RADIO STATS

OUR RELATIVE CHARTING, AS SEEN BELOW, RESEMBLES BASEBALL'S BATTING AVERAGES. IT ESTABLISHES A RATIO BETWEEN THE IDEAL, (HEAVY AIRPLAY AT EVERY STATION WHICH REPORTED), AND THE WEIGHTED COUNT THAT A RECORDING HAS ACTUALLY EARNED. THIS MATHEMATICAL FORMULA IS APPLIED TO EACH RECORD—FIRST REGIONALLY, THEN NATIONALLY. A DUAL WEIGHTING SYSTEM IS USED TO DERIVE THE COUNT. IT ADJUSTS FOR MARKET SIZE AND FOR HEAVY OR MODERATE AIRPLAY. THESE CHARTS SHOW THE RELATIVE INTENSITY OF RADIO AIRPLAY FOR BOTH NEW AND ESTABLISHED RECORDINGS.

At its zenith Newspace offered its 15 California affiliates superb daily newscasts on hi fidelity lines. Ace Young (KMET) anchored the morning, Tony Russomano (WQIV, WNUS) and Michael Linder (WQIV, WNEW-FM) took care of the afternoons.

Newspace was the first FM News Network ever attempted that was geared specifically to the AOR/Progressive format. They made ABC-FM look pale by comparison. And they came so, so close to "making it"... breaking even on their Calif. operation, later on going National.

Ace, Tony, Michael and the other folks that ran the shop are all out of a job now. And their investors are out a lot of money. But while I feel sorry for my friends, what bothers me more is that the newest wave of electronic journalism was nipped in the bud. And on that score we are all losers.

In other, happier news... WCOZ's "Rumpsticker" promotion has been incredibly successful. We've given away 3500 of the embroidered patches with 'COZ logo, then went out spotting them, awarding prizes to folks wearing them: 2 ten speed bikes, free 'COZ T-shirts, bike bags, Wrangler jeans, etc.

As this issue goes to press all of us 'COZers are recovering from seasickness, as our COZ/Kingfish promotion took us off the coast of New England with 20 listeners for a day of deep sea fishing.

Much to their credit, the audience, composed of all sizes and ages, remained enthusiastic and well-mannered, despite overcrowding and temperatures well over 100°, dancing and cheering the entire evening. An amusing thought - there were more people crammed into the Athens High School football stadium that night, then live in the whole town! Traffic flowing in and out provided almost as much talk as the concert.

Post writer Lou O'Neill, Jr. The orchestra is nearly as funny as Flo and Eddie, the kings of (the neglected field of) rock satire. However, Rhoades and company's show - though enjoyable - revealed two problems. First, the material performed was so visual that translating it to vinyl will not be easy. Second, the audience will need knowledge of the rock scene to appreciate certain spoofs; for example, the Allman bit loses some impact if one doesn't know who Scooter is. Nevertheless, the effort shown by their 13 piece band is commendable. Their ability to remain together, put on a fine show, and survive (without a record contract) gives hope that these two problems can be overcome. I certainly hope that they will be.

Spinning out of the Parliament-Funkadelic tension ring Hazel rescues 'California Dreamin'', among others, from cliché.)

MERIT PLUS ALBUMS

(All Merit and Merit Plus Albums are recommended for serious progressive radio consideration, recognizing that not all of these recommendations are suitable for all stations. The Merit Plus Albums distinguish themselves with an extra vitality.)

The Animals/BEFORE WE WERE SO RUDELY INTERRUPTED/Net JT-LA 740-M (This must be a solid Lp - Eric Burdon does some real singing for a change. The band is fantastic - Alan Price's keyboards and Chas Chandler's bass lay it right in there. One order of the blues on rye, to g.)

Elvie Bishop/LIVE! RAISIN' HELL/Capricorn 2 CP 0185 (Too much fun and too many fine, organic songs to dismiss this as merely a live Lp. In it, this Elvin Bishop album carries the essence of what music is all about.)

Ry Cooder/SHOW TIME/Warner Bros. BS 3059 (Called the Chicken Skin Revue, Ry's show isn't a polished, slick staging. Instead, it is more like an ethnic festival. It celebrates the joy of music and exemplifies his exquisite taste. Music as fun, not as business.)

Crawler/Epic PE 82083 (Paul Kossoff is gone and the label has changed and Crawler has made adjustments. They are highlighted by a vastly improved rhythm feel. Approaching Little Feat, Crawler even sports a few very special songs. Don't miss "Without You Babe," "Never Loved a Woman" and "Stone Cold Barber." Finally, Terry Wilson Slesser's singing puts him in a league with the best.)

Sonny Fortune/SERENGETI MINSTRAL/Atlantic SD 18225 (Sonny may not possess the soaring, indelible tone of a Gato or a Pharoah but, here he surrounds himself with an infectious Afro-Cuban rhythm and it doesn't matter. Nice melodies are the consumer guarantee of a joy ride.)

Nick Glider/YOU KNOW WHO YOU ARE/Chrysalis CHR-1147 (This time the careful production skills of Stuart Love are applied to some decent songs. The stylized approach which he and Nick have worked out adds some color to the scene while it removes Nick from the tired singer/songwriter genre.)

Mylon Le Fevre/WEAK AT THE KNEES/Warner Bros. BS 3070 (Mylon's music is imbued with a strongly Southern feel, as it should be. He gathers some tasty material into his sound bringing success into view. He nicely tags the processings a touch of his gospel roots.)

Magma/JDU WINDU/Tomato TOM 6001 (The level of creation on the part of Christian Vander is extraordinary. As the drummer, leader of Magma he sets a staggering example. His mega-dense jazz-space-rock formulation is more awesome than pretty.)

Hirth Martinez/BIG BRIGHT STREET/Warner Bros. BS 3031 (If a meeting of crazed musical characters were called, Hirth Martinez would be on the board of directors. He is crazed, charmingly, and he is musical, absolutely. His up tempo shuffles tend to flow best. Tasty.)

Charles Mingus/THREE OR FOUR SHADES OF BLUES/Atlantic SD 1700 (All of the afternoon sessions which pose as jazz recordings today, pale into the insignificance we've always known them to be, in the face of the first side of this Charles Mingus album. Eloquent and beautiful, it is not avant garde. Instead it defines mainstream. Side 2 jams nicely.)

Gary Ogan/Paradise PA 3078 (The arrangements are often interesting and Gary's voice is that of a pure singer. Those advantages serve to deliver Ogan's ever more impressive songwriting, even more impressively. There is talent in these grooves.)

Pine Island/LIVE INSIDE/Fretless FR 124 (Bi-musical, Pine Island switches between bluegrass and country swing easily. They play energetically and fluidly, presenting a delightful, total Lp. Distributed by Philo.)

MERIT ALBUMS

Blackfoot Sue/STRANGERS/Import IMP 1007 (Side one and side two are different breeds. The front side reveals a good rock band operating under the broad Beatles umbrella. However, side two takes some chances and, therefore, generates more interest. "Join Together" is the event on an album filled with ditties.)

Michael Bloomfield/ANALINE/Takoma B-1034 (Seems like Michael could have made this move a long time ago. Here, without the need to come up with the magic commercial formula, he is able to play the music which comes naturally to him. A tasty, mellow portrait emerges.)

Captain Lockheed & The Starfighter-/Import IMP 1011 (Previously reviewed as an import. A concept album with a story line around the rebuilding of the German air force. Melodrama alternates with Hawkwind style heavy rock. Both the concept and presentation are creatively vital and successfully brought off. The wings stand up by themselves.)

Colosseum II/ELECTRIC SAVAGE/MCA MCA 2294 (Previously reviewed as an import. One of the early fusion bands returns in about the same musical shape as when they dropped out. They are commanding instrumentally yet, only fair writers. When their melodies catch up to their technique Colosseum II approaches importance.)

Commander Cody/ROCK AND ROLL AGAIN/Arista AL 4125 (This loose bar band has been harnessed and harnessed. The production controls and arranging enhancements sometimes take precedence over the music itself. Rock and Roll Again is better than some of Cody Lps, in the album sense, but it doesn't lift off, in musical sense.)

Michael Henderson/GOIN' PLACES/Buddah BDS 5093 (Not that he is the first artist to sing in falsetto but, Michael Henderson's baritone to falsetto strides brand him an extraordinary vocalist. What elevates him even more is his already established masterful bass playing. He, with Miles Davis, and Larry Graham with Sly Stone, should be credited with the invention of the hot rhythm/disco formula which is omnipresent. These songs aren't always the best. Standouts are "Goin' Places" and "Won't You Be Mine.")

The Jam/IN THE CITY/Polydor PD-1-6110 (Previously reviewed as an import. From the bowels of inner city urban life comes more and more New Wave rock. The Jam is part of that generation. They make the Rolling Stones seem tame. Audition carefully before airing.)

Freddie King/1934-1976/RSO RSI-3025 (These bits and pieces make up an album well worth releasing. Some live things show Freddie's ability to cook it, while some studio things show the subtleties in his expansive talent.)

Mads Vinding Group featuring Janne Schaffer/DANISH DESIGN/Peters International CCLPS 9018 (Knowing Schaffer's work and the quality of the musicians Europe is capable of fostering, the expectation for this contemporary jazz band are high. As players they live up to most of those expectations while as musicians they just begin to. The riveting, enticing, minor alterations are not here, though nothing sends you away either.)

Murray McLauchlan & The Silver Tractors/HARD ROCK TOWN/True North ILTN 9466 (After years of recording, some of them awfully quiet, Murray nears the small circle which centers around Springsteen and Seger. This album has those kinds of moments in it. A bit more consistency is needed to place him only a step away.)

Neutrons/BLACK HOLE STAR/Import IMP 1010 (Previously reviewed as an import. Excellent instrumentalists, especially keyboardist Phil Ryan who manipulates sound in most pleasant ways. When the songs are right it all fits together nicely.)

Alan O'Day/APPETIZERS/Pacific PC 4300 (In some ways you could view this Lp as perfection. Alan is a good singer and a noted writer and few mistakes are made. Further, Steve Barri and Michael O'Martian are top notch producers insuring the album's quality. The hitch is in all of the insurance. Appetizers is too pat, too safe, it never takes a chance. It is rarely inventive. Paint by numbers.)

Tom Paxton/NEWS SONG FROM THE BRIARPATCH/Vanguard VSD-79395 (A trooper, still trouncing. We find Tom Paxton the same enjoyable entertainer as remembered. This live recording captures that while his liner notes display a note of resignation. These good old days are gone forever.)

Colin Scot/Import IMP 1009 (Clearly a production which was deliberate and thoughtful. The contribution made by the presentation is considerable, especially when compared to the songs. Mental melodies simply don't reach out to the ear in spite of the work which went into their delivery. "Hey! Sandy" is the best of them and it got buried deep in side two.)

MERIT ALBUMS CONTINUED

- The Silvertones/ONE CHANCE WITH YOU/Blind Pig BP 002-77 (The Silvertones' fixation in the post-war 1940's is fun. A loose production of swing tunes with a blues twinge does the trick. Their "Flip, Flop & Fly" sets the mood. Write: 208 S. First St., Ann Arbor, Mich. 48103.)
- The Staples/FAMILY TREE/Warner Bros. BS 3064 (Hot rhythm songs abound. The Staples have that formula down pat. While you don't get great songs out of it, the mighty groove keeps you involved.)
- Jody Stecher/GOING UP ON THE MOUNTAIN/Bay 210 (Traditional folkies have a new name to remember. Among others, John Herald aides in Jody's comfortable musical album. Virtuosity is mercifully not this LP's aim, the music comes first. Write: 1516 Oak Street, Alameda, Calif. 94501.)
- Stillwater/Capricorn CP-0186 (There is quite a leap between being a good musician and the ability to write songs. Stillwater has a tendency to stagnate when the lyrics have to fit into the musical setting. A song is a delicate balance which they do not always manage. They do manage the problem enough to interest the ear.)
- Various Artists/BIONIC GOLD/Big Sound BS LP 001 (Bionic Gold steps forward into the new back-to-the-basics school of music. These remakes of the early sixties music don't always hold up and some versions do more of recalling the original than they do in establishing themselves. Still, the future will not be lacking for strong artists.)
- Various Artists/CHICAGO BLUES AT HOME/Advent 2806 (Blues fans will find great enjoyment locked in these tracks. The migration of musicians from the rural South to Chicago has yielded a special species of blues player. Because it reflects few of the stars of that scene, the quality of these casual records demonstrates the richness and depth of it.)

SATISFACTORY ALBUMS

(Albums of acceptable quality, which, of themselves, require only secondary progressive radio consideration.)

- Bad Boy/THE BAND THAT MILWAUKEE MADE FAMOUS/United Artists UA-LA 781-G (This is the best Bad Boy will ever sound. Tightened by Bob Brown's production and enhanced by Steve Hunter's guitar, they still lack authentic purpose. The LP strides and postures but, it doesn't sing its own point of view.)

FRINGE ALBUMS

(Good albums which are not progressive, yet hold some interest for progressive audiences.)

- Chet Atkins/ME AND MY GUITAR/RCA APL 1-2405 (It's pretty much agreed that Chet Atkins rates highly among guitarists. It is only his slightly hokey approach to the material which puts us off. By side stepping the stuff at the front of each side you can find more uplifting music such as his version of Don McLean's "Vincent.")
- James Brown/MUTHA'S NATURE/Polydor PD 1-6111 (Chasin' that rabbit, James Brown continues too hard to find the handle. He is falsely humble at one time, and pushy at another. His preaching misses the point. He needs good material and a producer to bring him into the '70's and out of this artistically incestuous trap he's in. Spinning wheels.)
- Keni Burke/Dark Horse DH 3022 (A lovely album. It moves on swinging, airy rhythms and easy, enjoyable tunes. Keni updates an old Motown feel to our advantage. Try "From Me to You.")
- Mass Production/BELIEVE/Cottillion SD 9918 (Mass Production in some ways lives up to their name by stamping out a carbon copy pop R&B groove. They distinguish themselves by generating an energized performance and by a track like "Cosmic Lust" which breaks form in a jazzy way.)
- David Matthews/DUNE/CTI 75005 (On both a recent Muse LP and this LP David contrasts combo and orchestra. But, he is an orchestrator by trade and so, his albums take on a crafty easy listening feel. His remake of Bowie's "Space Oddity" gives it a remarkable new face.)
- Kenny Rogers/DAYTIME FRIENDS/United Artists UA-LA 754-G (Rogers is the quintessential crossover artist. He is a progressive MOR, country, folk-rock singer, if you need a label. His marvelous voice makes up for some of his sins of indiscriminateness. "Rock & Roll Man" could be played.)
- Gary Toms/TURN IT OUT/MCA 2289 (Gary Toms adds interest to his disco. His arrangements are saturated with either enticing sounds swirling tirelessly or lyrics which get beyond breathing. Toms' music is hotter than hot.)
- Brenton Wood/COME SOFTLY/Cream CR 1006 (It's a matter of degree. Brenton Wood is a wonderful Sam Cooke-ish R&B singer who gets arranged and conducted a little too much for us. His voice and the chosen material are of serious interest. A could-have-been.)

SPECIAL PROGRAMMING

(Spoken, poetry - comedy and extraneous musics.)

- David Bedford/NURSES SONG WITH ELEPHANTS/Import IMP 1008 (Intellectual and avant garde and rather amusing. This is Bedford's first album, dating from 1972, and is released now to fill in his discography as much as for any other reason.)
- John Cage/Tomato TOM 2-1001 (His concept is simple, by preparing a normal piano (by inserting screws between the strings inside) you change the piano to a percussive orchestra under the control of one person. In 1937 the concept was revolutionary. Today we have a synthesizer which requires a soldering iron instead of a screwdriver but, the idea is transferrable and often is. John Cage should be listened to because he is a bridge between serious classical music and the avant garde.)
- Chick Corea-Dave Holland-Barry Altschul/A. R. C. /ECM 1-1009 (A. R. C. represents Chick Corea's more abstract days in Germany. Recorded in 1971 it combines the intensity of contemporary music with the intellect, some what short circuiting the spiritual. Skillful play.)
- The Gods featuring Ken Hensley/Import IMP 1012 (Previously reviewed as an import. This is Hensley's college band. They recorded in the late sixties. It's basic stuff but provides an historical perspective on the evolution of Uriah Heep. Lee Kerslake went to Uriah with Ken. History.)
- Larry Karush-Glen Moore/MAY 24, 1976/ECM 1-1901 (Intellectual, mildly obtuse and skillfully brought off. But, for all of his improvisational ability Larry Karush is not very musical. "Triads" is the track which comes closest to marry skill and spirit which in turn, is what it's really all about.)
- The Silver Bow/SHETLAND FOLK FIDDLING/Philo 2019 (The harmonized fiddling music of the North Sea's Shetland Islands is beautiful. It is a more pleasant, but very similar to the sound of the bagpipes of their Scottish neighbors. At the roots of our folk music.)
- Son of Morris On/Import IMP 1013 (Another of those incestuous gatherings of the British folkies. All of the right people are represented and the music is duly jolly, if not inspired. Do the Morris dance and live happily ever after.)
- Paul Motian/CONCEPTION VESSEL/ECM 1028 ST (Abstract drumming by Paul Motian sets the tone for the players who join him. Among them Charlie Haden, Sam Brown, Leroy Jenkins and Keith Jarrett explore the outer reaches. "Inspiration From a Vietnamese Lullaby" generates the most power, emotional and aural.)

- Elvis Costello/MY AIM IS TRUE/Stiff SEEZ 3 (Don't let Elvis Costello's name and demeanor fool you - he is not to be missed. He'll remind you of Graham Parker and Springsteen. As important is his string of super rock and roll songs. Merit Plus.)
- The Count Bishops/Chiswick WIK 1 (Basic rock and roll often says it better than the pretentious. Economy defines The Count Bishops. Good songs and solid play propel them. Merit.)
- Fairport Convention/THE BONNY BUNCH OF ROSES/Vertigo 9102 015 (Fairport may not be as commercially viable as they once were. But, that should not be taken to mean that they are less artistically. They have moved back toward the traditional. In some ways they have improved by adopting a truer approach. Merit Plus.)

William Lyall/SCLO CASTING/EMI (Look out for any keyboard player with a blank check. Keyboard players, more than other musicians, tend to be classically trained. After they make the conversion to pop music they never quite lose that affection for big orchestras. Lyall is a case in point. His obese production gets out of hand, placing layer upon layer on decent songs. Merit.)
The O Band/THE KNIFE/United Artists UAG 30077 (Del Newman might have missed important essence in this mix. Well in the back you can hear what sounds like a fine rhythmic track. It should have been more up front. The O Band songs are adequate. Merit.)
Dave Swarbrick /2/Transatlantic TRA 341 (Years of listening to the medieval whine of Dave's fiddle provides warm comfort. These reels and gigs flow endlessly. Special Programming.)

U-Bout/Bronze BRON 501 (Passable melodies matched with lyrics which too often reach for the cheap, easy rhymes, cool the overall impression. The playing is the most consistently good element. Side one floats on its first 3 tunes while two submerges. Satisfactory.)
Various Artists/I COOL'S COLD/Chiswick Cl 2 (Be the first on your block to own this even dozen. Hear The Gorillas, Little Bob Story, Radio Stars and Rocky Sharpe and the Razors. Sample British New Wave. Merit.)
Various Artists/NEW WAVE/Vertigo 6300202 (This New Wave sampler compiles the American scene for the British. It reaches back to the New York Dolls and forward to Talking Heads, touching Patti Smith, Runaways and Ramones among others. Several of these things are reissues. Merit.)

CONCEPTS

RECORDS AS THE SONIC WEAK LINK

Our retail reporters have been rather vocal for years about what they view as the declining quality of record pressings.

Part of the problem is that our ears play games with us. For example, American record junkies often rave about European pressings. While Europeans think that pressings from the USA are to be sought out. These divergent perceptions are, of course, mutually exclusive.

Another part of the problem is that the electronics industry has made great advances in the last ten years. Today's hi-fidelity equipment, of even modest price levels, is amazingly sophisticated compared to years past. During this same period of time there has not been an equal advance in mass production, record pressing techniques.

Direct-to-disc and the pressings made in special batches don't qualify for discussion here largely because they are the avant garde ideas of the field. Their value is that they may eventually yield techniques which can be applied in the mass production of recordings where the problem is.

Our point is that records are now the weakest link in the chain of accurate sound. Recording studios at one end and hi-fidelity equipment at the other end are magically able to capture and transmit the subtlest shadings of sound. But, these colorations have to be gotten into the grooves.

Especially, with the higher prices it becomes imperative that the record industry go beyond simple quality control to intensify research to raise the level of its weak link.
