ACM Extends Home Depot Affiliation

The Academy of Country Music has agreed to continue its relationship with Home Depot for three more years. Additionally, the company will once again sponsor the Home Depot Humanitarian Award, which was presented for the first time last year. This year's show host, **Reba McEntire**, was the first recipient. The award was created to recognize the efforts of country artists or groups who serve others and are dedicated to building the dreams of those in need. A nominee solicitation letter has gone out to artists throughout the country community, and three nominees will be announced March 4. Fans will then vote for the winner through the Home Depot website:

Fans will be able to vote during the first two hours of the live ACM Awards Show on May 21, and the winner will be announced in the last hour of the CBS-TV telecast.

R&R/Bulleys: 'Internet Holiday Buying: How Many, How Much?'

Country listeners, similar to other parts of the population, are avoiding the malls more often and are turning to the Internet for holiday shopping. According to Bullseye Research's sample of 175 country listeners, a total of 21% made gift purchases via the Internet during the 2002 holiday shopping season. The good news for mall shopping, however, is that the majority of this sample's purchases are still made in stores. Only 6% of the total sample spent over \$150 online, 3% spent \$101-\$150, and 9% spent between \$51 and \$100.

Those percentages remain fairly steady among P1s, P2s, men and women, and age demographics. For complete breakouts — including men and women 25-34, 35-44 and 45-54 — check out the Bullseye Callout Research page in the Jan. 24 issue of **R&R**.

By the way, the Callout page also contains **R&R/Bulleys** Callout research for the Top 35 titles on the **R&R** Country chart. You'll see percentages for "Like a Lot," "Total Positives," "Neutral," "Familiarity," "Dislike," and "Burn" based on a 400 person-per-week sample. Plus, there's a new password allowing you to access regional and demo breakouts of the callout music research at Bullseye's web page, bullsi.com. A reminder: When you go to the website, use your station call letters as the user name. Then enter the new password.

↪ Could a new **Reba McEntire** album be coming this year? The star announced backstage during last week's American Music Awards that she's already co-written three songs with legendary songwriters Carole King and Gary Burr. Tentative plans are for Reba to start recording the project this summer. In the meantime, you can hear more from Reba in the February issue of *Glamour*, on newsstands now. She's featured in the "Five Things You Don't Know About Me" section.

↪ Get-well wishes to Trick Pony lead singer **Heidi Newfield**, who is undergoing vocal-cord surgery later this month at the Vanderbilt Voice Clinic in Nashville. Newfield chalks her problems up to "years of singing multiple sets every night and singing over inadequate sound systems." To accommodate her recovery, the group's planned concert dates are being rescheduled but not cancelled.

↪ As if to prove how common voice ailments are, **Keith Urban** dropped out of a performance on *Good Morning America* at the last moment on Jan. 14, citing vocal-cord problems. His doctor recommended full voice rest for a week, forcing Urban to also cancel appearances on *The Caroline Rhea Show* and the taping of an AOL Session.

↪ **Trace Adkins** spent part of the holiday season going through a 28-day inpatient alcohol rehab program. Adkins says, "This is something I needed to do for myself, my family and my career. I feel the best I've felt in years — both physically and mentally." Adkins had a well-publicized DUI arrest last year.

↪ **Toby Keith** was the No. 1 ticket seller for country concerts in 2002, according to *Pollstar*. Keith ranked No. 7 for all genres of music, placing behind Dave Matthews Band, Cher, Neil Diamond, Creed, Paul McCartney and Aerosmith.

↪ **Tim McGraw** and **Faith Hill** have both been added to the list of performers for the CMT Flameworthy 2003 Video Music Awards, set for April 7. Tickets for the show are available through Ticketmaster and CMT.com.

↪ **Tim** and McGraw join already announced performers Kenny Chesney and Shania Twain, who is in for a busy week that week. The night before this award show, Twain is slated to host the 2003 JUNO Awards telecast from Ottawa. In addition to hosting, Twain will also perform at Canada's version of the Grammys.

↪ Anybody care to give McGraw a good talking to? Now is your chance. He's featured as the MSN January Artist of the Month, and he'll host an exclusive online chat tonight at 8pm ET. That link is chat.msn.com/live. Additionally, McGraw will take part in the TNT All-Star Celebrity Game, which will be held Feb. 7 in Atlanta. McGraw will play on a team with Nelly, Ice Cube and Mark McGrath. They will be coached by Charles Barkley.

↪ On a *CNN People In The News* segment appearing last weekend, McGraw admits that he is a self-taught musician who learned to play guitar by watching CMT and reruns of *Hee Haw*. McGraw also says he relies on picking great material because "I just don't like anything that I write. I think I'm pretty bad at it actually."

↪ McGraw will next be seen on a commercial during the Super Bowl on Sunday, and several other country stars will be featured on Super Bowl spots as well. Hank Williams Jr. and Kid Rock have recorded "Are You Ready For The Superbowl" and both will be featured prior to game time. Willie Nelson, as we reported last week, will tell people how to avoid problems with the IRS in an H&R Block commercial.

↪ **Kellie Coffey** has been added as the opening act for the spring leg of labelmate Kenny Chesney's Margaritas and Senoritas tour. Coffey just finished shooting her latest video for "Whatever It Takes" in Canada, and she says the 12-degrees-below-zero weather didn't stop the production from moving forward at an outside location. Wearing her "glamour boots," Coffey says her feet became so cold that she would "run inside and iron the bottom of my feet" between takes.


