

DETROIT - "Radio stations must teach record stores how to sell Disco records," Jim Ryan, music director of WDRQ said. "We must educate them that Disco is not like Top 40.

"With Top 40 you get a few requests and have ten days to get the product. Disco is different. The Disco audience is trendy. They have to have the latest fashions, styles and records. If they dance to a song on Wednesday night,

College Radio **Breaks Artists**

"Supertramp, Peter Frampton, Chuck Mangione, Pablo Cruise, Joe Jackson, The Police, Chris De Burgh, Squeeze, The Tubes, and Seawind are some of the artists that college radio has helped to break," according to Bob Frymire, national college director at A&M Records. "It takes college radio plus a lot of secondary exposure, and, in some cases, college radio does the job better than others.

The formula that seems to really work for Frymire and A&M is a media blitz of a small college town adjacent to a larger market — for example,



Adult Contemporary Radio Re-emerges

AL HERSKOVITZ is currently Program Manager of Metromedia's WIP, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. Prior to his present assignment he was Operations Manager of KPOL AM/FM, Los Angeles, California, and WPRO AM/FM, Providence, Rhode Island. His varied broadcast background also includes stints as an air personality, newscaster, copy writer and sales manager at such stations as WTRY. Troy, New York; WNHC, New Haven, Connecticut; and WICC, Bridgeport, Connecticut.

Some years ago (it wasn't really that many) when I was the Program Director of WPRO, Providence, Rhode Island (a leading Top 40 station) I accompanied my evening disc jockey ("disc jockey" was then an acceptable term) to Rhode Island Auditorium where he was to M.C. a concert starring the Righteous Brothers. They were very hot then as a result of three big records in a row, the most memorable of which was "You've Lost That Lovin' Feeling." The big, old hall was jammed with teenagers. There wasn't anyone there under thirteen nor over nineteen, and there wasn't a square inch of open space. The show promoter told me "the house has gone clean" . . . his term for a sell-out. The auditorium seemed to be steaming in anticipation of the show.

After some discussion with the promoter it was decided I would be the off-stage voice who would introduce the disc jockey who in turn would go on stage and then introduce the Righteous Brothers. Well, when that air personality stepped on stage following my introduction to him, the audience response was absolutely overwhelming. They cheered, called his name: waved as if he were the biggest act ever to hit town. And in a way he was. He was a real radio personality in every sense of the word who was so totally ingrained into the community of listeners that his personal stature was as great as almost any so-called "name" act that could be imported. What he wasn't is almost as important. He wasn't a song introducer, cue card slogan reader or record segue-er.

Now what happened to those young people in the crowd. Well, let's start with the fact that most of them are around thirty years old or older right now. Think of that for a moment . . . married . . . with children . . . at jobs or in business . . . established in their communities. Have they suddenly stopped listening to radio? Hell, no! They were the radio generation. Radio was their secret world, one into which adults of their generation refused to enter, in fact dismissed until it almost overwhelmed them. These were the kids who welcomed Elvis with arms flung open. These were the kids who understood the message of the Beatles while their elders stood by in absolute puzzlement. They're the ones who elevated the disc jockey to the stature

of exalted guru and the station he represented as the Olympus for the oracle. And those of you who were there at the time know I'm not exaggerating.

In no way has that enormous mass of people brought up on radio deserted the medium. But once an individual enters his or her late twenties or early thirties the responsibilities and pressures of life cause a change in taste, a change in lifestyle, a mellowing of attitudes. It's a very normal evolution. Nevertheless, this, in fact, is the radio generation. And they seek and have found a kind of radio that satisfies their needs. It's called "Adult/Contemporary." For the last couple of years I have been hearing the cry that personality radio is coming back. Well, surprise, surprise! It has come back. What really happened was that the personality stations were there, some just barely hanging on, and the audiences finally caught up with them. Now that available audience is becoming the largest segment of the population.

Much is being said and written about the aging of the U.S. population. In a recent article "Broadcasting" magazine reported that the second largest demographic sought by advertisers is 25 to 54, the first still being 18 to 49. If you look at the ratings of any successful Adult-Contemporary station, you'll find it smack on target with primary strength 25 to 54 and remarkably good tonnage 18 to 49. Continued on 7

LOS ANGELES - Dick Whittinghill will do his last morning show on KMPC August 4, after nearly 30 years on the air in that time slot. Robert W. Morgan takes over the show effective August

Whittinghill is retiring only from the morning slot. He will continue his involvement with the station, both on a consultancy basis and with a Sunday

The station also plans some music changes. According to program director, Mike O'Shea, "we are mellowing tor, Mike O'Shea, "we are mellowing our music a little. We have felt that in the last couple of years the music got too contemporary for our demographic targets." O'Shea said that the station planned more artist-oriented music Barry Manilow, Neil Diamond, Olivia Newton-John.

2-Q-92 Signs On: Needs Service

CHESAPEAKE, VA — WQZQ (2-Q-92) signs on the air Sunday, June 24 at noon with a Contemporary format and very few records. According to station manager, Pete Low, when new owners, Chesapeake Communications took over the facility, there was no library and skeletal equipment (transmitter, some final signal equipment and two turntables). The station was formerly WJLY and had been off the air for two

Low said the station needs record service badly - singles and albums, currents and oldies. Until last week. there was not a record in the house. Service has since started, but the station went out and bought the top 40 to be on the safe side.

New staff at the station includes program director, Barry O'Day; music director, J.J. McKay; Mollie Brooks; Dan Williams; and part-timers, Bruce Harris and Bob Madison. Their shifts have not yet been determined. News director is Neil Rattigan. The station will have a heavy emphasis on local news with five-minute reports on the hour at 7, 8 and 9 a.m., noon, and 4, 5 and 6 p.m. Network news is pending.

happening to Disco, to AOR, to AM, to Top 40, to Adult Contemporary for-

Some of the implications of the ARB were discussed by leaders in the media field.

In New York, BOb Galen, vice president of Research, Blair Radio, felt that "This was predictable. WABC is hanging in about the same level. WPLJ drops very slightly. The Disco thing is starting to smooth out. The two stations have moved closer together. Disco music holds the same share of 14.1, but the two are sharing the audience. WOR was the big gainer; they had a big promotion going. They went from a 5.8 to a 7.0. WNBC is hanging in there. WNEW is up a little. As a researcher I don't think the difference of a couple of tenths of a point is important.'

Jack Masla, Jack Masla & Company, observed: "In New York, WKTU is still Number One for the third straight book. Any time you pull a 7.6 in a fragmented market like New York you are king. When WABC was pulling that kind of share they were on top. WKTU is the most listened to station in New York and probably the country. WABC continues to slide which indicates an end of an era. The advances indicate that: A) Disco is here to stay, B) the demise of the AM rockers continues, and C) FM has begun to emerge as the dominant medium."

Kathryn Lenard, vice president of radio research for NBC, commented: "It's so frustrating. Total persons, 12-plus...it doesn't tell you enough. Until you get into dayparts and demographic breakouts, you can't really evaluate the strengths or weaknesses of stations. As far as WBLS and WKTU, everyone thought that WBLS would come back with a punch and obviously they did. WABC is down again. We held our own, but until we start looking at dayparts and know what the ethnic breakdown is, it's hard to make any suggestions for radio

Deborah Gonderil, senior vice president and director of research for Western International Media, felt the advance ARBs were not useful to media buyers and sales personnel. "But I can see why the people at stations want them and of course you can boo or cheer depending on the station.

Sam Brownstein, Pro/Meeker Radio declared that "If one accepts that Arbitron has some considerable accuracy, certainly what the New York City survey showed is that listening habits can be changed rapidly. And there is considerable fluctuation at stations, which comes out at the end as a

warning that buyers shouldn't just keep buying what always has been good. It might still be or not.

Peter Moore, senior vice president eastern region, Torbet-Lasker, cau-"Agencies must go in for trends in ratings and not a single book. They should be wary of change. An increase or decrease in rating indicates a need to look for the reason for that change. The reasons could be valid. For example, programming changes, the market is ready to accept a new format, community involvement. Or the reasons could be invalid; for example, a sampling fluke." examining the different results in New York, Moore noted "NBC has been doing on-going promotions but it was not reflected in their ratings. I would have looked for higher ratings because of their high visibility in outside promotion. Regarding WBLS, I have not seen outside promotions. I would assume they must have done some programming changes; something was being done to get the listeners back. All news stations tend to drop some audience after winter recedes, so that explains WCBS-AM & WINS. WNEW had outside promotion and I felt they might make some increases in ratings. WRFM surprised me because WTFM, their competitor, left the field. I would have thought WRFM would go up in

ratings."
William Schrank, Katz Radio, discussed the Los Angeles market. "The market seems more fractionalized than ever. KABC is still totally dominant. But after KABC, the market is very fractionalized and closer than it's ever been or that I can remember. However. Los Angeles is a little different from the rest of the major markets. It's interesting that KABC is even more dominant under the new breakdown."

Andy Rainey, vice president of research, sales promotion at Selcom Inc., discussed the San Diego market. She noted that: "In San Diego there were new stations and a lot of people did sample them. And obviously baseball is really hot. KFMB went from a 3.9 to an 8.0 in the book. Baseball wins again.

"The question is what will the new stations be able to do in the next rating book. If you take the October/November book, KBZT-FM went with a first book to a 3.9 and now it's 2.9. So books go up and down because of sampling errors and you have to look at two or more. You can't put your money on a flash in the pan.

"In Los Angeles, I don't see any big surprises, except for KMET pushing out KBIG. KMET has done a wonderful job and it is a tribute to the power of a younger audience.'

College Radio

Boulder, Colorado. The promotion for Supertramp included not only the noncommercial college-affiliated station, but store displays all over town and video displays all over campus. Tied into the promotion campaign was a contest for the best place to have breakfast in Boulder. Every restaurant in town gladly participated in and advertised the contest. And the winner got to dine with Supertramp. The secret behind Frymire's formula is that the excitement created around Supertramp in Boulder (the group played in the field house to a sell-out crowd of 1,400) generated to Denver.

"We created a buzz in the college community and within the town of Boulder." The strategy has worked elsewhere for Frymire too.

He is very enthusiastic about what college radio is doing. "If you want to find the 'Progressive' Rock format the way it was originally, you have to go to the college stations. Their biggest problem is continuity. When the se-

mester is over, then what?"
Frymire heads A&M's college internship program. A college intern usually learns the industry by helping a local promotion man. For the student it provides job experience, college credit at some universities and contacts. For the record company, it's a farm league. It means A&M can train the staff from scratch in their techniques and methods. Indeed, the record company believes in hiring their interns right out of college. Lenny Bronstein, national promotion director, was hired right out of the college program, as were promotion reps in Kansas, St. Louis, Buffalo, Washington, Baltimore, Seattle, and San Francisco. And Bob Frymire himself was a college intern.



The story of successful Adult-Contemporary stations is unusually simple and certainly no secret. WIP keys off some fundamental principles. Needless to say, music is all-important. It is a blend of "oldies" from the past fifteen years and carefully selected current music. The careful selection of new material has little to do with loudness or musical intensity, but has everything to do with what is acceptable to broad adult tastes as determined by our music department.

One of the interested facets of selecting new music that has adult appeal is the importance of the artist. The fact the artist has a history of success bears greater weight than the song itself. For some reason the adult listener who has chosen the "Adult-Contemporary" station as his or hers identifies most closely with the artist. It probably has something to do with TV exposure, young music artists developing into movie performers and just plain artist longevity. A person of about thirty years of age certainly has had his life parallel the music careers of Neil Diamond, Barbra Streisand, John Denver, Engelbert Humperdinck, Elvis, etc.

It is worth noting that the A/C stations that continue to enjoy success have allowed their music selection to evolve with the times. One of the "reveal-able" secrets of WIP has been its willingness to accept and then blend into its music mix the newest and latest trends. In fact, if there was one clear element that caused the collapse of the M-O-R station [the granddaddy of A/C] it was its naively false assumption that the music stopped in 1955.

A recent WIP promotion involved the processing of a little over three thousand listener requests in the span of a week. Much was learned from analyzing the results. For example, the fifteen most requested artists were: Elvis Presley, Engelbert Humperdinck, Village People, Barry Manilow, Bee Gees, Barbra Streisand, Beatles, Billy Joel, Kenny Rogers, Neil Diamond, Carpenters, Anne Murray, John Denver, Olivia Newton-John, Tom Jones.

Please note that all of them are active, hit-producing artists today with a valid amount of professional history. The only exceptions are Presley and the Beatles, and their presence on the list needs no explanation.

But Adult-Contemporary radio's strong re-emergence does not end with music. The adult listener wants more from his station than a constant stream of songs. There's a desire to be entertained, to be informed, to be involved because life itself has brought the adult to this point.

The A/C stations came to realize June 21, 1979

that there are two kinds of news. The news you need to know and the news you want to know. The news you need to know is not always pleasant or of high personal interest, but any newscaster worth his journalistic salt understands that there are events in our world that must be revealed whether or not the listener specifically wants to hear about them. This is journalistic responsibility. On the other hand, there are daily occurrences that directly affect us, and today's A/C stations give us that news as well and in terms we can easily understand. For too long radio newscasts were affected by "Newspaperese." It is about time we put words like "perpetrator, assailant," etc. to rest. The news is better communicated when the language used to convey the thought is aural rather than visual. Much of the blame here can be placed on the doorstep of the wire services whose personnel in years past were print-oriented, but a whole new generation of broadcast journalists is on the scene now who sees itself as an integral part of the A/C station and utilizes the one-on-one techniques so successfully purveyed by the air personality. In this area I must tip my hat to our AOR brothers and sisters who were the first to realize that the newscan be aimed at specific listeners' particular interests and lifestyles. However, I must admit I was getting

pretty tired of the "paraguat" stories. There cannot be an adult around who has not been touched by some of the unpleasant aspects of life such as poverty, illness or even death, so there is a measure of community involvement for just about everyone. This is an important area for A/C stations because the target audience understands life's adversities and can relate to a charity drive or a benefit campaign. WIP has a long history of charitable associations. Just in recent months we have been involved in major campaigns with the Leukemia Society. the Special Olympics for Retarded Children and the Variety Club's Camp for the Handicapped. We utilize all our resources both on and off the air to make the event successful. This kind of activity is extremely beneficial to the station since it brings about direct contact with the audience and places the station in a good light. The more direct contact you have with your listeners, the more real the station becomes to them, the more audience loyalty you build. We use a single theme to bind all our community activities together. It's even emblazoned on our station banner: "WIP cares about Philadelphia and You.'

Then there are the goofy things we do to further our direct audience contact: the assembling of a one hundred foot cheese sandwich at a shopping center, then cutting it up and giving away pieces to everybody who

showed up; having the afternoon man sawed in half by a touring magician; the staff engaging in athletic competition against the Philadelphia Eagles; passing out thousands of green bagels on St. Patrick's Day and making the deliveries by helicopter.

Specialized programming holds a unique place in Adult/Contemporary stations. Sports play-by-play has always been there, and I couldn't encourage it more as an element having particular appeal to the target. This has led to some experimentation with other long form features. These features come in two basic shapes the "start to finish" type and the "in and outer." The key to their effective utilization is the time slot into which they're placed. A drama show such as the "CBS Mystery Theatre" or Watermark's "Alien Worlds" requires the attention of the listener from beginning to conclusion. Knowing the lifestyle of your audience determines the most effective time placement for these shows. The weekend specials such as the "History of Rock" or the "Elvis Presley Story" allows the audience to move in and out at will without causing listener frustration. Whether they are homegrown or purchased from outside packagers, these shows give an A/C station a distinct quality and are highly promotable items.

The mortar that holds all these elements together is the air personalities, and A/C is the one format that gives them enough elbow room to exercise their imaginations and use their special skills. There is one characteristic I have found that strong air personalities with high ratings have in common. The first time you hear one of them, you always say, "What's so special about him?" The truth is that they are so different that they are hard to characterize. They fit in no special mold. They are neither high energy, juicy-voiced shouters nor laid-back. super-cool mumblers, scores of which we have all heard across the country. One element can be pin-pointed. It is their ability to communicate with sin-

Adult-Contemporary radio is flour-ishing in Philadelphia and in important markets all over the country, and as with all good things, the copiers are out trying to put together their own homogenized versions. The great beauty of Adult-Contemporary radio is that it defies formula. Either you do it right, or it's not going to work.

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On Lamb & Lion Records
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Charley Lake

If he'd known how to get into the record business, Charley Lake thinks he might not have been a radio programmer at all. "Though I wouldn't change a thing, if I had my life to live

"But I started out as a musician and manager of high school Rock and Roll bands. I promoted sock hops, things like that. In Washington, D.C., where I

was raised.

"And I was a record collector . . . a freak. The main reason I got into the radio business was because that's where I heard my favorite music. Started in 1967 as a flunky and assistant gofer at WOL when Ted Atkins was program director. I didn't get paid, but that was okay . . . I got all of these R&B records. Can you imagine not having to pay for the new Sam and Dave record or the new one by the Temptations?"

From there, he went to WETT in Ocean City, MD, as a disc jockey, then to WINX in the Washington area to work with Joel Denver, now at KSLQ, St. Louis, and Bob Edson, now a senior vice president of RSO Rec-

"Then I got drafted, but was able to work around Richmond, VA, while in the service.

"When I got out, I went back to WINX for a month, then to WPGC in Washington for two years, then WCAR in Detroit before moving to WYRE in Annapolis, my first programming job.
"I later went to WJBQ in Portland,

ME, as part of a brief consultancy that Bob Pittman, Dick Booth, and I were involved in. But that was only for two or three months before I went to WPEZ in Pittsburgh. Then KSLQ in St Louis in January 1977." Two months later, he was named national program director of Bartell Broadcasting, which owned KSLQ and other stations.

The best station he ever pro-

Many records are now happening like an explosion in just three-to-four weeks, believes Dan Kelley. He pointed to Gerry Rafferty, Dire Straits, Wings and the Bee Gees. This syndrome in radio "has made it a little more difficult in the last nine months to a year to bring a record up through the secondary markets. It demands a lot of determination, hard work and a lot of belief in the record. You can lose a good record in the secondaries as well as make a hit out of it.

"The problem is that some secondary stations have adopted a big market attitude... if they see that a major market station has stepped out on a record, they just wait and see if the record makes top 10 before playing it."

On the other hand, secondary stations have caught up, he said. "You can go around the country today and hear some great stations. If those guys were in major markets, they could create some strong competition against many

of today's key stations."

He started in the business at KQV in Pittsburgh in 1968 in the music library, calling retail stores, filing records, placing oldies on the air. His first program director was John Borders, who was replaced by Mike (Jim Hankins) McCormick. Following McCormick was Bob Harper. In January 1971, Kelley was promoted to operations director of WDVE.

In mid 1971, Kelley was out of work. "I mean, I tried to find work. My problem was that most of my experience had been off the air. See, in radio you either have a balls-out voice at 14 and a great radio career ahead of you at 16, or you hammer away until you're 25 just in hopes that your voice will change and have some kind of consist-

ency to it.


"But I didn't have any kind of voice to approach a radio station with . . . just an understanding of music.

"So, I ended up trying to get into the record business. I was turned down twice by Liberty/UA Records for local promotion jobs in Cleveland and, I think, Detroit. The third job I went for was in Cleveland with Piks/Midwest, an indy distributor. It was a funny interview because I went in there and practically got down on my knees. "But you don't have any experience!" Well, the job was promoting in Pittsburgh, where I knew many radio people, and Cleveland, my home town. After hammering for an hour-and-a-half, they finally gave me the job.

"The irony is that two months after I

"The irony is that two months after I moved to Cleveland, I got a call from the branch marketing coordinator of the WEA group, wanting to know if I wanted to move back to Pittsburgh.

"How could I turn down a job with



the largest record and distribution company in the world?"

For the next five-and-a-half years, Kelley did local promotion in Pittsburgh. First, as a "three-bagger" for W.E.A., the last three years, for Warner Brothers.

"And during that time I learned a lot more about the business — about retailing, marketing..., and how to put those ingredients together with local performances to break new artists."

"Popsicle Toes" by Michael Franks was one of those records! It went to number two in the market, crossed several formats, and would have been number one except for a hit by a local group called Wild Cherry — "Play That Funky Music."

In his Pittsburgh years, he promoted records to such radio men as Chuck Brinkman (who he'd worked with at KQV), Buzz Bennett, Bill Tanner, Charley Lake, Dennis Waters, Bob Pittman, Jack Forsythe, Tom Bigby, his high school friend Ed Salamon, and Dwight Douglas . . "all of them incredibly intelligent and creative people."

Two years ago, November 17, Kelley was invited along with some East Coast radio people to attend a presentation party for George Harrison in Washington, D.C.

"That night, Russ Thyret, V.P. of promotion for Warner Bros., came up to me and said, 'I want to talk to you in 25 minutes'. And I'm thinking: Geez, what have I done this time?

"He pulled me aside about 25 minutes later and laid out the whole job as national secondary promotion director. I was absolutely floored. The job,

meeting George Harrison . . . I was above Cloud 9!"

He came to Warner Bros. in January 1977, determined to live up to what he believes is "an incredible honor" and the faith that Russ Thyret and Ed Rosenblatt, vice president of sales and promotion, have in him.

His Monday is primarily phone work, beginning as early as 7 or 8 a.m. He tries to call as many key stations as possible. First, to close out any market not on a given record; second, to try to start that next record. He referred to Manfred Mann's "You Angel You" and Maureen McGovern's "Theme From Angie."

Friday, he accumulates data from all of the tipsheets, analyzes what the trades have done, condenses this information down to a report that is mailed out to the local promotion

people.

Somewhere along the way in his hectic week, he finds time to delve into "creative projects." One of these was the McGovern record. He heard her singing it on the TV series, thought it would be a hit, checked with her manager Marsha Day, found out it wasn't planned for the new LP, persuaded everyone to let her go back into the studio and cut it. She did, and it's now beginning to hit. "The record has been out only a couple of days and I'll bet we picked up 50% of the Adult/Contemporary stations in the nation the first week!"

Kelley is assisted by Sue Emmer, who was hired over a year ago. "She has been a godsend... partner and a friend. She is now starting to handle bigger and bigger markets and is doing

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June 21, 1979

Bert Keane

Bert Keane believes that a good promotion person "is in the record stores as much as in the radio stations, if not more so." He rose up through the ranks of WEA distribution - as did Kim Anderson, George Gerrity and Dan Kelley - and considers himself a "street person." The day of the interview, he'd just hung up the phone with Stan Goman of Tower Records in San Francisco and had also talked with people at Tower Records on Sunset in Los Angeles. "I've worked in the branches with sales managers and it's great! I continue to keep in touch with them. If there's any one thing I try to transmit to our promotion staff, it's that I want them to work as close with WEA as I did. You can feel a hit record faster and you know if something is selling.'

Born and raised in San Francisco, Keane is strictly untypical in regards to how he launched his record career. He was actually a sociology major at the University of San Francisco and later a management trainee in the Refectory, a steak and lobster restaurant located about two blocks from the Tower Records store in San Francisco and just four blocks away from the offices of Warner Bros., Elektra, Atlantic. Keane spent a lot of time tending bar. Most of the record people used to come in. The drinks were good, the atmosphere was plea-

After a while, Keane began to hang out with Gary Davis of Warner Bros. Records. It was Gary who "created a job for me." I did secondary promotion out of San Francisco . . . covered every station except those in San Francisco . . . was handed the Yellow Pages . . . I actually went into record stores before I went into radio stations, trying to learn what happened to records after they left the manufac-

"I was Gary Davis' road lizard . . . went to Modesto, Stockton, Fresno ... that's where I first met Les Garland, who was then programming KYNO in Fresno."

Keane did the "lizard" bit for about six months, working with Bob Galliani, who was then the number one promotion person in San Francisco for the label. Then Kent Crawford, now in national sales for the company, left Denver to become regional promotion director in Boston. Keane got that Denver job and also promoted to all of Colorado, Utah, New Mexico, and parts of Wyoming. On his wall today is a blownup copy of the KTLK playlist showing 11 of his records out of a total of 40 ... "my finest hour as a local promotion man and all of them were good sellers or big hits - Doobie Brothers, America, Four Seasons,

John Sebastian, etc."

When Bob Galliani left the job in San Francisco, Keane fought for the job and won it.

At this time, he was still part of WEA, though getting his direction from Warner Bros. After about six months, he became regional promotion director for the West Coast. still

working out of San Francisco. By then, he was strictly a Warner Brothers staffer. "And at this point, I learned more how to manage people better . . . how to boss without being the boss. The hardest part of this job is

grammed? "The last. KSLQ. Because I always felt I was improving...a better jock at each successive station and a better program director at Portland than in Annapolis. I was not only learning more at each station, but was more mature, I suppose.

"And, lord knows, there's more to programming a radio station than coming up with rotations and fancy promotions. I was learning how to deal with people better, how to design promotions to the community better. I was given more responsibility . . . and I learned more about management."

One thing that he would recommend to most program directors today is: "Keep a very, very open mind to change...don't get locked up with what used to work five years ago, because those things usually don't work today...and certainly won't work five years from now.

"Resist the urge to go with the flow . . . the programming flow. Know why you make a change in your station . . . know why your station sounds the way it does. Don't try to make it sound a certain way because that's chic or cool or the latest radio fad."

Lake joined Warner Bros. in January 1979. It was probably the most-sought job in the record industry at the time. Was it difficult to get the job? "Maybe we should go ask Russ Thyret," he said, and laughed.

"What happened was that with the departure of Don McGregor to the Album Network and David Urso to Planet Records, Russ called me up and asked for recommendations . . . people in promotion that I respected. I said that I'd like to give it some thought. Then I called him back and said: 'Me.' And that's the truth."

Before he got the job, however, he had talks with Ed Rosenblatt, vice president of sales and promotion, and Mo Ostin, Chairman of the Board. These took place over about six weeks.

The syndrome of people getting out of radio and into the record business has sort of died down, though. "Because I think those people who wanted to do it, have done it. Now, you even have people getting back into radio — Scott Shannon and Jay Stone, for instance.

"I think there are always going to be people going from radio to the record industry. Because the two industries have such a symbiotic relationship that if your leanings are toward the music industry, you're exposed to it enough that the opportunity to work in it will come along sooner or later."

Lake said he knew several radio people who'd turned down record jobs. "And once I realized that a record job was within my grasp, I had to ask myself if I knew what I was doing. I RADIO REPORT

decided I did. Money had nothing to do with the job change. I was pretty well paid in radio. It was a personal satisfaction thing."

His radio background helps in his work today . . . "as long as I present myself as Charley Lake and not as the Charley Lake the former radio guy who's now the record guy. radio people take him at face value, he said.

"I don't think I have any edge at getting records played. If I have any edge, it might be in communicating information about a record in radio programming terms...terms that might not be understood or related to by anyone not from radio. So, I can call up a programmer and talk about one of our records and can pass along passive callout data from another program director whom I know is respected by this program director.

"And, another thing: I might pick up someone's playlist and maybe see patterns... or listen to a given station and discern what this program director is trying to do. This is information of great benefit to me in terms of promoting our records."

Do program directors ask him for programming advice? "A lot of guys still do. Sure. They'll ask me to listen to a new promotion they've just produced...or talk about ratings methodology. I was in Houston a few weeks ago and Clay Gish and I talked about promotions through half the

evening . . . that is, when we weren't talking about Corvettes. Then, the next day I dropped by to see Bill Young at KILT and we started talking about the pros and cons of RAM and Arbitron. And I suppose that's not something every guy in promotion would be interested in talking about, much less have the knowledge to do so.

"Now, I don't think this kind of thing is going to help me get a record played. But I do think it makes it a little easier for a guy like Bill Young and myself to strike an accord of some kind."

With his objective view about radio now that he isn't directly involved with programming, would he now program a radio station different?

"No. I'd program it the same. I've made kind of a switch in my programming philosophies, but my programming philosophies were always undergoing changes. From year to year, Heck, from ARB to ARB.

"When I went to KSLQ in St. Louis, I knew I was going to be moving on to New York City to become national program director within six months. So, I said to myself this is very possibly my last program job. And if I'm ever going to take a chance . . . to do all the things I've been wanting to take chances with, I'd better take them now.

"So, I made changes in what I had

been doing at WPEZ in Pittsburgh . . . I doubled my playlist, ran different kinds of promotions, experimented with different styles of presentation on the air, different news. And it worked out just great. I learned a valuable lesson from that.

"So far, what I've learned since then hasn't changed."

Was he much of a gambler when he was in radio?

"In terms of adding records? I was very heavy into R&B crossovers and loud Rock and Roll records. I always June 21, 1979

tended to go on those a little earlier. And later on, ballads. And I think I would probably be the same way now.

"But I always tended to take chances with new records. Yeah, I liked to break records . . . those that I thought were good. But I usually added records for my own benefit, than for a favor.

"I had a wonderful time in radio. And I still love radio. One of the nice things about this job is that I'm still in contact with radio.'

Below number 150, it is currently difficult to precisely portray ranking of a few of the records in comparison with others of almost equal airplay strength. This might make a difference of give or take three positions on the chart. Thus, ranking may be determined on as many as 10% of the records below 150 because of market size and hit potential of a given record and the label's capability to promote and distribute that particular record. Preference will be given to new records, as opposed to records on the decline. Label:

Rick Swig, vice president, field promotion: "They're one of the finest groups I've ever seen. I just saw them in Atlanta and it reconfirmed to me how good they actually are. They're all virtuosos on their particular instruments and there are no weak links. Just when you're through getting blown away by the percussionist on his solo, the lead guitarist will start into his solo and it's just one thing after another.

"They're very aware of making their music accessible to most formats. They organize their music for records because they know that most radio just can't play a nineor ten-minute song.'

directing people. Because we work together in this company, as opposed to someone working for somebody. This way, we gain respect for each other . . . and people tend to work for you better by working with you."

He did regional promotion for two years, then Russ Thyret promoted him to do national singles promotion, Top 40, major markets. But Keane pointed out that the job is "with Charley Lake, Dan Kelley, Pat McCoy, Kim Anderson, Bonnie Simmons, George Gerrity, Sue Emmer, and Mary Perkins. We're all one cohesive unit . . . I don't even like titles . . . we're all on the same level here."

His week is hectic... "there are never enough hours in the day. But I absolutely enjoy myself." He's in the Monday 2:30 p.m. meeting headed by Mo Ostin, Chairman of the Board, in which every single and album is

discussed from all angles. Then at 5:30 p.m. there is an interdepartmental meeting guided by vice president, promotion, Russ Thyret. Tuesday, the day is spent on the phone. And reports start coming in from the field force about music adds at stations. Wednesday, there's more phone work. And always, from day to day, artists and managers are coming by. Two weeks ago, for example, the Roches were in town for lunch. And just the other day Ry Cooder unveiled his new LP with its digital mix that Keane says is "absolutely phenomenal." "Gordon Lightfoot might be recording in Amigo Studios or the Doobie Brothers might be in town for a concert. There's always something to do, something interesting."
His personal goal "Right now is to

His personal goal "Right now is to have Russ Thyret's job. I would like to have that someday. If I ever reach that plateau, then I'll glance ahead.

"I'm a good student . . . I watch and listen to everybody in this company ...

there's so much to learn about this business and you pick up a little here and a little there.

"A few years ago I won the Local Promotion Man Of The Year Award at our convention in Scottsdale, AZ. Afterwards, Russ and I had a talk. He said, 'I want you to remember this: Don't pin your star on just one person'. I can't tell you how much that advice has helped me through the years. Since he said that, I have tried to learn from everyone."

The most fun from the job: "hearing one of the hits that I helped promote by a group at a concert."

The most rewarding part of the job: "When I hear one of my records on a major market Top 40 station, especially when it has been added out of the box."

Philosophy: "I don't know how other companies work . . . I don't really want to know . . . I don't want to develop any bad habits. All I know is that we do things right here."

they want to buy it on Friday."

Ryan advises programmers of Disco stations to sit down with store personnel and tell them what records will be big and what will explode because they are in heavy rotation. He is now even telling record outlets what he is considering adding. Ryan also suggests telling the stores what records are burning out. Because the burnout is faster if a record is not picked up by Top 40, he cites instances of unknowing outlets which see a surge in sales, restock product and are stuck with it. "When a Disco record ends, people will not buy it at all. Disco happens quickly and ends quickly.

WDRQ is planning a party for retail outlets and their employees to educate them on the life of a Disco record, how it crosses over, and where they can expect to see sales first. It's important, he notes, to put the 12-inch out first. Disco people will be the first to buy, and they will buy only the 12-inch. Once you get action on the 12-inch, then put out the seven-inch.

Why is he doing all this? "I'll do anything to make a record sell. If you work the stores correctly, you'll see much better results."
