Our statistics are a quantitative reflection of current Lp acceptance based on our contributors' reports. Progressive Retail Reaction is derived from Top 15 retail reports while New Retail Action is derived from New Reaction reports. Both are weighted to compensate for the size of the store chain.

Radio Emphasis is computed by counting radio reports of Audience Reaction and Heavy Airplay. (Heavy Airplay new additions are not included.) New Releases to Watch is calculated by counting all indicated New Additions and weighing them according to heavy or moderate play. All calculations are first done regionally then combined to form the national totals.

NEW RELEASES

Below is a catalogue of new releases. They are divided into categories designed to give you an idea of their relative musical worth. These first impressions are not meant to relate in anyway to past, present or future sales, nor should they be taken as the word of God.

SPECIAL MENTION ALBUMS

(These recordings which, in our opinion, deserve special mention because they come closest to perfecting their musical genre regardless of progressive radio application.)

STRONGLY MERITORIOUS

(The following Lps are Merit Albums which we feel have an extra edge.)

- Jimmy Cliff/IN CONCERT THE BEST OF/Reprise MS 2256
(A slight lack of presence diminishes the record's impact. For example, the normally riveting opening notes of "Mary Rivers to Cross" aren't as chilling as they can be. Still it is quibbling when discussing a great artist's great songs.)
- Dave Mason/CERTIFIED LIVE/Columbia PG 34174 (Dave's expression of relaxed enjoyment on the cover telegraphs the spirit which pervades the music contained inside. His greatest hits give him, his audience, and the record listener a warm reward.)
- Miroslav Vitous/MAJESTY MUSIC/Arista AL 4099 (It is not that every track on Vitous' Lp is engaging, though most are. Rather, his record gains importance as a daring musical adventure in a world of musical Xeroxes. Challengin and exciting in many ways.)
- Various Artists/ALL THIS AND WORLD WAR II/20th Century 2T-522 (Fortunately, it is no longer a sacrilege to record Beatles songs as it once was. Unfortunately, Lou Reizner remained trapped in the original conception of these songs, so that this album does little more than recapitulate. Still, it is the project of the year, just thinking about putting something like this together boggles the mind. Fine performances all around.)
- Bobby Womack/HOME IS WHERE THE HEART IS/Columbia PC34384 (This modern production evolves directly out of the classic rhythm and blues feel that fostered Otis Redding, James Brown and so many others. Bobby returned to Muscle Shoals to get refreshed in the life spirit, the natural juices. Real music, beautiful.)

MERIT PLUS ALBUMS

(This is a temporary category to help distinguish these Merit Albums which tend, in our opinion, to be better than the other Merit Albums. There may be only a percentage point's difference between them but, with the volume of good albums around it seems necessary to make the distinction.)

- Jackson Browne/THE PRETENDERS/Asylum 7E-1079
(Jackson hangs around the top of the singer/songwriter genre all of the time. He reaches to the beyond when he adds special touches as in "Linda Paloma." An error free recording.)
- The Charlie Daniels Band/HIGH LONESOME/Epic PE 34377
(Comfortable like a well made suit of clothes, the Charlie Daniels Band plays for enjoyment. There is not an ounce of pretention here.)
- Dirty Angels/KISS TOMORROW GOODBYE/Private Stock PS 2020 (It feels right from the first note. The Dirty Angels update classic rock sounds - guitar chords and rhythm patterns - to make rock and roll right for the times. The rejuvenated New York rock scene continues to spill out onto the rest of us.)
- Funkadelic/HARDCORE JOLLIES/Warner Bros. BS 2973
(Finding your own place on the musical continuum is an artist's first chore. Funkadelic has done that, they stand alone with Parliament, if that's possible. They are funky and psychedelic but, they are also tremendously creative. Another high score.)
- George Grizbach/HAD YOUR GRITZ TODAY?/Kicking Mule KM 126 (It is hard to imagine not being comfortable with the sound of real blues in the background. George delivers that wonderfully organic feeling with each tune. A strong musical sense guides him.)
- Groundhogs/BLACK DIAMOND/United Artists UA-LA 680-G
(One of their best albums in a long time sees the Groundhogs move closer to real music. Their songs are consistently solid and their play organically married to them. Good show from this perennial.)
- Graham Parker/HEAT TREATMENT/Mercury SRM1-1117
(Dragging a host of influences into his music, Graham issues his second impressive Lp. The first introduced him, this one takes him to the next level. He is a strong writer.)
- Tom Petty & The Heartbreakers/Shelter SRL 52006 (Rock and roll with a twist of the weird. Tom sets his music in a very New Yorkish context. Good songs and his stylized approach to them, add welcome character to the scene.)

MERIT PLUS ALBUMS CONTINUED

- Jean-Luc Ponty/IMAGINARY VOYAGE/Atlantic SD 18195 (Ponty's fusionist drive strikes a responsive chord. Surrounded by melodious soloists, he is able to extend the formula with gripping runs. Thoroughly accomplished.)
- Max Romeo & The Upsetters/WAR IN A BABYLON/Island ILPS 9392 (Basic purity strikes at the musical cortex. Lee Perry's production keeps the accompaniment simple and precise. Romeo's songs are pretty good too.)
- The Earl Scruggs Revue/FAMILY PORTRAIT/Columbia PC 34346 (The Scruggs' family portraits are always in focus and well cropped, only quality images develop. This album is no exception. Young Steve does a fine job.)
- Foghat/NIGHT SHIFT/Bearsville BR 6962 (Foghat's lesson to all rockers who may follow their path is that fuzz is no replacement for solid material. This group endures because of their genuine essence.)

MERIT ALBUMS

(Our recommendations for serious progressive radio consideration, recognizing that not all Merit Albums are suitable for all stations.)

- Mike Berry/ROCK'S IN MY HEAD/Sire SASD 7524 (Mike's reverence for the old days, Buddy Holly in particular, puts limitations on his appeal. It would be less a factor if he reversed the percentage of old to new material. He needn't change the presentation. He does have undeniable roots appeal. Feels good.)
- Paul Coyle/ON ST. JOHN'S EVE/Pharoah PHA 105 (Between a subpar pressing and the investigation needed to find out who the artist is, Pharoah Records makes Paul Coyle's audience work to hear his music. Paul's intentions are not thoroughly clear but, his contemporary jazz is very listenable. A more cogent direction would help all around.)
- Deep Purple/MADE IN EUROPE/Warner Bros.-Purple PR2995 (Through the smoke screen rather good melodies emerge. They reveal themselves in spite of some unimpressive mastering and mixing which sets the vocals almost in the background. Power with substance is the key.)
- Kinky Friedman/LASSO FROM EL PASO/Epic PE 34304 (You have to love Kinky's attitude. It is the embodiment of the rock & roll spirit. "When it gets too kinky for the rest of the world, it's gettin' just right for me." Friedman's voice holds him back, he might have to drop those ceegars.)
- Gabriel/SWEET RELEASE/ABC ABCD-972 (Their well performed songs all have nice hooks but, Gabriel has no hook as a group. Nice music isn't enough. They tend to blend in.)
- John Hammond/SOLO/Vanguard VSD 79380 (John's reverence for the blues and skill in retrieving them is a great credit. This live album captures his essence well. It may not be for a mass audience but, that doesn't matter.)
- Bo Hansson/ATTIC THOUGHTS/Sire SASD 7525 (Previously reviewed as an import. Bo Hansson plays amiable, melodious instrumental music with no pizzazz. Without that extra enticement he will have difficulty breaking out of the pack.)
- Roy Head/A HEAD OF HIS TIME/ABC Dot DOSD-2066 (In fine rockabilly tradition Roy stretches the country-rock genre, coming at it from the country side. A fine performance and quality sonics give the well chosen set of songs a right nice spin.)
- Jerry Jaye/HONKY TONK WOMEN.../Hi SHL 32102 (Natural country music, Texas style. Jerry's low-key presentation is punctuated only with good songs. That is all he needs.)
- Kiss/ROCK & ROLL OVER/Casablanca NBLP 7037 (Kiss is less of a gimmick and more of a group. On this album they sing their songs and, although they won't replace Dylan, the tunes are O. K. Still power packed, they are now palatable.)
- Al Kooper/ACT LIKE NOTHING'S WRONG/United Artists UA-LA 702-G (Al has gathered himself up to do a complete album for a change. A fair proportion of it is substantial, some is overdone but, no loose ends are left. His weak voice is well produced to mask its deficiencies, he is a good singer.)
- O'Donel Levy/WINDOWS/Groove Merchant GM 3313 (Levy's career has not followed on an aesthetic straight line. Bouncing from style to style, he lands here in an intense modern mode. It is his most appealing effort.)
- Murray McLachlan/BOULEVARD/Island ILTN 9423 (Previously reviewed as an import. A thoughtful writer who has gone under acclaimed, Murray deserves better. Here he turns out yet another solid folk-rockin' album.)
- Melanie/PHOTOGRAPH/Atlantic SD 18190 (Aside from some production overstatement, Melanie delivers a quality album. Her writing is melodious and her voice is as distinctive as always. Well done.)
- Nazareth/PLAY'N' THE GAME/A&M SP 4610 (A mature Nazareth rocks forcefully but, without the pandering which has sometimes infested their music. The counterpoint of "I Don't Want To Go On Without You" adds some class to the proceedings. Rock without guilt.)
- Leo Sayer/ENDLESS FLIGHT/Warner Bros. BS 2962 (This very well constructed album presents a bright Leo Sayer, changing up on the restraint of his last Lp. Here both the writing and production situation changes. This approach saps some of the Sayer individuality.)
- Red Steagall/TEXAS RED/ABC Dot DOSD-2068 (Texas country done in Nashville smells as sweet but, does not sound as sweet. Excellent material issued except for the choice of "I Left My Heart in S. F.," which does not translate. Exuberant presentations feel good.)
- Wishbone Ash/NEW ENGLAND/Atlantic SD 18200 (Is the title New England supposed to point to the Aerosmith/Boston sound? Wishbone does seem to add a buzz to their sound. It helps by giving their borderline melodies needed punch. Still, their dual guitars are the group's salvation.)
- Frank Zappa/ZOOT ALLURES/Warner Bros. BS 2970 (Zappa's name conjures images of the more than slightly bent. To his credit he always challenges our normal perceptions. Even his punk rock and his standard blues are off center.)

SATISFACTORY ALBUMS

(Albums of acceptable quality which, of themselves, require only secondary progressive radio consideration.)

- Papaya/Wolf WR 7620 (A less than taut rhythm section forces the bottom out of a good musical idea. Their light Latin-jazz has real charm and better presentation could have made for a more tasty Papaya. Write Wolf Records at 615 E. Pike St., Seattle, Wash.)
- Travis, Shook & The Club Wow/THE ESSENTIAL/Just Like Real Records JLR 333 (An appealing musical style does not always get the material it deserves. Their warm acoustic jazzy feel is often on the borderline of breaking down completely because of it. They need more work at this worthy approach.)
- David Soul/Private Stock PS 2019 (Soul really should never have been signed. He has nothing to offer as a singer at this time. Elliot Mazer's production intercedes to avoid embarrassment. It holds the album up but, cannot give it a reason to be.)

FRINGE ALBUMS

(Good albums which are not progressive, yet hold some interest for progressive audiences.)

- The Blackbyrds/UNFINISHED BUSINESS/Fantasy F9518 (It is a shame that the Blackbyrds spend their energy working at 1/2 their ability. They are capable of so much more. This pop-R&B format hits the commercial spot.)
- Brass Construction/II/United Artists UA-LA 677-G (Under the creative direction of Jeff Lane, Brass Construction puts a progressive stroke into R&B-disco music. The arrangements are complex and intense but, never lose the heart-beat. Best of its class.)
- Billy "Crash" Craddock/CRASH/ABC Dot DOSD 2063 (Craddock's rockabilly is sometimes masked by Nashville overproduction. Still, he reveals, as he always does, a true rock spirit. Find the rockers.)
- Diamond Reo/DIRTY DIAMONDS/Kama Sutra KSBS 2619 (Distinguishing genuine from punk rockers is easy, just listen for their roots. If their music is all style and moves, not based on a good song, then they are punkers. Adrian Barber said, "Power is their essence, "in talking about Diamond Reo. He's right. Punk.)
- Mickey Gilley/GILLEY'S SMOKIN'/Playboy PB415 (When Mickey looks into the mirror he sees Jerry Lee Lewis's reflection. Both his piano and vocal style are so strikingly Jerry Lee that at times they go beyond derivation, moving into the realm of imitation. If you like the former, you'll like the latter.)
- Frannie Golde/Atlantic SD 18196 (Glossy, hip M. O. R.)
- Leroy Hutson/HUTSON II/Curtom CU 5011 (Interspersed with his standard pop R&B presentation are a few instrumentals and a song or two which imply greater depth. Those excursions are clustered on side two.)
- Instant Funk/GET DOWN WITH THE PHILLY JUMP/TSOP PZ34358 (Instant Funk doesn't work the song format often. Mostly they stick to repetitive disco rhythm figures. A funky background.)
- Kool & The Gang/OPEN SESAME/De-Lite DDJ 2023 (The Gang puts itself in the fringes with less than exciting song-writing and fewer of those hot rhythm things. An almost sweet air covers this mellowed approach.)
- Hugh Masekela/MELODY MAKER/Casablanca NBLP-7036 (Always tasty, Masekela continues his more pop directed flow leaving room for a single instrumental gem called "Toejam." His textured trumpet lead is missed as it is replaced by lyrics and other miscellanea.)
- Rex/Columbia PC 34399 (Audacity, more than talent or material, drives the Rex frenzy. Their intense primal scream will part your hair and wither your resistance. Punkish to the core.)
- Stanley Turrentine/THE MAN WITH THE SAD FACE/Fantasy F9519 (Anyone committed to real music will don a sad face when hearing this elevator-Turrentine.)

CONCEPTS

Musical Directing 101

The all-thinking, all preceiving, all-feeling music director, it is presumed, does certain things regularly. Listening to lots of music and dealing with promotion people are rather routine functions. Hopefully, the listening is done on half decent equipment and the greeting is done with a modicum of courtesy. Further, it is assumed that some amount of reading trades is done to get a perspective on the world outside.

Here, however, we would like to concentrate on the inner world, the kind and quality of local research. In the end that is more important than any of the other sub-jobs of the music director.

Two areas in particular are notable. First, store reporting which is done in standard manner that is, calling a series of stores, is not enough. To enhance the quality of the information we'd like to suggest that personal contact helps. Several afternoons each and every week can be well spent in stores watch-

ing the process and building relationships with store personnel. Supplemented by calls, the best possible retail information can be had. But, stores offer only part of the music information available.

Concerts are a rarely tapped source. Too often they are not attended or attended only when a particularly appealing artist is playing. However, as many concerts as possible should be seen, if not for enjoyment, then to gauge the audiences' reaction to both stars and the second-bill artists. Also to gauge which audience is reacting to what artist. Are they 14 years old, 19 years old or 25 years old?

It is this kind of research subtlety which can put 3 or 4 important new artists on a station per year. It can make a difference. We prefer not to use research in the traditional sense, to confirm the hits. Rather, to find the new artists who add spice to our musical lives.

With the addition of Jeff Baxter and Michael McDonald to the band, the Doobies are reversing this trend and creating some of the best original rock to come out of this country today. The current touring band consists of the regular six members (minus Tom Johnston) as well as a percussionist and the five Memphis Horns. Surprisingly, Skunk leads the band, while Patrick Simmonds is the focal point of the show. All the hits were there as well as a few old favorites. Musicianship was excellent the entire evening with standout performances from each individual. The most impressive instrument of the night though was Michael McDonald's voice. Unlike many bands who tend to take themselves too seriously, the Funky Kings loosened up enough to deliver two hilarious numbers: "Mango Love," an impassioned reggae send up and "Killing Me Softly With Kung Fu," a great take off on the Roberta Flack classic. Unfortunately, on this particular night, being funny simply didn't make up for lack of musical punch. Daryl Hall and John Oates, on the other hand, could hardly have delivered more. Vocally, they were superb. Tight crisp harmonies and excellent lead vocals are their main appeal on record and they executed these flawlessly. An added surprise was provided by their incredible back up band which contributed an energy to Hall & Oates' music which simply can't be found on their recorded works. Live, Hall & Oates can really rock! I've made similar observations concerning other groups such as Fleetwood Mac and the Jefferson Starship. There seems to be an MOR approach to album production these days which tends to push a band's powerful instrumental work into the background while emphasizing the vocals. In terms of a compromise towards top 40's radio this may make sense but it greatly diminishes the impact of the music on record. Thankfully, this particular show was recorded for an upcoming live album. Like Frampton's live recording this Hall & Oates album based on what I heard could push them into the mass acceptance that they deserve.

I was at a loss to find any holes in the stage performance or material or the production... solid and straightforward and soooooo fine!!

Reviewer's Reaction: On this Halloween night, what could be a more fitting concert than to see the living skull himself, Lou Reed. Hot off the tracks of a new album, Reed and band displayed one of the most primitive and intense rock concerts I have witnessed since his days with the Velvet Underground. With a wall of 48 televisions flashing patterns along with the music behind the band and only 3 spotlights hitting the stage, it gave a perfect setting for Reed's already dark music. With a solid band and Reed being the only guitarist (as it should be) the music didn't stop rocking for 3 hours. Reed played everything you would want to hear, but played only 3 Velvet favorites during the set. But after two encores, which included "Heroin" "Rock 'n' Roll" and "Sister Ray" back to back, the crowd, who had been on its feet a number of times during the show, got more than they hoped for from Lou Reed; a true rocker if there ever was one.
