Harper, who is 5 feet tall and tips the seales at nearly 200 pounds, resembles a forentan on a large excavation project more
than one who devotes full time to the recovery of missing juveniles. The father of two children, ne knows from experience that he knows from experience that

heart of humanity as docs the straying of litle child. His work has brought comfort-when - second seemis years. He also has helped fair managers with conducted silent campaigns to sell petroleum and more recently ice cream.
