

RKO Strike Averted

BOSTON — An eleventh hour vote by members of the American Federation of Television and Radio Artists averted a strike at the RKO radio and television stations in this city. The vote was 21 - 17 against the strike. According to Mark McKay, program director of WRKO, all radio people had voted against the strike. RKO management had personnel standing by to fly into Boston in the event of a walk out by station staff members.

Clenott Cites AOR/ Disco Similarities

CHICAGO — "I think of Disco radio as being pretty close to Album Rock formatically and mechanically," said Matthew Clenott, newly appointed program director of WDAI-FM. "Musically and culturally, they are very different, but from formatic, mechanical and conceptual standpoints, the two are similar."

Clenott admits that Disco radio will not get its audience from AOR stations, nor will the two formats share many listeners, but among similarities that they do share, Clenott cites the programming more for long listening

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Stations Change Call Letters and Format

Talk Radio Losing With Radio Programmers

LOS ANGELES — Almost a fourth of the program directors and general managers in the United States and Canada believe that talk radio is fading. This information came to light in a survey answered by more than 230 radio men especially for the Radio

Maddox: PD Has It Tougher Than GM

HOUSTON — "In many ways, the general manager's job is easier than the program director's," according to Jim Maddox, general manager of the outstandingly successful KMJQ in

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Report. Of the respondents, 50.69% felt that talk radio was holding steady, 23.5% thought it was growing on AM. Only 1.84% felt it was growing on FM. And 23.96% said it was fading. This was the highest negative against any format (only 20.87% felt that Top 40 radio, which program directors have claimed dying for years, is fading; see Radio Report — May 10, 1979).

Only 217 radio men and women answered the question on how they felt about talk radio. Two hundred and nineteen answered about news radio, and of them, 51.6% felt news radio was holding steady, 31.96% thought it was growing on AM, 2.3% growing on FM, and 15.98% thought it was fading.

Of the 219 who voiced an opinion about Beautiful Music radio, 55.7% felt it was holding steady, 21.9% thought it was growing on FM and 3.2% on AM (actually, six of the seven people who thought Beautiful Music was growing on AM also thought it was growing on FM), and 21.9% thought the format was fading.

Wendell - The Promotional Gem Behind Diamond's 'Jazz Singer'



LOS ANGELES - When Neil Diamond signed to compose and sing the soundtrack of the new EMI version of "The Jazz Singer" with Bhaskar Menon, international music chief for EMI, in Los Angeles Bruce Wendell, promotion vice president of Capitol Records, took his Neil Diamond jacket off the hook behind the door and put it on. He waved a hand at the lifesize cardboard cutout of Neil that stands behind his desk. And he began to plan the greatest r promotional campaign ever attempted in the record business.

"It's been a life dream for me to work" with Neil," Wendell said. "I'm a Neil Diamond junkie and a great friend of his. This will be one of the greatest highs of my career."

It should be noted at this point that Wendell has had many promotional successes in his career, not the least of which has been lately bringing gold and platinum-plus albums to such as Bob Seger, Bob Welch, Dr. Hook, Anne Murray, etc., etc.

The EMI movie is expected to be out before Easter. The Capitol Records soundtrack will be released prior to that. Wendell has set his goal for a number one album, several number one singles from the album, and at least one Academy Award-winning

"The Jazz Singer," of course, is a remake of the first movie talkie; it featured Al Jolson. "But Neil Diamond is the most talented, creative writer of all time and this is the perfect vehicle for him," said Wendell.

Radio Programmers Select "Sultans of Swing" The Record of the Year to Date

LOS ANGELES - Radio programmers named Dire Straits' "Sultans Of Swing" the most exciting record they had heard since January 1, in a Radio Report survey conducted last month.

In a breakout of 75 different songs named by programmers, "Sultans Of named by programmers, "Sultans Of Swing" was the overwhelming first choice. Coming in second was Donna Summer's "Hot Stuff". The Doobie Brothers' "What A Fool Believes" and Amii Stewart's "Knock On Wood" tied for third place. Frank Mills' "Music Box Denger" and Blandic's "Hoart Of Clear". Dancer" and Blondie's "Heart Of Glass" tied for fourth place. Rod Stewart's "Da Ya Think I'm Sexy" came in fifth. And five songs tied for sixth place. They were: Sister Sledge/"We Are Family", Quatro and Norman/"Stumblin' In," Supertramp/"The Logical Song," Orleans/"Love Takes Time," and Peaches & Herb/"Reunited".

Over 200 program directors and general managers responded to the survey. Country songs are not included in this breakout.

Breaking Records

It's the Nature of the Business

ATLANTA - "I'm not in the business of breaking records,' that's the position in which Frank Holler, program director of 96 Rock in Atlanta, often finds himself. "It's the nature of the business," he says, and he cites Joe Jackson and Cheap Trick as two of the artists whose records he has helped break.

96 Rock is Album Rock WKLS-FM... "We play Rock and Roll". WKLS-AM is a daytimer which simulcasts 6-10 a.m. and all day Saturday. The rest of the time, the stations are independently programmed, but the music is the same, and Holler oversees both operations.

Holler is a leader who enjoys being in the vanguard. When asked if he has been responsible for making a record company release a single off an album, he notes that UA is now coming out with a new single, "Don't Want Your Best Friend" from the Chris Rea album, "Deltics". Says Holler, "I went on it at a time when they were getting resistance from AOR stations. I thought it was a strong song, and started programming it." With 96 Rock the only station in town playing the song, sales started coming. And now,

the label is releasing a single.

Once a song crosses over to Pop, Holler will continue to play it. He admits he will probably not stay on it as long as the Pop stations, having started it earlier, but "I won't stop playing a record just because it crosses over. I'm looking for broader appeal than a snobbish Album Rock image."

His playlist this week numbered approximately 60 to 65 titles. This, he says, is normal; it usually runs anywhere from 55 to 75. Holler does music on Thursday, but he will add at other times during the week if music comes in and warrants adding. The number of adds varies. "I add what I think is good. If there is a set number, that defeats the purpose." This week, he added five pieces. Some weeks he adds as few as two or three; other weeks, as many as 10 or 12.

The promotions that Holler likes are visual — those that get the station out in front of the people. They include low-priced admission to Atlanta Braves baseball games; Rock and Roll Nights at the Disco. The Disco? Indeed, but "we play NO Disco music. One of the station jocks programs the music and it's all Rock and Roll. More and more clubs in this area are looking for things to specialize in on different nights; and this is one of them. We have been doing it for eight weeks now, and will stay with it." Other promotions include live broadcasts from the showcase clubs like the Capri and Agora Ballrooms; and specials with Molly Hatchet, Joe Jackson, Blackfoot, Peter Tosh and Robert Gordon, all of which have garnered for the station superb response. In addition, he has the usual album and ticket giveaways. And in a recent tie-in promotion with Robert Gordon, the station gave away a 1957 Rockola jukebox.

Holler got his start at WPOP in Hartford; from there he went to WLW in Cincinnati and then to WYSP in Philadelphia. The four years prior to joining WKLS, he was at WDAI in Chicago. He left shortly before the great Chicago blizzard and immediately before the then-AOR station changed format to Disco.

Holler is not a Disco fan, but he does feel that Disco has given radio, and Rock and Roll radio, a kick in the pants. It has forced radio to define itself as one type of station or an other. And this is important. "When you're battling two or three stations, you have to define what you are.'

The combined WKLS AM & FM

changed June 7 to a similar format. AM and PM Drive are simulcast; when separate, they use the same playlist.

The changes were concurrent with the appointment of John Page Otting to the position of president and general manager of the stations. Otting joined the stations on May 10. "We made the decision the day I got here. Within four working days, we had put one format into effect."

Consulting the station and overseeing the changes has been E. Alvin Davis. Otting credits Davis with expediting the change and making the transition smooth. He has been working full time with the station, and according to Otting, will probably wind up staying.

Few staff changes accompanied the format switch. The AM had a large news staff which was trimmed; other than that, 90 percent of the staff remains the same. "I plan to keep them. They are a great staff," said Otting.

Reaction to the change has, in Otting's words, been "phenomenal. I can't believe it. I would have been very satisfied if I had spent a fortune and had gotten this reaction.'

The stations are owned by Great



Houston. "The general manager, if he has good department heads, can oversee the big picture. He can go home some nights and not listen to the station. A good program director, on the other hand, should be listening 24 hours, as a matter of general practice.

In comparing the two jobs, Maddox stated: "The program director I see as a director. No matter how good the talent, they always need to be directed. The program director should hear all. Mistakes should be corrected NOW. Talent should be told immediately if higher energy is needed or if they should be more subdued." Maddox emphasized that "All talent need to be refreshed in the basics by the program director. They also need direction in order for their gifts to be maximized. Otherwise they'll drift. You don't chew talent out . . . you direct talent." Maddox, as program director of KDAY. brought the station to glory. "If a DJ goofed and I knew that he knew, I wouldn't call. I'd only call if I thought he wasn't aware of what he'd done. If I catch a jock repeatedly making the same mistakes, it tells me something about the PD.'

The general manager doesn't have to be on call 24 hours like the program director. "I can get away for a weekend," Maddox pointed out. Nevertheless, the career move from program director to general manager took adjustment. It was satisfying for him because it meant "I could control the big picture as opposed to just one part. However, it takes getting used to ... overseeing departments and over 30 people, as compared with six or seven disc jockeys. Then there are FCC matters, and when I took over, old law suits, license renewals, making certain checks arrive on time. The general manager deals in reality . . . the program director deals with theory.

One of the biggest adjustments for the program director who becomes general manager, is learning to rely on other people's expertise. "As a program director, you don't have to rely on anybody else. You may delegate some responsibility to your music director. But as a general manager, you wish you had more expertise in many fields. Since you don't, and you don't have time anyway, you have to rely on others and you need to set up controls to check on other people to make certain they are working in the station's best interests.'

The program director who becomes general manager has to go through a period of adjustment. "I strove to expedite it by working long hours . . . eighteen at the beginning. I had inherited a lot of people. We had to make a lot of changes. The way you make changes is to work through your June 7, 1979

department heads . . . and it's not always fast. You have to be diplomatic in things you say. I would prefer to light fires myself, and I had to learn hands off. The general manager has to use his department heads to light the fire, and allow himself to become the mediator. The department head makes the change and you have to be able to smooth things out. You have to let your department head, (even after you have made a suggestion) decide whom to fire. And then there is the other temptation . . . when awards are being given out. You have to let your department head give the award or raise (even if it is your idea). I would like to be the good guy, but if you don't keep hands off, you end up with disgruntled department heads. You have to allow department heads flexibility and rope. As a PD, I was probably dictatorial. And basically, I'm a 'hands on' guy. So I had to learn to adjust. I had a new department head who came in and informed the staff that in 90 days they would be evaluated and if they didn't measure up, they would be fired. On the 60th day, he had evaluated someone and knew he didn't want this person. I might not have fired this person, or I might have waited the 90 days. But department heads see different things. I had to listen to his reasons, and keep my hands off."

One of the managing techniques that Maddox is very pleased with is his "open door policy". "The way I manage, and I got this from Gary Price one of the more gifted managers - is the 'open door policy'. Anyone from any department, whether they are disc jockeys or in sales, can come in and talk. If I'm busy, I say, 'I'm busy . . . later.' Later it may not be so important. But I think it's important to encourage staff to come in so you can find out how they really feel. Sometimes the general manager is the last to know. Obviously, if you are president of CBS, you can't talk to everyone; but you go as far down the line as you can.' As senior vice president of the Amaturo Group, Maddox talks to all the departments at KMJQ, KKSS in St. Louis, WSDO in Ft. Lauderdale, and a TV station in St. Joseph.

By now, Jim Maddox has not only adjusted to his general manager title, he likes it. "It's fun. And very, very gratifying to control the big picture ... if you like control. I can decide I want to buy this jingle package or use this rating service or do this promotion. And alternatively, I can say 'I don't want,' and that's gratifying, too."

"Over 400 radio programmers attended Musexpo '78 last year," Roddy Shashoua, president and chairman of the international convention told me last week. "Radio came because, at one time, under one roof, they can have a finger on the pulse of the record and music industry worldwide. Because we have executives from over 41 countries. In only four days, they can tell at a glance what is happening around the world and meet with the top executives and other radio programmers from around the world." Radio program-mers get a special VIP registration privilege which entitles them to attend all activities with a nominal administration fee. However, the rest of the industry pays \$330 per person or \$1,200 for a booth, which includes five registrations. Last year, 2,500 executives from 950 companies and 41 countries attended. This year there will be many more "because," explains Roddy Shashoua, "there is a definite need. That's why so many of the executives keep coming back each year. The U.S.A. is the largest market, so it is important that a world meeting be held here. Music is becoming more international." Producers from Eng-land, Sweden, Australia, France, and Germany usually attend en masse. And at Musexpo '79, he expects Portugal, Greece and Equador.

Musexpo has grown to be the largest meeting of its kind, and its makeup is 50 percent U.S. and 50 percent overseas attendees. Its success and growth have a lot to do with the talent, creative vision, and insight of its president and chairman Roddy Shashoua. The youthful-looking Shashoua, (actually he is 33 years old), has

a background of delightful contradictions. He is a Jew, raised in Alexandria, Egypt. He is a guitarist and manager of a band called Sunset; however, he received his BA in economics. Music and business seem to have always been two major interests in his life. He was asked to leave Egypt in 1967 because of religion. In England there was no music career open to him, so he began to organize and run international trade exhibits from different parts of the world. Eventually, he visualized a way of combining his music and his business talent: Musexpo. "We will have a 24-hour visual showcase of the latest acts on video tapes. Noon to 7 each day will be set aside for visiting the booths: mainly software, and in the mornings there will be panels."

Musexpo '79 will be held on November 4-8, 1979 at the Konover Hotel, Miami. If you want more information about registration or booths, write: 720 Fifth Ave., New York, NY 10019, U.S.A.. Telephone: (212) 489-9245.

I'd never met him before, but in a very short time I felt like he was an old friend. Tuesday is production day here and hectic, so everybody is hoping that Michael comes back (not on Tuesday) and spends more time with us.

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

Living Up To The Name

He played the vina so soulfully and sang so beautifully, that people would just fall to their knees in devotion and gratitude. Narada is the name my spiritual teacher and guru gave me. Narada had the quality to take all of earth's suffering back to heaven. So I think through music in my life . . . I've tried to live up to this.

Musical excellence, craftsmanship, great talent, dexterity, respect from his peers . . . while immensely gratifying . . . are not enough for Narada Michael Walden.

Whether it's due to his spiritual life. his marriage, or merely the wish to be challenged, he has set new goals for his professional career. "On my album 'Awakening'," he explains, "I've made a strong effort to relate to people. In the past five years of my life, working with John McLaughlin-Mahavishnu Orchestra and Jeff Beck, the music is so elevated it's almost like over the heads of people. It only relates to a select few. So I said I want to be able to relate to everybody. You know, there's some music for sophisticated people on the album, but there's music for everyday people, too. It's difficult to do something that a lot of people can say, 'Yeah we like that,' because it has to have a very simple element in it. That's not always easy to capture.'

Narada Michael Walden's single is "I Don't Want Nobody Else (To Dance With You)". "I liked the single a lot. Nowadays everybody wants to dance. So I wanted to give my contribution to dancing, but yet give a high standard...

feeling of just getting married and being kind of protective shows in the lyrics.

Michael Walden's persistence can be seen in his courtship. He met his wife-to-be when he was playing at the Bottom Line in New York, "She came backstage with a bunch of flowers and I said, 'Oh, she's beautiful. She gave me her number and I lost the card . . . (after performing, everything was strewn all over the place). But I knew she was a student at NYU. So I went to the University, and I was asking around, 'do you know this girl with long hair?' "Happy ending...the young woman whose photograph appears on the album jacket is his wife, the girl with the long hair.

"I first came to Los Angeles thinking I would do the whole album out here. But I wasn't knocked out with everything. Some things I liked and those things are on side two. But, I didn't feel like I had anything really geared for radio as far as Top 40 went. So I went to New York to record things for that market. You may notice that on side one, things are more flashy and hot, geared for radio and dancing as opposed to side two, where it's more in the sky and mellow.

Although the role of composer came later to Michael Walden, he recalls "beating on the crib and hanging on pots and pans and boxes at the age of one. "I'd play along with the records and watch them spin for hours and hours. When I was 10 years old, there was a man named Stevie Wonder, he was all of 12, and he had just recorded a song called 'Fingertips'. I was knocked out by it."

Walden did his first album at the age of 21 with John McLaughlin and the Mahavishnu Orchestra. "I had heard the orchestra and said, 'Oh, they're so great, they're so hot, I want to play with them.' And, lo and behold . . . you know God always gives you what you want if you really want it . . . two-andone-half-years later I was there playing with that band." Jeff Beck, guitarist,

was touring with the band and he later asked Walden to make an album with him. Beck is a "Progressive Rock guitarist, incredibly sensitive and known for doing all kinds of great sounds on the guitar," says Walden. "I flew to England and I recorded with him, and some of those tracks have become quite well known. In fact, that's the only gold album I have. I wrote half the songs on that album, 'Wired'

Besides composing, and getting ready to tour...Michael Walden teaches drums to about 60 students. He had attended Western Michigan University for a few semesters. I was just very dissatisfied. It's nice to learn about Mozart and Beethoven, but I wasn't getting enough feedback as far as growing on my instrument." Now that he's teaching, he's careful to be aware of what his students need. "I give them things that are very practical, things that they can use to make a living, to get out there and get those jobs they need. At the same time, I give them a bit of history and a bit of how things developed; but then I show them how to use this information on their instruments." He'll tell them about a guy named Chick Webb, the first guy to play drums in really Progressive swing, and Joe Jones, an old-time drummer; but that's not enough. They have to know how to use their ears. "Don't you know that playing with Weather Report, John McLaughlin and Jeff Back, there were no charts. They played a few licks, and you had to depend on your ear."

Walden believes that "music feeds the soul. God has given me a gift of music. It's a gift. It I can bring some happiness, a little light and joy and love to the world, that's what I'm here to do." And no doubt about it, that's what he's achieved in "Awakening", especially the cuts "I Don't Want Nobody Else (To Dance With You)", "Give Your Love A Chance," "They Want The Feeling" and "Awakening Suite".

Instability, Insecurity & Intransigence

It's a familiar harangue in our business to hear about the competitiveness that exists between programming and sales. Each seems to guard its domain zealously.

Obviously, the two areas must work closely together to bring in revenue to the station. A viable product must be produced and maintained; then, it must be sold and serviced to paying clients.

Basically, no one takes exception to this understandable premise. Yet, the hard core of reality prevails and works a borderline schism.

Let's address ourselves now to a human area that builds up all kinds of distrust and suspicion. It's one thing to say 'play nice,' but it's another whole ball game when elements over which few people have control start to intervene.

Ideally, programming and sales should be intimately aware of what is transpiring in the other's area. An interchange of ideas and concepts should flow freely.

But . . . what actually happens in the day-to-day world builds barriers and harbors suspicions. Everyone concedes that the vagaries of our business do not contribute to a great deal of longevity at many broadcasting situations. As a consequence, we see a certain degree of job-hopping.

Whether that's good or bad is a moot point at this juncture. We can argue about it philosophically for hours on end. But what does pertain is the overall impact that follows in the wake of programming and/or sales turnover.

For sales to properly sell a product, it has to know many features about that product. To be sure, there are no inviolate secrets that attain the topsecurity level in making any one format perform in its market. Yet, there are fine points that definitely separate one operation from another. Here is where the reluctance starts to set in.

Programming is expected to relay to sales the type of product it has concocted, how it is promoted, the types of personalities involved, the expansiveness of its involvement with the community, and myriad other factors that help to provide product features. This is to be freely given and constantly updated to provide the yer latest information to sales. Yet,

re is a joker in the deck and that comes about when, for whatever reason, a sales person is no longer affiliated with the station and can surface again in the same market with all of this information neatly tucked under his bonnet. A reluctance then June 7, 1979

sets in on the part of programming and it is hard to instill a feeling of confidence and trust when the pattern may be repeated many times.

A similar experience runs parallel to this thinking when this also occurs right within the programming department itself. Disc jockeys, news people, production people, copywriters, and program directors move about with the same degree of frequency as is experienced within the sales ranks.

Can you then blame people for subconsciously withholding what can be valuable information on a free flowing basis? And then again, there are the newcomers in sales and programming who could certainly benefit from this veritable treasure of source material. They too fall into a semi-communications vacuum and also suffer in the process. Maybe they suffer even more since they don't have the background to grasp what is going on beneath the surface.

Are there any solutions to the problem?

Is the overall problem unique to broadcasting?

Only those in broadcasting can weather this tempest. There is no clearcut solution no more than other businesses succumb to this very weakness. All of us in broadcasting are sensitized toward it inasmuch as we hold up our field as being so unusually creative and unusually responsive to a fickle public.

There is a genuine desire to communicate yet, the three I's of instability, insecurity, and intransigence mount their steeds and go counter to this very necessary tool of communicating. Perhaps his is another indication of hurting ourselves when we don't really look upon ourselves as a

Think of it also in terms of when a client hires an advertising agency to handle a sizeable advertising budget and then does not take that agency under its full confidence in providing the communications and information necessary to strike at the heart of the situation. There is always the fear that an account executive or someone on the creative team will leave for another advertising agency and eventually wind up as a competitor. It is akin to open industrial sabotage. Then, of course, there is the total throwaway when an advertising agency is fired from the account or resigns the account and winds up handling a competitor. Can such a thing be guarded against?

Who can offer a solution?

Maybe one can visualize its impact when the thinking is summed up in the political arena. In that vein, alliances and 'working arrangements' sometimes hang on a thread. Yesterday's ally can be tomorrow's enemy. How much information can be shared and how many confidences can be established on a long-range basis? The shifting of power plays makes strange bedfellows. We have seen such chess playing very recently in regard to the super powers. Look at the Mideast and its attendant interplay as manipulations take place.

Our whole world is closer and closer . . . but also more complex as interactions take place. The very number of radio stations in existence and the growth of advertising revenue make for complex layers of interaction than had ever existed.

What it narrows down to is being aware of this competitive aspect and trying to identify in a more businesslike fashion. Sharing must go on regardless of the risk involved. We must adopt an attitude that takes its chances and proceed with a positive attitude. If we are as creative as we think we are, we can overcome obstacles that stand in our way. We have to accommodate the situation and rise above it to constantly have a mature attitude to communicating within our own ranks.

spans than for immense cumes; the fairly long music sweeps; and the directive to announcers to be real people talking to real people. "I don't want them to sound like DJs."

Clenott joined WDAI as program director at the end of April of this year and is still in the process of revamping the station. He expects to have it sounding the way he wants within a month. At present, he is adding a lot of music, but in the future, it will depend on what kind of music is available. If his track record at WKTU is any indication, expect four to five records a week.

There are other changes he is planning. "I want more news people and more features.

News will be programmed to fit the format. "Radio is a stream of events. You never know when people are turning it on and off. News should occur periodically." In AM Drive, he plans a lot of short news breaks. "You

should never be more than three or four minutes away from hearing something you need to know — weather, traffic, information," with music providing a sense of consistency. Outside AM Drive, the station remains primarily a music service.

Among the features he plans are programs such as "Hot Mixes", halfhour segments done by several local Disco spinners which will run periodically throughout the week and as a three-hour block on Saturday night; a Disco Countdown of the top Chicago hits; and a Mini Countdown.

Clenott's name is so closely associated with Disco today (he was instrumental in the success of WKTU in New York), one tends to lose sight of a radio background that is both varied and extensive. But prior to WKTU going Disco, Clenott says, "I was ignorant about Disco and didn't much care for it."

Clenott feels that the best training for a Disco programmer is "a good radio programming background, and enough flexibility to adapt to the Disco format." And that, evidently, is exactly what he has. Formats under his belt include old line MOR, Top 40, Adult Contemporary and Album Rock.

Clenott started in radio in 1968 while in college with part-time jobs at WPNO (MOR and then Top 40) in Auburn, ME and later at WGAN (Adult Contemporary) in Portland, ME. In 1972-1973 he took a station break and worked for an ad agency in New Orleans. In 1973 he went to Philadelphia to attend graduate school at the University of Pennsylvania, and worked full-time at AOR-formatted WYSP - did mornings for two years, afternoons for two years, and spent his last year as music director of the station. In 1977, SJR Communications asked him to move to WKTU as music director. In June 1978 he was appointed program director, and the following month the station switched to Disco.


