the direction we started out in for Wing. It didn't make sense for me to look for the next Bon Jovi or Def Leppard when what I do best is to find the first Tonyl Tonil Tonel or Vanessa Williams. I had to get on the map.

How did you come to sign Vanessa Williams?

Ramon Hervey and I began discussing Vanessa, and, mercenary that I am, I thought, "Here's a new artist that everybody's already heard about." Win, lose or draw, they'll be talking about her, y'know. My question was, "Does she have a big-league fastball?" She started coming around the office and I really liked her. She's a cool person. Very sweet, very centered. Not affected by the whole Miss America controversy, nor did she have a chip on her shoulder about it. She's the living embodiment of "shit happens." She messed around a bit at the piano and I could tell she was musical. Her tastes are very wideranging, from hip-hop to weird Angela Bofill jazz fusion. We sold 700,000 albums and got a crossover hit with "Dreamin'." The Tonys sold 600,000 albums and had four Top Ten black records, including three #1s. Those are our two most successful acts to date. You're starting to branch out to the Post Modern rock of Chickasaw Mudd Puppies and Xymox and the pop-rock of Michael Morales.

Heather Irving's my main A&R exective and she brought in the Chickasaw Mudd Puppies. As Cliff O' Sullivan, our head of marketing, puts it, they're "Deliverance" with amplifiers. My original notion was to get on the board and make some noise with black pop, then to start to develop some rock acts. I give Heather free reign on that side. I learned a long time ago that not everything is going to sell four million records. There are certain things you do because, musically, they make sense. It helps to present the right image for a company. That's why we signed New Order to Qwest. We didn't want to be perceived as solely a black label. Wing is a fullservice label. I'm a big sports fan

and I love sports analogies. I really believe in the whole notion of minor leagues. You gotta look at the kid in double-A ball who's hitting .350 because three years from now, he might be the next Jose Canseco. What sells 100,000 records now may sell well 800,000 records four albums from now. You've got to keep looking at the broader picture. **Any other recent signings**

Any other recent signings you're high on?

Brian McKnight, a 19-year-old black male vocalist from Huntsville, Alabama, who is the younger brother of Clyde McKnight, the founding member of Take 6. He would have been Take 7, but he opted for a solo career. He could be Luther, Marvin Gaye and Billy Eckstine, all rolled into one.

Can you comment on what's going on these days at PolyGram?

The company has an enormous sense of direction. Alain Levy's the #2 guy at PolyGram International and he's come over to run the day-to-day operation of the company. Alain realizes as I do - the industry is operating, structurally, on a model established 25 years ago. Which is insane. We see a much broader picture than that. My job is more than just finding an act, signing an act, then closing my eyes and hoping for the best. The tentacles of the people in my area extend to other areas. We follow through at video, publicity, marketing, sales. We communicate our vision to each of the other departments. We're trying to bring an independent mentality to a corporate environment, one that's neither too monolithic nor unwieldy for people to make a decision on. Alain's a firm believer in allowing creative people to be creative without getting them so bogged down in the system and its budgets. Let's face it. We're a very easy target right now, but we'll be back. It's like the Dallas Cowboys. Jimmy Johnson has


been a winner everywhere he's gone; it'll take awhile, but he'll turn it around. We just lost the focus here. I don't know whose fault it was, but the combined forces of senior management, including me, are taking the bull by the horns. This label has a tremendous product flow from the European company of great quality stuff. Our visibility in the black street area has also grown dramatically. I just want to be the coach and the cheerleader here. to take projects this department passionately believes in and bring them home. Oh, by the way, Ed, how do we get our Laker tickets? Make this a two-part feature.



"Halleluiah" Happy (Elektra): From the city that gave us Joy Division, New Order and A Certain Ratio, there's Happy Mondays, Manchester, England's latest entry in the PoMo shuffle, who also embody their predecessors' strong sense of individualism. Taut-playing just this side of brittle marks a basic rock attack that's more rhythmic than is

apparent. Beyond that, there's plenty of off-kilter harmonies to set the title track apart, while the entire LP revolves around the notion of mainstream music without calculation.

Poi Dog Pondering, "Wishing Like A Mountain and Thinking Like The Sea" (Columbia/Texas Hotel): Austin's quirky 8-piece Poi Dog Pondering combines fiddle, steel guitar, trumpet and whatever comes to mind for a blend as tropical as it is Celtic. If you want to defy categorization, this is it, whether




you're listening to the salsa-inflected "Watermelon Song' with its syncopation, brass embellishments and electric guitar plummage or the decidedly funky "U Li La Lu" with its swelling bass line, harmony-steeped chorus and overall festive feel.



"Social Distortion" (Epic): The frenetic punkers who raged out of L.A.'s turbulent underground scene in the late '70s prove they're still *the* band to slam dance to with "Social Distortion." "Let It Be Me" is low-impact thrash, buoyed by backing vocals and guitars that sound like they were strung with rusty barbed wire, then run though vacuum hoses. Mike Ness still

sounds like the kind of guy they shouldn't have let out of the hospital without his medication - proving it's a good thing when singers push to the edge of frenzy.

Trilobites, "Savage Mood Swing' (rooArt/PolyGram): "Ladies and gentlemen, the Trilobites ... " intones a flat voice on the front of "Savage Mood Swing," a fitting introduction for an Australian band that invokes the legendary MC5 and The Stooges. Slow, heavy chords, chiming guitar notes, an SAVACE MOOD S



almost pop undercurrent and a vision that's skewed to say the least ("The day was a pig, so I decided to cut loose ... " for instance) mark the 5-man band that's a Post Modern mandate. "Minibar of Oblivion" and "Fuck=Love" seem the obvious entry points, but watch for "Girl From Mossad" to follow.

The irony in attending such a popular and populated confab as last week's Annual South By Southwest conference in Austin is the fact that there are infinitely more "important" bands and showcases than anyone, save Billboard's Chris Morris, could ever hope to see. On every one of the conference's five nights, no less than 20 venues were offering an average of six bands apiece. The hordes of A&R types from every label who converged on the city were alternately gushing over such up and com-

them "one of America's best live acts" - we must have caught them on a bad night. It's even more ironic that after seeing the numerous "post modern," "alternative," "college radio," "new music," "important" bands, these future A&R legends tipped me to, it was Antone's, for the past 15 years a Texas home away from home for countless legions of blues legends and hopefuls, that provided the clearest glimpse of the future. On Saturday night, Clifford Antone pulled together his top-of-the-line house band (Derek O'Brien, Sarah Brown and George Rains), overpacked the place to the rafters with a sweltering, enthusiastic crowd and rolled out some of the hottest young talent this side of the Mississippi - better make it that side of the Mississippi, too. Toni Price is an Austin-via-Nashville singer with a Maria McKee meets Patsy Cline meets Lou Ann Barton voice and style. If the majors in Nashville really are as progressive as they say, somebody ought to check out Ms. Price - quick! As great as Price was, no one was expecting the power of a petite, 21-year-old red-head from Canada named Sue Foley, who strapped on her guitar, walked to the front of the stage and proceeded to blow the walls out with torrid, no-nonsense guitar work that would make everyone from Buddy Guy to Stevie Ray Vaughan proud (she was later joined on stage by Stevie's Double Trouble bass player, Tommy Shannon). She's a superstar-in-the-making. Foley was joined for the encore by another 21-year-old guitar hero, Doyle Bramhall, who had rocked an A&R packed Continental Club the night before with the Bramhalls, an impromptu band featuring his father, Doyle Sr. on drums and legendary Austin guitarist Denny Freeman. While Bramhall isn't the ready-to-go package that Foley is, his talent is raw and overwhelming. No hype, folks, these kids are

the goods.



Wherehouse CEO Scott Young was joined by a sizable entourage that included Bruce Jesse, Ron Simms, Jim Dobbe, Chuck Lee, Bob Bell, Violet Brown and Rueben Meisel; Barry Borden and Jay Rosenberg accepted for The Wiz. Rosenberg later explained that winning the NARM award was only his second biggest thrill of the night -- "The first was Donnie lenner telling me he liked my new haircut." Title Wave President Lew Kennedy brought up VP Ted Singer for a well-deserved bow Presentation and performance highlights included Mariah Carey's duet with Michael Bolton, Harry Connick Jr.'s set with his 30-piece orchestra and guest soloist Branford Marsalis, the mini-set by I.R.S. duo Kenney-Rose introduced by Sting, Rodney Crowell's ripit-up performance. Lyle Lovett & His Large Band at the Awards Banquet, and of course Bonnie Raitt's appearance at the CEMA presentation, which brought the crowd to its feet for

two thunderous ovations Product-wise, Island drew cheers for its \$9.99 New Artist CD Series price starting with Kimm Rogers: CMV and BMG unveiled music video releases at \$9.99; PolyGram announced plans for release of the Phil Spector box through ABKCO; Penn & Teller uncovered a suspicious A&R trend during the A&M spotlight, noting that three acts in a row hailed from Scotland: and Martha Quinn had a great name for a retail chain of the nineties - Sexy CDs.... Suite-wise, Rhino ruled with its "The 70s Are Back" motif and table hockey game, while CEMA's suite was the most consistently packed. CBS lost a few friends by temporarily barring entry Sunday night, while much grumbling was also heard about WEA's suite being in a different hotel (the Marriott).... Retail is ecstatic about explosive new releases from Sinead O'Connor (Chrysalis), Depeche Mode (shipping gold on Sire/-Reprise) and Bell Biv & Devoe (MCA). The Wiz's Jay Rosenberg points out that "There's been a buzz on the streets of New York for the last six weeks on BBD." Raves **Record Bar's Ron Phillips** about the reaction to O'Connor's "I Do Not Want What I Haven't Got": "I haven't seen anything like this in at least a year. We've got it as part of our developing artist program going out, even though this isn't her first record." At Transworld, Dave Roy said "Personal Jesus," Depeche Mode's latest, "is the most requested single in the last 60 days, and for the last 30 days 'Violator' has been the most requested album. But the Sinead is starting to look even bigger. I've already had calls from six of our district managers doubling or tripling

their allocations."




