

Manfred Mann To Mercury

CHICAGO—In a negotiation instituted by Irving B. Green, President of Mercury Record Corporation, and concluded in conjunction with Les Gould, head of Philips Records in England, Manfred Mann, the much sought-after British rock group, signed last week with the Mercury label for U.S. distribution and with Philips outside the U.S.

The contractual discussions began between Green and Jerry Bron, London representative for Mann, when Bron was in New York during May. Green continued the negotiations two weeks later in London, where Gould joined the talks.

The first Mercury record release by Manfred Mann will be in July. Alan Mink, Product Manager for Mercury, is already conferring with Paddy Fleming of Philips of England concerning a U.S. visit by the Mann group to coincide with the release of the record.

Manfred Mann's recording of "Pretty Flamingo" was number one in England a few weeks ago. The British rock group had two previous international hits, "Do Wah Diddy" and "Sha-La-La."

Handleman 3-for-2 Stock Split

DETROIT - The board of directors of Handleman Company (AMEX) have voted a three-for-two stock split on the 1,002,960 shares of common stock and Class B common stock outstanding, subject to stockholder approval at the company's annual meeting to be held in Detroit on Aug. 1, 1966. After the split, there will be 1.504.440 shares of common stock and Class B common stock outstanding. The proposed three-for-two stock split is payable August 19, 1966 to stockholders of record August 2, 1966.

This is the first stock split for the company since its shares were initially offered to the public in 1963. Based on a three-for-two stock split 1,053,-108 shares of common stock will be eligible to receive dividends instead of 702,072 shares as previously.

It is the intention of the board of directors, at their next quarterly dividend meeting to be held on Sept. 7, 1966, to declare a quarterly dividend of \$.20 per share on the new shares then outstanding following the split.

Colgems Label Formed by RCA, Columbia Pics & Screen Gems

A Victor 'First'

Columbia Pictures Corp., Screen Gems, Inc., and the RCA Victor Record Division have announced establishment of a new record label, Colgems.

Columbia-Screen Gems will create and develop and RCA Victor during the term of the agreement will manufacture and market the new label's product. This is the first time RCA Victor has entered into such an arrangement with another company to establish a new label.

Announcement was made jointly by A. Schneider, President of Columbia Pictures; Jerome S. Hyams, Executive Vice-President and General Manager of Screen Gems, and George R. Marek, Vice President and General Manager, the RCA Victor Record Division.

At the same time, it was announced that Don Kirshner, head of the Columbia Pictures-Screen Gems Television Music Division, will serve as Creative Director for the new label.

Speaking for Columbia and Screen Gems, Schneider said: "The wide range of fine talent available to the Colgems label and the vast marketing and distributing facilities provided by RCA Victor assures that Colgems will emerge as an important new force in the recording industry."

Kirshner, who in the past three years has catapulted the Columbia-Screen Gems music division into one of the top publishers in the field, in outlining the immediate and longrange plans for Colgems, said: "We expect to draw from every area of music for the product of this label-television, motion pictures and Broadway—as well as the contemporary sounds which constitute so much of today's record market. It will be our purpose to see that Colgems will acquire and develop talent and product that will give it immediate and continued acceptance in the record market place.'

Marek, on behalf of RCA Victor, said: "This new label will be a significant addition to the product offered by RCA Victor and will broaden the market base for our distributors in the United States and throughout the world, particularly in the teen area. Don Kirshner is a dynamic creative talent with a splendid record of success and a reputation for inventive leadership which will assure success for the new label artistically. We intend to see that all of RCA Victor's marketing and promotional facilities are employed to assure maximum success of the label.'

A&M with Quintus For Gorshin Wax

HOLLYWOOD — A&M Records has entered into a long-term agreement with Quintus Productions, Inc., an independent production company headed by Leonard Grant, to release a minimum of two singles and one album by actor Frank Gorshin this year, according to an announcement by A&M President Jerry Moss. This is actor's first recording pact, and marks his debut as a recording star. Grant is also his personal manager.

Initial release, produced by Quintus, is "The Riddler," composed especially for Gorshin by Mel Tormé, with an arrangement by David Gates. Gates composed and arranged the ballad on the flip side, "Never Let Her Go."

Gorshin created the role of "The Riddler," most popular of all the guest villains in ABC-TV's "Batman" series, and also limns that character in the "Batman" feature recently completed by 20th Century-Fox.

Second single and album by Gorshin, still to be recorded, will

be released later this summer. A&M is giving "The Riddler," which will be released in a fourcolor sleeve, a giant national promotion, working in cooperation with ABC-TV's promo department.



The announcement of Columbia Records' first release of Eight-Track-Continuous-Loop Stereo Tape Cartridges will be made at the label's national sales convention to be held in Las Vegas, Nev. beginning July 20.

In addition to his work in this area, Novak's broadened responsibilities will embrace the marketing of all tape products, both cartridge and reel-to-reel and supporting tape accessories.

Novak will work in close association with Columbia Records field sales organization in the merchandising, promotion and advertising of all Columbia tape products and accessories.

He will also recommend sales and promotion programs and marketing and distribution policies.

The label, which'll have the same distribs as Bang (with possibly a few exceptions), has its first release on the market now-Donald Height's "The Talk of the Grapevine.'

Other label contractees as of now are Roy "C," who'll have a release within the next three weeks, and Bobby Harris. Berns will be looking to nurture other label talent as well. He also wants to look around for strong r/b masters, which he hopes to pick up "where hits are produced -Memphis, Muscle Shoals."

After 'Attitude' With New Label

With his new label, Berns wants to establish "an attitude" conducive to building r/b product and he defines the right attitude as getting behind an artist through a series of projects as opposed to "throwing out one single to see if it clicks or not."

Berns noted that albums will follow successful singles - at least at the start of things.

The r/b master plans to produce sides himself and also to encourage young r/b producers in their work.

"R and b," Berns said, "is growing and there aren't enough companies to absorb this growth. We plan to be one."

Dionne Warwick, no surprise, has another instant giant with "Trains and Boats and Planes." Scepter is swinging with hefty sales on Jackie Paine's "Go Go Train," plus "That's Enough," Roscoe Robinson. They should also have a big one nationally with the giant instrumental from NYC, "Fats Shakes 'Em Up," by Fats Lewis.

I am certain that Cosmo and Bob Robin of Dover and White Cliff Music of New Orleans will have no trouble collecting on their unbelievable "Barefootin'," because it looks like they've come up with a left-field giant. The No. 1 record with Bob Baker, WKIX-Raleigh, N.C., is their fantastic new record called "May I" by the Zodiacs on Deesu (in which they are partners with Marshall Schorn and Allan Touissant). Heavy confirmation has come in from Jack Gale, WAYS and WGIV, Charlotte, N.C., also Wilmington, N.C., and Myrtle Beach, S.C.

Shelby Singleton flashes that "The Joker Went Wild," Brian Hyland, Philips, is heavily back-ordered in New York City (via WMCA) and many other areas.

The reputation of Howard "Little Napoleon" Bednoe of All-State, Chicago, as a top promo man is known across the land. He and I discussed why "Hanky Panky," Shondells (a four-yearold Ellie Greenwich-Jeff Barry record) is now certain #1. Howie questioned a lot of kids in Chicago. They said that they have gotten tired of so many of the folk-rock tunes they have been fed all winter: "They are too complicated to dance to." It is summertime and they are not home listening, but are out at the pools and beaches, and they want good old simple rock and roll and R&B with a simple hard beat for dancing. The timing of "Hanky Panky" was perfect, and the sales figures are monstrous. A lot of brain-washed music directors just can't believe such a simple record can go so large. I have a feeling that the product coming out this summer will sound a lot like the vintage summer of 1959

The next shocker is the emergence of a recent medium R&Bhit, "Searching For My Love," Bobby Moore, Checker, as a smashing #1 giant in the home of folk-rock, L.A.; and, of course, a long list of pop stations are now discovering or re-discovering this record with big picks. The only difference between and among this R&B hit and the many others that blew past the pop stations is that this one was really played pop thanks to a great promo man in L.A., Stan Bly of California Distributors . The airplay on the Johnny Rivers version of the gut-bucket blues, "Muddy Water," is sensational, and it's a solid hit . . . The Temptations have a smash and it's king at the hops and pools.

Sam the Sham is a smash . . . Tommy McLain and Crispian St. Peters have Harold Lipsius of Jamie smiling "Solitary Neil Diamond, is breaking large . . . We kept telling you Man.³ that "Sweet Pea," Tommy Roe, was a smash. Thanks to Paul Drew, WQXI, Atlanta, Memphis, and Matty Singer of Philadelphia (who broke it in Carlisle, Pa.) for showing us all the way. Paul has sold his Southern Music Survey to Dick Reus in Sumpter, S.C.

"See You In September," Happenings, breaking in New England "Wild Thing," Troggs, is a smash, just like in England . "Happy Summer Days," Ronnie Dove, has Joe Kolsky on "Cloud 10" which is way above "9" . . . New England broke "David's Mood," Jack Eely, Bang, and now Cleveland and other markets are rolling. The sales are there and I have made Bert Berns a believer. This is a proven hit side, especially in the summer season, and will get immediate reaction. We've been mentioning this side for many, many weeks, and feel we are right about this record ... The Young Rascals and Shadows of Knight look very strong ... Paul Revere has an automatic ... The hit-picking ear of Irv Biegel feels that Atco has a smash in the CKLW, Detroit, Pick of "Spring Fever," Tony Pass . . . "United," Intruders. Gamble, is responding well to pop play and is the "Chapel of Love" of 1966 . . . "Just Walk In My Shoes," Gladys Knight, more than merits a good pop shot . . . "Hand Jive," Strangeloves, is already "King of the Beaches" . . . "Tell Her," Dean Parrish, broke fast in N.Y.C. with all stations wailing . . . Shangri-las look great . . . "All These Things," Uniques, is a good Southern hit.

Quartette Tres Bien-Very Well Indeed

When a group of jazz musicians shakes hands following a swinging set, displaying a rare feeling of love and unity as the ball teams do prior to taking the field or the court, it bears looking into.

The opportunity came this week for this columnist when the Decca recording artists, the Quartette Tres Bien, slipped quietly into New York for a record date.

It was a couple of years ago when Bill Cosby, the other half of the "I Spy" video team, pulled my coat and told me about a together group he had heard in California with the uncommon name of Quartette Tres Bien. Bill, a former drummer before embarking on a comedy career, is pretty much in with what happens musically. Therefore, we could not take his recommendation lightly.

It was a few weeks later when we heard the group on its "Kilimanjaro" album and we recalled the excitement of Bill Cosby and discovered in a matter of minutes why he was so impressed.

My introduction to the group was one of instant approval as I discovered the group was saying beautiful things in a most melodic and exciting way.

We, too, could not help but shout our praises for the group and played their album over and over on our radio show.

But it was not until this week that we had the chance to sit and hear the group in person.

More Than Ready

The Quartette Tres Bien represents a plethora of jazz groups who musically are more than ready, polished and talented but have not succeeded in breaking through to the mass music audience who buy the records and are responsible for the real bread and butter of the artists.

Upon hearing the group in person, I could not help but realize that this group is long, long, long overdue. The Quartette Tres Bien is very well indeed.

They consist of a piano, bass and drums combination with added congo drums. But the congos are fully integrated into the group as opposed to an added embellishment.

What kind of music does the group offer? It is filled with emotion, power, climaxes and melody. In Jeter Thompson, the pianist, there is a definite Ahmad Jamal influence; Richard Simmons, the bass player, is a strong walker; Albert St. James is a tasteful and most imaginative creator on percussion and Percy James, the congo player, sits behind a trio of congo drums with his set of bongos attached to his stool between his legs.

And it is Percy who is the surprise. His playing is skillful while never interfering with the drummer. This in itself is no easy task. In fact, as you look back there have been few successful attempts with the addition of the congo drums. With the QTB they have shown that the congos are not window dressing but can become an equal member in their family.

The group is out of St. Louis but what is of great concern to most jazz disk jockeys is that this is a group that must and should be heard. They are simply too good not to be among the leading jazz sellers.

Shorter Tunes?

Milt Gabler, VP of A & R at Decca, said that he felt if the group recorded tunes of shorter length (which is always the complaint attached to jazz personnel), they would receive more air play and with the exposure could become really big.

We will not argue the merits of this statement. With hundreds of jazz disk jockeys across the nation, it seems that all we need really is to tell them that this group is really together and deserves to be heard.

Two of its albums on Decca, "Kilamanjaro" and "Sky High," contain cuts of reasonable length and are ideally suited for any hip show that caters to good music lovers or the jazz-oriented buffs. From our

Much of the material has enjoyed its prime exposure through recordings on Robey's own Duke, Backbeat and Sureshot labels for pop and r. & b.






