SPECIAL MENTION ALBUMS

(Those recordings which, in our opinion, deserve special mention because they come closest to perfecting their musical genre regardless of progressive radio application.)

Asleep At The Wheel/TEXAS GOLD/Capitol ST 11441
(Imaginuity sets Asleep At The Wheel apart from the rest.
A sense of fun reinforces their lofty position and a sense of history caps it. Superior craftsmenship adds to further enjoyment.)

MERIT ALBUMS

(Our recommendations for serious progressive radio consideration, recognizing that not all Merit Albums are suitable for

Alquin/NOBODY CAN WAIT FOREVER/RCA APLI-1061 (Hot rockers. Two previous European albums trace Alquin's evolution from an anemic Focus to this - intensity incarnate. Tuneful songwriting helps though they still tend toward longer tracks, a remnant from jazzier days. Solid playing.)

Gary Bartz/THE SHADOW DO/Prestige P-10092 (Gary is an underestimated luminary. Here he magically creates an original, masterfully presented, fusion approach. The result is entertaining, funky, jazzy and melodious. Finally, he commands those strings with an understanding possessed by only the rare arranger. Side two is absolute dynamite.)

Ritchie Blackmore's Rainbow/Polydor PD 6049 (Hard-nosed rock and roll that Blackmore never permits to get shabby. The material is solid and they use the fuzz judiciously. Tops in pop rock.)

Arthur Brown/DANCE WITH.../Gull GU 6-405SI (Previously reviewed as an import. Roger Bain gets the scund, Andy Dalby planned the arrangements and Arthur delivers vocally. It all results in Brown's best ever, thoroughly entertaining rock & roll. Strong.)

Gary Burton & Steve Swallow/HOTEL HELLO/ECM 1055

(Short tracks make this enhanced due convenient to use for

(Short tracks make this ephemeral duo convenient to use for effect. This meandering musical meeting finds its own space.

effect. This meandering musical meeting finds its own space. Light and airy.)

Eric Clapton/E. C. WAS HERE/RSO SO 4809

(Marking time with Eric. This album is a nice commemorative of the tour but, not something about which to get overly excited. Strength builds from "Drifting Blues" to the end.)

Climax Blues Band/STAMP ALBUM/Sire SASD 7507 (To their credit Climax is never static, they continue to evolve. Here they shuffle toward the rhythm edge of the blues as more and more of their mellow intentions show. The second side seems melodically stronger.) melodically stronger.)

MERIT ALBUMS CONTINUED

Joe Cocker/JAMAICA SAY YOU WILL/A&M SP-4529
(Jim Price again joins Joe in an attempt to repeat the artistic success of their last Lp. Well, not quite, Side one weakens after the first strong track reaching for musical comedy in the middle. Generally the best stuff begins and ends each side with side two the better,)

The Crusaders/CHAIN REACTION/ABC-Blue Thumb BTSD-6022 (It is tought to listen to a Crusaders ellegated)

The Crusaders/CHAIN REACTION/ABC-Blue Thumb BTSD-6022 (It is tough to listen to a Crusaders album straight through because they tend to be so monolithic. Still, individual tracks can be a treat. The parts are greater than their sum. Well done.)

Jack DeJohnette's Directions/COSMIC CHICKEN/Prestige P-10094 (The word "best" is oft misused. In Jackie's case that word may well apply to his percussion work. His music is fluid but, not as thematically structured as fusionists would have it. He remains pure. Another credit for omnipresent John Abercrombie.)

Jackie DeShannon/NEW ARRANGEMENTS/Columbia PC 33500 (Careful production and Jackie's determination carry the

(Careful production and Jackie's determination carry the album past some derivitive vocals and some of the shakier name-dropping lyrics. Each song is given its best shot, most are worth it.)

Chris Duccey/DUCE OF HEARTS/Warner Bros. BS 2841

(The pros and cons of using veteran studio musicians can be argued over Chris' album. Their reliability unifies this effort around Chris' voice and songs. But, they also force an album to sound like many which have preceded it. Each argument has its points. Good songs with a Van Morrison taste.)

El Chicano/PYRAMID OF LOVE & FRIENDS/MCA MCA 2150
(Combining their collective sense of melody with that freely cooking rhythm makes success conclusive. Side one tends to be the stronger though the title song which closes the album is among the very best.)

Eric Quincy Tate/EQT/GRC GA 10015 (EQT, after long absence takes its place in line with the ever growing list of down home Southern rockers. They bring nothing new to the genre but, they do maintain its common denominator of quality. The live side two is more document than necessary.)

Grateful Dead/BLUES FOR ALLAH/Grateful Dead GD-LA-494G (Blues for Allah puts out a Dead challenge. They are following no formulas. Their cliche-free playing and even album conceptualization require an adjustment by the audience. Touching R&B, jazz, reggae, and classics with an all Dead original stroke unifies it. Interesting and entertaining.)

Daryl Hall & John Oates/RCA APLI-1144 (A retrenching album, a time to regain a firm footing was in order. Returning to their soulful strut was correct. The super smooth Hall & Oates presentation even smooths over some rough writing edges. They come back strongly.)

Ken Hensley/EAGER TO PLEASE/Warner Bros. "Bronze
BS 2863 (With the heavy fuzz at the front of each side you
might choose to slide in deeper. The better tunes are toward
the middle and back anyhow. Hensley displays more self in
this context than with Uriah. He can be a melodious man.)

Z. Z. Hill/KEEP ON LOVIN' YOU/United Artists UA-LA417-G
(Although several tracks seem to have been released before,
the bulk of this ZZ Hill is solid in every way and new. Between Lamont Dozier and Allen Toussaint ample production
assistance assured quality. Back to the basics.)

Al Jarreau/WE GOT BY/Reprise MS 2224 (A funky jazz singer.
Al's songs sometimes depend on his considerable vocal gymnastic abilities in order to work. As a vocalist he is potential dynamite. But, he cannot depend so heavily on his pipes
to bail out the songs - they have to be solid in their own
right. Side two is stronger.)

K. C. & The Sunshine Band/T. K. 603 (Applying the song format to disco rhythm works, especially when the songs are
good. They keep it simple and cook relentlessly.)

Kraftwerk - Ralf & Florian/Vertigo VEL-2006 (Previously
reviewed as an import. Electronic music reaches its most
realized form in repetitive, ever evolving cycles as in
"Tanzmusik." It becomes environmental sound for the
cosmos, universal and spiritual. Side one is meritorious
while side two, the more successful, suggests special programming application.)

Alvin Lee/PUMP IRON!/Columbia PC 33796 (Alvin shows his
muscle electrically and acoustically. Some inconsistency
keeps the whole Lp from the sparkling quality in 3 or 4 tunes.

Jon Lucien/Columbia PC 33544 (A sumptuous album in many ways. Lucien's voice, a rich baritone, is central. The quality of the presentation, both musically and technically, is appro-

priately excellent.)

Manfred Mann's Earth Band/NIGHTINGALES & BOMBERS/
Warner Bros. -Bronze BS 2877 (Plenty of open space provides the Earth Band room to stretch out beyond the confines of the song format. They are a fusion band which still sings Their improvisational stuff is often melodically in

Moonquake/STAR STRUCK/Fantasy F-9486 (A passing acquaint-ance with early Beatles and fuzz guitar and some organically honest rock & roll songs make a powerful impression for Moonquake. Unusually consistent quality makes them a mighty

prospect.)
Geoff Muldaur/IS HAVING A WONDERFUL TIME/Reprise MS 2220 (Split personality, Side one starts in an old timey stylized groove which evolves into blues by its end, The blues dominates side two with a touch of jug band which Geoff can't get out of his system. Though the album is musically all over the place, it is brilliantly sequenced so that the journey takes on some logic.

journey takes on some logic.)

Juice Newton & Silver Spur/RCA APLI-1004 (Recognizing that the sparkling Bones Howe production brushes Juice's country-rock with some pop dust does not diminish interest. She is a fine singer applying her talent to an unusually strong batch of tunes. Otha Young & Tom Kealey provide the writing strength.

Impressive.)
Procol Harum/PROCOL'S NINTH/Chrysalis CHR 1080 (As in all Procol Harum albums a couple super songs dominate.
They deliver great assurance and with individualized style. Strong.)

Jean-Pierre Rampal & Claude Bolling/SUITE FOR FLUTE & JAZZ PIANO/Columbia M33233 (Rampal, a leading classical

JAZZ PIANO/Columbia M33233 (Rampal, a leading classical flutist, seems to surprise everyone, including the note writer, with his feeling for jazz. With classical roots dangling Rampal and Bolling tear it up in a highly dignifying manner. Reminiscent of Brubeckian sojourns. Strong.)

Renaissance/SCHEHERAZADE/Sire SASD-7510 (To their great credit Renaissance manages classical rock with none of the pomposity often disguised as music. Beyond that, superior presentation and continued melodic growth enhance their status to new levels. Strong.)

Smokey/MCA 2152 (Chinn & Chapmanare fast becoming London's Gamble-Huff. It is their writing which keeps Smokey afloat. Rich Smokey harmonizing is the attraction and point of distinction for the band. But, material is critical...beyond "Going Tomorrow" and "Umbrella Day" their own stuff is not convincing.) not convincing.)

Steppenwolf/HOUR OF THE WOLF/Epic PE 33583 (You have to respect John Kay. He is an incurable rocker with a consistent ear and taste. He knows, instinctively, just when to change pace... and he does it with unerring accuracy. Solid. Rod Stewart/ATLANTIC CROSSING/Warner Bros. BS 2875 (Rod Stewart singing the right ballad is incomparable. His phrasing and intonation approach perfection. The stars converge several times on side two. Of course, he is no slouch as a rocker either. A creative back-up insures a strong album.)

Chip Taylor/THIS SIDE OF THE BIG RIVER/Warner Bros.

Chip Taylor/THIS SIDE OF THE BIG RIVER/Warner Bros, BS 2882 (Chip's collection of perfectly round country songs are performed with an easy, precise touch. This organically whole recording is a pleasure.)

Tut Taylor/THE OLD POST OFFICE/Flying Fish 008 (Tut teams with Norman Blake and Joseph "Butch" Robins for another in a series of folkie delights. Hot pickin and some singing carry the pleasant load.)

Guthrie Thomas/I/Capitol ST-11435 (If Guthrie Thomas is his given name, it is a cosmic stroke that he turned out a singer/songwriter of this style and quality. If it is not he doesn't embarrass those illustrious names. Place him in the line with Prine and Goodman and enjoy Guthrie Thomas as much. Strong.)

Ralph Towner & Gary Burton/MATCHBOOK/ECM 1056 (An album which never sinks below impressive is a pretty good album. Such is the case here as these supremely gifted players go at it. Three tracks are nothing short of brilliant... Towners classic "Icarus," the title track, and "Aurora." This is fine modern, improvisational chamber music.) Tina Turner/ACID QUEEN/United Artists UA-LA495-G

ina Turner/ACID QUEEN/United Artists UA-LA495-G (There are a hundred reasons why the concept for side one is great. But, the reality of the result is that much of it just misses. Tina sounds uncomfortable with all of that production going on behind her... out of her element. Ike shows up to save side two by contributing production assistance and songs. It moves more naturally.) ylvia Tyson/WOMAN'S WORLD/Capitol ST-11434 (Wishing all the while that Ian's production had avoided the avoidable strings, one is still struck by the beauty of this recording. Sylvia's songs are excellent, some like "Regine" are of classic stature. The two blues songs are sung and arranged perfectly while their feeling for country music goes unquestioned. It is good to have this classy musical couple back in the studio.)

SATISFACTORY ALBUMS
(Albums of acceptable quality which, of themselves, require only secondary progressive radio consideration.)

Atlanta Rhythm Section/DOG DAYS/Polydor PD 6041
(Atlanta Rhythm Section would be better off playing half as well as they do while doubling their writing ability. They remain a band in search of songs. "All Night Rain" is best.)

J. D. Blackfoot/SOUTHBOUND & GONE/Fantasy F. 9487

(Maybe not too distinctive but, certainly an articulate band.

Blackfoot's songs and production are clearly solid though that may not be enough. Some uniqueness is needed to get past good.)

Gene Corman/Thimble TLP-7 (A sense on underdoneness throughout, some listless tunes and one badly distorted track hold back the 3 or 4 tracks which must be heard. The last 3 tracks on side one and the first on side 2 require attention.)
Coke Escovedo/Mercury SRM 1-1041 (Coke Escovedo's still an artist of indeterminant direction. Azteca was fragmented too. Is he Latin or black, male or female, hot or cool? He wants to be everything without unifying the individual parts. Though we find the album's conceptualization weak, its presentation is not.)

entation is not.)

Hammersmith/Mercury SRM 1-1040 (Material of little socially redeming value holds back the energies of Hammersmith.

Because of weak material they remain just another group reaching for the younger audience in spite of good performing ability.)

Frank Hayhurst/YOUR LOVE, MY LOVE/Fantasy F. 9485

Frank Hayhurst/YOUR LOVE, MY LOVE/Fantasy F. 9485
(Frank has a strange singing voice which only sounds good when harmonized. Too often he is left out there alone. The arrangements too, could have done more to transmit his songs better. Several of them are worthwhile.)

HUB/Capitol ST-11439 (Hub rides on robust energy with little essence. They have a nack for choosing material to suppliment their limited writing. Everyone elses old tricks and good intentions aren't a sound basis upon which to build a band. A poor man's Three Dog.)

Ice/IMPORT-EXPORT/Prestige P-10096 (Solid presentation makes the material passable but not more. Ice needs its own sound rather than their mixed bag personality. Working every R&B groove is simply too broad today.)

Shawn Phillips/DO YOU WONDER/A&M SP-4539 (Let's talk frankly about Shawn Phillips, cult figure. His dual personality, rocker and deep thinker, are again separated. He start as a rocker on side one giving us two real songs, the title track and "Blunt & Frank." Side two gets heavy. Mostly pretentious. "Golden Flower" is its only meaningful contribution. A three tune album isn't enough.) He starts pretentious. "Golden Flower" is its only me tribution. A three tune album isn't enough.)

UNDISTINGUISHED ALBUMS
(In our opinion, below standard Lps except where noted.)

Deodato/FIRST CUCKOO/MCA 491 (Well Deodato finally sheds most of his overdone string arranging and, in doing so, reveals what some have long suspected...he is pretty shallow. His music is gutless and empty. Beyond "Funk Yourself" this Lp offers little.)

CONCEPTS

Programming: Instinct & Intellect

There exists in progressive radio a great programming philosophy schism. It's raw nerve was recently exposed by Jon Houghton's editorial in these pages where he argued forcefully against over intellectualization in progressive radio. He would argue for a programmer to rely on an instinctual sense of what is good music to play and would assume that the programmer is an organic part of the audience to which the communication is aimed. In fact, he would not accept the implication that program material is aimed. He would send it out and expect those who want that approach to find it on the radio dial, whoever and wherever they are.

Houghton's view faces down the ever growing reliance in progressive radio on charts and graphs - store reports, trade publications and ratings. And it is the kind of appeal to a vagabond hipness which elicites a viscerally positive response in many of the old-time progressive radio souls...those still paying attention paying attention.

The emergence of pop-progressive radio with its more organized, more restricted approach is an unhappy reality to that element. But, there is a middle ground to which neither side has given a proper ear.

It has always been the philosophy of this publication that in is going on around them a formed decision making was a good thing, even, may we would Radio in own unique essence.

when all of progressive radio was made up of vagabond audio-philes, that was our stated philosophy. We believe in the in-tellectual approach to our medium but, we emphatically do not believe that that relieves the programming department from tuning itself into its own feelings.

It is our conviction that instinct and intellect are not mutually exclusive, they can live together in the same head. In fact, they often do. Further, we would argue that the medium does not reach its pinnacle until the marriage of instinct and intellect is working together in proper proportion. The human who denies all he has learned is as foolish as the human who denies his feelings. They must interact.

As musical examples of the radio programming argument we would offer Mick Jagger, Pete Townshend, Joni Mitchell, Elton John, John McLaughlin, and Stevie Wonder, among others, as specimens who unite instinct and intellect to reach the pinnacle of their medium. None of them is operating in a vacuum yet, each has created his or her own space. Inspiration and skills converge,
