





Nation Goes Nuts Over "Nasty"

BANNED-WAGON!!

Gotta Have Faith!!!



FAITH NO MORE — Massive MTV exposure, sales and requests. Sounds like a smash to us.

MTV's Biz Bashes

Where else could an industry weasel vote for their favorite video while watching **Abbey Konowitch** gnaw at the gristle in his pastrami sandwich?

The answer lies in the MTV Video Music Awards Voting Academy Screening Parties, to be co-hosted by HITS at the Hollywood China Club on Thursday, July 12 (6-9 p.m.), and by Billboard at the New York China Club on Tuesday, July 17 (6-9 pm.).

We're trying to weasel invites to the *Billboard* bash.

The "voting academy" is a

specially selected cross-section of the music biz (people who've bought Abbey lunch) who will view the video finalists (announced on July 10) and choose the winners, who will ultimately be announced at the Universal Amphitheatre September 6.

It's a chance for serious industry professionals to congregate and view some major artistic achievements. (Translation: Come and suck down some free booze and food that'll be charged to Abbey's expense account.)

Getting your record banned is turning out to be the year's most surefire marketing move, as 2 Live Crew's "As Nasty As They Wanna Be," which was essentially over until Jack Thompson came along, surges back to #31 bullet. Now, let's wait for the fireworks when 2 Live's follow-up, "Banned In The USA," comes out on the 4th of July.

OK, we all know that "As Nasty As They Wanna Be" has been banned in three Florida counties and San Antonio, Tex. But ban-o-mania is starting to spread like wildfire, as Dallas, Columbia, S.C., and Prince William County, Va., just say no to "Nasty" — and there will undoubtedly be more on the banned-wagon by the time you read this (Ed note: Assuming anyone's reading this).

Amid all this insanity, an encouraging note was struck on Monday (6/18), when Sacramento, Calif., DA Steve White declared the 2 Live Crew album to be not obscene. White did, however, describe the LP as "extraordinarily crude and offensive." Fair enough, Steve. Earlier, the San Antonio police department, looking at a prior restraint charge, had been forced to amend its total ban to one covering sales to minors only.

And while local authorities around the country were preparing to decide what citizens could and could not listen to in the privacy of their homes, the nation's retailers were freaking out — some because they feared arrest, others because they were missing out on potential mega-sales from the newly red-hot album.

Musicvision's Scott Freeman reports that sales on "Nasty" in the chain's St. Louis stores are up 200%, with the LP shooting to #1.

In Phoenix, Hastings' Metro Parkway store verifies that HQ in Amarillo last week issued orders to pull the uncensored version. On the other side of the coin (pun intended), Rockaway Mesa has sold out and is jamming to get more.

Raspberry Records in Salt Lake City claims the "Nasty" album is selling an average of eight pieces daily since the publicity began, big numbers for the store. The local distributor refuses to carry the album, but Raspberry gets stock from "other sources."

A spokesman for **Record Exchange** in St. Petersburg, Fla., reveals that the store is "still selling it; no one is touching us. But I'm not selling it to minors. In Tampa, where they're not supposed *Continued on page 19*

Rick "You Can Call Me Captain" Bleiweiss has been named Senior Vice President, Sales and Distribution, at Arista Records. The announcement was made by Bill "Fries And A" Berger, Executive Vice President for the label.

Rick moves to Arista after two years as VP, Sales, at Island Records. He's also spent time at Great American Music Machine, PolyGram, Pickwick International and Pleasure Records, where he recorded his #1 disco hit, "Mutiny On the Boogie." He also produced Bobby Rydell, Steve Allen and Kool & the Gang. Rick's a lot cooler than he looks. Really.

Announcing the appointment, Berger said, "As a highly respected industry leader, Rick has been an integral part of many successful artist campaigns over the years. After we get him a few hair extensions and some bicycle shorts, I'm confident he'll make the perfect third partner for Milli Vanilli."

Bleiweiss responsed, "I've always admired and had great respect for Clive Davis, one of the industry's most influential and creative leaders. Of course, that's the same quote I gave Billboard. 

Great Promotion Jobs

FIRST THE TEST: Everyone seems to be wondering about the performance of promodepartments. Who's doing great? Who picks the right records? Who can close? And the ultimate question — what have been the best promotion jobs during the first half of 1990? The answers aren't as simple as you think, and we need to set parameters in order to draw the proper conclusions.

Many consider the best promo staffs to be those that drive proven non-hit records the farthest, but we dismiss that category as "promotion masturbation." Let's concentrate instead on successful exploitation of hit product the act of choosing the right records that will not only "sell product" but advance an artist's career.

As we see it, there are three stages in the promo process: test, identify and maximize. Records can be tested in many ways. Most obvious is to break it in a non-Top 40 radio format, where audience and consumer response can easily be evaluated. Does it sell? Does it pull phones? Does it do well in callouts? And, does it compare favorably to competitive product? This can also be achieved through non-radio outlets - MTV, VH-1, clubs, touring and press. Again, tangible results can be evaluated. Finally, and most difficult, is testing and evaluating a straight Top 40 record. This can be accomplished by finding a few markets to play and testmarket before attempting a blitz, or by pre-promoting a record and relying on "ear" response.


IDENTIFY & MAXIMIZE: The key to success then follows as a promo staff must tion on a great record.

evaluate the test to identify the "real hits" and begin the process of maximizing the record's potential. Atlantic constantly test-markets product, checks with early stores and identifies hit potential. Two of the year's finest promo jobs were turned in on En Vogue's current crossover hit and on Alannah Myles' breakthrough smash. WB used the small-market test-and-evaluation strategy on Jane Child's debut smash. a small-market winner that went all the way. Chrysalis used the Post Modern-tovideo-to-Top 40 strategy on Sinead O'Connor's smash, while Capitol felt the pulse of the street on M.C. Hammer. Reprise is using video, press and patience to break Faith No More, while Epic exploited Urban to break Luther Vandross and Calloway.

However, two of the year's most difficult and successful performances — Columbia's Mariah Carey and SBK's Wilson Phillips — revolved around the "ear" pre-promotion strategy, combined with a few early tests. While this is the most difficult path, it's the only way to break this type of sound. Both labels' time and undaunted belief brought these newcomers to the top.



to sell it, the major distributor [Jerry Bassin Dist.] is sending it out everywhere — why aren't they being arrested?"

The manager of an alternative store in Tampa tells us, "I'm the only one in the area stocking this album, and I am scared! I've been calling around trying to find out what I should do, but no one will tell me. I realize someone has to stand up to this harassment, but I don't think I'm the one to do it. It's our #1 seller, but I don't think it will be next week — I'm gonna send it back."

As the situation becomes more frightening, some members of the music industry are beginning to speak up. A key point — one that both sides should consider —

was made by industry activist **Danny Goldberg** in his *L.A. Times* editorial, Sunday (6/17).

"At a time when American productivity is reduced. American music is one of our few products that inspire and, not insignificantly, sell to the rest of the world," Goldberg pointed out. "Our long tradition of freedom of expression is precisely the reason why entertainment has our flourished.... It is not possible to have the vitality of Michael Jackson or Paul Simon or Willie Nelson or Bruce Springsteen in a society that imprisons 2 Live Crew. Creativity just doesn't work that way. Neither does America."




BACH TO

THE FUTURE

A year ago in February, Russ Bach left his longtime WEA VP position to take over the reins as CEMA's President. Less than 16 months later, the four top singles on the charts are CEMA product, with the brand-new SBK act Wilson Phillips in the #1 slot. Bach has a master's degree in music from Chicago's DePaul University and was set to pursue a Ph.D. from Peabody in 1960, but didn't receive a much-needed teaching assistantship. Northwestern rejected him because he didn't have two years of fulltime teaching experience, so he went to work for an independent record distributor in 1960, earning \$65 a week. "It was one of those freak kind of things," he says. "Thank God that Northwestern said I needed two years of experience or I'd be off at the University of Michigan leading a marching band now or something like that." HITS' Bill Holdship, who actually attended rival Michigan State, thought Russ was a swell guy anyway, then he blew his cover by calling him Johann Sebastian.

CEMA has just experienced the most successful three months in the company's history.

We've been on a tremendously hot run since February, as evidenced by the amount of #1 records we've had. But it's not just the #1's. It's what we've done with a lot of different types of music. It's M.C. Hammer breaking through and becoming a #1 record on both the pop and black charts. That's something which hasn't been done in a long time. Bonnie Raitt is an incredible story. I was with WEA



for 15 years, and we had all those Bonnie Raitt records. Everybody over there loved her, but we couldn't get a hit record.

We've essentially turned Bonnie into a new artist. We took someone whose career was basically finished in many people's eyes, and reestablished her. We

also

had

the for-

tune of having a Sinéad O'Connor come out of the box and just explode for us. The key to a good distribution company with someone like her is to just keep up with the demand. It's generally important to help build the demand, but with someone like her, it's already there. And we've broken Slaughter. There was an article in HITS which pointed out that Slaughter is really the only metal rock band to have broken so far this year. We also had the soundtracks to "Teenage Mutant Ninja Turtles" and "Pretty Woman." Until the Roxette track came along, we didn't even really have a hit from "Pretty Woman," and we're already over a million units on it. We broke Wilson Phillips on their first single. That album is now

750,000 — not bad for new artists with only one hit. So there have been a lot of different success stories out there in a lot of genres of music. Having the top four singles on the charts is phenomenal for a company our size. WEA did it last in December of '88, but WEA is twice as big as CEMA.

To what specifically do you attribute this phenomenal success?

We've reorganized the company since the time I arrived 16 months ago. I reorganized the street extensively, as well as the home office and branches. Someone asked me the other day, "How are you handling all of this, and how are you keeping it straight?" I told him that. first of all, it's not me, it's the organization. All I do is help direct the organization toward our goals. It's the people on the streets that reach those goals. And by having a good organization within each one of the branches, they're able to separate out and handle the different genres of music and work all of them at one time. That's the key to our success. When I first got here, we had district managers, who might have had 25 people reporting directly to them. I put in a system of sales managers and senior field marketing reps so the various field marketing reps could report to the right person. We placed an administrative assistant in each branch. We also hired

branch marketing reps, who work specifically on new and breaking projects. They worked on Slaughter and Wilson Phillips when those first came out, and now they're on to the London Quireboys and projects like that. We also have singles specialists. Singles have a life span of about two weeks, so you have to maximize that time. You can't wait

in every project that comes out. In the old days, a CEO or a president would sit up on the executive floor, dictating down what was going to happen. This new structure allows Hale Milgrim to move Capitol away from just a radio orientation into the breaking of artists through in-store play and things like that. We've done this by making the

for reps to make their next sales call — you must have someone working specifically on singles. We now have urban specialists, too. And we did all this while marrying ourselves to our various labels — so the regional people and the promotion people are all housed together in the various branches. In this way, we can represent our various labels in the way they want to be represented. EMI has different goals and aspirations than, say, Enigma Records. Our job is to reflect them on the street in the manner that they want to be reflected. This is what the reorganization has created; otherwise, there is no way that CEMA could have carried the load. We changed this company from a vertical structure to a horizontal one. In a horizontal structure, you work with your companies, not for them. We are partners with our companies

branch offices the focal point of our organization. The branch manager is an independent entity who really runs his marketing territory. And that's been a huge strength because there's really nobody here in the central office who can understand a territory the way a branch does. The people on the street are the real key to our organization. How has the influx of all these new labels affected CEMA and the industry in general?

There are probably more new companies right now than there have been at any one time in the industry's history. Obviously, some of these companies will be successful, while others will not be around a few years from now. CEMA has what is basically a new company in SBK, and we've been very successful with it in a relatively short period of time, so it can be done. One of the immediate negatives with

all these new labels is that they'll go out and raise the price of talent higher than it should be. Some people are going to be sucked into overpaying, and then not have success, and that may contribute to their demise. I believe you're far better off in many cases taking the shots on unknown artists with an intuitive gut feel - believing in your signings, and taking a long time to develop those acts. I'm not sure that these new companies will be able to afford that kind of staying power. So that's a danger point for them. But our labels will surely be out there bidding for talent, too. We're a profitoriented company, and, hopefully, we won't make any irrational decisions regarding talent. How is the continuing con-

solidation at the retail level af-

fecting CEMA? It has both good and bad sides to it. It's harder for new retailers to start up. On the other hand, the sophistication of some of these larger retail rackjobbing companies is something none of us would have believed 10 years ago. I really enjoy working with that sophistication, and getting answers on Monday morning about what happened over the weekend across the counter. So that's very positive. The danger is, with a smaller amount of retailers, there won't be new expansion or new ideas. And you need new people out there looking at things from a different view. The danger when all the companies get too big is that they really can't help with the breaking of local acts. And if we don't break new records, we don't have new product. The larger rack retailers can be a negative in that respect. We need those chains to be attentive to product so we can take it and spread it to other areas. It's harder to do that today than it was in the past, when you had a group of independent retailers in Cleveland, in Atlanta, and so forth. In the same way, we as record companies have to do a better job in marketing and really tuning into our customers. How is your relationship with Hale Milgrim? Both of you are

relatively new to your respective posts.

I hate the guy. It's one of those things. I hate guys with beards. You have a beard, so naturally I hate you also. No. We go back to the days when I was the branch manager for WEA in Los Angeles, and Hale was a merchandiser in our San Francisco sales office. It's a long-term relationship, and we both respect each other's abilities. We've loved working together, and it's areat being on board with him. I respect him greatly, especially for his wonderful musical knowledge. This isn't a record company president who's an attorney or a business affairs person, but a music person. I think that's undoubtedly where the best presidents are going to come from in the future. It seems he's trying to move Capitol away from being a back catalog company to a vital force in today's music industry. Absolutely. The catalog at Capitol Records is very strong, and, of course, that can take any company through rough times. Hale has developed some hit product - Bonnie, M.C. Hammer and Heart — but they're also working London Quireboys and acts like that. In fact, I just had a meeting with our national branch marketing person, and he said our problem is we have so much strong music right now, he doesn't know which acts to work first. That's great news for us. And that's not just from Capitol, but from all of our companies. Take Chrysalis, with the new World Party album. It's a wonderful record, and it deserves to be worked. With Capitol, Hale is committed to developing groups and acts from the ground up. It doesn't matter if they get a lot of airplay coming out of the box. If he has a commitment to the artist, he's going to find a way to work and develop it. What is CEMA's stance on record stickering, and how do you remain sensitive to the artists, the retailers and the public

all at the same time?

As a distribution company, we

have to pay attention to our cus-

tomers. That's my job. We don't sign groups or artists to CEMA. They are signed to the labels, and we are the go-between for the label/artist and the customer on the streets. So we have to be sensitive to both groups. We have to listen when our customers tell us they're having a major problem in, say, Pennsylvania. I also understand that we do not want to inhibit our artists in their creativity. And yet, somebody has to be responsible and realize that middle America wants a sticker on certain, what I would call "obscene" records. What I've done is say to the labels, "Hey, have somebody there who's a responsible person listen to the lyrics, and if they think they're obscene, then we request you indicate that so we can alert our customers." Then our customers won't be getting beat upon by the local politicians — the people who want to become the next mayor or whatever and may use this as an issue. It's also a matter of

taking on more smaller labels like Rhino and Enigma? You'd have to look towards what Jim Fifield has been trying to do with EMI Worldwide. Jim has made the statement that he wants EMI to be the number one publishing company and the number three record company. Those are our immediate goals. And I think he has shown —

Do you see CEMA expanding

even further in the near future,

through the birth of SBK, through the purchase of 50% of Chrysalis and Enigma, through the rejuvenation of Capitol Nashville — that he is really putting his money where his mouth is, and truly expanding us. Before I took the job here, I had a meeting with Joe Smith and Jim Fifield, and both of them have a vision which we're presently acting out. We're attempting to develop a distribution company that's a triangle between the label, the customer and CEMA. It's just a lot of interraction that makes it work, and

being sensitive to the feelings of America at this time. But we're not talking about censoring ideas here. If there's something clearly obscene in the lyrics, then I think that a sticker warning probably should be there. we're trying to do it in a humane way, treating everybody the way we'd like to be treated. It seems to be working for us. Through the grace of God, I guess. Or maybe it has to do with some talented people in the field.




VHEELS & DEALS

Devine's hipness quotient should further increase through his inking of Ruthless act CPO, fronted by Small Nation (so named because he's the size of one) and produced by N.W.A.'s MC Ren. As Devine knows, there hasn't been a Ruthless act yet that hasn't at least flirted with platinum. Don't spend it all in one place, Tim.... Jon Sutherland is the latest Metal Blade staffer to make a power move, joining Lisa Johnson as a talent scout for Zomba Music.... ASCAP's Tom De Savla has put together a batch of mostly pre-buzz acts for next Tuesday's Best Kept Secrets showcase at L.A.'s Coconut Teaszer: Too Many Joes from Orange County, stylish writer/singer Patrik Tanner, This Is Our Daughter (already signed by Kaz to Virgin Music) and powerpopsters the Tearaways, who have a Tony Berg-produced demo. Those acts join the returning Spencer the Gardener.... Former Blondie bassist and Capitol A&R staffer Nigel Harrison has been doing some dates with Geffen's the Brothers Flgaro and talking to some labels.... Zoo Records honcho Lou Maglia has hired CMJ editor Scott Byron as his East Coast ears.... And ex-Circus editor Ben Liemer is on the hunt for a N.Y. A&R gig.

This 24-year-old multifaceted prodigy has the Minneapolis pedigree — he was bassist for the Time at 17 and the lead singer for the Family at 19. His label debut is a potent slice of funk-rock, featuring state-of-the-art guitar-driven r&r, interspersed with soaring ballads and uptempo dance numbers. The talented young veteran is part of Allen Kovac and Jeff Sydney's Left Bank stable, so you know he'll get a lot of loving care.

Suggested Cuts

The first single, "Stranger To Love," is a radio-ready anthem, while the romantic, slower-tempo "Every Heart Needs A Home" has already been featured on the "Teenage soundtrack to Mutant Ninja Turtles."

Label Comments:

"Now, this is more like it," says guest analyst Jack "The Throwin' Samoan" Thompson. "Not one reference to bodily functions, sex acts, illegal drugs, pedophilia, toesucking or sadomasochism. Over the past few years, Top 40 radio has been dominated by the sound of urban-oriented dance music. While pundits have predicted its demise and the rise of (pick one) — metal, folk, Post Modern, rap, New Age, etc. — the sound of today's airwaves continues to be dominated by what might be called disco, if that weren't such a dirty word. Anyway, we sent our radio geeks out in hopes of finding out if this situation will change at any point in the near-future — or whether we should just shuddup and dance, as Paula Abdul puts it. We asked several well-known MDs and PDs if they felt there was too much of this type of music on Top 40; here are the results of those inquiries — three "You owe me 20 bucks, Murph," six "No, Todd, this is not the 976-BONDAGE line," and five "Who's Danny Ostrow?"

It's an unending cycle."

I know that some of the more mainstream and rock-leaning stations that I work with on a consulting basis are having a tough time maintaining a unique mass appeal presentation because there is so much great dance product. As far as change goes, it always swings in cycles. By the end of the year, Def Leppard and Poison will both have albums out, so you never know what will happen when there are major rock acts with new product. I'm sure there will be a bit of balancing going on."

PD, B97, New Orleans, La.:
"Dance and dance/rap product is getting absolutely unbearable. At certain times we sound like an urban or rap station rather than a Top 40. I'm scared that, when the product turns around and becomes more mass appeal, we'll be caught up in the stigma of being a dance/rap station. As far as change goes, I don't think that dance/rap songs will always be this hot. I can see a change to more mass appeal, quality-type records by the end of the summer."



Kevin Weatherly

PD, Q106, San Diego, Calif.: "Anytime you take something to an extreme, it becomes dangerous. You have to have an idea as a programmer what you think your station should sound like and not subject yourself just to the current product that's out there. If there happens to be a lot of dance product, you have to be able to balance it with other things in your library so that your sound is consistent and not dance-heavy. As far as dance music going away. it's never going to. This is the music that's hot right now. Look back over the past year and you have acts like Salt N' Pepa that never charted and yet they sold over a million singles. Same thing with Digital Underground. The scary thing is that some people take these things to the extreme and are playing Digital Underground at 10 in the morning, which I think is dangerous for the format. I think it's encouraging that acts like the Cure, Depeche Mode and the B-52's have broken through with hits at Top 40. This music is very compatible with dance product."



PD, WXKS, Boston, Mass.:

"Considering that we started this as a dance station in '79 and there were years that we certainly made

it more mass appeal, but right now there's just too much dance music. I've heard PDs actually tell record guys, 'We don't play any more white rock on this radio station.' And that's come from several national programmers. There are some good rockers out there who are afraid to make a record because they know what's happening in the industry right now. I think the trend probably has happened because we've got a lot of

young MDs in the business and a lot of PDs who are too lazy to listen to records. The PDs are also too young and they let the MDs do all the music. They're too young to know the heritage of this music. Believe me, I'm pissed off with what's happening right now."

MD, KOY-FM, Phoenix, Ariz.: "At the moment, that's the kind of music which is working and crossing. There is just a great deal of good dance and R&B crossover music out right now. But music is a cyclical thing. Last summer, rock & roll was really big and happening, but it always changes. I do think it will move back to rock, especially because there haven't been any huge new acts breaking recently. We're due for the big names - Bon Jovi, Cinderella, Def Leppard, Poison, etc. - and when those come out, you'll probably see it shift back again."

At least one major chain in the Midwest, which wishes to remain anonymous, reports that sales of the nasty version of 2 Live Crew have doubled "at least," and predicts that the chain will benefit greatly from being one of the few retailers in the region to carry the hot-sell-
